

The following marriage records predate the existing Kent County Marriage Records, which begin in 1845. These records are drawn from newspaper accounts, particularly from the North-umberland Gleaner. They have been arranged alphabetically by the surname of the groom, and (where possible) include the date of marriage, name of officiating clergyman or J.P., place of marriage, place of residence of bride and groom, and parentage of the bride and/or groom. Where the exact date of marriage is not given in the report, the date of publication will be given in its place, denoted by square brackets.



#### CRAIG FAMILY REUNION - 200 YEARS

On behalf of the Craig Family Reunion Committee, I welcome this opportunity to thank the people of Charlotte County and other New Brunswickers, for their interest, support, friendliness and help during our first Craigs of the Magaguadavic Family Reunion, which was held on August 3, 4, and 5, 1985.

The Reunion commenced at the John Craig homestead, Bonny River, home of Donald Craig). Registration, introductions, refreshment and tours of the home were enjoyed on the opening afternoon. The Saturday program continued in the early evening with a Family dinner at the excellent hall facility of the Pennfield Lions Club. The 200 attendees, from 20 States and 4 Provinces, were greeted with a lively and meaningful Proclamation by Town Crier, Bev Lawrence of St. Andrews; and following which the procession of family and guests was led into the hall by Highland Piper, Cecil Reid, of Hampton. Presentations were by Allison Craig, Chester Craig, and Bev Lawrence of New Brunswick; Margaret Vogt, Pullman, Washington, and Barbara Cook, Jefferson, Louisiana. Telegram of regret and best wishes was read from Percy Craig of Motueka, New Zealand. Mr. Robert Craig, Eatontown, New Jersey, extended thanks on behalf of all present to Cal Craig for his efforts in organizing the reunion.

A "Macadavie" Dance was enjoyed in the late evening with music supplied by The Pearls, a very talented group of local people. Sale of Family Charts, Craig books, commemorative plates and T-Shirts added to the day's proceedings.

On Sunday attendees enjoyed optional self tours and a "Passamaquody Chowder-Do" at the Lions Hall with brief remarks by Vice-Chairman, Alan Craig, Mayor Nate Rubin of St. George and others. Special recognition was given to Brad Hinton of Louisiana, 17th Birthday; Mr. & Mrs. Alan (Mildred) MacDonald, 20th Anniversary; and Mr. & Mrs. Chester Craig; 50th Anniversary. Presentations were by Rev. Grady Hinton, Leslie Jean Craig and Alice Hicks.

On Sunday evening a Family Church Service was held at St. George Baptist Church under the leadership of Don Craig, Rev. Grady Hinton and a Craig choir and quartet. A thirty-four car motorcade through the town and along the Magaguadavic River followed the service and cars were signed - "Craigs of New Jersey"; "Craig-Davis of Iowa" etc. At the Second Falls Baptist Church Cemetery family members witnessed and viewed the unveiling and dedication of a Pvt. John Craig (United Empire Loyalist) memorial. Don Craig and Rev. Grady Hinton officiated with the Dedication and Prayer. That the Settlement Consists of fifty families who are labouring under Serious inconveniences in consequence of wanting a grist mill. After the laspe of so many years.

It is by experience proved that the soil of New Ireland is capable of producing an excellent quality of English Wheat, Oats, Buckwheat, Barley etc, etc, equal to any part of the province.

When in seasons subject to early frost in some parts of the settlement Potatoes would prove an uncertain crop, Grain would be permanent yet in consequence of wanting a mill and having to convey it about twenty miles to the nearest mill.

To the majority of the inhabitants the grain is of no material benefit.

Petitioners humbly solicit your Honourable House to grant an augmentation to the ordinary allowance to enable them in their humble circumstances to erect a mill suitable to their purpose on Bernard Duffy's stream Lot No. 40 - South side of the (River?) (Road?).

LOCATION: 1660 Manawagonish Road, Saint John.

HOURS: Saturdays: 10am-4pm.

NOTE: Before visiting the BGL you should complete most of your research work at the Provincial Archives, the New Brunswick Museum etc. It is suggested that you should 1) select a research goal; 2) determine the type of records that will help you meet your goal; 3) locate and use or order those records; and 4) organize, evaluate and share what you learn.

GENEALOGICAL LIBRARY CATALOG (GLC): This new computer produced aid describes on microfiche the records found in the main library in Salt Lake City. It is used by Branch Genealogical Libraries to order film and fiche from the main library. It is arranged by locality, author or title, surname and subject. Once you obtain a microfilm number you can order the reel on interlibrary loan from the main library in Utah after you pay the postage.

MICROFILM CARD CATALOGUE (MCC): This is an older version of the GLC and consists of microfilmed cards describing the holdings of the main library in Salt Lake City. It will be completely replaced by the GLC in the near future.

INTERNATIONAL GENEALOGICAL INDEX (IGI): The 1984 edition contains vital statistics for 88 million deceased persons from over 90 countries. The data has been extracted from birth, baptism, marriage and death records dating back to the 1500's. The IGI is arranged by locality and then alphabetically.

ACCELERATED INDEXING SYSTEMS (AIS) DATA BASE: This is an index of many of the American census returns, particularly the censuses from 1790 to 1850.

LIBRARY PUBLICATIONS: The BGL makes available to researchers visiting their office in Saint John many films, books, and manuscripts that are on permanent loan.

FAMILY REGISTRY: This is designed to help individuals coordinate their genealogical research efforts and thereby avoid unnecessary duplication of time and expense. You register your name, address and the family names you are researching. You must be willing to share information should someone write to you.

#### More on "The Taits"

Your Article, "The Amazing Taits" taken from "What's In A Name" by Mary Young, caught my eye as I had just run across Cant., William George Tait of Chatham N.B.

William George Tait was born in Chatham N.B., 7. April, 1854 the son of William James and Eliza Smith Tait. He was a ships carpenter and later became the Harbour Master of the Port of Miramichi and died in Chatham, 18, Sept., 1934. I am interested in his Mother Eliza Smith.

Could William George Tait be a nephew of Robert Yule Tait? I came across the following in the St. James/St. John's Church records:






#### JUST RELEASED

The first list, of 2,696 names, is all of the only known interment book and covers the period from July 2, 1939 to November 1847. The second list of 658 names is from the Momumental Inscriptions in J. W. Lawrences's 1883 book "Loyalist Centennial Souvenir."

The cemetery operated from shortly after the arrival of the Loyalists, until 1848, hence this book does not claim to be a total listing of all burials. Indeed

the author extimates 12,000 burials could have taken place there. Nevertheless, a valuable book for Saint John research.

#### New Brunswick Legal Heritage

Among the projects of the Bicentennial Committee, sponsored by the New Brunswick Lew Foundation, in commemoration of the 200th anniversary of the New Brunswick Supreme Court is the reprinting of two historical works on the New Brunswick legal heritage. One will be in English and one in French. The first of these is now available: a reprint of J.W. Lawrence's celebrated <u>Judges</u> of New Brunswick and Their Times (1907).

Lawrence's Judges of New Brunswick is old-fashioned history at its best. It is nothing less than a general political history of New Brunswick from the 1780's to the 1870's, told through the vehicle of biographies of the first 20 men appointed to the Supreme Court. Of essential practical as well as literary value, its discussion of the fundamental jurisdiction of our Supreme Court is the only one in print.

The 550-page book is also rich with fascinating social detail. How many of us know that in the 1880's the New Brunswick judges declared that they would on no account be addressed as "Your Lordship" but rather as "Your Honour" (Judges, p524)? In what other book would we read that:

Judge [John Wesley] Weldon...was the first man to introduce a moustache on the judicial bench...He cultivated the moustache, not as an ornament, but in the belief that shaving the upper lip is injurious to the eyes. (Judges, p504)

Maine Genealogical Society's Special Publication No. 1, Walter Goodwin Davis: A Scholar's Unique Contribution to New England Genealogy, comes from the Anthoensen Press at this season to mark the centennial of the birth of a Maine man who came to be recognized as one of America's foremost genealogists. We began with the intention of working at Indexing newspapers, and we have been doing precisely that, admittedly we have been taking a very cautious approach to what we have been attempting, trying to get some feedback from individuals and groups, as to what they would like to see published, in terms of types of material. We will continue to index newspapers of Ontario, we will be working on one or two from Quebec in the coming months. We will also be indexing material other than newspapers, ie: Vital Statistics from various Townships particularly around the Niagara region to begin with, but branching out as needs require.

Therefore, we wanted to put out this small publications list, though it is unquestionably, we think that it is a good beginning; we are still new and we will make a few mistakes from time to time. Hopefully not in transcription, but more probably in how we may present it. It is our goal to provide good quality material, at as low a cost as is possible. One of the reasons that we got involved with this in the first place, was because we believed that in general, the cost of genealogical reference material was excessive. We, along with other individuals and genealogical societies and historical societies, simply wish to provide an alternative.

The newspapers are complete indexes, not abstracts. All newspaper indexes are and will continue to be executed in the same manner, also indexed at the back of each publication, in the manner normal book index.

"Births, Marriages & Deaths in East & West Flamborough: 1869 - 1913" \$8.00

This particular publication is somewhat unique, in that it cannot be found elsewhere, it is not on microfilm anywhere, approximately 1000 names, between 1869 and 1913. It provides a good overview of the families in those particular townships at the time. East and West Flamboro Townships of Wentworth County, were, essentially, the most populous townships of Wentworth, many of the families were either descendants of U. E. L. families, or from Quaker background. Of course there were those who were also of English, Scots or Irish emigrant families as well.

As I have said, this is a beginning. Much of the work that we will produce in the first 18 to 24 months of operation will focus on the Niagara Region. As well documented as this particular region is, there is an awesome amount of material that has never been touched. The reason of our focus is, primarily genealogical. There is a great deal of material around that we genealogy types just don't get enough access to, so maybe we can help to alleviate that a bit. There is also material that historians and history buffs may find of value as well.

#### Researchers Needed 1.

Editorial-Every week, the New Brunswick Genealogical Society receives letters from members outside the Province, asking for assistance in obtaining names of family history researchers.

> For the most part, these letters come from members who find it difficult, or even impassible, to get to New Brunswick to do their own research on ancestors whose records lie in various repositories in our Province.

A response is always made to these inquiries but it often falls short of their requests simply because we have, at the moment, no one in Fredericton available to carry out this besearch work.

The Saint John Branch of N.B.G.S. does have a limited program whereby, for a fee of \$10, an initial, one-hour search will be carried out by experienced Branch members, confined to resources in the Saint John area. Should further research be agreed upon, the Branch can supply a list of available local researchers.

We are not aware of how other branches handle such requests.

There is a severe scarcity One fact remains: of available researchers in the Fredericton area where a good part of the genealogical resource material is situated. There would appear to be both a long-term and a short-term solution to this problem. For the short term, the branches might consider setting up a "queries committée" and formulate a policy whereby members experienced in family history research would carry out such work. Any fees thus obtained might be split between the branch and members involved

In the longer term, the Society might consider sponsoring a seminar or series of seminars at which potential researchers from various sections of the province might be "trained". This would establish a cadre of local qualified persons available to provide a better service to those seeking to delve further into their New Brunswick roots.

Still another possibility is an # inquiries desk" at the Provincial Archives, staffed part-time, by volunteers from N.B.G.S. We believe Archives management would look favorably upon such an arrangement as it would take some of the burden of answering this kind of inquiry off an already over-burdened Archives staff, and at the same time provide a service by the Society to assist its out-of-province membership.
