



## GENEALOGICAL RESOURCES AT THE PROVINCIAL ARCHIVES OF NEW BRUNSWICK

(1986 Edition)

PURPOSE OF THIS GUIDE: This guide has been prepared by the staff of the Provincial Archives to provide assistance to family historians conducting research in New Brunswick.

LOCATION AND ADDRESS OF THE ARCHIVES: The Archives is located on the University of New Brunswick campus two buildings below the Bank of Montreal. It is open to the public from 8:30am to 5:00pm Monday through Saturday, except for statutory holidays. Parking is available in the rear of the building. The phone number is: (506) 453-2122. 

WHAT IS GENEALOGY? Compiling a family history is a fascinating and entertaining hobby that requires no lengthy training, and involves no great expense. You gather vital statistical and other historical data on your ancestors and then carefully organize this material. You will learn a great deal about your forbears and about the environment in which they lived, and you will come to appreciate your ancestors as living, loving humans whose lives deserve to be remembered. You should set aside a specific amount of time each week to work on your new hobby and draw up a list of goals or a plan of action. After getting underway you periodically evaluate your progress and set new should research goals. Promise yourself from the very beginning that you will conduct your research and record what you learn "carefully" and "accurately".

STARTING A GENEALOGY: To begin a family history you start with yourself and then systematically work back in time recording the statistical data for yourself, your parents, grandparents, and so on. To the birth, baptism, marriage, and death information you add data on early life, education, occupation, religion, military service, and accomplishments worthy of note. You should first consult family records such as Bibles, letters, certificates and clippings and then contact elderly relatives for additional information.

A GENEALOGICAL TEXT: A 300 page book Researching Your Ancestors in New Brunswick, Canada can be purchased from: Robert Fellows, Historical Publications, R.R.#1, Mouth of Keswick, N.B., EOH 1NO for \$14 (including postage). The book contains an historical sketch of the province, data on starting a family history, and descriptions of the records found at the Provincial Archives, the New Brunswick Museum, the University of New Brunswick, Mount Allison University, the University of Moncton, and at other small museums, libraries, and historical societies.

COUNTY GENEALOGICAL GUIDES AT THE PROVINCIAL ARCHIVES: To assist family historians, special guides have been produced for each of the counties of Albert, Carleton, Charlotte, Gloucester, Kent, Kings, Madawaska, Northumberland, Queens, Restigouche, Saint John, Sunbury, Victoria, Westmorland and York. These guides note the date each county and parish was created and list the reel numbers for the church, census, probate, marriage, and school records. Also provided are the addresses for various institutions that may have other helpful genealogical resources. These guides are free.



VISITING OR WRITING THE PROVINCIAL ARCHIVES: The best way to conduct genealogical research is to make a number of visits to the Provincial Archives and consult the various records and resources in person. If you live outside Fredericton you are welcome to borrow microfilmed records, no more than three reels at one time, through your local library. There is at present no charge for this service. Due to the small staff size, detailed research work cannot be carried out for those corresponding to the Archives but the names of people who can be hired to do this type of work will be provided upon request.

FAMILY HISTORIES COLLECTION: At the Provincial Archives researchers will discover hundreds of genealogies, large and small, that have been donated to the institution since its creation. A card catalogue lists both the files and the books. You can select the family history you wish to see and then view it in the Search Room. Patrons can photocopy material themselves at the rate of .10 per page. Each genealogist is encouraged to write up their research efforts and to donate a copy, even if it is only a few pages long, to the Archives. If every family historian did this, a great deal of the repetitive research work would be eliminated.

COUNTY REFERENCE COLLECTION: Over the years many copies of tombstone transcriptions, local histories, compilations of church records, and other useful information have been acquired by the Provincial Archives and filed by county. The larger donations are kept in binders while the smaller items are stored in file folders. Researchers are reminded that a number of published local histories are found in Manuscript Collection 80. A card catalogue lists the books by author, title and geographical location. You should also look through the book New Brunswick History: A Checklist of Secondary Sources and its two supplements because they describe many genealogical publications found in various libraries around the province.

GENEALOGICAL LIBRARY: In addition to the printed family and local histories found at the Archives there are a number of other publications that will be of great assistance to the pedigree hunter. These books describe the genealogical records available in Canada, England, Ireland, Scotland and the United States. Also, there are gazeteers, periodicals, "how to" books and publications on Loyalists, Acadians, old handwriting, surnames, marriages, wills, heraldry, and on other subjects. The books must be used in the Archives and are not sent out on interlibrary loan.

CENSUS RECORDS: Many genealogists like to start their research at the Provincial Archives by looking at the unindexed 1891 New Brunswick census returns on microfilm. These reels often provide the names, ages, relationships, occupations, nationalities, and other helpful information on one's ancestors. The 1881, 1871, 1861, and 1851 records are also available for most counties. Researchers can use these census films in the Archives or borrow them on interlibrary loan from the Public Archives of Canada, 395 Wellington St., Ottawa, Ontario, K1A ON3. Many of the 1851, and a few of the later returns have been printed and can be viewed at, or purchased from the Archives in Fredericton.

CHURCH RECORDS: Within church records there is data on births, baptisms, marriages, deaths and burials. A number of the province's older church records have been microfilmed and are available on interlibrary loan from the Archives. Some of the reels have been "restricted" by individual churches and family historians must obtain prior written permission from the clergy before the reels may be viewed or sent out on loan. The county genealogical guides available from the Archives describe the various church records on film. Researchers are reminded that some church records have been transcribed and these compilations placed in the County Reference Collection (MC 2) at the Archives.

PASSENGER LISTS: Some 10,000 names have been extracted from Passenger and Immigration lists. The documents have been microfilmed and are found on reels F-9798 and F9799. The index to this collection is on reels F-9800 (A-D); F-9801 (D-H); F-9802 (H-Mc); F-9803 (Mc-R); and F-9804 (S-Y). Unfortunately, the vast majority of Passenger Lists were lost when the Customs House in Saint John was destroyed by fire in 1877.

SAINT JOHN BURIAL PERMITS: There are 30 volumes of burial permits for over 20,000 people from various parts of the province who died in Saint John between 1889 and 1919. books are indexed and microfilmed. The indexes for 1889 to 1910 are on reel F-8089 and the later indexes are filmed with the volumes themselves. A list of the years covered by 1889-1892 on F-8090; 1892-1895 on each reel follows: 1895-1899 on F-8092; 1899-1901 on F-8093; 1901 F-8091: -1903 on F-8094; 1903-1905 on F-8095; 1905-1908 on F-8096; 1910-1911 on F-8098; 1912-1913 on 1908-1909 on F-8097; F-8099; 1914-1915 on F-8100; 1916-1917 on F-8101; 1918-1919 Researchers are reminded that accompanying this on F8102. collection at the Archives there is also a "Maiden Name Index" containing over 4,000 entries.

PROBATE RECORDS: In the probate files and registers there are copies of wills, petitions, letters of administration, bonds and inventories for many of our ancestors. The probate registers for each county have been microfilmed and the reels can be borrowed on interlibrary loan. The reel numbers are listed in the county genealogical guides. If a researcher sends us the name of his ancestor and the county in which he lived, the staff will be happy to search the index for that particular county and photocopy the will should one exist. Each will contains about four pages and there is a charge of .50 per page to cover the copying.

In the Records of the Administration of the Estates of Deceased Insolvent Debtors, Record Series 575, are some 360 files of individuals with property who died intestate and left behind debts. It was necessary for creditors to obtain permission before they could sell these estates to recover their losses. These records deal with the years from 1784 to 1843.

RECORDS OF THE EQUITY COURT (RECORD SERIES 55): This collection covers the years from 1784 to 1910 and consists of over 10,000 files. The cases deal with a wide range of litigation pertaining to such matters as land, companies, estates, guardianship of children, bankruptcies, domestic disputes and so on. Researchers will discover that many of the files contain informative biographical data. A quick check of the index for this collection will reveal any mention of one's ancestors.

Other court records at the Archives can also be helpful. In Record Series 58 are the Divorce files from 1847 to 1944; in Record Series 56 are the Matters files from 1909 to 1945. Both are open to the public. Researchers are reminded that access to the Adoption records can only be obtained through the Department of Social Services.

LATE REGISTRATION OF BIRTHS: These 25,000 records of birth cover the years from 1810 to 1887 and are based on proof supplied to the Department of Health by individuals for legal or personal reasons. The vital information has been transcribed onto index cards, alphabetized and microfilmed. MARRIAGE REGISTERS: Many of the counties kept marriage registers from about 1810 until 1888. The volumes for Victoria and Sunbury Counties are missing and not all of the other surviving registers are indexed. All of the marriage registers and the scattered county marriage licences have been microfilmed and are available on interlibrary loan. The county genealogical guides will provide researchers with the appropriate film numbers.

In Record Series 551, the Administration of Performance Bonds Records, are several thousand Marriage Bonds which were required when banns were not read, or the clergyman did not know both of the parties. LAND RECORDS: Genealogists will discover a wealth of biographical data in the old land petitions that are found in Record Series 108 and 272 and cover the years 1784 to about 1850. These petitions are indexed and microfilmed and the reels can be borrowed on loan. A list of the films will be sent upon request. Also available at the Archives are copies of the land deeds, leases and mortgages formerly kept in the County Registry Offices. These documents can supply valuable information about our ancestors. Land grant maps showing where settlers were located in the province can also be consulted at the Archives.

If a family historian wishes to obtain a copy of the land grant describing the bounds of a particular lot, he will have to write to the Lands Branch, Dept. of Natural Resources, P.O. Box 6000, Fredericton, N.B., E3B 5H1. There is a \$4 search fee plus an additional charge of \$1 per page for photocopies, usually about 3 pages. The grants contain no biographical data. From this same office one can obtain a copy of the cadestral or reference map that shows where an ancestors' first grant was located for \$2.25.

MILITARY RECORDS: At the Provincial Archives there is a small collection of military and militia papers containing correspondence, desertion records, commissions, pay rolls, troop supply documents, order books and so on. In addition, the Public Archives of Canada has donated copies of nearly 180 reels of microfilmed Loyalist military records formerly kept in the Admiralty, War, and Audit Offices in London, and another 140 reels of British Military records pertaining to New Brunswick and other British colonies. These reels can be used at Fredericton or ordered on loan from Ottawa.

In the Records of Old Soldiers' and Widows Pensions, Record Series 566, there are copies of petitions, schedules and correspondence referring to over 400 soldiers of the American Revolutionary War or their widows. These files can contain very interesting biographical data.

SCHOOL RECORDS: In Record Series 655, Teachers Petitions and Licenses, the documents give names, country of birth, education, teaching experience, church affiliation, and samples of handwriting. Local school trustees and clergymen attached certificates verifying the petitioner's teaching ability and moral character. In Record Series 657, School Returns, there are scattered grammar, parish and private school returns from about the 1820's to the 1870's. Teachers' Returns were kept systematically from 1877 to 1954 and contain the name of each teacher, the names and ages of the students and other data of use to researchers. Post 1877 returns have been filmed and are listed in the county genealogical guides.

MACTAQUAC DAM CEMETERIES: In Record Series 173, Mactaquac Development Project Records, there is data on cemeteries at Mactaquac, Lower Queensbury, Burden, Bear Island, Medutic, Longs Creek, Barony, Parents Ferry, Kingsclear, Southampton, Dowville, Lower Woodstock, Prince William, and Northampton. Information is also available on the cemeteries for the Otis, Porter, McNally, Cliff, Joslin, Lawrence, Lenentine, Brown, Ritchie, McFarlane, Rosborough, Cronkite, Ellegood, Calder, Munro, Hillman, Temple, Kilburn, Burrell, and Smith families.

NEWSPAPERS: At the Provincial Archives there are several hundred reels of microfilmed daily New Brunswick newspapers. These include the Fredericton Daily Gleaner, the Moncton Times, the Moncton Transcript, the Saint John Telegraph Journal, the Sackville Tribune, and others. These can be borrowed on interlibrary loan. To discover the names of the newspapers in a particular community researchers can consult J. Russell Harper's Historical Directory of New Brunswick Newspapers and Periodicals. Family historians are reminded that the University of New Brunswick has microfilmed many of the weekly newspapers and lends these reels on interlibrary loan. The address of this institution is found on Page 10.

NEW BRUNSWICK VITAL STATISTICS FROM NEWSPAPERS: This series of publications contain data on births, marriages and deaths extracted from the old provincial newspapers from 1784 onwards. These very helpful books can be used at the Archives or purchased from Dan Johnson, P.O. Box 2387, Saint John, N.B., E2L 3V6.

MUNICIPAL RECORDS: Most of the province's fifteen counties have placed their old municipal records at the Archives for storage. In these collections are financial papers such as tax assessment lists, as well as school records, voters and jury lists, marriage certificates and other information of use to the family historian. There are also city, town and village records that may also contain useful data on one's ancestors.

PRIVATE MANUSCRIPT COLLECTIONS: Since its creation in 1967 the Provincial Archives has acquired over 1100 collections from various individuals, families, companies, churches, clubs, societies, and groups involved in sports, theatre, and the arts. Scrapbooks, diaries, and other material are also available. Visiting researchers are welcome to view the many inventories that describe the contents of these manuscript collections.

PHOTOCOPYING: Researchers wishing to make photocopies of the old records are charged .10 per page if they do the work themselves. The staff will do a limited amount of copying for those writing to the Archives at .50 per page. Certified copies for legal purposes will be made for \$1.00 per page. For extensive copying jobs the name of a private researcher available for hire can be supplied. To make prints from the microfilm reels there is a charge of .50 per sheet. Prints from the photograph collection cost \$3.00 for the 5 x 7 size and \$5.00 for an 8 x 10. The prices for maps reproductions are available upon request.

RESEARCHERS FOR HIRE: The names of people who can be hired to do genealogical research work is available upon request. Charges vary from \$10 to \$25 per hour. The Archives cannot be held accountable for the work done by these individuals, but in the past the work done by private researchers has been found to be of high quality.

NEW BRUNSWICK GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY: P.O. Box 3235, Station "B", Fredericton, N.B. E3A 5G9. It is strongly recommended that each family historian researching in New Brunswick join this provincial organization and also the branch nearest to where your ancestor lived. The society prints a newsletter and an "Index of Names Being Researched by Members" and other publications. BRANCH GENEALOGICAL LIBRARY OF THE CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST OF After researchers have exhausted the LATTER-DAY SAINTS: sources available at the Provincial Archives and at the other New Brunswick archival institutions, they should get in touch with their nearest Branch Genealogical Library of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The public is welcome to use the many helpful resources found in these libraries such as the "International Genealogical Index" which contains over 88 million pieces of vital statistical data on deceased persons. About half of the information was extracted from vital records copied in Great Britain. the cost of postage, a researcher can order from Salt Lake City any of the over four million microfilm reels containing church and other vital records from all over the world.

"Registor of the first Calvanist Baptist Church at Springfield, County of King's, November 25th, 1809"

The information to follow was obtained from the Vaughan Memorial Library, Acadia University, Wolfville, Nova Scotia. It represents only a few pages in the register but may be of interest nevertheless. It is important to note that the Church was founded November 25, 1809 but that the entries in the register have been made at a much later date, possibly 1850-65. Therefore, for example the entry "Died" opposite the name Caleb Davis in 1809 does not mean Caleb Davis died in 1809, but that he was a member in 1809 and that at the time the register was made up or entered, he had died.

I do not know how many pages are in the Register nor what years are covered. Also I am not certain that the Library provides more extensive photocopying of that source. But these few extracted bits may be of interest to some.

"July 22nd 1810. A conference meeting this day the following persons were chosen James Hughson Snr Deacon, Caleb Davis Clerk.

Some time after this the following Persons were chosen Caleb Davis Deacon and James E. Davis Deacon - and Gilford Fleweling Clerk.

From this time the Church was in a low state. Prayer Meetings much neglected. Scarce any meetings unless by traveling Ministers, until about the year 1821 when Elder David Nutter from England but afterwards in the States was directed here by the Lord.

Elder Nutters Labour being Blesd of God to the good of the People Generally -

After Preaching on the Sabbath he Baptized six willing converts the Church appeared to awake to a sence of their obligations to God.

About this time Elder Francis Pickle of Norton took the Pastoral charge of the Church the Lord Blessing his labours to the benefit of the Church and the Conversion of Sinners many coming forward and uniting with the Church -

Deacon James E. Davis Received licence from the Church to Preach and labour Publicly which was a Blessing to the Cause of God in this place and the adjacent neibourhoods, so much so that the Church thought proper to call him to Ordination as their Pastor.

Accordingly a meeting was called for that purpose in October 1831 when the subject was taken up and agreed to by the Church - "  $\,$

#### HOMO SAPIENS

(From the Prince Albert, Sask. branch newsletter)

A Grade 5 teacher gave her students a lesson on the human anatomy. In the test which followed, all came up with a passing mark except one, who wrote:

#### MARY CRAIG'S MONUMENT

It is a distinguished looking monument, not only for its style, but also because in 1973, when the restoration of the Wesleyan Burial Ground began, it was one of the few monuments that stood erect. Made of marble and now weathered well beyond its original sharp detail of carving, its vertical cylindrical column was seemingly broken off at the top but capped with a wreath which rested at an angle down the front. Symbolically, this suggested the commemoration of someone whose life had been broken off too early, and the laurel (?) wreath which that person were was forever to mark a last resting place.

On the front of the monument is the inscription "In Memory of our Mother Mary Craig who departed this life 1st Dec 1865 aged 43 years. A tribute of affection to our beloved Mother". On the back of the monument is listed:

John Harding 2yrs 9mos
Elizabeth Ann 1yr 7mos
Margaret Eliza 7mos
Thomas Harding 8mos
Herbert Owens 2yrs 8mos
Henry McHol(?) 20 days
Children of William and Mary Craig M.D.

Just who was this Mary Craig and why was William's death not also marked on the monument? Is this the same Mary Craig referred to in "HISTORY OF THE SAINT JOHN GENERAL HOSPITAL AND SCHOOL OF NURSING" by Alberta V. Hanscombe (1955)? In 1865, of six applicants, Mrs. Mary Craig was appointed as Matron of the General Public Hospital. She began her duties in May of that year, but, said the history, "being of the advanced age of 81 years, died in December of the same year". And who was William Craig, M.D.? His name did not come to mind of 19th century Doctors in Saint John, nor did the name appear in DR. W. Brenton Stewart's "MEDICINE IN NEW BRUNSWICK"'(1974), but his book did say "Mrs. Mary Craig, an elderly lady, was the first matron. She died in December of the same year - aged 81".

There the mystery remained, until Novbember of 1981 when Dr. Eli R.Davis, then on the Medical Staff of the Saint John Regional Hospital, phoned me enquiring about a Dr. James Sinclair who had died early in 1866 and wanting to know if he had been buried in the old Methodist Cemetery (The Wesleyan Burial Ground, Thorne Ave., Saint John, N.B.). Although I was unable to be of assistance to Dr. Davis his call gave me an opportunity to ask about Mary Craig. Dr. Davis' subsequent letter gave me all of the information in the old

Minute Books including the resolution that she be hired at a salary of \$140.00 per year, the hiring of her successor and, oddly, payment for six telegrams to and from "Milwaukie" (ie.Milwaukee, Wisconsin, U.S.A.)

Further clues to unravel this mystery did not appear until later in 1982 when THE NEW BRUNSWICK CENSUS OF 1851: SAINT JOHN COUNTY (Compiled by the Saint John Branch, New Brunswick Genealogical Society, and published by the PROVINCIAL ARCHIVES OF NEW BRUNSWICK, 1982) was printed. The following seemed to be related to our quest.

Perhaps we were, at last, seeing something more of the whole family of Mary Craig of the Monument, because if she was 43 when she died in December of 1865 she could have been 28 when the census was taken as of June 1851. But, is this also Mary Craig, the Matron?

The conclusive document was found later, in 1983, in the Saint John County Probate Records, on file in the Provincial Archives in Fredericton. This was the Petition, dated December 12,1865, of William B. Craig of the City of Saint John, Gentleman, for Letters of Administration for the Estate of his Mother Mary Craig, late of the City of Saint John, whose death he stated to have occurred on December 1st,1865. William B.Craig's petition states also as follows:

"That the said Mary Craig immediately before her death was an inhabitant of the City of Saint John....., that the said Mary Craig left a husband William Craig who resides in Australia and has resided there since the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, two sons James Albert machinist who is now residing at Stephens Point in the State of Wisconsin in the United States, your petitioner, and one daughter Mary A. Robb a married woman residing at Stephens Point aforesaid. ...............That the said William Craig husband of the said Mary Craig deserted the said Mary Craig in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two and went to Australia from whence he has not since returned, that the said Mary Craig since that time has been compelled by her own exertions to maintain herself,...."

From Daniel F. Johnson's excellent publications VITAL STATISTICS FROM NEW BRUNSWICK NEWSPAPERS more details of Mary

Craig have appeared. She was Mary Harding when William and she were married on November 5th 1838 by the Rev. Mr. Wilson of Saint John though the couple were both from the Parish of Lancaster in Saint John County .(Two of the children listed on the monument have a middle name of Harding). Also from Daniel Johnson we have learned of the dates of death of John Harding Craig(18 Feb 1845), Elizabeth Ann Craig(20 Nov 1846) and Margaret Eliza Craig(21 Mar 1849). The deaths of Elizabeth Ann and Margaret Eliza took place at the Alms House, and from the ACCOUNTS OF MONIES PAID BY THE ALMS HOUSE COMMISSIONERS APRIL 1846-TO JUN 1851 (Manuscript, private collection) we find that William Craig is Keeper of the Alms House to May 1849 being paid 25 pounds per quarter.

The JOHNSON volumes now go to 1850, but from reading subsequent newspapers we have found in the SAINT JOHN MORNING NEWS of Monday 12 Mar 1855 "Died on Friday morning (the 9th) Herbert Owen ,age 2 years and 8 mos, youngest son of William Craig, M.D." Undoubtedly, succeeding volumes of JOHNSON'S VITAL STATISTICS will help fill in the dates of death of Mary Craig's other children.

Finally, our research took us to the Saint John newspapers for December 1865 to look for an obituary. The Morning News of Monday, December 4th, 1865 contained the following brief notice: "Died, on Friday morning, the 1st inst. Mary, beloved wife of Dr. Wm. Craig, aged 43 years".

In short, it seems that Mary Craig married at the age of about sixteen, bore nine children six of whom died before reaching their third birthday, deserted by her husband before she was thirty and thereafter supported her three remaining children. There seems little doubt that Mary Craig was 43 when she died and it is now only a minor mystery as to why two authors said she was age 81.

Meanwhile, the white marble monument stands silently in tribute to a woman who suffered the loss of most of her children in her lifetime, lived through the agony of a deserting husband, and whose life was cut short at age 43 while serving as Hospital Matron.

### Annual Report:

1985-86 was an active year for the members of the <u>Southeastern</u>

<u>Branch</u> of the New Brunswick Genealogical Society. There were three general meetings, one public workshop and the annual meeting which included a field trip to the Dorchester area.

In keeping with the groups objective of promoting the study of genealogy and family history research, guest speakers high-lighted the general and annual meetings.

In September, historian C.Alex Pincombe spoke on the interconnection of the rivers in the areas surrounding Salisbury and Petit-codiac, Westmorland County and the influential families of these areas in the early days.

Dr. Rainer Hemple of Mount Allison University presented a paper at the November meeting on his research re the German settlers who had come to Germantown, Albert County in the 1700's.

Dr. Robert Wilson of the Atlantic Baptist College outlined the influence of prominent Baptists on local history at the January meeting. He also showed the group a number of recently published historical books which were biographic in places and therefore would be of interest to family historians.

At the annual meeting in May, Dr. Byron Allen Walton shared information on families he was researching from the Parish of Botsford, Westmorland County.

A public genealogical workshop was held in place of the March meeting. The purpose was to provide information to members and friends, to encourage them in their research and to help them with their research problems.

Many publications were added to the library holdings of the society and were placed at the Moncton Library for the use of members and friends.

The highlight of the year was the beginning of a project to compile an outline of the families who first settled in the southeastern area of New Brunswick. Many entries have been submitted to date and the committee is actively searching for more contributions to make this project complete.

### The DesBarres Papers

A note from the DesBarres papers indicates that "In the spring of the year 1773, Thomas Coates, Stephen Reed and James Metcalfe resided in the farm now occupied bu James Metcalfe. In 1779, Thomas Ripley bought out Stephen Reed for £8. Reed had obtained the property from one L. Brown.

Ripley paid £10 rent per year. He remained in the property for two years, then sold out to James Metcalfe for £22, 10s, which amount he had expended in dyking the marsh.

The papers also mention the names of other residents as being Peter Wood, Peter, John and Joseph Gold (Gould), Charles Leger,..... Blinkhorn, George Ma(e)nnard, Peter Hall, Rev. D. Harrison and others.

The above-mentioned persons are identified as being, apparently, the "names of personsas settled from the southernmost pocket of Memramcook River to Charles Malancons".

A list of DesBarres' tenants in the Maccan-Nappan area of Cumberland County, N.S. includes the names of several who had other family members mettling in the Sackville area and other parts of eastern Westmorland County.



# Dictionary of Scattish Emigrants

Some of our members have contributed to <u>A Dictionary</u> of Scottish Emigrants to Canada before Confederation recently published by the Ontario Genealogical Society. This monumental work was compiled by Scotland's preeminent genealogist Donald Whyte F.H.G, F.S.G., 4 Carmel Road, Kirkliston, West Lothian, Scotland, EH29 9DD. Mr. Whyte is already planning a supplement with 1991 being the probable date of publication. The present book includes information on many New Brunswick pioneers but data about the majority were unavailable. The supplement provides us with an opportunity to include many more.

For each pre-Confederation Scottish emigrant he lists, Mr. Whyte will include as many as possible of the following: date and place of birth, parentage, date of sailing, name of ship and destination, occupation, date of marriage, name of wife or husband, parentage of spouse, names and dates of birth of children born in Scotland and after arrival in Canada.

Could our members make sure that Mr. Whyte has information about their Pre-Confederation pioneer forebears who came to Canada <u>directly</u> from Scotland and who are not included in his 1986 publication?

COLONIAL TITLES -- A person's title in colonial days often had a different meaning than titles used today. Stepmothers were sometimes called mothers-in-law. Cousins could be relatives of any type or sometimes even friends. Housekeeper once meant property owner and could be used for a male as well as a female. Inmate, refers to a man living in the home of another person, not necessarily in an institution. Freeman meant a young man, not yet married. Domestic once meant housewife, not necessarily a servant. Mister was a title used only for men of wealth and/or education. A retired man might be listed as a gentleman. (DuPage Co. IL G.S.)

# **BRADSHAW** and Related Families

This Bradshaw family history, published 1985, has been compiled, after twenty-eight years of research and collecting family records, by Evelyn M. (Bradshaw) Wright.

The early history of the ancient Bradshaw family in England and Northern Ireland is recorded from 1042 to the 1700s. Starting in 1727 in America, the family of James Bradshaw c1715-1776 and his wife Ruth Lowther 1718-1800 and their children, is documented.

An effort has been made to follow the descendants of James and Ruth to the present day, as the family spreads throughout the U.S.A. and Canada. It details the family in the Revolutionary War in Bucks Co., Pa., and the four sons and five daughters who stayed there. It also follows the three sons who came to Canada 1788-1800, and their descendants--many involved in the War of 1812 and the Upper Canada Rebellion of 1837. Early histories of related families have been included wherever possible.

Hardbound, about 650 pages, the book is printed on quality paper for long life, with a striking blue and silver-stamped cover bearing the arms of the family. There are approximately 40 pages of old photographs, letters and documents. The book is fully indexed, with about 9,000 names.

# Searching Titles in N.B.

The Province of New Brunswick came into being in 1784, with records prior to that date being located in Nova Scotia. By 1786 the counties of Charlotte, Saint John, Kings, Queens and Sunbury were identified in the same shape as they presently appear. The Counties of York, Northumberland and Westmorland covered much greater areas than at present and it was not until 1850 that the Province attained its present geographic boundaries. The book "Researching Your Ancestors in New Brunswick, Canada," by Robert Fellows provides the researchers with information as to where records existed at some specific date or period in history. Obviously, unless you are looking in the proper area the results will be less than satisfactory.

The searching of people through real property records can be a frustrating experience, and this source of information appears to be most useful in confirming previously suspected identity or location at some particular time. The method of indexing real property records chosen in 1784, and still in use today, was to identify the property by the name of the seller or grantor and the name of the buyer or grantee. It was customary for property to be obtained in the name of the male member of the family, and in large families the names of male members were often duplicated, with a son of the owner bearing the same name. Some purchasers insisted that the spouse of the seller join in the conveyance and when property was sold we find the name of the owner's wife appearing in the records. This has resulted in better identification of the property owner when the name of the owner's wife is known. It has also alerted searchers to the fact they have been following a false lead when the name of the wife of the property

owner is not the name with which they can identify. Either great grand-dad had two wives or the wrong name is being searched.

However, the real property records of New Brunswick have one redeeming feature as far as the genealogical searcher is concerned, and that is the practice of registering wills in the local registry office rather than having the will probated. Finding a will is often a major asset to a searcher, as it not only confirms the identity of the individual but provides a list of the family members and date of death of the individual being searched.


A complete search of New Brunswick could involve visiting all fifteen County Registry Offices. However, this information appears on microfilm and the Provincial Archives in Fredericton maintains a copy of this microfilm, so that a visit to the Archives may avoid some time and travel if the information being sought can be provided through property records.

The following dates indicate when New Brunswick counties were formed and attached maps indicate the origin of counties formed after 1784:




#### TIPS ON TRACING YOUR FAMILY TREE

- 1. YOU'RE NUMBER ONE. Start with yourself; your full name, date of birth and other important dates, the full names and dates of your parents.
- 2. KEEP THE RECORD STRAIGHT. You may use file cards, loose-leaf notebook, or another system. Enter all the information you find so that you can find it again when you need it.
- 3. ONE STEP AT A TIME, prove the facts as you go; don't skip generations. You can't prove that John Henry Morgan was your great grandfather unless you can show positive evidence that your grandfather was his son.
- 4. PENCIL VERSUS PEN. You need both. Keep unproved records in pencil so they can be changed. Don't make a permanent record until you are sure.
- 5. IT'S A FAMILY AFFAIR. Enlist the help of relatives. If they're nearby, visit them. If they're far away, write. Get reacquainted with distant cousins.
- 6. DATES ARE VITAL. Exact dates of birth, death, marriage may be found in family Bibles, on tombstones, in state, federal or local records. Approximate ages appear in the census. Try every source.
- 7. "THEY WENT THATAWAY". Census records since 1850 show state of birth, family migration. Newspaper obituaries, county histories some land and probate records also give clues to residences.
- 8. WHERE THERE'S A WILL. Probate records can be proof positive of a relationship. Even when there's no will, records of estate settlements may show heirs and relationships.
- 9. NAMES ON THE LAND. Land transactions have been recorded with great care through most of our history. Records of deeds may show not only owners, but heirs and relationships on both sides. Tax Lists help. And look at the neighbours, they might be relatives.
- 10. PENSION PAPERS PAY DIVIDENDS. They're full of dates and places. If an ancestor served in any war, it's on record; you can get a copy.
- 11. CHECK THE CHURCHES. Some denominations kept baptismal, burial and marriage records; others didn't. But some who didn't may have adjacent cemeteries with the data you need carved in stone.
- 12. LEARN TO LOVE LIBRARIES. For it may be that much of your research you need has already been done and is waiting for you right in your local library, in printed books or on microfilm.
