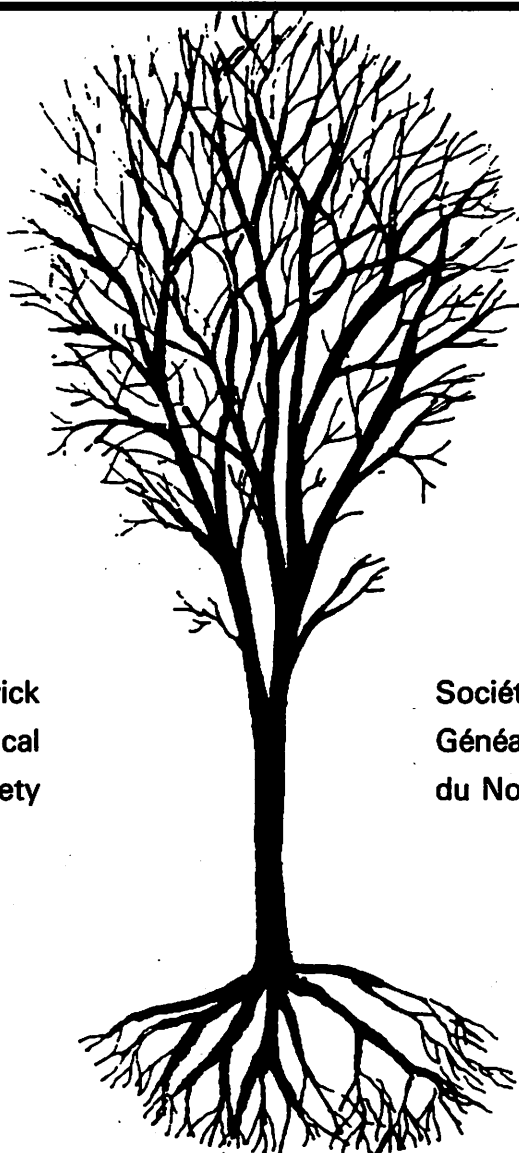

GENERATIONS 1 & 2

1. John Stilwell is said to have been born 15 September 1737, supposedly s/o Daniel & Catherine (Johnson) Stillwell who lived in the King's County, New York area. It is also said he married (1) Sophia Sommers of Cape May, and took up residence in the Tuscorora valley of Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, where he was loyal to Britain during the revolution. He, and perhaps several of his family, went to New Brunswick in 1783 aboard the ship Aurora. It is said one "l" was dropped from the last name to distinguish those of the family who were not supporting the rebel cause. He married (2) Sarah Kibler, almost certainly d/o David Kibler, a Loyalist who died intestate before 15 August 1788 at Hampstead, Queens County, New Brunswick. He m. (3) Mehitabel \_\_\_\_\_. John himself died in 1823, with the following supposed issue, i-v by (1), remainder by (2):

2. David<sup>1</sup> Stilwell (John<sup>1</sup>) b. in New Brunswick 1790, died presumably in Middleton Township, Norfolk County, Ontario 1868. He m. (1) 17 Sept. 1812 at Queens County, New Brunswick, Rebecca Elsworth, b. in New Brunswick ca. 24 Feb. 1794, d/o William & Mehitabel (McMahon) Elsworth. William died in June, 1835 at Waterborough, Queens County, N.B. In 1836 the family left New Brunswick with 9 of their 11 children, and went to Port Burwell, Ontario. Rebecca died 26 July 1836, just before the boat arrived, and was/is buried in the Old Eden Cemetery, Lot 23 Concession 8, Bayham Township, Elgin County.

David made his way up the old plank road, now Highway 19, and took up land in Middleton near the western end of what is now known as the Goshen Road. He married (2) Margaret Vincent, the mother of Eleanor Vincent who married his son Benjamin. She is probably the sister Margaret Stilwell of Middleton, bap. at Eden 6 Feb. 1855.

He was active in the Eden Baptist church, otherwise known as the "2nd Regular Baptist Church of Bayham". On its 3rd meeting 13 Jan. 1849, it was voted to invite him to take part in business, and on 19 April 1850 it was "resolved that Deacon David Stilwell be requested to assist in the business of the next church meeting." A letter of 12 May 1852 certified that he "was a member in good standing in the Regular baptist church of Christ at Fredericksburg (now Delhi) and as such we cheerfully recommend to any other church of the same faith and order." On 13 April 1854 a charge was brought against him for "Publicly slandering and falsely ( ? ) the church" and he was apparently excluded as a result. This was only temporary for on 10 July 1858 his son William was appointed assistant deacon to assist him.

13. xi. Jane, b. 1834, d. 1908, poss. the Jane of Middleton bap. at Eden 6 Feb. 1855 or the Jane of Bayham bap. same date. On 17 April 1855 the case of Jane Stilwell of Vienna brought up. A letter received from her acknowledged past errors & asked pardon of all & that she was going away. At this time Margaret Stilwell of Vienna asked for letter as she was going away.

3rd GENERATION

3. Nicholas<sup>3</sup> Stilwell (David<sup>2</sup> John<sup>1</sup>) b. in New Brunswick, 1813, d. there in 1876. He m. Eliza Jane Glasgow. Nicholas was a sea captain residing in St. John. Issue Stilwell:

5. William<sup>3</sup> Stilwell (David<sup>2</sup> John<sup>1</sup>) b. ca. July 1817 in New Brunswick, the eldest of the 9 children who emigrated with their parents to Ontario. He d. 22 April 1897 aged 79 years 9 months. William m. 26 Jan. 1841, Christiana Ostrander, b. in Bayham Township, Ontario 12 July ? 1822, d. 15 Sept. 1909 aged 87 years, 2 months, 3 days, d/o Andrew & Sarah (Buchner) Ostrander. William farmed near his father.

He was a Captain of the militia during the rebellion of 1837, and was known as a very saintly man. He & Christiana were received into the Eden Baptist church and baptized, 8 June 1851. William was very active in its affairs, serving as deacon and church clerk at various times. On 7 July 1855 it was resolved that "Brother William Stilwell take legal steps of labour with Elder Conrad to effect a reconciliation between them." On 7 May 1859 he was appointed church clerk again. On 16 July 1878 difficulties existed between him and Elder Haycock when the latter complained that William had "reported slanderous falsehoods about him to the injury of his character" and resigned. On 13 August it was determined that remarks to his nephew, Selkirk Stilwell, were blown out of proportion and William apologized.

Both he and Christiana are buried in the Eden Cemetery next to the Baptist church where the family was active. Issue Stilwell b. near Eden:

7. Israel<sup>3</sup> Stilwell (David<sup>2</sup> John<sup>1</sup>) b. ca. 1822 in New Brunswick, d. at or near Eden, Ontario 8 Feb. 1899 aged 76. He was an overseer of the plank road from Port Burwell to Ingersoll. He built the first hotel and store in Eden, and took part as a member of the Elgin Volunteers in protecting the Detroit River area during the rebellion of 1837. Israel was a Baptist and is buried in the Eden Cemetery. On 18 Sept 1877 he was offered the old Baptist church building 1/2 mile east of Eden for the sum of \$40 with the church reserving the fence. He m. in 1843, Sarah Ostrander, b. ca. 1825, d/o Asa Ostrander of Eden and cousin of Christianna. He was baptized at Eden 24 Feb. 1882, she the same date or the 28th. She d. 7 March 1908 in her 84th year with burial at Eden. Issue Stilwell:

8. John<sup>3</sup> Stilwell (David<sup>2</sup> John<sup>1</sup>) b. 1823 in New Brunswick, d. 1900 at or near Eden, Ontario. (Tombstone says 1825-1900, and as Israel's dates are off by 2 years, it's probable that the birthdates on p. 2 are in some cases in error.) He m. 11 May 1849, Mary Buchner of Bayham, b. 1829, d. shortly before 22 Feb. 1917 at the home of her daughter in Goshen. John farmed adjacent to his father. During the latter part of his life he became totally blind, his wife deaf. Both buried at Eden. Issue Stilwell:

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## Genealogical Notes

**Noted Maritime Historian** Esther Clark Wright died at her home in Wolfville, N.S. on Sunday, June 17th, 1990 at age 95. Her publications included "The Loyalists of New Brunswick", "The Steeves Descendants", "The River St. John & Its Tributaries", "Planters And Pioneers of Nova Scotia 1749-1775" and "Blomindon Rose".

We extract the following from her obituary which appeared in "The Evening Times-Globe", Saint John, N.B. June 19th, 1990, page A14: Born at Fredericton, she was the daughter of the late William George and Harriet Hannah (Richardson) Clark. Her father was New Brunswick's lieutenant governor from 1940 to 1945. She graduated from Acadia University in 1916, studied at Toronto and Oxford Universities and received her doctorate from Radcliffe and Harvard Universities in 1931. She was awarded honorary degrees by Acadia and Dalhousie Universities and the University of New Brunswick. From 1943 to 1947 she served as lecturer in economics and sociology at Acadia University. She received the Silver Jubilee Medal in 1978 and the Order of Canada in 1990. Acadia University named its university archives in her honor and the students named the Chase Court Lounge for her. She was a member of the Wolfville United Baptist Church, a life member of the Canadian Bible Society and charter member of the Wolfville Historical Society. She is survived by her husband, Dr. Conrad Payling Wright, one brother Alden, two nephews and a niece. Interment will be at Fredericton."

**Researching Scots-Irish Ancestry** will be the topic of a presentation by guest lecturer, Robert C. Starratt, Family History Consultant, at the Saint John Regional Library, One Market Square, Saint John to be held at 7 o'clock p.m., Tuesday, October 9th, 1990. The talk is co-sponsored by the New Brunswick Genealogical Society and Saint John Regional Library. Robert C. Starratt presently resides in Edinburgh, Scotland. Mr. Starratt interests include 17th Century Scottish and Ulster Scot family and local history, including Scottish migration to Ulster and North America. Those planning to attend should arrive early as facilities will allow only a maximum of 85 persons.

**A great success** was just one of the many favorable comments regarding the seminar recently held by the South Eastern Branch, N.B.G.S. Over 80 registered attenders listened to the eleven speakers in Moncton. The temporary research room containing local published and unpublished genealogical material proved very popular to out-of-town guests and was in constant use from quarter to 8 a.m. until 10 o'clock p.m.

# Index to Vital Statistics Entries in the Richibucto Review

The Review was a small weekly newspaper, published in Richibucto, New Brunswick from 1889 to 1911. In addition to national, international and provincial news; serialized fiction (including Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's first Sherlock Holmes story, "A Study in Scarlet"); and patent medicine ads, the Review ran a series of "Notes" contributed by it's readers, regarding the doings in various small communities in Kent County, as well as a number of New England settlements with significant populations of Kent County natives. Obituaries, wedding notices and birth announcements were also a feature in the Review. These, together with the aforementioned "Notes", provide a rich source for the genealogist. The following is a reference to the vital statistics entries in the Review covering the period between 1900 and 1905. Only the briefest information for each entry has been transcribed, as this is not meant to be a source in itself, but rather a guide to the original writings in the Review. The Review is on microfilm at the Harriet Irving Library, U.N.B., Fredericton.

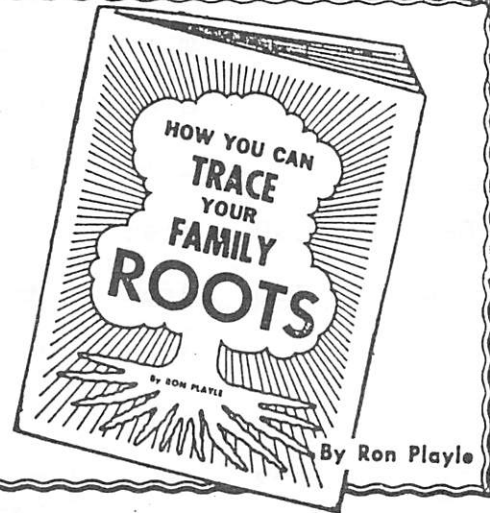

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## 1990 SEELY REUNION

LONDONDERRY N B JULY 22

July 21, 1990 was a sunny, hot, humid day in Kingston N B, as 250 members of the Seely Family gathered at the MacDonald Consolidated School.

At the registration desk they were greeted by Cathryn Ward, Ben Fanjoy, and Lorrie Fox. Shawn and Jennifer Seely were on hand to sell hand made "Seely" coat of arms plaques and pewter lapel pins.

The reunion had a gold "Time Box" on hand for each person to drop a memento in. This box will be opened at the next major reunion. (2000 AD?)

C G (Hap) Ward, Ron Seely, and Denis Seely were on hand to provide research into the family. A special room was provided to receive updated family history and receive donations to the printing of "The Seelys of New Brunswick", a book on the family which will be printed by December 1991.

Robert Seely and Harold Fanjoy acted as custodians of the Seely Archives. Hundreds of books, family history charts, photos, maps, original documents, and other artifacts were on display for all to see.

At 1 PM the clan gathered in the Music Theater for the official ceremonies. Reunion chairman Harold Fanjoy welcomed everyone and related that chairing a reunion was like an adoption agency--Everyone looking for their lost cousin.

At this time we all realized that his son Ben, Vernon Seely and D M Seely were trapped in the elevator. It took close to two hours before they were able to be freed, and they had missed the ceremonies; mind you, many Seelys were involved in their rescue.

Rev. John Matheson of the Kingston Anglican Parish expressed greetings to the Clan, stating that Seth Seely UEL was one of the first vestrymen of the Kingston Trinity Church. He read the minutes of the first session in which the clerk, Mr Hoyt, had spelled the name Seth Seely. Rev. Matheson had called the clan together for prayers in celebration of the 1990 Reunion.

New Brunswick was blessed by the special visit of Marshall B Seelye of the State of New York USA. Marshall is the president of the "SEELEY GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY". In his remarks to the clan he stressed that there are no borders when it comes to the Seely clan and that the Seely reunion 1990 was very special to him and his wife. He has provided the chairman with application forms for the Society. He also emphasized that the Society will host a reunion of the Seelys in 1992 in Connecticut USA, the home of Robert Seely (1630). This should be a great reunion for any descendents of Robert Seely.

C.G. (Hap) Ward, who is one of the key organizers in the book "The Seelys of New Brunswick" had stressed the importance of receiving up to date and accurate information for the book.

Everything is under way, and the deadline for input to the book is July, 1991. Please send in your photos, family recipes, maps, documents, and any interesting stories about the family.

Consideration is being given to a "Seelys of N B" newsletter. We are looking for individuals from all over N B to act as a board of directors to help in the collection of data and in submitting articles for the newsletter.

Chairman Harold Fanjoy stated that the book "The Seelys of New Brunswick" is guaranteed. Over two thousand five hundred dollars has been received from individuals acting as sponsors for the book. Funding is pretty well assured, and the pre-sale of the book will continue until July 1991.

The families present were introduced with representatives from Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Ontario, P.E.I., N.S., and N.B. The United States were well represented with people from Maine, New York, Minnesota, Tennessee, and Massachusetts. Chairman Fanjoy brought greetings from relatives in Japan, New Zealand and Scotland.

Members of All Saints Church of Clifton Royal were on hand to provide the canteen services all day as well as to provide a family supper of homemade beans and weiners, ham, and potato scallop. They worked very hard and the meal was delicious. On behalf of the Seely reunion a 300.00 dollar donation was made to the church.

A photo copier was made available by the school board..Paper was supplied by the reunion committee.

The John Fisher Memorial Museum, in the basement of the school, was open and available for viewing of some local family histories, and artifacts for sale. Tickets for a quilt by the All Saints Church was on sale.

Mrs Emelie Seely Sullivan of Massachusetts played the Piano and led a sing-a-long. Directions for travel to Londonderry N B was provided by Capt. Dennis Seely of St Martins.

W. Errol Seely, Treasurer, was on hand to make sure that funds were available to put on a great reunion. While the Gym activities were not organized, the kids were active and had a lot of fun.

The photo session took place in the music room, but unfortunately the 85 degree very humid surroundings, along with the rescue operations at the elevator curtailed the picture taking.

The Eldest Seely member attending was Mrs Marguerite Morrissey of Saint John N B. She was born 8 Dec 1890, and is therefore in her 100th Year. She is a descendent of Ebenezer Seely, UEL.

Kopy Kats, a Saint John printing and copying service, were a sponser in that they provided, on spec, \$700.00 in printing cost, and The Seely Family Tree fund advanced \$600.00 in mailing costs. All expenses have been paid and finalized.

Many long lost cousins were brought into the fold.

Neil Seely of Amherst closed the event by recognizing the efforts of Harold (Seely) Fanjoy and his committee for putting on the 1990 Seely reunion.

Saturdays activities concluded at 5.00 PM.

The Seely Reunion continued the following day, Sunday, 22 July, at 2.30 PM at Londonderry N B. Some eight miles from the nearest habitation in the back woods of Kings County was a settlement established in 1840-50. Our clan of Seelys had settled in this community and were very active in the church.

Walter A Seely was on hand for the establishment of St Paul's Anglican Church in 1852, and Walter B Seely was on hand for the closing of regular church services in 1922.

Since then the community of Londonderry has become a ghost town, with no one living within eight miles of the church; but faith draws people together, and once a year St Paul's Anglican Church (Londonderry) holds a special church service. This year the service was held at the same time as our Seely reunion.

Dry weather, dusty roads into this remote part of Kings County...It has to take some special faith, some special loyalty, or some special desire to research your heritage in that part of the country.

Over four hundred people joined the Right Reverend George (Seely) Lemon, Bishop of the Diocese of Fredericton, and Rev Alfred Morris in the Memorial Service. It had a special touch and you had to be there to feel the spirit. The historic church was opened for inspection. The Seely Reunion Committee served cakes and soda pop to the guests. On behalf of the Seely Reunion 1990, a donation of one hundred dollars was made for the preservation of this historic church.

There is a sincere interest in holding reunions more frequently and I think that on a smaller scale this is true. However, the objective is to hold the next MAJOR Seely reunion in (maybe?) 2,000 AD. Volunteers for chairperson of the next reunion required.

The Craigs & the Royal Highland Emigrants  
(84th Regiment)  
Quest for the Colours

---

Having established through research that my great, great, great Grandfather, John Craig, served in the 84th Regiment (Royal Highland Emigrants) during the Revolutionary War, I have become over the past several years, quite interested in the Regiment's history.

During the cold Nova Scotia winter of 1989/90, I was introduced to several members of the 84th Regiment Association in Halifax. The group is associated with sister groups in Quebec, Ontario and Michigan. One of the Nova Scotia active members is Kerry DeLorey (Pvt) of Precision Photographic Services Ltd., 6220 Quinpool Rd., Halifax, who volunteered, along with three other members of the Association, to appear in full Highland Regimental dress, to add colour, atmosphere and backup for my illustrated talk on the Regiment and "Craigs" at the February 1990 meeting of the N.S. Genealogical Association. I was so impressed by the interest and dedication of Kerry and his 'confreres' that I not only "joined up", but was convinced that I should try to obtain photos in Scotland for the Association. I was to be in the area of the Isle of Mull in late March 1990, and despite previous efforts by Association members to obtain photos of the sealed Regimental Colours, I agreed that I would try to gain entry (legally) to TORLOISK HOUSE to photograph same.

After a week and a half in the U.K, and attending a security conference and touring the Scotch Whisky Heritage Centre, researching at the Scottish Records Office in Edinburgh, and touring three distilleries and untold numbers of very moving historical locations, my wife Barb and I travelled through Culloden, Inverness, Fort William, Fort Augustus and on to Oban and the ferry to the Isle of Mull. We landed 50 minutes later at CRAIGNURE and saw DUART CASTLE, presently owned by the Chief of the Clan MacLean. It was not possible to be admitted inside DUART, nor to see the miniature of the 84th Regiment Commander (1775-1783), Col. Alan MacLean.

After an overnight stay at a very beautiful little island town called TOBERMORY, we made contact with Torloisk House with the aid of the local constabulary, and visited there for an hour on 27 March 1990. Torloisk House was the family home of Col. Alan MacLean and it was here, after the war,


that he gave the colours of the 84th "Royal Highland Emigrants" to Marianne MacLean CLEPHANE, his niece, for safekeeping.

We were graciously greeted by a descendant of the MacLean/Clephane/Northampton/Compton families - Captain Alwyn Compton Farquharson who owns and resides part of the year at Torloisk. We photographed "The Colours" and their glass case on the grand stairwell, from all angles, along with a carved powder horn of Lieut. Lauchlin MacLean which depicted many of the relevant battles of the Revolutionary War and the regimental name etc.

As a matter of added interest, Capt. FARQUHARSON is Chief of the Clan Farquharson. He extended greetings to all his associates in Canada. His address is:

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**Tracing Records of Births, Deaths and Marriages**

The main series of records maintained by the Registrar General at the Office of Population Censuses and Surveys, General Register Office, St Catherine's House, London WC2B 6JP relate to **births, deaths and marriages registered in England and Wales and deaths at sea since 1 July 1837**. They are records of separate events and are not linked together in families.

The registers themselves are not open to inspection, but information from them is supplied in the form of certificates. If you apply in the Public Search Room, certificates are normally available for collection after 48 hours or they can be posted to you within two to three weeks.

Individual entries are traced by searching in the indexes. Time will be saved if you first obtain from family sources and documents, such as a family Bible or baptismal cards, as much information as possible about the events being sought.

**Up to 1983** the indexes are compiled alphabetically in yearly quarters by date of registration, eg the birth index for the March quarter 1854 lists births registered in January, February and March 1854. A birth or a death which occurred in one quarter of a year may have been registered in a subsequent quarter and will be found in a later index. Marriages are registered in the quarter in which the marriage took place.

**From 1984** the indexes are arranged in alphabetical order for the full year. The entry contains the month and year of Registration under the column headed REG. The first two digits 01-12 indicate the month, the last two digits, the year.

The indexes may be searched free of charge.

**Public Search Rooms - Hours of Opening**

The search rooms are open to the public from 8.30 am to 4.30 pm Monday to Friday. They are closed all day on public holidays.

## Sources of Records of Births, Marriages and Deaths which occurred before 1 July 1837

Before 1 July 1837 the principal means of recording births or baptisms, marriages and deaths or burials were parish registers kept by Clergymen of the Church of England. The best way to trace them is to get in touch with the appropriate County Archivist or the Minister of the church in which the ceremony is thought to have taken place and because the majority of the population belonged to the Church of England you may be more likely to find information you require in those records. *They are not at St Catherines House or the Public Record Office.*

However, records and registers of births, baptisms, deaths, burials and marriages were also kept by religious denominations other than the Church of England. These records and registers are in the custody of the Keeper of Public Records, Public Record Office, Chancery Lane, London WC2A 1LR, to whom you should address any enquiry. If you wish to inspect the records personally you will require a Reader's Ticket. Application forms for a Reader's Ticket will be forwarded by the Public Record Office on request.

### SPECIAL QUERY

#### The lost John Power

Grant No. 503, Aug. 14, 1809 (Vol. "D", N.B. Dept of Natural Resources, pp. 402-409) allocated 4,456 acres at Pokemouche to 24 petitioners who had applied individually or in groups. John POWER received Lot. No. 23, 3rd Tract, 160 acres, and marsh Lot No. 32, 32 acres. Was the "John Power of Nelson" with wife Mary, who sold that same lot No. 23 and the marsh lot at Pokemouche Oct. 1, 1816 (Northumberland County Deeds, Bk. 12, No. 116, pp. 236-238) the same John Power with wife Mary who settled at Beobair's (Wilson) Point by 1804 (Bk. 8, No. 108, pp. 224-225)? If so, was he related to the Martin and James Power, fishermen who left Newfoundland when the French fleet appeared, and also received Pokemouche lots, Nos. 10 and 11, under Grant No. 503 at same time as John Power? Can anyone identify the petition in which John Power would have requested that grant? So far it has not been located.

 Spinster - woman who spins or an unmarried woman

## WORDS A GENEALOGIST SHOULD KNOW:

Abstract - a summary of the important parts, or points, of a document.  
 Ahnentafel - pedigree, a table of ancestors.  
 Consanguinity - state of being related by blood, or descended from a common ancestor.  
 Consort - spouse (husband or wife).  
 Decedent - deceased person.  
 Et. al. - (Latin) and others.  
 Et. ux. - (Latin) and wife.  
 Emigrant - one who leaves one place or country to settle in another.  
 Freeman - one who was given civil and political liberty after taking an oath to a government or church.  
 Freemen - in tax or other records, unmarried men age 21 or over, free of family obligations, so taxed as single men. They were transferred to regular lists after marriage, thus a search of tax records year by year will show year of marriage.  
 Immigrant - one who enters a new country and settles there.  
 Indenture - agreement in writing between two or more parties, which was then cut or torn in in a jagged line, each party receiving one section that could be matched: frequently used in a colony, or when money loans were involved.  
 Pace - measure of distance, approximately 2-1/2 feet.  
 Progenitor - ancestor in the direct line; forefather.  
 Redemptioner - person who sold his services for a period of years to pay his ship's passage.  
 Relict - widow or widower.

Alias Copias - Writ of attachment or arrest

Bailiwick - Jurisdictional area of a sherriff

Capias - Term used for several species of writs. The common characteristic is that they require the officer to take the body of the defendant into custody

Caveat - Notice given to a court against the performance of certain acts. Can be used to delay probate of wills.

Common Bail - to ensure the appearance of a defendant

Confessed Judgement - Debtor permitting judgment against him by a creditor.

Dedimus - A writ authorizing a lay person to act for a judge.

Imparlance - Time given to either parties to an action to answer the pleading of the other or delay action

Nihil Dicit - Judgment taken against a defendant who fails to answer plaitiff's complaint

Nil Debet - Does not owe as alleged

Non Assumsit - The defendant did not undertake or promise as pledged

Oyer - Hearing

Pluries - A third writ when original and Alias writs have not been answered

Replication - Reply made by plaintiff in action to defendant's plea; a general denial of truth of defendant's plea

Right of Dower - Wife's interest in her husband's property

Scire Facias - To revive a judgment after a lapse of time

Special Bail - Sureties who undertake for defendant's appearance.

Tithable - All male persons of sixteen years and over, all negro, mulatto, and Indian women of sixteen years and over, not being free; excepting only, those the county court and vestry, for reasons of charity, think fit to excuse

Trouver - Recovery of damages against person who found another's property, and converted same to his own use

Writ of Enquiry - Writ to inquire into amount of damages sustained by plaintiff

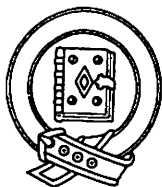

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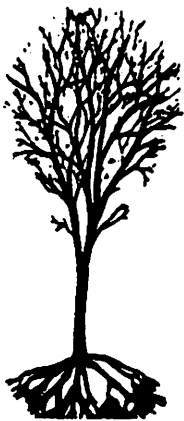

Dear Sir:

I have just read your issue for June 1990 and want to congratulate you on a very interesting publication. I hope your journal and publications are being purchased by our genealogical societies herefor Nova Scotians with ties to New Brunswick; I'll take it up in the ones I belong to.

One critical comment on the content of this issue... the information you have copied from the Central Georgia Genealogical Society, Fall 1985 (p.33) is not strictly accurate. Other readers may already have pointed out flaws or simplifications. For example the category of "Lord" quoted is not the common usage, and I seriously doubt that it can be set among the ranked nobility at all...It is used as a courtesy title ( or Lady, if that id appropriate) for the younger children of a duke, and is used for referring to peers of the 1 rank of Earl, Viscount and Baron. The examples of "Lord" given in this presentation are all Scots and are surely archaic survivals of pre-feudal hierarchies in Scotland. Neither are Dukes necessarily related to the Royal Family....though royal princes are normally given dukedoms when they reach the age of wisdom. There are plenty of other dukes in England and Scotland who are in no way related to the Queen.

Also, baronetcys are hereditary; that is what makes a baronet superior to a knight.

No doubt these and perhaps other errors have been noticed already; perhaps someone should write and tell them in Georgia.

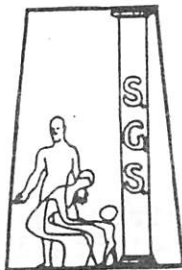

Dear Canfed Member:

The Government of Canada has stated that as part of the cut in the Goods and Service Tax to 7% from 9%, they will be phasing out all subsidies to Canada Post and be replacing these with a new program. This cut would directly affect the rate for mailing library books i.e. SGS mails library books direct to our members, plus all forms of Interlibrary Loan. This increased rate would affect all Interlibrary loans, with a loss to Genealogists, to all researchers and to all persons living in small localities without libraries. Genealogists are among the heaviest users of the Library Rate, which allows them access to information across Canada. We do not know what the "Replacement Program" will cover. We can be assured any new program will be less beneficial to genealogists and others.

At the last CANFED Board of Directors meeting, it was agreed to support the Saskatchewan Genealogical Society in its lobby to maintain the Library Rate. Canfed members are being asked to mail the attached Sample letter and/or write a letter to your Member of Parliament and the Minister of Communications Marcel Masse, Parliament Hill, Ottawa, Canada, K1A 0C8 outlining the benefits you and your family receive through borrowing educational resources from inaccessible libraries. Such a letter to a Member of Parliament is postage free. The more letters that are received, the less drastic the cut may be.

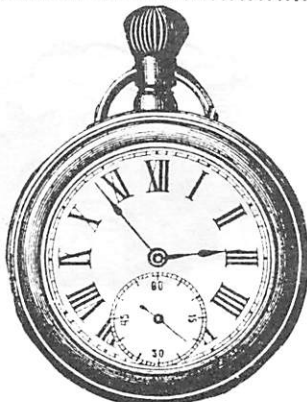
We ask that the Genealogical Societies ask their members to support us and mail letters to Marcel Masse and their MP. Thank you for your support to save our access to information.

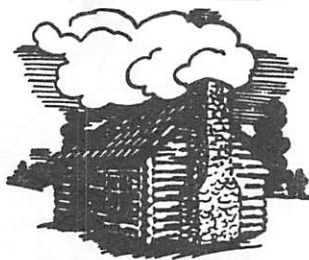
