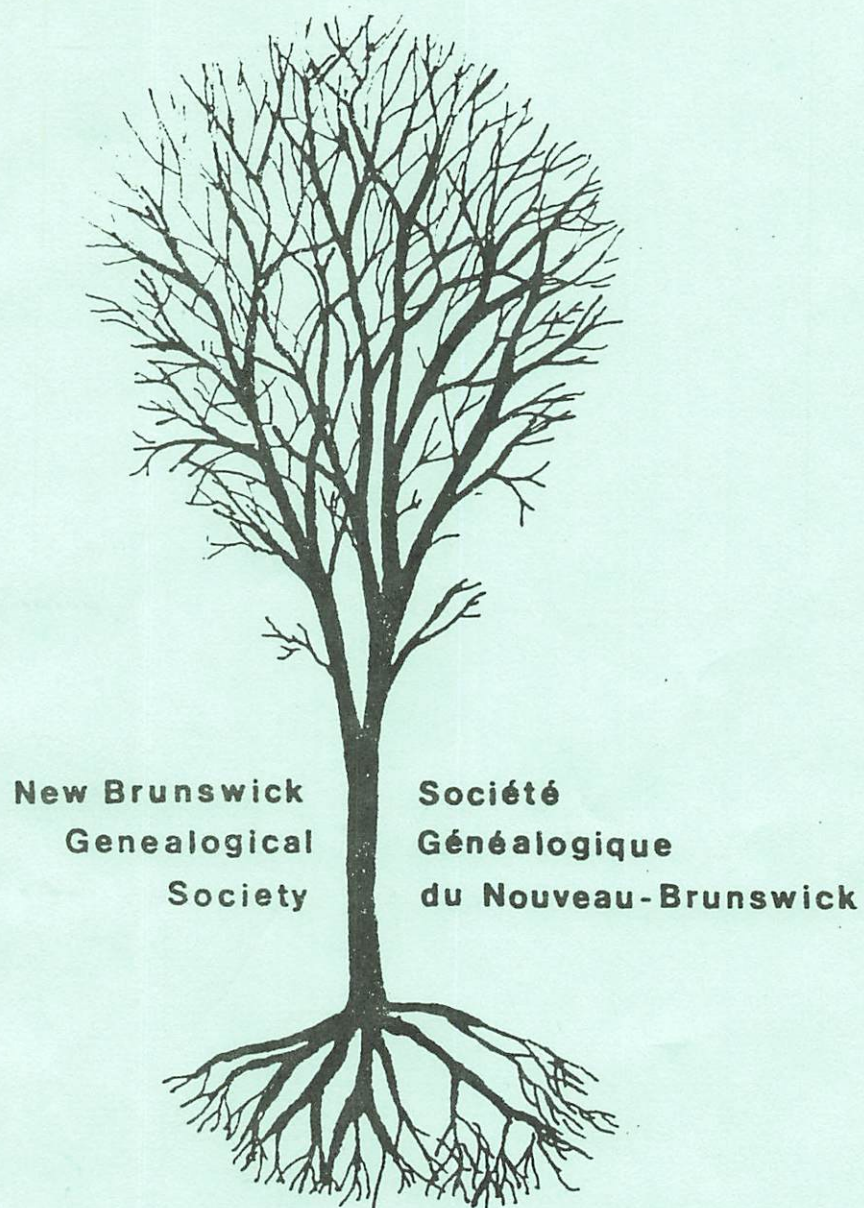

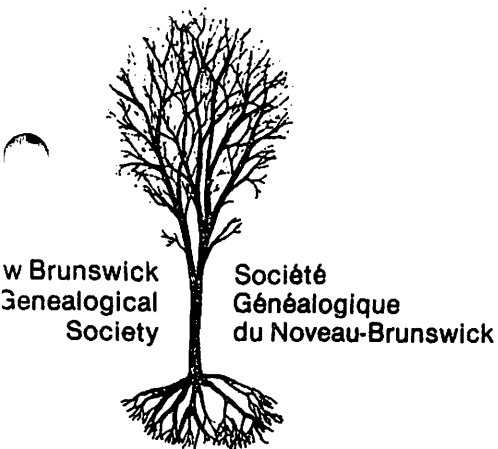

NOTICE TO CHANGE CONSTITUTION

In order to meet the requirements of the taxation laws in acquiring a tax number as a non-profit organization, it is necessary to include in our constitution a formal statement of profit exclusion to members of the Society. A vote to add the following clause to the constitution will be called at the Annual Meeting of the Society at Fredericton NB on May 28, 1983.

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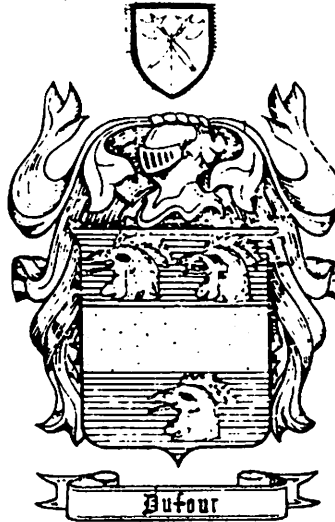

An item of particular note to researchers is the revision of the finding aid to the York-Sunbury Historical Society Collection, completed after several months of meticulous arrangement, description and indexing by project workers funded by a Canada Community Development Project. The collection contains 65 manuscript series dating from 1761 to 1981 and although most of the documentation pertains to the counties of York and Sunbury a wide variety of topics generally relating to New Brunswick are included.

Also of interest is a recently unearthed collection of ship passenger lists for the ports of Saint John and Saint Andrews covering the years 1833-1837. These lists have been indexed by surname of passenger, and have also been microfilmed.

From December 13 through January 15, the Provincial Archives will be hosting an exhibition entitled Dreams of Empire, sponsored by the Public Archives of Canada. The exhibit concentrates on the exploration, settlement, government, wars, economy, society and religion in Canada from its origins until 1700. This will be open to the public during regular Archives' hours, Monday through Saturday from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

NEW BRUNSWICK LOYALISTS
compiled by Sharon M. Dubeau

The Ontario Bureau of Archives Annual Report, 1904, contains the enquiry by the British Crown into the losses of United Empire Loyalists in consequence of their loyalty. An abundance of information can be found in these claims, which list things such as: land holdings in America, services to the British, residence in New Brunswick and familial relationships.

Hearings were held in London, Quebec, Montreal, Halifax and Saint John between the years 1784 to 1788, in order to give the Loyalists an opportunity to state their cases. Only a small proportion ever did, however, because the time and expense involved were too much for most. The claims are reproduced in this Report in over twenty volumes, with an index to each volume prepared by Alexander Fraser. A microfilmed copy of the report is located at the Archives of Ontario, 77 Grenville St., Toronto, Ont., M5S 1G3.

For example, one entry in the chronological index reads:

"Petition of sundry inhabitants of the parish of St. Mary's praying that a law be passed to enable them to pay property taxes"

Although this petition may contain numerous signatures, none are contained in the following index. Despite this discrepancy, the papers are a valuable historical and genealogical source, covering a wide spectrum of subjects such as:

Petition of Stair Agnew complaining of the undue return of James French, one of the members for York County.

Petition from Joel Daniels, James Dugan, and other inhabitants of Sussex Vale, Kings County, praying that ministers of any denomination be authorized to solemnize marriages.

Petition from Thomas Menzies and other inhabitants of Musquash River, Lancaster Parish, County of St. John praying for funds to improve the road to Saint John.

Petition of John Barrs & Co. of Liverpool, Nova Scotia, merchants praying for a drawback on rum seized at Bath on the Kennebec River.

Petition of Cliver Arnold, Rector Trinity Church in the parish of Sussex asking for aid for a grammar school.

SAINT JOHN BRANCH N. B. GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY

The following is an extract from a letter to the Sussex historian, Leonard Allison. It was written 1 November, 1901 by Mrs. Azor Hoyt. She was born Margaret Matilda Reid, 22 December 1829 in Nova Scotia. She died in Havelock, N.B. 27 April, 1915. Her husband was born 16 July, 1818 at Portage Vale, N.B. and died in Havelock, N.B. 24 January, 1901. The letter contains much genealogical information on the early settlers of the Sussex Portage area such as the Ketchums, Hoyts and Sniders.

Mrs. Azor Hoyt tells L.A. Nov. 1/01

The annexed letter is from A. H's 2nd sister, she lives Rogersville, Kent Co. A.H. was 83-84 and she 4 years older. He died Dec. 2/00 (Note: Tombstone says 24 Jan. 1901). She about 88 now. Their mother's name was Fanny (Frances) Ketchum. She was oldest of the girls or Mrs. James Ketchum was, she died years ago. Think James Ketchum of Norton. Mrs. Tobin was youngest of the family. There was also a Mrs. Snider - a sister of Mrs. Hoyt, her husband was Elias Snider of Portage - her sons were Douglas and William and a son died young. The daughter Mrs. Ed Gosline (Mary Eliza), Mrs. Dale Weldon of Dorchester (Jane), Mrs. Andrew Kinnear (Susan) and I think another, Mrs. John Davidson (Fred's mother, Margaret).

Mrs. Hoyt had a brother _____? Lost at sea when young. Mrs. Hallett's father and Mr. Hoyt claimed to be cousins. Azor's father and her grandfather were half brothers, I think. He called Azor of Hampton "Uncle Azor".

Old Sheriff Samuel Ketchum was I think a brother of Mrs. Hoyt's father, Isaac. (Note: brother of his mother who was also a Ketchum, Mary Elizabeth, daughter of Jonathan). Ketchums of Saint John are of the Norton family.

I don't know but think Sheriff Samuel Ketchum's wife was ...never lived at Portage, never was there I believe. Mrs. Price (Azor Hoyt's sister, Sarah) doesn't seem to know anything about it.

Uncle Ashton Ketchum of Little River, Hammond, was a first cousin of Peter, Mrs. Hoyt and Mrs. Tobin. There was a Ketchum who lived at Dutch Valley. I don't know who he was.

Mrs. Tupper's name was "Aunt Polly" (Sheriff Samuel's daughter, Mary). She had only one daughter, she wed Charles? Phinney. Mrs. P. was Mrs. T.'s only child. She had a family. I met them in Cornwallis - Don't know but think Mr. and Mrs. Phinney....

Neither Ashton nor Samuel (sons of Sheriff Samuel) had any children. There was an Isaac Ketchum who lived in Carleton, Saint John who was ?

Cosby Ketchum (son of Sheriff Samuel) wed a Catholic girl - don't know her name (Note: Mary Harr) He had a family; only one child, George Ketchum who lives near Campbell's Bridge, Hammond River. He married and has a family.

Ashton Ketchum lived at same place and deeded it among his brothers. His wife was Mrs. Fuller and her mother's name was Tait. Mrs. Ketchum was a sister of my mother - Scotch - all born in Nova Scotia. They had no brothers. Two Mrs. Fullers and Mrs. Reid - my mother. Ashton had no children. Mrs. A. K's first was Homer Fuller. My grandfather, Mr. Miller, built Prince's Lodge at Halifax and _____ it when the Duke of Kent was there.

My home was New Minas - 2½ miles from Kentville. My mother married a woodman of Wolfville. I had only one brother, Stephen Reid who went to Australia 40 years ago - never had a word from him. He married there. My father was killed moving a house and I came when 11 to live with my aunt, Mrs. Ketchum.

Can't surmise where names "Ashton" and "Cosby" came from. But think I have heard. Aunty Ashton Ketchum used to tell me a lot of family history but I didn't take much interest in it then.

Don't know what became of Ashton's brother, John - he may be the one who lived in Carleton, Saint John. (Note: Yes). Mr. Hoyt's mother's father, Isaac, that lived at Dutch Valley and after at Portage was called "Captain" Ketchum having been a sea captain in younger days - know Mrs. Hoyt, his daughter, referred to him as "a tough sailor".


