This officer, aide-major of the French fleet and ship's lieutenant (on the Tonnant), after having had the good fortune of risking his life in the service of the United States, was tending to his duties when he was made the victim of a brawl instigated by badly-intentioned persons; died (the 15th September 1778) still feeling the same loyalty to America; the bonds of duty and good feeling which link his compatriots to the city of Boston were thereby re-inforced. May all such efforts taken to separate France and the United States come to similarly unfruitful ends. This is the prayer that, in centuries to come, every Frenchman and every American will address to Almighty God when casting his eye upon the tomb of a young man taken from his friends; their (friends) only consolation in their bereavement will be that of seeing similar floral tributes scattered upon his tomb.

This inscription was prepared by the Comte d'Estaing, Commanding Admiral of the first French fleet sent to the United States of America by the King of France.

This inscription, taken from a monument in King's Chapel churchyard in Boston, though mournful in tone, provides a suitable opening thought for this journal, dedicated to Franco-American genealogy and history.

To accompany this first installment of the French-Canadian births of New Bedford, it is only fitting that the name of Louis-Zephir Normandin be mentioned. The "Father of the French-Canadians of New Bedford" was born at St-Jacques-le-Mineur, Quebec, on October 9, 1851, into the family of Antoine Normandin and Emelie Pinsonneault. One of nine sons and three daughters, several of whom were to come to New Bedford, Louis-Zephir destined himself at an early age to the practice of medicine. After attending the parish school, he was sent to the Sulpician Fathers' College in Montreal. Graduating after an eight-year course, he was accepted by Victoria College, Montreal, from which institution he received the degree of Doctor of Medicine in 1879.

No sooner had the ink dried on his diploma, so to speak, than did the young doctor head south for New Bedford. The city, though holding much promise for industrial workers, counted approximately 1,000 French-Canadians among its' inhabitants in 1879 - a far cry from the 15-20,000 Francos who would call the city their home twenty years later. Doctor Normandin could doubtlessly sense the future quite well.

By the Spring of 1880, his medical practice was well under way, as is evidenced by the reports of births which he begins to make to the City Clerk. It is because of Doctor Normandin's meticulousness in recording births that we possess indications as to the places of origin of a good many early Franco-American families. The practice of recording the mother's full name had established itself in the city birth records by 1865, when the first Franco-American birth was recorded. Although Dr. Normandin cannot be said to have originated this custom, he nevertheless did render the spelling of names much more intelligible, while making the added notation of parish of birth for each parent. Previously, the note "Canada East" had sufficed. For several years, his were the only birth entries to record this data with any consistency.

The year 1881 saw his marriage to Marie Goulet, born July 19, 1857 at Wotton (Wolfe), Quebec, the daughter of Julien Goulet and Flavie Houle. She had come to the U.S. with her family, at age nine, settling in Holyoke, Mass. In 1870, the family moved to New Bedford.

The young doctor lost no time in moving towards obtaining American citizenship. Firmly convinced that the ballot was the only way that his people could secure their rights, he was an early proponent of citizenship drives.

Normandin was elected to the school committee in 1883, winning

among a field of four candidates. He polled more votes than all his competitors combined. This first term on the school committee lasted two years.

By 1886, we find Dr. Normandin still further immersed in Franco-American affairs. In June of that year, the Franco-Americans of Providence invited their compatriots from New Bedford to join them in the St-Jean-Baptiste Day celebrations. The city's French-speaking element lacked any sort of organization which might take part in the parade. It is here that the doctor stepped in to distribute badges to 100 members of the National Club. Thus "transformed" into a marching unit, the members made the trip to Rhode Island. Shortly thereafter, these men formed the nucleus of the "Zouaves", a para-military organization whose chief purpose was the carrying-on of fencing and marching drills for public display. The members, brightly attired, made more than one contribution to local celebrations during their 17-year history.

Upon the occasion, in 1893, of a three-week absence of Dr. Normandin in Canada, the Zouaves organized a grand reception in his honor. Upon arriving in New Bedford, the doctor found himself the guest of honor at a banquet held in the Wansutta Club, attended by more than 300 persons.

The Zouaves were to continue their marches and drills until 1903 when they merged with the Franco-American Confederation.

A second round of political activity began for Dr. Normandin in 1897 with his election to the city board of aldermen. A first attempt, the previous year, had resulted in defeat for the doctor. Running as a candidate from Ward 2 on Dec. 8, 1897, he defeated his opponent with a plurality of 450 votes out of 7,184 cast. Normandin was to be returned to office every year until 1904. In 1903 he had the honor of being named chairman of the board of aldermen.

Political activity was but one facet of the doctor's concern for the physical well-being of his people. His vocation remained that of the man of medicine. In an era when most doctors could be described as "general practitioners", Doctor Normandin chose rather to be an obstetrician. The record of no other local physician could (by 1914) approach that of Doctor Normandin in child-birth attendance. In his 34 years in the city, he had delivered some 7,600 children, or more than 220/ year for the length of his practice.

Three years after his arrival in New Bedford, the doctor founded his own pharmacy on North Acushnet Avenue. Changing its' location

in 1890, he returned his store to its original location in 1898. His assistant, Alexandre Petit, was to become his son-in-law by marrying the doctor's eldest daughter, Azelia.

The doctor returned to city affairs in 1907 when he was appointed member of the board of health. Here he served from January 1907 to January 1915, and again from 1917 to 1919, being the only physician on the board throughout these years.

By the year 1920, Doctor Normandin was approaching the end of a long life of public service. Nearing the age of 70, he chose to retire. Never lacking the esteem of his compatriots, he had been the guest of honor at still another banquet, four years earlier. This gathering had been held in Sharpshooters' Hall, and had been attended by some 500 people.

The doctor was to spend barely four years in retirement. On January 20, 1924, he would suffer a stroke which would end his life. Surviving him were his wife, Marie, son Alfred, and two daughters, (Miss) Ella and Azelia Petit. Another son, Romeo, had preceded his father in death by two years.

Of the numerous brothers and sisters of the doctor, only three remained: Camille and Narcisse, both of New Bedford, and Mme. Delphine Guerin of St-Jacques-le-Mineur, Quebec.

Among the social organizations of which the doctor had been a member were Loyal Alpha Lodge, Manchester Unity IOOF; New Bedford Lodge No. 73, Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks; Court of Good Will, No. 25, Foresters; Les Franco-Americains; Les Francs-Tireurs; L'Union St-Jean-Baptiste d'Amerique; Le Grand Conseil Franco-American; Le Club Laurier; and the Club Rochambeau.

The tale of Dr. Normandin's popularity does not end with his death. Plans would soon be under way for the erection of a Junior High School in his memory. The location was to be in the French "North End" of the city of New Bedford. Normandin Junior High was completed by mid-March of 1927. Two years later, it was to welcome the portrait of its' namesake, a 3/4 length, life-sized work, executed in New York City by Lorenzo DeNevers, a French-Canadian who had received his art education in Paris.

Mrs. Marie Goulet Normandin would live on eight more years, dying on Nov. 6, 1937.

A quote from l'Indépendant, the French-language newspaper of New Bedford, accurately sums up the character of Doctor Normandin,

at the same time assigning him a fitting epitaph: "In the days when the vigor of his youth permitted him, he was always at the front, anticipating the needs of the sick, and his services he lavished upon them, making it above all a pleasure to be useful to the suffering. It is that generosity and that continued attention to the distress of his fellow countrymen that has earned him the just title of "The Father of the Canadians of New Bedford."

Border Warfare and the Stebbins Family of New England and Canada

Students of American history are familiar with the story of Deerfield, Massachusetts, a secluded frontier outpost attacked by a force of 200 French and their Indian allies, February 29, 1704. Though the raid is remembered today for the hardships inflicted upon the inhabitants of the town, the episode was but one in a series of related events illustrating the long struggle waged by France and England for control of North America.

This warfare dated back to the earliest years of colonization, reflecting in large part the wars waged on the European continent by the two mother countries. In America, economics lay at the root of the problem: Britain had welcomed the foundation of American colonies, first as a convenient way of disposing of religious dissenters, then as a means of redistributing excess population -- all the while building up a protected foreign market for domestic manufactured goods.

French attitudes toward colonization could not have been more different. In spite of Champlain's noble efforts to set the foundations of a thriving colony, New France retained the character of a commercial outpost for the first fifty years of its existence. Missionaries did in fact make inroads among the native Indians; colonists did cross the ocean to settle at Quebec, Trois-Rivieres, and Montreal, but this happened more in spite of government authorities in Paris than with their vowed support.

For enterprising Frenchmen, the chief attraction of Canada lay in the quick fortunes to be made in the fur trade. The demand for beaver pelts, then the rage in the manufacture of men's hats, had all but wiped out the animal in Western Europe. In contrast, the lakes and streams of North America abounded with the creature, a fact which led one company after another to bid upon the trading monopoly granted for specific periods of time by the French government. One of the conditions laid down by the government was that the individual companies agree to transport specified numbers of colonists to Canada within given periods of time.

Such recruitment and transporting seemed to many stockholders to be a waste of energy and monies that could well be returned as profit. The result was a meager - if at all noticeable - effort at colonization on the part of the fur-trading interests. Until the arrival of Colbert in the Paris ministries, even the government lacked the will to develop these Canadian settlements.

Colbert understood the necessity of building up foreign markets for French goods -- as well as securing the French foothold in North America against incursions by the British.

The year 1662 was marked by the cancelling of the charter of the Company of New France and the making of New France a royal province under the direct control of Paris. Three years later, in 1665, the Carignan-Salieres Regiment was sent to Canada to make the colony safe from the Iroquois, while several hundred settlers, including the "filles du roi" were sent forth from France at the king's expense.

Though Colbert had no intention of draining the population of metropolitan France for the benefit of Canada, he nonetheless championed the cause of Canadian prosperity. His actions, combined with the wise administration of the Intendant, Jean Talon, resulted in the population moving from 3,215 in 1666, to 6,705 in 1673. The population would continue to grow, reaching 9,400 in 1679.

After 1675, this increase in population would be largely internal, receiving little support from immigration. The colony had been made militarily safe, though only for a short while. As for royal interest in colonization, it too declined, with the result that despite the healthy advances made in the establishing of a viable agricultural community on the banks of the St. Lawrence, the life-blood of the colony continued to lie in the fur trade.

Young, unmarried colonists frequently chose the exciting life of the coureur de bois over the more secure, but sedentary life on the seigneurié. Travelling the uncharted lakes and rivers, they bartered with the Indians and brought their precious catches of furs back to trading counters, usually in New France, but occasionally to the English if the price was right.

Despite the presence of Europeans in the forests, the survival of the fur trade depended in great measure upon staying in the good graces of the Indian tribes. The natives, quite aware of the power struggle going on between their northern and southern neighbors, were more than happy to play the one off against the other in the hopes of improving the market for their furs. The English had inherited the Dutch trading posts at Albany and elsewhere, and had just as much to gain as the French from the successful exploitation of the fur trade with the interior of the continent. The fact that both the English and French maintained a vital interest in the fur trade could not help but set the stage for much bloodshed in the coming years.

French and English skirmishes in the New World usually coincided

with larger conflicts at home. Such was the case when William of Orange ascended the English throne in 1688, deposing his father-in-law, the Catholic James II. The door was thus thrown open to hostilities between the English king, and Louis XIV who regarded each other as mortal enemies. In North America, this conflict first manifested itself with the French and Indian raid upon Schenectady, where 60 inhabitants were killed and 80 more made prisoner.

A second party was later to raid Salmon Falls, on the Maine-New Hampshire border. Later, Fort Loyal, on the site of present-day Portland, was attacked by French and Indian forces.

English reaction included the capture of Port-Royal and the destruction of the Chignecto settlement (Acadia), by a Massachusetts force under Phips. The same Phips commanded a sea invasion which culminated with an unsuccessful attack upon Quebec City. Earlier, in August, 1689, a force of 1,500 Iroquois, allies of the English, had sacked the settlement of Lachine, killed 20 - 30 inhabitants, and carried off nearly 100 more into captivity.

By 1702, England and France were again at war, this time on opposing sides on the question of the Spanish succession. Queen Anne declared war on France, May 4, 1702, after Louis XIV had compounded the issue by declaring the "Old Pretender" to be king of England. In the New World, a new round of fighting was about to be launched.

In August of 1703, Vaudreuil, then governor of New France, launched an expedition to terrorize the English settlements in Maine. At about the same time, English raids upon the Abenakis, allies of the French, prompted these tribes to request the aid of the French in securing safety from English incursions. Word was sent from France ordering Vaudreuil to refrain from further border warfare, but this message arrived too late to prevent the outfitting of an expedition against Deerfield, Massachusetts, in February of 1704. Two hundred French and one hundred forty Indians were assembled and sent south. After a long march through deep snows, the party reached Deerfield, at that time a remote frontier settlement on the Connecticut River. The town had suffered once before from Indian attacks, and had all but been abandoned, only to be resettled in the 1680's. At dawn on the morning of February 29, 1704, the combined French and Indian force descended upon the town and put much of it to the torch. When the invaders retreated, they left between 40 and 50 English dead, while carrying off some 100 prisoners.

Indian warriors were responsible for the majority of these

captures, this being caused by their practice of adopting individuals to take the place of deceased family members, and also by the fact that these captives would be readily ransomed by the French in Canada.

Despite the number of captives taken, the majority of these were eventually returned to their place of origin in New England, this through the efforts of Ensign Jonathan Sheldon, among others, who made trips to Canada to effect prisoner exchanges and ransoms.

Despite the untiring efforts of men like Ensign Sheldon, numerous prisoners chose to remain in Canada, either because they had been mere children when abducted, or because life in New France was more palatable than that of Puritan New England. One such notable case of captives who chose not to return, was that of the John Stebbins family.

John Stebbins, born Jan. 28, 1647, and a carpenter by trade, had married, ca. 1682, Dorothy Alexander, daughter of John Alexander and his wife Beatrice, of Newton, Mass. John was among the third generation of his family to live in New England. The progenitor of the Stebbins family, one Rowland Stebbins, had come to America on board the Francis of Ipswich, England, in April of 1634. He had been baptized in St. Mary's Church, Bocking, Essex, Nov. 5, 1592, later marrying Sara Whiting in the same church, Nov. 30, 1618.

Rowland landed at Boston with his wife and four children. He settled at Roxbury where he remained for one year, moving inland to Springfield in 1635. It was here, fourteen years later, on Oct. 4, 1649, that his wife of 31 years died, aged 58.

Rowland was yet to move to Northampton, being among its' first settlers ca. 1656. He died there Dec. 14, 1671, aged 79 years.

To Rowland and Sara were born two sons and two daughters: Thomas, 1620-Sept, 1683(Spfd), married first to Hannah Wright, secondly to Abigail Mun, and father of nine children; Sarah, b. 1623, m. Jan. 14, 1641, Spfr. to Thomas Merrick; John, b. 1626, m. Mary, widow of Abraham Bunden, and secondly to Abigail Bartlett; Elizabeth, b. 1628, m. March 2, 1646, to John Clark of Springfield.

John Stebbins, though present at Roxbury in 1651, bought a house in Springfield during that year. His record is that of a public-spirited man. Made a selectman in 1654, he served on numerous committees, among them those of land surveying (1659); laying out of highways (1661); and building of a new meeting house (1661). He served as juror (1661) and was chosen bailiff responsible for the clearing of wayward cattle and swine from public meadows. He signed

a covenant April 18, 1661, organizing the church of Northampton. Among John Stebbins' other activities was that of keeper of the saw mill, the place where he eventually died, March 9, 1679. Although he seems to have been killed by some runaway logs, the sudden-ness of John Stebbins' death led his neighbors to draw conclusions as to the suspicious nature of his passing. A jury of inquest ruled that witchcraft had been responsible for "several hundred spots, small ones, as if they had been shot with small shot, which we scraped and under them were holes into his body." The evidence was forwarded to Boston, but nothing came of the case.

John was twice married, first on May 14, 1616, to Mary, widow of Abraham Munden, probably the daughter of Thomas Munson of Hartford. He married second, Nov. 17, 1657, to Abigail, daughter of Robert Bartlett of Northampton. After John's death, his widow married, Dec. 28, 1681, Jedediah Strong; she died July 15, 1689. From John Stebbins' first marriage were born five children; from his second- eleven.

The first of these many children was named John after his father. Born January 28, 1647, he soldiered under Captain Lothrop and was the only man to have survived the Bloody Brook massacre at Deerfield in the 1670's. This massacre resulted in the temporary abandonment, and subsequent resettlement of Deerfield. Undaunted, this second John married and returned to Deerfield where his children were born: John-1683?; Abigail-Jan. 4, 1684; Samuel-Dec. 25, 1688; Thankful-Sept. 5, 1691; Ebenezer-Dec. 5, 1694; and Joseph- April 12, 1699.

Before the raid of February 29, 1704, there had been living at Deerfield three Frenchmen, two of whom remain nameless, the third of whom was referred-to as James Denio or Denieur.

In 1700, a Jean de Noyon, and one Gosselin, both probably "coureurs de bois", had addressed a memorial to Gov. Bellomont of New York, requesting to become English subjects, and promising to bring 52 more young Frenchmen to do their fur-trading at Albany. This Jean de Noyon, and the Jacques/James of Deerfield, may have been the same person.

In any event, James Denio married Abigail Stebbins, daughter of John and Dorothy, at Deerfield a mere 26 days before the French and Indian attack. It is this fact which probably accounts for the fact that all of John Stebbins family were spared, not only at Deerfield, but along the trail to Canada as well.

We may perhaps assume that the family fared better than the

average prisoner in Canada. Their ready-made alliance with a Frenchman may well have softened their living conditions and disposed the Stebbins family - at least the children - to integrate themselves among their captors. When Abigail and Jacques' first child was born, Dec. 26, 1704, only two days passed before the child René was baptized by the parish priest at Boucherville. The couple had settled in the home parish of the DeNoyon family.

Though Abigail's children were baptized into the Catholic Church at about the time of their birth -- Gabrielle, 1705; Jean-Baptiste, 1707 (d. 1708) -- their mother waited until May 28, 1708 before making a similar step herself, receiving the sacrament of baptism from the hands of Père Mériel. Her godparents were none other than the Governor -- the Marquis de Vaudreuil, and Marguerite Bouat, wife of Antoine Pascaud, the king's treasury clerk. Upon baptism, she was given the name Marguerite, probably in honor of her godmother.

If the newly-married couple had found some comfort among Jacques' relatives upon their arrival in Canada, this welcome had worn a bit thin by 1708. The soldier/ courieur-de-bois Jacques was not well disposed to the sedentary life of a family man. Abigail, with two children to care for, was reduced to petitioning the king's council to grant her a tract of land for the support of her family.

"Humbly petitioning, Marguerite Stebe, wife of Jacques de Noyon, English woman, shows that with the consent of her father and mother she had married in her country the said Noyon, who was there at that time; upon the assurance that he would give her un établissement considerable and that he possessed much property (de grands biens) in this country where she came with him and where, having found nothing not even a home (pas même aucun asile pour se retirer) she has been obliged to support her family by the work of her hands; to live at the expense of charitable persons, receiving nothing from her husband as her work does not suffice to feed her numerous family, she has been advised to purchase land in Boucherville, which is offered at a reasonable price; agreement for payment during a long term being made in her own name which land she hopes to pay for when due....both by her heirs and labor as by the help she hopes for from her parents when it shall have pleased God to give us peace...." **

Her petition granted, she and her heirs were given a concession of 75 arpeni; in the seigneurie of Boucherville, and charged a seigneurial

rent of 3 livres 15 sous, and 3 live hens. The price of the land was to be 260 livres, to help defray the 500 livres paid to Marguerite Godet, widow of Charles de Couagne, by Pierre Boucher for her land and house, said properties having been sold to Marguerite Stebbins.

In spite of the marital difficulties alluded-to in Abigail's petition, domestic life seems to have regained a more conventional character after the land grant was finalized. A fourth child, Jean-Baptiste was baptized in 1708; a fifth, Francois, in 1710; followed by Dorothee, Oct. 3, 1711, Marie-Josephe-1713 (d. 1714), and Jacques-René in 1715. Their ninth child, Marie-Charlotte, was baptized in 1716. A second Marie-Josephe arrived in 1718, being followed by Marie-Magdalène in 1720, and then by Joseph in 1724.

On July 6, 1725, permission was granted Charles Grain, Nicolas Pinet, René Lebeaux, and Abigail Stebbins to journey to Deerfield to seek out the latter's relatives. Already pregnant with her thirteenth child, she embarked some time later, before the end of the summer, and was at Deerfield when the child was born on February 27, two days before the 22nd anniversary of the massacre.

Returning to Boucherville with her companions, Abigail there spent the remaining years of her life. It was in the parish cemetery that she was buried, November 15, 1740. Her husband Jacques followed her in death five years later, aged "about seventy-eight."

Abigail's brother Samuel, though present in Canada as late as 1723, has left no further trace in that country. A list of returned captives, compiled in 1731, would have him returned to New England, yet neither in New England is any mention to be found of the man.

Their sister Thankful, however, left a clearer record. Three years after her capture, she was baptized at Chambly. The ceremony took place April 23, 1707, the girl being 15 years old at the time. Her godparents were Messire Hertel de Chambly and Madame de Pérygny, wife of the commandant of the Chambly fort. The previous year, Thankful had petitioned for French citizenship.

She is to be found at Boucherville in 1707, where, under her new baptismal name of Thérèse, she sponsors one of her sister Abigail's children in baptism. Thankful-Thérèse may well have continued to live at Boucherville with her sister and brother-in-law, for it is there on February 4, 1711, that she married Adrien-Charles Grain-Lavallée, son of Charles LeGrain and Louise LaFortune.

Returning to Chambly, she settled there with her husband and set about founding a family. To Thérèse and her husband were born

five daughters and one son: Françoise-Thérèse in 1713; Marie-Jeanne, 1716; Charlotte, bapt. Jan. 6, 1720; Isabelle, bapt. Jan. 3, 1722; Antoine, 1723; Marie-Thérèse, bapt. Feb. 2, 1725; and lastly Véronique, bapt. on July 4, 1729. The labors of this last birth were apparently too much for the mother for one week later, we find the record of her burial in the cemetery of Chambly (July 11, 1729).

The fourth Stebbins child, Ebenezer, was baptized at Boucherville in June of 1708. He had been living with his sister Abigail, perhaps since his capture. Two years later, under the name Jacques-Charles, he was made a French subject. He stayed in Canada at least thru 1723.

The last of the Stebbins children to stay in Canada was Joseph. Although his baptismal certificate has not survived, his marriage contract was registered by the notary Loiseau on Nov. 18, 1734. His wife, Marguerite Sansoucy, was the daughter of Guillaume Sansoucy and Catherine Limousin. Only four years old at the time of his capture, Joseph Stebbins probably kept few memories of life in New England. It is through the union of Joseph Stebbins and Marguerite Sansoucy that the Stebenne name established itself in Canada. "Stébenne" was the gallicisation which eventually prevailed over the original Stebbins.

To this couple were born seven children: Joseph, 1735; François, b. and d. 1741; Marie-Suzanne, 1744; Pierre, 1746; François, 1751; Marie-Anne, b. and d. 1753; and lastly Jean-Baptiste.

Though five of their children chose to remain in Canada, John Stebbins and Dorothy Alexander maintained their loyalty to the British Crown. Within a few years of their capture, they made their way back to Deerfield, doubtlessly through the efforts of Ensign Sheldon, or of men like him who arranged for the release of so many New England captives. They returned to their home, joined by their eldest son John.

In spite of the fact that the Stebbins children congregated in and about Chambly and Boucherville, they seem to have been kept from their parents who were not able to remove even the youngest of their progeny from Canada when they themselves chose to leave.

Memories were more bitter for John Stebbins who had lost a brother, Benoni, and sister, Hannah Sheldon, in the raid that made him and his family captives. Ten years after the raid, we find John and his wife living in Deerfield. During that year, young René DeNoyons came south for the purpose of visiting his grandparents. Only ten years old, the boy must have been taken in by the "exotic" nature of the New England town, in much the same way that his aunts and uncles

had been affected by the strange Canadian environment. When the boy's Indian companions were to return north, the boy was nowhere to be found.

The young René, renamed Aaron by his English-speaking relatives, undoubtedly became the comfort of his grandparents' old age. For the elder Stebbins, who was approaching the age of 70, this child must have seemed as a sort of compensation for the five children who had been taken from him. In any case, the child was raised in Deerfield, marrying Anna Coombs at that place, July 8, 1730. He would become the father of thirteen children born with the anglicized surname Denio: Aaron, b. Mar. 24, 1731; Anna, b. May 4, 1732; Joseph, b. Mar. 8, 1734; Seth, b. Aug. 5, 1736; Abigail, b. Feb. 18, 1738; Ely, b. April 21, 1740; Baptist, b. Nov. 20, 1741; Sarah, b. Jan. 15, 1744; Elizabeth, b. Jan. 16, 1746; Dorothy, b. Feb. 7, 1748; Seebury (daughter), b. Aug. 19, 1750; Rebecca, b. Mar. 3, 1751; Solomon, b. Aug. 19, 1753. All births were registered at Deerfield.

When Aaron/Rene Denio/DeNoyons married in 1730, his grandfather had already been dead seven years. John Stebbins had died, making reference in his will to his children who remained in Canada. Of his family, only his wife Dorothy, his son John, and grandson Aaron were to be found in New England. Dorothy survived him for at least ten years, being present at Newton in 1733.

As for the Frenchman Rene DeNoyons (Aaron Denio), he had by his wife Anna thirteen children, born between 1731 and 1753. The prospering of this family brought to full circle the story begun in 1704 which saw the English Stebbins family implanted in Canada, and now the French DeNoyons integrated among the English of Massachusetts.
