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President's Message

When I took over the presidency again in September of 1985, I made two promises to the Society's members:

1. Numerous marriage repertories on Library shelves, receiving heavy usage from member patrons, would need to be rebound in sturdier covers to ensure their increased longevity as valuable research tools.
2. An effort would be made to find larger and more suitable facilities elsewhere for our Research Center.

As of this writing, a total of 85 volumes of marriage repertories and other reference works have already been returned to our Library--all sporting handsome new covers at a cost that was extremely reasonable. Additional volumes are in the process of being rebound. This sizable but necessary book renewal project will continue until all of our reference works are hardbound.

I'm hopeful of being able to announce at our June 7 Society meeting that FCGSC will soon occupy spacious new quarters in a community not far from Hartford. More on that important topic later.

As a result of the aforementioned activities, my own hobby of French medieval genealogy has had to temporarily take a "back seat" to more pressing Society business. But I'll soon be back to work in that historical area of special interest!

The plan to recruit resident genealogy researchers in every Connecticut city and town is off and running. Society volunteers now cover four areas of the Nutmeg State. We're adding a Geographical Index of Connecticut Researchers to our Library services roster.

A Beginners Course in Genealogy--comprising seven sessions in all--is scheduled to get underway this Fall and continue through the Winter months. It will include the following topics of study: HOW TO UNDERSTAND, AND EXTRACT INFORMATION FROM, MARRIAGE REPERTORIES AND OTHER REFERENCE WORKS...WHERE TO SEARCH FOR FRANCO-ORIENTED HISTORICAL DATA...HOW CANADIAN NOTARIAL AND MARRIAGE RECORDS (INCLUDING INDIAN MARRIAGE CONTRACTS) CAN PROVIDE VALUABLE INFORMATION...CLOSE-UP LOOK AT PALEOGRAPHY (deciphering handwritten 16th, 17th, and 18th century French legal documents)...HOW TO PREPARE A GENEALOGICAL RECORD FILE.

Non-members are welcome to attend this instructive Beginners Course but will be charged a nominal fee of \$5.00 for each of the seven classes.

The annual election of Society officers and directors (to take office in September) will be held at the June 7 meeting. I'll be seeking reelection myself for another term at the helm of FCGSC. I don't mind admitting that 1987 will be a year to which I'm looking forward. It'll be one of exciting promise for our organization!

The Society continues to grow in terms of numbers of members and increased Library holdings. We're examining the possibility of conducting a

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membership recruiting campaign this Fall in various media. At that time, we'd like to count on your assistance in promoting FCGSC research facilities to your Franco friends. We'll keep you posted in regard to that proposed membership drive.

I trust that each one of you will have a very pleasant summer of 1986. Enjoy your vacation!

Saturday, January 25, 1986 - Our first meeting this year again took place at the impressively designed South Windsor Public Library. The scheduled film, "They Called Us," an English-language version of a French-Canadian production entitled, Les Filles du Roy (Daughters of the King), proved very disappointing.

The Society subsequently sent a letter to the National Film Board of Canada in protest against its inaccurate film catalog synopsis which misled us concerning the movie's contents. SEVEN CENTURIES OF AMIRAULT FAMILY HISTORY

NOTE: The following article first appeared in the May 1984 issue of L'ANCÊTRE, member publication of the Société de Généalogie de Québec. Originally written in French by Monsieur Cregheur, he kindly granted us permission to republish this English version in CML.

Amirault Origins

The Amirault name is unique for the reason that it originated in 13th century France at a time when most Frenchmen didn't even have surnames. Derived from the Arabic word "emir," Amirault is a noun meaning military commander. It passed into general usage to describe a native ruler in parts of Asia and North Africa. The "ault" suffix in Amirault denotes "small" and is common to the Middle Loire region of north central France. In effect, Amirault is an occupational surname meaning "little chief."

The patronym Amirault or L'Amirault first appeared in the city of Orleans--a community along the Loire River some 200 miles east of the English Channel ports--that became a favored second residence of French monarchs. There a lowly serf was set free in March of the year 1224 by his master, Abbot Franco Saint-Mesmin de Micy, and took for himself the name Laurent Li Amiraut.

The Charter of Cartulaire CLXXV provides a listing of male and female serfs plus the dates of their liberation. Since most serfs were middle-aged by the time they gained their freedom, we can assume that Laurent was at least 60 years old in 1224 and, therefore, was born around 1160.

The last page of this article contains Table I of Armorial Général de France (General List of Coats of Arms of France), by d'Hozier, and outlines the first genealogical degree of kinship for the Amirault/L'Amirault family. It describes the ties existing between the two primary family branches. The older line that remained in Orleans assumed the surname L'Amirault while the younger branch settled in the ancient province of Anjou, some 60 miles west, and dropped the definite article "L'" (The) before their name.

Descendants of Laurent Amirault who later sailed across the seas to the colony of Acadia in New France were offspring of Olivier Amirault (1450-1520), royal sergeant at Saumur and Bourgeil (see Item A on Table I). This branch of the family established itself in the communities of Bourgeil, Chignon, Saumur, and Tours--not too distant from Orleans.

Members of this particular Amirault clan were employed in diverse occupations: merchant-tanners, farmers working their ancestral lands, and magisterial officials that included clerks, notary-solicitors, sergeants-at-

arms, lawyers, tax agents, municipal officers, judges, etc.

In terms of social position, the 16th and 17th centuries saw the family entrenched in the prosperous and fertile provinces of Orleanais, Touraine, Anjou, and Poitou--regions of France that attracted the privileged classes that constituted the nation's royalty and nobility.

Acadia

On the instructions of Jean-Baptiste Colbert, the most influential of King Louis XIV's ministers, the vessel L'Oranger left the west coast port of LaRochele in 1671 bound for New France. Among the 50 new settlers enroute to the colony of Acadia, the passenger list contains the names of Amirault dit Tourangeau, Arsenault, Barriault, Benoit, Brossard, Doiron, Garaut, Le Prince, and Levron dit Nantais.

Francois Amirault dit Tourangeau owed his curious nickname to the fact that he came from Tours, capitol of Touraine Province. He was the only Amirault to become an Acadian colonist. We know very little about his actual age. According to the Acadian Archives at Moncton, New Brunswick, Canada, Francois was born circa 1664. Yet the 1686 Acadian Census lists him as 42 years old, or born in 1642. To further confuse matters, the 1693 Census established Francois' age as 38, or born in 1655, while the 1708 Census backs up the 1686 Census in stating that he was 66, born in 1642.

Port Royal Settlement

Thirteen years after arriving at the Port Royal settlement (later renamed Annapolis Royal by the English), Francois Amirault married 18-year-old Marie Pitre in 1684. Eldest daughter of Jean Pitre-Pieter dit Beneque, a toolmaker of Flemish origin, and Marie Pesselet-Pesseley, the young bride was born in 1666. She had previously inherited the seigneurie of Pobomcoup, which came to her through her grandmother, Barbe Bajol-Bajolet. The Pietre family was among the early settlers of Port Royal and Marie's parents married there about 1664.

It was, therefore, to Pobomcoup--which included the southern point of the Acadian Peninsula, that Francois and Marie Amirault would later move. There the couple lived for 35 years with their large family. The first two Amirault children were born in Port Royal: Marie in 1685 and Francois in 1687. By 1688 the family was residing at Cap Sable where a son, Joseph, was born on 8 December 1689. A fourth child, Anne, was born there on 14 December 1691.

Two additional Amirault births were recorded at Port Razoir, a settlement about 37 miles from Cap Sable: Jeanne, born on 16 November 1694, and Madeleine, who arrived on 14 March 1697. Their five remaining children were born at Baccaro, about 19 miles distant from Cap Sable. These were Pierre (9 May 1699), Charles (14 June 1700), Jacques (31 July 1702), Marguerite (1704), and Elisabeth-Isabelle (1709).

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The English Menace

Like other Acadians of his time, Francois Amirault earned a livelihood by farming part-time but the bulk of his income came from fishing the waters of the Atlantic. Fish were so abundant in the Cap Sable area that the site attracted English fishermen who journeyed there from the New England colonies to catch tons of fish which they sold in the American colonies along the Atlantic seaboard.

The native Micmac Indians as well as Acadian colonists frowned upon this pillaging of their coastal waters by English/American fishermen. To thwart the interlopers, Francois Amirault and his son-in-law, Joseph Mius D'Entremont, were put in command of an armed party comprising 100 Micmac warriors.

They so convinced an American fishing boat captain, named Southack, of their serious intentions--by capturing his fleet of vessels--that he invited them to accompany him to Boston in Massachusetts Colony. There they could present their case before the English royal governor. All went well in one respect, for Francois and his companions returned safely to Acadia.

Captain Southack also learned to respect Amirault's talents as a coastal pilot. While battling rough seas on 23 September 1721, he asked Francois to pilot his ship, the William Augustus, toward Cap Sable and they sailed into Pobomcoup Harbor without trouble on 28 September.

End of an Era

Francois settled in 1725 with his family at Cobequid where they lived peacefully in a cabin constructed from tree trunks, squared by an axe, in which mud and peat were used for mortar.

In 1737, the year of his death, Amirault followed the French custom of selling his lands at Cap Sable to his children as indicated in the following deed:

"I confess and declare to have received from Lord Nicolas Gautier the sum of one-hundred Francs which he paid me for the land which I sold to my children at Cap Sable of which I am discharged and give receipt in Cobequities. This fifteenth of April One Thousand Seven Hundred Thirty-Seven."

(Marked with an X)

Francois AMIRAULT

"I certify that I have received the contents mentioned above and the sum of one hundred Francs for which I have signed."

Signed in Bacaros this 16 June 1737

/s/ Nicolas Gautier

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Descendants

Here are the marriages of the children of Francois and Marie (Pitre) Amirault:

1. Marie; married 1) at Pobomcoup around 1700 to Joseph Mius D'Entremont, son of Abraham and Marguerite (La Tour) Mius D'Entremont. Marie married 2) at Port Royal on 21 May 1731 to Jean Benoit, widower of Anne Brault.

2. Joseph; married at Port Royal on 31 July 1718 to Marguerite Lord, daughter of Julien and Anne-Charlotte (Girouard) Lord.

3. Anne; married at Port Royal on 12 January 1717 to Jacques Leger-Larosette, son of Jacques and Marguerite (Gauterot) Leger-Larosette.

4. Francois; married at Port Royal on 16 January 1714 to Magdeleine Lord, daughter of Julien and Anne-Charlotte (Girouard) Lord.

5. Jeanne; married at Port Royal on 26 November 1725 to Jacques Girouard, son of Jacques and Marguerite (Gauterot) Girouard.

6. Magdeleine; married at Port Royal on 3 October 1719 to Jean Commeau, son of Pierre and Jeanne (Bourg) Commeau.

7. Pierre; married at Port Royal on 8 July 1726 to Anne Brun, daughter of Abraham and Anne (Pellerin) Brun.

8. Charles; married at Port Royal on 28 August 1726 to Claire Dugast, daughter of Claude and Marguerite (Bourg) Dugast.

9. Jacques; married at Port Royal on 24 August 1726 to Jeanne Lord, daughter of Alexandre and France (Barillot) Lord.

10. Marguerite; married at Port Royal on 30 September 1723 to Jacques Mius D'Entremont, son of Jacques and Anne (de LaTour) Mius D'Entremont.

11. Elisabeth-Isabelle; married Antoine Aucoin. No trace has been found of Elisabeth in Acadian records apart from the notation of her journey to France on 23 January 1759 aboard one of the five vessels which made that Atlantic crossing: the Yarmouth, Patience, Mathias, Restoration, and John Samuel.

Born in 1709, she could only have been the daughter of Francois and Marie Amirault, since her parents' first son didn't marry until 1714. On arriving in France, already the widow of Antoine Aucoin, she was accompanied by two sons (the eldest of whom was listed as 27 years old) plus two daughters. Another daughter had been lost at sea when only 10 years old. Elisabeth died at the Channel coast village of St. Enocat (St. Malo District) at the age of 57.

Exile

When in 1755 the English began deporting those French colonists living in Port Royal, the families of Joseph and Francois Amirault--first and second sons of Francois and Marie (Pitre) Amirault--were sent off to the American colony of Connecticut, where they resided for 12 years. Unfortunately, we know very little about their stay in exile.

Charles and Jacques Amirault--fifth and sixth sons of Francois and Marie--were apparently captured in their beds by English troops under command of a Colonel Preble. He and his force of 167 men debarked from the vessel--aptly named Vulture--on 21 April 1756 at Baccaro Passage.

Evidently, the English first visited the homes of the Amiraults and Mius D'Entremont, located in Buttes de Sable (and later renamed Villagedale by the English). Charles de la Tour had constructed a fort here, called Saint Louis, 125 years earlier. The English burned a total of 44 buildings, herded the bewildered French families aboard their ship, then set sail for Massachusetts Colony.

Jacques Amirault, his wife Jeanne, and seven children debarked at Marblehead, Massachusetts, but lived there only a short time inasmuch as they experienced difficulty in finding suitable quarters in which to live. They went next to Boston in search of Charles Amirault and his family and resided there for the next 10 years.

A decade passed before these Amiraults were again able to set foot, in August of 1766, on the soil of Acadia at Cap Sable. Some descendants of Jacques Amirault still live at Yarmouth, Nova Scotia. Charles and Claire Amirault, who had only daughters, left no descendants bearing the family surname.

As for the Connecticut deportees--Joseph and Marguerite Amirault plus Francois and Marguerite Amirault--they arrived at L'Assomption, Quebec, together with their married and unmarried children, in 1767. Thirty-five other Acadian families accompanied them on their trek.

Some time later, this same group of Acadians settled at St. Jacques-l'Achigan in Montcalm County. All of the Mirault/Mireault/Amirault families in Quebec descend from that branch.

Amirault Longevity

The 11 children of Francois and Marie Amirault all lived to reach the age of majority, married, and left descendants. They must, therefore, have been blessed with good health in order to survive the difficult conditions of life experienced by Canadian colonists during the 17th century, not to mention the trying ordeal of deportation far from home in disease-infested vessels to the English colonies. Infant mortality rates in that period were also very high.

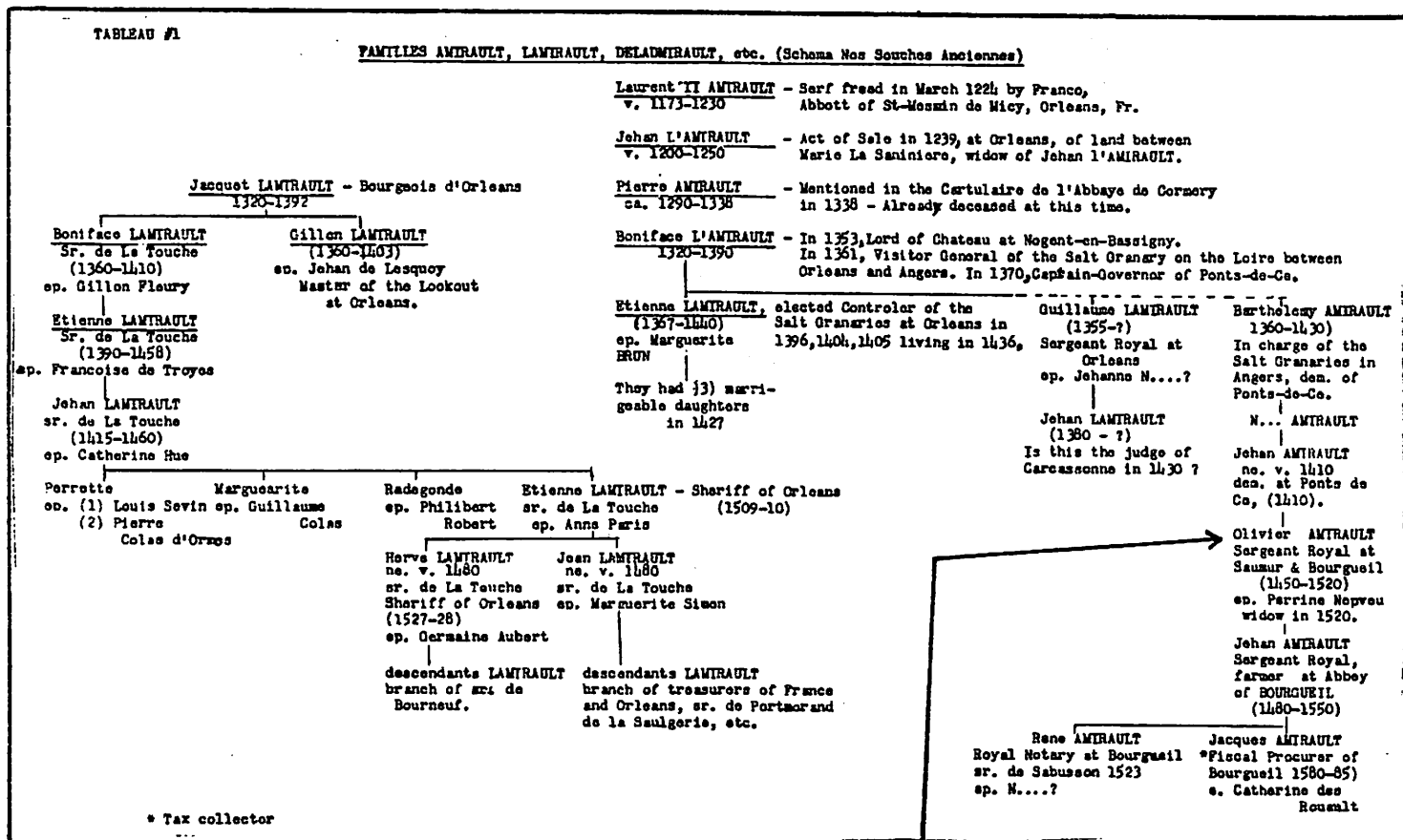
Conclusion

Those valiant Acadians who put so much effort into building their colony also discovered that more than courage and determination were needed. In the wake of their deportation, these Frenchmen developed an unconditional faith and love for their land that enabled them to return from forced exile more numerous and stronger than before.

For these reasons, every descendant of Francois and Marie (Pitre) Amirault can feel justly proud of their Acadian origin. Theirs is a heritage all the more remarkable thanks to the courage, willingness to sacrifice, and great love of family that Francois, Marie, and their children demonstrated so forcefully in the course of their North American sojourn.

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SERVICE RECORDS OF FRANCO WORLD WAR I VETERANS FROM CONNECTICUT

Military records are a rich source of genealogical information. Service Records of Connecticut Men and Women in the Armed Forces of the United States During World War I; 1917-20 is such a document. This three-volume roster, complete with surnames index, was prepared and published by the Connecticut Adjutant General's Office around 1941.

Copies of the invaluable reference work were distributed to the Secretary of the State, Connecticut State Library, Commissioner of Public Welfare, each town clerk, state veterans organizations, various U.S. military offices, U.S. Library of Congress, Adjutant General of each state and territory, and to public libraries and most college libraries within Connecticut.

With the permission of Mr. Ciccio Savino, Historian for the Connecticut State Armory, and the kind assistance of his secretary, Mrs. Anita Dionne, an abbreviated 18-page extract--covering the names Calvin S. Albee thru Camille C. Devaux--appeared in the December 1985 issue of CML.

This June edition contains an abbreviated extract of veterans' names, arranged alphabetically, from Charles A. Devaux to Clarence T. Mallett. Additional extracts will appear in subsequent issues of CONNECTICUT MAPLE LEAF. Our second installment contains:

- a. Full name of each individual;
- b. Place where indicted or enlisted;
- c. Branch of service; viz.,
 - 1) AGD = Adjutant General's Department
 - 2) CHAP = Chaplain
 - 3) DC = Dental Corps
 - 4) ERC = Enlisted Reserve Corps
 - 5) FA = Field Artillery
 - 6) FMRC = Fleet Marine Corps Reserve
 - 7) MC = Medical Corps
 - 8) MERC = Medical Enlisted Reserve Corps
 - 9) NA = National Army (draftee forerunner of WW II's Army of the United States)
 - 10) NG = National Guard
 - 11) NURSE = Nurse Corps
 - 12) ORC = Officers Reserve Corps (non-regular officers)
 - 13) QMC = Quartermaster Corps
 - 14) RA - Regular Army
 - 15) USCG - United States Coast Guard

- 16) USMC = United States Marine Corps
- 17) USN = United States Navy
- 18) USNRF = United States Naval Reserve Forces

- d. Birthplace;
- e. Birth date or age at enlistment.

To demonstrate the scope of each original record, a photocopy of an actual roster page has been reproduced on the next page. Readers interested in referring to the initial work itself will discover that it provides much more pertinent data on individuals, viz.

- a. Service serial number of the person;
- b. Race;
- c. Home address;
- d. Individual service record data breakdown:
 - 1) "Ind" = Inducted. If so, the local draft board is listed; i.e., "LB 16," plus the board's locale.
 - 2) "Enl" = Enlisted, followed by place of enlistment.
 - 3) Unit assignments and date ("Mch 23/17" = March 23, 1917).
 - 4) Individual's rank at discharge.
 - 5) Campaigns in which the person served during the war.
 - 6) Medical history, if pertinent; viz., "WIA: = Wounded in Action, "KIA" = Killed in Action.

It should be mentioned that other states also printed similar rosters of men and women who served in the military forces during World War I.

I intended the single page sent to Mr. Lausier as background "introduction." But there was much more to the occasions, the one in Rhode Island, and another here in Stamford. So, to give your editor the "full story" to quote from, if he so wishes, here are several supplementary pages with more detail. You'll note that even Father Dennis Boudreau, editor of the Pawtucket, R.I., society's JE ME SOUVIENS, played quite a part, and we have since become good friends.

As a matter of fact, your publicity would be very helpful to my genealogical ambitions. Admittedly still a novice, having started from scratch only four years ago, it has been startling to learn, from the experts, that I appear to be the very first VARIEUR ever to get seriously involved in ancestor-search.

And I've done it the hard way--in time, effort, and expense. My greatest wish now is to share my findings, FREE, with as many serious VARIEURS as I can find, even those with but partial lineage, or by marriage. Then, there are the married VARIEUR women, now identified by God knows how many different surnames.

As you may know, there never was a VARIEUR ancestor. The real name was VERIEUL which, ironically, died with the ancestor or shortly thereafter when, for some strange reason, over 99% of the early Canadian descendants adopted the surname VEILLEUX.

For example, the voluminous 1982-83 Quebec City Area phone book lists 1-1/3 pages of VEILLEUX and not one single VERIEUL. I did not expect to find any VARIEUR, and there were none.

According to my findings, so far, it would appear that in our branch at least the name transition from VERIEUL to VERRIEUR and, finally, VARIEUR occurred in the early 1800s, and nearer Montreal, in the Richelieu district, I feel quite certain that several American VARIEURS started to search out their roots. But I fear that many impasses and "stonewalls" made most of them give up.

I would like to help, and I'm sure that "Maple Leaf" publicity would greatly assist, if FCGSC members would pass the word along to their non-member relative friends, and acquaintances the VARIEUR and VERIEUL names, or offshoots thereof.

My own ancestry Lignée. Many thanks, too, for offering to include my paternal and maternal ancestry. I herewith gladly enclose copies of my rough worksheets. But if it would be more practical, I can arrange to provide typewritten versions with less detail, similar to the copy attached of Rev. Father Dennis Boudreau's lineage (Je Me Souviens).

Also note that, maternally (LAURENCE), I proudly share ancestry-in-common with Frere Andre (Oratoire St. Joseph) and the historically controversial LOUIS RIEL. Incidentally, I have considerable material on him, and will gladly share .

Tom Laforest (LISI Press). Delighted to read, in the Jan. 8 newsletter, your recommendation of "Our French-Canadian Ancestors." Tom and I are pen-pals. Father Lebel (Shrine of Ste. Anne), author of NOS ANCETRES, has become a close friend of mine. I've contributed new findings on NICOLAS VERIEUL (VEILLEUX) for the current 3rd printing of Volume 1.

Dear Mr. Jack Valois:

Thanks for your kind letter of February 7th wherefrom it is a pleasure to learn that we share the distinction of "God's Country" origin in Lil Old Rhody. What a small world. I remember Moonsocket very pleasantly and very well. How and why would take pages to explain.

The elder of my five sisters, Mrs. Urbain Savaria, lived over 25 years at the Social Street end (of town) near Bellingham Four Courners. My closest cousin, Monsignor Corbeil, served over 12 years in Precious Blood Parish, and Mount Saint Charles was the giant "offshoot" of my Central Falls Sacred Heart Academy alma mater. I am still in fairly close rapport with 102-year-old Brother Adelard, whom I've known for almost 70 years.

It is quite a coincidence that we were both in Europe in 1950. That was to be the beginning, for me, of 23 years of "commutation," trans-Atlantic. In mid-November 1949, I was given a fortnight to transfer command in easy-going New England and take over a Manhattan Ivory Tower mess.

You may recall that 1950 was the first post-war Holy Year and also (saw) the first post-war Oberammergau Passion Play. Both of these events involved arrangements for tens of thousands of tourists emanating from North America--requiring added executive care and attention.

Despite occasional frustrations and many challenges, I fully agree that my career was replete with fascination. It was very fortunate that my spouse was able to accompany me quite often. Meanwhile, Rhode Island was "home base."

From 1950--between "dashes" off to Europe, Africa, the Orient, etc.--I lived in a New York hotel for four years of 15+ hours of office workdays and long R.I. weekends with my family. We finally "emigrated" from Pawtucket to settle in Stamford (when I was in the U.S.) during the spring of 1954 for 18 years of commuting to Grand Central. By request, I postponed retiring until 1972, at the age of 68.

It was interesting to read of your own background in advertising and PR. I enjoyed a close rapport with the Madison Avenue representatives for international navigation, aviation, and the hotel industry. Obviously, our interests were kindred. They taught me much.

I am flattered by your favorable reaction to my genealogical efforts. What started out as an avocation has really become a challenging obsession. It is sadly ironic, however, that my interest in roots evolved so late in life. I do not believe there ever was another single Franco-American who ever missed, as I did, the priceless genealogy help that could have been mine for

were asking, on the spot at that, and ages ago.

Way back in the early '30s (long before Hertz and Avis), our U.S. sales season of Europe travel waned around Labor Day. I annually ship-loaded my own (R.I.) car shortly thereafter, for a month or so of 3-4,000 self-drive miles abroad that always included my favorite French northwest. Purpose of trip: review the now closing season, adjust accounts, "negotiate" for the following year, and search out added touristic highlights to feature and promote.

What pleasant memories I have of frequently criss-crossing Upper Normandy, the Seine Valley, Joan of Arc's Rouen, Saint Theresa's Lisieux, the Calvaos coast, fashionable Deauville, the regal Trouville resorts, historic Mont St. Michel, etc. My favorite cross-channel carferry was Dieppe-Newhaven.

Known to represent the potential for sizable volumes of annual American tourist dollars, I was heartily welcomed and royally treated everywhere and especially because of my fluency in French. I was wine-d, dined, cajoled, and wooed by mayors, tourist boards, hotel groups, sightseeing contractors, etc. in area after area--each vying for top consideration. Bear in mind, that was generations ago--before World War II.

You can therefore appreciate my shocked surprise to learn, less than four years ago, shortly after my initial involvement with genealogy, that both of my European ancestors (paternal and maternal) were Normans! What unique opportunities I missed!

Now, my infirmity is post-retirement. Prior thereto, whenever time permitted, and while they still operated, my preference in trans-Atlantic travel was by ship, either arriving or departing from Cherbourg or Le Havre, both in Normandy.

Countless times I could have personally researched the archives. And prior thereto, since they were all currying favor, with plenty of free time during long winter off-seasons, I could easily have had mayors' offices, tourist boards, etc. gladly researching for me. But that's all "post mortem" now.

Factually, on my own, after three years of consistent efforts and dozens of letters, all I've succeeded in securing directly from Normandy so far are the ancestor's 1632 baptismal record and his mother's 1673 death registration. But I'm still at it.

You kindly mention the wish, in your letter, to include some of my personal background in your CML piece. As I mentioned in my letter to Mr. Carrier, I am flattered and very grateful to you both for your generous offer of publicity. I repeat that you have absolute "carte blanche" to use any part or all, data and letters that I've provided, for your article.

MISSIONARY LIFE FOR FOUR GOULETS/
A FAMILY OF RELIGIOUS

Missionary Life for Four Goulets

In the Rev. Albert Goulet's long research into his genealogical history, one story has captured his imagination. "I am impressed with the missionary spirit of the two White Fathers and two sisters of Ste. Ann--four children of my father's brother, Francois Goulet, and his wife, Celina Gagnon. These four religious spent their lives in distant mission fields," he says.

His two uncles, Amedee Goulet and Octave Goulet, served for many years as White Fathers in Africa. They used both French and English in their mission work, according to Father Goulet.

The White Fathers were a Catholic missionary society established in 1875 by Cardinal Lavigerie to serve initially in French North Africa, now known as Algeria. Engaged in parish and educational work in various African fields, members of the order wore Arab-type robes to protect them from the desert sun and to harmonize with local custom, according to Goulet.

Amedee was born on 25 March 1879 at Ste. Marguerite, Dorchester County, Quebec. While still a child in 1882, he emigrated to Holyoke, Mass., with his parents. There he attended Precious Blood Elementary School. During the years 1892-95, Amedee studied at Assumption College near Montreal. His ordination into the White Fathers took place on 29 June 1905 at Algiers, Algeria. Amedee served in Africa as a parish pastor with educational duties at the local Catholic school.

Amedee spent a furlough at Holyoke in 1924. At that time, the future Father Goulet was attending a Catholic high school in Hartford, Conn., and considering his own future. Amedee advised the young student's mother to send Albert to a French-Canadian college in Quebec so that he could more carefully make his decision about the priesthood.

Acting on his uncle's advice, young Goulet decided to study at the College de Levis and become a priest in the Springfield, Mass., area. He decided against becoming a missionary so that he could help support his parents in their old age.

Amedee died on 17 January 1957 at Entebbe, British East Africa, which became the country of Uganda, and is buried there. "He was a man of good judgment," Father Goulet remarked.

The other Goulet uncle, Octave, was born on 3 December 1881 at Ste. Germaine, Quebec. He emigrated as a small child to Holyoke, Mass., in October 1882 with his parents. Octave studied theology at Carthage, Tunisia, French North Africa, and ordained a priest of the White Fathers on 29 June 1911.

Octave was on furlough in Holyoke during 1927-28 when the young Albert Goulet got to know him. Only five feet tall and chubby, Octave was in great need of a motorcycle for his mission work. So Father Goulet's mother raised \$800 for the vehicle by arranging a series of home whist parties. A small, customized motorcycle was then ordered in England and Octave had it shipped to the Uganda mission. With his general pastoral duties in Mbarara, Uganda, Octave used the motorcycle to visit his widely scattered parishioners.

"He used to have to blow his motorcycle horn to scare away lions, leopards, and tigers met on his travels," Father Goulet relates. Octave died of cancer at age 61 in 1942 and is buried at Mbarara.

Francois and Celina Goulet also had two daughters who entered the order of the Sisters of Ste. Ann. Their names were Victoria and Anna. Victoria was born in 1876 at Ste. Marguerite, Quebec. She entered the convent, at age 19, in 1895. Two years later, Victoria made her religious profession as a nun of Ste. Ann at Lachine, Quebec.

Taking the name Sister Madeline du Sacre Coeur, she served for 25 years in missionary work in Alaska where she taught school, and also performed hospital work in Nome and Juneau. Victoria celebrated the golden jubilee of her profession at Lachine, Quebec, in 1947.

At that time, Father Goulet took her to see all her relatives in Quebec. The following year, he and his mother paid Victoria a surprise visit at Juneau. When the good sister heard the familiar voice of a relative addressing her in French, then spotted him in the living flesh, she almost fainted away on the spot.

Ten years later, Victoria celebrated her diamond jubilee at Lachine and came to Southbridge, Mass., for the funeral of Father Goulet's father. She celebrated in 1967 the 70th anniversary of her profession at Victoria, British Columbia, in the presence of the local bishop and with Father Goulet sitting in the audience. Victoria died at Victoria in 1968. "She was the longest-lived religious in the Goulet family," Father Goulet says.

Anna Goulet was born in 1877 at Ste. Marguerite, Quebec, and entered the convent of the Sisters of Ste. Ann in 1899. She made her profession in 1901 and took the name Sister Jeanne du Sacre Coeur. Anna served as a teacher in Nulato, Yukon Territory, Canada, for a number of years. She died in February 1907 and is buried in Victoria, British Columbia.

In reflecting on his Goulet religious relatives, Father Goulet observed: "These four individuals adapted easily to missionary life with its different customs and diverse weather conditions. Such adaptability is a gift of grace. Their mother tried unsuccessfully to enter the religious life;

four of her children became missionaries in her stead."

A Family of Religious

The four missionaries mentioned above--Fathers Octave and Amedee Goulet, Sisters Madeleine and Jeanne du Sacre Coeur--are not the only priests and nuns related to Rev. Albert Goulet of Southbridge. Altogether, there are eight religious in the family of Father Goulet.

Six of these relatives are sons and daughters of Caroline Goulet and Joseph Gagnon who were married in 1861. Those relatives are uncles and aunts of Father Goulet and his brother Ernest.

The family members were involved in such matters as teaching, parish ministry, church music, and nursing. A more distant family member with musical talents is Robert Goulet who starred in the hit musical "Camelot." Robert is a sixth cousin of the local priest-genealogist.

The six children of Caroline Goulet and Joseph Gagnon who entered religious vocations were Eugene, Octave, Placide, Adelard, Clotilde, and Anna Gagnon. Eugene was born at Ste. Marguerite, Quebec, on 8 November 1868. He entered the congregation of the Christian School Brothers and made his religious profession in 1896. His religious name was Brother Maixance Vital.

Eugene decided to become a religious brother after the father of the girl he planned to marry refused to accept him, according to Father Goulet. Brother Maixance's religious vocation was teaching in Catholic elementary schools in the province of Quebec. Eugene died on 2 Jul 1924 and is buried at Laval-des-Rapides.

Octave Gagnon was born 12 September 1874 at Ste. Marguerite, Quebec. After entering the congregation of Christian School Brothers in 1889, he took the name Brother Paul of Mary. Octave taught English at parochial schools throughout Quebec and died at Maissonneuve on 11 July 1901 where he is buried.

Father Goulet knows much more about Placide, who was born on 30 May 1880, and played an important role in the restoration of religious chants in Quebec. He spent 15 years with the Christian School Brothers after taking the name of Brother Claude.

Placide left this educational congregation in 1909 to begin further studies at the College de Levis. Ordained a priest by Bishop Roy on 19 April 1914, the new priest said his first Mass the following day at Ste. Marguerite with the future Father Goulet and his brother, Eugene, taking first communion.

As a diocesan priest, Placide had a special interest in Gregorian chants. Cardinal Begin sent him to the Gregorian Institute in Paris to compile a book of Gregorian chants suitable for French Canada. After returning from France, Placide taught the chants to church choirs throughout Quebec.

According to Father Goulet, these Latin chants originated in France and Italy in the 7th century.

Father Goulet says Placide was living at Levis, Quebec, when the young Goulet was attending college there in the 1920s. One fall he asked the young student how his academic work was progressing. Goulet simply told him to look at the current honor roll of the top eight students in each class posted in the main hall. Every time Placide returned to the college, he noticed that his young relative's name was always on the honor roll.

Placide spent the last part of his career, from 1941 to 1950, as principal of a Catholic girls school at St. Damien, Belle Chasse County, Quebec. He died there on 3 June 1950.

Adelard Gagnon was the final religious uncle of Father Goulet. Born 1 April 1882, he later entered the congregation of the Oblate Fathers and became a professor at the College de Levis. Adelard was ordained a priest in 1916 by Bishop Roy at Levis. Between 1935 and 1947, he pastored churches at Ste. Cyrille de l'Islet and Ste. Croix de Lotbiniere. Adelard died at Ste. Croix on 9 May 1947.

The two religious aunts of Father Goulet were Clotilde and Anna Gagnon. Clotilde was born at Ste. Marguerite, Quebec, on 8 November 1873. She later entered the congregation of the Augustinian nuns of Hotel Dieu Hospital in Quebec City. With the religious name of Sister Ste. Veronique, she served as a nurse and died there, aged 27, in 1900.

Her younger sister, Anna, followed in her footsteps. Born at the family home, she entered the Augustinian order at Hotel Dieu Hospital in 1901. She took the name Sister Ste. Veronique in honor of her deceased sister Clotilde.

Father Goulet notes that, for genealogical purposes, the sisters are known as Veronique I and Veronique II. Anna also served as a nurse at the Hotel Dieu Hospital until her death in 1922.

The final two religious in this family are brothers, Albert and Ernest Goulet. Albert was born on 4 January 1908 in Holyoke, Mass. He studied at the College de Levis and the Grand Seminary of Laval University at Quebec, between 1924 and 1933. Bishop O'Leary ordained Albert into the priesthood at St. Michael's Cathedral in Springfield, Mass., on 10 June 1933. During his first Mass at Precious Blood Church in Holyoke, Mass., Albert's uncle Adelard preached the sermon with another uncle, Placide, and cousins Arthur and Eugene assisting.

Father Goulet's pastoral ministry between 1933 and 1945 was at Holy Name in Worcester, Immaculate Conception in Fitchburg, and St. Peter's in Northbridge, Mass. From 1945 to 1962, Albert served at Notre Dame in Worcester and at St. Theresa in East Blackstone, Mass.

From 1962 until retiring in 1978, Father Goulet served as pastor of Immaculate Conception in Fitchburg, Mass. For the past six years, he has been living in Southbridge, Mass., assisting in local churches and continuing his genealogical research.

Father Goulet's brother, Ernest, was born at Holyoke on 14 November 1919. In 1943 he entered the congregation of the Clerics of St. Viateur in Joliette and has continued to this day at Joliette with that order.

VITAL LIBRARY PUBLICATIONS MISSING AND BELIEVED STOLEN

As of May 6, as many as eleven marriage repertories were discovered missing from Library shelves at the French Social Club in Hartford. This sad disclosure came to light following a time-consuming audit of book holdings by President Carrier.

It's possible that some of the missing reference material was removed--strictly in violation of Library rules--by a member or members who fully intended to return the repertory(ies) later, but forgot about them. Or it was an act of willful thievery on someone's part.

The loss of these invaluable (and, in several instances, irreplaceable) publications causes an obvious problem. Any Society member wishing to extract family data from the missing repertories is now unable to do so--thanks to a thoughtless, or deliberate thief.

Most of us realize that a substantial portion of annual membership dues is used to expand our research holdings in the important area of marriage repertories. Over the past several years, we were fortunate enough to take advantage of special bargains, particularly in Quebec Province, to obtain large numbers of repertories at reduced cost to us.

Notwithstanding, such book purchases do involve a sizable investment of FCGSC funds. Example: the recent purchase of Rene Jette's Dictionnaire Généalogique des Familles du Québec (Genealogical Dictionary of Quebec Families) cost us \$150.00. That expenditure represented an amount equivalent to the dues money collected for 15 annual membership renewals. The average marriage repertory itself costs \$30.00 to buy--an amount equivalent to the sum received for three annual membership renewals.

Fortunately for our Library purchases budget, several dedicated members voluntarily donated considerable time and effort, at their own expense, to laboriously photocopy other marriage repertories (specifically, the Maine parishes) for the research use of Society Library patrons.

Under the circumstances, we're forced to adopt more stringent security practices to protect our remaining holdings. Such practices are bound to cause inconvenience and hard feelings among members, but we see no other alternative. We trust you'll bear with us in this matter.

REVOLUTION IN FRENCH CANADA

Extract from "The Valois: A Family Genealogy & History,"
by J. Valois and the Reverend R. Valois, C.S.V.

When a 51-year-old lawyer and provincial parliament member named Louis Papineau incited Quebecers in 1837 to rebellion against the small but intractable ruling elite of English Canadians, three Valois brothers played significant roles in the short-lived insurrection. Unfortunately for his reputation, Papineau fled to the U.S. when the first sounds of gunfire erupted, leaving the movement leaderless.

Narcisse Valois, V.1 (1786-1859), great-grandson of Jacques Levall-
ois' eldest son Pierre, was a close associate of Papineau. A rich tanner-
merchant of Vaudreuil, below Montreal, this former militia lieutenant and
justice of the peace quickly rose to prominence in the Quebec faction. In
charge of organizing pro-Papineau militants in Vaudreuil County, Narcisse
seconded the official patriote resolution of 6 August 1837 that sparked
armed revolt.

Their efforts were doomed from the start inasmuch as Papineau's anti-
religious radicalism cost the support of influential Quebec clergy and mod-
erate-minded French Canadians. With much of the Franco populace remaining
passive, preliminary riots and later skirmishes by rebel bands in the Mont-
real vicinity were swiftly crushed by British regulars assisted by English-
Canadian militia.

By no means a bloodless attempt, 124 patriotes and 11 English sold-
iers or Anglo militiamen died in four skirmishes during 1837. Include also
one Québécois turncoat summarily executed by former comrades. Arrested on
19 December 1837, Narcisse was fined 1,000 Pounds and imprisoned five months.
Valois overcame these early political difficulties and in 1845 was appointed
a captain of militia, later becoming mayor of Vaudreuil.

Narcisse's brother Joseph, V.1 (1796-1874), a prosperous farmer at
Vaudreuil, joined the rebel cause, too. His inflammatory speeches at pro-
revolutionary rallies brought police down on him but Papineau supporters
kept him safely hidden until the tempers of provincial officials cooled in
the aftermath of the abortive uprising.

Third and youngest of the brothers, Dr. Michel Valois (1801-69), is
the subject of an article in "Dictionary of Canadian Biography," published
in 1969 by the University of Toronto Press. He attended the College of Mon-
treal from 1816-21 and was licensed to practice medicine on 10 May 1826.
Since medical school training didn't become commonplace until the last half
of the 19th century, most physicians, Michel among them, learned their skills
by serving an apprenticeship with a practicing physician.

Dr. Valois became identified with the liberal cause by 1830 and, as
an official of the Pointe Claire Catholic parish, loudly criticized the Eng-

lish merchant class who controlled a large portion of land holdings in his locale. Beginning in 1836, Michel took an active part in setting up local Papineau organizations in the region. It wasn't unusual to see him haranguing fellow citizens from the church steps after Sunday Mass.

The physician's home became a meeting ground for local rebels and he played a major role in the historic rally at Saint-Laurent on 15 May 1837. Although a major influence in the Pointe Claire area, Michel never formed a close, direct relationship with patriote leaders. Nonetheless, he found himself at the top of the government's list of most-wanted revolutionaries. For a time, Valois evaded pursuit and arrest although his home was looted by an angry mob of English soldiers.

Contemporary records show that Michel was captured and brought to Montreal as a prisoner on 13 December 1837. A booklet published in 1968 by the Quebec Ministry of Lands and Forests states that Valois Bay, off Pointe Claire, was named for Michel to honor his role in the 1837 uprising. The entry notes that Valois subsequently spent a period of exile in the U.S. He went on to serve from 1851-54 as elected deputy from Montreal County in the Lower Canada Legislative Assembly. When the county was separated into two parliamentary divisions, Michel represented Jacques Cartier County from 1854-57.

In all, 500 patriotes were captured during the 1837 revolt. Two hundred were released in January of 1838 and 100 others, Narcisse Valois among them, set free in May of 1838. Of the principal rebels in confinement, eight directly implicated in killings signed confessions and were exiled to Bermuda in June of 1838, forbidden to return without permission under penalty of death. On that same day, the remaining 153 revolutionaries in detention received amnesties.

Attempts in 1838 by French-Canadian nationalists to bring off another insurrection in Quebec were soundly repressed by authorities and acted as a final reminder of the hopelessness of further resistance. During this last uprising, 50 patriotes died in six engagements and 750 others surrendered at gunpoint.

The government took harsher measures toward 99 Franco prisoners. All were tried by military courts-martial in December of 1838: 12 convicted ringleaders died by hanging, 58 were deported to Australian penal colonies, two were banished from Canada, and the remaining 27 freed under bond for good behavior in prison. Conscientious efforts by Canada's English governor-general, the Earl of Durham, wrecked his career but he laid the groundwork for eventual, and a more representative form of, dominion status in 1867.

OVER 1.5 MILLION PEOPLE SPEAK FRENCH IN THE U.S. - 30% IN THE NORTHEAST

How many people in the United States speak French? Data gathered during the 1980 U.S. Federal Census recently made available point to a figure of about 1.5 million persons aged 5 and above who speak French at home. The exact number is 1,550,751 with another 147,000 children under 5 whose parents' home language is French.

That is the fourth largest non-English-speaking group in the U.S., after the 11 million who speak Spanish, the 1,618,000 who speak Italian and the 1,586,000 who speak German.

The Census figures have been researched and analyzed by ActFANE in order to obtain a clear picture of how many Francophones there are and where they live.

The latest Census also produced a set of statistics which places the French-speaking population in second position. That figure is 2,461,651 and it represents persons 5 years and over in families in which French is spoken. The difference between this figure and the 1.5 million persons who speak French is obviously the result of counting individuals who live in a French-speaking environment (family) but do not speak French. When the two French figures are compared with the German and Italian groups, we find the French group jumps ahead. Interestingly, this could be interpreted to mean that Franco-Americans have larger families than the Germans and Italians.

So, two different figures can be quoted:

1.5 million Americans speak French at home, representing the fourth largest non-English-speaking group in the U.S.

2.4 million Americans live in families whose home language is French, the second largest such grouping in the U.S., coming after the 12.6 million persons in Spanish-speaking homes.

It is also worth noting that the 147,065 children under 5 whose parents are French-speakers is the second largest such grouping in the U.S., after the 1,537,000 children of Spanish-speaking parents.

Of the four U.S. Census designated geographic regions in the U.S., the Northeast has the largest number of French-speakers. The 643,352 Francophones in the Northeast also represent the most compact French population in the country. Other regions report the following numbers of French-speakers: the Southern region has 561,511; the West has 179,713; and the North Central has 166,175 French-speakers.

New England and Upstate New York (ten Northeastern counties) account for 425,094 persons who speak French at home, representing 31.3% of the total

Francophone population of the United States. This is the area covered by Act-FANE.

Massachusetts ranks first in the region with over 135,000 French-speakers, while Northeastern New York ranks last with 13,000 Francophones. Maine has the highest percentage (8.4%) of its total population that speaks French and the highest percentage (32%) of its French ancestry population that still speaks French.

Of the 33 counties in the region with more than 2,500 Francophones, Providence County, R.I., has the largest number with 32,000 (as befits God's Country--J.V.). Three counties are practically tied for the highest percentage of French-speakers at close to 25% each. They are Coos (Berlin) in New Hampshire, and Aroostook and Androscoggin (Lewiston) in Maine.

NOTE: The term "Francophone." used in the above article, denotes a person belonging to the French-speaking population--J.V.

1900 FEDERAL CENSUS OF CONNECTICUT (Con't)

The seventh installment in an ongoing series of Franco-American genealogical data extracted from the 1900 federal census of Connecticut is presented on succeeding pages. The city of Norwich, in New London County, is again the focus. As previously explained, the unusual spellings of some French surnames are, for the most part, the handiwork of Yankee census-takers.

An explanation of abbreviations, used to identify the relationship of individuals to the head of a household, appears on the page preceding the census data. The following information of genealogical value is furnished in the extract:

1. Community of residence.
2. Family surname.
3. Christian name of each family member.
4. Relationship of each person to the head of family (see "Abbreviations Used in the Census").
5. Age of every person in the household ("1/12" = one month old, etc.).
6. Place of birth of each household member.

The actual 1900 census is on file at the State Library, located at 231 Capitol Avenue in Hartford, and at the Connecticut Historical Society, 1 Elizabeth Street, Hartford.

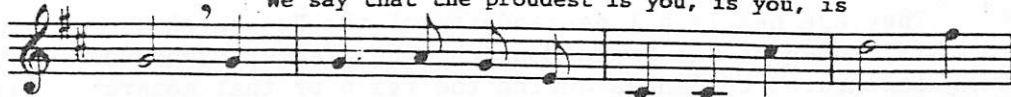

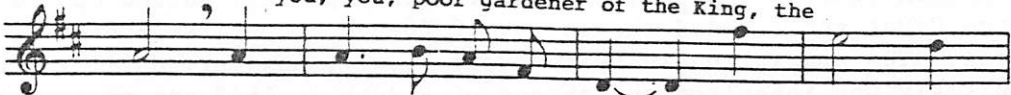

THE FRENCH CANADIANS IN TAFTVILLE, 1878 & LATER

Chapter 10 Extract from "History of Taftville, Connecticut"--published in 1940 by The Bulletin Press; Norwich, Ct. Reprinted with permission from the NORWICH (CT.) BULLETIN

After the first (labor) strike in 1875, many of the original settlers left Taftville for New Bedford and other textile centers. The few French-Canadian families living in Taftville at that time remained and, in 1877 and 1878, many friends and relatives began to arrive from Canada until, at the present time (1939), at least three-fourths of the inhabitants of Taftville are French Canadian or of that descent.

They are probably the most prolific race (sic) in the world, 10 to 15 children being an ordinary family, while a few years ago, families of 18 to 20 were nothing unusual. They are a very industrious, God-fearing, and sport-loving people and have produced many fine athletes, notably baseball players, some even gaining national reputations. Their courteous manner is proverbial and, in the many years in which I have known and associated with them, I have always found them courteous and friendly. There are no people in the world who cling to their language and customs as tenaciously as the French Canadians.

They are nearly all descendants of the French of the days of King Louis XIV, known as the Grand Monarch, the greater number of their ancestors having immigrated to Canada during the reign of that monarch (1643-1715).

In 1608, Champlain, a noted French explorer, sailed up the St. Lawrence River and founded the colony of Quebec, the first French colony in America. The population increased very slowly, however, until the reign of Louis XIV who inherited the throne of France in 1643 and reigned for 72 years, during which time France rose to be the most formidable power in Europe. Many people immigrated to Canada during his reign, Canada, at that time being a possession of France. France and England had been at war intermittently for nearly 100 years, and Louis cherished the ambition to add all of North America to his dominions.

After a long and bitter struggle, however, the British under General Wolfe defeated the French under the brilliant French general Montcalm on the Plains of Abraham and captured Quebec, thus ending the rule of the French in Canada. Both generals, Wolfe and Montcalm, died after the battle. As the English settlers in New England greatly outnumbered the French in Canada, at the outbreak of the struggle for supremacy in North America in a ratio of 15 to one, King Louis, in order to increase the French population, offered a pension to any Canadian family having a family of from 12 to more children; with the result that families of from 15 to 20 were not uncommon.

The French Canadians in Taftville, 1878 & Later (Con't)

From 1878 up to the present time, there has been a constant influx of immigrants from Canada until, at the present time, there is said to be about three million of the French-Canadian race (sic) in the New England states. The majority of them are located in the textile centers in Massachusetts, Rhode Island, and Connecticut. They are very numerous in eastern Connecticut, especially in Windham County. In the town of Norwich, they have a voting strength of 2,400 and hold several political offices.

Although the majority of the French people came to Taftville after 1878, there were quite a number among the early pioneers who helped to build No. 1 Mill and the village of Taftville. Some came from Jewett City, many from Baltic, and some from Willimantic. Among the earliest were Henry Germaine, Thomas Blais, Henry Fontaine, and the Gladues. The wives of Messrs. Germaine and Gladue were sisters, daughters of Thomas Blais, and were the first to start operating speeders in No. 1 Mill. Mrs. Germaine and Mr. Blais are still living in Taftville.

Among the other early settlers were: Napoleon Rondeau, John Reeves, Peter Fournier, Peter Letendre, Charles Gadbois, Fred Lemoine, J. Frazier, P. Dugas, Albert and Nazaire Lafleur, Peter Benoit, Frank Marien, Joseph Pothier, Mr. Previer, Christopher and Joseph Caron. The Norman family, the Jarry family, Fred King (Roy, in French), Joseph Marsan, Antoine Pacquet, Thomas Lambert, Frank Beique, Frank Demarais were also among the earliest settlers.

The great change in the racial population of Taftville is shown in the nationality of the priests who conducted services in the Taftville parish. In 1873 Father James J. Reynolds, then pastor at Jewett City, was appointed to care for the spiritual needs of the Catholics of Taftville and Occum. Father Reynolds died in 1894, his successor being Reverend Terrance Dunn who remained until the following May, when he was succeeded by Rev. John Synnot, who began his labors on May 16, 1894.

Reverend Father Synnot purchased from the Ponemah Company a tract of land on October 30, 1897 measuring 200 by 572 feet; 2½ acres on Providence Street, and two acres on School Street plus a cemetery which was purchased in 1896 and blessed by Bishop McMahon in May of the same year. The school was conducted by ten Sisters of Charity, Sister Benoit being directress.

Father Synnot died in December 1901 and was succeeded by Reverend John Quinn who, in turn, was succeeded by Reverend Arthur O'Keefe in 1903. In 1908, after the fire on School Street, all plans for the completion of the church had to be abandoned as the parish set itself to work to provide a new brick school, with convent adjoining.

Father O'Keefe was succeeded by Reverend John Stapleton, who left in 1914, and was succeeded by Reverend U. O. Bellerose. Father Bellerose was known as the church builder since, I believe, he had great success in building the new church at Baltic and came for the same purpose to Taftville. In 1927 Father Bellerose was transferred to the Putnam parish and died there November 30, 1932.

The French Canadians in Taftville, 1878 & Later (Con't)

The cornerstone of the new school was laid in 1909 and \$4,800 was spent for new walks on Providence Street and Hunters Avenue. The Reverend Frederick R. H. DesSurreault succeeded Father Bellerose and is still pastor at present (1940). In 1924 a Hartford newspaper published the following item which shows the remarkable fecundity of the French race (sic):

"Little Louise Dugas has two grandfathers, two grandmothers, two great-grandfathers, two great-grandmothers, and a great-great-grandmother. Who can boast of such a wealth of living grandparents?"

"The entire family lives in Taftville; the mother, Mrs. Joseph Dugas, is the daughter of Mr. Louis Paquette. Mr. and Mrs. Paquette's parents are still living. They are Mr. and Mrs. Antoine Paquette, and Mrs. Paquette's parents still reside on Providence Street. Mrs. Marcaurele's mother, Mrs. Victor Marcaurele, Sr., is also a resident of the village."

At the present time (1940), all the older people, with the exception of Mrs. Victor Marcaurele, have passed away.

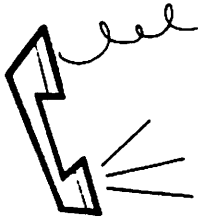

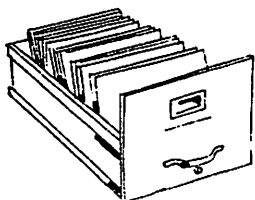

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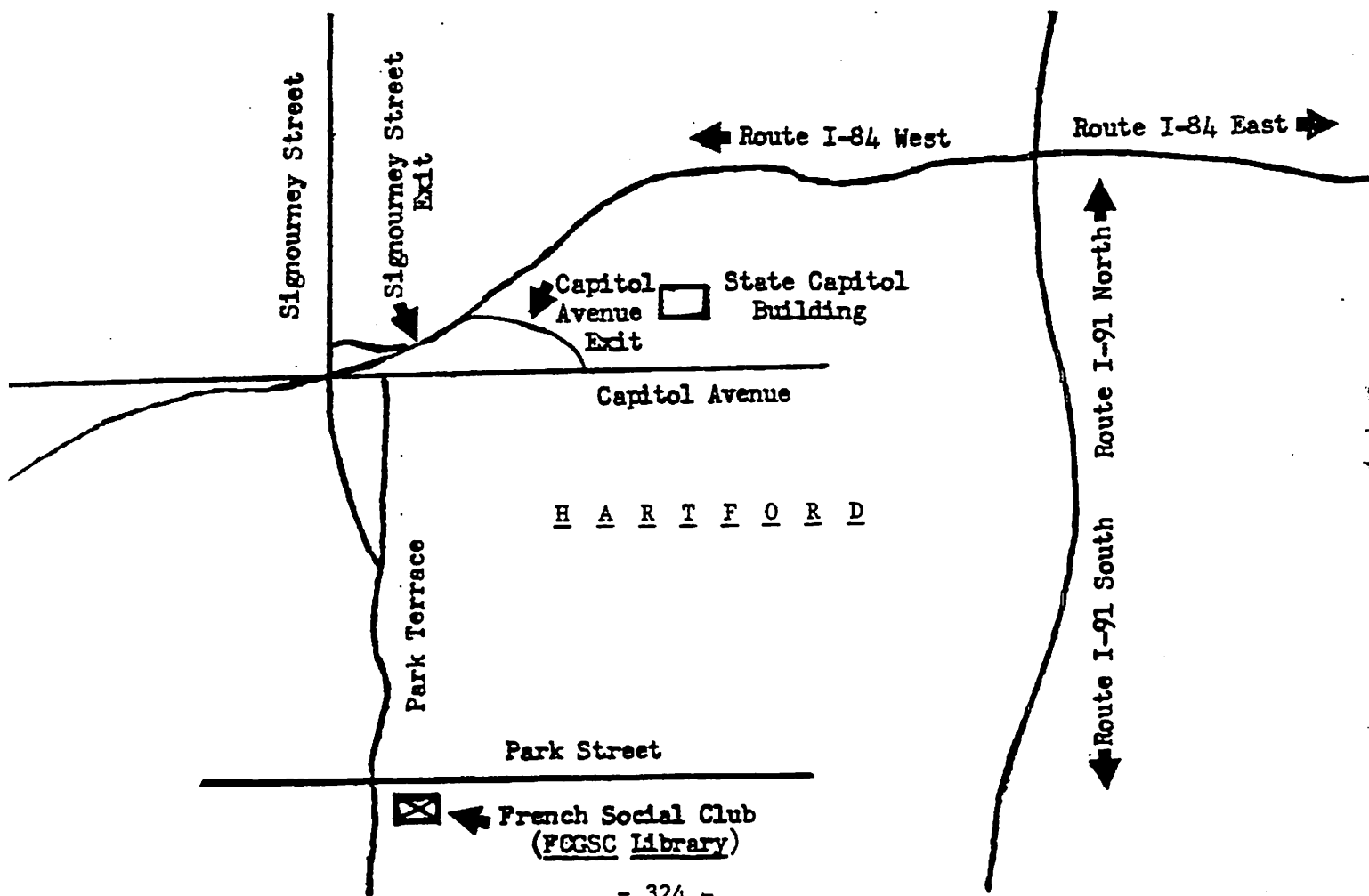
