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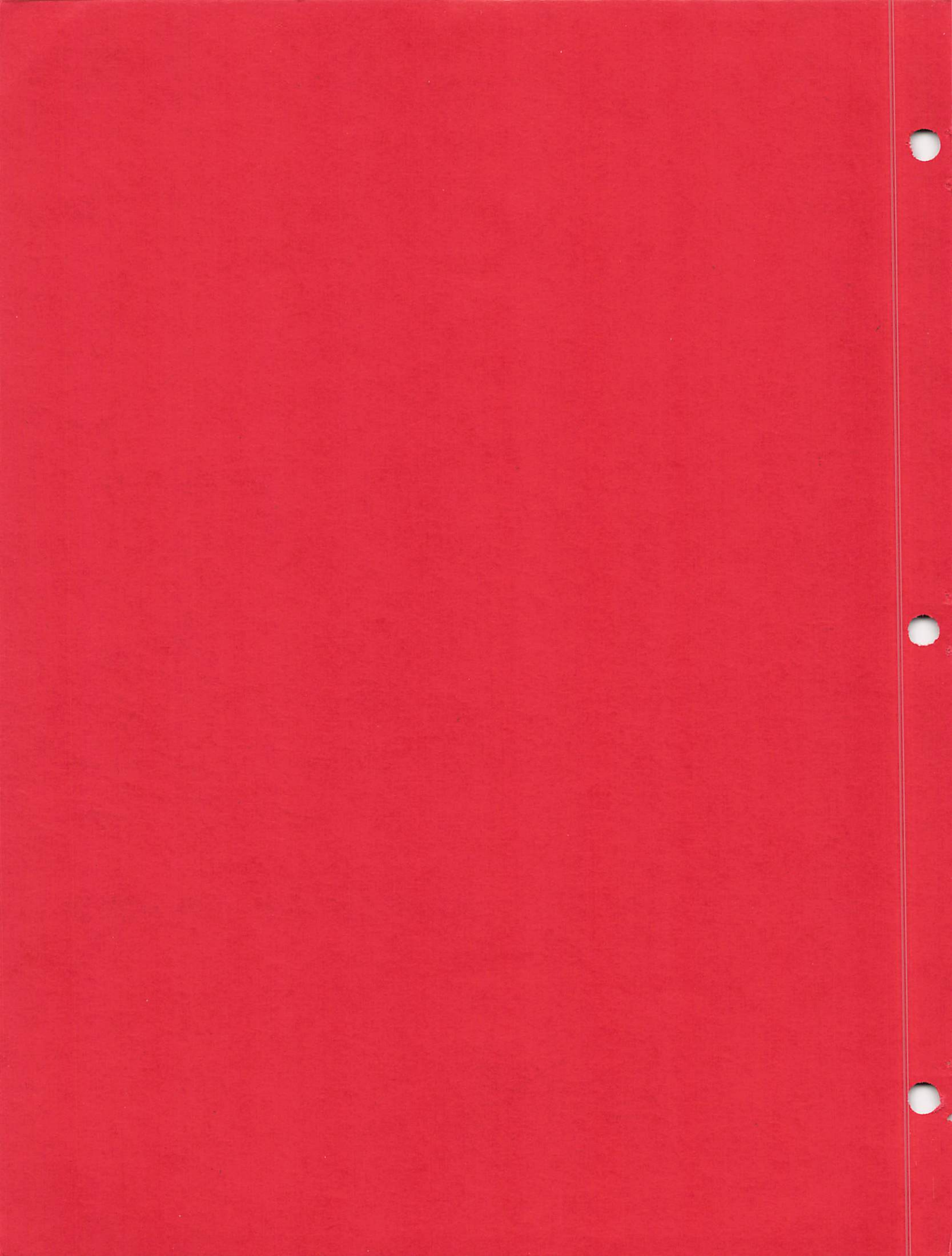

United Church Archives as a Source in Genealogical Research,
Particularly in the Provinces of Quebec and Eastern Ontario

The United Church of Canada was formed in 1925. It was a union of the Congregational Church of Canada, the Methodist Church of Canada, and the majority of the churches of the Presbyterian Church in Canada.

The records of the first two churches automatically passed into the United Church, as did those of the Presbyterian Churches which entered the union. The records of those remaining outside the union generally remained with those churches. There was some confusion in cases where there was a substantial minority either way.

These steps should be taken when looking for registers of present or past United (Congregational, Methodist or Presbyterian) churches:

1. Approach the church if still active.
2. If not, find out whether the register wanted is amongst those held at the Montreal Presbytery office on Decarie Boulevard. These will, in general, be those of churches which have closed down because of population movements.
3. Check with the Conference archives in McGill University to see whether there is a record of the register desired being held by another local church with which the desired church may have been amalgamated in the past. In some cases, churches hold registers for six or eight former churches. This record is not complete, but attempts are being made to enlarge the list.

For many years registers of births, marriages and deaths have been forwarded to local government registry offices, but this was not the case earlier.

Unfortunately, many records and registers have been lost through fires, carelessness, vandalism, etc.

Some registers have arrived at the Public Archives of Canada in Ottawa, and the Quebec Archives, and so this source should be checked. Others are in the hands of local historical societies and museums, so all local possibilities should be checked out.

If the exact name of the church, the denomination or the minister is not known, the Conference archives holds lists of churches and ministers, and a review of these may stir up memories of names. For example, if the name of a Montreal minister is known, but not the name of the church, it would be possible to find out which church he was pastor of by looking at the list of churches in existence at the pertinent time. This could be done even though the denomination was not known.

A further check could be made in some cases to see whether a family was actually connected with a particular church by looking through membership lists or other documents of local churches held in the Conference archives.

A note re church records pre-1830: Before this time ministers other than Roman Catholic and Episcopalian (Anglican) were not

allowed to perform marriages or hold Civil Registers. Marriages between two Protestants were in most cases performed by Anglican ministers, and would therefore be entered on those church records.

Belleville Cemeteries

Doing research in Belleville, Sidney Township of Hastings County, Ontario, Joan Benoit #212, shares the information she has collected about the early cemeteries of Belleville.

1. St. Thomas Church: this is the first church in Belleville, and the cemetery is beside and behind the church. It is located at the corner of Bridge and Church streets in Belleville. The cemetery is being restored and some headstones have been lifted. The Burial Records are available at the Anglican Church Diocesan Office, 190 Johnston Street, Kingston, Ontario. All the other church records were destroyed by fire about five years ago.

2. White's Cemetery (formerly known as Van Blaricons): this burial ground is located on the south side of Highway #2, 3/4 of a mile west from White's Road and Highway #2 intersection (on the way to Trenton). White's Church once stood at the cross roads. The dates in the cemetery are from 1817 onwards. Some headstones are illegible, and there are no records or burial plot plans available.

3. Hogle's Cemetery: this is situated on the 3rd Concession of Sidney Township. To get there take the MacDonald-Cartier Freeway to Aiken Road, turn south. The cemetery is at 3rd Concession Road. This cemetery is being restored, head stones have been lifted, and burial records are available.

Russian-Canadian Collection Discovered

A recent release from the Public Archives of Canada details the saga of a collection of Russian-Canadian papers compiled by Sergei Likacheff, former Consul General in Montreal, Harry Mathers, Vice-Consul in Halifax, and Constantine Ragosine, Consul in Vancouver.

These records had been housed in Washington, D.C. after the Russian consulate in Montreal closed in 1922; and had then been taken to an unknown American repository after 1933.

Likacheff, Mathers and Ragosine had lost their jobs in Canada when the Bolsheviks overthrew the Provisional Government in 1917. The Canadian Government offered them positions in the Immigration service, and in this capacity they served Russian citizens until 1922.

All three were inveterate collectors of records relating to all aspects of immigration, settlement, social adjustment, military service and relations between Canada and Imperial Russia.

For thousands of Canadians of Armenian, Soukhobor, Estonian, Finnish, Georgian, Jewish, Latvian, Lithuanian, Mennonite, Polish, Russian and Ukrainian origin a new bridge has been opened to the place they, or their ancestors, came from. Likacheff and Ragosine in particular kept accurate records on places of origin of immigrants, dates of arrival in Canada, places they settled, education, names of next-of-kin, ownership of property, and value of estates. They were legal advisers, defenders in courts, trustees of estates and monitors of claims for pensions, compensations, land grants, and support for their dependents while on war service.

Thousands of East Europeans served in the Canadian Armed Forces during World War One. Written in Russian, Finnish, Yiddish, and Ukrainian, their letters have been kept. Canadians who served in the Siberian Expeditionary Force of the Archangel Railway Brigade are often listed by name, and Canadian relief to victims of the Civil War is well-documented, as is Likacheff's effort to free interned Russians mistaken for Austrian nationals.

One ethnic group, more than any other, will find these records of enormous benefit. The immigration of the Jewish Community from Russia to Canada is exceptionally well documented. For most Canadian Jews the

lack of comprehensive records on places of their origin in Russia, Lithuania, Byelorussia, Poland and the Ukraine, has been a major obstacle to establishing their ties with a former homeland and relatives left behind.

Robert Gordon, Director of the Manuscript Division of the Public Archives of Canada, negotiated the transfer of the collection from the U.S. to Canada in April of this year. His division is now actively organizing and indexing the collection, and the papers may yet reveal a wealth of additional information once they have been properly inventoried. The task of organizing, describing, and micro-filming the material may take a year or more, at which time this priceless collection of Canadiana will be available to the public for research.

Two Quebec Families

A Family in Five Generations (Sait) by Lynn Black

Edward Sait was born in Chichester, Sussex, England on September 28, 1823. Growing up in London, he became a tailor supplying the Royal family with shirts for all occasions. He married Emma Woegers and they had seven children:

The Saits made the decision to move to Canada and Edward was given a handsome stick pin when he left the employ of the Royal family. It was in the shape of a blue bird, with the body a sapphire and the eyes two rubies.

In 1863 the family left London and moved to Quebec City where Edward became a clerk. His wife Emma had become ill on shipboard during the trans-Atlantic crossing, and died shortly after the family arrived in Quebec.

In 1864 Edward Sait married Mary Leonard. They had one son, Henry Hugh Sait, born 10 March 1865. On 15 April, 1865 the four eldest children were

baptized at St. Matthew's Chapel in Quebec City. It was on the same day that Lincoln died of his wounds in the United States.

In 1871 Edward and his family, having moved to Montreal, started their own business, a shirt manufacturing company at 480 Sagauchitiere. It is not known what became of this company. Edward gave the stick-pin given to him by the Royal family to his youngest son Henry Hugh. On 31 March 1879 Edward Sait died and was buried in Mount Royal Cemetery, Section B4, grave no. 1337.

His wife Mary Leonard remarried three times before her death twenty-seven years later, in 1906. She was buried in the Sait lot in Cote-des-Neiges Cemetery.

Of his children, Edward Jr. wrote several political and religious books before moving to California where he died. George Leopold returned to live out his life in England. Annie Adele became Mrs. Haywood and moved to Winnipeg. Emily Lenora Victoria, nicknamed Kate, moved to California for health reasons, but died in Montreal in 1935. Eleanor "Nell" graduated from the second class of the Montreal General Hospital. She never married and is buried beside her father in Mount Royal Cemetery. Harriet Anne married Henry Ross and lived in Lauretteville, Quebec where his family owned a factory. Nothing is known of Charles and Eleanor. Henry Hugh Sait married Mary-Anne Mansfield on 29 April 1890. They had eleven children:

The pin handed down to Henry Hugh was redesigned into a brooch and given to Laura. Henry Hugh Jr. was a treasurer for Farquhar-Robertson, a coal company, until his death on 19 April 1917 due to pernicious anemia. His wife Mary Anne lived until 17 March, 1955. Their daughter Lenora Anne married a William Henderson Black on 17 October 1925. They had a daughter, their only child, Carroll Elena on 26 November 1926. Mr. Black worked for the Canadian Pacific Railway and the family was transferred to Chapleau, Ontario and from there to White River, Ontario.

While in Chapleau, Carroll met a young man who also worked for the C.P.R. and in St. Basil's Church, White River, on 17 July, 1949 she married Gilbert Joseph Tremblay. The young couple had three children before Carroll died of cancer on 28 May 1955:

Shortly after Carroll's death the children were legally adopted by their maternal grandparents and their last name became Black.

Carroll Lynn is a registered nurse and as yet is unmarried. William Joseph Gilbert joined the Canadian Armed Forces in 1972 and on 25 June 1977 married Ruth Ann Bailey, and as yet they have no children of their own.

The Mansfield's by Mary Lou Collins

In 1846 the Potato Famine was at its height in Ireland. Catherine Mansfield, nee Ryan, got together with her family and discussed the possibility of moving to the New World. Her husband Patrick Mansfield must have already been dead because there is no mention of him, and Catherine is referred to as "the widow Mansfield". There is a strong presumption that Richard Mansfield, born in 1794 was Patrick's brother. Sometime in the year 1847 they set sail for the New World. As far as can be ascertained they all came from Fethard, Co. Tipperary, Ireland.

There was Catherine Mansfield, her two (proven) sons Patrick, aged 22 years, and Martin, age unknown. Not yet proven are what I believe are her other children: John aged 36 years and his wife Catherine McGee and their child Mary Anne; Edward aged 27 years and his wife Johanna Butler aged 19 years; and Bridget, age unknown. Also with them were Richard Mansfield aged 53 years and his wife Mary Gleason aged 51 years, and two sons John and William.

Catherine's son Patrick married Mary Cussack from County Clare, Ireland on 8 May 1855 at Notre Dame Church in Montreal. Patrick's occupation is listed as inn-keeper.

Johanna Carroll died five months later, in 1870, of pneumonia.

Before her first daughter Mary Ann was born, Johanna made a beautiful white Christening gown. It was all sewn by hand, and even the lace was hand-made. Mary Ann wore it on her christening day, 16 August 1866. Dennis Owen Collins born 9 Sept 1973 wore the same dress at his christening 108 years later. He was the first of the sixth generation to be baptized in it.

William later married Angelina Carr. They had one son who died of scarlet fever in 1900 at the age of 11 years.

The (not proven) son of Catherine Mansfield, Edward, perhaps was married in Ireland. His wife was Johanna Butler, born in 1828 and died 1875. They had two children:

Of all these Mansfields, only two carried on the Mansfield name. One was John who moved to Chicago, and the other was Edward, the son of Patrick Mansfield and Mary Cussack.

In Lost in Canada Vol. 6, No. 3 is an article by QFHS member Stephen C. Gilmour entitled "Tracing Anglophone Ancestors Amidst the French of Quebec". Mr. Gilmour describes his research in Quebec for his Gilmour/Aitken ancestors who lived in Montreal in the middle of the 19th century. Mr. Gilmour's claim to be a dedicated searcher is amply borne out by his research in this area. He writes clearly and concisely about the various sources he consulted and the problems peculiar to Quebec - but notes reassuringly that "the same techniques used in searching in the United States do admirably well in Quebec".
