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Noah Brusso dit Brousseau
The Forgotten Heavyweight Boxing
Champion of the World

French-Canadians are a fierce and proud sporting breed; They know and laud their sports heroes such as Hockey's Maurice Richard and Jean Beliveau. Old timers recall Louis Cyr, the famed Quebec strongman of Acadian descent, who was world-famous in the 1890's and early 1900's. Strangely enough, such celebrities as Napoleon Lajoie escape recognition, this baseball hall-of-famer, Canadian-born and Woonsocket-raised, one of the first ten entered into the Hall of Fame at Cooperstown, and the man whom the legendary Ty Cobb considered one of his prime rivals.

But alas, it is the boxing ranks that possess one of the strangest and greatest figures in the sports realm, a man not only forgotten by French-Canadians, but likewise ignored by boxing experts themselves. Noah Brusso hardly deserves such a legacy, for he was the smallest and, pound for pound, perhaps the most lethal champion that the heavyweight division ever saw.

Noah adopted the name of Tommy Burns early in his career, after fighting a few fights under his true name. Born near Hanover, Ontario, in 1881, he was an incredibly short 5 feet, 7 inches tall. His fighting weight was 170-180 pounds, what could be called an overblown middleweight. He was extremely quick of foot and hand, however, and possessed a booming right hand that knocked out dozens of bigger and heavier ranking fighters of the day.

Noah's father was Frederick Brousseau who settled in Ontario

and married a German girl, becoming the father of a large family and adopting the Methodist faith and the German language in the process. But Brausseau, now Brusso, was French-Canadian for all the classic indexing.

Tommy Burns was champion for nearly three years, from early 1906 through late 1908 when he lost his title to the great Black fighter, Jack Johnson, in Sydney, Australia. The fight lasted fifteen rounds, officially. After fourteen stanzas, the bell rang for the fifteenth encounter, but the much shorter and lighter white man was not allowed to come out and be kayoed by a black man. Old time films show an incredibly short and smaller man standing his ground against what many have considered the greatest heavyweight champion ever, in the person of Johnson from Galveston, Texas. Downed in the closing moments of the first round from a vicious uppercut, Burns, tough and resilient, fought the battle of his life against terrific odds, later stating: "From the second round it was a small man gaming it against a great fighter. The big fellow dealt out terrific punishment." The physical differences were too many and formidable, but notwithstanding Johnson's later claim, the Black giant did not "carry" his white opponent. At the end of the twelfth round, in fact, Johnson's cornermen feared that the Black boxer would quit, several of his ribs being badly fractured or broken from Burns' many hard rights. Both contestants knew, at this point, however, that it was just a matter of time, and that physical superiority would prevail.

Tommy Burns died in 1954 in Vancouver, at age 73, an ordained Methodist minister on the evangelical trail. His story would fill quite a book. In some 60 fights, fighting mostly giants that towered above him and outweighed him by much, he lost but five.

fights, while stopping some 40 men, for an outstanding knockout average. It's true that Jack Johnson would have stopped him had the fight been allowed to continue, but that was hardly a shameful topic. Burns was stopped but once in his life, in his last fight while approaching his fortieth birthday, an advanced age for a boxer, by Joe Beckett of England, a big and dangerous hitter. It was a sorrowful end to a brilliant career.

Of the great athletes and strange stories to emerge from Quebec and Ontario, the saga of Noah Brusco must rank among the finest and most exciting, a believe-it-or-not sports tale. For the French-Canadians, this figure is undoubtedly one of their greatest forgotten heroes.

An addendum

Tommy Burns' greatness as a fighter is brought into perspective by citing the experience of one of his adversaries, and the ring superstar which this adversary later defeated. In this way, Burns' era is brought a bit closer to our own.

Burns defended his title ten times in the span of just under three years, a record yet to be matched. One of his defenses was against Fireman Jim Flynn, a big and burly fighter who succumbed from a right to the jaw in the fifteenth round after a furious brawl. Nearly ten years later this same Flynn, now past his prime, confronted a young toughie from Colorado and stopped the youngster in the first round, for the only knock-out ever registered against the fabled Jack Dempsey. Dempsey reversed the tables a year later and went on to his celebrated reign by stopping Jess Willard in three rounds in Toledo, Ohio. (It is worth mentioning for Francophiles that the referee for the Dempsey-Willard fight in 1919 was a French-Canadian named Oliva Picard who, for some reason, emerges in boxing history as Ollie Pecord.

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Partial list of men with apparent French-Canadian surnames who died at Andersonville, Ga.

During 1864 and 1865, the Confederate States operated a prisoner-of-war camp at Andersonville, Georgia. Many thousands of Union soldiers were penned up in an area far too small to adequately contain their numbers. From Feb. 27, 1864, the date of the first recorded death, until the camp was liberated in late April of the following year, 12,920 men died. With few exceptions, these deaths were caused by unhygienic living conditions, and by malnutrition. While it is true that in certain Union camps such as the one at Elmira, New York, conditions were not much better, the fact that the South lost the war, coupled with the trial and subsequent execution of Wirtz, the Andersonville commandant, more than sufficed to indelibly imprint the name of Andersonville onto the Northern conscience.
