

Jeams Clarke - intention of marriage recorded Apr. 13, 1717 to Elizabeth Haggart. ( Haggit)

His son, Ebenezer, was baptized Oct. 7, 1722 and married Margery Patch (intentions recorded in Ipswich Town Records Aug. 10, 1745). Vital Records lists his marriage on Oct. 3, 1745 in Wenham, Mass.

Ebenezer was a grantee of Yarmouth, N.S., two of his holdings being at Cheboque, and, one on the west side of the Harbour. His occupation is unknown, and there is no record of his burial place.

Excerpts from Planters & Pioneers - Nova Scotia 1749-1775 by Ester Clark Wright.

Ebenezer Clark arrived from Ipswich, Mass. - 1 man, 2 boys,

l woman, l girl (1773). They were pre-loyalist settlers and Massachusetts pioneers.

The New England fisherman came to Nova Scotia for years and camped, dried and salted fish during the summers.

Governor Lawrence of Nova Scotia in 1758 invited settlers to N.S. Fisherman came to secure bases. This was just after the expulsion of the Acadians. These settlers then started boat building and lumbering. There was very little arable land in Yarmouth area.

The fish catch was returned to Boston or Gloucester and schooners returned with flour, oatmeal, corn meal etc. Some went to the West Indies and returned with molasses and rum.

When Massachusetts colonists rose in rebellion, Boston etc. were closed to N.S. vessels and rebel privateers captured their vessels and cargoes.

Most of the immigrants came from Essex and Barnstable Counties in the Massachusetts Bay Colony.

The following petition, forwarded to the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts in General Court was dated Yarmouth, N.S., April 29, 1782 and includes the name of Ebenezer Clark.

This petition prays for redress of some grievances which they suffer in Yarmouth. They also express thanks for allowing provisions to come to Yarmouth in times of want.

The petition reminds the Commonwealth of the help Yarmouth has given to their prisoners when in distress in Yarmouth and in captivity with their enemies. Yarmouth expresses concern with the prisoners' threats and plunderings.

Yarmouth asks the Commonwealth to try to prevent their privateers from coming on shore in Yarmouth and that the prisoners be returned to Massachusetts.

This petition is found in the Annals of Yarmouth and Barrington (Nova Scotia) in the Revolutionary War by Edmund Duval Poole. Reprinted from the Yarmouth Herald, 1899. Compiled from the original manuscripts etc. contained in the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth, State House, Boston, Mass.

Joseph Story in his "Discourse on first settlement in Salem" states that the first settlers were "Zealous, yet modest; innocent though free; patient of toil; serene amidst allarms; inflexible in faith; invincible in arms".

Dates of birth recorded prior to 20th Century were often baptismal and christening dates and not actual date of birth.

Intentions of marriage were often recorded, which might not be actual date of marriage.

Ebenezer Clarke arrived from Ipswich, Mass. in 1766 to Yarmouth Co., N.S. and was settled at Bunker's Island. His land grant was dated Apr. 7, 1767.

The name "Yarmouth" was first used in 1759, and was settled June 9, 1761.

Gov. Lawrence proclamation was dated Halifax, Oct. 12, 1758. As the conditions of land grants was not clear, a further proclamation dated Jan. 11, 1759 was issued. This allowed grants of 100 Acres for each man, and 50 Acres for each child, plus conditions for continuing the grant.

After the expulsions of the Acadians in 1755, the majority of the immigrants to Yarmouth and N.S. were descendants of the Puritans who had settled in New England and some were descendants of Mayflower passengers who arrived in Plymouth, Mass. in 1620.

Joseph Saunders came to Yarmouth the same year as Ebenezer Clark; i.e., 1766. There seems to have been family connections from an early date. Ebenezer's oldest child John (1749-1828) married Sarah Saunders (d. of Joseph). John's occupation or place of death is unknown.

A <u>John Clark</u> listed in families in Jeboque in Yarmouth - From Broad Brook to the Little River on July 11, 1791.

An interesting sidelight noted in Bunting's Freemasonry in New Brunswick is the laying of the cornerstone of the Provincial Lunatic Asylum (now Centracare) in West Saint John on June 24, 1847 with Masonic Ceremony.

John Clark's 5th child, Joseph, b. May 18, 1785, Yarmouth, N.S. d. Apr. 30, 1826, Saint John, N. B. Married Jannet (Jane) Rebeccah Gillies (d. of Archibald) Dec. 31, 1812 at Trinity Church, Saint John, N. B. by M. Byles, Rector of Saint John, as minister. Archibald Gillies and William Olive were witnesses. Both bride and groom were residents of Saint John.


Also, on Dec. 31, 1812, <u>Catherine W. Gillies</u> (d. of Archibald) married <u>Isaac Olive</u> at Trinity Church, Saint John, N.B. by <u>Roger Viets</u>, as minister. <u>Archibald Gillies</u> and <u>William Olive</u> were witnesses. Both bride and groom were residents of Parish of Saint John.

The record of the above two marriages are recorded in the Saint John Board of Health Records (first year that records were kept; i.e., 1812). These records are in the Public Archives in Fredericton.

The "Save Our Museum" Committee is a coalition group of private individuals, representatives and members of various New Brunswick historical and cultural organizations. This coalition contains people who are members of the

Additional members represent educational interests, professional researchers, university departments, amateur historians, authors and scholars of New Brunswick's material and written heritage.

The stated goal of this group is to halt any further deterioration or destruction of the services and/or collections of the New Brunswick Museum. We have direct evidence sworn in a legal affidavit that significant items of New Brunswick heritage have been destroyed wilfully by the New Brunswick Museum.

Members of the general public who have donated items for safekeeping to the Museum should be extremely concerned.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS:

,

- 1. That the Provincial Government move immediately to investigate the operation of the New Brunswick Museum.
- 2. That the Province take immediate steps to halt any further destruction of artifacts currently in the custody of the New Brunswick Museum.
- 3. That Dr. Alan McNairn be placed on leave of absence with pay until the investigation is complete.
- 4. That a temporary administrator be placed in charge of the New Brunswick Museum.
- 5. That all seats of the Board of the New Brunswick Museum that are currently vacant remain so until the investigation is complete.
- 6. That the City of Saint John place in abeyance any request for additional monies by the New Brunswick Museum.
- 7. That any public fund raising by the New Brunswick Museum or its agent be suspended immediately.

#### FLATLANDS CEMETERY

Flatlands is located approximately 11 or 12 miles west of Campbellton, in Restigouche County, New Brunswick. It is situated on the banks of the Restigouche River where the view of the islands and surrounding hills is one of the best. The cemetery serves the Protestant population of the village of Flatlands, and is located off the main road to the rear of the village in a wooded area between Flatlands and the village of Glen Levit. Its opening date is not known to the compilers, but the earliest death recorded on stones is 1888. Two ways of reaching it are given:

- Travel west from Campbellton through Atholville and Tide Head and past Morrissey Rock Lookout (stop here for the view). Continue until you've crossed a railway crossing. About 1/2 to 3/4 mile past the crossing, turn left, uphill, on a paved road. Drive approximately one mile.
- 2. Travelling west from Campbellton on the Trans Canada about five miles or so, you will find the Trans Canada ends and becomes a two-lane road at Glencoe. Continue about 2 or 2-1/2 miles to Glen Levit. Just before a Roman Catholic church and cemetery on the right, make a right-hand turn next to the cemetery and drive about 4 miles.

#### GENEALCGICAL INSTITUTE OF THE MARITIMES

#### By Terence M. Punch CG(C)

This report is intended to clarify one or two matters relating to the Institute's point system, and to update the list of those who have completed accreditation through the Institute.

#### I - The Point System

We wish to underline the fact that for work to be classed as a "publication" it need not have appeared in printed form, i.e., as a book or article. The material may exist as a manuscript or as a collection of information (e.g., transcriptions of headstones in a cemetery) which has been placed in an institution where such material is freely available for public consultation.

The point system provides a strong balance in favour of the practical qualifications: 20 of the possible 28 points (14 for experience and 6 for "publications"). An applicant for the GRS(C) certificate is not restricted by any educational requirement as such, while those seeking the CG(C) certificate require only two points in the education category. As "minimum education" bestows one point, it is most probable that any serious genealogist has taken the steps to acquire a second such point. Applicants who are in doubt on this point should submit a detailed explanation of their genealogical "education" to enable the Institute to consider the case on its merits.

#### II -Recent Certification

Three persons have qualified as Certified Genealogists(Canada) since the last report, namely:

- 1. Edward V. Chafe, Nfld., certificate dated 1 March 1987.
- 2. Elsa H. Hochwald, Nfld., certificate dated 1 May 1987.
- 3.Philip Thorpe, Alta.& N.S., certificate dated 1 Nov.1987. In addition, three persons will be examined as C.G.(C) within the next few months, as well as two as G.R.S.(C). Of these five persons, three are Nova Scotia residents, and one each resides in P.E.I. and New Brunswick.

#### III - General Statistics

The Institute began operations in October 1983, and in four. years has had 50 preliminary applications, of which 47 have been approved to 1 November 1987. While 29 formal applications have been received, a further 18 are pending. Of the 29 applications that have gone forward, 2 have been withdrawn, 8 are in process and 19 have been approved.

New Brunswick . . . . . 12 (24%)

Prince Edward Island. . . 8 (16%)

Newfoundland/Labrador . . 3 (6%)



#### MY FAVORITE FAMILY STORY



#### The Horsman Family

I have researched my family history on my mother's side--the Horsman Family.

The first Horsman: Christopher came to New Brunswick to the Moncton area in 1775. I have also gone back further to Yorkshire, England, Ripon area and found Christopher's mother, father and his grandfather. All the early Horsmans lived in New Brunswick but after 1900 some of them decided to come west. My grandfather and family came in 1907 and my mother and father followed in 1908.

My grandfather's sod house was used as a stopping house and the Mounties (Royal North West Mounted Police in those days) often stopped with prisoners, usually horse thieves. One time they came with a whole family in a buckboard. The father was the criminal but the Mountie could not leave the wife and two small children alone on the homestead so he had to bring them in to Battleford as well as the father.

On another homesteader's farm was a very large deep lake. The young men of the district made a boat to use on the lake. It was named after two young ladies of the area, "The AGGIE-ABBIE." These two ladies are still living, one in the Senior Citizen Home in Unity and the other in Meadow Lake both well over ninety now.

Most of the homesteaders used oxen to drive and work. My uncle had a small black steer that he broke to ride. He used to ride all over the countryside on his little black steer.

Another horse thief, Wilson, operated in this area. He was captured by the Mounties. The party stopped to camp for the night and the mosquitoes were so bad one handcuff was unlocked. The prisoner got away and stampeded the Mounties' horses. Wilson escaped across the prairie, stole a horse from Bremners, stopped at Postlethwaite's threshing machine and filed off his handcuffs. He was away and was never recaptured.

St. Stephen and Machins or Machinsport are only a short distance from each other in New Brunswick and Maine respectively. One has to consider the possibility that all these Bibles may have a connection to one another. The following information was extracted from Sunadian Senous.



#### CALLING MCGOLDRICKS & McCANNS

This week we are looking for help from any McGoldricks or McCanns with connections in the Fermanagh-Tyrone area.

Mr. William H. Fowler has written to us from Redlands in the US looking for information on his McCann and McGoldrick ancestors, who came from this part of Ireland. His enquiries relate specifically to one John McGoldrick, b 19 Mar 1817 (1823?) or (1824?) in Co Tyrone. Mr. Fowler thinks John may have been related to a Denis McGoldrick b 1803 Co Fermanagh. John m Mary McCann b 26 Dec 1823 in either Fermanagh or Tyrone. Fowler believes she was the d of Patrick McCann b ca 1806 and Rose Ann (Rosey) b ca 1808. Unfortunately there is no record of her maiden name.

The McGoldricks emigrated during the famine years, the late 1840s, to Saint John, NB and later to Petersville and Enniskillen, Queens County, NB. Before they left Ireland, they had several children. A son Owen d in infancy 3 Jul 1845 bur in Tryone or Fermanagh. Other children born to them were Mary b ca 1825; Francis, b ca 1829; John b ca 1833 and Patrick b ca 25 June 1840 in Tyrone.

There are McGoldricks in Dromore still and McCanns live around Coa, Ballinamallard; Trillick, Fintona and Clogher who may be connections for Mr. Fowler. If anyone can help him they should write him: Mr. William H. Fowler, 23 Delores Court, Redlands, CA 92373, USA or contact the Impartial Reporter.

#### National Forum on Heraldry in Canada

Efforts being made to set up a Canadian Heraldic Authority are discussed in the following material supplied by John D. Blackwell, MA., chairman of the Coat of Arms committee of the Ontario Genealogical Society.

#### National Forum on Heraldry in Canada

On 26 March 1987, The Honourable David Crombie, Secretary of State of Canada, and Major Terence C. Manuel, President of The Heraldry Society of Canada, co-hosted a National Forum on Heraldry in Canada. This historic meeting took place amidst the Gothic splendour of the Centre Block on Parliament Hill in Ottawa. More than 75 delegates attended from all walks of Canadian life, including leading academics, members of the legal and medical professions, the military, ceremonial and protocol officers, Native People, federal and provincial officials, churchmen, artists, and representatives of many prominent organizations.

Among the invited guest speakers were two experts from Great Britain: Dr. Conrad Swan, York Herald at the College of Arms in London (Dr. Swan is the first Canadian-born British herald); and Mrs. C.G.W. Roads, Lyon Clerk and Keeper of the Records at the Court of the Lord Lyon in Edinburgh (Mrs. Roads is the first female British herald). They spoke with much eloquence about the heraldic traditions of England and Scotland respectively. Afterwards, many delegates raised concerns about particular aspects of Canadian heraldry.

Discussion focused on the need for the creation of a Canadian heraldic authority, independent of, but co-operating with heraldic authorities overseas. During the conference, it became apparent that Canadians must establish a multi-cultural heraldic authority, capable of acknowledging symbolic traditions from various parts of the world. Delegates observed as well that grants of arms require legislative protection in Canada. Numerous other recommendations resulted from this constructive deliberation.

#### Heraldry in Canada (cont'd)

Mr. John D. Blackwell, representing The Ontario Genealogical Society (Canada's largest and only armigerous family history association), presented a Brief to the Forum, stressing the importance of providing for "the registration of genealogical information in order to administer the lawful descent of arms in Canada." He went on to say that: "Genealogy has traditionally been the handmaid of Heraldry.... Therefore, it will be imperative for the Canadian Officer of Arms to be assisted by persons competent to judge the genealogical, historical and legal pitfalls of verifying a pedigree, using either Canadian or foreign documentation. This is a formidable and endlessly challenging task." In conclusion, Mr. Blackwell noted: "As a major repository of artistic and genealogical history, a Canadian heraldic authority could eventually become a great national treasure -- rivalling the vast collections of European counterparts. In this increasingly depersonalized age, the establishment of a Canadian heraldic authority would also help us all hold onto the things in our lives that make us individuals. We heartily applaud the vision of The Heraldry Society of Canada."

Delegates left the meeting greatly encouraged by the interest of the government and the progress being made in this significant endeavour. Editorial Transfer of genealogically-oriented material from the New Brunswick Museum to other centres in Saint John is continuing apace, throwing yet another road-block in the way of family history researchers, particularly those who come from considerable distances to look up New Brunswick ancestors.

> The Saint John Regional Library, now houses most of the Museum's micro-filmed newspaper files. It is the intention of Museum authorities to have the complete social history inventory in the Regional Library by next Spring.

According to a Museum announcement last August, the Provincial Archives in Fredericton and the LDS church library in West Saint John will have the following material:

> 19th century probate &marriage records Land petitions Customs House records Burial permits Church & cemetery records.

There is no indication so far which of these records are in Fredericton and which are in Saint John.

The August announcement also stated that the Ward Chipman Library and the Saint John Regional Library would receive post-1900 newspaper films while pre-1900 newspaper microfilms are included in the material going to the regional library.

It is now time Museum authorities produced and distributed a printed information guide. This would tell the interested public where each type of material is housed, the days and hours (summer & winter) it is accessible and the search costs involved, if any.
