With this issue, the Dickinson County Genealogical Society embarks on what we hope will prove to be a long and successful venture in the preservation, collection and dissemination of the genealogical records of our area.

Although the primary focus of DICKINSON DIGGINGS will be initially on the Dickinson County, Michigan, area, as interest and memberships grow, the Dickinson County Genealogical Society hopes to expand its scope to include the western portions of Michigan's Upper Peninsula and northeastern Wisconsin.

Geographically, Dickinson County is closely tied to Iron County, Menominee County, Marquette County and Delta County in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan, and to Florence County, Marinette County and Forest County in northeastern Wisconsin. Genealogical information from these and other related areas is welcomed for possible inclusion in DICKINSON DIGGINGS.

This publication will be issued in January, April, August and November. Each volume will comprise one calendar year, and the pages in the year's quarterlies will be numbered consecutively.

Each issue will contain regular features, such as marriage records, cemetery records, ancestor charts, a query section and corrections and/or additions.

A list of members and their respective addresses will be published in the April issue annually. Names and addresses of new members will be included in each quarterly throughout the year.

We welcome your criticisms, comments, suggestions and ideas. In an endeavor of this kind, it is inevitable that inaccuracies will occasionally occur. If you note an error, please send your correction to: D. JoAnn Johnson, Box 72, 227 Dean Street, Loretto, Michigan 49852.

Membership is open to all who are interested in genealogy. Dues are \$5.00 per year, and include the year's quarterlies and two free queries. Anyone joining after the beginning of the calendar year will still receive all quarterlies included in the annual membership fee. Annual membership runs from January 1 through December 31. ## SOCIETY NOTES: HISTORY AND ACTIVITIES OF THE DICKINSON COUNTY GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY

The Dickinson County Genealogical Society (DCGS) was organized on February 17, 1977, under the direction of Mrs. Olaf (Beatrice) Blomquist, for the purpose of collecting and preserving the genealogical records of the area, and to promote pride in family, no matter how humble.

Under the presidency of James LaVoie, the DCGS began the project of reading and recording the monuments in the cemeteries of Dickinson County. Work was begun on this project in May of 1978 with the Quinnesec/Breitung Township Cemetery. This cemetery reading was completed in 1980, during the tenure of President Hazel Dault. During the summer of 1980, Foster City Cemetery and Waucedah Cemetery were also read and recorded. Under the direction of William J. (Bill) Cummings, our current president, the Sagola Township/Channing Cemetery was read and recorded, and work begun on the Cemetery Park/Park Cemetery in Iron Mountain.

In September of 1981, the DCGS began copying the marriage records of Dickinson County. As there is no index of brides at present, the DCGS offered to compile one for the county. This offer was accepted by County Clerk Susan Wicklund. Work on this project is now under way, but we do not expect to complete this in the near future, as ninety years of marriages need to be copied and indexed.

Space for housing the growing collection of the DCGS genealogical materials in the Dickinson County Library was graciously provided by Director David Curtis. The library has also provided a locked cabinet for housing the rare books containing genealogical information in its collection.

Interest in genealogy was shown by the attendance of the public at several workshops held by the DCGS in the library. The DCGS's display at the Hobby Show during the 1980 Dickinson County Festival of the Arts also inspired others to begin tracing their roots.

As money becomes available through the sale of forms and membership fees, the DCGS purchases genealogical publications which are donated to the library's collection for use by everyone.

The DCGS has been fortunate in the caliber of people who have served as officers. They have given unstintingly of their time and provided direction. Officers past and present include: PRESIDENT: James LaVoie (1977-1978), Hazel Dault (1978-1981), William J. 

# DICKINSON COUNTY ESTABLISHED IN 1891; MICHIGAN'S YOUNGEST COUNTY FLOURISHES



The Dickinson County Court House and Jail, constructed in 1896, is now a Michigan State Historic Site. Despite vigorous protests from Iron County residents, Dickinson County was created from townships of Iron, Marquette and Menominee counties when Gov. Edwin B. Winans signed Bill No. 89 of Public Acts 1891 on May 21, 1891. Due to the opposition, the bill had been bandied around the House and Senate chambers in Lansing since January 14. With the final House vote of 54-26 and the final Senate vote of 17-12, Michigan's 83rd county was formed, being named in honor of Donald M. Dickinson, then U.S. Postmaster in the administration of President Benjamin Harrison.

Iron Mountain celebrated upon being named as the county seat. In early October of 1891, Gov. Winans named the following county officers: Patrick O'Connell, sheriff; John Friedrich, clerk; Anson F. Wright, treasurer; Hugh McLaughlin, register of deeds; August C. Cook, prosecuting attorney; Patrick Flannigan, judge of probate; Edward L. Parmenter, county school commissioner; David Bergeron and Alex Patenaude,

coroners; John Lane Buell, county surveyor; William C. Teller, county surveyor, filling the vacancy left by Buell.

Most of Dickinson County was carved from Menominee County which had been established in 1861 from a portion of Marquette County. Much of the famed Menominee Iron Range was located in northern Menominee County, while the southern townships were mainly devoted to lumbering operations. Thus, a natural division occurred. Dickinson County was given the mining townships which included the settlements of Waucedah, Loretto, Vulcan, Norway, Quinnesec and Iron Mountain.

Timber played an important role in the development of the northern portions of Dickinson County, as well as in Quinnesec and Norway. The Hamilton-Merriman Logging Company headquartered at Quinnesec, while the O'Callahan brothers led Norway's logging operations. In Foster City, the Morgan Lumber Company operated a sawmill. Sagola was a lumbering town founded by Patrick Flanagan and others. Ralph's early history centered around lumbering.

Channing became the area's railroad center, and the Felch area, after an early but brief mining history, became an agricultural area. Kingsford was founded when Henry Ford I built a plant on the outskirts of Iron Mountain.

People from all nations settled in Dickinson County. Some stopped only briefly, and followed the mining and lumbering industries as they expanded toward the West. Some families boast many generations here. Larger ethnic groups included the English (Cornish), Italians, Scandinavians, French and Germans.

## WAUCEDAH CEMETERY

The Waucedah Cemetery is one of the oldest, if not the oldest cemetery in Dickinson County. It has suffered badly from neglect, and when the members of the DCGS met there on September 27, 1980, there were only eight stones left.

Even several years ago, stones could be seen from the county road which runs past the cemetery. Nobody seems to know exactly what has happened to the stones that were there. Some of them may have been removed to other cemeteries in the county. Others may have disappeared due to theft or breakage.

We have been unable to find any records of the burials made in the Waucedah Township Cemetery. It is owned by the township, but no burials have been made there for many years. It is possible that use of the cemetery ceased after the Norway Township Cemetery opened.

If anyone knows of a burial in the Waucedah Cemetery which is not listed below, we would greatly appreciate recording the appropriate information with our Waucedah Cemetery records.

The Waucedah Township Cemetery is located in the NW½ of Section 23, Town 39 North, Range 28 West, Waucedah Township, Dickinson County, Michigan.

## MARRIAGES RECORDED IN DICKINSON COUNTY, MICHIGAN

Marriage records at the Dickinson County, Michigan, Court House, located in the county seat at Iron Mountain, Michigan, begin in October of 1891, when the county government began operation.

Marriages are recorded by license number. The original and the returned licenses are stored in the vault at the court house. The grooms' names are indexed, but there is no index for the brides. As the marriage records are copied by DCGS members, a bridal index is being compiled.

The marriages listed below were copied from the original documents by Hazel Dault and JoAnn Johnson. The original documents were used because many mistakes occur in the marriage ledgers due to clerical copying errors and poor penmanship. Also, the original documents contain more information. All information contained in these original documents has been included.

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

# DICKINSON DIGGINGS TO PUBLISH USEFUL REFERENCE RESOURCES ON THE UPPER PENINSULA AS NEW, REGULAR FEATURE

Historical and reference works featuring Michigan's Upper Peninsula and north-eastern Wisconsin have appeared sparingly over the last century. However, growing numbers of publications focusing on this area have been appearing in recent years as reprints of early and rare out-of-print volumes from the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries and in the form of new or previously unpublished material gathered by contemporary researchers.

Many communities in this area, particularly those located on the Menominee Iron Range, have recently celebrated their centennial, and the majority have published a book commemorating their first one hundred years. Some of these books offer excellent genealogical and historical material, and are still available for purchase. Other noteworthy publications occurred as a result of the nation's bicentennial celebration.

With this issue of DICKINSON DIGGINGS, the feature A Northern Bookshelf: An Annotated Bibliography of Publications on Michigan's Upper Peninsula and Northeastern Wisconsin of Special Interest to Historians and Genealogists will appear regularly. Suggested publications for inclusion in this bibliography are welcomed by the compiler.

The bibliography will begin with the Upper Peninsula as an entity, and then focus on the Menominee Iron Range and the counties it encompasses. Then, expanding outward, the various remaining counties in the Upper Peninsula and northeastern Wisconsin will be included.

A number of titles are publications of the Mid-Peninsula Library Cooperative, and are available for purchase from that organization, c/o the Dickinson County Library, 401 Iron Mountain Street, Iron Mountain, Michigan 49801. The initials MPLC and the price per volume, post paid, will be indicated when these publications are reviewed.

#### THE UPPER PENINSULA OF MICHIGAN

HISTORY OF THE UPPER PENINSULA OF MICHIGAN: Containing a Full Account of Its Early Settlement; Its Growth, Development and Resources; an Extended Description of Its Iron and Copper Mines; Also, Accurate Sketches of Its Counties, Cities, Towns and Villages, Their Improvements, Industries, Manufactories; Biographical Sketches, Portraits of Prominent Men and Early Settlers; Views of County Seats, Etc. By the Western Historical Company, Chicago, Illinois: A.T. Andreas, Proprietor, 1883. (Facsimile Edition by the MPLC, \$17.00 post paid) 549 pages with engravings of prominent men and early settlers and views of the county seats.

This extensive and comprehensive volume offers much to the historian and the

genealogist researching in the Upper Peninsula prior to the mid-1880's. It is still considered to be the best single volume history on the Upper Peninsula.

The contents of the book include: Geological Characteristics; The Mound Builder The Indians; Early Exploration and Settlement; Military History; Copper Mining; Early Navigation of Lake Superior; Political and Organic History; The Great Industries; Railroad System of Michigan; Religious History; Statistics; Miscellaneous; County Histories for the Following: Baraga, Chippewa, Delta, Houghton, Isle Royal, Keweenaw, Mackinac, Marquette, Menominee, Florence (Wisconsin), Ontonagon, Schoolcraft.

In addition to the above, well over one thousand biographical sketches are included in this volume. These sketches contain a wide variety of information, including usually the date and place of birth, the residences from youth to present (1883), present occupation, date of immigration to the United States (if applicable), political and fraternal affiliations, wife's name and place of residence prior to marriage, date of their marriage, occasionally the place of the marriage, a list of children, sometimes with names, and sometimes also with birthdates. At times, the wife's birthplace and date of birth is given, and frequently her father's name appears. Occasionally additional family members are named, as parents, spouse's parents, brothers, etc. Children who have died are usually mentioned by name, and sometimes a death date is included. Death dates for the subject of the sketch rarely occur, as few sketches are posthumous. However, there are numerous death dates for wives. If the man remarried, usually both wives are listed, with both wedding dates, and usually the children by each wife.

The book has not been indexed.

MEMORIAL RECORD OF THE NORTHERN PENINSULA OF MICHIGAN By the Lewis Publishing Company, Chicago, Illinois: 1895. 642 pages with 743 biographies of some of Michigan's Upper Peninsula's residents, including 35 portrait engravings.

The biographical sketches included in this volume are indexed by the individuals about whom the biographical sketches were written. No index has been compiled for other names included in these biographies. Information included in these biographical sketches would be similar to that mentioned above. Both the Dickinson County Library and the Menominee Range Historical Foundation Museum in Iron Mountain have a copy of this work.

A HISTORY OF THE NORTHERN PENINSULA OF MICHIGAN AND ITS PEOPLE: Its Mining, Lumber and Agricultural Industries By Alvah L. Sawyer, the Lewis Publishing Company, Chicago, Illinois: 1911. Three volumes with illustrations, 1,552 pages. Volume I contains a history of the Upper Peninsula, and Volumes II and III include biographies similar to those found in the MEMORIAL RECORD OF THE NORTHERN PENINSULA OF MICHIGAN mentioned above. (Facsimile Edition by the MPLC, \$35.00 per set post paid)

Like the HISTORY OF THE UPPER PENINSULA OF MICHIGAN, this work offers a wealth of information to the historian and the genealogist, including an additional twenty-eight years of data. ## SAGOLA TOWNSHIP/CHANNING CEMETERY RECORDS

Located in Section 17, M-95, Channing, Sagola Township. Township-owned. Active.

Burials in the present Sagola Township/Channing Cemetery started in 1912, after William and Raymond Shay and Erwin Miller cleared the land and prepared the site for the township cemetery. Several transients were the first to be buried here, and one of the first village residents to be interred in this cemetery was Lincoln Anderson in 1914.

Prior to the establishment of this cemetery, there was another burial ground known as the Sagola Township Cemetery, also located in Section 17, but further out on the road, near the Ford River. This cemetery is inactive, and no grave markers remain. Tombstones recorded in these records bearing death dates prior to 1912 could have been moved to the new cemetery.

The D.C.G.S. read the tombstones in this cemetery on June 20, 1981.

Northwoods News Nuggets, our other new feature, consists of bits of news taken from back issues of the Iron Mountain Press through the courtesy of the Menominee Range Historical Foundation Museum. Hazel Dault has scoured the museum's bound volumes, extracting interesting genealogical gems for this feature. Datelines

range across the Upper Peninsula and into northeastern Wisconsin.

William Cummings has compiled an index to the biographical sketches which appear in the <u>History of the Upper Peninsula of Michigan</u> (Chicago: Western Historical Company, 1883). Almost 2,000 names have been indexed, and, since this historic volume has never been indexed, Cummings' work should prove a great timesaver. For one dollar and a SASE, Cummings will check one name. We will soon have a microfilm of the Michigan State Census of Dickinson County for 1894. Since the U.S. Federal Census for 1890 was almost completely destroyed by fire, this census, the first taken after Dickinson County's formation in 1891, should be a great help. The DCGS will work at indexing this census which will be available at the Dickinson County Library for public use.

### NORTHWOODS NEWS NUGGETS

From the IRON MOUNTAIN PRESS, Menominee Range Historical Foundation Museum

PENTOGA, 5 January 1905 -- At the age of 107 years, MRS. MARGARET DOWNEY of Marinette died at Pentoga after a short illness. She was born in New York, coming to Marinette County sixty years ago. She leaves many sons, daughters, grandchildren and greatgrandchildren.

QUINNESEC, 2 February 1905 -- JOHN ST. DENNIS, one of the pioneer residents of Quinnesec, died last Thursday of heart failure. The funeral services were held at the Catholic church, Rev. N.H. NOSBISCH officiating. The deceased was 57 years old and was born in St. Hyacinth, Quebec, Canada. He has resided in Quinnesec for the past 25 years and during a portion of the time was in the mercantile business. He is survived by a wife and two daughters, and has two sisters in Canada.

MENOMINEE, 20 November 1902 -- An early settler of Menominee passed away last Thursday. MRS. CHARLOTTE LeMIEUX died at the home of her son, THOMAS LeMIEUX, at 1215 Holmes Avenue, Menominee. She was 82 years old and is survived by two sons, AMOS and THOMAS, and a daughter, MRS. WM. PARENT, of Iron Mountain. Mrs. LeMieux came to Menominee in 1853 with her family, her husband having died two years previous. She has resided in Menominee ever since. She was well-acquainted with the early pioneers of the Menominee River, and is also well-known to all the old settlers.

NORWAY, 20 October 1904 -- R.M. SAMPSON, father of Postmaster Sampson of Norway, who died in Houghton recently, was one of the copper country's staunch pioneers, witnesign its development from its infancy. He located in Houghton where a prosperous village of 5,000 people now stands. Both sides of Portage Lake at that time were covered by dense forests. Until he was sixty years of age, Mr. Sampson worked as a miner. He came to the U.S. from England when he was 23 years old. His birthplace was Devonshire and the date of his birth was June 12th, 1827. He leaves two daughters, MRS. C.D. HIBBARD of Duluth and MISS MARTHA SAMPSON of Hurontown, three sons, HENRY and WILLIAM of Hurontown, and R.M. SAMPSON, JR., Postmaster at Norway, Michigan.

MARQUETTE, 1 January 1903 -- KAW-BAW-GAM, the noted Chippewa Indian chief, whom the first settlers found at Marquette when they landed in the forties, is dead, after a two-month illness, at the age of about 103. He is survived by his wife CHARLOTTE, who is blind and helpless. Kaw-baw-gam was known throughout the U.P. He was a son of the chief of the Sault Ste. Marie band of Indians. For the past 20 years he had lived in a little cabin at the outskirts of Presque Isle park, at Marquette, supported by an allowance from the county and by contributions from PETER WHITE.

IRON RIVER, 26 September 1901 -- ANDY BOYINGTON, who lost one arm in the defense of his country during the war of the rebellion, is just now the hero of Iron River. BARNEY MORGAN stated in the presence of the veteran that he was glad PRESIDENT Mc KINLEY had been shot, and the result proved that the old soldier knows how to fight in a good cause. Morgan was severely beaten and kicked out of doors by the one-armed veteran.

CHANNING, 29 September 1904 -- ROBERT E. HAYES left last Thursday for Milwaukee where he is attending the medical college. Mr. Hayes will finish his course this year.



# A NORTHWOODS BOOKSHELF PRESENTS USEFUL GENEALOGICAL REFERENCE SOURCES ON THE UPPER PENINSULA'S MENOMINEE IRON RANGE AND DICKINSON COUNTY

Although a great amount of information can be obtained on the Menominee Iron Range and Dickinson County in books such as the HISTORY OF THE UPPER PENINSULA OF MICHIGAN and A HISTORY OF THE NORTHERN PENINSULA OF MICHIGAN AND ITS PEOPLE, books dealing more specifically with the area have been written during the past century which contain bits of information not always found in the general histories.

#### THE MENOMINEE IRON RANGE

TROUTING ON THE BRULE RIVER, OR LAWYERS' SUMMER-WAYFARING IN THE NORTHERN WILDERNESS By John Lyle King, The Chicago Legal News Company, Chicago, Illinois: 1879. (Facsimile Edition by the MPLC, \$8.00 post paid) 273 pages plus 17-page preface.

This account of an early fishing trip by a group of Chicago lawyers gives a colorful and detailed description of their trek from Menominee to points on the Brule River, the Pike River, the Michigamme River, the Paint River and the Menominee River. The twenty chapters include subheadings such as "A Cleric Curmudgeon, An Expostulary Fly-Fisher, A Lantern Hunt Organized, Red Rooster and Squaw, and Yellow Dogs." What is most noteworthy regarding this volume is that the descriptions of some of the Indians, their settlements and a few trading posts are among the earliest recorded. The following chapter subheadings might be of interest to genealogists: Section Eighteen, Stephenson's, Sturgeon Farm, To Dickey's, At Dickey's, Bad Water, Tom King, Michigami (sic) Falls, Advance on the Brule, Badwater Hamlet and King's Cabin, Badwater Lakes, Adieu to Badwater, Twin Falls, Big Quiniseck (sic) Falls, Little Quiniseck (sic) Falls, Sturgeon Farm and Sturgeon Falls, Wausauka Bend, The Relay House Again, Upper Twin Island, The Lower Menominee, The Michigami (sic), Upper Michigami (sic) Falls, Lake Mary, Paint River, Paint Falls, Lake Chicagon, Little Brule Falls, Kaquotash's Reminiscences, Dr. Andrews, Peenbinwun Rapids, Indian Encampment, Peemony (sic) Falls.

THE MENOMINEE IRON RANGE: Its Cities, Their Industries and Resources By Walter R. Nursey, 1891. (Facsimile Edition by the MPLC, \$8.00 post paid) 152 pages, including 57 halftone plates and photo-engravings.

Although Nursey attempted to obtain responses from hundreds of residents of the Menominee Iron Range prior to publishing this book to induce people to settle in the area, few responded, and inaccuracies are common. Included are chapters on the following: The Menominee River Country -- The Old and the New: The Menominee Iron Range -- Discovery and Development; The Ore and the Iron of the Menominee -- Comparative and Affirmative; The Iron Mines of the Menominee Range -- Facts and Fancies; The Cities and Towns of the Range -- Their Industries and Their Resources (Norway, Iron Mountain, Florence, Crystal Falls, Iron River)

BE-WA-BIC COUNTRY: The Story of the Menominee Iron Range in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan By Herbert F. Larson, Sr., Carlton Press (A Reflection Book), New York, New York: 1963. 392 pages with some early photographs and maps.

Herbert F. Larson's account of the history of the Menominee Iron Range is of particular value to those researching in the Iron County area, where Larson worked for many years as the county road commissioner. Although some inaccuracies occur, mainly transmitted unknowingly from earlier, erroneous sources, Larson's narrative includes amusing and informative anecdotes which may not have been recorded elsewhere regarding the settlement of the Menominee Iron Range, particularly in the Iron County region. Chapter titles are: Captain Cram Gets His Orders; Me-Ne-Ca-Ne Sepe; The State Boundary Reconnaissance; The Opening of the Wilderness; A New Iron Range; The End of the Railroad; Settlers Arrive in the Iron River District; Settlers Arrive in the Crystal Falls Area; The Organization of a County; The Land Dispute; The Mansfield Mine Cave-In; The Lumber Era; Our Indians; Better Roads; Parks and Parkways; County Road Commissions; What's Out Future?

NELSON POWELL HULST, "THE GREATEST AMERICAN AUTHORITY ON IRON"; PIONEER LIFE ON THE MENOMINEE IRON RANGE By Ellis B. Usher, The Wisconsin Magazine of History, Vol. VII, 1923-1924, pp. 385-405; and by Mrs. Nelson Powell Hulst, The Wisconsin Magazine of History, Vol. VII, 1923-1924, pp. 406-416. (Facsimile Reprint by the MPLC, \$4.00 post paid)

Ellis B. Usher's article is an excellent biography of Nelson Powell Hulst, often called the Father of the Menominee Iron Range. Portions of the biography include detailed information about Hulst's years on the Range in the 1870's and 1880's. Mrs. Hulst's narrative records her life in Vulcan, Michigan, in the late 1870's, and is an excellent account by one of the Range's pioneer women.

#### DICKINSON COUNTY

A SOUVENIR OF DICKINSON COUNTY, MICH. Published by C.O. Stiles, circa 1902. 52 pages containing 168 photographs with identifications taken at the turn of the century.

Period photographs of Iron Mountain, Quinnesec, Norway, Vulcan, Loretto and Sagola are included in this album. Public buildings, views of the business district, schools, churches, industries (including many mines) and homes of prominent men are included in this collection of photographs.

A HISTORY OF CHANNING, MICHIGAN By Viola Stevens, published by Viola Stevens, 1977. 51 pages including an appendix, reference sources, a preface and a name index, illustrated with nine photographs.

Included in this volume are chapters on the following: The Railroad; The Village; Schools, Doctors, the Law; The F.F.C. (First Families of Channing); I Remember. The appendix contains a short article entitled "Cinders and Sawdust: History of Channing, Michigan" by J.P. Channing.

HISTORY OF IRON MOUNTAIN, MICHIGAN, 1878-1914 By the Iron Mountain Women's Club, 1914. 43 pages, unindexed and without illustrations.

Four members of the Iron Mountain Women's Club gathered historical information about their community in 1914, dividing the history into four segments: 1878-1888; 1888-1896; 1896-1906; 1906-1914. While the majority of the information is not documented, many anecdotes about the early settlement of the community are included which otherwise would have been lost to posterity. Many individuals are named. Hazel Dault, member of the D.C.G.S., has made an index of the information recorded in this book.

OUR FRONTIER DAYS ON THE MENOMINEE RANGE By Mary Louise Dulan, Iron Mountain, Michigan: 1973. 93 pages plus acknowledgements, table of contents and 100 photographs.

Although the title suggests a wider scope, this book deals with Iron Mountain's past. Chapter titles are: How Iron Ore Came to the Lake Superior Area; Man's Progress Underground; The Founding of Iron Mountain; Important Dates of Iron Mountain; Mrs. Hulst -- Pioneer Life on the Menominee Range; Special Picture Section; John T. Jones; 1932--The End of the Mining Era; A Trip Into the Past; Bibliography.

BORN FROM IRON: Iron Mountain, Michigan, 1879-1979 Compiled by Mary Louise Dulan and edited by William J. Cummings, Taylor Publishing Company, Dallas, Texas: 1978. 264 pages including 15 pages of advertisements and 344 photographs with complete identifications. (Available for \$14 post paid from the Menominee Range Historical Foundation Museum, P.O. Box 237, Iron Mountain, Michigan 49801.)

Published for the centennial celebration, this volume is the most complete history of Iron Mountain currently available. Chapter titles are: Section 30; The Development of Iron Mountain; The Way We Were; The Blending of Many Cultures (Cornish, Scandinavian, French, Italian and Jewish); From Generation to Generation (50 family histories plus many family photographs and some reminiscences); Pigskins, Hoops, Knickers, Skis and Tees; Rush the Can; Extra! Extra! Read All About It!

NORWAY, MICHIGAN, HISTORICAL DIAMOND JUBILEE ALBUM (1891-1966) Norway, Michigan: 1966. 140 pages, including 38 pages of advertising and 91 old photographs with complete identifications plus Diamond Jubilee celebration photographs.

Mainly composed of chronological excerpts from the Norway Current and other sources, the book deals with the following topics in random order: mines, railroads, personalities, newspapers, schools, buildings, town, organizations, sports, logging, fire department, businesses, lumbering, travel, churches, hospital, county, banking, city, transportation, industry, police department, light department and power plant, city improvement, government, bands, mayors, war dead, map of "old" Norway.

QUINNESEC, MICHIGAN, CENTENNIAL 1876-1976 Quinnesec, Michigan: 1976. 263 pages including 37 pages of advertising and 471 photographs with complete identifications.

In addition to histories and/or photographs of about 25 Quinnesec families, this volume is divided into the following sections: History; John Lane Buell; Quinnesec Fire; Mining; Quinnesec Rebuilds; Schools; Sports; Fire Department; Scouting; Churches; Lumbering; Organizations.

VULCAN, MICHIGAN, CENTENNIAL BOOK (1872-1972) Vulcan, Michigan: 1972. 140 pages including 35 pages of advertising and 113 old photographs with complete identifications.

This centennial book contains chapters on the following: First Settler (Thomas Rice); Lumbering; Mining; Vulcan from 1872-1972; Vulcan Brick Works; Churches; Schools; Sports; Photographs of Six Early Weddings; Hydroelectric Plants; Mail Route; Charlotte Armstrong; Centennial Committee and Celebration.

DIARY OF LEWIS YOUNG WHITEHEAD, FATHER OF THE MENOMINEE RANGE 1833-1908 Mid-Peninsula Library Federation, Iron Mountain, Michigan: 1976. (Available for \$5.00 post paid) 62 pages including photographs of Lewis Young

Whitehead and Jennie Rice Whitehead.

This book includes a foreward, biographical sketch, diary, pedigree, letters, news articles, epitaph, obituaries and the family tree of Lewis Young and Jennie (Rice) Whitehead. Family histories for the following are included: Lewis Young Whitehead, Silas Whitehead and Susan Little Whitehead, John Whitehead and Phebe Turner Whitehead, Elias Little, Hannah Young, Simon Little.

JOURNAL OF GEORGE FREDERICK SEIBERT 1879 and GEORGE FREDERICK SEIBERT: A BIOGRAPHY by George S. Fisher. Mid-Peninsula Library Federation, Iron Mountain, Michigan: 1976. (Available for \$5.00 post paid) 54 pages plus a foreward by Adelaide Russell.

The following items have been printed in this volume: Journal Account from 4 May 1879 to about 24 May 1879 of Experiences on a Trip from Menominee to Vulcan; Biography: His Early Life, Chicago, Tuscorora, Iron Mountain.

LEONORA A. CROWELL LETTERS 1882-1885 Mid-Peninsula Library Federation, Iron Mountain, Michigan: 1976. (Available for \$5.00 post paid) 68 pages.

This publication of a collection of letters written by Leonora A. (Schumacher) Crowell, the wife of Iron Mountain's second physician, Dr. Joseph Addison Crowell, to her family in New Jersey shortly after her arrival on the Menominee Iron Range captures living conditions in early Iron Mountain as seen through the eyes of a young bride.

### NORTHWOODS NEWS NUGGETS

From the IRON MOUNTAIN PRESS, Menominee Range Historical Foundation Museum

IRON MOUNTAIN, 5 February 1903 -- The Commercial Hotel has been sold to Milliman Bros. On Saturday last a deal was closed whereby FRANK M. and C.H. MILLIMAN, late of Belle Plane, Iowa, became owners of the Commercial Hotel. The consideration is private.

She was married in 1860 to MICHAEL CRANE, who died 19 years ago and was one of the first employees of a Lake Superior property to be opened up. Mrs. Crane is survived by five sons and one daughter.

CHANNING, 11 May 1905 -- The Sagola Telephone Company has completed the line to Channing and has four phones in Sagola and two at Channing. The company has increased its capital stock to \$2,000 and will build to Iron Mountain this summer.

MARINETTE, 11 December 1902 -- COL. GEO. W. THORNE, an old resident of Marinette, died last Tuesday. He was 76 years old and served with the Pennsylvania troops during the Civil War. He was a member of the legislature in N.Y. in 1859 as a Whig and was elected county clerk of Marinette county for three terms. The deceased was an uncle to GEO. H. CORNING and THOMAS H. BARRON of this city.

CRYSTAL FALLS, 3 November 1904 -- "GRANDPA" CAMPBELL of Crystal Falls has written PRES. ROOSEVELT a letter to the effect that 24 members of his family would vote for Republican candidates next Tuesday, vis: seven sons, nine grandsons, five great-grandsons, and two sons-in-law and himself. Mr. Campbell is 88 years of age.

IRON MOUNTAIN, 5 January 1905 -- On Sunday next, MR. AND MRS. JOHN VAN DELL, who reside on W. Ludington St., will celebrate the fiftieth anniversary of their marriage. From near Three Rivers, Canada, JOHN VAN DELL and OLIVIA GIVAN were married fifty years ago next Sunday. Nine children were born, all living now but one. Mr. and Mrs. Van Dell have forty-five grandchildren and one great-grandchild. They came to this section some thirty years ago. There was no such place as Iron Mountain at that time, the only inhabitants being a few woodsmen. Mr. Van Dell is seventy years of age, and worked as a janitor of the Fisher Block. Mrs. Van Dell is three years older than her husband.

QUINNESEC, 13 October 1904 -- MRS. PATRICK ENGLISH, one of the pioneer residents of Quinnesec, died last Tuesday of paralysis. She was 72 years old and a native of Ireland. She came to the U.S. before the Civil War and resided several years in the state of Missouri. After the war she moved to Chicago where her first husband died and where she married PATRICK ENGLISH. They moved to Quinnesec in 1882 and Mr. English secured a position as section foreman for the North Western and two years later was accidentally killed. Mrs. English has kept a boarding house in Quinnesec. She was a member of the Catholic church. Her remains were interred in the Quinnesec cemetery beside her husband.



## RELIVING A LAKE MICHIGAN TRAGEDY

November 21 marks the anniversary of one of the cruelest, if not the worst of marine disasters on the Great Lakes in terms of human suffering and loss of life. The year was 1847.

It has to do with the voyage of the "Phoenix," a steamer designed to carry passengers and package freight between Buffalo, New York and the western ports along Lake Michigan's shores.

On November 11, 1847, the "Phoenix" left Buffalo with freight consigned to Chicago, and with a passenger list of considerably more than 200 persons aboard, including the crew and some others returning to their homes in Wisconsin.

By far, the immigrants from the Netherlands made up the largest percentage of the passengers. For them, the ill-fated journey began with leaving Rotterdam harbor near the end of September, 1847, reaching New York late in October, and from there traveling by train to Buffalo. There, boarding the "Phoenix" propeller, they were bound for ports in Wisconsin and Chicago.

The Dutch brought their gold with them to buy land and build homes in this country, as their kinfolk and friends had done before them.

The "Phoenix" encountered heavy seas on the trip down the Great Lakes, and was still on Lake Erie when Captain Sweet fell, fracturing his knee, an injury which was to confine him to his cabin for the remainder of the trip.

After passing through the Straits of Mackinac, the vessel turned her prow south-

ward, putting in at Manitowoc to take on wood for fuel, and to wait out a storm on Saturday evening, November 20.

Although still bitterly cold, the storm subsided by 1 a.m. on Sunday, and Captain Sweet gave orders to continue the trip, expecting to reach Sheboygan harbor by daybreak.

Everyone but the watch retired for the night, little anticipating that within a few hours they would be awakened by the cry of "fire" to find their boat engulfed in flames. Forming a bucket brigade, it soon became apparent that the wooden vessel was doomed!

The terror-strickened passengers clad only in their nightclothes were almost paralyzed with the bitter cold and fear of awaiting death, from which there seemed to be no escape!

Some families were separated by the flames. Others joined hands and leaped into the icy waters rather than stay aboard the burning vessel. The Misses Hazelton, daughters of a Sheboygan merchant, who were returning from a trip east, clasped hands and jumped overboard rather than die in the flames. It was a scene that beggars description!

Many heart-rending tales of heroism in the holocaust were related by those who survived the harrowing experience. One was that David Blish Jr., a young businessman of Kenosha, went about attending to and consoling the distraught passengers. Helping the injured captain into one of the two lifeboats, he refused to save himself, saying, "There is work left for me here, and I want to take my chances with the rest."

Over 160 passengers and crew met death that fateful Sunday. The two lifeboats, heavily overloaded with passengers, made the perilous journey to shore, and hopes ran high to return for the others. But the distance was too far, and the "Phoenix" had burned to the water's edge.

Twenty-five of the forty-three saved were Dutch immigrants. All possessions were lost except for the Landeweerd Family Bible.

Residents of Sheboygan were awakened by the blaze, and hurried to the north shoreline to build bonfires to warm those who survived, when but a short distance from their destination. According to her obituary, Mrs. Henry J. Wilterdink, the last known survivor of the "Phoenix," reached good age, although she "had suffered considerably for a time as a result of exposure to the cold, being obliged to leave the ship in her night clothes."

Historically, many have made arduous journeys to settle new territories via the waterways of the Great Lakes, but it is doubtful that any venture was more tragic than the last voyage of the "Phoenix."

#### UPDATE: 135 YEARS AFTER THE WRECK OF THE PHOENIX

(Taken from the November 1, 1982 Edition of the Green Bay Press-Gazette)

Three Sheboygan men think they may have discovered the wreck of the Phoenix which on November 21, 1847, burned a few miles off Sheboygan's North Point. "No one will ever know how many died in that tragic event," said William Wangemann, a Sheboygan historian who along with two divers believes the remains of the Phoenix may have settled and been found in Sheboygan's harbor.

According to old accounts, the burned-out ship was towed to shore by the Delaware steamer and moored to Old North Pier. Old writings also suggest that parts of the Phoenix and possessions of the deceased passengers were scavenged. As the city's shoreline changed, the memory of the tragedy faded.

More recently, fishermen complained that their craft were scraping on underwater protrusions. Upon investigation, the city engineer's office determined from old maps that the foot-thick piles they found were the same pier to which the Phoenix had supposedly been moored. The divers also found what appears to be the hulk of an old boat whose dimensions match those of the Phoenix, according to records checked with the National Archives in Washington, D.C. The divers have assembled the dredging equipment they say they would need to recover the wreck's propeller, which would be the key to establishing the craft's identity.

In his <u>Historic Sheboygan County</u>, Gus Buchen suggested that a suitable memorial be erected at North Point in memory of the Phoenix victims. "It's too important a thing, historically, to allow it to be forgotten," he said. That was in 1944, and Mr. Wangemann perhaps rightfully wonders why nothing has been done to date to mark the tragedy.

(EDITOR'S NOTE: Most reports state 250 passengers died in the fire aboard the Phoenix, and between 43 and 46 persons were rescured.)

The Felch and Ralph cemeteries were read by a group from the D.C.G.S. in August. Toni Cummings announced at the August meeting that nine sections of Iron Mountain's Cemetery Park have been completed. At the same meeting, JoAnn Johnson, your editor, gave a talk on her court house research techniques and what can be found in these treasure houses of records.

In September, Robert Rochon of the Erickson-Rochon Funeral Home, assisted by his wife, Kathryn, gave a very informative and interesting talk on mortuary records and the history of his occupation. President Bill Cummings displayed three books donated to the D.C.G.S. by Mrs. Ellen Cootware Conner, member, which are: Place Names Directory of Wisconsin; My Land, My Home, My Wisconsin; and the 1982 Milwaukee Genealogical Society Membership List. These volumes are now available at the Dickinson County Library.

At the October meeting Hazel Dault, past president, presided in the absence of our president. Your editor spoke on the Pennsylvania Germans, their customs and immigration patterns.

Florence Trestrail, 301 West Flesheim Street, Iron Mountain, Michigan 49801, the author of the feature article, has a list of most of the passengers who were aboard the ill-fated Phoenix. She will check her list for you for a S.A.S.E.

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## NORTHWOODS NEWS NUGGETS

## From the NORWAY CURRENT, Menominee Range Historical Foundation Museum

MENOMINEE, 18 July 1885 -- WM. J. PENBERTHY, the founder of the first newspaper published on the range passed away at the residence of his brother in Menominee, Sunday last, of consumption. His remains were sent to Dodgeville, Wis., for burial.

NORWAY, 4 September 1886 -- Mr. O. PAUQUETTE and family left for their new home in Rhode Island. They were among the earliest settlers in Norway and will be missed.

ESCANABA, 13 March 1886 -- The Gov't light house at Escanaba was destroyed by fire on Friday last and keeper Mrs. TERRY, who has had charge of the light for seventeen or eighteen years, perished in the flames.

QUINNESEC, 1 January 1887 -- FELIX LaBROOK and wife of Quinnesec have been sorely afflicted. One of their children died and while going to the funeral two others caught cold and both died in a few days.

NEGAUNEE, 19 September 1885 -- Negaunee lays claim to the oldest man in the state. His name is BARTHOLOMEW KEATING and he says he is 105 years of age.

NORWAY, 9 October 1886 -- Married on Wednesday, Oct. 6, at the Colwell House parlors, by Justice of the Peace THOMAS HAY, Mr. VINEEZO NOMELINI to Miss JESSIE WOODMAN, both of Iron Mountain.

WAUCEDAH, 25 September 1886 -- Sudden death here on Saturday last of an old man named LUKE STANTON who lived alone at the kilns...veteran of the War of the Rebellion, as Corp. of Co F, 5th Michigan Infantry...born in Ireland and was 63 years of age. The remains were interred at Quinnesec.

NORWAY, 10 November 1888 -- JOHN JOHNSON, of Klenshyttan, Sweden, grandfather of PERRY JOHNSON of this office arrived here Tuesday to remain permanently.

FOSTER CITY, 7 November 1885 -- A new station called Foster City has been opened on the Peninsula Division of the C & NW railroad. It is located about five miles from Metropolitan.

MARINETTE, 2 January 1886 -- From the Menominee Herald we learn that Mr. OSCAR J. BROWN, brother of A.C. BROWN, died at his residence Sunday evening last. He was 51 years of age and a resident of Marinette about five years. The deceased was the father of E.L. BROWN of East Vulcan.

NORWAY, 6 June 1885 -- There not being many old vets left in our town it was not over well represented; however we had one in the person of D. FITZGERALD, an old timer and a survivor of Andersonville prison who with his wife participated in the exercises at Escanaba on decoration day.

QUINNESEC, 6 February 1886 -- Married at Quinnesec, Mr. L.N. CLEVELAND to Mrs. OCTAVIA FORT. The ceremony took place at the residence of the bride.
