



From the Preface

The Loyalists are unfashionable. W.O. Raymond's world of women "delicately reared" and men "unaccustomed to toil" who subdue a wilderness to become Canada's founding nobility is now an embarrassment. The romantic iconography of C.W. Jefferys has lost its charm. The derring-do of Archdeacon Cody's novels no longer stirs. . . . [Esther Clark] Wright's demographic insight — which should have revolutionized the image of Loyalists among those who shape public perceptions — has yet to be grasped. . . The Loyalists remain condemned as something they demonstrably were not. Those responsible for public culture have still not understood that the Loyalists they find so unserviceable in an egalitarian and bi-cultural society are the Loyalists of Raymond and Cody, Mowat and Hill. They are not the Loyalists of 1783.

EARLY LOYALIST SAINT JOHN is an introduction to Loyalist New Brunswick drawn from sources which, in great measure, are brought together for the first time. It offers a particular account of the settlement and leadership of the community in which most New Brunswick Loyalists spent the early stage of their exile, together with an extended essay on the emergence of politics. If anything will finally shatter the mythology surrounding the Loyalists and rehabilitate them in the eyes of academics, students and culture bureaucrats it is a close study of the tumultuous history of early Saint John.

Among the appendices are anti-government petitions with 900 signatures, the first accurate version of the 1550 grantees of Parr and Carleton, and an abstract of demographic data on 2400 Refugee families drawn from scores of passenger and victualling lists newly-discovered by the author at the Public Records Office. Of interest to scholars as well as the reading public.

Nova Scotian Loyalists and Their Documents

This year, 1983, is the bicentenary of the arrival of the Lovalists to Nova Scotia. To commemorate this event, the Public Archives of Nova Scotia has compiled an annotated Bibliographic Guide of the printed and manuscript sources relating to the Loyalists held in the Archives.

The Guide's over 1500 entries cover the Loyalist period in Nova Scotian history from 1775 to 1830. The three hundred pages of entries and indexes are divided for easy use into sections and subsections, including those of regions, government & politics, genealogy, trade & commerce, education, architecture, and soldiers of the American Revolution.

Each entry provides a summary of the material in the source with the complete reference for locating it in the Archives' holdings. Sample entries are on the reverse of this page.

Two thousand copies of the Guide are now being printed for sale to the general public in the early Autumn of this year. The price for copies ordered in advance is \$7.95 plus \$1.50 for postage and handling. Copies may be ordered in advance by completing the form on the opposite page.

This is a copy of an old letter dated at Weston, Connecticut, April 3, 1803, from Calvin Wheeler to Hezekiah Hoyt of Kingston, NB. A copy of this letter is located in the Raymond Paddock Gorham Papers concerning the Loyalists of Kingston, in the Provincial Archives of NB.

Sir, I lately Rec a letter from you dated 28 of February last, which gave me satisfaction to hear from you in particular and the rest of my old neighbors and acquaintances, in which you told me you was in good health, they find me and my family in health also. You tell me you have commenced housekeeping or rather batchelors hall; you complain some of the want of females at Kings, we have one and an half to a boy in Connecticut, perhaps if you was here you might make a Composition out of some of those halves which would please you. If you should come next winter and call yourself batchelor you would be much admired only for your name, for that sound is not heard in our Country. our Girls would think it Equal to the title of Dukedom, Earldom or some dum or other. excuse me when I come to close and I will begin again.

I pitty your situation as to living alone, for it appears to me that it will keep the mind in a Continual agitation, if so there is no happiness; for happiness in this world is seated only in the mind, when that is disordered man is like a shadow.

but be not cast down or Gloomy about it, a faint heart never wins the Golden Prize.

Remember me to your Honored Father, to M^{Γ} Picket and family and all old friends. I should be exceeding glad to see you all If I could but the Distance prevents me.

GORHAM LOYALISTS

The earliest recorded usage of the surname Gorham (variations Gorum, Goram, Goreham, Gorram) was in the 10th century as the name of the Danish king Gorm, who invaded northern France. The name is next recorded in Normandy. The little town of Gorram is located in the Province of Maine in Northern France. There, the ancient ruins of the Chateau de Gorram, built in 1199, can be seen. A William de Gorram accompanied William the Conquerer in his invasion of England in 1066, and was given an estate in England. There were three branches of the Gorham family in England, with homesites in Suffolk, Hertfordshire, and Northamptonshire. In 1635, two Gorhams, Thomas and John, immigrated to America from Northamptonshire. There are several townsites in the eastern United States named Gorham. In 1783, five Gorhams (brothers and cousins) took up residence in New Brunswick. Two hundred years later many of their descendents remain in New Brunswick.

The ancestor of all the Gorham Loyalists who settled in New Brunswick was GEORGE GORHAM, the eldest child of Shubael and Puella (Hussey) Gorham, who was born in Barnstable, Massachusetts, 19 January 1697. George was married 20 July, 1725, to Hannah Banks, daughter of Joseph, in the Church of England, at New Rochelle, New York. They settled first in Greenwich, Connecticut, but by 1728, they were living in Rye, New York. George Gorham was the first of the name to settle in Stamford, Connecticut in 1738, and became a wealthy citizen of the town. In 1743, his name appears as one of the town officials. He has also been called the first genealogist of the family, but his notes have never been found. George Gorham was a mariner by trade, and was licensed as Master of the sloop "Hannah" in 1727. He travelled the West Indies route. George Gorham died aroung April 1772 at Stamford, Connecticut. His will, dated 28 March 1772, and proved 5 May 1772, mentioned his grandchildren (children of his deceased son Shubael): Shubael, Nathaniel(UE), John(UE). Samuel(UE), Anthony, George, Mary, Hannah, and Deborah; and his sons: Jonathan(UE), George, Joseph(UE), and Daniel. George Gorham also had eight daughters: Hannah, Puella, Abigail, Mary, Phoebe, Annie, Sarah, and Deborah. His widow, Hannah, died after December 1789. Early Gorham ancestry is recorded in: Genealogical Dictionary of New England, James Savage, Genealogical Publishing, Co., Baltimore, 1965; Mayflower Descendants and Their Marriages, John T. Lanids, Genealogical Publishing Company, Baltimore, 1956; Directory of the Ancestral Heads of New England Families, 1620-1700, compiled by Frank R. Holmes, Genealogical Publishinh Company, Baltimore, 1974.

NATHANIEL GORHAM was the founder of the Kingston branch of Gorham Loyalists. He was born in 1752 at Stamford, Connecticut, son of Shubael (1727–1771) and Mary (Selleck) Gorham. He was married, 16 September 1773, to Mary, daughter of Elakim and Mary (Beachgood) Whitney, at St. James Episcopal Church, Stamford, Connecticut. He arrived in New Brunswick, Summer 1783, aboard the ship "Two Sisters", accompanied by his wife and young daughter. Nathaniel was granted a townlot at Parrtown in 1784, where the family lived during the first winter. Parrtown of 1783–84 was a desolate place, with army tents, shoddy lean—tos, and a few rough log cabins to house the homeless immigrants. In the early days, it was a feat just to survive. Shortly after the Loyalists began to establish themselves in Parrtown, a forest fire swept the eastern part of the town, destroying the precarious hold the people had had. This fire affected Nathaniel Gorham and his family. Early in 1784, he settled on his granted lot on the Long Reach of the Saint John River, Kingston Parish, Kings County. He may have

been reunited with some of his friends as Connecticut refugees were prominent in Kings Co. Nathaniel had been a farmer in Connecticut and continued in that profession in Kings Co. Kingston Parish was a hilly area of great beauty, a wealth of forest, plentiful waterways, but little good agricultural land. Uhile many settlers had to move on to seek more arable land, Nathaniel must have been more fortunate in his allotment of land, and in later years acquired further neighbouring lands to extend his farming acreage. Around, 1768, Mary Gorham died and a year later Nathaniel was remarried to Sarah Bostwick. According to the records of Trinity Anglican Church, Kingston, Nathaniel was buried there 12 February 1846, aged 93. His wife Sarah was buried there 18 October 1837. The will of Nathaniel Gorham mentions: his sons - George and Henry; his daughters - Hannah wife of Hugh McCleery, Elizabeth wife of Samuel Foster, Francis wife of William Porter, and Hester wife of Seth Sterret; his grandson - Beverley Nathaniel McCleery; and his sons-in-law Seth Sterret and Hugh McCleery.

In manuscript form, the Raymond P. Gorham Collection - MC211, also microfilm F1283 - at the New Brunswick Provincial Archives, has considerable notes to do with Nathaniel Gorham's descendents and early Gorham ancestry. For descendents of Nathaniel Gorham see also 1851 Census Records, Kings Co., parishes of Kingston, Westfield, and Greenwich; and Kings Co. Marriage, Baptismal, and Death Registers.

JONATHAN GORHAM was the founder of the Oak Point branch of the Gorham family. According to Stamford Vital Records, Jonathan Gorham was born 25 January 1740, son of George (1697–1772) and Hannah (Banks) Gorham. He arrived in New Brunswick, Fall 1783, and in a grant dated 1787, he received a lot of 200 acres lying on the northwesterly side of the Saint John River, in the Long Reach, opposite Caton's Island, Kingston (now Greenwich)Parish, Kings Co. A few years after he had received this grant, he purchased a lot adjacent to and south of his own, upon which he established a tavern. In addition to his public house, he operated a brick yard and a store. Jonathan Gorham soon became a leading man in the community. He was among the founders of the first Anglican Church, built at Oak Point in 1790, named St. George's Chapel. During the tlar of 1812, he was active in the militia, training soldiers. Jonathan used to trap Passenger Pigeons, to be delivered alive to the Saint John garrison, for target practice. Jonathan Gorham died April 1824. His wife, Mary Watters died October 1822. Both are probably buried in St. Paul's Anglican Churchyard, Oak Point, although no markers remain. In his will dated 8 April 1824 and proved & May 1824, Jonathan mentions: his sons - William and Daniel, and his daughters - Phoebe, Lydia, and Elizabeth.

Information on the descendents of Conathan can be located in the 1851 Consus for Kines Co., Greenwich and Kineston Parishes, as well as in the Kines Co. Marriage, Saptismal and Death Redisters.

JCHR GCRHAM was a younger brother of Nathaniel and was born around 1754 at Stamford, Connecticut. He serves as an Ensign with the Royal Fencible Americans during the Revolutionary Mar. He arrived in New Brunswick in 1783. and received a townlot at Parrtown in 1784. He bacame a Freeman of Saint John in 1785, admitted as a weaver. It is not known if he married, or where he died.

SAMUEL GORHAM was a younger brother of Nathaniel and was born around 1758 at Stamford, Connecticut. He settled in Kingston Parish, Kings Co., in 1784, where he died in 1854, aged 96. (Trinity Anglican Church Records) He appears on the 1851 Census of Kingston Parish, Kings Co.: Samuel Gorham, widow, aced 93, living with his mephew Henry, son of Nathaniel. No known descendents.

JOSEPH GORHAN was a younger brother of Jonathan. He was born February 1747 at Stamford, Connecticut. (Stamford Vital Records) During the Revolutionary War, he served with the Engineering Department, a civilian department which functioned to construct bridges, erect buildings etc. Joseph was a Captain of a militia company of Loyalist refugees, who arrived in New Brunswick, Summer 1783, aboard the ship "Two Sisters". In a grant dated 1784, he received a lot on the Kennebecasis River, Kingston Parish, Kings Co. He became a Freeman of Saint John in 1790, admitted as a carpenter. He died at Kingston, 4 February 1832, aged 86. (Trinity Anglican Church Records) It is probable that he never married.

The Provincial Archives was pleased to cooperate in hosting the 1983 United Empire Loyalist Association Annual convention in Fredericton in late June. As well, several staff members presented papers at the Third International Genealogical Workshop in Saint John, and at various meetings of the Learned Societies in Vancouver. The editorship of the Association of Canadian Archivists Bulletin has been undertaken by P.A.N.B. for a two year term.

The Archives has witnessed an increasing number of visitors during 1983, serving approximately 7,000 researchers in the January-September period. Regular hours of operation continue, Monday through Saturday, 8:30 to 5~p.m.

Due in part to a grant from the Cultural Relations and Cooperation Branch of the Department of Historical and Cultural Resources, a survey was conducted of documents relating to Acadian and Indian history at the Archives Nationales de Quebec. Other projects during the past several months include Conservation of Historical Documents, Broadcast Archives Survey, Sources of Women's History, Non-Traditional Sources of History, Customs and Immigration Records, Health Records and Land Settlement Records.

ELDRIDGE GENEALOGY

Loyalists records show William Eldridge, maybe of New Jersey, served the 2nd Delancey's was in Beaver Harbour in 1787.

In a petition dated 7 July 1794, William Eldridge stated: he served as a private in General DeLancey's 3rd battalion of provincial troops. That he "sat down on a spot of land" close by the twon of Beaver Harbour ten years past. William further stated he had a family and he requested the government to grant him this piece of land of about 50 acres.

In a petition dated 1 January 1814, William Eldridge requested the government grant to him land of 100 acres laying on the west side of Camp Creek. He stated he had been there twenty years.

William's request was granted as shown in a deed of 21 November 1829, Book K, Pg. 85 #89, where in William deeded a piece of the land, "granted to him in 1815" to the minister church wardens and Vestry of the Parish of St. George. The land William deeded for one shilling, one quarter of an acre was for the use of a "school for the education of youth in Beaver Harbour."

A great, great grandson (now deceased) of William the Loyalist claimed William had a brother Barnabus who landed on Pubnico, Nova Scotia, that the Eldridge living around Yarmouth were his descendents.

There are no records to either prove or disprove this claim.

In 1851 Euphemia Lived with sister Hartha. Her death is recorded in St. George Anglican Church records.

In a deed 1804, C-195, William Jr. signed his name "Will". A deed 1830 L 121-122 William Jr. and wife Sarah sell land of "his father William deceased".

In November 1829 William Sr. deeded the land to the church. He therefore died between Nov. 1829-1830. In 1884 some children of William Jr. are selling their share of land of their father William, deceased.

Sarah, the wife of William Ir. was the daughter of Isaac and Sarah Justason. Her mother Sarah died in 1805 and Isaac drew his will mentioning Sarah, not yet of age. Isaac died in 1812. It is probable that Sarah took care of her father until his death at which time she married William Eldridge. There is no record of her death but deeds show she was deceased by 1844. William Ir. and Sarah bapt. in 1823 at St. George Anglican church. Mary Ann 10 yrs, George 4 yrs, Martha 18 mo., in 1825 - Lydia 10 yrs in 1831, James 2½ years in 1832, William Justason 6 yrs.

The ages given do not agree with the cemetery stones in some cases, this could be due to error of either church record or stones.

I thought the following information might be of interest to some of your readers.

George Dobson immigrated to Nova Scotia from Thirsk, Yorkshire, between 4 Feb. 1773 (when he and his son-in-law, William Wells, signed off a deed for the "New Room", a meeting house for the Methodists and John Wesley in Thirsk) and 28 July 1773 when he died in Cumberland.

In his will, dated 27 July 1773, there is a "list of debts due the estate of George Dobson deceased". The following names were listed:

William Jones Benajah Lewis Timothy Carter Anthony Burke Mark Patton Jr. Robert Sharp Olliver Eddy Gidion Smith William Southward Robert Haggart John Cassy ? Abiathar Eddy William Bryan John Fillimore Robert Hagart William Southworth William Jones

I also have a copy of Georges brother Richard Dobson's will, dated 13 Jan. 1775. names his neice Margaret Wells, neice Mary Dobson, two nephews Richard and John Dobson and also nephews George and David Dobson. Also mentions his wife Ann. George and David, sons of brother George are joint executors. Probated 28 June 1780. Records from Yorkshire tell us that Richard Dobson married #1 Elizabeth Skelton who died 23 Oct. 1867. He married #2 Ann Wear 1770. He had one son, Richard bp. 29 Sept. 1723 and buried 3 Dec. 1728. (this proves the information in Burns and Trueman wrong).

Those familiar with the Census format will recognize the data that is presented - surname, census page number. Christian names, relationships, ages in 1861, area of birth, occupation, religion and/or other remarks.


