RE: CORNISH MINING INDEX: Through my interests in both genealogy and the Cornish heritage, I am in the process of compiling a computer database of Cornish miners both at home and overseas. Initial research has been restricted to census returns, mining journals and other publications, but since publicizing the project, I have been in receipt of a variety of other data such as pay book transcriptions, wills and indexes to name but a few. Since the commencement of this project in September 1993 the index has in excess of 4,000 entries, and includes entries as widespread as England, Wales, America, South Africa and Brazil.

As you are no doubt aware, the value of such indexes increases with the amount of data held, and this leads me to one of the following: I formally offer the facilities of the above database in the hope that it will assist research. To cover the cost of a search, printout and return postage it would be appreciated if all enquiries would be accompanied by 2 IRC, multiple name searches (within reason!) accepted, this is a NON-PROFIT MAKING project. Additionally, if it is possible for you to publicize the existence of this index in the hope that some of your members would be willing to submit data for inclusion, this would be greatly appreciated. CIVIL WAR SOLDIERS INDEX The National Park Service in cooperation with other interested organizations is developing a Civil War Soldiers System which will be available to visitors at the Parks Service Civil War sites by 1995-96.

The System will include a computerized database containing very basic facts about the soldiers who served on both sides during the Civil War; a list of regiments in both the Union and Confederate Armies; identifications and descriptions of some of the major battles of war; references that identify the sources of the information in the database and suggestions for where to find additional information.



# BORDER OUTLAWS!, are you descended from a border family?

Armstrong, Burns, Graham, Hall, these are just four of the riding families from the Borders of England and Scotland. There are more than 60 such families who, for over four hundred years, ruled the north of England and the south of Scotland with ruthless abandon. It's a moot point as to whether these families were good or bad at this point in time and does it really make any difference to those of us who are decended from them. It doesn't matter to me that the four families named above are my ancestors, in fact I'm proud of them. These families are still very much a part of life in the Cumbria and Northumberland counties.

The Hall family, in Cumbria, became Anglican ministers, county councillors, and yeoman farmers. They helped settle Australia, along with the Potters, another border "family". They were sugar planters in British Guyana and farmers in Upper Canada. The Grahams were a cross border family who protected each other from the law on both sides of the border. If you have an Irish Graham in your family tree then you have border ties. The

Grahams were shipped off to plantations in Rosscommon, Ireland when James I and IV followed Elizabeth to the throne of England. James wanted to subdue the borders, and he did so in no uncertain manner. Many descendants of the Graham and the Burns families are still in Ireland. But many of the Grahams sneaked back to the Borders. They did this by changing their names to Maharg, Graham spelled backwards - smart bunch those Grahams. Other families that you may have heard of in this day and age are, Nixon, Johnson, and Armstrong, Elliot, Scott, Forster or Foster, Pringle and Rutherford, the list goes on.

There is a great deal of written information about the riding families, or clans, from the six old Marches that comprise the "border" area. This is due to the huge amount of mail that went between the March wardens and the Crowns of England and Scotland. All this information is available to genealogist and family historians. What would you like to know about your forebears? Were they reivers (outlaws) or were they on the side of the law? Sometimes they were both at the same time. How did they live? how did they dress? and what were their homes like?

The main home for the family chief was a Pele tower, a huge square building that was a fortress built to keep out the enemy. The enemy could be the law or one of the other riding families if there was a blood feud going on. The Pele towers were built to last, and last they did - many of these Pele Towers are still standing in the loneliest areas of the Borders.

In September we will leave Edmonton for a 16 day trip back in time. We will visit the Clifford Estates and the Ancestral Research Centre where their speciality is Border Families. Archivists and genealogists will be on hand to help us look at our ties with the North. The way they lived and why their life style was so very different from the rest of England and Scotland will surprise and fascinate. Pele Towers, Public Record Offices, Castles, the Roman wall, and Museums are just a few of the wonders that are waiting for us. If you want to join the group please call me as soon as possible at 923-3290. There are only 30 spaces.

#### FRENCH CANADIAN...

The recent Liberal victory in Ottawa has provided an interesting exercise for those studying genealogy. You may ask "what do genealogy and Jean Chretien have in common?" Well, here's the answer:

Last year when the Conservatives were deciding who to choose for their leader I thought it would be fun to find out if I was related to number two candidate Jean Charest. After Parliament Hill's latest face-lift I now find myself interested in finding a link to Jean Chretien (and maybe even Lucien Bouchard). This is a lot like looking for a needle in a haystack, but it is more fun and your allergies are guaranteed not to act up.

If you're from French-Canadian roots that go back to the original Acadian and French-Canadian colonies, the possibilities of being related to other French-Canadians of the same stock are quite good. Consider the millions of French-Canadians that live all over Canada and United States who originated from the original colonies.

To find the particulars on Jean Charest, I scoured the newspapers and magazines until I found an article in *Maclean's* magazine that mentioned who his parents were.

Once I had tracked his line through his father Claude Charest the journey began to simplify itself. From Claude's father, Ludovic Charest, I found the appropriate parish registry book at the Societe' Historique in Donnelly, Alberta. From there it was a matter of tracing the Charest line as far back as I could. The result: Jean Charest, former Deputy Prime Minister and presently one of two Tories left in the country, is my 9th cousin once removed. Our common ancestors being Mathieu Choret and his wife Sebastienne Veillon who left France for Ouebec circa 1647.

Did that help me meet Jean when I was visiting Parliament Hill in March of 1993? Well... people were impressed when I mentioned I was Jean Charest's cousin but somehow they lost interest when I went into detail of our kinship.

The first step in conducting your research will be to find out the time and place of marriage of your "would-be relative". At this time you would look into a variety of French-Canadian genealogy books focusing on marriages. For recent dates one would look to parish records of certain counties. For more distant dates one would look to parish records of certain counties. For more distant dates the best books include Rene Jette's invaluable Dictionnaire genealogique des familles du Quebec, Cyprien Tanguay's Dictionnaire genealogique des familles canadiennes and the massive 47-volume collection Repertoire des actes de bapteme, mariage, sepulture et des recensements du Quebec ancien. There are plenty of other superb reference books, but these deserve special mention.

As mentioned before, the odds are in your favour if you are descended from the early pioneers. To prove it wasn't an isolated incident I decided to see if I was related to Franco-American writer Jack Kerouac who was born in Lowell, Massachusetts in 1922. To make a long story short we are 9th generation cousins once removed.

While this exercise is easiest if you are of French-Canadian origin, it would be a historically profitable experiment whatever your background.

"Profitable?" you ask, "Can I make money from this?"

No, this is not about that kind of profit. It is about stimulating your creativity and knowledge of personal history. This game of detection is one of the most pleasurable ways of reaping the benefits of genealogy... and it's a great ice-breaker at parties if you do find a connection.

#### CANADIAN, OR WHAT?

My sister and I have argued about many things, but this was ridiculous.

"So you're Canadian!" she said vehemently.

"That's what I use when I fill out forms", I said.

"Well, I'm Welsh!" She was so indignant that I was forced to ponder how siblings from the same two parents could have been so cut asunder. We were born in Canada and so was our father. Mother was born in North Dakota, but only because her people had moved there from Ontario seeking farm land. So that makes us Welsh?

It is true that in the western hemisphere we have generally followed patrilineal traditions. My sister's defence of the Welsh strand in our heritage is an emotional loyalty and a certain pride in a feisty immigrant grandfather from North Wales. She thoroughly objects to my more logical and legal response. But how many generations do we have to live in a country before claiming to be of that country in blood and bone? And if we must go back, how far? What were we before we were Welsh?

For many of us, to pick one "nationality" from among those of our forebears is to ignore a great deal about ourselves. I question whether any purpose is served. Apart from genealogists, most people have only scant knowledge of their roots before their grandparents' era. There is so much confusion and misinformation about "nationality" that it might be wise to relegate the issue to the category of lore and save it for sentimental musings at our genealogy meetings.

The federal and provincial governments collected misinformation for years. Let me share an experience that may be familiar to readers. Some years ago as each of my babies came into this world, there were forms to fill out at the hospital. The nurse came with her clipboard, and new moms had to declare, among other things, the baby's nationality. This question threw me the first time, and I confess, it didn't occur to me then to say

"Canadian". I knew bits and pieces about my heritage, and also that my husband's maternal grandparents were born and raised in Norway. His father's people had come from Ontario. But we had a "Mac" surname.

"Nationality? Well, Scottish", I said, surprised at my sudden insight and that lying could be so easy.

"Scottish! Lovely!" chirped the nurse, a recent arrival from the old sod. "I'm so glad you didn't say 'Scotch'. Scotch is whisky!" Thirty-some years and reams of research later, we have yet to connect with Scotland.

My maternal grandfather thought he "might be Pennsylvania Dutch" but my digging over twenty years shows only that his grandmother's family may have moved to Pennsylvania from New Jersey in the course of their migration to Canada in the early 1800's. Nor were there German-speaking people in the near family. Grandpa, born in 1868, was already a third-generation Canadian on his father's side. Still, he recited his "Dutch" response regularly for the census taker. So much for silly questions.

And judging from 19th century census returns, we have been collecting misinformation for a long time. The 1871 census for Beverly Township, Wentworth County, Ontario, shows that others in the family were just as uncertain. Two brothers, paternal uncles of my grandfather, appear on this return: James was "Dutch"; Walter was "English". Two other brothers, nephews of the above, were similarly divided. Thomas, age 19 was "German"; Sidney, age 23, was "English".

To be fair, they were probably drawing on the only facts they knew: they spoke English, their forefathers had left the United States after the Revolution, and some of the more recent relatives had intermarried with Waterloo County families with German surnames, some of whom had come from Pennsylvania. They were all busy clearing land and raising big families; nationality was no big deal.

The issue of nationality and/or race was still pretty muddy in the 1930's. When I obtained a photo-copy of a great-grandmother's death certificate (Saskatchewan, 1934), there were some instructions in fine type along one edge of the government form:

"Racial origin will be described by stating to what people or race the deceased person belonged, whether English, Irish, Scotch, French, German, etc.; the terms 'American' or 'Canadian' should not be used as they express citizenship or nationality but not a race or a people."

Great-grandmother's parents were born in Scotland. By this definition, she was of a different *race* than her neighbour who came from just across the border in England. This confusion seems to be more a matter of semantics, and one would need to spend some time examining the assumptions underlying the concepts found here.

As far as government forms go, I think we have come a few steps in the right direction. The hospital near me merely asks new parents to state their birthplace, if not Canada. Our local high school asks for visa numbers if students are not Canadian citizens, and also whether they qualify for instruction in the French language under Section 23 of the Canadian Charter of Rights. There are obvious practical reasons for questions such as these.

But the concept of race and the fact that there are differences in the human groups that walk the earth can't be overlooked. In the academic sense, anthropologists use terms such as Mongoloid, Negroid, and Caucasoid, and using these divisions compare the shapes of skulls, eyes, noses. Or they may separate the world's peoples into "curly-haired groups" and "straight-haired groups" in the hope of learning more about human evolution from prehistoric times. I won't go into that area of study, nor will I attempt to deal with the ethnic/religious bases of wars such as the one in the former Yugoslavia.

In medicine, however, there is often a legitimate need to search out racial inheritance since some peoples are pre-disposed to certain diseases; for example, sickle-cell anemia in Afro-Americans. Doctors have learned something of the link between western diet and bowel cancer when studies revealed that native Japanese, living in Japan, had a lower rate of this type of cancer than Californian Japanese who had switched to a typical American diet. But racial classifications often seem to be a

double-edged sword, and where good may have been the original intent, less than happy outcomes ensue. Labelling people, of necessity, discriminates. The overall effect of racial division has been to harm humanity more than to help.

And we can become so narrow and selective in claiming our heritage. Recently a Canadian woman made the C.B.C. news as a "first" in her field. She reported that her father was Ukrainian and her mother a Canadian Indian. She herself was touted as the "first native woman to..." I pictured her father and a couple of grandparents feeling somewhat slighted. You see how subjective and complicated the whole issue becomes.

Ann Landers featured a letter from a Californian dubbed "White Hispanic". He was insulted that people "thought Hispanics were not white". Ann pointed out that most Americans are not pure anything," and that early Spaniards brought more than a drop of Saracen blood to mix with that of the natives when they invaded the western hemisphere. Another writer on the same topic suggested that the complainant "get a map and look at how close Spain is to Africa!"

You will suspect me of having no pride in my ancestors and of being the worst kind of wet blanket at genealogy meetings. Not so. Last fall I couldn't wait to tell our group that my second cousin had just come back from Shropshire with nine more early grandparents to add to our tree (and most of them with Welsh surnames!).

But let's be Canadians if we were born in Canada. Let's avoid the word "nationality" as too ambiguous. Let's complain loudly when foolish, useless questions pop up on government forms, and above all, let's be chary about claiming "purity". We're not spring water or Ivory soap. The word "pure" has little meaning when applied to people, given millennia of migration and the human propensity to mate for love, political advantage, fame, gold, anything but tidying up a bloodline.

Instead, we can celebrate the many different ethnic strains we represent. I'm convinced, but can I reprogram that sister of mine? I've read that the Welsh have a fierce pride and I'm afraid that she has inherited some of it. But I've also read that

"the Welsh, being a coastal people, are among the most mongrelized in the world." I'll keep that last bit to myself just for the present.

#### I'VE GOT THE BUG

Twenty five years ago I was sitting in my office in the City of London where I managed a computer department that looked after the accounts of a large international bank when one of my colleagues returned from lunch to inform us all that he had the 'Bug'. "Get away from us" was the instant response until he explained that the bug in question was genealogy and that his lunchtimes were spent in the library tracing his family.

That was it, forget the million dollar computer, every day I spent lunch times researching my family. At first with great ideas of being related to royalty or perhaps finding a will from my ancestors where a fortune lay unclaimed, just waiting for me. Perhaps it would not be that simple as I was the fifth and youngest son but I would persevere.

Every day I was off to St Catherine's House and its predecessor Somerset House heaving the heavy indexes around.

I did discover one thing in my favour, I have a fairly rare surname 'Nice'. Thank goodness I had not been born a 'Smith' or 'Jones'.

If I could squeeze in extra time or take an afternoon off I would go to the Public Record Office and spend hours going through the census records which gave me an enormous database of 'Nices'.

I realized that as I traced back to the early 1800s that transport was rare so families tended to stay in the same area which was a great help in my research.

My next problem was that my family came from a small village in Essex, there was no street map of it! Yet I had names of houses and streets where my ancestors had been born. How could I solve this?

I hit upon the idea of contacting the local school and offering a prize for a competition as to who could draw the best street map. It worked; I received an admirable map.

At last the great day dawned, I was to visit the village - would there still be people there to whom I was related; would I find someone who looked like me?

In fact the only relatives I could find were in the churchyard, this was a morning where the mist was low and thick which in itself generated a certain atmosphere.

My family had in fact all been farm labourers, an average of 7 to 8 children to each generation and my grandfather born in 1863 had been the first generation of the family who could write.

I came to a full stop in 1740 with my direct line so I branched out. I found branches of my family had come to England with the Huguenots in the 1500s, some members owned large estates and farms, wills had been written showing extensive wealth.

In total when I wrote everything, I had over 80 pages of names, residences, trees, wills, etc.

My next development was on to houses. I am fortunate to live in an area where there are many old houses - some dating back to the Domesday Book (1086). My own house, being a mere 100 years old, was quickly researched but I obtained so much information I felt as if I knew the person it had been built for. He commissioned it for his wedding but his first wife was to die after a short time; he remarried but was to have no children to carry on the tradition of his name. I did feel sorry for him until I heard the following story:

While the house was being built in its two acres of grounds there was a small cottage opposite the magnificent drive entrance spoiling the view. He ordered that this cottage be demolished and the tenant made homeless. This was carried out. What he did not realize was that this homeless labourer was the local grave-digger and when this hard Victorian landowner came to pass away, the grave-digger got his revenge by refusing to dig his grave.

The history of individual houses is a fascinating development, there are so many sources that may be used in studying families that can also be utilized in houses eg. Land Tax, Rates, Voters Lists, Muster Lists, Hearth Tax, Tithes Maps, etc. that it is possible to obtain a very good picture of the people who lived there and discover their way of life - joy and tragedy.

Most of the country was at one time owned by a small number of landowners and fortunately quite a few estate records have been retained; so deeds, leases, rental agreements can be found and information gleaned.

Being able to become involved in a house has given me a creative background when researching individual families so the two lines of research work side by side produce a better result.

As my work has become more well known I have built up a growing band of clients in the areas of the world where residents of the UK migrated to, mainly USA, Canada, Australia and New Zealand.

Amongst my current assignments I am in hot pursuit of a south Devon man who sailed from Plymouth in Devon to Massachusetts in the early 1600s and I hope to complete this project shortly.

If any of your readers have an interest in their ancestors or their ancestors' houses in the UK (particularly in the Devon and Cornwall area) I am familiar with most sources of information that are available and I would be happy to undertake research on their behalf.

#### BARRHEAD OBITUARIES INDEX

This project originally began in the mid 1970's when I discovered my mother had old Barrhead newspapers stored away. I started clipping interesting stories and the obituaries. The clippings

- stories of people or events I pasted into scrap books and the obituaries were put on 3x5 cards.

In the 1980's when we were recording cemeteries and trying to find death dates for some of these, we found it handy to be able to check our obituary file. We discovered it would be handier if we had obits from before the 1970's. I found out the Barrhead Museum had a collection of the Barrhead newspapers back to its first issue in 1928. So then began the extensive project of copying, by hand, the obituaries onto 5x8 cards. I could soon see I would not complete copying these in one short summer. The Museum is open from May to September and there were 40 years to cover.

At the end of the summer we contacted the Legislature Library in Edmonton to see if we could purchase microfilm copies of the Barrhead Leaderyes, but that would cost \$400.00. However they allowed us to borrow them in two batches and so for the next six months every spare moment was spent typing obits onto cards. We wore out two typewriters.

This last year we decided to enter these obituaries in a data base. Our son spent three months at the computer doing this. After all this work we thought why not make an index and put it into book form.

This book is an alphabetical index of obituaries found in the Barrhead Leader (or Barrhead News as it was once known) from the years 1928 - 1969.

There are only a few entries from the year 1928, as well some issues through the years were missing so we do not have those obituaries.

The index includes the surname, given name, date of death, age, cemetery & date of newspaper the obituary appeared in. There are 2056 entries. We also include a list of the Barrhead County cemeteries and their land location.

# UNIQUE SETTINGS IN RURAL ALBERTA

by Lillian Wight AGS #2668 How often do we toss out something we wish we had kept? A receipt.., a clipping.., even a device that might have come in handy the very next day. And how often we try to forget the hardships in favour of remembering the good things that happen...

These two thoughts come together in an attempt to learn more of the history of our Alberta people by researching and recording information about the lives of those who have gone before us. The idea is especially relevant in delving into the history of Kuusamo Cemetery, Tail Creek Cemetery and the Brown Family Plot.

#### OLD KUUSAMO CEMETERY, SYLVAN LAKE NW24-38-02-W5

From an article preserved by the Red Deer and District Archives dated October 1970, the first Kuusamo Cemetery (1.66 acres) was located on the A. Parvi homestead, NW24-38-02-W5, in what is known today as the Marianne District established 13 November 1902.

Kuusamo Cemetery is located south-west of the town of Sylvan Lake. Take Highway 11 almost 2 miles west of the town, turn south for 2 miles, then west 1/2 mile to the property on the left. The CPR rail cuts through this property and crosses the road before reaching the next intersection. Kuusamo School was built about 1/2 mile north of this same intersection.

A letter dated 17 May 1910 lists the members of the Kuusamo Cemetery Company to be Alex Kinnunen, John Kinnunen, P.M. Wetelainen, A. Holoppa, J.W.W. Slack, A.H. Kinnunen, Aug. Johnson, Ilmar Hyvonen, Isaac Porttin and Matt Porttin. This letter bears the seal of the Provincial Secretary, signed by E. Trowbridge, Deputy Provincial Secretary.

Charlie Johnson, son of August Johnson, residing at Sylvan Lake found the title to the Cemetery No. 98T2, two receipts, minutes of two meetings, and one page of a burial register. August Johnson's twin sons born prematurely, and an infant daughter are buried in this cemetery but are not recorded on the register page.

Translated from Finnish, the minutes record a meeting of the cemetery committee March 3, 1923 by Secretary Matt Porttas, August Johnson presiding. It was decided to obtain the records from Mrs. Slack, purchase two rolls of wire and fence the cemetery, and give A. Johnson authority to store the records at home or in the bank.

An article in the local history "Along the Burnt Lake Trail", c. 1977, together with incomplete burial records suggest that at least eight persons are buried in the cemetery. Reasons for deaths range from liver complaint to lung fever, inward trouble caused by an accident, and diphtheria.

This cemetery has not been used for many years, nor has it been tended. There is no fence and the wooden markers that identified a few graves have disappeared. Apparently a few years ago there was one resident who knew more about the cemetery but unfortunately no one recorded his knowledge while he still lived.

#### **BROWN FAMILY PLOT**

#### HUGHENDEN, ALBERTA NE20-40-08-W4

On a warm, still autumn afternoon a visit to the Brown Family Plot entails trekking through original prairie grassland, down a steep incline to the south on the sheltered side of a poplar bluff to discover a fenced and groomed plot on the edge of a hayfield. During the flu epidemic of 1919 coupled with an attack of scarlet fever, the family lost four children ranging in age from 7 months to a young man of 23 years, all within ten days in April, 1919.

The children are all buried in this fenced family plot. Each grave is marked with a headstone, and the family has erected one large headstone with four individual inscriptions. The children's father died in 1937 and is also buried there.

The Brown Family Plot is located a total of nine miles from the village of Amisk, Alberta. Travel seven miles south of the Intersection of Highway 13 and secondary Highway #884, then west on a good gravel road, past an old stone house and what used to be the site of Poplar Site School, for a distance of two miles. On the southwest corner of that intersection is farm property presently owned by relatives, Lawrence and Sylvia Crone.

This corner of the property (the NE corner of Section 20) is covered with native prairie grass and shrubs and the rising terrain bears the poplar bluff. To the south of the bluff, approximately 100 yards from the road is the family plot.

According to the Cummins Directory Map of 1918, Albert and Margaret Brown came from Ontario to homestead that quarter section in 1911. At present the plot is maintained by the families of three granddaughters.

A poignant account of these trying times may be found in a local history entitled, "The Lantern Years: Buffalo Park to Neutral Hills, 1867 - 1967", pp.79 - 80. This article was written by Reverend H.C.McNeil who, along with Dr. Ferguson and Mrs. Cyril Young, a registered nurse, tended the family during their crisis. A copy of this book is held in the Amisk village office and in the Provincial Archives of Alberta, Edmonton.

#### TAIL CREEK CEMETERY NEVIS, ALBERTA SE27-38-22-W4

Tail Creek, Alberta, you say? A village? Where? When? Certainly the local residents know!

Tail Creek is but a memory. Over the years Tail Creek has drained Buffalo Lake in a southerly direction entering the Red Deer River just east of Highway 21 (south of Highway 12) at a point known today as Content Park, the site of two campgrounds and a ball park. Presently the creek is almost dry.

In the 1870's this junction was a busy, thriving winter settlement of approximately 2000 people living in about 400 wooden cabins erected for shelter by the Indians, Metis and fur traders. They had gathered in this area to harvest the buffalo for meat, ingredients for pemmican and hides for personal use and for trading with the Hudson Bay Company. Temporarily the biggest settlement in Western Canada it was virtually vacant during the summer months and early fall.

A small detachment of the North West Mounted Police was also established there to ward off any influx of whiskey-traders. Apparently the headquarters, log buildings, a stable and a stockade were situated where ball games are now played.

A prairie fire went through in 1889 levelling all but one of the cabins together with the meeting house

which had been used evenings for spirited music, dancing and socializing. The fire, together with the decline of the buffalo and the influx of early settlers, forecast the demise of this thriving community.

The original graveyard was located north of this setting on the east bank of Tail Creek. It is thought that victims of a small pox epidemic and native Indian hunters and Metis may have been buried here. In 1903 some human remains were found in Charlie Claes' field while cultivating. The spring run-off also eroded the cemetery site, so in 1907, the graves that could be located were moved a halfmile from the original site to what is known today as Tail Creek Cemetery located on the McKnight farm. The County of Stettler #6 map of 1965 shows this property to be owned at that time by Walter Harold Lynn. To reach the site travel east on Highway 12 one mile from the junction of Highways 21 and 12, then south for one and a half miles. The cemetery is on the west side of the road fringed by farm land.

In 1976 Mrs. Irwin Dyck of Nevis was instrumental in organizing a small group of citizens of the town to restore the cemetery as an historic site. It had not been used since 1940 when Ian Clark, a former resident of Nevis, was buried there. Wooden graves and grave markers had been destroyed in an earlier attempt to burn grass and clean the cemetery. Fryer's book "Ghost Towns of Alberta" has an excellent photograph of the Indian graves with their original covers, p.100. The Nevis group cleaned the fenced site, replaced the crosses and constructed an overhead sign. A plaque which identifies 18 known gravesites was designed and erected 'Dedicated to the Metis People Who Were Among the First Permanent Residents of This Area.'

One legible headstone reads "James House, beloved husband of Isabell House, 5 June 1897, aged 64 yrs. May his soul rest in Peace." A second marker commemorates his wife, Isabell who died 25 October 1917, age 66.

Articles describing this historic area in some detail appeared in the Red Deer Advocate November 5, 1976, and in the publication "Western People" in October, 1980. Other sources of information include Fryer's book mentioned above and Colonel S.B. Steele's "Forty Years in Canada, 1835 - 1875."

Two other local histories that help to provide us with insight as to life in these early times include "Trails of Tail Creek Country" by Edith Lawrence Clark, 1968, and Joe Ball's collection of writings entitled "1891 - Memories of Central Alberta" printed in 1975.

These secluded rural settings together with their accompanying histories cause us to make time stand still while we contemplate the trials and tribulations, the strength and fortitude, and ultimate determination of those very people who have helped to shape the Alberta we know today.



#### Objects of the Society

We, the undersigned, hereby declare that we desire to form a society under the Societies Act, R. S. A., 1970 and that:

- 1. The name of the society is: Alberta Genealogical Society.
- 2. The objects of the society are:
- a) To promote the study of genealogy and genealogical research within the province of Alberta;
- b) To encourage adherence to accuracy and thoroughness in research;
- c) To encourage and instruct members in the ethical principles, scientific methods and effective techniques of genealogical research and to defend the standards of genealogy from incompetent and disreputable persons;
- d. To assemble a library of genealogical guides, handbooks, reference sources, family and local histories, and other books and materials which may assist the members, all of which will be available to the members;
- e. From time to time to publish such bulletins, booklets, books, pamphlets, or other documents as may be found desirable and expedient by the Executive of the society and to make the same available to the members and others as such terms and conditions as may be determined by the Executive;
- f. To establish friendly relations with other genealogical societies for exchange of ideas and informalities and the promotion of common interests;
- g. To enter into arrangements with other genealogical societies for the publication of bulletins, booklets, books, pamphlets, or other documents, on such terms and conditions as may be found desirable and expedient, by the Executive;
- h. To promote seminars and workshops on genealogical research and methodology and such other studies as may seem helpful to members;
- i. To provide a centre and suitable meeting place for the various activities of the Society and its members by rent or purchase or otherwise;
- j. To encourage the establishment of Branches of the Society under such terms and conditions as the bylaws of the Society, from time to time, provide;
- k. To achieve the foregoing objects, funds may be raised and donations, gifts, legacies and bequests accepted.
- j. The operations of the Society are to be carried out chiefly in the Province of Alberta.
