

"Mister Zero"
by Albert H. Ledoux

One of the most colorful characters to live in New York City during the twenties and thirties was a man named Urbain Ledoux. Like many other New Yorkers, this man was not a native of the city. He was not even American-born, having first seen the light of day at Ste-Helene-de-Bagot, Province of Quebec, Canada.

His parents, Joseph and Octavie Ledoux, had been among the thousands of Quebecois who, in the late nineteenth century, had answered the call of the New England cotton mills. Married in 1866, they lived for awhile in Baltic, Connecticut. By combining his mill wages with the modest revenues which he earned as a book-seller, Joseph Ledoux was able to return with his wife to Canada and purchase a farm at Ste-Helene. It was there that Urbain, their first child was born August 13, 1874. Six other children would follow, four boys and two girls. Of these, only the girls, Josephine and Aurise, would survive.

Urbain was still a very young child when his parents again felt the urge to venture south. This time, their destination would be Biddeford, Maine, a community which was, and still is, largely Franco-American.

Joseph Ledoux was apparently an enlightened man for the times, as he saw to it that his only son should benefit from a good education. After graduating from parish schools in Biddeford, the boy was sent off to boarding school at Marieville, Quebec. Still later, he spent time at the Marist Fathers' Seminary at Van Buren, Maine. Graduating from this course of study, he began working as a journalist, first in Biddeford, then in Montreal,

and later in Woonsocket, RI.

A turning point in Urbain's life occurred when the young man was 23. A man whom he disliked had applied for the position of American consul at Trois-Rivieres, Quebec. Urbain applied in turn, and was accepted. His life of public service would now begin.

At 23, Ledoux was the youngest U.S. consular representative anywhere in the world. He and his young wife, Carmeline Painchaud, stayed at Trois-Rivieres for seven years, starting from the time of his appointment, July 27, 1897. Consuls do not usually busy themselves with local affairs. This consul, however, was the exception. He personally tried to, and succeeded in obtaining the sum of \$10,000 from Andrew Carnegie. The philanthropist's pet project in his later years was the construction of municipal libraries. Thus, through the initiative of Urbain Ledoux, and the good graces of Carnegie, Trois-Rivieres acquired a library of its own. Ledoux also saw to it that the city obtain the funds for a municipal skating rink. Not content with these two achievements, the cunsul also helped found various social and sports clubs.

The fact that a young man had become such a popular and able representative of this country could not escape the notice of the State Department who, in 1904, sent him to Bordeaux, France. Later, he was to be transferred to Prague, then a regional capital within the Austro-Hungarian Empire. There, he was the only non-aristocrat to be a member of the Nobility Club. A further post followed at Santos, Brazil. By 1910, though, Ledoux had had his fill of the consular service and began to seek new challenges.

Up until this point, his philosophy of service to his fellow men had been a sort of appendage to his own ambitious nature.

In getting ahead, he had used the opportunity to serve others.

Ledoux apparently began to question all this about the time that he was in Prague. Everything seemed to be falling within his reach-- a fact symbolized by his elbow-rubbing with Imperial German royalty at the Prague Nobility Club. This was not bad progress for a man whose parents had been obliged to exile themselves from their native land in order to find work. Progress-- yes, at least that is what most people would have termed it.

Urbain Ledoux was beginning to think in different directions. After leaving the consular service, he again worked as a journalist, this time for the Philadelphia Commercial Museum, and for Commercial America.

At about this time, the publisher Edwin Ginn set up what amounted to an International Foundation, funded to the tune of one million dollars. Said foundation was to work towards a plan for universal peace. Remember that the First World War had not yet occurred. People of the time still believed (perhaps naively) that world peace could be reduced to a well-thought-out plan to govern international relations. If one excepts the Crimean War, Europe, and consequently the world, had not seen a large scale international conflict since 1815. The Congress of Vienna had at that time undone Napoleon's conquests while setting up a balance of power that was to endure until August, 1914. Even so, the spark that would then set the world afire would not be an international one, but rather a question of minority rights within the Austro-Hungarian Empire. It was only in reaction to this internal catalyst that the great powers would become involved.

For Urbain Ledoux, as well as for the majority of his clear-thinking contemporaries, such peace foundations as Ginn's seemed

to offer mankind's only hope for prolonged survival. Ledoux became a member of this "International School of Peace" (later renamed the "World Peace Foundation." His duties were those of a lecturer, spreading his philosophy throughout the country. His travels took him to Harvard and Dartmouth College, among other places. At the latter school, his talk was deemed by many to have been among the best ever presented.

Shortly thereafter, the American sculptor Henrick Anderson proposed the "International City Plan," inspired by the same dream of international peace and co-operation that had driven Ginn to set up his foundation a year or two earlier. Urbain Ledoux, invited to Brussels to participate in the conference, came back to the U.S. with the germ of disillusion in his heart. Since before the turn of the century, nationalist agitation in the Balkans had threatened to disrupt the peace of Europe. The longer Austria tried to hold down the lid on the kettle of resentment brewing among her Slavic subjects, the greater the crisis would likely be when the inevitable moment of truth would arrive. Once more placed among European politicians, Ledoux came to accept this bitter fact, along with the almost certain prospect of war in the not-too-distant future.

A man of weaker convictions might have given up entirely on his principles. Urbain Ledoux, quite to the contrary, simply chose another field of endeavor. Like Voltaire's Candide, in a way, Ledoux decided to cultivate his own "garden plot." This "garden plot" would be none other than the relief of the urban poor.

During the subsequent World War, Ledoux worked for the

Government Labor Bureau. After the end of hostilities, it became apparent to Ledoux that a means had to be found to avoid another such conflagration. He once more associated himself with the World Peace Foundation, giving lectures, and trying to drum up support for the cause in Boston.

Still feeling unfulfilled, Ledoux began to lower his sights a bit, moving in the process from theory to practice. While still recognizing the need for an international understanding of some sort, he started to look about himself for more immediate cases of need. They were not lacking.

The industrial boom caused by war demands had, by 1919-20 spent itself. Hundreds of thousands of men were on the streets, unemployed, with no likely prospects for feeding themselves. Ledoux saw therein a new cause to dramatize, a cause which would pre-occupy him for the rest of his life.

Ledoux may have been indignant, but for the most part, the government and public either were not aware of the problem or just did not care. Remember that the Great Depression and subsequent New Deal were still many years away. Ledoux began working among unemployed ex-soldiers in New York, giving them food and shelter. He himself worked at odd jobs to pay for the food. Later Ledoux would move to Boston to spread the message further.

A world-wise friend of Ledoux suggested that what might be in order was a gimmick of some sort to force public attention onto the plight of the unemployed. One day, in the midst of the lunch-hour crowd on Boston Common, Ledoux had the notion to auction off an unemployed man. Standing the unfortunate fellow on a bandstand, he proceeded to treat the man as a slave of by-gone

days, asking passers-by to consider his work-potential, appealing to their latent desires to make a good investment. It worked, at least for awhile. Several grateful "slaves" found paying jobs. Public opinion, however, was not so kind on the originator of the slave-auction gimmick. He was banned from any further activity on Boston Common. The locals feared that the good name of the city might suffer if Ledoux were allowed to continue with his unorthodox activities.

Seeking better conditions, and a larger population to care for, Ledoux returned to New York, setting up housekeeping in the Bowery. Before long, he was feeding a large number of unemployed men, paying for the meals out of his own pocket. This was in 1921. Realizing that his own resources could not hold out indefinitely, Ledoux next tried working with the Salvation Army. By year's end, however, he had opened his own canteen called "The Old Bucks' and Lame Ducks' Club."

It was about this time that Urbain Ledoux acquired the name "Mr. Zero." Throughout his charitable actions on behalf of New York's unemployed, Ledoux had steadfastly refused to divulge his identity. One evening, while being pressed on the matter by an unemployed member of the assembly, Ledoux answered "I am nothing but bread and water. You were thirsty and I gave you to drink. You were hungry and I gave you to eat. That's all." At that point, one of his listeners, still mulling over the word "nothing," exclaimed "Alright then, you must be Mr. Zero." A nickname had been coined, one that the press would eagerly use.

Since separating his relief work from that of the Salvation Army, Mr. Zero had again been running his canteen out of his own pocket. Because of this fact, he was forced to limit his charities

to only the sickest and oldest among the unemployed. Sensing once again that the cause needed media exposure, he marched a rag-tag group into the White House on New Year's Day, 1922. President Harding had been receiving visitors, and dutifully shook the hands of these new arrivals as well.

In spite of the great publicity which he received, Ledoux's finances were still troubled. He was rapidly running out of his own money, a fact which necessitated the charging of admission at the canteen. The price of a meal was set at 1¢, being raised eventually to 2¢, and finally to a nickel. At the unbelievably low price of 5¢ per meal, Ledoux was able to realize a slight profit at the canteen (renamed "The Tub.") This money was promptly spent on clothing for the destitute.

With so many needy unemployed walking about, Mr. Zero was forced to examine candidates critically before offering such things as second-hand coats or trousers. His sympathies always lay with the man who wanted to work but who had been shut out by "the system." Panhandlers, and others who were only interested in selling the used clothing were not welcome.

Even while registering a slight profit at "The Tub," rent problems constantly plagued Mr. Zero, forcing him into court on a regular basis, asking for a short grace period. The New York Times of the mid-20's frequently carried such reports. The physical premises of "The Tub" were far from being grandiose-- a cluttered basement that Ledoux had cleaned out with the help of his men.

The daily fare was not glamorous either -- a thick bean soup, accompanied by mounds of rye bread. Everything was bought by the ton or by the hundredweight: beans from the previous

year's harvest, cans with damaged labels, etc.

Mr. Zero would typically work during the summer in order to pay the bills during the winter, both those of his canteen, and those of his family as well. As far as the latter were concerned, they had become as wrapped up in this Good Samaritan existence as had Mr. Zero, himself. Mr. Zero still found the wherewithal to educate his children as he thought they deserved.

A senator once offered \$500 to Mr. Zero's cause. Usually such gifts were either returned, or accepted with a wary eye. Ledoux was suspicious of all who might use "The Tub" for propaganda purposes, or for personal gain through media exposure. Small contributions in money, clothes or food were always welcome, however, these usually forming the bulk of all donations to the cause. As irregular as the contributions may have been, Mr. Zero managed them well, since by the onset of the Great Depression, he was serving 500,000 meals per winter.

As the twenties wore on, Mr. Zero's renown spread beyond the New York Bowery. The entire city, and then a great number of Easterners, came to recognize his work. No holiday went by without Mr. Zero leading a band of his followers in the Easter Parade, or in the Thanksgiving procession. On New Year's Day, Mr. Zero could usually be found in the company of the Mayor, or even the President, with a band of tattered companions closeby. It was apparently not enough to feed and clothe the poor. Mr. Zero had another mission, that of jabbing at the public conscience. If his first mission brought praise from many, his second did much to have others question his mental stability.

Ledoux's sanity was never in jeopardy, of course. He had long ago realized that sometimes, dramatic gestures are needed

to rouse the indifferent from their slumber. There had been the Boston slave auctions. There would be the incident in New York City as Henry Ford's Peace Ship was sailing for Europe, this toward the close of World War I. Arriving several minutes late for the boat, for which he already bought tickets, Ledoux plunged into the East River and began swimming. He was overtaking the ship when a tug-boat crew pulled him out, thinking that he was drowning.

At the Washington Disarmament Conference in 1922, Ledoux managed to get himself arrested. He had committed the indiscretion of picketing the entry hall while carrying an umbrella marked with the words "Open your hearts." The last straw was Ledoux's stalking about the entrance of the same conference hall, at noon, carrying a lantern. He explained that he was looking for a true Christian among the assembly.

Curiously enough, it was the government which put an end to Mr. Zero's labors in the Bowery -- but this is a way of which he certainly approved. With the advent of Franklin Roosevelt and the New Deal, the government took upon itself the responsibility for caring for its less unfortunate citizens. This was precisely the "gospel" which Mr. Zero had been preaching for the last fifteen years. Sharply reduced attendance at the Tub, coupled with Mr. Zero's declining health, forced the sale of the establishment for a token sum.

By 1935, Mr. Zero, who now was just Urbain Ledoux again, decided to try his hand at film-making. His ultimate products were two Spanish talkies, shot in South America. Both dealt with the theme of universal brotherhood.

Ledoux had been a widower for several years when he met and married Mary W. Hall, a former Shakespearean actress, in 1930. This was the woman who was left a widow at Ledoux's death, April 8, 1941. Urbain Ledoux had lived the latter portion of his life in New York. It was fitting that he should die there.

Two children survived their father, Lucille Blackshaw of Quebec, and son Normand of New York. Another daughter, Yvette had died earlier.

Mr. Zero's remains were transported to Old Orchard Beach, Maine where a funeral mass was held in St. Margaret's Church. Interment followed in the family lot in St. Joseph's Cemetery, Middeford.

In his sixty-six years, Urbain Ledoux had worn many hats: mill operative, journalist, consul, public speaker, member of a peace foundation, movie director, and "brother's keeper." It is undoubtedly this last one which it is most fitting to remember.

Mrs. Hoye adds the following on the French story:

Richard French was in Marshfield in 1657, and took an oath of

fidelity. There was no French in Rehoboth at that time. Richard was a freeman. I have John French of Rehoboth marrying Mary Palmer in 1678, and I have the births of Hannah in Rehoboth in 1679, John in 1681. Thomas was the son of Joseph in Taunton, and so was Ebenezer, both born in Taunton in 1680, and 1682 respectively. Thomas died the day he was born. I find no other mention of Richard, and no other children for John or Joseph. This information came from the book Records of Plymouth Colony, births, marriages, deaths, burials, and other records 1633-1689, edited by Nathaniel Shurtleff and published by Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc. of Baltimore, Maryland, 1976.

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"Telephone Directory Letters"

For those of us attempting to construct a family genealogy, a ready source of names and addresses to contact may be found in the telephone directory. Since most people have telephones nowadays, the chances are that most "target households" will be listed somewhere in some directory or other.

The fact that the names and addresses are available, however, does not mean that the individuals involved will be quick in handing over the information requested. The experience of this editor is that, unless one can state specifically that one was talking to the addressee's great aunt Minnie, one's letter will probably wind up in the trash.

There are several approaches, of course: the family historian, the appeal to family pride, the appeal to intellectual curiosity, etc. Given the times in which we live, though, people can get very suspicious if they believe that their privacy is being invaded. Mainly for this reason, apparently, the rate of return on such letters is usually around 10 or 15%.

Has any reader discovered a successful format for this sort of letter. By "successful," let us say a more than 20% return on letters mailed. If such letters exist, the readership will undoubtedly benefit from knowing about them. If you would care to share your version of the "genealogical request letter," simply send a copy of it to Fleur de Lys, along with an indication as to how successful it has been in the past. These letters will appear in future issues.

Acadian Continentals

Numerous Acadian soldiers are known to have served in the American Army during the Revolution (1775-1783). For the most part, these men were members of militia units raised in Louisiana, then Spanish territory.

In an earlier Fleur de Lys issue, mention was made of Pierre Robichaud, the Acadian minute-man who took part in the Lexington/Concord skirmishes. Among Massachusetts soldiers, his is not the only such record known to us. If one recalls the sojourn of the Acadian exiles in Massachusetts, as well as the fact that young Acadian children were often taken from their parents and used as indentured servants by the British, then the presence of these Acadian names among Massachusetts soldiers need not be surprising. Among the names in the first group of soldiers which we will list, several could possibly be taken for those of Huguenots. Upon closer examination, however, one will notice names which are so unmistakably Acadian (Briault, Gautreau, Poirier), that little doubt is left in this editor's mind that these soldiers were in fact refugees of 1755.

Our first group of soldiers enlisted individually in Massachusetts regiments, and this for varying lengths of time. Following are their service records, in most cases, the places in which their names occur.

Joseph Benoit Return of men enlisted into the Continental Army from Col. Ebenezer Thayer's (5th Suffolk Co.) regiment, dated Braintree, January 20, 1778, enlisted for the town of Braintree; joined Captain Langdon's company, Colonel Crane's regiment, enlisted for 3 years; reported a transient; mustered by Nathaniel Barber, Muster Master.

Jean-Baptiste Berioit (Bariault?) Return of men, enlisted into Continental Army from Essex County, subsequent to Feb. 11, 1778, dated April 18, 1778, residence, Amesbury; enlisted for the town of Amesbury; joined Captain E. Lunt's Company, Colonel Henley's Regiment; enlisted for 3 years.

Jean Bernard List of men mustered in Suffolk County by Nathaniel Barber, Muster Master, dated Oct. 26, 1777, Colonel Crane's Regiment.

Jean-Philip Bernard (perhaps the same as Jean Bernard) Return of men into the Continental Army from Captain Obediah Beal's Company (year not given); residence: Cohasset; enlisted for town of Cohasset; joined Captain Langdon's Company, Colonel Henry Jackson's Regiment, enlisted for 3 years; mustered by Nathaniel Barber, Muster Master.

Stephen Gautraw (Gautreau?) Boston, private in Lieutenant Hodijah Bayles's Company of grenadiers, Colonel Henry Jackson's Regiment; pay roll for February 1778, dated Gulph, Pennsylvania, service, 1 month; also, same company and regiment pay roll for June 1778, sworn-to at Providence, service 1 month; also return certified at camp near Morristown, NJ, April 30, 1780, of officers and men belonging to Colonel Lee's, Colonel Henley's, and Colonel Jackson's Regiments, and men belonging to Massachusetts in Colonel Henry Sherburne's Regiment who were incorporated into a regiment under the command of Colonel Henry Jackson, agreeable to the arrangement of April 9, 1779, residence, Boston; rank- private; enlisted Nov. 20, 1777, enlisted for 3 years; reported killed in Rhode Island August 29, 1778; said Gautraw appears among men belonging to Colonel Henry Jackson's Regiment who had been discharged from the rolls prior to above engagement.

Jockes Pouryea (Jacques Poirier) receipt dated South Hadley, Mass., March 26, 1782, signed by Noah Goodman, Superintendant for Hampshire County, stating that he had received said Pouryea, a soldier engaged to serve in the Continental Army for the term of 3 years, to the credit of the town of Granby.

Simon LeBlanc (as well as Francois LeBlanc, whose record he shares) list of French prisoners sent from Halifax to Boston October 8, 1778 to be exchanged; reported a Seaman; letter from Bat. Fox, Commissary of Prisoners to the Commissary of Priosners at Boston, dated en board the "Rainbow" at Halifax, October 8, 1778; accompanying list requests that said men be exchanged for British priosners.

The next group of soldiers spent the term of their enlistment in Maine. At the time, Maine was under the jurisdiction of Boston. It would continue as such until 1820 when, under the provisions of the Missouri Compromise, it would enter the Union as a state in its own right.

Jean LeBlanc Pay-roll of persons employed under Colonel John Allen, Commander-in-Chief of Eastern Indian Department, for agency business, and in defence of Machias (Maine); entered service January 1, 1778, discharged June 1, 1778, service 5 months; pay roll of field and staff officers and other persons under Colonel John Allen and stationed at Machias for its' defence, engaged June 1, 1778, discharged December 1, 1778; said LeBlanc reported as "Employ'd in Indian Business for Going Expresses & co."; also courier; pay-roll sworn-to in Lincoln County, of sundry persons who continued service for the defence of Machias, agreeable to order of Council of November 11, 1778, and other persons employed in the Indian Business under Colonel John Allen; entered service December 1, 1778; discharged June 1, 1779, service 6 months; said LeBlanc probably employed in Indian Affairs under Captain John Prebble.

In late 1776, Isaiah Boudreau raised a company of soldiers in Cumberland County, Nova Scotia. These men were known by the name of their commander as Captain Isaiah Boudreau's Company, or yet again as his "Company of Frenchman."

Present in the company were the following: Joseph Bastarache, Joseph Boudreau, Michael Bourg, Jean Gaudet, Joseph Gaudet, Maturin Gaudet, Paul LeBlanc, Peter LeBlanc, and of course, Isaiah Boudreau himself. With the exception of the Captain, and of Peter LeBlanc, the sergeant, all men had the rank of private.

The service record of all these soldiers is identical: Captain Isaiah Boudreau's Company of Frenchman, Colonel Jonathan Eddy's Regiment, enlisted November 14, 1776, discharged February 14, 1777, service 3 months; company raised in Cumberland County, Nova Scotia.

After his company disbanded, Isaiah Boudreau continued in military service:

list of persons employed in Eastern Indian Department under command of Colonel John Allan; enlisted January 1, 1778; discharged June 1, 1778, service 5 months at Machias.

courier, Eastern Indian Department, under Colonel John Allan, enlisted June 1, 1778, discharged December 1, 1778, service 6 months reported employed in Indian Affairs.

courier, Captain John Prebble's Company, enlisted December 1, 1778; discharged June 1, 1779, service 6 months in Eastern Department under Colonel John Allan; reported employed in Indian affairs. Roll dated Machias

courier, Captain John Prebble's Company, Colonel John Allan's Regiment, enlisted June 1, 1779; discharged December 1, 1779, service 6 months, in Indian Department at Machias.

The presence of these soldiers on Revolutionary War muster rolls offers interesting possibilities for the genealogical researcher. Membership in the Revolutionary War honor societies could well be obtained by bona fide descendants, -- an interesting thought for a large body of Franco-American/ Cajun researchers.

Census Humor

Census returns can, and often do provide a wealth of information to the patient genealogical researcher. From amid a tangle of dates and sometimes mis-spelled names, one can "flesh-out" the family tree with birth dates, professions, and places of origin.

The majority of foreign immigrants to this country were illiterate. This is a widely known fact. At best, some could read and write their mother tongue, while barely being able to express themselves in English. In daily affairs, this crisis of communication could prove serious enough. When, however, an English-speaker was entrusted to gather information from the mouths of foreigners, the results could be very predictable. Foreign names suddenly found English equivalents, either through an English spelling, or through translation. American census takers were not the only ones to commit this indiscretion, as anglophone Canadians very often came up with the same results. Since modern-day Americans live in a heterogeneous society, we would in most cases be able to make intelligent guesses. The nineteenth-century census taker was not so well equipped.

The following are bona-fide examples taken from the U.S. Federal census of 1880 and the Canadian census of 1851. One has to wonder about the reactions of the proof-readers in Washington and Ottawa.

We could whimsically try to reconstruct a day in the life of our census taker...

Having gotten off to a bad start, he manages to record baby Sarah as "Sorrow" in his first household visit. Later in the

morning, the sky begins to cloud over, causing our scribe to hear "Rain" instead of "Reine," at his next stop. By the stone quarry, "L'Aimable" becomes "Lemarble." Lunchtime approaches. Feeling a bit hungry, our census taker traces the words "Frozen" and "Boloni" into his record book, not realizing that he should have written "Frosine" (Euphrosine) and "Beloni".

Our census taker's day reaches its climax toward mid-afternoon, but takes a sharp nose-dive when a strong-minded housewife refuses to reveal any data on her children. The distressed scribe mutters a few words to himself, but continues on his appointed rounds.

At his next stop, however, the words "Terrific" (Seraphique) and "Audacity" (Dosithe) find their way into the ledger.

The day wears on. As the setting sun disappears beyond the horizon, the census taker enters one last family into his records. Thus "Twinight" (Toinette) and "Moonie" (Monique) forever enter the realm of statistics.

Although women's names seem to predominate among these rather bizarre anglicisations, this editor's favorite spelling variants belong to two nineteenth-century men: Tadde Bare (Thadde Hebert) from New Brunswick, and Michael Buckwheat from Connecticut. While the former may be fairly easy to comprehend, the second requires that Buckwheat first be translated into its French equivalent: "ble sarasin." Dropping the "wheat" (ble), one is left with "Sarasin." Coupled with the appropriate given name, one obtains "Michel Sarasin."






