ASYLUM

During the era of heavy immigration to the United States, from 1840 to 1920, national "colonies" were a fairly common sight. As a matter of fact, those immigrants who did not opt for life in the cities, in other words, those who chose to work the land, very frequently wound up in such colonies. Here customs and institutions could be perpetuated without undue interference from native-born Americans. City-dwelling immigrants established their "little Italies" and "Little Polands" to deal with the much more difficult task of preserving national identities in the main-stream of American life. In the cultural domain, rural settlements usually enjoyed an easier life.

A realistic attitude toward economic life in America was an absolute must for any such rural community. Any settlement which did not have a broad base in agriculture was almost certainly doomed. Hard work was an absolute necessity. Anything that fell short of this realistic goal-- gold rush boom towns, for example--, anything in short that smacked of the something-for-nothing philosophy would eventually fade into oblivion. Despite popular belief to the contrary, the something-for-nothing attitude has never been a sure-fire key to success in America.

We can therefore understand why most small communities needed a base in agriculture if they were to survive. Of course there were exceptions -- mining, fishing, but agricultural life would predominate.

It might therefore seem strange to find an ethnic colony populated almost exclusively by nobles, but such a colony did

in fact exist. Its name was Asylum, or Azylum, and it was located on the upper Susquehanna River in Pennsylvania, mid-way between Scranton and the New York border.

If one man must be singled out as the founder of the colony, that individual would be Louis-Marie, Vicomte de Noailles, a member of the landed aristocracy of France, and brother-in-law to the popular Marquis de Lafayette. By 1792, when the Azylum Project got under way, de Noailles was no stranger to the United States. He had seen service in the Revolution. Although barely 30 years old at the time, he had grown rapidly in General Washington's esteem, was appointed ^{to} oversee construction of the trenches before Yorktown, had a hand in preparing the instrument of British surrender, and was chosen to represent France at the surrender of Lord Cornwallis, the final event of the War.

de Noailles eventually made his way back to France, where the events of 1789 found him. He later became a member of the National Assembly, proposing, at one point, the abolition of feudal rights. His sojourn in America had undoubtedly influenced him greatly. The infant U.S. was, for his generation, the very proof of what idealism can accomplish if given half a chance. de Noailles was therefore a man of his times, unafraid to compromise his own privileges for the sake of an idea whose time had come.

de Noailles saw some military service against the Austrians in 1792, this in the company of his famous brother-in-law. As the Revolution took a more radical character, however, good intentions came to count for less and less among that minority of the nobles who actually favored reform. de Noailles eventually

opted for exile, first in England, and then in America. It was in Philadelphia that he met the second key figure of the Azylum story.

Antoine-Omer Talon had been a highly placed bureaucrat among Paris functionaries. He was a member of the bourgeoisie, as well as part of the same family which had produced, a century earlier, the able and innovative Jean Talon, who as Intendant had done so much to contribute to the prosperity of New France.

This latter-day Talon was brought up in the family law practice and had been attached to the law courts of Paris before his 29th birthday. A steadfast royalist, he sought to protect the king's privileges against attacks by revolutionaries, and went so far as to elaborate a plot for spiriting the king out of France if things ever got too sticky.

The situation did in fact get "sticky" with the royal family being arrested for attempted escape from France. Antoine-Omer, being a bit too highly placed with respect to the throne, and not having been one to keep his sentiments secret in the past, was now obliged to flee for his life. After a series of near-miss escapades, Talon found himself in the U.S., joining forces with de Noailles in what seemed like a very interesting venture.

For the past year-and-a-half, or so, French emigres had been piling up in American port cities. Vaster numbers of other nobles had chosen to live in European exile, so this American contingent was not as large as it conceivably could have been. Still, the charm of America, popularized by Rousseau, and by every voyager who had ever set foot on the American continent, played a preponderent role in getting this group of nobles to

American shores.

Many of these formerly privileged individuals had escaped France with only those things which they could carry on their persons. Others had been more fortunate. Yet they all shared the same problem: procuring a place where a bit of the old "good life" could be recreated. In the spring of 1793, de Noailles and Talon joined forces with three other individuals to try to remedy their countrymen's predicament.

Speculation in unpopulated woodlands was at that time a very lucrative field in which many wealthy Americans had found a way to engage. de Noailles approached Robert Morris, the financier of the American Revolution, John Nicholson, the comptroller general of the State of Pennsylvania, and John Keating, an influential Irishman, and persuaded all to join together on a colonizing scheme. The Americans would provide the business sense, while the Frenchmen would, by association, lend respectability to the proceedings in the eyes of their countrymen.

The first order of business was to purchase the somewhat fabulous sum of 1,000,000 acres of northeastern Pennsylvania woodland at a rate of 15¢ per acre. This land was in turn parcelled off prior to re-sale to prospective settlers.

A capital was chosen and laid out on a broad, flat area, bounded on three sides by a horseshoe curve in the Susquehanna. House lots were partitioned off and wide avenues chosen for their grand character and nostalgic value. The Azylum settlement was born, "Azylum" being a cross between "Asylum" and the French "Asile", pronounced with a Z sound instead of an S.

Advance agents set to work constructing enormous log houses, two stories in height, with such amenities as huge fireplaces and

windows made of glass. The few Americans who were in the area were amply amazed at this lavishness, especially since the common man usually housed his family in a one-room hovel with greased-paper windows. These great log houses were quite obviously not on a par with the ancient Loire Valley chateaux, but then this was a different land and a different society. Certain adjustments would have to be made.

The colonists eventually arrived, taking the same route as had the tools and window-glass that had gone into the fabrication of the great log houses. They came up river on rafts.

The clearing of the land and the building of sufficient habitations took all of two years to accomplish. This first round of hard labor was seen-to by American labor. Still, the French would not enjoy an entirely carefree life at Azylum. Some could afford to pay others to do their work, but others could no longer afford such luxury, being forced instead to plunge into farming as a means of survival. Needless to say, the going was exceedingly rough for these people. Life on the frontier was usually synonymous with toil. Azylum offered no real alternatives.

Azylum's settlers never forgot the initial reason that they had banded together. They were extremely attentive to social niceties, and were known to don their silk and lace for evening meal, this after a hard day in the fields.

Visitors from the mother country were welcomed with open arms as so many more distant cousins in distress. The Duc d'Orleans made an appearance at Azylum in 1797, while touring America with his two brothers. Thirty-three years later, the Duc would ascend the thrown of France as the Citizen-King Louis-Philippe. This was the closest that Azylum ever got to harboring a member of

the royal family. One of the earliest buildings to be constructed had always borne the name of "the Queen's House." The unfortunate Marie-Antoinette met her end under the blade of the guillotine, and never had the opportunity to set sail for America. One would wonder if, liberated, she would even have wanted to live in such a place. Her brother was Emperor of Austria and would have been more than happy to harbor his relatives in Vienna. One must suspect that the wily Talon had a plan up his sleeve for rescuing the royal personnages, either in fact or in fiction. In any event, when news of Marie-Antoinette's death reached the infant colony, Talon had to shelve any such plans permanently.

The Azylum colonists, several hundred strong, flourished in their little utopia for seven years, at which time a combination of factors brought about the end of the experiment. The financial minds behind the project found more lucrative fields of endeavor, leaving the colonists to their own devices in seeing to the economic health of the community.

This in itself might not have meant the end of the colony. What did in fact spell the fate of the Azylum experiment was a decision made by Napoleon in 1802. Having arrived at the top of the French power ladder, the future emperor was in a position to invite all emigres to return to their homeland. The exile of the nobles had proved to be a great hardship to these individuals, but also to France. The nobles, being the most educated class, had taken a good deal of expertise -- military among others -- out of the country. Napoleon, the shrewd tactician, could appreciate this probably better than anyone. It was therefore necessary to reintegrate the nobles to the mainstream of French life,

to find them a place in the new order of things. Offering a restoration of titles and lands, Napoleon hoped to lure the majority of the emigres back from exile. This, he succeeded in doing.

The Azylum refugees, no longer forced into re-living the past when they could have a hand in shaping the presence, began to make plans to leave. Within a year, the several hundred settlers were back in France, leaving only a few families to cast their lot on the side of life in the New World. Had Napoleon not acted when he did, the colony might well have lasted for many more years. Similar tries had been made to establish French-speaking utopias in the wilderness. All had failed, usually within the first year. Azylum, from the moment of its inception, until its disbanding, lasted ten years. Where all other such colonies failed because of structural weakness, Azylum ceased to exist because its reason for being vanished. It nonetheless provides an interesting chapter in the story of the French presence in America.

STE-ANNE, NEBRASKA

In the latter part of the 19th century, many New England cotton mill owners, hard pressed for laborers, actually recruited workers from among the farmers of Quebec Province. Earlier mill workers had been Irish for the most part, and had satisfied mill needs adequately enough. By the time of the Civil War, however, with native Yankees needed on the battlefields, and with the great wave of Irish immigration at an end, the mill owners had to look elsewhere for able-bodied workers. The French-Canadians at this point represented a great untapped pool of workers. Recruiters for the mills lost no time in spreading news of the wealth which an honest laborer could expect to earn. Mill recruiters, quite obviously, were not responsible for all the immigration which took place from Quebec into New England. It could be argued, however, that they in fact caused the first breach in the dam.....

By 1870, overpopulatuon and lack of land were causing many Quebec residents to consider leaving the land for good. Ready cash was to be had in the factories to the south. For many, the choice was basically between a small portion of the family farm, or a life as a manual laborer in New England.

There was however a middle-road for which some farmers could have opted. It was a choice which required exile from Quebec, as did the life of a mill worker, but one which allowed the "habitant" to continue the life and work which he knew best--that of a farmer.

Except for some latter-day settlements in the Saguenay and Labelle areas, the farming land of Quebec had been completely

settled by the 1860's. To continue to live as a farmer, the "habitant" had to look outside the borders of his province.

Co-incidentally, in the post-Civil War days, the American government was in the process of opening up the Great Plains to settlers. Local Indians had already been exiled or confined to reservations, so the white man was relatively free to settle wherever he pleased.

About the year 1878, a small group of hardy Quebecois left home and family and set out for the Great Plains. Their destination was the fertile valley of the Republican River in Nebraska. They most likely made the trip by train, since the eastern half of the United States was fairly well served by the railroad. The last leg of their journey, the 200 miles beyond Omaha, was probably spent in a wagon, since railroad service beyond the Mississippi consisted largely of major trunk lines.

Quebecois settlers were to gravitate to Franklin and Webster counties, where they would join several other French-speaking families who had spent some time in Illinois before moving to this part of the Plains.

Life on the farm had a few new twists: Indians still wandered about the area, asking for an occasional meal. The farmer, his wife, and numerous children now lived in a sod house, rather than in the wood and stone variety that had been so common in Quebec. Temperature extremes were even more marked on the Plains than they had been at home. In the summer, the settler had to keep a watchful eye on the horizon, and be ready to rush the entire family into the root cellar, lest a cyclone swoop down and carry everything (and everyone) away.

The settlers apparently fared well, as they were numerous enough to establish a Catholic church for themselves by the early 1880's. This they named after Sainte-Anne, long-time patroness of French-Canadians. The church still exists, though not in its original form, and is located at Campbell, Nebraska.

Descendants of the first settlers continue to worship there, and perpetuate this little piece of French-Canada so far away from their ancestral homeland.

FRENCHVILLE, PENNA.

Central Pennsylvania of the 1830's was no more or less than a wilderness. Whereas the eastern portion of the state was fairly well populated, and Pittsburgh was developing into a respectable-sized town, the area in between remained untamed. The primeval forest, which still covered the mountains and valleys, was punctuated at irregular intervals by hamlets and agricultural settlements. Yet, many miles separated these outposts. The rural farmer thus tended his land by himself, depending on his immediate neighbors for his social contacts.

In the middle of Pennsylvania, or more precisely, to the north-west of its geographical center, lies Clearfield County. The county was not opened up for general colonization until the early 1800's. Like the rest of this central portion of the state, the county consists mostly of hills and valleys, with very little wide open flat space. The area offered to settlers interesting opportunities in the lumbering business, not to mention the many acres that lay waiting the plow.

Among Clearfield County's many townships is that of Covington. It is this area which interests us the most. Erected in 1817, the township had all the trouble in the world attracting settlers. Being so far from the major population centers was not the least of things which the prospective farmer had to consider before moving out there. At the time of its founding in 1817, Covington township had a mere 80 inhabitants.

The township and the county did not have many inhabitants, but they certainly had land owners. In many cases, the owners had never seen their properties. Many had been granted tracts

of land in payment for military duty, or for services rendered the infant United States during the Revolution. Land ownership may have conferred prestige upon the proprietor, but the desirable part lay ultimately in the selling off of the land in smaller lots, or the exploitation of the land in some manner or other.

One John Keating found himself in just such a situation in the mid-1820's. He was the proud owner of several thousand acres of woodland-- a potential source of revenue if only colonists could be found to buy the land parcels. Hitting upon an idea which others would use in the future, he decided to go directly to the biggest potential source of farming recruits: Europe. Immigration to the U.S. had been rather slow but steady since the turn of the century, and would not know its first real moment of glory until the 1840's with the Irish potato famine and the German exiles of 1848. Still, even at this early date, there was reason to believe that the European farmer might be the answer to John Keating's problems.

Commissioning a detailed map of his holdings, he sent it, along with a representative, to Europe, in or about 1827. Judging from subsequent events, this emissary must have met with success. Prospective immigrants were shown the map, and given a glowing description of the land that was waiting for them. They were also provided with detailed instructions on reaching their lands after getting off the ship in New York.

A number of Frenchmen found the whole project to their liking, although not all were able to come immediately to America. Keating's emissary recruited many of the prospective settlers

from the departments of Haute-Saone and Haute-Marne in eastern France. Why he chose this area, we may never know.

At any rate, the first two settlers to come to Keating's lands were Nicolas Roussey and Irene Plubel, this in 1830. Plubel died shortly after his arrival, while Roussey lived on into the 1860's.

During the next year, these first two men were joined by Francois Coudriet and Claude Renaud.

In 1832 would come the families of Pierre Mulson, Hyacinthe Mignot, Francois Hugueney, Pierre Breoel, Auguste Gaulin, Jean-Baptiste Fournier, and Pierre Bergey.

The last of this first group of immigrants arrived the following year, and consisted of the families of Jean-B. Barmoy, Francois LaMotte, Francois Liegey, Francois Garmont, Christophe Biggleman, Jean Rougeux, T.R. Verbeck, M. Tourail, Francois Rolley, Francois Hugard, and others. Other immigrants would arrive on an individual basis, but for the most part, the French colony of Covington was now formed.

All settlements must have names, and this one was no exception. It quickly acquired the name of "Frenchville," a name which it retains to this day.

As the settlers arrived, the first task which awaited them was the clearing of the land which, of course, was completely forested. While the rest of the colonists cleared, however, the Leconte brothers, Alphonse and Auguste, set about founding a lumber mill. Along with the grist mill which they would later construct, the lumber mill became the basis of the Leconte brothers' fortune. These two passed for

the wealthiest of Frenchville's inhabitants. This reputation was not unjustified since, in the Federal census of 1850, Auguste Leconte is listed as being worth more than \$20,000 (at least \$200,000 in today's inflated currency.)

The majority of Frenchville's inhabitants devoted themselves to farming, however, choosing the American method of building one's house on one's farm, rather than the European approach of living in a town, and working a tract of land at some distance from the main settlement. For this reason, Frenchville, even today, has no real village at its' center, at least if by "village," one intends to say an agglomeration of houses. If however, one can settle for a combination of church-post office-general store, then the "center" of Frenchville has the requirements for a village center.

As was the case in France, as well as in French Canada, the church was the real focal point of the community. For the first ten years of Frenchville's existence, there was no church building. The size of the local population just did not warrant it. A priest would come by occasionally and celebrate mass in the home of a member of the community. Baptisms, marriages, and belated grave-site prayers would then take place. By 1841-42, however, the local houses were no longer able to accomodate the faithful, so the decision was made to construct a church, one of logs, on the site of the present cemetery. Perpetuating yet another French custom, the dead were buried within the shadow of the church, in hallowed ground.

This first church received its first permanent pastor in

1846, and this in the person of Father Rauder. He was succeeded a few months later by Rev. John Berbigier, who administered to the needs of the parish until 1880. During these 34 years, whenever Father Berbigier had to absent himself from the parish, his place was taken over by temporary pastors, all French.

The first non-French pastor, Rev. H. Mullen was appointed in 1880, either due to a shortage of French priests, or to the fact that the French no longer constituted the overwhelming majority of the parishioners.

The remoteness of Frenchville was the strongest agent acting for the preservation of French culture in the village. Until the turn of this century, French married French and raised their children in homes where the mother tongue was in day-to-day use. The inevitable result was that within 50 years, everybody was related to everybody else. This fact is borne out in cemetery inscriptions.

With the advent of World War I, and the coming into use of the automobile, the distinctly French character of Frenchville began to change. Younger generations, acquiring increased mobility, started to abandon the ways of their ancestors. This is of course a phenomenon that is not limited to Frenchville, since all immigrant groups go through the same period of strain. Today, the old people of Frenchville are the ones who preserve memories of a French-speaking town. Only they are capable of expressing themselves in French, and this to varying degrees of perfection. The old mother tongue is dying out, yet the French presence lives on in the person of the many descendants of these old-time pioneers.

A word about the cemetery:

As was stated elsewhere, the Frenchville cemetery was begun next to the first log church. When a second church was built, in 1873, at a distance of several hundred feet from the first one, the graves of the ancestors were left alone.

The cemetery is built, or rather extends itself up a rather steep incline, and is divided into two parts. The upper one contains most of the 19th century graves, while the lower contains more recent burials.

Many of the earlier stones bear rather wordy inscriptions in French. These served as models for later stones carved by artisans who were not conversant in French. This is borne out by the fact that the stone carver very often copied over inscriptions word-for-word, only varying names and dates, while leaving feminine adjective endings alone, even when the newer stone belonged to a man.

Many of the early stones bear the place of origin of the deceased. These first pioneers wisely opted for a lengthier inscription in the hope that their descendants would never forget their origins in France. It is by these inscriptions that we are able to ascertain the origins of most of the original French stock of the village. Even in those families where the precise name of a village is not known, pre-immigration marriages with other individuals in the same vicinity allow us to ascribe a probable birthplace to most of the immigrants. The spelling of family names can vary greatly from gravestone to gravestone. In most cases, however, the names "sound" the same, or are at least good approximations of the original.

On page 20, Anastasie Gill married 20 July 1795 at St. Francois du Lac to Ignace Plamondon, and had the following children:

1. Ignace b. 10 April 1796, m. 19 Aug. 1822 at St. Regis, Que. to Marie Anne Chretien.
2. Joseph b. 7 Sept. 1797, m. 8 Jan. 1821 at St. Regis, to Josephte Legros.
3. Antoine b. 16 May 1799, m. 10 Feb. 1823 at St. Regis, to Catherine Legros.
4. Sophie b. 12 May 1801, m. 5 May 1823 at St. Regis, to Ignace Durocher.
5. Marguerite b. 20 Jan. 1803, d. 29 Jan. 1803.

When Marguerite was born, the mother, Anastasie died in childbirth and was buried 22 Jan. 1803.

Ignace Plamondon married 2nd. 31 Jan. 1804 to Josephte Houle and they had at least 9 children. Ignace was by trade a surveyor and also a "Juree". On the 14 Sept. 1808 he moved his family to New York City and lived there until about 1817 when he moved here to Massena, N.Y. Ignace kept a ledger where he recorded family information, such as births of his children and business affairs. In this ledger he describes his trip from Baie-du-Fave to New York City. This ledger has been preserved and is at the History Center at Canton, N.Y. Descendants in this area changed the name from Plamondon to Plumadore and many live through-out Northern New York.


