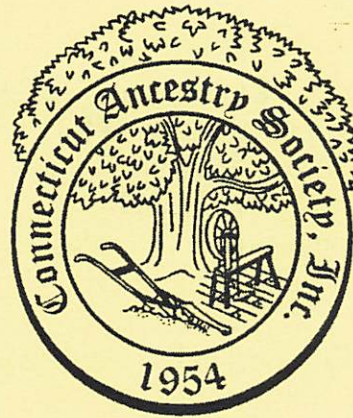

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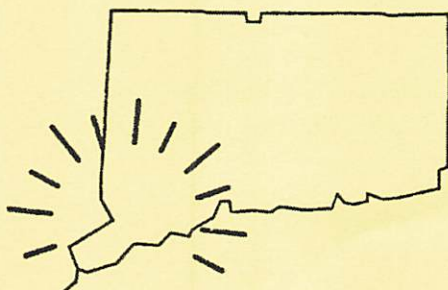

Editorial Notes

Our first articles in this issue are two sketches from Kathryn Downs Wolff highlighting households enumerated on the 1790 US census in Fairfield County. This time she provides sketches for Abel Bennett and for Bennett Perry, both of Newtown.

Harlan Jessup studied land records in Ridgefield to develop a proof argument for the identity of the parents of Daniel Bennett (d. 1877) of Ridgefield. In a second article Harlan provides a short extension of the Benedict family—the children and grandchildren of John Harvey Benedict (1808-1871) of Ridgefield.

Member Harry Knapp wants to know the identity of the parents of Lt. William Palmer. See page 97 for details of his query and contact him if you have any information.

The publication of records from Volume 1A of the New Canaan Congregational Church register continues with the first part of the Bill of Mortality, 1808-1853, transcribed by your editor. This volume has never been microfilmed and is not indexed at the State Library. The recorders of this history were interested in family relationships and they named relatives of many of the deceased. They included the deaths of town residents which occurred in different jurisdictions and those who were not members of the church. Readers without ancestors in that town will no doubt be interested in the historical aspects of these records such as causes of death.

Harlan Jessup closes out this issue with an explanation of the Constitutional Convention of 1818 and a list of the delegates from Fairfield County.

Dear Readers,

You may note that this issue of *Connecticut Ancestry* is short on narrative articles. That is because only these few articles were submitted for publication.

Every family is worthy of having its ancestors published. Please consider submitting a narrative about yours. The only requirement is that the subject(s) of the article be connected to Fairfield County or nearby New York including Long Island.

The job of the editor is to work with authors to make submitted articles worthy of publication. Occasionally we receive a manuscript that does not need editing. In most cases we receive articles that need some alteration—addition of sources, rearranging sections to make the story flow better, requesting additional information about someone in the article. This means that *your* submission does not need to be perfect. Author and editor work together to bring the article to the standards of *Connecticut Ancestry*.

In the past few years we have set up several themed suggestions for articles—the One-Page Challenge (just a single page about your ancestor), the 1790 US Census Project about Fairfield County families who were enumerated on the first census, and most recently the Fairfield County Immigrant Project, spotlighting individuals and families who moved into our county after the American Revolution. One of these themes must cover *your* research. You could also write an article with your own theme. For example, who is your brick wall ancestor and what have you done to get past that point?

In our last issue author Linda Wesner welcomed contact from readers who might have more information about her ancestor Fred Arnold. After publication she heard from the wife of one of Fred's descendants. This woman knows the person who still lives in Fred Arnold's house. Linda is thrilled at the prospect of learning more about her family.

How about you? Consider your article to be bait for other genealogical fish in the sea of Fairfield County history. Pick one ancestor and get started with your writing. Send your questions (and manuscript) to editor@connecticutancestry.org.

Thanks for helping to make *Connecticut Ancestry* the best journal in Connecticut.

Abel Bennett of Newtown in 1790

2 - 1 - 5 - 0 - 1¹

Newtown

ABEL BENNETT was born in Newtown 1 Apr 1746, eldest child of Ephraim and Ann (Baldwin) Bennett.² He was baptized at the Congregational Church in June of that year as was admitted to church membership on 27 October 1771.³ He died 21 Apr 1831,⁴ age 84, and was buried in the now-defunct Bennett Cemetery.⁵

Abel married ANN STILSON on 9 Aug 1770 at Newtown.⁶ Born about 1749, Ann died 13 May 1815, age 66, and is also buried in Bennett Cemetery.⁷ All of Abel Bennett's children were born in this marriage.

Abel married second, sometime after May 1815 when both of their first spouses died, MARY (___?) JOHNSON, widow of Abel Johnson. She died 30 June 1828, age 74.⁸ Abel Johnson was also a 1790 Newtown head of household.⁹

Abel married, third, BETSEY (___?) CROFUT on 10 Dec 1828 at Newtown the same day they signed a jointure in which in lieu of dower Abel agreed to pay Betsy \$30 per year during their marriage.¹⁰ She was the widow of Capt. Daniel Crofut and apparently had enough property to maintain herself if Abel died before her.¹¹ Daniel was also a 1790 Newtown head of

household.¹² Betsey survived Abel and married, as her third husband, Dan Peck (as his second wife) on 26 May 1832 at Newtown.¹³ Dan Peck died in 1833 and she is probably the Betsey Peck who was married to Peter Lake, as his second wife, on 9 Jan 1834.¹⁴ In that case, she would be the Betsey Lake who died 28 Nov 1843, age 77, and was buried in Taunton Cemetery, “relict of Peter.”¹⁵

Abel took the Freeman’s Oath in 1769.¹⁶ He received a bequest of 136+ acres of land in eight parcels valued at £653 from his father’s estate in 1781.¹⁷ In 1786, he was one of the petitioners to establish the Wapping school district in Newtown.¹⁸ However, the Newtown landmark most synonymous with Abel is “Bennett’s Bridge.” Now submerged under Lake Zoar, the bridge, which Abel, his brother Thomas and son Isaac built, was one of the ways to cross over the Housatonic River from Sandy Hook to Southbury.¹⁹

Abel Bennett wrote a will on 30 April 1828 in which he made clear that his daughter Anna and son James had already died. He left his property to son Isaac, heirs of Anna Glover and James Bennett and to Polly (Bennett) Curtis. Son Abel had received his portion earlier.²⁰

Members of the household in 1790: The two adult males are Abel and his oldest son, Isaac, age 19. The one male under sixteen was his son Abel, an infant. Four of the five females are his wife, Ann, and his unmarried daughters: Ann, age 16; Polly, age 14; and Jerusha, age 3. The identity of the fifth female is not known. The name of the slave is unknown.

Children of Abel and Ann, all births listed in the Newtown vital records:

- i. ISAAC BENNETT, b. 7 July 1771, d. Medina, Orleans, N.Y., 15 Apr 1845,²¹ m. HANNAH BEERS, daughter of John Jr. and Sarah (Sterling) Beers.²² One son died in Newtown in 1807.²³ At least one son reached adulthood, possibly other children.²⁴ Isaac was a resident of Orleans County, New York, by 1809.²⁵

- ii. ANN(A) BENNETT, b. 21 Feb. 1774; d. 3 Feb 1812, age 37 years, 11 months, 10 days;²⁶ m. 28 Sep 1794 EZRA GLOVER, "according to the Rites & ceremonies of the Episcopal Church at the house of Abel Bennitt."²⁷ He was a son of James and Eunice (Booth) Glover.²⁸ Three children, of whom two lived to adulthood. Abel Bennett bequeathed property to Anna's sons *Bennett Glover* and *James Edson Glover*.²⁹
- iii. POLLY BENNETT, b. 20 May 1776, d. of old age, 1 Nov. 1847,³⁰ age 71 years, 5 months, 10 days, buried Zoar Cemetery,³¹ m. BENJAMIN CURTIS 3rd, son of Benjamin junr. and Phedima (Nichols) Curtis.³² Four sons: *Benjamin B, George, Charles and Philo*; seven daughters: *Phedima; Ann, m. Zera Blackman; Maria, Amelia, Polly, Sarah and Eliza*.³³
- iv. UNNAMED DAUGHTER BENNETT, b. and d. June 6, 1784, lived four hours.
- v. JERUSHA BENNETT, b. 26 Dec 1786, d. 18 Nov 1826, age 40, buried Bennett Cemetery.³⁴
- vi. ABEL BENNETT, b. 28 Sep 1789, d. 22 July 1860, age 76 years [*sic*],³⁵ m. BETSEY A. SMITH, daughter of Levi.³⁶ Abel and Betsey are both buried in Newtown Village Cemetery. Abel did not receive any bequest from his father's estate because "I have already given him his share in my estimation."³⁷
- vii. JAMES WHEELER BENNETT, b. 28 July 1791, d. 23 Nov 1826, m. MARY ANN (___?), both buried in Bennett Cemetery. Three children definitely identified: *Ann Jerusha*, died at age four in 1827 and is buried with her parents;³⁸ and two children identified in Abel's probate: *William S. Bennett* and *Mary Ann Bennett*.

Bennett Perry of Newtown, Connecticut, in 1790

BENNETT PERRY was born in Woodbury on 29 December 1755, son of Dr. Joseph and Ruth (Preston) Perry.² He died in Newtown 26 November 1821,³ age 66, and is buried in Newtown Village Cemetery.⁴

Bennett Perry married **SARAH "SALLY" BEERS** on 9 October 1777.⁵ She was born in Woodbury 17 September 1753, daughter of Daniel and Phebe (Walker) Beers.⁶ At some point, presumably after Bennett's death, Sally joined her daughter Sylvia's household.⁷ Sally died at New Haven 05 May 1832, age 80, and is buried in Grove Street Cemetery in New Haven.⁸

Bennett Perry was a physician having trained under his father. He settled in Newtown as early as September, 1783, when he took the Oath of Fidelity there.⁹ He followed this up in 1784 by taking the Freeman's Oath.¹⁰ Dr. Perry served as one of the town physicians during the same era as two other physicians: Dr. Gideon Shepard, who later turned his practice over to Dr. Perry, and Dr. Oliver Bancroft. Later, Newtown physician Dr. Cyrenius H. Booth received part of his training under Dr. Perry.¹¹

Dr. Perry resided on what is now Main Street in Newtown. He started a hotel in his residence in 1819. After his death, his house was sold to Sallu Pell Barnum, and it later became Dick's Hotel.¹² That lot is now the site of the Cyrenius H. Booth Library.¹³ Bennett Perry's brother Rev.

Philo Perry was the minister at Trinity Episcopal Church from 1787 through 1798,¹⁴ and in 1789, Bennett contributed 3 shillings to the subscription to support Bishop Seabury.¹⁵ Bennet Perry was also a Free Mason. In 1791 he was appointed First Senior Warden of the Hiram Lodge in Newtown, and the meetings were held at his house from 1797 to 1818. Dr. Perry served as a town selectman in 1793.¹⁶

Members of the household in 1790: The adult male is Bennett. The three males under sixteen are his sons Joseph, age 12, Herman, age 8, and Nathaniel, age 2. Three of the four females are his wife, Sally, and his daughters Polly, age 10, and Betsey, age 7. The fourth is undetermined, unless it was an incorrect enumeration of baby Sally.¹⁷

Children of Bennett and Sally, all births recorded in Newtown¹⁸:

- i. JOSEPH PERRY, b. 13 Aug 1778; d. New Haven 13 Dec 1829;¹⁹ m. Abigail Beers, daughter of Andrew and Sarah (Gunn) Beers. One daughter and one son.²⁰
- ii. MARY "POLLY" PERRY, b. 12 Apr 1780; d. Brooklyn, Kings, New York, 21 Mar 1850,²¹ bur. Grove Street Cemetery, New Haven;²² m. Asa Chapman in Newtown 02 Sep 1798. Four children.²³
- iii. HERMAN PERRY, b. 16 Jan 1782; d. 30 Oct 1811, bur. in Newtown Village Cemetery;²⁴ m. Orphia Shepard, daughter of Moses and Sarah (Birch) Shepard. Herman and Orphia had one daughter. After Herman's death, Orphia married Garry Bacon and had three more daughters.²⁵ She is buried in South Cemetery, Woodbury.²⁶

Finding Parents for Daniel Bennett (d. 1877) of Ridgefield

Harlan R. Jessup

Daniel Bennett, who died 14 Jun 1877 in Ridgefield, was known to have one son, Charles Bennett, and one grandson, Charles H. Bennett. Daniel's parents were not known, however. This article proposes that he was a son of Trowbridge⁶ and Sarah (Hine) Bennett and, through them, a descendant of the immigrant James¹ Bennett.¹

No birth record is found for Daniel Bennett though both his own death record and the birth record of his son Charles give Ridgefield as Daniel's birthplace. We surmised that he might be a son of Trowbridge Bennett, named for Trowbridge's father, an earlier Daniel. There are no Connecticut probate records for Trowbridge Bennett, his wife Sarah, his father Daniel, or his son Josiah, which might prove these relationships. However, a series of quitclaim deeds exchanged among this Daniel and known children of Trowbridge (his proposed siblings) in Ridgefield shows a close relationship of Daniel with the family of Trowbridge Bennett.

A brief chronology summarizes the Ridgefield vital and land records pertaining to this Bennett family:

- 20 Aug 1767 Trowbridge Bennett marries Sarah Hine.² They have four recorded children: Josiah (1768), Daniel (1771), Sarah "Sally" (1777) and Polly (1788).³
- 08 Mar 1789 Josiah Bennett, oldest son of Trowbridge and Sarah, marries Rachel Osborn.⁴
- 22 Aug 1793 Daniel Bennett, 22, dies, presumably the son of Trowbridge and Sarah born in 1771.⁵
- 14 Aug 1794 Another Daniel Bennett is born, but his birth is not recorded. He is presumably the namesake of the Daniel who died the previous year.⁶
- 02 Apr 1795 Trowbridge and Sarah Bennett quitclaim Sarah's rights to the land of her father Josiah Hine to Josiah Bennett (their son).⁷
- 04 Sep 1804 Trowbridge Bennett dies.⁸
- 10 Feb 1807 Sarah Bennett quitclaims land with dwelling house from her father's estate to her two married daughters, Sally Olmsted and Polly Abbott.⁹
- 17 Apr 1818 Lewis and Sarah Olmsted quitclaim a 9-acre plot to Daniel Bennett (who by now is age 23).¹⁰
- 09 Nov 1824 Isaac and Polly Abbott of Wilton quitclaim her rights in her mother's dwelling house to Daniel Bennett.¹¹

- 07 Mar 1825 In two quitclaim deeds Daniel Bennett exchanges rights in parcels of land with Lewis and Sarah Olmsted, now of Delaware County, N. Y.¹²
- 17 Jun 1837 Josiah Bennett quitclaims a small parcel near the family homestead to Daniel Bennett.¹³

The indexes to Ridgefield deeds in this period are not easy to interpret, and these may not be all of the relevant deeds. Except for Sarah's deed to her daughters, none of the deeds specifically states a relationship, but such quitclaims generally imply that there is a shared inheritance.

Who were Daniel's parents?

Given that Daniel was, therefore, closely related to this family, his father could be either Trowbridge or Josiah. However, no male under age ten appears in the household of either man on the 1800 census.¹⁴ A study of the other Bennett households in Ridgefield on this census, and a comparison of birth records for males 1790-1800 to this census, did not reveal a stray Bennett boy. Errors in the age categories for Trowbridge and Josiah cast doubt on the accuracy of the enumeration. In any case, the 1800 census does not help to identify Daniel Bennett's parents.

The most straightforward interpretation of the quitclaim deeds evidence is that Daniel was a son of Trowbridge and Sarah and was named for the elder brother who died a year before his birth. Though Josiah was old enough to be his father, the exchanges of property, including one between Josiah and Daniel, indicates Daniel was a sibling, not a nephew or son, of the known children. Their mother Sarah was likely in her mid-forties when Daniel was born, but not too old for childbirth.

Extending the Bennett genealogy

Our positioning of Daniel as a son of Trowbridge permits us to carry forward the line of Trowbridge⁶ Bennett an additional four generations in the following genealogical summary.

The preceding article in this issue identifies Edith, wife of Charles H. Bennett, as a daughter of Henry Benedict. This summary of her immediate family identifies her grandfather "Harvey" as John Harvey⁷ Benedict whose wife, Jane A. Benedict, was his first cousin. Their fathers, Joseph⁶ and Benjamin⁶ Benedict, were the twin sons of Jesse⁵ and descended from the immigrant Thomas¹ Benedict.

The 1870 *Genealogy of the Benedicts in America* gives a rather complete and quite accurate picture of the family. The detailed account of the first immigrant, Thomas Benedict, is especially interesting.¹

The description of the family by Donald L. Jacobus in *Families of Old Fairfield* is much briefer. It confirms the first three generations of the family, but note that it gives John³ a first wife, Anna St. John, who may be the mother of some of his children including Matthew, rather than the Mary (___?___) (perhaps Haite or Hoyt) named in the Benedict genealogy.²

New Canaan Congregational Church Records, volume 1A: Bill of Mortality, 1806-1853

A volume of Congregational church records from New Canaan has recently been rediscovered at the Connecticut State Library. The volume is not microfilmed and the contents of the volume are not indexed at the Connecticut State Library. Some of the records from this register were included in a history of the New Canaan church published in 1935 commemorating the bicentennial of its founding but they are not indexed in that book. They are not included in the Barbour Collection.¹

The following article is Part 1 of a transcription of the Bill of Mortality. The rest of the list will be published in May and the full list will be indexed in May as well. The list was begun by Rev. William B. Bonney in 1808 and continued by a successor beginning in 1831. The list ends in September, 1853. Many of the records provide relationships to other people in town. Some include a cause of death. Some indicate that the deceased person was African-American. Some of the people are apparently not permanent town residents (e.g., "Theodore Schoedde, a lad at Wid. Richards.") Some give a history of the deceased—birth, marriage and death dates, date of joining the church.

Scores of deaths occurred in those four decades. Read in chronological order, this bill of mortality provide us with a history of the diseases that caused grief in New Canaan. In some cases we see several young children in a single family dying in a short span of time. Some gruesome deaths were reported like the two children of Stephen J. Miller "killed by their father in a state of insanity." There were a surprising number of suicides and a number of people died from "intemperance." Three infants "all born at one birth" died, presumably triplets born prematurely. The oldest person recorded was Mercy Tuttle, 102.

How the transcription was done:

The columns are: Page Number (p) in the original volume, Yr (year), Mo (month), D (day) (date of death), Given Name, Surname, Relationships, Age, Cause (of death), CM (chh indicates church membership), and Additional Notes. Not every person had age, cause, relationships or notes and most were not members of the church.

A surname was presumed in some cases where it was not directly provided (e.g., "Mary, widow of George Smith" was transcribed as Mary Smith, widow of George Smith.

"Wife of George Smith" was written as Female Smith, wife of George Smith.

"Daughter of George Smith" was written as Female Smith, daughter of George Smith.

"Son of George Smith" was written as Male Smith, son of George Smith.

"Mary Smith, wife of George" was written just that way without adding a surname for George.

Sometimes a husband or father's surname was abbreviated, even as short as an initial. That rendering was not changed. (e.g., William Benedict, son of Trowbridge B.)

Some dates were missing and month only was provided.

Researchers are encouraged to consult this resource directly to rectify possible errors in transcription.

Fairfield County Delegates to the 1818 Constitutional Convention

In 1818 Connecticut adopted a new state constitution, which would serve with some amendments until the current constitution of 1965. The 1818 constitution was prompted by the Election Sermon given by the Rev. Harry Crosswell, Rector of Trinity Church on the Green in New Haven, who had been chosen for this event by Governor Oliver Wolcott, Jr. Rather than the expected triumphant politics, Crosswell's sermon strongly insisted on the total separation of church and state. Such separation would disestablish the Congregational Church in Connecticut.

The General Assembly responded first by establishing voting rights for all white males who paid taxes or served in the militia, eliminating property requirements. It then called for a constitutional convention and voted that a simple majority of the legislature would be required to approve any new constitution. This motion carried by one vote with 81 in favor and 80 opposed.

Each town was represented in the constitutional convention by the number of seats held in the Assembly, then two seats for the established towns and one for those formed after 1800. The one-seat towns in Fairfield County included Brookfield, New Canaan, New Fairfield, Sherman, Trumbull, and Wilton, while Easton, Monroe, and Westport had not yet been formed.

Delegates to the convention from Fairfield County are listed in the Journal of the Constitutional Convention [*Public Records of the State of Connecticut*, vol. XIX, pp. 142-148].

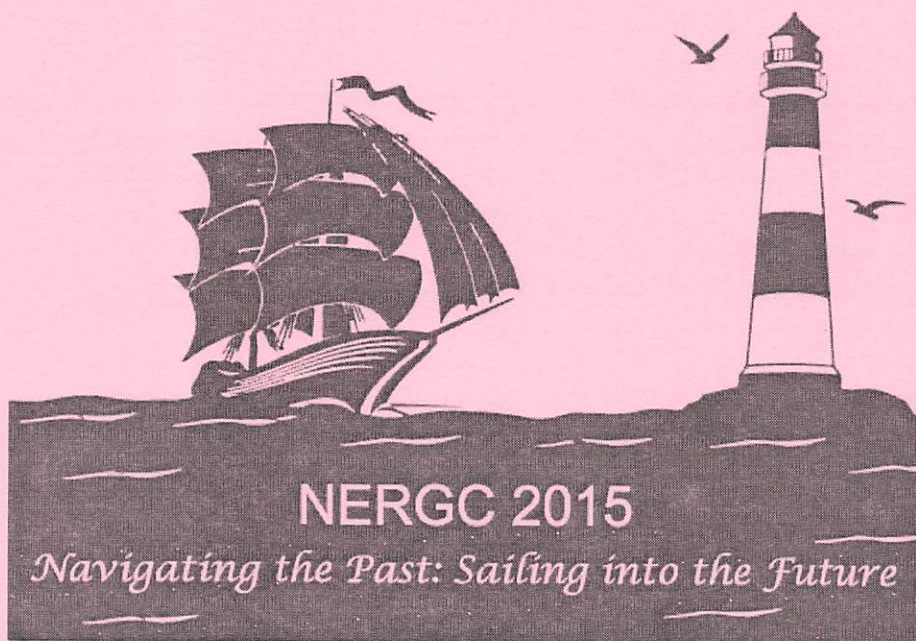

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Treasurer/Membership/Sales Chair

The **treasurer** receives deposits made by the Asst. Treasurer or Paypal, writes checks for various expenses, submits (very simplified) government filings, sends donation thank you letters each January, and reports on those activities to the Board and to the membership at the annual meeting.

The **membership** chair maintains a membership database, prints and mails membership cards based on deposits received from the treasurer, solicits membership renewals, provides mailing lists for the quarterly journal and monthly eNews, and reports on membership numbers to the board.

The **sales** chair obtains back issues and product from the librarian, packages and mails product based on orders received from the treasurer using Paypal to print labels, and reports on activity to the board.

Recently these positions have been combined as a single position because of overlap of activity, though they could be separated. The treasurer must be able to attend our meetings which are held in Fairfield County. The sales chair needs to live in or near Fairfield County where our inventory is kept. Membership work could be done remotely.

Webmaster

The webmaster maintains the organization's presence on the internet, including general email addresses, public webspace of general genealogical service to all, and private content in a password-protected members-only area. Currently the programming is managed by the service provider so content is a point-and-click environment (typing in text or selecting files to upload) with the exception of uploading Paypal-generated web code for the shopping cart (really, just copy/paste from Paypal). There is also a Facebook page that is currently maintained in parallel for announcements and public interaction. This position can be done by a member who is not local to Connecticut.

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The vice president defines the agenda and runs the public or board meetings in the absence of the president. The person who holds this position must be able to attend our meetings which are held in Fairfield County.

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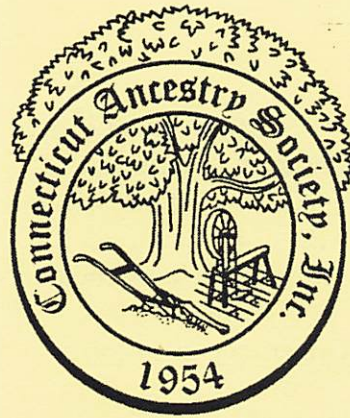
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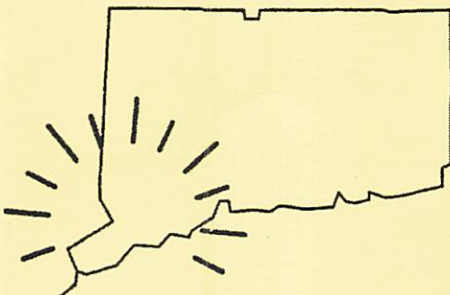

Family of Israel Frederick and Nancy (CONNOR) WENZEL of Newtown
Harlan R. Jessup

Israel Frederick Wenzel and Nancy Connor married in Danbury, Connecticut, in September, 1851, in one of several marriages between the few Germans and the numerous Irish who had immigrated to Connecticut. Frederick reported being in Orange, New Jersey, in 1848 and in Newtown, Connecticut, by 1850. Neither Frederick nor Nancy has been found in the federal census of 1850.

Note the tragic deaths by diphtheria of three children of their daughter Mary Louise (Wenzel) Shepard at two-day intervals in September 1887 and the accidental deaths just one year apart in 1888 and 1889 of two young sons of another daughter Lilliett (Wenzel) Schumacher. In the genealogy below, data that do not have source citations came from family records.

First Generation

1. Israel Frederick WENZEL, b. nr. Stuttgart, Württemberg, 11 Oct 1830, son of William and (___?___) Wenzel. He died at Newtown, Connecticut, 29 May 1881, æ 50 years, 8 months, 18 days, of lead poisoning.¹ He married at Danbury on 14 Sep 1851 **Nancy CONNOR / O'CONNOR**.² She was born in County Clare, Ireland, about 1833 and died at Newtown on 17 Feb 1893 of heart disease.³ Both are buried in Sandy Hook Cemetery, Newtown.⁴ Like other Germans of the period, Frederick was generally known by his second baptismal name.

Frederick Wenzel learned the hatter's trade with John Davison at Orange, New Jersey, beginning about 1848. He moved to the Sandy Hook section of Newtown in 1850.⁵ He has not been found either in New Jersey or Connecticut in the 1850 census, but a John Davidson, age 25, hatter, is found in Orange on that census.

Frederick, wife Nancy and their several children, appear in several census records of Newtown.⁶ In each record he is reported as born in Württemberg and Nancy born in Ireland. In 1860 Frederick was a farm laborer. In both 1870 and 1880 he was working in the "Rubber Factory," that is the New York Belting & Packing Co., which employed a large number of mostly Irish immigrants in their mills along the Pootatuck River. Otherwise known as Frederick, he is listed as "Israel F. Wintzell" in the 1870 census. He is not listed in any Newtown deeds.

Frederick enlisted as a soldier of the Civil War on 11 Feb 1864, serving in Company F of the 8th Connecticut Volunteers, and was discharged on 12 Dec 1865. On 07 March 1878 he filed application for an invalid pension based on his Civil War service and a disabling disease of the

eyes. He testified that he caught cold in April, 1864, which led to inflammation of the eyes. He was hospitalized at Portsmouth, Virginia, and was subsequently transferred to Chestnut Hill Hospital, Philadelphia, later returning to duty.⁷

The application was rejected based on testimony of two pre-war coworkers in a hatting shop in Sandy Hook. They stated that Frederick then had defective vision such that he "could not detect lumps in the fur." This was countered by testimony of many former acquaintances. One petition signed by 64 Newtown residents stated that they had never known him to have difficulty with his eyes before the war. Others testified to the disabling effect of his later defect, which prevented his working in the hatting industry at \$3 to \$5 per day, requiring him to perform menial labor in the rubber factory at \$1.44 per day. Though his own petition was never accepted, his widow Nancy applied for and received a pension of \$8 per month from 30 July 1890 until her death in 1893.
