HENRY HALLETT REUNION Henry Hallett came from England in 1793 to join the service of the Hudson's Bay Company in what is now Western Canada. One of his postings was to Buckingham House, near modern day Elk Point. So his family history is of interest to many of us.

Like most fur traders of those days, Henry married a native woman whose first name was translated to Catherine. When they were officially married at St. John's Anglican Church in the Red River Settlement on the 18th of October 1824, her surname was given as Dreese. Their family included the following:

1. Sophia, born 1796, who married James Knight,
2. Henry Jr. born 1799, who married Catherine Parenteau,
3. James, born 1800, who married Sarah (Sally) Fidler,
4. Marie Julie, born 1802(?) who married Louison Letendre,
5. Anne (Nancy), born 1809, who married Andrew Fidler,
6. William Peter, born 1811, who married Maria Pruden,
7. Elizabeth, born 1814, who married Alban Fidler.

There was also an Antoine Hallett, born 1823, who married Jane Spence, and a Janet Hallett, born 1839, who married Joseph Spence.

From the above, it is clear that Henry Hallett has many descendents in this world somewhere. Naturally many of them now are in Western Canada.

Now the point of all this is that some of the Halletts have decided that there should be a Hallett reunion in Winnipeg on July 1 to 4 1993 to celebrate the 100th anniversary of Henry's arrival out here.

If you're planning a trip to England in April of 1993 you might want to try to get to Norwich, Norfolk on the 2nd to 4th. Aside from being a beautiful city it is also the host for the Silver Jubilee Conference of the Federation of Family History Societies. The theme is "Life in Stuart England" and an interesting line-up of topics is scheduled. Complete cost including accomodation at the University of East Anglia is L88 but different packages are available. For more information contact me through the AGS mail or in Edmonton at 464-6448.

Plans for the British Isles Genealogical Directory are underway. Most member societies have agreed to support the project so the FFHS will go ahead with it. The information provided previously indicated that the forms for this project would be distributed in November 1992 - obviously the date has been pushed back! I will keep the membership informed as I receive the information.

The FFHS is seeking a solution to the problem of making payments for subscriptions, services and publications to the U.K. There is no easy solution but they are gathering information and will pass on their findings. Unless you have a service package through your bank the cost of money orders in British funds can be quite high.

The overseas liason officer is gathering information for a guide to unpublished indexes available on this side of the Atlantic. If anyone knows of any such indexes available in Alberta please let me know.

Two large British firms have archive sections and wish to encourage visits from family historians. They are: 1) Bank of England Archive Section, HO-M Threadneedle Street, London EC2R 8AH; 2) British Telecom, Room G09 Telephone House, 2-4 Temple Ave., London EC4Y 0HL. British Telecom hold a collection of telephone directories dating from the last century. As always when writing please include a SASE.

The Guild of One-Name Studies will hold its annual conference on 17-18 April 1993. Some conflicting dates were published previously but this is the correct one.

Some of you may have used the Department of Social Security or as it is now called, The Contributions Agency, to attempt to trace missing persons in England. They have now decided that they will not forward letters for genealogical research or social reasons but only for "welfare" purposes, which they define as a serious illness or the death of a family member. The FFHS is attempting to change their minds (a difficult task when applied to government departments!), even if it means introducing a charge for the service.

The Yorkshire Archaeological Society has published 14 out-of-print Yorkshire Parish Registers on microfiche at a cost of L7-8 per set. Further details may be obtained from C.S. Preston, Y.A.S. Parish Register Section, Claremont, 23 Clarendon Road, Leeds, LS2 9NZ.

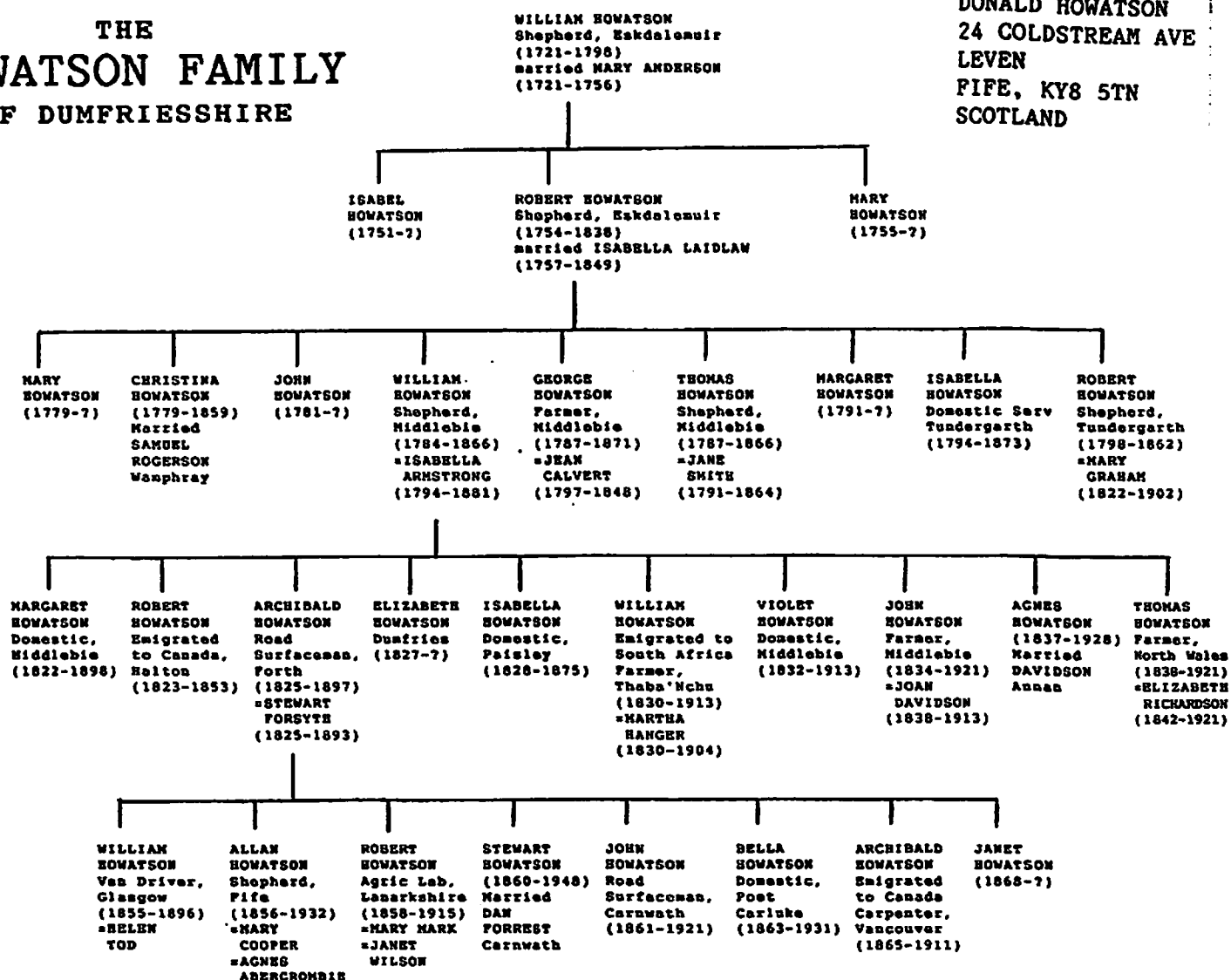
Donald Howatson writes to offer information exchange with anyone interested in the HOWATSON name. He writes:

In the past, before literacy was widespread, the spelling of the surname tended to vary. Thus, HOTSON, HUITSON, and HOWISON can all be considered to be variants of the HOWATSON surname. Different spellings for the same people between written and memorial records prove that spelling was free and phonetic as recently as the early 1800's."

Gourlay Family History

by J. Bradley and B. Thomson

Peter GOURLAY, a Corpl in the 94th Regiment of Foot, married Jean SMITH at Montrose, Angus, Scotland on June 12 1814. It is believed that Peter was killed in the Crimean War. We know of at least six children born to them:

After Peter's death, Jean and her grown children emmigrated to North America. They may not all have come at the same time, but all seemed to make their voyage in the 1850's. Jean lived in Wellington County with both Joseph, a farmer at Luther, and Peter, a tailor in Arthur. James, a plasterer also lived in Arthur. Jean's last years were spent in Hamilton where she lived with her daughter Margaret. Jean died in Hamilton and was buried in Hamilton Cemetery March 6 1876.

James married before crossing the Atlantic, and his children were born in England, USA, and Canada. Margaret also married before emmigration, and her children were born in Scotland and Canada,

(Hamilton). Peter and Joseph both met and married their brides in Wellington County. We are unsure of David's movements, but he may have lived in Toronto, Ontario. We believe William never married, and moved into the USA, eventually Nebraska, where he had a Music Store at Crete, and later Lincoln. He encouraged some of Joseph's children to join him in this business. We only know of children born to James, Margaret, Peter and Joseph.

Joseph farmed Lot 9 Concession 9 Luther Township, Wellington County, Ontario. On June 24, 1860 he married Jane HOLLIS daughter of William HOLLIS and Mary INGOLDSBY. (William, a member of the British Military, had been promised land in Canada if he "survived the war". The family was in Kitley, Leeds, Ontario in

1849, but by 1851 were in Chinguacousy, Peel. They settled in Luther ca 1853. The HOLLIS' farmed Lot 7 Concession 7, Luther.) As there were no roads at the time of Joseph and Jane's wedding, only a path through the bush north of Arthur, the couple walked through the bush to be married in the Catholic Church in Arthur, walking back home for the wedding breakfast. Joseph and Jane raised ten children on their farm at Luther.

Their daughters drew the stone for the large house. Joseph served his community as Reeve from 1887-1888, and Treasurer from 1889-1896.

Joseph died of a heart attack at a council meeting on December 28, 1896. After Jane fell nine feet through a barn floor in 1903, an accident requiring seven stitches, her health began to fail. Jane died October 27 1906.

Charles Englisby GOURLAY, the youngest child of Joseph and Jane, followed in his Uncle William's steps, and went into the music store business. At first he went to Lincoln, Nebraska and worked in the family store there. Around 1912 he followed his brother James to Edmonton, Alberta where Charles worked in Real Estate, and also owned his own sewing machine store and music business. James had

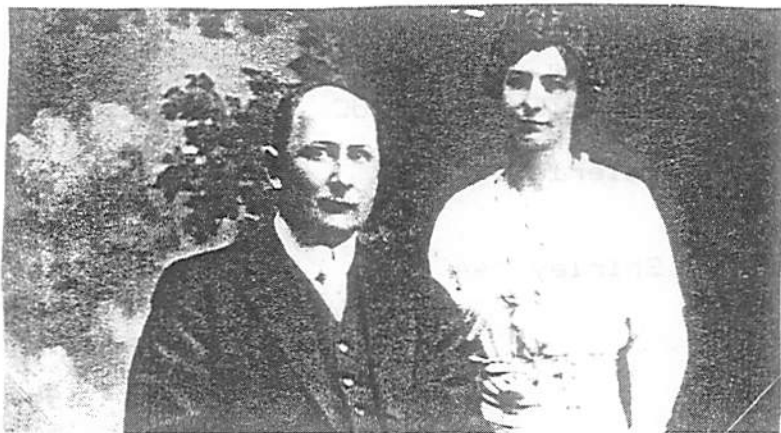
started his music store business in Edmonton in 1907, and by 1910 had stores at both 138 Jasper Avenue W. and 501 Jasper Avenue E. His stores were stocked with "the best in sheet music, phonographs and records, musical instruments, stationery, post cards, sewing machines and supplies." (Edmonton 1910)

During a visit from Lincoln to his sister Catherine in Luther, Charles was asked to take her into Toronto as she wished to purchase a stove. He did as she requested, and at the store met a young saleswomen. Being ten years his senior, Catherine teased him about the young lady. He later returned to the store to become better acquainted with the saleswoman, Mary Delia Eva HARVEY, or Della as she preferred. Romance blossomed, and the rest, as they say, is history. After carrying on a correspondence, Charles persuaded Della to move west with him. He advised her to say she was coming west to work as a domestic for James GOURLAY, as she would be able to ride the harvest train at no cost. In Calgary, Della stayed over to visit with her brother. She did not like the west, and had decided to return east. She missed the trees of Ontario. Charles convinced her to continue the trip to

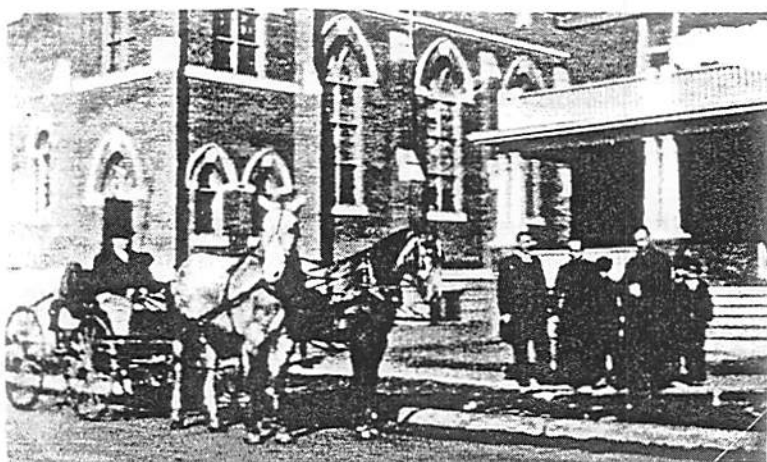
Edmonton, as she had a ticket for Edmonton, and if she was unhappy, he would take her back east. She must have enjoyed Edmonton, as they were married there February 15 1915.

Charles and Della's marriage was much too short, although they did have a wonderful life together. They made trips east, at least three times,

and also had a home in California where they enjoyed living seasonally. They also relaxed at their cottage at Alberta Beach. Although Charles had a car he loved his horses, and preferred to drive his team. Their home on 105 Street, just south of Jasper Avenue was

often filled with friends in town for the weekend shopping. Charles played the fiddle, and friends danced and enjoyed their hospitality. Sadly, upon return from a visit to California, Charles caught pneumonia after going out coatless on a winter's night to repair a sewing machine. He died December 18, 1923, leaving five children, and Della expecting their sixth the following April.

Della raised her children while maintaining her music business. Her children, in their adult years, have admitted to leading their numerous "nannies" on wild chases as these poor young girls tried their best to maintain order. Della certainly had her work cut out for her. Although some family members offered to adopt and raise some of the children, Della was adamant that she keep her family with her. Della lived a long life, knowing all her grandchildren and some of her great grandchildren. Her last years were spent at Barrhead, Alberta where she lived in a nursing home. When her health was failing, she was sent to the hospital in an ambulance. She would have nothing to do with lying down in the back, but she sat up in the front with the driver. Della died May 10, 1974.

WE, the undersigned, hereby declare that we desire to form a society under the Societies Act, R.S.A. 1970 and that:

1 The name of the Society is - Alberta Genealogical Society.

2 The objects of the Society are -

b) To encourage adherence to accuracy and thoroughness in research;

d) To assemble a library of genealogical guides, handbooks, reference sources, family and local histories, and other books and materials which may assist the members, all of whom will be available to the members;

e) From time to time to publish such bulletins, booklets, books, pamphlets, or other documents as may be found desirable and expedient by the Executive of the Society and to make the same available to the members and others on such terms and conditions as may be determined by the Executive;

f) To establish friendly relations with other genealogical societies for exchange of ideas and information and the promotion of common interests;

g) To enter into arrangements with other genealogical societies for the publication of bulletins, booklets, books, pamphlets, or other documents, on such terms and conditions as may be found desirable and expedient by the Executive.

h) To promote seminars and workshops on genealogical research and methodology and such other studies as may seem helpful to the members;

i) To provide a centre and suitable meeting place for the various activities of the Society and its members by rent or purchase or otherwise.
