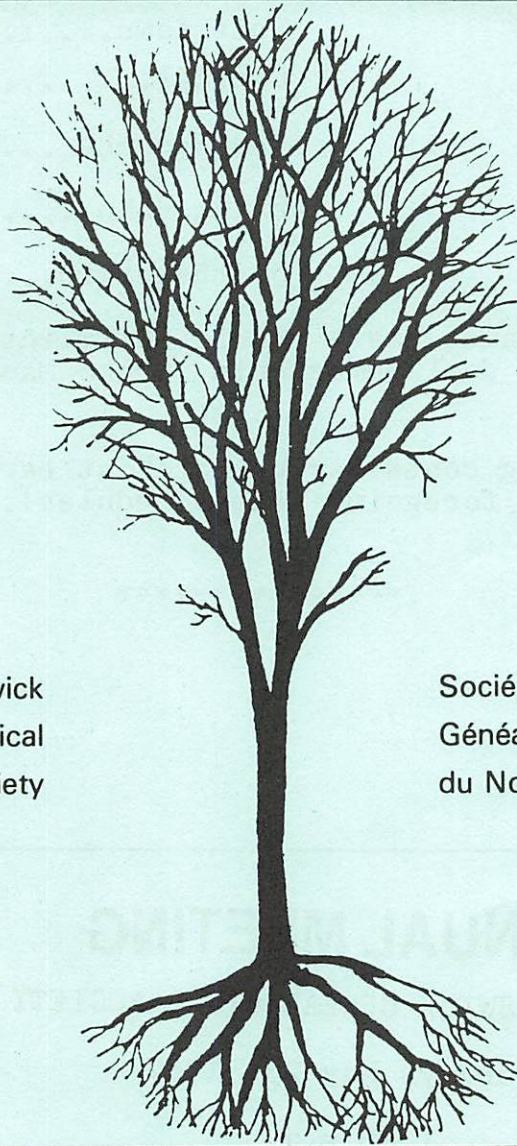

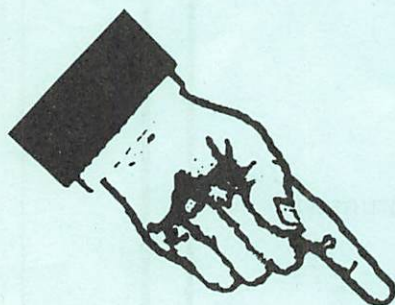

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MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING
NEW BRUNSWICK GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY
(N.B.G.S.)
MAY 24, 1986

The Annual Meeting of the New Brunswick Genealogical Society (N.B.G.S.) was held at the King's County Museum, Hampton, N.B. on Saturday, May 24, 1986, at 2.00 p.m. The president, Mrs. Jan Dexter, was in the chair and welcomed the 28 members who were in attendance.

Before the time of the Annual General Meeting, the King's County Museum was open and members enjoyed viewing the interesting exhibits in the collection. There were many articles of genealogical as well as historical interest.

The minutes of the Annual Meeting, May 25, 1985, were read and approved. They were published in GENERATIONS.

REPORTS

PRESIDENT - Mrs. Jan Dexter

The president reported that the work of the Society was being conducted efficiently. However, the Society is in need of a Membership Secretary and a Corresponding Secretary. Other members are fulfilling the duties of these positions on a temporary basis. Implementation of the new dues structure has taken considerable time and attention this year. Some people in the Chatham-Newcastle area have expressed an interest in forming an N.B.G.S. branch in that area of the province. Four executive meetings, in the months of July, November, January, and March, were conducted at the Provincial Archives, Fredericton, and one on May 24, 1986, at 12.00 p.m. at the King's County Museum. The International Genealogical Workshop which was hosted by the Saint John Branch, August 3-5, 1985, was an unqualified success. The trip to Partridge Island (and the sunny day for its enjoyment) was appreciated by all participants.

The treasurer moved the adoption of her report. It was seconded by Mrs. Evelyn Eardley and approved by vote.

GENERATIONS EDITOR - Mr. Bill Kilfoil

Four volumes of GENERATIONS were published during the year. Issue # 28 will be printed in June. This will be the eighth issue published by the present editor. Members are requested to submit material to the editor for publication. Material should be submitted well in advance of publication deadlines. In an effort to improve the content and appearance of GENERATIONS an "Editorial" was introduced in December. It is planned to begin a "Letters to the Editor" column later in the year. It is hoped to publish a membership breakdown by province and state in the September issue. This might be a means of opening up correspondence between members who might be reasonably close neighbours.

BRANCH REPORTS

BOIESTOWN BRANCH - Mr. Wilmot Ross, President

This branch is holding regular meetings. Mrs. Betty Saunders, as well as being Queries Editor for GENERATIONS, is willing to do research in that area of the province.

CAPITAL BRANCH - Mr. Clifford Marks, President

Ten regular meetings were held during the year. This Branch meets on the first Tuesday of each month with an average attendance of twenty members. The members assisted the N.B.G.S. executive with queries, correspondence and related tasks. The branch responded positively to a request from the N.B.G.S. to form a library committee which would organize the present holdings of the Society at the Provincial Archives, coordinate the acquisition of new materials, and investigate the cost of reproducing out-of-print issues of GENERATIONS. Work is progressing on the first task.

The annual meeting was held in May and Mr. Bill Kilfoil was elected as the new branch president.

RESTIGOUCHE BRANCH - Mr. Kerry E. Price, President
(Branch report by letter)

This branch has eight paid-up members and held four meetings during the year, two in the fall and two in the Spring. The meetings alternate between Campbellton and Dalhousie. Mrs. Jan Dexter, N.B.G.S. President, was the speaker at the November meeting and spoke about the new fee structure.

It was an active year for this branch.

(1) The 1851, 1861, and 1871 Censuses of Restigouche County were published with the co-operation of the Provincial Archives,

(2) Work is progressing on the 1881 Census of Restigouche County,

(3) Copies of the Charlo Roman Catholic Church records, 1843-1920, were published in co-operation with the Provincial Archives,

(4) The records of St. Andrew's United Church, Campbellton, 1874-1965, have been copied from microfilm and are available for consultation in Dalhousie,

(5) The records of the St. John the Baptist Roman Catholic Church, Dalhousie, 1890-1920, have been copied from the microfilm and are available for consultation in Dalhousie,

(6) Cemetery inscriptions have been compiled and are available for consultation in Dalhousie, for the following cemeteries:

- (a) The Campbellton Rural Cemetery
- (b) St. Thomas Aquinas Cemetery, Campbellton
- (c) Our Lady of Snows Cemetery, Campbellton
- (d) The Mary Queens Roman Catholic Cemetery, McLeods, N.B.
- (e) The Flatlands Rural Cemetery
- (f) The Kempt Road, Quebec Cemetery
- (g) Ste. Helene Roman Catholic Cemetery,
Pointe a la Croix, Quebec,

(7) Transcriptions of other cemeteries are in progress,

(8) Restigouche-Bonaventure area vital statistics are being extracted from Campbellton newspapers, 1909-1986.

The Restigouche Branch has a number of valuable members who over the years have done much genealogical research: Mr. Jackson B. Ross, Mrs. Maxine Bain, Mrs. Ila McRae, and Mrs. Gwen McDonald (moved to Halifax) - from Campbellton; Mrs. Annette Hynes, Mrs. Mary Young, Mrs. Alice Doherty (moving West) - from Dalhousie.

Any one interested in genealogical research is invited to visit the Genealogical Resource Room at the Dalhousie Centennial Library and use the materials housed there.

GRAND MANAN BRANCH - Mrs. Gleneta Hettrick, President
(Branch report by letter)

Unfortunately, because of our isolated position, it is not feasible for Grand Manan members to attend mainland meetings. We would have to spend at the very least six to seven hours travel for a two-to-three hour meeting. In most instances it would mean an overnight stay. Perhaps one of these times some of us can tie the Annual Meeting into a mainland trip.

Meetings are attended by an average of five people, two of whom are working on materials other than their own family records. Four issues of THE SANDS OF TIME were published. The June 1986 issue will begin the seventh year of publication. Suggestions to give SANDS more variety and interest are invited. An \$ 8.00 fee is required to cover the costs of publishing and distributing SANDS. The vote to join N.B.G.S. individually was defeated because the dues seem prohibitively high.

Several projects have been undertaken this year:

- (1) The 1891 Census for Grand Manan has been copied,
- (2) The records of The Graham Funeral Home, 1886-1944, have been copied and are being published in THE SANDS OF TIME,
- (3) The transcriptions of the cemetery records for Grand Manan will soon be completed. They will be published in Generations,
- (4) Members are preparing copies of their own Family Group Sheets for the Grand Manan Museum Archives. This work is progressing slowly,
- (5) The Genealogical Society and the Historical Society purchased a photocopier with assistance from the Grand Manan Rotary Club,
- (6) A \$25.00 gift was sent to N.B.G.S. to assist in a small way with the publication of GENERATIONS.

SAINT JOHN BRANCH - Mr. Jim McKenzie, President

Mr. Dan Johnson reported that Mr. Peter Gillies will be the new President.

The following projects are being undertaken by members of this branch:

(1) Publication of Custom House Records (Passenger Lists for 1833, 1834, 1837, and 1838),

(2) Publication of Burial Records of the Church of England Cemetery, Thorne Avenue, Saint John,

(3) Publication of Old Loyalist Burial Ground Records, King's Square, Saint John,

(4) Publication of applications for Burial Permits for Saint John City and Saint John County,

(5) Collection of epitaphs from Saint John County cemeteries.

SOUTHEASTERN BRANCH - Mr. David Christopher, President

Mrs. Dawn Kinnie reported that the Southeastern Branch held four regular meetings on Saturday afternoons at 2.00 p.m., on odd numbered months. Mr. Wayne Gilcash is the new president.

Note - A complete Annual Report of the Southeastern Branch was published in Issue 30, GENERATIONS, December, 1986.

It was moved by Mr. Dan Johnson, seconded by Mr. Bill Kilfoil, that the reports be accepted as presented. The motion was carried by vote.

Following the branch reports, the president, Mrs. Jan Dexter, presented Mrs. Betty Sewell with an Honorary Life Membership certificate. Mrs. Sewell responded appropriately.

NEW BUSINESS

It was moved by Mr. V. Bing Geldart, and seconded by Mr. Bill Kilfoil, that the N.B.G.S. sponsor an International Genealogical Workshop in the Moncton-Sackville area in the summer of 1987, and that the Society accept the kind offer of the Southeastern Branch to host the workshop on behalf of the Society. The motion was carried by vote.

It was moved by Mr. V. Bing Geldart, and seconded by Mr. Dan Johnson, that a sum of money not to exceed \$1,000.00 be made available to the workshop committee as operating capital. Motion carried by vote.

Mr. Dan Johnson reported that he would take a display to the Irish Festival in July in Chatham on behalf of the Society. He would appreciate help with this project.

It was moved by Mr. Wilmot Ross, seconded by Mrs. Betty Sewell, that the signing officers of the Society for the next year will be any two of Mr. Bill Kilfoil, Miss Eileen Wallace, and Mr. Ross Wilton.

The "Daniel O'Connell" and her passengers:

The following information is taken from Customs and plantation papers at the Public Archives of Canada in Ottawa, Ontario.

18 Aug 1832

Brig Daniel O'Connell out of Donegal, Ireland

Gentlemen;

Having been called upon to state so in writing the reason for not giving the Tide Surveer at Quebec the passenger list received by me at Donegal and sertified by this assistant Colector at BallyShannon 11th day April last. I beg leave humbly to state that in consequence of the confusion and bustle of passengers at this time of sailing I forgot to get the list of passengers from the consignee as they had it mustering the passengers along with the coast gards and he neglected to give me back (as controller had it in mustering of them) when he came to Donegal to inspect the passengers and he gave it into the hands of the consignee. When that I forgot it and I made out another list for the Tide Surveer at Quebec and as I was under the number of passengers were under complement allowed by law I did not consider that I had been guilty of any fraudulent irregularity in that neglect as it was not my intention.

One can easily understand the resulting confusion when two passenger lists turned up, with discrepancies between them. We are publishing both lists because each contains information not on the other.

The mixup occurred, apparently, when Capt. Rittie sailed without a list of his passengers. Upon discovering this, he made up a list during the voyage. When the original list also turned up: well, you can see resulting discrepancies and confusion.

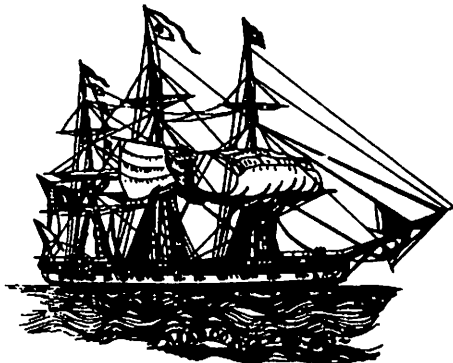

Customs House Quebec
4th June 1832

Hon. Sirs

Your letter of 5th January 1832 having directed us to report any irregularities connected with the clearance of Vessels leaving the United Kingdom with emigrants, we have to state for your information that the Brig Daniel O Connell arrived here yesterday from ligo with 112 emigrants on board and that the only returns of which produced by the master was the document transmitted herewith which not being in conformity with that prescribed by Sec 4 - 7. Geo IV. Cap 21 - We consider it our duty to submit to your consideration and direction.

The vessel appearing to have cleared previous to 16th April, no duty is ligible on the passengers under the Provincial Act and the number mustered on board by the Tide Surveyor does not exceed that allowed by same. We take this opportunity of stating that such numerous changes of passengers take place between the time of ships clearing and her sailing from entered passengers getting on shore not making their appearance at the time of sailing and others being substituted in their room as also from the name given in to the Master or agent for the vessel being fictitious ones that we find no reliance can be placed on the certified list of named and in consequence that numbers alone must be our guide in applying the law and we have further to add that from our ignorance of the name of the clearing officer in the ports of the United Kingdom and the great diversity of forms of certificates issued by them we have no means of distinguishing genuine from fabricated ones.

We are not aware of any irregularity in the clearance from Donegal of the Daniel O'Connell for Quebec on the 11th of April last. The 1st and 2nd sections of 9" Geo 4 Chap 21 one particularly attended to by the Tide Surveyor and a list of passengers not corresponding with this enclosed document/consisting of ninety eight full passengers/Children included and seven of crew was delivered here by the Master of that Vessel with both and a certified count hand signed by the Apt Master handed to the Master on board his vessel by the Tide Surveyor after he mustered the passengers on board and found the provisions -- ample for the voyage and after the deliverance thereof we had no further contact of the master or -----any irregularities that might take place during the course of his intended voyage.

VITAL STATISTICS FROM NEW BRUNSWICK NEWSPAPERS

In 1982 the Vital Statistics Committee of the New Brunswick Genealogical Society began a project to extract genealogical data from New Brunswick newspapers. Births, marriages, death notices, coroner inquests, shipwrecks, melancholy accidents, murders, trials, executions were extracted, compiled and published in the Vital Statistics Series. Following the disbandment of the Committee, the project was continued on a private basis. The parameters of the project were expanded to include information regarding migration to and from New Brunswick. The series has become an essential tool for genealogical, biographical and historical research.

- * obituaries of the earliest settlers of New Brunswick
- * accounts of New Brunswick natives who have married or died in foreign lands.
- * lists of passengers bound for gold fields in California and Australia
- * biographies of prominent men of New Brunswick
- * burials on Partridge Island, Saint John during Irish "famine" years

- * Irish Riots in Saint John and Woodstock
- * accounts of Vessels lost at sea
- * accounts of murder, trial and execution
- * drownings, accidental shootings, dynamite mishaps, suicide

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During the Irish Famine years the Port of Saint John saw the arrival of many thousand immigrants. Many families had suffered loss from typhoid and cholera during their passage to North America. Widows, orphans and the families of men who had left to seek employment in the United States found temporary shelter at the Alms House. Over three quarters of the arrivals eventually made their way to Boston and other American communities. This book is a reproduction of Alms House registers containing the names of 3000 persons, their age, religion, county of origin in Ireland, name of vessel on which they came, dates of admittance and discharge (or death). Existing Immigration records of this time period are extremely rare underscoring the importance of this book in Irish genealogical research.

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INDIANTOWN 1863-1865

Situated in Portland parish, County of St. John, Indiantown is bounded by Marble Cove of the St. John River above the Reversing Falls. Regretfully, the census records of 1851, 1861 and 1871 are missing. Inhabitants appear as part of Portland District #1. in the 1881 Census; and as part of Lorne Ward in the 1891 Census.

Many inhabitants of Indiantown by the 1860's consisted of descendants of the early settlers of Kings and Queens counties, particularly those communities which bordered the St. John River ie. Long Reach, Westfield, Hampstead.

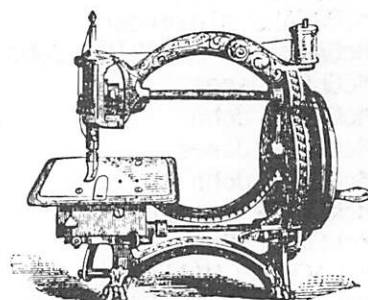

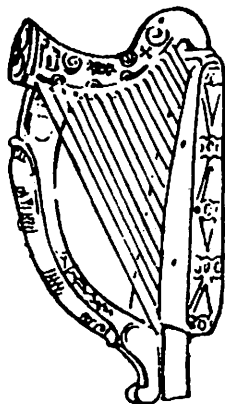

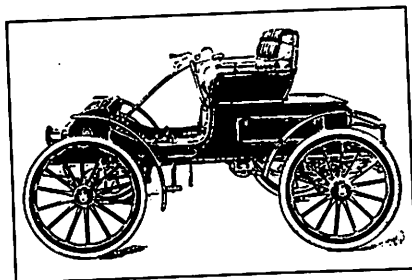

Be it known that I, Oscar S Davis, after being duly sworn, do say that I was born in Lincoln, Maine Oct 11th A.D. 1860 and lived thier until I was four years of age with my Father Peltiah Davis until the year 1865.

We moved to West Glassvill, N.B. We lived thier about three years. Then we moved to No. 5 called Mount Chase in the State of Maine and we lived thier and in Patten Maine about two years then we moved to Mattawumkeag, and lived thier about three years and then we moved back to Lincoln, Maine. We lived thier about two years and then we moved to Mattawamkeag and lived thier about twenty years.

Then I moved to Millinotic, (?) ME. and lived thier 2 years. Then I moved to Blanchard ME. and I lived thier about 1 year and then I moved to Island Falls, ME. in March 1898 and lived thier till Aug 1902 and then I moved to Springfield, ME where I now live.

 to the front to identify places, to the back to trace sources.

E Mr Whyte has devoted a quarter of a century to the task of collecting names of Scottish
 V emigrants to North America. In 1972 he published *A Dictionary of Scottish Emigrants to the*
 I *USA*, and for the past ten years he has concentrated on Canada. He remains modest about
 E the completeness of his work, for instance disclaiming any possibility that it might be used
 W for statistical purposes. Few scholars can be so well acquainted with the problems of
 handling Scotland's more familiar combinations of forenames and surnames. 'Alexander
 Bannerman, b. 1805, Kildonan, Sutherland, who settled in Grey County, Ontario, before
 1844, might be the same man who appears in 1854 at Lot 30, Con 25, Brant Township,
 Bruce County, but the compiler has made no such assumptions.' Indeed. There are 27
 pages of Macdonalds, including Canada's first prime minister, and no fewer than five
 Margaret McKays are identified, all of whom migrated to Pictou County in Nova Scotia.

Single-handedly, Donald Whyte has performed for thousands of ordinary people what the
 multi-author *Dictionary of Canadian Biography* has done for several dozen distinguished
 Scots who made their impact on Canada. It is impossible not to admire a work in which so
 much unobtrusive research carries the reader from Tatamagouche to Orkney. It is
 impossible not to be grateful to have access to this distillation of Donald Whyte's extensive
 personal research.

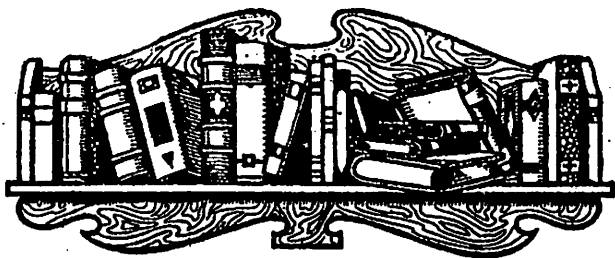

The Brockway Family

This is a listing of the Brockways' of New Brunswick, Canada, most of whom came here from USA and returned to USA, while only a very few lingered on and settled here, from New Hampshire.

As is usual, we start with:

1. Wolston and Hannah Briggs Brockway
2. Wolston and Margaret Jones? Brockway
3. Ephriam and Susannah Carrier Brockway
4. Jonathan and Phebe Smith Brockway.

Jonathan Brockway was born at Lyme, Conn., in 1738; baptized there in the First Church, 28 May 1738; married there 20 Oct. 1757, with Phebe Smith, of Lyme.

They resided in Lyme after their marriage until eight children had been born to them, during which time it is believed that he followed the sea. He was known as Captain Jonathan at that time. Having accumulated a handsome property, he removed from Lyme, between the years 1772 and 1774 and settled in Washington, N. H. near the outlet of Millen Pond, which was long known as Brockway's Pond. He invested his money largely in the wild land of Washington, purchasing, it is said, about fifteen hundred acres, a considerable portion of which was at the east part of town. He was a man of much enterprise, and built a grist-mill at Millen Pond, and later a saw-mill at East Washington. He also built a linseed oil mill and a whiskey distillery at the west part of the town the latter being the only establishment of its kind ever operated in town. The materials used were potatoes, which could be produced with little labor on the newly cleared land. Captain Brockway was of a patriotic turn and twice on the occasion of alarming news from Ticonderoga, he commanded small companies of men, who marched into Vermont to reinforce the American army, but in both cases their services were not required. No portrait of Captain Brockway is in existence, but he is described by those who remember him as a man of commanding presence, tall and very powerfully built. He was an honoured and influential citizen of his adopted town and aided largely in its development. His wife died Apr. 5, 1791, at the age of fifty-three. He married for his second wife, Rebecca Jones of Hillsborough, by whom he had one child. Captain Brockway died in Bradford, N. H. at the residence of his son Asa in January, 1829, at a very advanced age.

NOTE

Before I go on, I will try to explain to you the history of the Brockways' coming to N. B.

Reuben and Rufus came to St. George, in 1805. They left their families there, while they travelled up the river (Magaguadavic) to a little vale surrounded by mountains. *They came to Brockway about 1806.*

They were granted Lots No. 1 and No. 2 in Jan. 1818, after having cleared for themselves a bit of land and there they built their log cabins. They each got 300 acres, for a total of 600 acres in all, even though afterwards they still bought different parcels of land. This 600 acres was divided by the Magaguadavic River which ran between the 300 acres.

They bought the land from the Government for fifty cents an acre. The houses were little more than rough camps with large fire places that served in place of stoves. The brick used in these fire places were made by Reuben Brockway.

A saw mill on Upper Trout Brook, together with a machine for making matches, the first matches used in the little village, was conducted by Reuben (sticks) Brockway. A few years later he built a grist mill on Brook Stykes which was burned. The mill wheel from this mill, laid on the bottom of Brook Stykes (sticks) for years and years, until a few years ago it was brought out and is now placed in our Cemetery with a plaque on it in honor of our pioneer fathers, of which Reuben and Rufus are the two prominent ones mentioned.

Oxen were used in place of horses, and provisions were poled up the river in skiffs, small boats; or carried over foot paths up the Magaguadavic River, for about thirty miles of hilly country.

The place was once swept by fire (called the Miramichi Fire) and a number of buildings were burned; among them the school house, which was later rebuilt.

Reuben also had a saw mill in Second Falls (St. George) which he sold to Mr. Gillmore in 1831. The mill burned in 1824.

The foregoing is just part of a history of Brockway, but it does tell of Reuben and Rufus' coming and some of the things they got into when they first came here.

Inscriptions taken from this monument by Leroy P. Hall, September 1985, are given below]:

"HUMPHREY GILBERT -----[several words undecipherable (1)]
American Revolution family from Devonshire, England. After the American Revolution he came with his grandfather Colonel Thomas Gilbert. Being adherents to the Crown in the ship 'Spencer' to Saint John, New Brunswick in the Spring of 1783 and was married at Dorchester, New Brunswick February 12, 1807 to SARAH only child of Lieutenant Robert Keech, where he resided until his death 20 July 1838 aged 63 years".

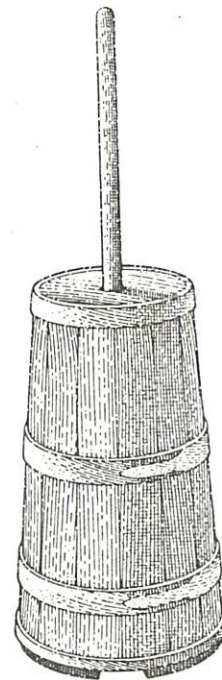

3-6 Nathaniel Gilbert
Born 1774 at Berkley, Mass. Married Elizabeth Gilbert (1788-1852)- 9 children.
Farmed Mangers Island, Sunbury County, New Brunswick.
Died July 2, 1828.

2-2A Married Phoebe ?-- probably in New York CA. 1782. Born 1756; died Mangers Island April 30, 1809. No documentary evidence has yet been uncovered that Thomas and Phoebe had any children yet circumstantial evidence indicates that at least one daughter was born to this union:

3-8 Phoebe, born December 25, 1792 on Manger's Island. Married: 1. Nicholas Brown; 2. ? Hickey. Five children born by No. 1. Died May 5, 1893 at Summerside, Prince Edward Island, aged 100+.

[NOTE: The information contained in the foregoing was gathered piecemeal from sources which include notes in the archives of Old Colony Historical Society of Taunton, Massachusetts; Vital Statistics from New Brunswick Newspapers, Vols. 1&2 (New Brunswick Genealogical Society); the Will of Thomas Gilbert made November 22, 1800; Anglican Church records: St. Anne's at Dorchester, N.B. and St. John's at Gagetown, N.B.; the research of Cleadie B. Barnett of Oromocto, N.B. confirmed much of this but in particular turned up the fact that daughter Mary (3-7) married and had children ("Loyalist Families" by Cleadie B. Barnett and Elizabeth S. Sewell) plus observations at the Burton, Sunbury County, cemetery. This compilation made by Leroy Porter Hall, La Canada, California 1986, who is a gr. gr. grandson of the Phoebe 3-8.]
