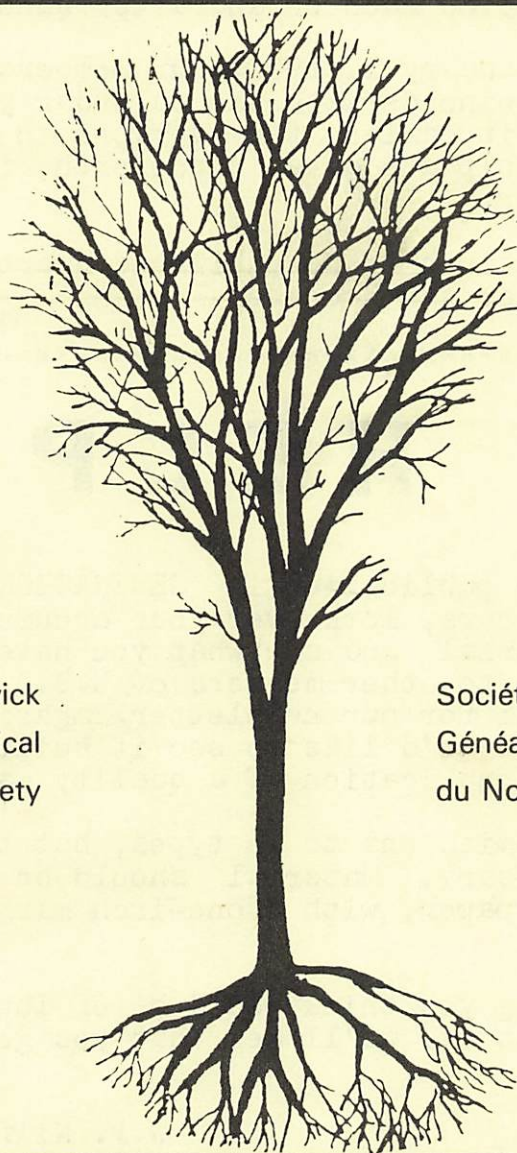

Generations

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26th (N.B.) BATTALION, C.E.F.

This famous World War I Battalion was formed in Saint John, New Brunswick in late 1914 and early 1915. It consisted mainly of recruits from Saint John, many parts of New Brunswick and from neighbouring Provinces.

Following mobilization, they were trained in Saint John to prepare for the many battles they would face in Europe. Their time in Saint John was relatively short.

At 11.30 A.M. on Sunday morning, June 13th the stalwarts of the Battalion sailed out of Saint John harbour aboard the Anchor Line steamer "S.S. Caledonia". The previous day, nearly 20,000 citizens had lined the route to see, to cheer and to bid farewell as their brave sons and husbands marched through the streets of the city on their way to the docks. Now, on this Sunday morning, by the time that the ship began to swing away from McLeod's wharf (now Pugsley Terminal), whistles throughout the City blared for over half an hour. The churches emptied of their congregations and the boys were given a tremendous send-off by the many thousands who lined almost every inch of the shores.

After a brief stay in England, the Battalion received its "baptism of fire" in France on 27th September 1915. Before long, they were being referred to as "The Fighting 26th" - a well-earned name for a Unit that fought with outstanding valour for the remainder of the War.

The following pages list those who sailed to Europe that Sunday morning 74 years ago - showing their Regimental numbers, Ranks, Names and Places of Residence.

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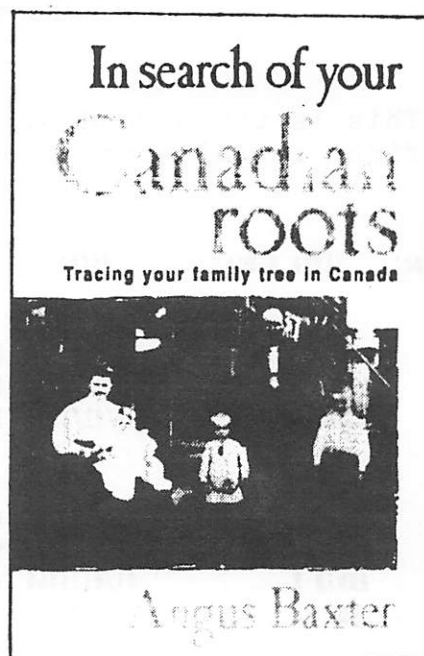
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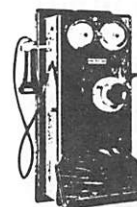


ABOUT THE AUTHOR

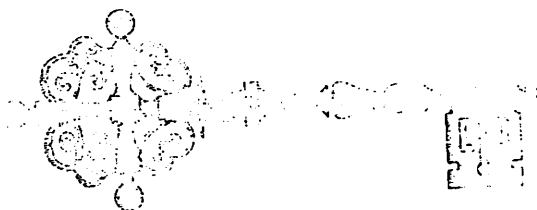

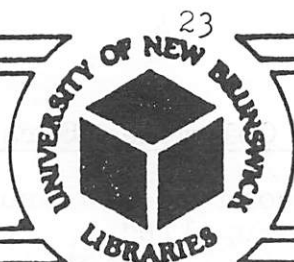

LOYALIST MICROFILM COLLECTION



HARRIET IRVING LIBRARY

The Harriet Irving Library at the University of New Brunswick in Fredericton, N.B. is a repository of Loyalist resources which is unique in Canada. The Loyalist Microfilm Collection is a special collection on microfilm of North American colonial and early Canadian primary sources from approximately 1760-1840. The chief focus is directed toward the American Revolution and the early years of Loyalist settlement.

The Collection was begun in the early 1970's by the Canadian Committee of the International Programme for Loyalist Studies and Publications. The Canada Council provided the financial support in this country. The University of London, the City University of New York, the American Antiquarian Society and the University of New Brunswick were the institutions involved in an international agreement to identify, list and microfilm all Loyalist primary sources in the three countries. The Canadian portion of the project ceased in 1976 and approximately 700 reels of microfilm were deposited in the UNB Library.

In 1982 the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada awarded the UNB Library a three year \$50,000 grant to expand both the Loyalist Microfilm Collection and the Library's resources which support Loyalist research. This grant was particularly timely as it coincided with the Bicentennial of the creation of New Brunswick in 1784 and the founding of the University of New Brunswick in 1785, both of which were a direct result of Loyalist settlement. The purchases made possible by the SSHRC grant have further confirmed the role of the UNB Library as the main Loyalist research centre in and for Canada.

At present the Loyalist Microfilm Collection contains approximately 2800 reels of microfilm and 650 microfiche. In addition, there are numerous finding aids to records in the Collection and to relevant primary sources in other repositories which have not been acquired on microfilm as yet. The Collection is arranged by five categories of material:

- Papers of Families and Individuals
- Societies and Special Collections
- Church Records and Registers
- Military Records
- Public Records

A general listing of the Collection is in progress, but, until it is finished, researchers should continue to use, A Bibliography of Loyalist Source Material in the United States, Canada and Great Britain. If possible, those planning to visit the UNB Library to use the Collection and related material should write or telephone in advance. Records of Rev. Edward F. Cutter, of Maine, now available. (1833-1856)

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GENEALOGY SOFTWARE

(A User's Evaluation of Two Computer Programs)

A genealogist who owns a computer, but hasn't considered acquiring a genealogy program, is missing a great opportunity. The immense amount of information that may be accumulated in the course of genealogical research can quickly become overwhelming. No matter how carefully family group sheets, pedigree charts, reference lists, and text files are arranged and maintained, the time always comes when a search for a certain piece of information ends in frustration. Inevitably, too, unsuspected connections remain hidden because the related data are kept in different notebooks, or the key records have been unwittingly separated by an arbitrary numbering or filing system.

Computer genealogy programs can't guarantee that every relationship will be detected, or that some obscure bit of information can be found effortlessly and instantaneously. But they can certainly help organize all that information and make it more accessible. In addition, good programs can extract the desired information from the files and print it out as pages fit for presentation-quality booklets. The following reflects the writer's experience with two such programs.

(1) PERSONAL ANCESTRAL FILE (PAF): For the genealogist contemplating acquisition of computer software, this program leads all others in one attractive feature - its low price. The obvious quality of the materials received for that price may, in fact, exceed the buyer's expectations. The manual comes in a boxed 8 1/2 x 9 inch three-ring binder more than 2 inches thick. When opened, the lower part of the binder folds back to form an easel that holds the manual upright for easy reference while working. The eight major sections of the manual are divided by heavy card stock pages listing the section contents and having color-coded index tabs on their edges. The program itself is furnished on three 5.25" floppy disks housed in a durable plastic sheath at the back of the binder. Even duplicate labels for backup copies of the main system disks (which should be made for all software programs) are provided.

My experience with this program suggests it may be best suited to the researcher who hasn't progressed too far with his genealogy or become too set in his working methods. The program automatically assigns a sequential Record Identification Number (RIN) to each name entered. From then on, the computer uses that number to locate and identify that individual's record. That's fine if you've never gotten around to doing it; but if you have already assigned individual ID numbers and don't want to change them, it could lead to frustration. The program has no provision for changing RIN numbers or entering them out of sequence.

Another peculiarity of the program is that every name must

be typed in twice. This insures that the spelling is correct and as intended, because if the two entries aren't exactly alike they won't be accepted by the program. This wouldn't pose any problem for a beginning genealogist, but when I acquired the program my index list had grown to more than 1,500 names. In the end, the prospect of typing in each of those names in duplicate proved too daunting.

Once your data is entered, the program provides a variety of ways to view it on the monitor screen or print it out. Printed forms and reports options include pedigree charts, family group records, individual entry forms, marriage entry forms, individual summaries, or descendants charts. Any of these may be printed as blank or completely filled-in forms. Unfortunately, pedigree charts are limited to four generations, starting with any individual. Descendants charts can handle up to ten generations. For printouts of an extensive genealogy in traditional format, these are simply not enough. Bearing in mind that the program was developed by and for the use of the LDS church and is primarily geared to their requirements, it is still a remarkable value for its price, despite its limitations.

(2) FAMILY ROOTS: After seeing the impressive documentation for the preceding software, the initial reaction to the Family Roots manual might be one of doubt. The full-size white three-ring binder emblazoned with the logo and title is eye-catching enough, but opening it reveals some 140 pages that look like they were typewritten and reproduced on a photocopier. A modification of an old adage about not judging a book by its cover is appropriate here, however. In this case, the viewer should not be misled by the plain appearance of the inside pages. The information on those pages and what the program can do are what count, and that turns out to be a great deal, indeed.

Family Roots comes on three 5.25" floppy disks labeled Main Programs, Auxiliary Programs, and Utilities, respectively. Duplicate labels are provided for backups, which you are wisely urged to make before starting work. Then you follow a series of clear instructions to configure the program to your computer and your needs. With that done, you can get down to some serious and highly productive work.

If any single word best describes this program, that word is flexibility. The genealogist is offered the option of using the program's built-in Record Number (RN) identity system alone, or may also enter a personal numbering system in a user defined

field. The latter may be any combination of letters, numbers, and punctuation, including hyphens, slashes, parentheses, and so on. Through the program's Manager module, more than 200 parameters can be set. These adjust such diverse things as the maximum number of generations, the order in which data fields appear, margin widths, whether source citations are included, print size, last or first name first, or whether married or maiden names appear in printouts. Function keys can be programmed so repeated entry of place names or other lengthy data strings can be done with a single key press.

Individuals are entered into the file by typing last or maiden, first, and married names (if any). If spelling or other errors are detected later, any part of the entry can be edited as desired. The program assigns ID numbers sequentially and keeps track of the next available number, or the user may specify the next number. Spouses, parents, or children of any person can be specified by entering only their ID numbers, and the program then automatically "complements" or connects the records of every individual involved. This can lead to startling discoveries of previously unsuspected family connections.

The program's versatility extends to the wide choice of printout formats. Options include Cascade or standard pedigree charts with or without overlay, 4 or 5 generations per page, compressed (Ahnentafel) pedigree charts with or without lines between generations, individual data sheets, family group sheets in either wide or narrow format, with or without appended notes and/or source citations, and descendant charts in either page length or continuous form. The user can create text files with a word processor, store them in the Family Roots program, and have them automatically appended to the appropriate group sheets during printout.

Searches can be conducted for specific names or ID numbers, dates between two years, a year between two dates, months and days, or for empty fields. Screen traces can be run which proceed either upwards or downwards from any individual, through their parents, spouses, or children. Index lists, sorted either numerically or alphabetically, can be generated and may include columns showing family group or page numbers, birth dates, or data from other fields in the individual records.

In short, this is an immensely versatile program which should satisfy the needs of either beginning or experienced genealogists.

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"WHAT DO YOU MEAN, YOU'RE MY FIRST COUSIN ONCE REMOVED?"

I will never forget the day I was told that my grandmother was my mother's mother. That was something I would have to get used to. It did, however, spark my interest, and upon further inquiry I found that Nana was my father's mother. I also discovered that my grandfathers had similar relationships to Mom and Dad. This bit of information opened up a whole new world to me. At relatives' weddings and funerals, people would walk up to me, state their names, and ask me how we were related. "You are my first cousin once removed," I'd reply. It took several of these various get-togethers for me to realize that my first cousins once removed had not the slightest idea what I was talking about. The first cousins twice removed wouldn't even speak to me for fear that I would try to explain it to them.

It is simple, really! One must be in exactly the same generation as another in order to be a first, second, third, etc., cousin. If one refers to the relationship between himself and a cousin in another generation, then the number of generations between them must be removed. Hence the term once or twice, etc., removed. Let's say that John and Jane are the parents of two daughters, Pat and Nancy. Of course Pat and Nancy are sisters. Now let's say that Pat has a child, Bob, and Nancy has a child, Joe. Bob and Joe are first cousins. They are in the same generation and their mothers are sisters. Let's go on another generation. Bob's child, Mary, and Joe's child, Joan, are second cousins. Again, they are in the same generation. Remember those first cousins Bob and Joe? The relationship between Bob and Joan (the daughter of his first cousin, Joe) is first cousin once removed. They are not in the same generation and there is one generation between them. Now, if you are not completely confused, go back to those second cousins, Mary and Joan. Mary has a daughter, Dot. Joan has no children, so Dot has no third cousin. Dot's relationship to Joe is first cousin twice removed. Joe's first cousin is Dot's grandfather and there are two generations between them.

Now, keeping in mind that Dot's mother and Joan are second cousins - the relationship between Dot and Joan is second cousins once removed.

Are you ready for something even more simple? It is improper to refer to an aunt or uncle as great-aunt or great-uncle, although it is a very popular term. For the sake of less confusion I will discuss only aunts. The same rule will, of course, apply to uncles. Our aunts are our father's sisters and our mother's sisters. Those ladies that we so ~~incorrectly~~ call great-aunt are the sisters of our grand-parents. The truth of the matter is that the aunts in that generation are our grandaunts, just as we say GRAND-father and GRANDmother. The aunts who are in the same generation as our great-grand-parents are our great-grandaunts, and so on.

With the divorce rate being what it is, I feel it is important to discuss brothers and sisters. If two boys have the same mother and father they are brothers. If they share one common parent they are half brothers. If both are the product of former marriages and share neither mother nor father they are stepbrothers. Therefore it is entirely possible to have brothers, half brothers, and stepbrothers in the same family. The same rules apply to sisters, half-sisters, and stepsisters. Of course adoption can change half brother and stepbrother status.

A sister-in-law can be your husband's sister or your wife's sister or your brother's wife. Did you know that your husband's brother's wife is also your sister-in-law? So is your wife's brother's wife. You probably introduced them as sisters-in-law, anyway. I just thought it might be interesting to note that, according to Webster, Thorndike Barnhart and Dear Abby, that's what they really are. Therefore your brothers-in-law are your husband's brother, your wife's brother, your sister's husband, and your wife's sister's husband.

If John Q. Smith names his son John Q. Smith, they may be referred to as Senior and Junior. If little John's middle name is different, he is not Junior. If little John was named after his grandfather who was John Q. Smith, then he may be referred to as John Q. Smith II. Grandfather would be John Q. Smith I.

Shall we go on now to "kissing cousins"? No, I think that's another story.

THE GUILD OF ONE-NAME STUDIES

The Guild of One-Name Studies is an organization of people in various countries who research their own family name and collect various records and references pertaining to that surname. Most of the members have done extensive research on their surname. A great many of the members publish a family journal or newsletter to which interested persons may subscribe. All members should reply to a query especially if an SAE is enclosed.

On the formation of the guild in 1979, a registrar, was appointed to maintain the register and to publish updated versions from time to time.

THE REGISTER OF ONE-NAME STUDIES

In 1975, at the request of the Federation of Family History Societies, in London, England, a card index of genealogists with particular interests in specific surnames was started. In 1977 the card index was published as THE REGISTER OF ONE-NAME STUDIES.

The main purpose of the register is to enable individuals who are specialising in researching specific surnames to have their interests on record. Only one person can register a given surname although membership in the guild is not limited to those who have registered.

The register contains names of societies, family associations and individuals who are interested in all references to a specific surname and its variants. Some of the family organizations or societies have elected officers, hold periodic meetings and issue a regular newsletter or other publications relating to the surname registered.

A contact with registrants can result in receiving helpful information as very often they have considerable information at their disposal.

The register is in three parts. The first consists of a list of all the registered surnames arranged in alphabetical order. The second part lists the names and addresses of all the members in numerical order as well as the surnames being studied. The third part has the members' names listed in alphabetical order with membership numbers.

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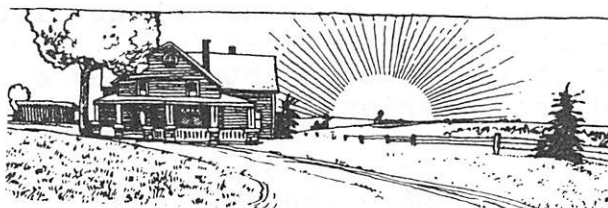

A California member, Mr James Townsend, has provided NBGS with a copy of his third communication with Ancestry Inc., of Box 476, Salt Lake City, Utah. In part, Mr Townsend's letter reads as follows:

"My original letter of November 25 was accompanied by my check number 119 for \$42.20 and it ordered the following:

1. Ancestry Research Club membership	\$24.95
1. Irish Records, by James Ryan 14.00 (member price in flyer)	14.00
1. Shipping, handling and Insurance	3.25
Total	\$42.20

"You shipped and I received the Ryan book in early December. You raised the price from the 14.00 in the printed flyer to 24.95, but shipped the book without consulting me as to whether I would pay the higher price".

At the time of writing (January 8, 1989) Mr Townsend was holding the book, awaiting return of his check. Despite instructions from Ancestry Inc. to UPS (United Parcel Service), to retrieve the book. In this regard Mr Townsend wrote: "... You will not get the book until you send me the refund check which will include the postage and handling I originally paid, for a total of \$42.20 . Send me the check for the full refund by return mail."

Mr Townsend feels the development is totally unacceptable and has asked that his membership (in Ancestry Research Club) be cancelled and his name deleted from all mailing lists immediately. His parting shot: "I plan to avoid dealing with this company in the future".

KIERSTEAD MOUNTAIN BAPTIST CEMETERY

by John R. Elliott and Daniel F. Johnson

On August 1st, 1988, the following transcriptions were taken from the Baptist Cemetery on Kierstead Mountain, Studholm Parish, Kings County. Many stones were broken in two or more pieces. In certain instances, new gravestones have been recently erected to replace older stones that have been lost or where inscriptions have eroded to a state of illegibility. In these cases [new stone] identifies the modern stone. The transcriptions appear in the same order as they were taken in the cemetery. 101 stones survive.

In 1954, Mrs. Fred Kierstead of Norton visited this cemetery and counted 43 gravestones. She recorded some of the stones and made notes in parenthesis from her knowledge of individuals buried there. Her work was donated to the New Brunswick Museum, Douglas Ave., Saint John and was among the the epitaph collections transferred to the Saint John Free Public Library, Market Square, Saint John in the fall of 1987. Her work has been included as footnotes to the present day transcriptions.

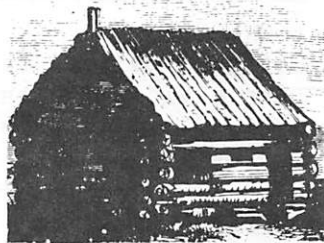

ABANDONED PRIVATE CEMETERY

Situated on the Parleeville Road about one mile from its junction with the main road from Apohaqui to Lower Millstream, Kings County, this private cemetery is completely hidden from sight. A LITTLE IRISH GEOGRAPHY & PLACENAMES

Ireland is politically divided into two countries, Northern and Southern Ireland. Northern Ireland which is the old province of Ulster, is composed of 6 counties, Londonderry (called by the Irish Derry), Antrim, Tyrone, Fermanagh, Armagh, and Down. The Republic of Ireland or Eire, commonly called Southern Ireland is composed of 3 provinces, Connacht, Leinster and Munster, in which are 26 counties, Donegal, Monaghan, Sligo, Leitrim, Cavan, Louth, Mayo, Roscommon, Longford, Westmeath, Meath, Galway, Offaly, Kildare, Dublin, Clare, Laois (formerly King's County), Wicklow, Limerick, Tipperary, Kilkenny, Carlow, Wexford, Kerry, Cork and Waterford. As well as cities, towns and villages which are large enough to be found on a regular map, there are townlands which are small geographical units in rural areas. They are listed on the postal address but may be hard to find without an ordinance map or special book listing them. It could be a townland that an ancestor gave as his home address and which you cannot locate. Parish names usually given are those of the Church of Ireland which was the established church until 1828 under British rule. Roman Catholic parishes do not exactly coincide.

The following from "Ireland of the Welcomes" explains the meaning of some of the Gaelic placenames.

Irish placenames in English generally preserve the obvious meanings of their elements. Eyrecourt was the seat of a family of Eyre. Placenames of obvious Norse origin (like Strangford, Carlingford and Wexford on the east coast which incorporate the Norse 'fjord') are not to be found on the Galway coast, heavily defended by nature against the sea-rovers from Scandinavia. We give here a table of the more common beginnings and endings of placenames of Irish-language origin.

QUEENSLAND, AUSTRALIA, ARCHIVESPUBLIC RECORDS RESOURCE KIT

The Queensland State Archives has produced a Public Records Resource Kit which will potentially enable access to these and other records for the whole of Queensland and even Australia.

The kit consists of rolls of microfilm, microfiche, handbooks and leaflets. At present the Kit includes copies of Queensland immigrant ship passenger lists and some crew lists together with the most useful aid of all, a card index to immigrants from Europe, the United Kingdom and Ireland. This index is arranged alphabetically by surname and was specifically devised by the archives staff so that researchers can easily find the surname of the person they are seeking.

Without this index, the researcher would have to know either the exact year or vessel in which a person arrived or else plough through some 18 reels of microfilm - not a pleasant or easy task!

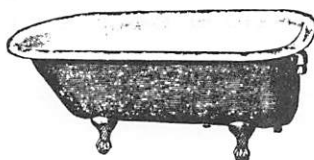
These records represent the first part of a projected series that will gradually make this kind of important records more freely available to the general public. The kit will ensure that precious archival documents remain in protective care at the Queensland State Archives while still being accessible to large numbers of people via the magic of microfilm.

GENERATIONS 10 is a volume containing the material published in the first ten issues of our newsletter. In those early days, the newsletter didn't even have a name; in fact it didn't have a cover until Issue #7. The publication officially became "GENERATIONS" at our 1983 annual meeting.

This anniversary volume should be of particular interest to new members of N.B.G.S. and others interested in the material published in those early newsletters. Our first newsletter editor, as many will recall, was Eugene Campbell, widely-known Oromocto writer/newspaperman and historian. Their work helped establish an important element in the growth and development of the New Brunswick Genealogical Society, especially for those members who live hundreds and even thousands of miles from our Province and who depend, to some degree, on GENERATIONS as a means of providing genealogical information, sources and leads.
