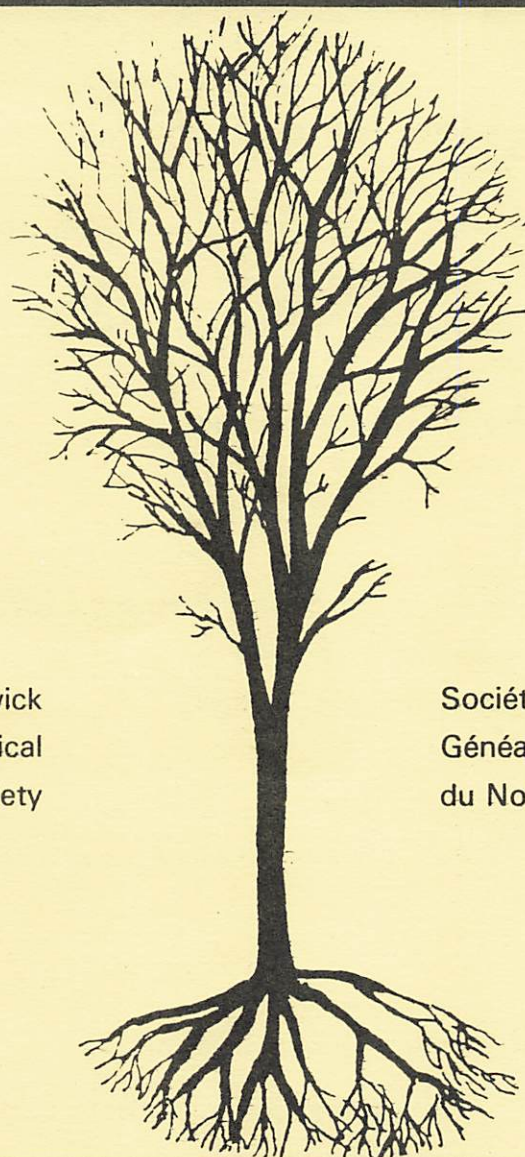

On October 24, 1984 an exhibition of photographs by the Smith Studios of Sackville, New Brunswick and Amherst, Nova Scotia WAS opened at the Provincial Archives. The Smiths through their photographs made New Brunswick known to the world. Their work was the first comprehensive attempt by the New Brunswick government through the N.B. Travel Bureau, precursor to the Department of Tourism, to visually present the province to perspective visitors.

We are pleased to report that Volume 5 of "Vital Statistics From New Brunswick Newspapers, 1832-1834" is at the printer and is scheduled for distribution before Xmas. The 1830's seem to contain more obituaries of loyalists than previous years.

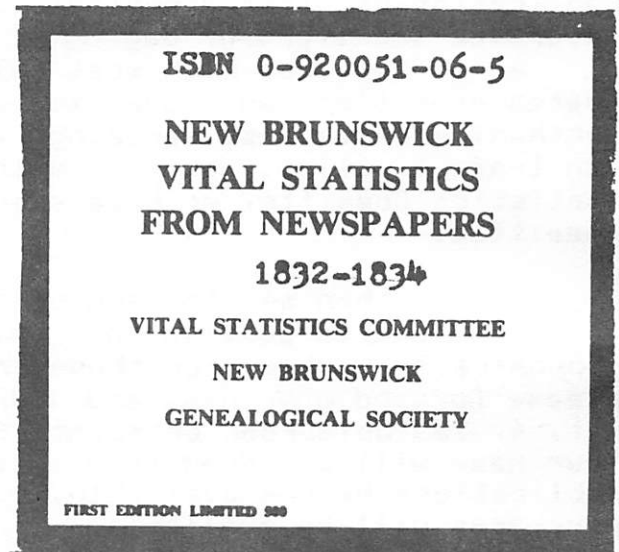
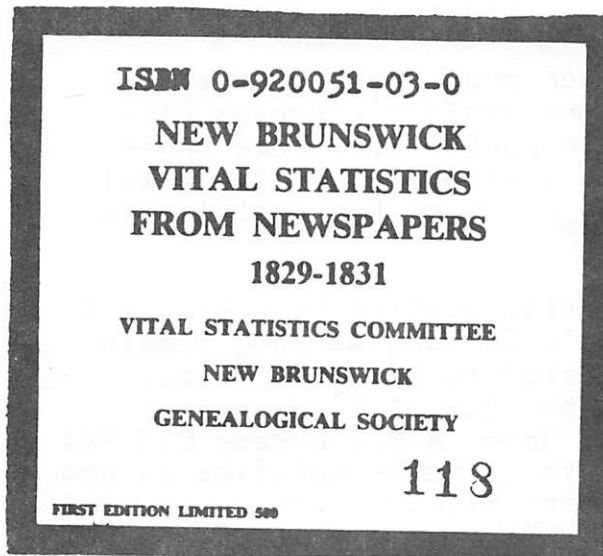
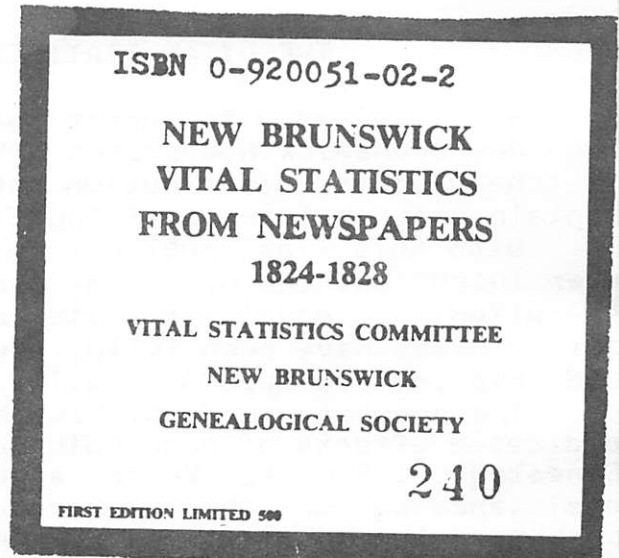
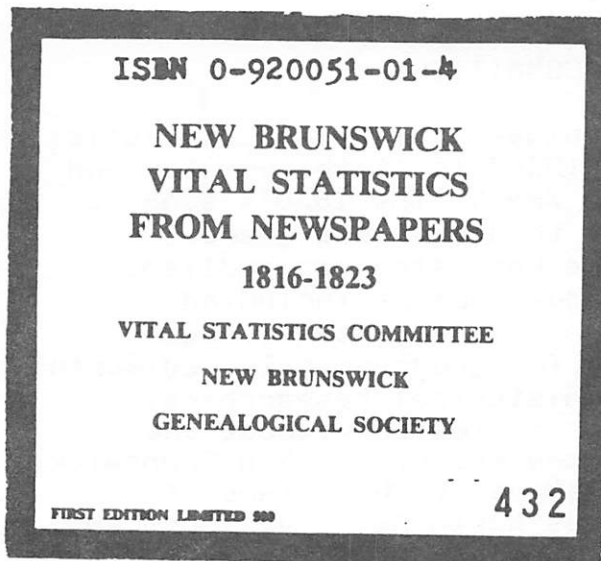
With this final publication, the Committee has published over 10,000 entries of birth, marriages, deaths including executions, coroner's inquests and notices of estate. About 15,000 names have been fully indexed. The geographical, regimental and ship indices hopefully will aid historical researchers.

The project would not have seen completion without the dedicated efforts of many volunteer members of the New Brunswick Genealogical Society. We are appreciative of the offers of assistance by our other members across North America. Those who purchased the publications not only have gained a valuable library, but have helped to provide a fund which will allow the publication of other genealogical works that otherwise may never see the light of day.

As is the case with most volunteer projects, interest abates over time, and committee members prefer to pursue other worthwhile endeavors. Genealogists, in particular, have their own trees to climb. However, with the disbandment of the Vital Statistics Committee, we have seen the birth of the Publication Committee.

Rather than see the end of the Vital Statistics Volumes, I will continue to publish them privately as long as they remain economically viable. From an article appearing recently in the "Telegraph Journal" we learn that many New Brunswick families have received letters with a Don Mills, Ontario return address promoting family history in a "hand-bound book with a burgundy grained finish, richly gold embossed." Miss Edgett of New Brunswick's Better Business Bureau said: "People who have ordered it at a cost of \$34.95 plus \$1.88 for shipping and handling charges, found it contained only general information anyone could find in a genealogical encyclopedia. Several of those that complained to the bureau that the book failed to live up to its advertising promise did return it to Don Mills address and eventually received their money back." The bureau traced the origin to Halbert's Irish Reunion Tours of Akron, Ohio. We are indebted to Vera Ayling the Telegraph Journal Correspondent for bringing "Halbert's Scam" to the attention of the general public. Regretfully, such activity, does much harm to bonafide publishers in the field which depend upon mail order.

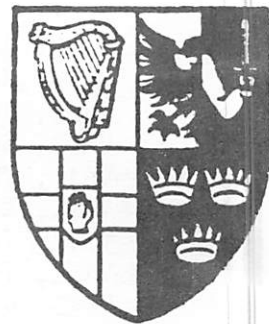

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LOYALIST BIOGRAPHICAL REVIEW
by Daniel F. Johnson

Published loyalists biographies often must be accepted with a grain of salt. Even standard "bibles" of Loyalist biography by noted historians Lorenzo Sabine, D.R. Jack and E.C. Wright must be scrutinized for documentation. These were quantitative works and, in general use, provide important leads. There are cases, however, where confusion of similar names have occurred. The onus of proof lies with the genealogist. You have only yourself to blame should you not check the primary sources.

For the purpose of a documented genealogical inquiry I chose those persons who drew lots at Parrtown, now a part of the City of Saint John. Although loyalist refugees arrived as early as May, 1783, it was not until 1784 that the actual Parrtown Grant was dated. A Parrtown grantee was not necessarily loyalist. Some were Pre-loyalists who had settled the area in the early 1760's; others were merchants from Nova Scotia and New England.

Lists of Parrtown Grantees by J.W. Lawrence, D.R. Jack and others have numerous errors ie. ALLAINE instead of ALLAIRE, etc. This genealogical inquiry is restricted to those lot holders of Parrtown whose surname commences with "A".

Anyone who has read D.G. Bell's "Early Loyalist Saint John" (Fredericton: New Ireland Press) 1983, recognizes its appendices are drawn from original papers. Because of the detailed nature of the work and specific references, I accept its reproduction without further documentation.

ACRIG,AYCRIG,AYERCRIGG (lot 1137)

Racheal ACRIG formerly of New Jersey, arrived with Unit 12 (militia captain, Oliver Bourdette) aboard the ship "Tartar" in the June Fleet of 1783. Her Family at New York at time of departure and in May, 1784 consisted of one child over age 10 and another child under age 10. [D.G. Bell, "Early Loyalist Saint John: The Origin of New Brunswick Politics"]

Sharon Debeau writes: "She later married Garret JACOBUS and they removed to New Jersey. Rachel returned to Saint John where she died 28 October 1807, age 69." According to the Vital Statistics from New Brunswick Newspapers (Saint John Gazette: 2 Nov.1807 "died last Wednesday, Mrs Rachel JACOBUS, age 70." Otherwise, I am unsure where Ms. Dubeau has acquired her information. Ms. Debeau also mentions a son Benjamin ACRIGG who was drowned on passage to Fredericton, 22 April 1818, age 44. [The source of this data comes from the "Centennial Souvenir" of 1883 in which epitaphs of the 'Old Loyalist Burying Ground' of Saint John is recorded.] From the York County Probate records we learn that on 28 April 1818, that John Woolhaupter, watchmaker of Fredericton and his wife Mary Payne Woolhaupter, "next of kin" were appointed administrators to Benjamin's estate. A notice of same was published in the New Brunswick Royal Gazette May 5,1818. I do not know Ms Debeau's source indicating that Benjamin was Racheal's son.

ADAIR, ADARE

(lot 1350)

Robert Adair, native of Scotland, arrived with Unit 22 (militia captain Nathaniel Horton) aboard the ship "Elizabeth" in the July Fleet of 1783. In May 1784 he is still recorded as single. Former trade: millwright. [See Ibid. D.G. Bell]

August 31, 1785 - drew lot 15, 2nd Survey Little Kennebecasis land exceedingly difficult to get to, not fit for cultivation; seeks vacant lot on Jemseg Creek, branch of Salmon River in the Grand Lake. dated at Saint John. [Land Petition]

August 19, 1786 - Robert Adair, County of York, Carpenter to David McClure, proportion of house and half lot on Main Street, Saint John City. [St. John County Registry Book A-2 p.108].

ADAMS

Lot 703

According to E.C. Wright, John ADAMS of New Jersey received Parrrtown Lot 703, later removing to Sunbury County. Perhaps her source was D.R. Jack's "Loyalist Families". In any case, this John ADAMS was one of many by such name who came and will require considerable research. There are numerous possibilities:

- (1) John ADAMS, on list of voters St. John City, for years 1785, 1801, 1804. [St. John Registry Book H. p.261] Samuel ADAMS, Yeoman & John ADAMS, Carman & wife Elizabeth mortgage from David Merritt for lot 390 Kings Ward, 10 March 1804. [Saint John Probate: Elizabeth, widow of John ADAMS, Carman named administrator to Estate. 20 March 1820; [Loyalist Souvenir, 1883 "Old Burying Ground" John ADAMS died 12 March 1820, age 49, Elizabeth died 3 February 1836, age 62.] Vital Statistics Vol 2 (City Gazette: 15 March 1820) died Sunday morning, paralytic stroke, age 49.
- (2) [Land petitions] John ADAMS, loyal subject, has wife, two children, ahving for some time lived with hid father-in-law but now wishes to settle vacant back land Hawser's Survey, north side Kennebecasis River, Kingston Survey. 15 Dec. 1788.
- (3) [Land Petition] John ADAMS, not being able to get lands assigned to him upon his arrival in this province was directed to proceed up River St. John and settle on unallocated lands. Built house, improved land and raised grain at Gagetown. Threatened by writ of ejectment by James Peters, Esq. without compensation. Grimross Neck, Gagetown 7th January 1785. John ADAMS, came May, 1783 with large family. Wishes Lot 57, Gagetown. [According to Duncan Thomas of Fredericton 10 Sept. 1907 to D.R. Jack, John ADAMS was a resident of Long Island, New York. At the outbreak of the Revolution received a warrant for captain's commission. After raising men, as his company was not assigned a place under command of Lord Cornwallis as promised, he refused to accept command and served instead as clerk in War Department. After first settling Gagetown, later removed to Sunbury County. [D.G. Bell "Early Loyalist Saint John"] John ADAMS of Spring Fleet, family at New York included wife, four children and servant. Upon arrival at Saint John servant no longer indicated on lists. In May, 1784, wife, three children over age ten, and two children under age ten.

ALAIR, ALLAIRE

Lot 1192

According to W.O. Raymond in "Provincial Regiments" [NBM: SB 25 p.66] "The Loyal American Regiment, engaged in the campaign in the South under Cornwallis, suffered heavily at the disastrous Battle of Kings Mountain. Outnumbered and surrounded on all sides, they were obliged to surrender." The diary and order book [NBM:Manuscript] of Lt. Anthony ALLAIRE includes a record of this battle.

Jonas Howe states that he was born at New Rochelle, New York of Huguenot descent, but does not cite source. [Acadiensis v.6 n.4 Major Ferguson's Riflemen p.240, Oct.1906] In 7th August 1785 sought grant of vacant land near mouth of Oromocto River, formerly reserved for John Porteous - Lt. Anthony Allaire, Loyal American Regiment. Dated at Fredericton 9th May 1787 petition for lots 36,39 returned for Amand Cormier and Francis Cormier who sold their possessions on River St. John and removed to Westmorland last fall.

On 27 July 1794 Anthony ALLAIRE married Mary SIMONDS, received certification by Robert Willis, Rector and attested 12 Sept. 1820 by William Scovil and Harry Peters. [NBM: Lt. Col. Beverly Robinson Papers, Manuscript]

On 4th June 1803, Anthony Allaire and Mary, his wife of City of Saint John sold lots 63,84 Kings Ward to James Grigor, merchant with buildings, fences. [St. John Registry Book H. p.105 Old Burying Ground, Fredericton: "Sacred to Memory of Anthony ALLAIRE, born 22 February 1755 died 9th June 1838; In Memory of Mary wife of Capt. Anthony ALLAIRE eldest daughter of James SIMONDS, Esq. died 9th June 1827, age 55."]

His wife, Mary died at Pine Grove, Douglas parish, York County. [Vital Statistics From Newspapers Vol 3] Their only daughter Eliza Maria married 31st December 1818 at Pine Grove to Lt. John Robinson of the 104th Regt. [Ibid: Vital Stats Vol 2]

ALBRIGHT

Lot 381

John ALBRIGHT arrived with unit 33. His family in May 1784 included wife, one child over age 10 & 3 under. [Ibid. D.G.Bell]

5th July 1848, John, Jr. of Grand Lake, Queens Co., N.B., administrator to estate of his father sold Parrtown lot 381 to Amy Nixon, City of Saint John. [St. John Registry L-1 p.43] Children of John & Elizabeth ALBRIGHT baptized at Grand Lake. Henry William bapt. 14 Aug. 1791, Catherine & Jacob bapt. 6 July 1793, Esther bapt. 18 Febr. 1794, Lewis, Elizabeth, Mary bapt. 8 March 1806. [NBM: Marianna Gray Otty Papers: Gagetown Church]

ALGEE, ALGAR

Lot 914

Alexander ALGEE arrived with unit 37. In June 1784, he was single.[Ibid. Bell] He married 12th July 1797 Ann ROBINSON [NBM: Marianna Gray Otty Papers] On 11th Nov. 1819 Alexander Algee of Waterborough, Queens Co., wife Ann sold Parrtown lot 914 to John McLean, Waterborough. [St. John Registry U-1 page 10] [Land Petitions] 25 August 1785 drew lot 4, Gaspereaux branch from Salmon Creek on Grand Lake which was burnt and unfit for cultivation. Wishes lot 16, 1st Range, Grand lake. Children: Mary Ann, Catherine, Elizabeth Wiggins bapt. 28 July 1811. at Waterborough. [NBM: Mary Gray Otty Papers]

ALGEE,ALGAR

Lot 919

James ALGEE arrived with unit 37. In June 1784 he was single. [Ibid. Bell] On 11th November 1819, lot 919 was sold by Alexander ALGEE and Ann, his wife, "Heirs at Law of late James ALGEE, formerly City of Saint John to John McLean. [St. John Registry U-1, p.111]

ALGEE,ALGAR

Lot 901

John ALGEE arrived with unit 37. In May 1784 he was accompanied by a wife and child over age 10. In June 1784 he is recorded as having a wife only. [Ibid. Bell] In 1785 he is unclued with Register of Voters for Saint John, as a weaver and freeman.[NBM] In September 1784, John ALGEE and his wife Christian, both of Parrrtown sold lot 901 "with small tenement" to Charles McPherson of Parrrtown in presence of Luke D. Thornton and S. Stevens.

ALLAN ADAM

Lot 16

E.C. Wright, D.R. Jack and other Loyalist biographers indicate that Adam ALLAN who received Parrrtown Lot 16 was Lt. Adam Allan, Lt. of the Queens Rangers.

[Land Petition 16 July 1787] Fredericton, Lt. ALLAN in 1777 received warrant to recruit 15 men for Lieutenancy in Maryland Loyalist. In two months raised 17 and was informed that he would be mustered as Ensign whereupon he gave his resignation from that regiment. Lt. Adam ALLAN arrived with his corps in October 1783 and by regimental draft drew lot 77 above

Fredericton. On 13th August 1785 he sought grant of a vacant tract of land adjoining a grant to Maryland Loyalists upon the Nashwaak. [Land Petitions]

5th Oct. 1793 letter from John Saunders to Lt. Col: Beverly Robinson asking him to use his influence in favour of Adam Allan to succeed Mr. Hanley as Paymaster of New Brunswick Regt. [NBM: Lt Col. Bev. Robinson Papers, Manuscript] REceived 13 March 1798 escheated grant in York Co., formerly granted to Isaac Hedden. [NBM: Ganong MSS]

Stationed at Grand Falls with N.B. Regt. 1802 where two children baptized. [Rev. Frederick Dibblee diary] "Died Tuesday 14th Oct. 1823 at Clarnee, Prince William, York Co., Adam ALLAN Esq., age 66, British Half Pay. [Vital Stats Vol 2 City Gazette] At Dumfries, York Co., 27th November, Mary Woodbridge ALLAN widow of Lt. Adam Allan, age 86. Deceased came to Province 1783 with her father, late Jos. CLARKE of Mougerville. [N.B. Courier 6 Dec. 1851.] 3rd Jan. 1824. Letter of Administration to estate of Adam Allan, Esq. from Mr. Street, Surrogate to William F. Odell refers to Mary Woodbridge Allan, widow and Jacob Allan, his eldest son." [York Co. Probate]

ALLEN

Lot 377

I can find no evidence to support the contention that Benjamin ALLAN who received Parrrtown Lot 377 was the same one who petitioned for lands at Mispick as indicated in "Loyalists in N.B." by E.C. Wright. Furthermore, the Benjamin residing at Baie Verte was a pre-loyalist [Land Petitions] I can find no further record of this individual at this time.

ALLEN

Lot 56,57

The following dates are provided by D.R. Jack in his "Loyalist Families". He sites his source as a memo on back of an old bible then (Oct. 1900) in possession of Alice Jack. I have no reason to suspect its authenticity: Isaac ALLEN son of John ALLEN and Naomi WATSON born 1st Sept. 1741 was married 20 December 1769 to Sarah daughter of Thomas & Elizabeth CAMPBELL of Philadelphia.

Of Trenton, New Jersey, joined the Army in December 1776 as commander of 2nd Battalion under Brigadier Skinner and was present at taking and defence of Savannah. In 1783 went with his family to form settlement at Annapolis Co., Nova Scotia. Lost large stone house at Trenton and brick house and woodland in Philadelphia. [AO 13/17/1-10]

8th Oct. 1784 Indenture Lt. Col. Isaac Allen, of Annapolis, N.S. to Thomas Horsefield, Sunbury Co., N.B. Parrtown lots 56,57 in presence of Robert Allen, William Allen.

[Vital Stats vol 1](St. John Gazette) "Died Sunday 12th October 1806, Isaac ALLEN, Judge of Supreme Court, of His Majesty's Council, age 65." His wife Sarah died 19 March 1808, age 55. [Old Burying Graveyard, Fredericton] Children: birth dates [Ibid. D.R. A major error which has found its way into print can be traced to Lorenzo Sabine. In his biography of Lt. Col William Allen, he simply states that he finds the name at Saint John in 1783. E.C. Wright includes his name in her appendices and Sharon Debeau follows suit in her publication. There is no evidence that Lt. Col. William Allen came to N.B., at least as far as my investigation was concerned. From an old family Bible in possession of Alice Jack [See D.R. Jack Ibid.] we find that he was an uncle of Col. Isaac ALLEN.

Our only N.B. reference to William Allen who received Parrtown Lot 13 is an Indenture dated 15th October 1784 indicating transfer of that property from William Allen of Mauderville, Sunbury Co., merchant to Thomas Horsefield of Parrtown in presence of Thomas Bean and William Vermillye. [St. John Registry A-1, p.145]

It is equally plausible that William Allen was Lt. Col. Isaac Allan's brother born 28th Sept. 1755 son of John Allen & Naomi Watson. This name definitely requires further investigation.



ZEBEDEE LINNEKIN, LOYALIST

Little more than one hundred years have passed since Zebedee Linnekin, a resident of Tenants Harbor, Maine, was caught in the politics of the American Revolutionary War. His loyalty to the British Crown resulted in the loss of his property; the evacuation of his family to the British fort at Penobscot and the subsequent evacuation, with other Loyalist families to Charlotte County, New Brunswick. What was initially intended as a straight genealogical pursuit of this family has become a fascinating and poignant look at one family caught in this political revolution.

In a petition for relief, dated February 15, 1823, Zebedee Linnekin, the only documented Loyalist of the Linnekin families, stated that he was 75 years of age (Provincial Archives, Fredericton NB, File S31-P40). From that statement, the year of his birth is placed as around 1748. On March 8, 1770, the Rev. John Murray, a Presbyterian minister, performed a marriage at Mt. Pisqah, Boothbay Maine between Zebedee Linnekin and Susanna Linekin, the daughter of Benjamin and Mary (?) Linekin (Rev John Murray's Book of Records, 1766-1789).

Zebedee is presumed to have been an unrecorded son of Daniel and Martha (?) Linnekin of Jeremy Squam (now Westport) Maine. Since Daniel and Benjamin Linnekin were undoubtedly brothers ("Downeast Ancestry"-June 1984), Zebedee and his wife were probably first cousins.

The late Albert J. Smalley, historian of the St. George area in Maine made an interesting observation about Zebedee when he wrote: "...no road where Route 131 now is from Tenants Harbor to Smalley Town. There was no sign of a village at Tenants Harbor and no road up as far as the turn by the church and Zeb Linnekin and Tom Henderson were not in favor of people traipsing around on their property which took in most of the land east of the marsh". (Smalley, Albert; Mayflower Descendants of St. George Maine through Joshua and Keturah Hopkins Smalley). It would appear that Zebedee represented that faction of people who preferred a structured society of law and order to prevent potential "squatting" on their property or potential destruction of it. For many of those people, the British Crown represented that structured society as opposed to the very loose form of government that existed in the Province of Maine at that period of time.

Whatever his motivations, Zebedee Linnekin, in a Memorial dated March 24, 1786, (Reed, Elizabeth Freeman, MS in possession of Bangor Maine Public Librayr "Empire Loyalists in Maine") seeking compensation from the British Crown for financial loss, stated that prior to the war he was comfortably settled at St.

Georges in the Province of Maine on a farm which contained about 25 acres of improved land. At the outbreak of the war, he openly avowed his loyalty which caused him to be labelled as an enemy to the States. He paid a fine of \$30.00 rather than go to the Army for which he was drafted and, to avoid the Oath of Fidelity to the States, joined the British at Penobscot in 1781; which he would have done earlier if it would not have involved his family in ruin. Upon leaving his farm, it was seized by General Wadsworth who commanded the wife and family of Zebedee Linnekin to leave it. Zebedee then bought a house at Penobscot for 65 pounds and made improvements valued at another 10 pounds. At the time of evacuation, October 1783, he sold it for 10 pounds rather than to lose it entirely.

Much has been written about the notorious Tory, "Linniken", reputed to be the leader of a gang of privateers who mauaraded along the coast of Thomaston Maine ("Thomaston Maine Recorder" February 19, 1846). Zebedee Linnekin, by his own depositions (Reed, Elizabeth Freeman, MS "Empire Loyalists in Maine") stated that after joining the British at Penobscot, he went out first in a Tender waiting for the "Nautilus". He afterward engaged in privateering and was also a Pilot for several men of war; - the "Jupeter", the "Albany" and others. Thus, one must assume that he was, in fact, the Linnekin "well nigh as much feared as Long" who was to be brought to justice. ("Thomaston Maine Recorder" - February 19, 1846).

In an effort to better understand Zebedee Linnekin, the services of a professional graphoanalyst were utilized. Her conclusions, limited by only two signature specimens, were that Zebedee exhibited a very strong trait in the desire to accept responsibility and was basically a proud, conservative man who conducted himself with great pride and dignity. Self reliance and self confidence were also exhibited as well as a definite desire to be noticed. Whether or not one accepts handwriting analysis as a valid portrayal of personality traits, the conservative picture drawn by the graphoanalyst would be consistent with the Loyalist position of Zebedee Linnekin.

From another petition of Zebedee Linnekin, dated in 1800, land was requested for himself and his sons, Benjamin and William who are described as "grown men" (Provincial Archives, Fredericton NB, File S31-P40). He evidently expanded the definition of "grown men" as William, born in 1791, would at age 9 hardly qualify for that description. In 1801, in another petition (Ibid. File F1042) he referred to three sons he was anxious to settle near him "lest they should be inclined to quit this country, and settle in the United States, where they have some relations residing". Those three sons are not mentioned by name in that Memorial.

Zebedee Linnekin had two marriages, the first to Susanna Linekin as mentioned previously. Evidence of a second marriage was discovered in the Revolutionary War Widow's Pension Application submitted by Hannah Linnekin (Ibid. Loyalist Pension

Lists). In that petition she stated that she was married to Zebedee Linnekin in 1803-4 at St. David, County of Charlotte, New Brunswick. The record of that marriage has not been found. Notes left by a granddaughter of that union indicate that Hannah was Hannah/Ann Homans of Marblehead Massachusetts prior to her marriage to Zebedee (notes in the possession of Bernard Gardner, Gorham Maine).

Although birth records have not been found for children born in either marriage, the Census of 1784 of Loyalists in New Brunswick provided the names of five children. A petition submitted to the British Crown in 1800, described above, and another in 1821 gave the name of another son. The third son mentioned in the petition of 1801 remains unidentified.

The 1851 Census data from Charlotte County, Parish of St. David revealed that the widow Hannah Linniken was in residence with her son-in-law, Joseph Hill and his wife Ann, thus providing the name of one daughter of that marriage. A marriage record of Priscilla Linnekin to Jacob Reed (Ludwig Genealogy, p. 176) and subsequent correspondence from Hannah Linnekin requesting that Jacob Reed pick up her pension check, leads to the conclusion that Priscilla was yet another daughter. Finally, the death records of two daughters of Abner and Lucretia Linnekin, one of whom was born in New Brunswick around 1830, (Vital Records-Roxbury MA) suggests that Abner was probably a son of Zebedee and Hannah Linnekin.

That Zebedee Linnekin was a man of purpose is implied from the petition he made for one thousand acres of land (Provincial Archives, Fredericton NB., File F1041). With that petition is a well executed plot plan showing the proposed distribution of land with, presumably, fellow Loyalists. The suggestion is that he was chosen to petition for and carry out this plan for his friends.

As a strong minded authoritarian, Zebedee Linnekin, commissioned a Lieutenant in the Saint David Company of Militia in 1795 and later serving as a Captain of that Militia, found himself embroiled in a law suit with one of the members of his

militia (Ibid. File S31-P40). The judgment was against him and, in 1823, the foregoing cited Memorial speaks to his reduced financial status resulting from that judgment and a fire which destroyed his house, barn and everything he possessed.

Although no death record of Zebedee or his wives has been found, the Revolutionary War Widow's Petition of Hannah Linnekin states that he died in 1831-2. Susanna was obviously dead by 1803 when he remarried. It appears that Benjamin, the son of Zebedee and Susanna, died before 1818 at which time Zebedee was named Executor of his estate (Ibid. File RS 63). William, another son by Zebedee's first marriage, by his deposition, was married and had four children by 1821 (Ibid. File RS108). Although we have no record of the marriage nor the name of his wife, one child, Esther Vizzie, was baptized in St. David on July 16, 1809 (McColl Methodist Church Baptisms 1794-1848). Hannah Linnekin, the second wife of Zebedee, appears to have died between 1859 and 1861 as she does not appear on the lists of those receiving pensions after 1859 nor is she listed in the 1861 Census.

Mention must be made of the people who were so instrumental in providing the data used in this research. William MacKinnon of the Provincial Archives in Fredericton NB was unfailingly generous in his help. Cather Somerville of St. John, NB demonstrated her wonderful abilities as a professional researcher as she persisted searching the pension records until she finally found that Hannah "Linton" was later shown as Hannah Linton or Linnekin; a small example of the overall material she unearthed. Other Linnekin "cousins" who added information include David Nichols of Lincolnville Maine; Marjorie Bowers of Olympia Washington; Roberta Williamson of St. Andrews NB; Bernard Gardner of Gorham Maine and Dorothy Chase of Damariscotta Maine. Last and by no means least, my mother, Genevieve (WEEKS) Ireland of Shrewsbury Massachusetts who started this whole search in an effort to establish the lineage of her maternal grandmother, Sarah (LINEKIN) Rogers.

Those of us who have researched this family are still left with the question of what happened to the descendants of Zebedee Linnekin. Anyone with an interest in this family is urged to contact the author of this article.

Also known as Michael Hawkins Jr., we find our ancestor in the census records listed as follows:

However, in checking pictures of the gravestone recently, I discovered it had been copied wrong and should be 1871. Also agrees with several lists of inscriptions from Keswick Cemetery that I have seen).

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As will be noted, these census records, as most, show many inaccuracies. In 1851 the name Ann is used interchangeably with Nancy and the ages seem to have been given five years off. In 1871, Michael is still the head of the house at age 84 and living with them is their daughter-in-law, Sarah Ann, widow of Stephen Hawkins, and three grandchildren. It would seem that Stephen had died recently as Sarah Ann bore a child Minnie, born posthumously.

In turning to the census of 1861 we find some description of the Michael Hawkins Jr. farm. In that year he has two farm hands-one male and one female, 40 acres of improved land and 150 unimproved acres, a cash value of \$800 in implements and \$100 in machinery on the farm. The farm has produced 200 pounds of butter, 15 pounds of wool, 15 tons of hay on 8 acres of land, 40 bushels of oats on 6 acres of land, 25 bushels of buckwheat on 1 acre of land, 1 bushel of peas, 10 bushels of turnip on $\frac{1}{2}$ acre of land, 150 bushels of potatoes on 1 acre of land, 10 bushels of carrots on $\frac{1}{2}$ acre, and he has approximately 50 yards homespun valued at \$25.00.

Generation Two: JOHN MICHAEL HAWKINS (1786-1877)

The records of York County Registry of Deeds do not record, however, the earliest record of John Michael Hawkins's attempt to obtain land. As with his father 27 years before, John Michael Hawkins, calling himself Michael Hawkins Junr., applied for a grant of land with Joseph and John Merrithew, and William Stone in the Nashwaak-sis Grant. This document, which appears on the facing page and which is reproduced below, is the first official record of his age, thus setting his possible birth date in 1786. The Memorial reads:

This 180-page book, with 24+ pages of index lists all baptism, marriages and burials from St. Paul's Church from the beginning of the city of Halifax, in 1749.

Because these records date back so far, the publication is bound to be of considerable help to those, wherever they live, whose antecedents spent time in Halifax, or even Nova Scotia (and until 1784, that also includes New Brunswick). A useful addition to the growing list of genealogically-oriented publications.

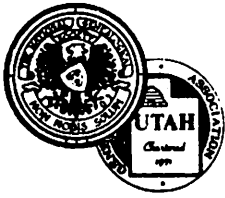

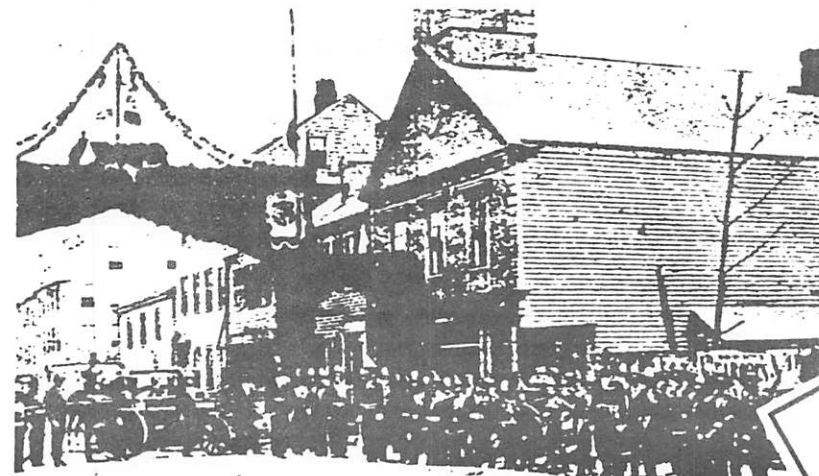
