



DOED HAD VETERANCE

BOER WAR VETERANS

Overshadowed historically by the First and Second World Wars the participation of New Brunswick natives in the Boer War in South Africa has largely been ignored. We are collecting data concerning 500 men who enlisted in New biographical Brunswick or natives of New Brunswick who enlisted elsewhere. Military lists have provided us with addresses, next of kin, etc. and newspaper obituaries have yielded considerable biographical and genealogical data. In addition to the biographies we are including as many photos of the veterans as possible, preferably the time of enlistment. A narrative concerning Brunswicker's experiences in South Africa ie. prisoners of war. enteric fever will include such details as name of their transport ship or institution in which they were hospitalized in South Africa and England. It is interesting to note that about 50% of those who served were from Saint John. Another 25% came from the Chatham-Newcastle area. New Brunswick natives recount their experiences in letters home at such famous events of the Siege of Ladysmith and Battle of Paardeberg. 

OLYSTE(A)DS PLAN GATHERING IN HARTFORD, CT - JULY 10 - 13,1986

Looking forward to 1986, members of the Olmste(a)d Family Association reunion organizing committee, chaired by Richard and Pauline Olmsted of Wilton, CT are formulating plans for an international Reunion to celebrate the 350th anniversary of a significant milestone in the history of the family, the settling of Hartford, CT in 1636.

The Association, organized at the first reunion in Hartford on Jan. 2,1911, was discontinued in the 1950's but reformed in the early 1970's. There are presently over 420 families in the OFA including Omstead and Umstead, spanning the United States and Canada.

First published in 1912, now with six supplements in the 1979 edition, the 'Genealogy of the Olmsted Family in America' relates that the Puritan James(then 42), his two sons Nicholas and Nehemiah, two nephews Richard and John and their sister Rebecca, together with 117 others (including 50 children)," arrived on the ship LYON (Capt. Pierce) in Boston, Mass. on the Lord's Day, Sept. 16,1632 after a voyage of 12 weeks from Braintree, England".

Settling first Mount Wollaston (now Quincy, Mass.), then Cambridge, Mass. (where a recent archaeological dig has uncovered the foundation of James' home under Harvard's Wadsworth Gate), the pilgrims, "strained for room, decided to examine the lands along the Connecticut River, then called the Fresh River".

According to the 'Genealogy', "On the 31st of May, 1636 the Reverand Thomas Hooker and his entire flock of about 100 souls took their departure from Newtown (Cambridge). They were a fortnight on their way through the wilderness and "James Olmsted was one of the original proprietors of Hartford" being one of the first settlers of the town.

In 1651, Richard with the assent of the General Assembly of the Colony and on behalf of other inhabitants of Hartford, would "plant" with Nathaniel Ely the towne of "Norwalke" after purchase of the land from Roger Ludlow and the Indians for 15 pounds sterling and additional considerations, viz: "seventeen Indian coates, thirtie fowre fathom of wampum, tenn kettles, tenn knifes, tenn hookes, twenty pipes, tenn muckes(muskets?) and tenn needles.

In 1726, Richard's great grandson Nathan would join 30 other original Norwalkers in petitioning the "General Assembly of His Majesties Colony of Connecticut convened in Hartford" ...to "give us the Name of Wilton Parish in Norwalk" -- Wilton then being known as the backwoods of Norwalk. Olmsteds were also among the early settlers of Redding and of Lewisboro, N.Y. as well as Danbury and Bethel.

Another major 'line', descended from James' uncle William (b. ca 1548) to Jabez of Ware, Mass. (b. ca 1690), numbers many hundreds in North America. Full documentation of the history of their arrival in America is a major research project of the OFA.

Family plans to gather at the University of Hartford from July 10-13,1986 include participation with the City of Hartford which has invited the family to join it's "JUBILEE 350", a year long celebration of it's founding, commencing September 1985.

Other plans of the Assoc. include a group tour to visit the moated, ancestral Olmsted Hall (used as an ancient court) in Cambridgeshire, England (then Essex). According to Morant's History of Essex, it was held by Maurice de Olmstede in the 28th year of the reign of Henry III (1242) and by Martin de Olmstede before him. Active research is attempting to determine if it might date as far back or further than 1086, the earliest mention of the name Almsteda (Elmsted or Olmsted) in the "Domesday Book" for the county of Essex, in the first property survey made under William the Conqueror. The Hall is presently owned and occupied by the Kiddy family who have farmed it's 260 acres for several generations.

All descendants of Olmste(a)ds and allied families are invited to attend the Reunion.

LOYALIST ISAAC BOSTUICK (continued) compiled by Sharon Dubeau

JARED BOSTWICK was born 3 November 1794, Kingston Parish, Kings He married Mary Merritt Adams of Westfield Parish, Kings Co. on 4 February 1828. The marriage was witnessed by Michael Lowrey and Samuel Huiet at Greenwich. Jared's name is spelled Jerod in this marriage record. (In the documents pertaining to the administration of his father's estate, it appears as Gerard.) His wife Mary was born about 1807 and baptised at Kingston, NB, on 9 August, 1829. On that same day, Elizabeth and Abigail, adult daughters of Samuel & Margaret Adams were also baptised. Thus, I have assumed that Samuel & Margaret Adams were probably the parents of Mary. As well, Jared and Mary's first child was named Isaac Samuel - which was probably a composite of the names of their fathers. A widow Margaret Adams (born around 1788) lived in Greenwich Parish, Kings Co. in 1851. Mary Bostwick died 6 December 1851 and is buried in Trinity Anglican Cemetery. records of Trinity Anglican Churchyard, Kingston put Jared's death date as 4 December 1857. However, his will was dated 6 September 1858, so he likely died in 1858. Since both Jared Bostwick and his wife Mary died before 1858, three young children were left without parents. Their eldest child was 29, the youngest only 10. Jared made provisions in his will for these three children: Thomas was to stay with his Uncle & Aunt Prince (Jared's sister Ann Prince) until he came of age; James was to live with his Uncle & Aunt Mason (likely sister to Mary) until he was 14 years old, and then he was to be put to such a trade as he chose; and Martha was to remain with her Grandmother(must be Adams). Mary & Jared Bostwick had nine children, and lived in Kingston Parish, where Jared was a Farmer. 44

- i) <u>Isaac Samuel Bostwick</u> born 8 December 1829, Kingston Parish, and baptised there 21 March 1830. He did not live with his parents in the 1851 Kingston Census, but was mentioned in his father's will of 1858. He died before 1915.
- ii) <u>Isabella Bostwick</u> was baptised 29 May 1832 (b. 27 May 1832) at Kingston. She probably died at Greenwich Parish, 20 September, 1832.
- (born 25 June 1833) at Kingston. According to R. P. Gorham (Kingston Loyalists manuscript): "He went to Saint John and entered a mercantile establishment as clerk. In 1865, he opened a business house of his own on Water Street where he conducted for years a wholesale grocery business. He also became an extensive lumber dealer and real estate owner." As well he was the owner of the Dufferin Hotel in Saint John. Charles married Mary O'Donnell, 6 August 1867 at Amherst, Nova Scotia. Mary was born at Amherst, 26 December 1836. In the 1871 Directory for New Brunswick, Charles is listed as a provision merchant, Saint John. Charles died 24 May 1919; Mary died 9 July 1904. Both are buried in Fernhill Cemetery, Saint John. They had three children:
 - a) Charles Merritt Bostwick born 23 March 1870 in Saint John, educated in Germany and subsequently engaged in business with his father. Charles married Helen M.

 ______, and died around February, 1917.

 Charles and Helen had two children: 1. Charles Munson Bostwick, born after 1898; 2. Donald Embree Jarvis Bostwick, born after 1898, who lived in Moncton, NB in 1947.

Prior to 1754 there was no law requiring a civil or religious marriage anywhere in Great Britain. Man and woman could stand before two witnesses and declare themselves husband and wife. This was considered a legal and binding marriage. In most cases, some sort of certificate was given, there being no legal need for a record to be kept.

- b) Elizabeth Bostwick born 7 May 1872 in Saint John and died in Toronto January, 1890. She is buried in Fernhill Cemetery, Saint John.
- C) Guy O'Donnell Bostwick born June 1879, attended Rothesay Collegiate School, and was later in business in Saint John. At the time of his father's death (1919), he was a Broker in New York.
- iv) David Hiram Bostwick was baptised 22 March 1835 at Kingston (born 1 January 1835). On 20 June 1860, he married Eliza Jane Shaw at Saint John, daughter of William Shaw and Margaret Shannon of Wickham Parish, Queens Co. Eliza Jane was born 5 October 1843 and died 30 April 1921. David Bostwick died 23 May 1915 at Saint John. Both David & Eliza are buried in Wickham Cemetery, Queens Co. In the 1871 Directory of New Brunswick, David is listed as a Boatman, Wickham Parish, Queens Co. Like his father-in-law William Shaw, David Bostwick was a mariner a Captain, in coasting and river trades, first aboard the China tea clippers, then later on the Okanagan River in British Columbia. David had owned real estate in Kamloops, BC. David & Eliza Bostwick had eight children, and lived in Wickham Parish. 47
 - A) Leila Mary Bostwick b. 7 December 1865, Wickham Parish, Queens Co., m. 27 November 1888 at Havelock, NB to William McKnight, a teacher and a butcher. William died before 1913. They had five daughters: Eula (unmarried); Edith (died young); Belle married Ernest Blake, Camp Sussex, New Brunswick (Camp Sussex was used for annual training of Militia troops); Margaret married Mr. Kidd and lived in U.S.A.; & Mary.
 - b) Winifred Bostwick born 24 October 1868, Wickham Parish, Queens Co., m. 7 March 1892 at Saint John to Cardwell Lake. They moved to West Somerville(Boston), Massachusetts, where Cardwell worked as an Inspector.

They had four children: 1. Simon; 2. Elizabeth(Bessie) who married John Smith, and lived in Burlington, Vermont; 3. George; 4. Walter.

- c) Willmina Shaw Bostwick born 21 December 1869 at Wickham Parish, Queens Co., married on 1 February 1893 at Saint John to Frank Melbourne Gorham, son of George and Sarah (Campbell). George Gorham was a leading merchant tailor in Saint John. Frank met his future wife Willmina Bostwick when she came to his father's firm the learn the tailoring trade. Frank Gorham was the proprietor of a tailoring ship in Indiantown (west Saint John) for many years and later entered the meat business and worked for a number of years as a butcher. Frank Gorham died 22 March 1952 at Harding's Point. Willmina died 12 April 1959 at Saint John. Both are buried in Fernhill Cemetery, Saint John. Frank and Willmina Gorham had seven children: 1. Sarah (Sadie) Eliza b. 1894 d. 1918 m. in 1917 to Frederick Yule Brown; 2. Elizabeth (Bessie) Mabel b. 1895 m. in 1924 to Arthur Hugh Phillips, and lived in Rothesay, NB; 3. Frank Leopold b. 1897 d. 1932 m. in 1924 to Anne McDonald; 4. Gladys Willmina b. 1900 m. in 1925 to Clayton Joseph Taylor, and lived in Toronto, ON; 5. Winnifred Josephine b. 1903 d. 1979 m. in 1930 to John Percy Tippetts, and lived in Saint John, NB; 6. Arthur Bostwick b. 1905 m. in 1929 to Genevive Allen, and lived at Hardings Pt, NB; 7. Marjorie Gertrude b. 1906 married in 1929 to Arthur Stewart, and lived at Grand Bay, NB. 48
- d) Ottis W. Bostwick b. 5 December 1872, Wickham Parish, Queens Co., m. 18 July 1900 at Saint John to Robie Smith. Ottis died 2 April 1911. Ottis and Robie had four children: 1. Charles who lived in California; 2. Mary who married ______ McIntosh, and died 3 February 1953; 3. Eva who married Frederick Gooding, 4. Grace, who married Vernon Goss.

- e) <u>Utah Bostwick</u> b. 10 October 1873 at Greenwich Parish, Kings Co., m. 14 August 1902 at Saint John to Stanley McMulkin. They had one child Helen; Utah died when this child was born. Helen married William Johnson.
- f) Eva Bostwick twin to Utah, born 10 October, 1873 and married to Henri Stelpflug, 2 July 1898 in New York. Henri was a jeweller who set up a business in San Francisco and was killed there during the earthquake of 1906. It is not known when Eva died or if they had any children.
- g) Manfred Imel Bostwick b. 2 August 1877, Wickham Parish, Queens Co., died 16 August 1878, and buried in Wickham Cemetery.
- h) (David) Otha Bostwick b. 13 September 1882, Wickham Parish, Queens Co., m. to Edith Margaret Mathews at Saint John on 18 June 1907. Edith was born on 26 April, 1892, at Hampton, NB. Otha died 1 March 1963 and is buried in Wickham Cemetery. Edith was alive in 1985. Otha and Edith had seven children: 1. Ottis Edward b. 16 June 1908 and married 16 October 1929 to Mary ______; 2. Helen, b. 3 July 1910 and married ______ Black; 3. Murielb. 26 May 1912, m. Charles E. Ross, (1906-1974); 4. Walter b. 5 December 1913; 5. Greta born 21 October 1915 m. Alfred Vail); 6. Kathleen b. 25 September 1922; 7. George Blake b. 1 August 1931, died young.
- v) John Neville Bostwick was born 26 December 1836. Little is known about John, but he was mentioned in his father's will of 1858. He died before 1915.
- vi) Margaret Jane Bostwick was born 12 October 1839 in Kingston Parish. She married 30 June 1863 to Wilford Drury Fowler, who was born 7 December 1840 in Norton Parish, the son of Gabriel Fowler (1809-1892) and Sarah Ann Bunnell (1812-1884). Wilford is listed in the 1871 New Brunswick Directory

as a farmer, Butternut Ridge, Havelock Parish. Wilford died 10 February 1913 at Seymour, Connecticut. Margaret died 29 September 1912. Both are buried in Butternut Ridge Cemetery, Havelock Parish, Kings Co. They had eight children:

- a) Weldon Mason Fowler born 17 April 1864, married Emily MacDonald on 24 March, 1887.
- b) Sarah Adams Fowler born 1 October 1866, died 1956, married 24 December 1889 to Hartley Wheaton(1864-1950).

 A son was Frank Lorne Wheaton, who was a doctor in Connecticut (1890-1965). All are buried in Butternut Ridge Cemetery.
- c) Mary Adelaide Fowler born 1 September 1869, died in 1949 (buried in Butternut Ridge Cemetery) married Fred Daniels, on 15 June 1892. She lived in Washington, DC.
- d) Adelaide Mary Fowler (twin to Mary Adelaide) was born on 1 September 1869, and died in 1957 (buried in Butternut Ridge Cemetery). She was not married and lived in Tacoma, Washington.
- e) <u>Julia Alice Fowler</u> born 8 October 1871, died in 1960.

 She was married on 1 January 1905 to Arthur B. Hicks

 1872-1941 and lived in Butternut Ridge(Havelock), Kings

 Co. Both are buried in Greenhill Cemetery, Havelock,

 NB. Children: Donald.
 - f) Herbert Arthur Fowler was born 9 May 1875. He was married first to Grace R. Butler on 7 June 1907 and second to Bessie J. Howard in August 1930. He lived in Connecticut.

- viii) James Jared Bostwick was born 11 June 1846, Kingston Parish, Kings Co. In the 1871 New Brunswick Directory, James is listed living in Saint John, working with his brother Charles. He died in 1902 in Saint John. 50
- ix) Martha Adams Bostwick was born 12 June 1848, Kingston Parish. She married Hiram G. Fowler on 5 July 1866. Hiram was born 23 August 1836, the son of Gabriel Fowler (1809-1892) and Sarah Ann Bunnell (1812-1884). In the 1871 New Brunswick Directory, Hiram Fowler was listed as being a farmer, Butternut Ridge, Havelock Parish, Kings Co. Hiram died 6 October 1894 at Havelock. It is not known what became of Martha, or if they had any children. Martha died before 1915. 51

ANN BOSTWICK was born 11 February 1797, Kingston Parish, Kings Co. She married George Prince, a Farmer of Hampton Parish on 18 October 1820 at Kingston. George Prince was born about 1791, the son of John Prince (1742-1825) and Abigail Riddle (1765-1830) of Kingston Parish. John and Abigail Prince were Loyalists from New Jersey. George died 12 October 1866, aged 75, and is buried in Hammond River Cemetery, Kings Co. Ann died March 1882. Ann and George Prince had six children: 52

- i) <u>Miles Edward Prince</u> born 1823, married in 1849 to Eleanor Jane Watson (1827-1917), daughter of John and Margaret (Gerow). Miles and Eleanor settled in U.S.A. Miles died in 1869. One daughter was:
 - a) Mary Augusta 1852-1929 married Joseph Ward (1850-1931) and had son Charles Eugene Ward (1877-1902) who married Minnie Olive Jones (1876-1974). 53

JANE BOSTWICK was born 29 December 1800, Kingston Parish, and baptised there 31 January 1802. She was married to William Whiting on 24 January 1832. William(b. ca. 1794) was probably the son of William (1759-1830) and Hannah (1770-1860) Whiting of Kingston Parish. William Sr. was a Loyalist from Virginia. Jane died 11 September 1877; William died 28 March 1873. Both are buried in Trinity Anglican Church Cemetery, Kingston. In the 1871 Directory for New Brunswick, William is listed as a farmer, Kingston parish. William and Jane Whiting had four children: 55

- i) Charles Hiram Whiting was born about 1833, and was married between 1871-1881 to Ellen MacDougall (b. ca 1846), probably daughter of Daniel of Kingston Parish. In the 1871 New Brunswick Directory, Charles is listed as a farmer, Kingston Parish.

WILLIAM HIRAM BOSTWICK (known as Hiram) was born 6 January 1802, Kingston Parish. He was married to Mary Ann Richards on 15 March 1836, Greenwich Parish. Mary Ann was born 18 March 1809, probably daughter of Thomas. Hiram died 15 January 1854. He was killed in the woods, being struck by a limb. Mary then raised her six children alone - the youngest just over four, the eldest only fifteen. They farmed in the summer and cut cord wood and logs in the winter. Mary Ann died 10 May 1889. Both Hiram and Mary Ann are buried in Trinity Anglican Cemetery, Kingston. Hiram and Mary Ann Bostwick had six children: 57

- i) Thomas R. Bostwick was born 2 November 1839, at Kingston, and was married on 14 December 1874 to Annie Elam. Assume he died before 1926 (see obit for Joseph Bostwick). It is not known if they had any children.
- ii) <u>Susanna Bostwick</u> was born on 19 November 1841, at Kingston, and was married on 28 December 1864 to William Lawton Prince, son of George and Ann Prince. Assume she died before 1926 (see obit for Joseph Bostwick). It is not known if they had any children.
- iii) Joseph Hiram Bostwick was born on 28 January 1844,
 Kingston, and was married on 14 February 1889 to Jean
 Sheldrick (b. ca. 1853), daughter of Ezra and Elizabeth of
 Kingston Parish. In the 1871 Directory of New Brunswick,
 Joseph is listed as a Farmer, Long Reach, Kingston Parish.
 Joseph died in Montreal 23 January 1926; his obituary stated
 he was survived by one son Robert R., of Montreal; one brother
 L. A. Bostwick, Grey's Mills, Kings Co.; and a grandson D.
 Irvine Watters, Saint John. Jean died at Kingston 26 March
 1911. Both Joseph and Jean are buried in Trinity Anglican
 Cemetery, Kingston. They had two children: 58
 - a) Robert R. Bostwick (1890-1950), buried Trinity Anglican Cemetery, Kingston, NB. He lived in Montreal at the time of his father's death in 1926.

- b) Margaret Bostwick (1892-1917), buried Trinity Anglican Cemetery, Kingston, NB. She married Douglas Watters.
 One son was D. Irvine Watters (b. 1917) of Saint John, mentioned in his grandfather's (Joseph Bostwick) obituary.
- iv) Elizabeth Jane Bostwick was born on 6 March 1847, Kingston and was married on 13 February 1872 to William Greenslade (born around 1849), son of Frances and Jane Greenslade (1851 Springfield Census). Assume she died before 1926 (see obit for Joseph Bostwick). It is not known if they had any children.
- v) <u>Lemuel Allen Bostwick</u> was born on 21 May 1848, Kingston Parish, Kings Co. He married Mary Eliza Pickett (who was born 15 September 1852), on 7 June 1876. He died 17 November 1927, Kingston Parish. His wife died there 3 July 1940. Both are buried in Trinity Anglican Cemetery, Kingston. They had eight children:
 - a) William Lewis Bostwick b. 8 April 1877, married to Amy Pickett on 27 December 1905. He died 11 November 1906 "out west" of Typhoid Fever and is buried in Trinity Anglican Cemetery, Kingston. No children.
 - b) Warren Bell Bostwick b. 7 October 1878, died during an epidemic of Scarlet Fever on 25 April 1890 and is buried in Trinity Anglican Cemetery, Kingston.
 - c) <u>Louise Lavinia Bostwick</u> b. 16 August 1880, died 9 March 1962. She was married & divorced.
 - d) Susan Helen Bostwick b. 15 December 1881, died in September, 1974 and is buried in Trinity Anglican Cemetery, Kingston. She was not married.
 - e) <u>Harry Ludlow Bostwick</u> b. 27 December 1883, married to Bertha Esterbrooks 16 September 1924. Harry died 16 September 1968. They had one daughter Norma Elizabeth Bostwick (b. 1926 m. Donald Lord Beville, who died

- about six months after the marriage. Norma lived in Saint John; no children).
- f) Miles Wesley Bostwick b. 13 April 1885, died during an epidemic of Scarlet Fever on 5 May 1890 and is buried in Trinity Anglican Cemetery, Kingston.
- Gladys Vida MacDougall (she b. 21 May 1899, daughter of George) on 21 November 1917. Chesley died 21 October 1975 and is buried in Trinity Anglican Cemetery, Kingston. Vida Bostwick lives (1985) in Kingston, NB. They had four children: Jessie (b. 1921, m. Victor C. Cole); George Allen (b. 1922, m. Grace Hall); Marion (b. 1932 m. Ron Baird); and Kathleen (b. 1935 m. Ken Moore). George Allen Bostwick resides and works on the farm granted to Loyalist Isaac Bostwick.
- h) Myrtle Velma Bostwick was born on 25 July 1893, and was married to Roy D. Wetmore, of Perry Point on 28 August 1912, died 6 November 1943. They had five children: Helen Louise(died aged 18); Guy Douglas; Velma Olive (m. James Beyea); Cortlandt Orley; Donna (m. Herbert Robertson).
- vi) Harriett Ann Bostwick was born on 3 June 1850, Kingston, and was married on 3 June 1874 to George Edward Evans. George was born about 1845, son of Joseph and Susan. Harriett and George Evans had five children, and lived in Kingston Parish where George was a Farmer: ⁶⁰
 - a) Lena Evans b. 1875.
 - b) Alice Evans b. 1877.
 - c) Blanche Evans b. 1878.
 - d) Sandford Evans b. 1879.
 - e) Male infant b. Dec 1880. (possibly Walter)
