In the Young Irish disorders, in Ireland in 1848 the following nine men were captured, tried, and convicted of treason against Her Majesty, the Queen, and were sentenced to death: John Mitchell, Morris Lyene, Pat Donahue, Thomas McGee, Charles Duffy, Thomas Meagher, Richard O'Gorman, Terrence McManus, Michael Ireland.

Before passing sentence, the judge asked if there was anything that anyone wished to say. Meagher, speaking for all, said:

"My lord, this is our first offense but not our last. If you will be easy with us this once, we promise, on our word as gentlemen, to try to do better next time. And next time—sure we won't be fools to get caught."

Thereupon the indignant judge sentenced them all to be hanged by the neck until dead and drawn and quartered. Passionate protest from all the world forced Queen Victoria to commute the sentence to transportation for life to far wild Australia.

In 1874, word reached the astounded Queen Victoria that the Sir Charles Duffy who had been elected Prime Minister of Australia was the same Charles Duffy who had been transported 25 years before. On the Queen's demand, the records of the rest of the transported men were revealed and this is what was uncovered:

GIDEON COREY, LOYALIST AND MAYFLOWER DESCENDANT

Four generations or more of Gideon Corey's paternal and maternal ancestors had lived in Rhode Island or surrounding area before the English -- American Revolutionary War. But Gideon caused the termination of his residency in Rhode Island by supporting the British during that fateful struggle. Consequently, in 1783, he found himself exiled to the soon to become Province of New Brunswick, arriving in Saint John with the Loyalist spring fleet, to establish a new existence. This article presents a review of results of our investigations on the life of Gideon Corey and his paternal ancestors.

A letter written by Gideon on 11 April 1783, to his half-brother, William Corey, North Kings Town, Rhode Island,³ is excerpted below.⁴ This letter, together with other reviewed information, documents that New Brunswick's Loyalist Gideon Corey is the same Gideon Corey who was the son of Mayflower descendant, Elizabeth Drake Corey. Her history is reviewed in the publication, *Mayflower Families Through Five Generations*.⁵

"I suppose you heard that E. Slocum and I were prisoners at Boston, by Benj. Baker, who informed us your Family were well; we sailed from Boston in a cartel on the 1st of April and arrived at Lloyd's Neck the 6th. I heard a few days since that Frank was well, I left brother Slocum and family well last Wednesday at Lloyd's Neck, they expect to sail for Saint Johns River within the course of the week as does myself. Frank I hear intends to go but whether with the first fleet I cannot tell; the King's proclamation declaring a cessation of arms by land and sea was read in this town last Tuesday; I would come and see you but have not the time before this fleet sails."

William Corey, Francis (Frank) Corey, and E. (Ebenezer) Slocum are also listed with Gideon in *Mayflower Families Through Five Generations*, giving

further support to the contention that Gideon Corey was descended from Mayflower passenger, William White.

Gideon, along with his sister Esther, her husband Ebenezer Slocum and four of their children, arrived in Saint John on 16 April 1783 aboard the Union Transport, according to the ship's passenger list.⁶ The ship had sailed from Huntington Bay, Long Island, on 11 April 1783 and is claimed to be the first of the Loyalist-bearing ships to arrive in Saint John.

Francis, Gideon's half-brother, also came to Saint John, but apparently not on the same ship. He died before 11 July 1795, in a drowning accident at the falls in Saint John.⁷ Half-brother, William, remained in Rhode Island. Also included on the ship's passenger list were Eleazer Slocum, claimed by Reicker to be Ebenezer's brother, and his wife and child.⁸

Gideon Corey was a military man, according to R. H. Corey.⁹ Recently it was reported that he was in the Loyal New Englanders, a small detachment of troops that campaigned against the New England revolutionaries.¹⁰ His brother-in-law, Ebenezer Slocum, of North Kings Town, Rhode Island, was a lieutenant in the same force.^{11, 12, 13}

Gideon Corey and Abigail Clark: Gideon, upon arriving in New Brunswick, married Abigail Clark, daughter of Elisha and Desire Gardner Clark, in 1783 or 1784. Abigail was born in Cornwallis, Nova Scotia, about 1766. Stanley Corey suggested that Gideon and Abigail were married before their departure from Rhode Island. This appears unlikely, since there is no indication of a wife in Gideon's letter or in the Union Transport passenger list. Gideon and Abigail's first child was born about 1785. By 1802 they had nine children with at least one more born after that year.¹⁴

When the Coreys moved to New Canaan, Gideon taught classes at night school, which indicates the importance he placed on education. Undoubtedly his teaching played an important part in shaping the future of his fellow New Canaan residents and their descendants. Indeed, at least three

of his grandchildren (He had a minimum of 45) held important positions requiring advanced education: Two became ordained ministers, and a third held stations in theological education in the United States after graduating from Acadia College.¹⁵

At the time that 26-year-old Gideon wrote the letter quoted above he showed a good command of the English language. The extent of his formal education is unknown, but there is a long history of interest in books among his forefathers. Gideon's great-great grandfather, Peregrine White,¹⁶ had received the book collection of William Basset, his father-in-law, in 1667. It was claimed to be the largest collection of books in Plymouth Colony at that time.¹⁷

Gideon Corey accumulated property following his arrival in New Brunswick. In 1784 he received a grant of land on the Saint John River in Hampstead Parish, Queens County. Probably he and his wife, Abigail, were living there when their children were born. Town lots were owned in Carleton (across from Saint John), granted in 1785, and Gagetown, granted in 1792. The Coreys moved from the Saint John River to a land grant in New Canaan by 1802.¹⁸ When Gideon wrote his will on 8 August 1823, he owned a farm in New Canaan, a farm on Washademoic Lake, and lots in back of Carleton.¹⁹

Gideon Corey, born on 21 or 24 March 1757 in North Kings Town, Rhode Island, died in New Canaan, New Brunswick, between 8 August 1823 and 8 January 1824. His wife, Abigail, died on 29 April 1849 at the age of 83. A monument to their memory, to that of their son, Gardner, and his wife, Elizabeth, stands in the old Baptist cemetery in New Canaan.

Children of Gideon Corey and Abigail Clarke were:

Elisha Clarke and Desire Gardner: The Clarke family, said to be earlier residents of Connecticut, moved to Cornwallis, Nova Scotia, and then to Gagetown, New Brunswick, about 1779, and lived there until 1784, when they were ousted from their land by Loyalists. They then moved to New Canaan where Elisha purchased property.^{22, 23}

Thomas Corey and Elizabeth Drake Corey: Gideon Corey's father, Thomas, married Elizabeth Drake Corey, b 1 March 1724/5 (all dates by old calendar²⁴), daughter of Captain John Drake and Mayflower descendant, Esther

John Corey and Elizabeth: John was granted land in East Greenwich, Rhode Island,²⁸ out of shares not taken up in May, 1679.²⁹ He married Elizabeth.³⁰ In 1686 John was a resident of Portsmouth, Rhode Island,³¹ and became a freeman that same year. In addition, he received ten acres of

land in East Greenwich. In April, 1705 he bought 90 acres of land in East Greenwich from Daniel and Mary Thurston of Newport for £40. He and Elizabeth sold 12 acres for £90 and another 50 acres for £350 in April, 1705. In October, 1707, John deeded to his son, William, for "love & c.", 90 acres, house and meadow, at East Greenwich. At this time both John and William were Portsmouth residents. But John must have moved from the island to Kings Town, Rhode Island, which is at the western mainland shore of Narragansett Bay, that same year. He was declared Deputy there in 1707.³² John died in 1712. Elizabeth died sometime after John's death.

William Corey and Mary Earle: John Corey's father was William Corey, a house carpenter and a miller by trade. He was granted 8 acres of land in Portsmouth, Rhode Island, in 1657 -- presumably following emigration from England.^{33, 34} He gained the status of freeman on 18 May 1658. He married Mary Earle, daughter of Ralph Earle and Joan Savage of Portsmouth, Rhode Island. William held a number of responsible public positions in Portsmouth between 1671 and 1680: jurymen, member of Indian court marshal, caretaker of gunpowder and guns, deputy holding offices of lieutenant and captain, successively. He and William Earle, his wife's brother, were given one acre of land on Briggs' Hill, Portsmouth, and one-quarter acre near the town pond, to have as long as they would maintain a windmill for the town's use. Three years after receiving the land, they exchanged with the town their two acres near the mill for two acres located elsewhere. In 1684 the former location became known as Windmill Hill.³⁵ William was involved in land transfers with William Earle in 1665 (Windmill Hill), 1668 (near the mill) and 1669 (one-third share of Dartmouth, Plymouth Colony³⁶).

Ralphe Earle and Joan Savage: Ralphe Earle (son of Raulphe) was baptized in St. Michael's Church, Bishop's Stortford, England (30 miles north by north-east of the center of London in Hertfordshire), on 9 February 1606. He married Joan, daughter of Richard Savage and Mary Isaak, on 29 June 1631. Joan was baptized in Widford Parish, Hertfordshire (6 miles south-west of Bishop's Stortford) in 1609/10. They and their children may have arrived in New England as early as 1633/34, but the first appearance of his name in the records was as a resident of Portsmouth, R. I. on 1 October 1638.³⁷ This settlement was primarily established by followers of Anne Hutchinson's teachings.³⁸ Many of these followers were of the Quaker faith. On 30 April 1639 Ralphe Earle and twenty-eight others signed a declaration of allegiance to his Majesty King Charles and bound themselves into a "civil body politicke, unto his laws according to matters of justice". In 1647 he was chosen to keep an inn, to sell beer and wine, and to entertain strangers. He was involved in numerous land sales, including land in Hartford, Connecticut. Between 1649 and 1671 he held a number of public service positions in Portsmouth, including treasurer, jurymen, overseer of the poor, captain of a troop of horse, Grand jurymen. Ralphe Earle's will was recorded on 14 January 1678. Joan Savage Earle died sometime after 15 Sept. 1699, being at least 93 years old at that time.

Richard Savage and Mary Isake:⁴⁰ Richard Savage married Mrs. Mary Isake on 14 January 1608/9. Richard was buried in Widford Parish on 5 May 1636, and his wife on 17 December 1637.⁴¹

Raulphe Earle and Margaret Browne: The Earles were traced by S. Miller through St. Michael's Church records in Bishop's Stortford, England.⁴² The first Earle entry in records dating from 1561 is the marriage of Raulphe Earll and Margaret, daughter of George Brown, on 25 August 1605. Margaret was baptized at St. Michael's Church in June, 1581, and was buried there on 27 November 1647. She may have been one of twin sisters. Raulphe was operating a shop on Basbowe Lane in Bishop's Stortford in 1642. He also lived on that street in 1642, which is a stone's throw distance from St. Michael's Church. Raulphe and Margaret Earle had ten children.

George Brown and Elizabeth Lawe:⁴³ George Browne was not born in Bishop's Stortford, but became a man of importance there. He and Elizabeth Lawe were married in Bishop's Stortford on 2 October 1580. He probably bought

a house, accompanying buildings, and land in Bishop's Stortford from Robert Perrye and his wife, Margaret, in 1594.

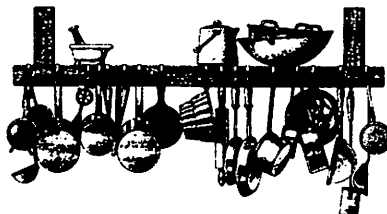

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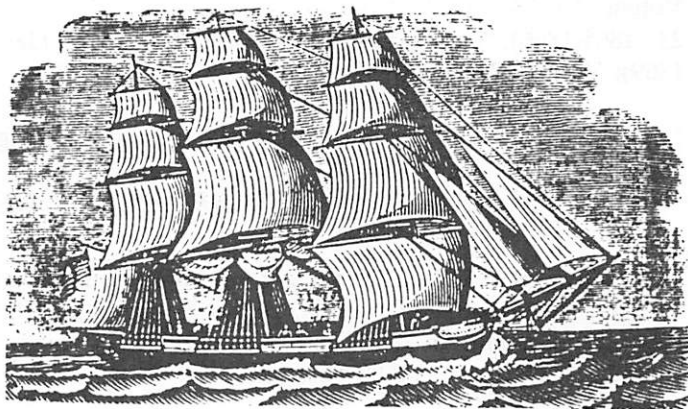

Age

Age at death is generally shown only for Type 1 entries and then only where stated on the epitaph. Otherwise a 'zero' appears in this column.

Fractional ages (eg. 18 years, 7 months) are clarified under 'Inscription'.

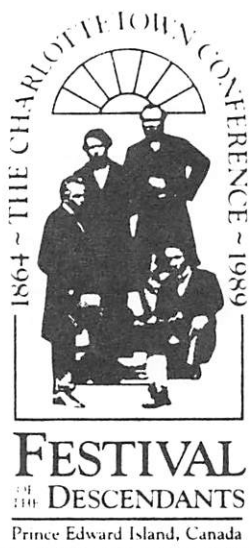

Editorial

CHANGES IN N.B.G.S.

Like most organizations these days, the New Brunswick Genealogical Society has been hit by higher postal rates and other increased charges. We have, reluctantly, found it necessary to increase our annual membership dues by \$5.00 for each of the three categories. The vast majority of our memberships become due on May 1 of each year, which is presently the beginning of our fiscal year.

Because we are changing our fiscal year to coincide with the calendar year--effective January 1, 1990--we are asking our members to pay a special membership fee of \$17.00 for the period from May 1, 1989 until December 31, 1989. After December 31, individual membership fees will be \$20.00 per year. At the same time, family and institutional memberships will increase to \$25.00 annually.

A few members have already paid dues beyond the May 1 date. These will be honored at the current rate and when the time comes for renewal, the new rates will apply.

We sincerely hope our membership will understand the reason for these increases and continue to support our Society and its aims.
