

FATHER ALBERT P. GOULET of SOUTHBRIDGE, MA.

Many of the members of our Genealogical Society in Tolland are well acquainted with Father Goulet and his research into the family histories of countless French-Canadian families. He is one of our most respected and beloved members as well as a generous benefactor. In this issue of the Connecticut Maple Leaf, we honor him and give thanks for all his help over the past years. We all hope he will continue to visit us in spite of the fact that he probably has enough genealogical material in his own living room to start his own society!

Father Goulet was born on January 4, 1908 in Holyoke, MA. and was baptized at Precious Blood Church in Holyoke by Rev. Laurent. He attended grammar school at Precious Blood Elementary School and graduated in June of 1922.

With his brother, Eugene, he made his first communion during the first mass celebrated by his Uncle Placide Gagnon. This mass took place at Saint Margarite, Dorchester County, Quebec. Albert had attended his uncle's ordination by Bishop Roy the day before, April 19th, at the Hotel Dieu in Quebec. The communion was held on April 20, 1914.

He received the Sacrament of Confirmation at Precious Blood Church, Holyoke, in October 1919. This was administered by the Most Reverend Thomas B. Beaven, D.D.

From 1922 to June 1924, Albert was at La Salette College in Hartford, CT. He then went on to Levi's College in Levi, Quebec from 1924 to 1929, graduating from the college with an A.B. degree. In 1929, he applied to Bishop Thomas M. O'Leary, D.D., to be accepted for the service of the diocese. He was then sent to Quebec to study theology from September 1929 to June 1933. On June 10, 1933 he was ordained by Bishop Thomas M. O'Leary at St. Michael's Cathedral in Springfield, Mass. and he said his first mass the very next day at Precious Blood Church. With him at his first mass, were his Uncle Placide, and his two cousins, both priests, serving the mass.

In July 1933, he received his first assignment as an assistant. He spent the next fourteen years at Holy Name in Worcester, MA.

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
## FATHER ALBERT GOULET

Next he was sent to the Immaculate Conception Church in Fitchburg, MA from 1943 to 1945 and then on to Saint Peter's Church in Northbridge, MA from February to July of 1945. From July of 1945 to February of 1952 he was an assistant at Notre Dame in Worcester and went on to St. Joseph's in Worcester until 1955.

In April of 1955, Albert was given his first pastorate, as the pastor of St. Theresa's in Blackstone, Mass. This honor was given to him by Most Rev. John Wright D.D.

His final assignment before retiring, was at the Immaculate Conception Church in Fitchburg, MA. He was given the pastorate of Immaculate Conception by Bishop Bernard Flanagan.

In July of 1978, he retired to Southbridge, Mass. where he has become quite well known, not only for his help with the various parishes, but for bringing a greater awareness to the people of French-Canadian background as to their heritage and various lineages. We all thank him and wish him all the best in the future!

## The life of Rev. Nelson W. Deveneau

Nelson was born May 17, 1856 in Buffalo, New York, the fourth child of French-Canadian parents Edouard Davignon and Clemence Lareau, who married in Iberville, Quebec, Canada on Feb. 12, 1844. Edouard's parents were Joseph Davignon and Marie-Angelique Payan St-Onge, who were married at St-Mathias on Nov. 17, 1800. Joseph, in turn, was the sixth child of Clement-Amable and Marie-Anne Lamoreaux Davignon, who were married in Chambly on Feb. 2, 1761. Clement-Amable's father, Francois Davignon dit Beauregard, ca. 1685-1761, was the first known member of the family to emigrate from France to Quebec. He married Madelaine Mailhot in Chambly on May 24, 1719.

Nelson received his early education in Buffalo and in Bedford, Quebec. In the 1860s his father moved the family to Illinois, where sisters Louise Josephine and Victoire Lille were born in 1867 and 1870, respectively. Shortly thereafter, Nelson's eldest brother Joseph P. Davignon emigrated to Worcester, Mass., married in nearby Webster in 1873 and became a naturalized U.S. citizen in 1876. He worked as a sewing-machine salesman, later living in Danielson and Norwich, Connecticut, finally retiring to Webster.

At about age 18, in 1874, Nelson obtained a job as a druggist's apprentice in Oxford, Massachusetts, a town south of Worcester. Prior to that time, his parents, brother Louis and sisters Jenny, Louise, Phoebe and (Victoire) Lillie moved to Wauregan, Connecticut, a mill village above Plainfield. On Sept. 6, 1874, Jenny (Virginie) married Frank X. Maynard (Ménard) who was also an emigrant from Quebec. He ultimately ran a successful dairy farm, and the couple had eight children. Their home on Shepard Hill, on the road from Wauregan to Central Village was said to have been razed about 1962.

In Oxford, Nelson was befriended by Dr. George A. Adams, a physician, who may have been influential in Nelson's decision to leave the Catholic Church and pursue training leading to the life work of a Protestant minister. With the probable financial assistance of Dr. Adams, Nelson returned to Canada to obtain the education he would need. He attended Stanstead Wesleyan College, actually a secondary school located in Stanstead, Quebec, just north of the Vermont border, founded in 1873. He then studied at Point-au-Tremble Institute near Montreal, McGill University, and Wesleyan Theological College (which later became part of McGill), in Montreal. At this time, he changed the spelling of his name from Davignon to Deveneau, selecting more accurately in English its French pronunciation. Part of his training was to work with various Quebec congregations of Protestants, preaching in either French or English, as necessary. After a brief term as assistant pastor in Montreal's French Methodist Church, he returned to the U.S. to minister to French-speaking residents. In February, 1882, he was sent to Illinois to work with the French Protestant effort there, and settled in Kankakee, south of Chicago. He was soon ordained and accepted as a member of the Central Illinois Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church.

Nelson kept a diary in English for most of 1882, to 1885 and part of 1886, concerning his work, journeys, geography and relations with family and friends. Besides chronology, it provides some insight into his motivations, feelings and goals. Names of Illinois towns and settlements noted in the record indicate the range of his missionary travels; Sheridan, L'Erable Crossing at Sugar Island, Onarga, Orion, Dwight, Little York, Watseka and Lacon. In Iowa, he carried on his work in places as diverse as Harlan, Muscatine and Oskaloosa. The socio-

logical climate in which Nelson operated was not always cordial; there was resistance from the Catholic Church and some parishioners. From his Oct. 25, 1883 diary entry: "we had much conversation over the case of Mr. Lanoir, whom the R.C.'s have tried to adjudge insane on account of his conversion," and, "at St. Mary (Illinois), I was denounced by a Catholic priest from the pulpit". While Rev. Deveneau may have been verbally abused, there is no evidence he was physically harmed. This in spite of the diary entry of May 28, 1882: "at Papineau (Illinois) had one of the hand-to-hand fights with a live agent of the Devil". This may be illuminated by another entry in which he called Papineau a "wicked town".

Most entries, of course, documented daily ministry and evangelism among congregations in small towns and rural areas. On Aug. 15, 1883, "I buried a poor girl at 3 (p.m.) who had died at the insane asylum from love affairs". On Jan 2, 1884, "(I) reached Aledo at 12 ... it was about 20 below zero ... so cold". On July 5, 1884: "I went to Tonowanda (N.Y.) and was treated coldly by cousin Corbin". Nov. 24, 1884, "at Viola, fair interest but a lack of zeal is apparent". On July 31, 1886 an entry: "The presence of a widow and four orphans, the father and husband having been drowned two weeks before. Yes, we saw how Earth has its varied sorrows".

In the summer of 1882, Nelson's youngest brother Louis came to Chicago by train from Bedford, Quebec for a visit. He stayed through October, working for a time for Mr. Arcade Langdoc in Kankakee. One of Rev. Deveneau's objectives was to raise funds to build a church for his Kankakee area congregation. To that end he undertook a strenuous lecture and speaking tour, on top of his regular missionary work, appealing to his listeners for support. Toward the end of that year, his tour through Illinois and Iowa was interrupted by a siege of boils, and he was ordered by a doctor to take a complete rest. He chose to travel East by train, first visiting his eldest sister, Rose Davignon Gonzales, her husband Frank and their children in Cleveland, Ohio. In Wauregan,, Connecticut, he enjoyed a reunion with his parents and younger sisters Louise and Lillie, as well as his brother-in-law and sister, Frank and Jenny Maynard. From there, he traveled north to Putnam, and Worcester, Massachusetts, on route to his Montreal destination, visiting with church friends and often preaching or speaking to congregations at the request of his hosts. There is abundant evidence that wherever he went, he rarely missed an opportunity to evangelize, preaching the gospel as he saw it.

In 1883, following his Eastern trip, Louis again visited Nelson in Illinois, and apparently under the influence of his minister brother, experienced a religious conversion. Nelson baptized Louis along with several others by immersion in a river near Papineau. In September, Nelson attended the Moody-Sankey convention in Chicago, at which the noted evangelist Dwight L. Moody was present. He is known today for the Moody Bible Institute in Chicago, and in New England for the Northfield Schools which he founded in 1879-81.

In April 1884, Nelson was again in Connecticut and preached in the Methodist Episcopal Church in the Greeneville section of Norwich, to an English - speaking congregation. After the sermon, he "also spoke to the Sunday School and sang in French to them". In the afternoon, he drove ten miles to Jewett City, a heavily French milltown, where he spoke "in a grove to a congregation of about 300 people, two-thirds of whom were R.C.". It is likely his sermon topic was "Why and How I became a Protestant", which he delivered frequently. In January, 1886, he held ten days of meetings in his early home area of Bedford, Quebec, where, he wrote, "some sixty were converted, among them my dear

old father".

On June 24, 1886, Rev. Deveneau married Lydia Savoie in Kankakee. She<sup>1</sup> was from nearby St. Anne, Illinois. He then took his new bride on an Eastern trip, to, among other things, introduce her to his family. She was apparently well accepted, even though his mother and several of his siblings are believed to have remained Catholic. His visit to Bedford was most nostalgic for him, as many childhood memories are noted in his diary entries at this time. He writes, on July 12, 1886, "I began reading 'Uncle Tom's Cabin' to the family in French". The couple also visited the Thousand Islands, Niagara Falls, Buffalo, New York City and Washington, D.C. on their 42-day journey, after which they returned to Illinois.

Two sons were born to the Rev. Deveneau and his wife. George Adams, born in 1890, was named after his father's mentor in Oxford, Massachusetts. Willard Francis, born in 1892, was named in part, in honor of Women's Christian Temperance Union president and suffrage advocate Frances Willard, and apparently also after Methodist Bishop Willard Francis Mallalieu, who began his career as a<sup>2</sup> leader of the denomination in Massachusetts. Rev. Deveneau was transferred between the Chicago area and New England several times during his ministerial and missionary endeavors. In 1892, he was called to take charge of the French mission in Chicago. In April of 1896, Bishop Mallalieu transferred him to Worcester, Massachusetts to work among the French-speaking in New England.

During these years, Nelson's siblings married. Louis married Josephine Kerouack in Wauregan in 1885; Victoire Lille married Emery (or Henry) Despelteau in Bedford, Quebec in 1887 and Louise Josephine married Leo McGrath of Newfoundland and Worcester, Massachusetts, also in Bedford, in 1899. There were also losses. His sister Phoebe died in Canada at age 24, in 1887. His father died in Bedford in 1897. Nelson's brother-in-law Frank Maynard died in Connecticut in 1902 and brother Louis died at age 42 in 1903, from injuries incurred in an accident which had left him paralyzed for three years. A trolley motorman for the Norwich (Connecticut) Street Railway. Louis had fallen from the roof of a car while trying to fix an electrical arm. He left a wife and two young sons.<sup>3</sup> Nelson's mother died in Canada in 1904 and his sister Jenny, Frank Maynard's widow, died in 1908.

In another move, Nelson was called back to Chicago in June, 1910 to assist Rev. Arthur Allais in a French Methodist Church there. By Sept. 1914, Rev. Deveneau had left the French ministry and assumed the pastorate of an English-speaking congregation in South Chicago; and in the years during and following World War I, he assisted the pastors of churches in three towns west of Chicago- Sheridan, Fairdale and Lee. His last calling in the ministry was in 1922 when he became pastor of the St. Jean French Methodist Church in Manchester, N.H. By 1926, his health was such that he was obliged to retire.

Rev. Nelson Deveneau died in Pasadena, California on June 9, 1928 at the age of 72. He was buried in Homewood, Illinois, south of Chicago. His widow Lydia died on March 4, 1936 at the home of her son Willard in Cincinnati, Ohio. Their son George A. Deveneau died in the Panama Canal Zone in 1939. He was a graduate of the University of Chicago in 1912, had served as research director of the Elgin Watch Co., and at the time of his death was the assistant personnel manager for the U.S. government in the Canal Zone. His brother Willard F. Deveneau had a career as an advertising and marketing executive, at one time serving as editor of the publication "Modern Packaging" in New York. He lived in New Haven, Connecticut from 1937 to 1956 while an executive of the National Folding Box Co. He died in 1967 in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

The preceding account offers a glimpse of the life of one family of French-Canadian descent. In numbers, the French Protestant community was much smaller than its Roman Catholic counterpart, but these emigrants to the U.S. attempted in many cases to retain their French language and customs as did the Catholics. Like others of many nationalities, they brought with them their unique heritage into the melting pot of ethnic and religious values to become a part of the fabric of late 19th century and early 20th century America.

Notes:


1. St. Anne, Ill. was founded in 1852 by a then Catholic priest, Rev. Charles P.T. Chiniquy (1809-1899), who led 5,000 settlers from Quebec. In an 1856 trial for "immorality", Chiniquy was defended successfully by lawyer Abraham Lincoln! After much controversy, Chiniquy left the Catholic Church, returning to Canada and becoming noted as a Presbyterian evangelist and author.
2. Bishop Mallalieu (1828-1911) was partially of French descent but not via Canada. His father's ancestors were Huguenots who settled in Massachusetts.
3. Only one of Louis' sons survived to adulthood, Saul Samuel (1896-1949), who claimed the title of "Count" D'Avignon. He lived in N.Y.C. and Norwich, CT

## A MEDIEVAL VESTIGE

What, when, where and how? For many years these unanswered questions have been asked by researchers concerning the French adjective "dit", and the names that follow it. This dit name has been, and still is, the cause for much confusion for many French Canadian genealogists.

A number of theories on the reason for this second name have suggested that: a. It was used to differentiate between two or more persons with the same name. b. Indicate origin of a person. c. Name of adoptive parents. d. Indicate occupation. e. A custom associated with French soldiers. Although these theories shed some light on the subject, the questions remain.

Historical events are very important to genealogists, and can often aide in developing a personal profile of his or her ancestors. It is through history and the prevalent use of dit names by the French soldiers that I have developed a plausible theory for its use.

We'll begin with a definition of a phrase most of us are familiar with.

### THE NOM-DE-GUERRE

Although it has been Anglicized to mean pen-name or pseudonym, its original French meaning is "war name". At one time it was a custom for every person enlisting into the French army to take on an assumed name. That tradition can be traced to the middle ages when knights were identified by the symbols displayed on their shields.

The development of such a tradition can be seen through the introduction of body armor to the Franks by the Saracens in the 8th century. Originally, starting out as coat mail, then soon developing into plate armor.

During the Crusades in the 11th century, the Christian soldiers adopted yet another custom of the Saracens. The wearing of surcoats which displayed emblems. These coats, originally worn over the armor for protection against the elements, soon developed into a means of identification for the troops. Returning from the Crusades, these knights brought back with them, among other things, the use of surcoats emblazoned with symbols.

At this time the feudal system was well established throughout Western Europe. This feudal system can briefly be described as an allegiance between King, Lord and Vassal. The King would grant land to his seigneurs in exchange for military services as he thought needed. The seigneur in return sublet his land to tenants while enforcing the same military obligations. When the King needed an army he called upon his seigneurs who gathered all his able bodied men and marched into battle.

Prior to the development of a regular army, all military engagements were done by these individual feudal armies. In battle the seigneurs displayed their emblems and colors not only for the purpose of individual identification but also a rallying point for his troops. The tenant/soldier in turn would wear the badges and symbols of their seigneur for identification as one of his troops.

With improvements in plate armor, naturally came alterations in the helmet. What started out in the 12th century as a simple nose piece added for facial protection, advanced into helmets that completely covered the head and face. As a result these new helmets concealed the identity of the knights wearing the armor. In the fever-pitched battles of the middle ages, it was obviously important to determine friend from foe. The adoption of personal symbols worn on the shields and surcoats of the knights helped to alleviate this problem. Through this practical use of these symbols we see the birth of heraldry.

Bearing arms reached its peak through chivalry and the popular medieval sport of tournaments. During these events, knights and descendants of knights, would display their shield insignia that became distinguished by either himself or his ancestor on the battlefield.

Different from England and other European countries, the heraldry of France was a weak institution. Very few rules and regulations concerning arms were established or enforced. As a result the bearing of arms was adopted by non-combatants without the permission of the French government. By the end of the 13th century, the use of arms by common townsmen and peasants alike was prevalent throughout France. These arms assumed by the middle and lower classes in style and design, but not in status. In no degree were the lower class arms bearers considered noble.

Another common practice during the middle ages was for a beneficiary to assume the name and arms of one who has made a will.

The medieval societies of France were militaristic. During the 16th and 17th centuries, arms continued to hold an element of high social influence. As the societies and armies of France continued to evolve, they retained some of the ethics associated with chivalry. Senior officers could be seen wearing a light blue silk sash across their shoulders. This being symbolic to the Order of the Holy Spirit, which is an order of knighthood originally founded by Louis of Anjou in 1352 and re-established by Henry III in 1579. Captains of the Gendarmerie de France, whose origins can be traced back to 1422, were known to display their arms on their hats.

During the 1660's, uniforms began to appear. By 1670 they were standard issue among the troops. Although uniforms now existed, their styles and colors differed from regiment to regiment. Originally these regiments bore the names of their colonels. In keeping with the traditions of knighthood and chivalry, these colonels sought to maintain their individual identity by adopting uniforms and colors different from those of any other existing regiments. Along with his colors, the Colonel also displayed his personal coat-of-arms on the regimental standard, drums and trumpets.

It is conceivable that the common French soldiers maintained their medieval custom of bearing arms through the use of the dit Nom-De-Guerre. A long standing tradition in which soldiers listed by either their patronymic or assumed names has been recorded on muster rolls dating back to the 14th century.

Found in Volume 3 of French Canadian Ancestors by Thomas J. LaForest, you'll find a brief discussion on French name origins, including suggestions that connect the dit to the French troops that served in Canada.

Not unlike the feudal societies of medieval France, Canada was also militaristic. Consequently, it is not so unusual to find large numbers of dit names associated with soldiers. Examples of this may be found in lists compiled on soldiers in the regiments of Carignan / Salières, the Troupe de la Marine and the seven years war. In these lists you will notice that a good number of the soldiers (not officers) bear dit names.

As in the middle ages, the bearing of arms was not exclusive to the nobility. It did, however, take on a different tone for the lower classes. In 1676 and again in 1700 King Louis XIV issued edicts from which ecclesiastics and commoners were forced to register for arms. The underlying purpose for these edicts were so the King could finance his wars with the monies collected from the fees that accompanied these registrations. By 1760 stricter guidelines were established limiting arms to individuals with specific occupations and social status.

Through this 500 year tradition of bearing arms, we will begin to see how the dit name develops as a remnant of the insignias displayed on the medieval coat-of-arms.

Volumes have been written on the subject of heraldry. To explain in depth the science involved in developing a coat-of-arms would be extensive. For this reason, I will only discuss the essential elements pertaining to this subject.

The specific components of armorial bearings which appear to be directly related to the dit name have been categorized as follows:

- A). NOM-DE-GUERRE - War name assumed via the symbols displayed on ones coat-of-arms.
  
- B). CHARGES - Symbols displayed on a coat-of-arms.
  - Human figure
  - Religious and ecclesiastical
  - Classical and mythological
  - Birds
  - Beasts
  - Reptiles
  - Fish
  - Invertebrate Creatures
  - Parts of men and animals
  - Monsters
  - Vegetable kingdom (flowers, fruits, etc.)
  - Armor, Accoutrements
  - Articles of attire and ornament
  - Articles of domestic use
  - Weapon, war materials
  - Home studies, recreation
  - Ships and shipping
  - Landscapes, buildings (cities)
  - Heavens

- C.) MOTTOES - Originally war cries that later became a word or phrase assumed by an individual, displayed on the coat-of-arms and may be classified as having:
1. Religious, loyal or patriotic characteristics.
  2. Reference to symbols displayed on the shield.
  3. Reference to the bearers name or occupation.
- D.) ALLUSIVE ARM - Pun or reference to bearers name, occupation, etc.
- E.) TITLES - Baron, Knight, Duke, etc.
- F.) MISCELLANEOUS - Inherited / Testator - To assume the name or arms of a family member or that of testator. Marshalling- assuming a spouses arm or name. Seigneurials arm. Military officers arm. Provincial arm. Town - City of a foreign country. Phonetic misspell/spelling variation. Symbols, words, towns no longer existing. With these established, we can now begin to classify those allusive dit names into one or more of these categories.

Again, due to the vast number of dit names assumed by our French ancestors, it would take months if not longer to categorize each and every dit name accurately. Therefore, I have selected a certain few as examples for this theory, bearing in mind that by using the same guidelines, a little imagination, and accurate translations, many dit names can be classified in this method.

Unfortunately, due to the lack of information on some individuals, certain dit names are not easily classified. For these I have established a miscellaneous column. Researchers may find their families dit name assumed through one of the various sub categories found in this section. Keep in mind that arms were assumed through any conceivable means known to man. If a certain dit name does not fall within one of the better known categories, it does not necessarily exclude it from this theory, nor contradict it.

For my examples, I have chosen primarily those dit names using the prefixes; d', de' des, du, La and Le. With these you should be able to gain a general understanding of this theory.

Hopefully, once analyzed, this theory will become generally accepted within the genealogical community and finally put to rest those long unanswered questions concerning that elusive French adjective "Dit", and the names that follow it.

The following examples will be listed by dit name first, then by surname:





French Neutrals (Acadians) in Connecticut, Part V.

By G. Philip Hébert (# 284)

JEANSON (JANSON, JOHNSON) FAMILY: This family is presumed to descend from a Scottish soldier named William Johnson who was married to Elisabeth Corporon about 1715 in Acadia.

JEANSON, JEAN BPT: (Guillaume and Isabelle Corporon) married to M. Josephte Lord (Pierre and Jeanne Doucet) at Port Royal Feb. 11, 1743. Seven children were indicated in the 1763 Listing. At Middletown, CT in 1756. Of the children, Fr. Hébert mentions Jean Bpt, M. Josephte and M. Magdelaine; also, Germain-Marin who was baptized conditionally at the age of 10 on Oct. 22, 1767, hence born in Connecticut. Bergeron also gives two other children, Monique and Germain (probably identical with Germain-Marin). The family lived at L'Assomption and at St. Jacques L'Achigan, where Jean Bte, the father, died on June 15, 1784 at the age of 70. His wife, Isabelle, died at the same place on Dec. 5, 1796.

JEANSON, THOMAS: (Guillaume and Isabelle Corporon) was married to M. Josephte Girouard (Alexandre and M. Le Borgne) on Jan. 8, 1742 at Port Royal; remarried at L'Assomption on Oct. 3, 1768 to Marie Josephte Granger, widow of Denis Petitot Sincenne. He was in Middletown, CT in 1756 and had nine children listed in 1763. At the time of the inventory of his property (Loisel, March 17, 1773), he had been living at the town of L'Assomption ("Histoire de l'Assomption" by Christian Roy 1967). See also the census of St. Sulpice in Rapport de l'Archiviste de la Province de Quebec, 1949-51, Vols. 30-31.) He was called "English" (Anglais) in the records.

LANDRY FAMILY: See the excellent article An Historical and Genealogical Study of the Two René Landrys Who Arrived in Port Royal About 1645, by Rev. Albert Landry, OFM, translated by Josephine R. Landry, pages 17-24 in the Genealogist, Vol. V, No. 2, August 1, 1979, American-Canadian Genealogical Society of Manchester, N.H.. Also, Les Origines Francaises des Premieres Familles Acadiennes--Le Sud Loudunais, by Bujold and Caillebeau, especially pp. 31-32. Indexes of the S.G.C.F. Montreal and of the Cahiers of the Societe Historique Acadienne, Moncton, N.B.

LANDRY, CHARLES: With his wife, Marie Bourg, who was a widow in 1763 with 8 children.

LANDRY, FRANCOIS: Officiated as a layman authorized, or witnessed, several marriages given in this series of articles. According to the "Repertoire" of the Nicolet, P.Q. marriages, 1975, "those coming from Connecticut were married by a certain Francois Landry." Not known to have regularly lived in exile in Connecticut but probably from Massachusetts. See Histoire de L'Assomption, by Christian Roy, 1967, where Francois Landry arrived with his wife, Marie Doucet, in 1766; buried there on April 21, 1767 at age 75. In Fr. Albert Landry's article mentioned above, with reference to the imminent deportation in 1755, it's stated "on the 10th of September Francois Landry,

called Pére Landry, served as interpreter for the English. This Francois, already 65 years old, was a grandson of René and Marie Bernard." He also lived at St.Jacques l' Achigan.

LANDRY, JEAN: Married to Margarite Granger. A child, Anastasie, was born Oct. 20, 1767, baptized the 21st, at L'Assomption.

LANDRY, JOSEPH: alone, in 1763 Listing.

LANDRY, PAUL: and his wife; Father Hébert states that they were later at Lapraire, P.Q.. Note the following petition involving Woodbury and New Milford, Connecticut. From Maryland, with his wife and 5 children in 1763 Listing. This document is from the Connecticut State Library:

To the Honourable the General Assembly of the Colony of Connecticut to be held at Hartford on the second Thursday of May, Anno Domini 1757--The Memorial of Paul Landre now residing in New Milford in the County of Litchfield--Humbly Sheweth -- That your Memorialist was lately an inhabitant in Nova Scotia and was by Governor Lawrence sent with some other of the Neutral French to Maryland together with his wife and one child and your Memorialist had two other children one of about seven years old and the other about five years old which happened to be put on board another vessel and sent to this colony and are now in Woodbury and your Memorialist obtained liberty from the Governor of Maryland to travel to find his said children & came into this Colony, and yor Memorialist was by order of his Honorable Assembly ordered to New Milford where he together with his wife now dwells, and is very desirous to have his other two children removed from Woodbury to dwell with him, and and the selectmen of the Town of New Milford are willing that said children should come and dwell with your Memorialist at said New Milford, but your Memorialist is advised that they cannot be removed without special leave from this assembly, and whereas this Honorable Assembly was pleased to order that no one family of the French People that were sent into this Colony should be separated and sent into two or more Towns, your Memorialist humbly prays that your Honours would be pleased to order that your Memorialist's said children be removed from said Woodbury to New Milford and as in duty bound your Memorialist shall ever pray.---

LANOUE FAMILY: See Une Nouvelle Acadie 1772-1972 by Fr. Courtin S.J. and Abbé Francois Lanoue, 410 pp. Also by the same Abbé Lanoue, the article La Famille Lanoue en Acadie et dans Joliette-Lanoudiere, in Memoires de la S.G. C.F. pp.24-34, March 1983. In the latter article, the claim is made that the two Roosevelt Presidents, Theodore and Franklin, are descended from Basil Lanoue, an Acadian deported to South Carolina. The same article contains several references to Connecticut Lanoues in exile.

LANOUE, CHARLES: (Joseph and Margarite Belliveau), married to Marie Brault (Pierre and Marie Melanson). One child in 1763 Listing. Civil marriage in Connecticut, revalidated at Laprairie, P.Q. on Sept. 6, 1772. Bergeron mentions a Louis, while Fr. Hébert mentions a Jean, died Dec.9, 1773 at 3 weeks old.

LANOUE, JEAN BAPTISTE: (Pierre and Anne Belliveau) married to Théotiste Bourgeois (Guillaume and Anne Hébert). Civil marriage in Connecticut in 1764, witnesses Paul Landry, Louis Amirault, Jean Richard and Jean Bpt. Forest. Revalidated at L'Assomption on Oct.15,1767. At Pomfret, Connecticut. Théotiste died at St. Jacques l'Achigan on Dec.2, 1814. Fr. Hébert gives 5 more children than Bergeron; M.Margarite (2), Anne-Veronique, Marie, and Anne-Rachelle.

LANOUE, JOSEPH: (Pierre and Marie Granger) married to Margarite Belliveau (Charles and Marie Melanson) Port Royal Oct.16, 1725. Joseph died at St. Philippe April 24, 1782. Five children given in 1763 Listing. Fr. Hébert gives a child not mentioned by Bergeron, Jean Bpt, baptized 1743, August 15th.

LANOUE, MICHEL-PONCY: (Joseph and Margarite Belliveau) married to Madeleine Brun (jean and Anne Gautrot) Civil marriage in Connecticut on Jan.26, 1761, revalidated at Laprairie, P.Q. on Nov.6, 1774. Two children given in 1763 Listing. All three children, Marie, Margarite, and Michel were born in Connecticut.

LANOUE, PIERRE: (Pierre and Anne Belliveau) married to M.Josephte Dugas (Louis and M.Josephte Girouard). Civil marriage about 1764; witnesses Victor Forest, Pierre Dugas, Pierre Forest, Thomas Jeanson. Revalidated at L'Assomption on Sept.22, 1767, in the presence of Francois Amirault, Louis Lord, J.Bte Amirault and Benj. Martin. Four children recorded in the 1763 Listing. Bergeron gives 5 children; Fr. Hébert, one more, Elisabeth, baptized Oct. 7, 1774. Also, he mentions that M. Josephte was baptized conditionally at L'Assomption on April 20, 1767 at age 2½years, she was born in Connecticut.

LANOUE, PIERRE: (Pierre and Marie Granger) married to Françoise Thibodeau (Pierre and Anne-Marie Bourg) at Grand-Pré 1730 and 2nd to Anne Belliveau (Charles and Marie Melançon) at Port Royal on Nov. 4, 1737. Six children were indicated in the 1763 Listing. Two children from his 1st marriage. Bergeron gives 4 children from 2nd marriage, Fr. Hébert gives 2 more, Benjamin born in October of 1742; and Joseph, born and baptized Sept. 24, 1747. Pierre Lanoue's sudden death occurred Dec. 24, 1772 at St. Jacques L'Achigan, P.Q.

LANOUE, PIERRE: (Joseph and Margarite Belliveau, of St. Laurent at Port Royal) married Jan.1757 to Ursile Brun (Antoine and M.Françoise Comeau). Witnesses at the civil marriage in Connecticut were Charles Granger and Marie Lanoue. Ursule died at St.Philippe on July 10, 1783. Pierre was remarried to Marie Hébert on July 28, 1788, the widow of Francois Landry. Five children were in the 1763 Listing. Fr. Hébert specifies 6 children, as does Bergeron, but the data varies considerably. Fr. Hébert details:

1. Marie Félicite was born 1756, bpt. at Port Royal on Jan.21, 1757, had a civil marriage on June 20, 1773 to Chas. Granger, was revalidated at St.Philippe on June 16, 1775.
2. Agnes was born in Conn. and married at St.Philippe in 1780 to Clement Bourgeois.
3. Jean--?

4. Félicite was born 1759 in Connecticut and baptized at Laprairie on June 25, 1775 (at age 16); married on Feb.5, 1776.
5. Anne was born in 1761 in Connecticut and baptized on June 25, 1775 at Laprairie at age 14.
6. Francois was born in Connecticut in 1773.

LEBLANC FAMILY: See French Canadian and Genealogical Review, Quebec Vol. IV, 1972, No.1, pp. 11-36, three excellent articles by Ian Sclandars, Archange Godbout, and Roland J. Auger; also indexes of said publication; of Les Cahiers of La Société Historique Acadienne, Moncton and of the Mémoires de la Société Généalogique C.F., Montreal.

LEBLANC, BASILE: (Joseph - Cajetan and Margarite Bourgeois) married at Port Royal Nov.27, 1752 to Anne Richard (Rene and Margarite Thériot). Listed with 2 children in 1763. According to Christian Roy, Histoire de L'Assomption, 1967, p.478, they arrived at L'Assomption about 1767 with two children from the first marriage (Anne and Joseph). After the death of his first wife, he remarried to Marie Landry. He lived in the village of L'Assomption at the home of Armand Leblanc, husband of Margarite Leblanc, at the time of the inventory of his property, July 15, 1772 (Loisel). Among his belongings were two compasses, "un vieux compas de proportion et un petit compas de route". He became a miller at the mills of the seigneurs at L'Achigan, where his son Pierre was in charge of the saw mill. Another of his sons, Jean-Edouard, was likewise a miller there for a very long time and was the father of Jean Olivier Leblanc, notary, the first of his profession to practice at the village of L'Industrie (Joliette) beginning in 1825.

LEBLANC, JEAN BAPTISTE: (Widower in 1763 Listing, with 5 children). Significantly, Fr. Hébert added nothing to this card because he was unable to make a positive identification, although he made extensive efforts to do so. He consulted Archange Godbout in 1956 and the latter in his letter of Nov.3, 1956, indicated that he, also, could not identify him, nor Louis Hébert, whose daughter he was supposed to have married according to local unwritten Connecticut tradition.

Mrs. Caroline Francis Winslow of Meridan, Connecticut wrote to Placide Gaudet, the distinguished Acadian genealogist, in 1914 and he answered her on Feb.5, 1915; both letters are given in full below. In the typed 51 page, 9 generation genealogy sent to Fr. Hébert by another descendant, Mrs. Arthur W. Bailey, Tuttle Rd Durham, Conn., the latter indicated, Generation I, that Jean Bpt Leblanc landed in Guilford, Conn. in Dec. 1755 and came married to Caroline (last name not given), and had two specific children, John (married to Margarite Hébert according to Fr. Hébert's long-hand notation, who was a daughter of Joseph, Fr. Hébert's ancestor) and Carlos or Charles, born 1747 and died 1833 in Durham.

Charles is supposed, by Connecticut tradition, to have married in 1775 Marene Hébert (Marie Anne) b. 1754 (1752 according to Fr. Hébert's notation) died May 15, 1829 in Durham and was buried at Westfield, Mass. at the age of 77. She is specified by Connecticut tradition as being the daughter of Louis Hébert. Louis Hebert had lived at Grand Pré, Nova Scotia and came to Guilford, Conn. in December of 1755 and married to Anna, (last name unknown). There is also in actual fact, a record

of Charles White's death at Durham. It says he was buried at Durham at the age of 86 and that he died on Aug. 23 (Fr. Hébert says Oct. 23rd). He and his wife were also in the 1790 Connecticut Census and had been admitted to the Congregational Church in Durham on Nov. 6, 1803 (as stated in Fr. Hébert's notations).

Placide Gaudet was obviously unaware, back in 1915, that the Jean-Bpt he mentions was not a widower, but had subsequent children with the same wife, Margaret Hébert, settled at Yamachiche near Trois Rivieres, and was buried at Yamachiche in 1771. this general information is given by both Arsenault and Bergeron.

Regarding Charles' brother Jean (John), the present writer found in the State Library that Salle (sic), a daughter of John and Margaret, was born July 12, 1765 at Branford and that John himself sailed from Branford on Jan. 6, 1785 and was lost at sea. John had been married to Margaret "Eber" at Branford by Samuel Barker, J.P. on Jan. 17, 1765.

The existence of a Louis Hébert in Connecticut seems the least probable of several possibilities. father Hébert theorized that Marene (Marie Anne) Hébert was married to Charles Leblanc in 1775. He believed that she was Anne, the daughter of Pierre Hébert and Elizabeth Dupuis, but subsequently found that this Anne married at Laprairie in 1768 to Joseph Hilaire Hébert.

Mr. Placide Gaudet,  
Dear Sir,

At the request of Mr. J.F. Herbin, I am writing to you for information. I have been interested in looking up my family lineage for the past year and have spent much time in finding anything I could find which would enlighten me about the discoveries of the St. Laurence, the settling of Canada, and Acadia for here was where my interest was, in Acadia, the birthplace of my great-grandfather Carolus LeBlanc and my Great-Grandmother, Marne Hébert, but as nearly all literature this way that I could find on the subject of the Acadian Expulsion seemed to give very little of the Acadian ancestry side of the story, I made slow progress. This summer I had friends touring Nova Scotia and requested them to be sure to glean everything they could for me at Grand-Pré and much to my delight, brought me home The History of Grand Pré and little things of interest concerning the prosperity of these people. Of course all family records are apt to be obscure, but what I have I will give to you. Carolus Leblanc and Marene Hébert, children, the boy was six years of age and the girl Marene was four years old, they were with a number of families representing seven families in all, but the only name I have been able to find so far was Caroline Leblanc (In whose memory I was named) and a brother Jean Leblanc-- were put off a British ship on the Connecticut shore, near Killingworth or Guilford--while the records of Guilford do not reveal any names, it claims that a British ship landed Acadian refugees in 1755.

Our family records say they came from the Island of Menis (?), France in 1758--another family (or branch) record says there was seven families taken prisoner of war from France and that the Leblancs settled in Durham, Connecticut after marriage and had ten children. I have had no trouble in following the families down the line to the present day and I feel proud to be one of this family, for there are many who have occupied places of prominence in professional, political, and social life. One of the family letters written to me in answer to questions about our ancestry was from a rector's wife at Riverside, Connecticut. She writes thus -- I have been trying to find something that might be of interest to you regarding our ancestry. Undoubtedly, you are aware that we are Acadians--our Great-grandparents were French refugees from Acadia, separated from their parents, they were brought to what is now Clinton, Conn., where they found homes with different people. Our Great-grandfather's name was "Carolus Le Balnc" but people who cared for him translated his name to "Charles White" and Mareyn's name was changed to Irene Hébert (the fact that they were under the care of English people, in English colonies, may account for this, Mrs. Boyleton writes.)

Father said we are descendants of René Leblanc the Notary made famous by Longfellow in his tale of Evangeline--as he was the father of twenty children - this is probable - Father used to sing a French song - as he was taught by his grandfather- which he in turn had sung to him by his father René Leblanc - in his happy Acadian home at Grand Pré- I regret that I have not many of his recollections of the past in writing- the need to interest my children, telling them the Acadian legends and was proud of his French ancestry, etc. This is just only one of the letters that I have received - it is a fair sample of others & I will not write any of the others but here is what I wish to establish is the proof that Carolus Leblanc was the son of René Leblanc the Notary- it seems to be a fact that the great-great-grandfather was René Leblanc, but I would like to have proof by record- is it possible? Is it possible to trace the parentage of Marene Hébert? I have one more record I can search, for the names of those seven families- will Catholic Church records reveal anything? When the priests were taken from the Acadians, were they able to take the records, as we would call them here the Vital Statistics? I have corresponded with a gentleman who is on the Editorial Staff of the Hartford Courant as I was informed that he was interested in the Acadians, and so I wrote to him in hopes of gaining something interesting, but he rather discouraged me by telling me it would be the work of a lifetime to try and trace early Acadian ancestry. It has been a pleasure for me to try and unravel the history of these, my people, for if not established, it would soon become extinct and as memory fails - many regret we have not put them in writing, the things which have been told us by our parents - not thinking but that we might always retain them. While on my father's side I am wholly French, I am fast losing the marks of French, as I can neither read or converse in the language - much to my regret.

Carolus LeBlanc and his wife Marene Hébert had ten children:

1. Seymour- married to Phebe Merwin
2. John - married to Sally Robinson
3. Charles - married to Hannah Chalker
4. Emma 1st - married to Quartus Smith
5. Rhoda 2nd - married to Quartus Smith
6. Dency- married to Aaron Hosmer
7. Annie - married to Friend Francis, my grandfather
8. Sally - married to Jonathan Smith
9. Lizzie - married to Norris Walter
10. Clara - married to Moses Hosmer

Annie married: Friend Francis, son of Daniel, one of the early settlers of the Connecticut valley at Wethersfield town. His ancestors by this name settled there in 1657- Daniel settled later in Durham and Killingworth, Conn. and married a Miss Wicks - this family name I cannot trace but it would seem that she would be French. I am simply carrying this out so you may see I am able to follow down to the present generation which means my 2 sons and 2 daughters and 3 grandchildren - and it is largely for them I am interested in writing this tale - for they are Winslows, a peculiar fact that the Le Blancs, the Héberts, and the Winslows have been united in one family - by my marriage to Henry O. Winslow of Massachusetts at Durham, CT on January 13, 1875: My husband is a descendant from the same ancestor Edward A. of Droitwich, England as General John Winslow (Winslow Memorial) who under the command of Gov. Lawrence so cruelly led the Acadians into a trap and banished them from their homes - the heartless and cruel blot on history, as they were a peaceful people but unable to defend themselves. But I am proud of being a member of the Winslow family - there can be some better Winslows. Our grandfather graduated from Yale College in 1771 and at the outbreak of the Revolutionary War, he became an ardent supporter of the Colonies and being a man of means, he contributed largely to fitting out a war ship to attack the enemy on the high seas and went aboard as a surgeon. This ship was captured off the coast of Spain. All on board were taken prisoner of war about one year and suffered much -- after his liberation, Dr. Winslow resumed practice as a physician residing at Foxboro, Massachusetts where he reared his family. The early home of the Winslows was at Marshfield, Massachusetts.

Mr. Gaudet, if you have taken the time to follow this through and find anything of interest to you, I shall feel recompensed for my efforts and if you can give me any interesting facts of Acadian history, will you kindly inform me. Very respectfully,

Dear Madam,

Pardon me for having delayed so long to answer your long

and most interesting letter of the 3rd of December last. And yet I had not forgotten you and when your last letter of the 30th of last month was handed to me, it found me hard at work translating a French document into English, which document gives the names of the Acadian families that were, in August 1763, in Conecticut. In this list you will see that, at date, Jean Bpt. Leblanc, father of Charles or Carolus was then a widower, and had five children living with him.

This Jean Bpt Leblanc, a native of Grand Pré, was the son of René Leblanc and Jeanne Landry, his wife. This René Leblanc was not the notary sung by Longfellow but his first cousin. Their fathers were brothers but sons of Daniel Leblanc, born in 1626 in France, where he married in 1650, Francoise Gaudet and in the same year he came to Acadia and settled on the north side of the Port Royal River, now called Annapolis River. Jacques, his first son, was born there in 1651 and he was the father of René who married Jeanne Landry. Jacques had several brothers, one of them was called René, the father of the notary René LeBlanc.

Jean Baptiste LeBlanc, who was deported to Connecticut in the fall of 1755, married at Grand Pré on July 31, 1741, to Margarite Hébert the daughter of René Hébert and Marie Boudrot, his wife. By the church register of Grand Pré I find the certificates of baptism of four of their children, namely:

1. Jean-Mathurin, born 10 December, 1742 and baptized the following day. Apparently known as Jean.
2. Pierre, born September 1, 1744 and baptized the next day. Apparently he died as an infant.
3. Pierre, born and baptized August 21, 1746.
4. Jean-Charles (Carolus) born and baptized June 5, 1748. Therefore he was in his eighth year when he was deported.

The church registers of Grand Pré, after November 1748, are destroyed and the names of the other children borned (sic) to Jean-Baptiste Leblanc are not to be found. But the main thing for you was to find certificate of baptism of Carolus LeBlanc and now you know it. But you have no idea how difficult a task it has been to ascertain who this Carolus was.

LEBLANC, PIERRE: married to Josephte Landry. One boy, in the 1763 Listing.

LEBLANC, PIERRE: (Pierre-Hilaire dit Pineau) from Riviere Canards (Antoine and Marie Bourgeois) married to Francoise Landry (Antoine and Marie Thibodeau). Both were transported to Shrewsbury, Mass. and both were deceased before 1775. Children, Pierre-Hilaire (see below) and M. Rose, married at Trois-Rivieres July 29, 1767 in a civil marriage to Jean Hébert.

LEBLANC, PIERRE-HILAIRE: (Pierre and Francoise Landry) married 1st to Marie-Isabelle Hébert (Pierre and Isabelle Dupuis) at Guilford and 2nd to Marie Granger at L'Acadie, P.Q. on Oct. 25, 1784. No children in the 1763 Listing. Witnesses at the civil marriage at Guilford, CT were, Pierre Hébert, Sylvain, Dupuis, Fabien Hébert,

Joseph Hébert, Charles Richard and Jacques Hébert. Revalidated at St. Philippe, P.Q. on Jan.17,1762. Child born in exile: Marie-Claire, conditional baptism at St.Philippe on Sept.25, 1774, at age of 6 years and 5 months (born in 1768).

The 1762 Civil Marriage was performed, according to Roland Auger's article in the F.C.A.G.R. by Louis Robichaud, a church-authorized laymen exiled to Massachusetts.

See: The Parkman Diary, by Frs. D'Etremont and Hébert in the F.C.A.G.R., Vol.1, 1968, pp. 280 & 281 (including illustration of Acadian house in Guilford, CT) which refers to residence in Shrewsbury. Robert J. White, who is a faculty member of Wesleyan University, Middletown, is a descendant and has some material on the Leblancs.

LEGER FAMILY: See Les Parlers Français d'Acadie, by Genevieve Massignon, Tome 1, Paris Librairie C. Klincksieck, pp.46-47.1962.

LEGER dit LARozETTE, FRANCOIS: (Jacques and M.Madeleine Trahan) married at Port Royal on may 25, 1739 to Madeleine Comeau (Abraham Comeau and Margarite Pitre). He was born at Port Royal in 1714 and she was born in 1720. They had 8 children in the 1763 Listing born at Port Royal: 1. René-1753, Margarite-1751, Joseph-1740, Jean Bapt.-1741, M.Jos.-1743, Scholastique-1744, Francois-1746 and Charles -1749.

A Paul is mentioned by Father Hébert, born (N.Y.) marriage contract July 23, 1789, to M.Constance Poitier at Attakapas Post, Louisiana, according to Winston de Ville; it is specified that both parents were deceased before that date. Other members of this family are mentioned in Appendix B, Settlements and Settlers: Some Acadian Pioneers, in the Opelousas District--Grand Coteau Area, Michel Leger, Paul Leger,; North Plaquemine Brûlée Area, Louis Leger; p. 205, The Founding of New Acadia, by Carl A. Brasseaux, 1987, Louisiana State University Press, Baton Rouge.

From Diocese of Hartford, 1900, p.71, "We have seen that fourteen Acadians were assigned to Stratford. Among them was William Rose, a gardener. Rose married Jeannette Mann. His children were Peter, Mabel, Charity and Polly. He died April 21, 1812 at age 90 years."

"The Stratford Acadians remained steadfast to the Catholic faith, though strenuous efforts were put forth to proselytize them. The Church of England minister at Stratford bears witness to their unconquerable fidelity in the midst of the spiritual dangers that environed them. Writing to the Home Secretary, the Rev. Mr. Winslow said: "Besides these (Dissenters), there are no other sectaries among us, except a few families of French Neutrals, of inconsiderable notice, who were in the beginning of the war dispersed from Nova Scotia, and remain inflexibly tenacious of their superstitions (?). But there is not the least danger of any influence from them. It is rather hopeful that if they are not themselves, their posterity may be brought off from their errors(!) though hitherto they will not suffer any efforts of this kind."

"This Anecdote is told of Rose. It was his custom to fish in the harbor of Bridgeport in a boat, accompanied only by his dog, Lyon. One day he lost his balance and fell overboard, and was on the point of being drowned when his dog swam to him. He grabbed the dog's tail and directed him to swim for the shore. When the faithful animal had brought his master almost to the shore, he turned about and began to swim out again, when Rose in his broken French, called out: "Tudder way, Lyon." The dog obeying the command, towed his master to the shore. Orcutt's History of Stratford and Bridgeport." 1884-86.





Xavier and Magdalena and their two children Magdalena and Xavier set out on a journey to Le Havre, France, where they booked passage on the sailing vessel "Louis Phillippe." This 794 ton vessel was mastered by Captain I. Castroff. They set sail on or about the 1st of October 1847. The passenger list included #153 Ledogard, Xavier age 32 male, occupation: Farmer, Destination: France to Michigan, U.S.A.; #154 Magdalena, age 29 female; #155 Magdalena age 3 female; #156 Xavier age 1 male. After a voyage that lasted three months, the ship sailed into New York City Harbor, U.S.A. on the 31 December 1847.


