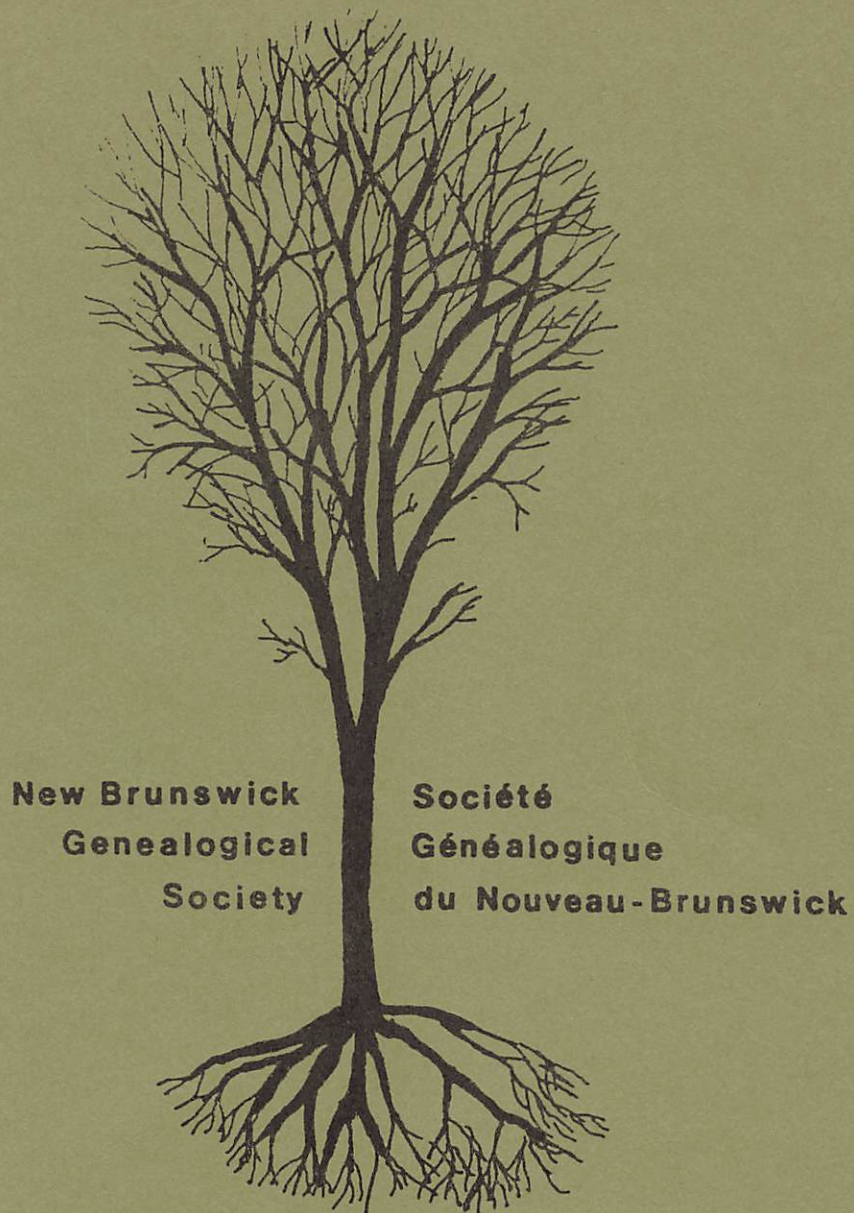

ATLAS FOR GERMANIC GENEALOGY (1982)

by Ernest Thode

This atlas is a collection of maps of German-speaking Europe chosen for particular applicability to Germanic genealogy. In addition to maps of each of the provinces of the German Empire showing the capital cities of each governmental district (Oberamt, Bezirk, Amt, etc.), the "county seats," so to speak, in two languages where applicable, other maps show an overview of Europe; an overview of the Deutsches Reich (German Empire); locations of German settlements in Central Europe; areas from which the greatest emigration took place; ports from which emigrants left; locations of German archives; locations of feminine given names, masculine given names, surname and locality-name suffixes, etc., characteristic of a particular region; rivers, forests, and mountains; major postal code areas; religious distribution; etc. Maps of Switzerland, Austria, and Transylvanian Saxony (Siebenbuergen) are also included.

If the place of origin is known, these maps may help put the area in perspective. (What regional archives might have jurisdiction? What may have been possible ports of departure?)

If the place of origin is not known, these maps may provide clues to a possible general area of origin. If your ancestors were named Melchior EGLE and Rosine DETTWILER, for instance, the maps on pages 8, 9, and 11 will all point to Switzerland, based on the given names and the surname suffixes.

An atlas this size cannot show every small village and does not attempt to do so. If the name of the village of origin is shown, detailed maps of German-speaking Europe are available from the author. Please state the place(s) of interest and enclose a self-addressed, stamped long business envelope with your inquiry.

The following data on James Savage was printed in the " The State of Jefferson News " from Medford Or and submitted by June Pratt of Grants Pass, Or.

JAMES SAVAGE was born in 1831 in Westmorland county, N.B. Canada, received a Donation Land Claim in Jackson County August of 1854 after arriving in Oregon the 1st of November 1853. He was married May 9, 1853 in Whiteside county, Illinois. His wife, Margaret, apparently immigrated to the U.S.A. at the age of three. He had removed from N.B. to Fulton, Whiteside county, Illinois, where he married and engaged in farming pursuits. On May 10, 1853, he started upon the long and tedious journey, with Ox-Teams, for the distant west, and in November he arrived in Oregon from the Southern

route. Shortly afterward he took up a donation land claim of three hundred and twenty acres seven miles east of the present site of Grants Pass. There he built a log cabin and cleared the land, after which he continued for years as a General farmer and stock-raiser. During the Indian troubles the families on both sides of him were attacked by savages, but he escaped their depredations. At the time of the Rogue River War he was a member of the First Oregon Mounted Volunteers. As the years passed by he acquired additional land, until his possessions aggregated six hundred acres. Meanwhile he also engaged in mining and from a placer mine near his claim took out enough gold to furnish a livelihood for his family. At the age of seventy-five years, he no longer actively cultivated the land, although he still oversaw the work of the place. In politics he voted with the Republican party. His wife came from Aberdeen, Scotland, and settled in Virginia. A family of thirteen children were raised.

Wilson's Point Cemetery

located at the Enclosure, near Newcastle, Northumberland Co. N.B.

" Father Jumeau, a Recollet priest, made a map of the Miramichi River & district in 1685 and this map indicates a graveyard and a mission station. This site is the first burying ground of the English-speaking settlers in Miramichi. Seventeen whole tombstones and parts of stones were found in restoring the graveyard in 1946.

forefathers."

Here lies interred the body of

who departed this life Oct. 28, 1814
in the 59th year of his age.

On the 28th Nov. 1804 - A canoe in the river Hopewell filled and
sunk and by which fatal accident two promising young men were
lawunched in eternity: The bodies of the unfortunate were found and
interred in one grave near this stone which is erected by their
disconsolate parents as a grateful tribute to the memory of their
dutiful and virtuous children.
William was in his 24th year, leaving a wife, only a few months
married, to bewail his untimely fate.
Abiel Peck Junr was in his 20th year.

Here lies the body of Abiel Peck, a native of Boston and one of the
first settlers of this place - who on the 16th day of December 1809,
Unfortunately perished in a boat, in the 73rd year of his age
leaving upwards of three score descendants to lament his
melancholy fate.

The Family of Joseph and Abigail⁹ (Parlee) Wright
Parish of Studholm, Kings county, New Brunswick

Joseph Wright - His land petition, dated 14 December 1822, stated that he was then twenty years and five months old, that he was born in the Parish of Norton, and that he had lived in the Parish of Sussex for fifteen years. He could have been the son of William Wright who died Parish of Studholm 13 January 1841, age 77 (N. B. Currier, 23 January 1841). On 15 July 1801, William Wright bought from Ralph Hait the western half of Lot #38, Parish of Norton (Kings County Land Records, Book G1, p. 301). On 21 November 1808, he sold the same property to Ephram Deforest and at that time William Wright is referred to as being of the Parish of Sussex (Kings County Land Records, Book J1, pp. 22-23). In 1809 William Wright was granted Lot #41 on the Millstream.

On 4 December 1823 Joseph Wright married Abigail Parlee

Abigail Parlee - Born 17 August 1797; died 3 February 1866; daughter of Isaac and Mary (Casey) Parlee.

2. William Joseph - Baptised 13 November 1825, Trinity Church, Sussex; married Elizabeth Belding 10 October 1850 (Saint John Marriage Register). 1871 Census lists children: Horatio, 18; Joseph, 16; Catherine, 14; Eulalie, 12; Myles, 9; Melbourne (?), 6; James, 2; William 2/12, born May.
3. Elizabeth - Born 14 March 1827; died 10 October 1859. Married 28 January 1847 William Bell Corey. Children: Hiram, born 30 May 1848, married Marion Sanders; Mary Ann, born 14 February 1850, married _____ Jamison; Abigail Jane, born 13 September 1851, married Moses Starkey; Joseph Clark, born 5 February 1853, married Mary Lee; Thomas Wells, born 26 April 1854, married first Bertha Wright, second Hannah (or Harriet) Pinckney; Alonzo S., born 27 November 1856, married a Mrs. Stilwell; Margaret E., born 13 May 1857, probably was the Margaret E. Corey who married Isaac B. Vincent 23 December 1875. (All information on Elizabeth Wright Corey taken from Corey History.)
4. James E. - Age 23 in 1851 Census
5. John - born c.1829, died 3 July 1908, age 79 (Obituary in Kings County Record, 10 July 1908). Married first Dorothy May Ferdinand 2 June 1852 (Saint John Marriage Register); Children: James, age 16 in 1871 Census; John, died 9 February 1862, age 3 years and six months (tombstone in Baptist Cemetery, Millstream); possibly Ferdinand -- in the 1881 Census, a Ferdinand Wright, age 16, was living in the home of Henry Wanamaker, Dorothy's uncle. Married second Hannah Elizabeth Belding, daughter of Duncan and Havallah (Hart) Belding. See separate sheet for their children.
6. Mary - Died 31 August 1849 in her 18th year (New Brunswick Currier, 15 September 1849)
7. Sarah (Sally) - Age 18 in 1851 Census; married William Burroughs Parlee; died 14 February 1866, age 33. Children: Jane, born 1862; Anna, died young; John, born 1865, died 1936, married Annabella Long. (Information on Sarah Wright Parlee from Talbert Gailey)
8. Isaac Nelson - Born 4 September 1835; died 24 April 1882; married Barbara Ann Goggin 5 April 1855. Children: Annie B., born 19 January 1856; Susan P., born 4 March 1859; Clarissa J., born 17 March 1862; Sarah A., born 25 August 1864; Edward N., born 4 July 1867 (?); James Caleb, born 28 June 1870, died 19 April 1943; Wealthy F., born 14 March 1874. (Information taken from the Isaac Nelson Wright Family Bible)
9. Anna Barbara - Age 13 in 1851 Census, married Thomas Gailey 12 March 1857 (Kings County Marriage Register). The following is a reprint of articles prepared in 1974 by George H. Hayward, 29 Leeds Drive, Fredericton, N.B., E3B 4S7, and published at that time in the Hartland Observer. He invites any readers who have additional information, or who have any questions relating to this family, to contact him.

WILLIAM ORSER, LOYALIST

A grave stone in the old Orser cemetery in Hartland, N.B., which can be seen from the Town Hall on Orser Street below the hill, is inscribed: "William Orser, 1762-1844; Mary Blake, his wife, 1772-1856; United Empire Loyalists."

The inscription implies both William and Mary were Loyalists. We can be reasonably sure William was, but if Mary was born in Saint John in 1772, and if her family remained in N.B., as we believe they did, she could not have been a Loyalist.

It is also said Mary Blake was the first female child born to English speaking parents on the Saint John River. The first English settlers came to the river in 1763, and the record shows there had been several children born to them before Mary's birth in 1772, nine years later.

Too, there is a popular tradition in N.B. that William Orser's parents were born in Amsterdam, Holland, and that the Dutch form of the name was Van Auslin. There appears to be no evidence to support either supposition. It is, however, quite certain his parents were born in New York State, and that the surname Orser is derived from Aertszen.

All bona fide Orsers in the U.S. and Canada are probably descended from one, Aert Willemszen, who likely came from Barneveld in Gelderland, the Netherlands, and became one of the earliest settlers in New Amsterdam, now New York City.

Aert Willemszen and his wife, Wintje (Elberts), were recorded as members of the Dutch Church in New Amsterdam when the first roll was made in 1649. He was a burgomaster (mayor) of the city, and died before 1662. His sons all took the surname Aertszen, meaning "Aert's son", following the Dutch custom of forming a patronymic surname by adding "-szen" to the father's first name; but his grandsons, who were brought up in New England, adopted the English custom and retained the surname Aertszen.

Twenty-three variant spellings of the name Aertszen can be found in the church records in New Amsterdam, and in Tarrytown, but the progression from Aertszen to Orser appears to have been: Aertszen, Aertse, Artse, Arse, Orser. The "A" was probably always pronounced by the Dutch in New England as "O", and the use of the Anglicized spelling, Orser, commences in the church records, and on tombstones in the large cemetery near the Tarrytown church, about the time of the Revolutionary War.

William Aertszen, son of Aert Willemszen, was a victualler by trade and lived on Broadway. However, about 1702, he moved up the Hudson River and settled in Philipsburg Manor where he probably became a tenant farmer. The Manor was ninety thousand acres along the east side of the Hudson owned by a wealthy

Dutchman, Frederick Philipse. In 1693, the British government had elevated the Philipse landholdings to the status of "Manour of Philipsborough", which gave Frederick rights to his property akin to those of a feudal lord of the middle ages.

Elbert Aertse, son of Willem Aertszen, was pound master at Philipsburg Manor in 1742. And Willem, son of Elbert Aertse, was "overseer of the King's Highway from Upper Mills to Croten's River", in 1745.

Jan Artse (or in English, John Orser), son of Elbert and Wintje (Devoe) Aertse, was born anout 1723, probably at Philipsburg Manor. He married, 13 Sep 1746, in the Dutch Church at Tarrytown, Rachel, daughter of Jan and Helena (Williams) Boulier (now commonly spelled Belyea). She was baptized 13 Aug 1726, at Tarrytown, and after their marriage she and John Orser lived about ten miles up the Hudson from Tarrytown, at Ossining, N.Y.

William, son of John and Rachel (Belyea) Orser, was baptized, according to the record in the Dutch Church at Tarrytown, 11 Sep 1763. This is one year later than the birth date on his tombstone in Hartland, N.B., and it is difficult at this time to be sure which is correct.

In 1783, William Orser found his presence as Tory, or one loyal to the British Crown, unwelcome among the citizens of the newly formed United States of America. Accordingly, tradition says he set out in the company of a few other youths and walked to freedom, to the Saint John River, where he settled. Why he did not come by ship like the other Loyalists is a bit puzzling.

Esther Clark Wright, in her Loyalists of New Brunswick, shows William Orser as having been a member of the Kings American Dragoons; and the Boulier, Bulyea, Belyea genealogy, 1970, says he served in Capt. Philips' Troop in that regiment. But his name does not appear in Sabine's Loyalists, Kelby's list, the Bureau of Archives Report of 1904, and a few other places one might have expected to find it. However, family tradition is very positive he was a Loyalist, and there is some supporting evidence, so it appears quite certain he was.

The Kings American Dragoons were assigned Block 4 at Prince William, on the westerly side of the Saint John River in York County, N.B.. The Department of Natural Resources, Land Branch, Fredericton, has on record three grants to William Orser: 19 May 1786, Lot 49 at Lower Prince William; 1 Feb 1793, Island Lot 76, on Bear Island in the Saint John River opposite Prince William; and 20 Jun 1809, Lots 45, 46, and the lower half of 47, including Middle Becaguimec Island, 500 acres, in what is now the Parish of Brighton, Carleton County, where the Town of Hartland is located.

William Orser's first wife was Mary Craig, sister of James Craig. After her early demise he married Mrs. Mary (Blake) Craig whose first husband was James Craig. About 1802, William and his second wife are said to have come up the Saint John River in canoes, presumably from Prince William, with their 12 ready-made children, offspring of their previous marriages, shared on the old and honorable principle of fifty-fifty, and settled at the mouth of the

Becaguimec. They are believed to have been the first permanent settlers in that area, and tradition says they were the founders of the Town of Hartland.

The late Judge M.L. Hayward, writing about George W. Orser and the "Oserites", in Collections of The New Brunswick Historical Society, Volume 11, 1927, said: "If (William) Orser had fought under Washington and been the first settler in an American town, some prominent feature thereof would bear his name, his monument would occupy the centre of the Public Square, there would be an 'Orser Day' set apart on the local school calendar, and his descendants would be inflated with ancestral pride. When the Town of Hartland was incorporated and the streets thereof named, the writer urged upon the committee in charge the propriety of recognizing William Orser as our first settler, and a former resident of the town made a similar plea on behalf of William S. Nevers, a later and prominent citizen, but both suggestions were rejected, the committee preferring such threadbare names as Main, King, Queen and Prince."

Finally, in 1966, about 164 years after William and Mary (Blake) Orser came to the mouth of the Becaguimec, a street was named after him, "in deference to a request from Senator A. Neil McLean, one of the town's biggest benefactors, who wished the street named 'Orser' after William Orser, founder of the town and the Senator's great grandfather", reported a front page article in the 6 Oct 1966 Observer.

William Orser's children by his first marriage to Mary Craig were:

1. **John Orser**, who was probably named after his paternal grandfather, was born about 1791. He was killed at Kingston, Ontario, 12 Nov 1813, during the War of 1812. A letter from John to his father, written at Saint John, 22 Apr 1813, is on display in the Town Hall in Hartland. In it, John mentioned plans for his regiment to go to Halifax, then to Upper Canada. He left no descendants.
2. **Ann Orser**. She was Phoebe Ann, and was probably born about 1793, although we have no documentary proof. She married, 12 Nov 1818, Joshua Bishop of York County, N.B.. Their children were: 2.1 **Samuel Bishop**; 2.2 **William Bishop**; 2.3 **John Bishop**; 2.4 **Elijah Bishop**; 2.5 **Peggy Bishop**, m. Mr. Pyle; 2.6 **Georgianna Bishop**, b. c1838, m. Stephen, son of William & Temperance (Kinney) Giberson, and had children, (a) Stephen O., (b) James, (c) John, (d) Maria, (e) Ralph, (f) Emily, (g) Caroline, (h) Phoebe, (i) Lydia, and (j) Elizabeth Giberson; and 2.7 **Mary Bishop**, m. Mr. Giggey.
3. **Lydia Orser**, b. c1795, m. 23 Mar 1811, John, son of John and Elizabeth (Brown) Giberson. He was born about 1789, and was killed by a falling tree before 1851 when Lydia was shown in the census as a widow, age 56, living in the Parish of Kent, Carleton County, N.B.. Several of the Gibersons living in the Bath area in Carleton Co. are descended from John and Lydia (Orser) Giberson. Their children were: 3.1 **William Giberson**, b. 1812, m. 4. **William Orser**, b. c1796, m. 28 Nov 1822, Mary, d/o Jonathan & Abigail (Tapley) Shaw. On the 27th of March, 1818, William was granted the upper half of Lot 47, and the whole of Lot 48, 300 acres, adjacent to his father's land at Hartland. In 1831 William and Mary Orser sold their land to William's half brother, Edward Orser, who was known as Evard, and they removed to Upper Canada, probably shortly after they sold the land. Nothing more is known of them.
5. **Elizabeth Orser**, m. James Lovely. We know nothing about this couple.
6. Tradition says there were six. Who was the sixth? Did he or she survive childhood and marry?

We now come to the descendants of William and Mary (Blake) Orser. It is believed that all the Orsers in Carleton County, N.B., are descended from this couple. Their children were:

7. **Stephen Orser**, b. c1803, d. 29 Oct 1868, as a result of injuries he received when he fell from a moving wagon onto the frozen ground. He married first, 25 Nov 1826, Jane McIsaac, who died in 1834. He married second, 02 Dec 1835, Sarah Foster, who was born c1812 and died 20 Dec 1889, at Fort Fairfield, Maine. His children by his first marriage to Jane McIsaac were: 7.1 **Asenath Orser**, b. 1829, m. Edward McIsaac, no children; 7.2 **Mary Orser**, b. 1831, was a deaf mute and never married; 7.3 **Stephen Orser**, b. 22 Apr 1832, d. 23 Mar 1912, m. 21 Jul 1853, Lydia, d/o George & Rhoda (Shaw) McGee, and had children, (a) Amanda, b. 1854, m. Colby Henderson, (b) Laura, b. 1857, m. 1st, Michael Simonson, 2nd, James

McIsaac, (c) Stephen, b. 1862, m. Nora Connolly, (d) Frank, b. 1864, died young, (e) Bessie, b. 1866, m. William Britton, (f) Annie, b. 1869, m. Edward Britton. 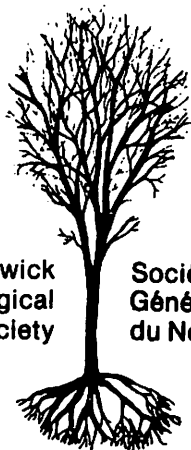

THE VEHICLES WILL THEN PROCEED ON TO KINGSTON AT APPROXIMATELY 10.30 A.M. THERE WILL BE A CHURCH SERVICE THERE FOR THOSE WHO ARE INTERESTED, AT 11.00 A.M..
