

THE CALIFORNIA CONNECTION with

CHARLOTTE COUNTY, NEW BRUNSWICK

The following is in response to the listing by Warren H. Hasty of New Brunswick natives in <u>Humboldt County</u>, <u>California</u> printed in the March 1990 issue of GENERATIONS.

Although news of the California Gold Rush did not reach New Brunswick until the early months of 1849, by the <u>Census of 1851</u> many families had already lost one or more of their young men to the lure of adventure and riches. (In some cases the men were older and heads of families.) The Parishes in Charlotte County which listed men as "Absent in California" were St. David, St. George, and St. Stephen, the latter having the largest number of 19. Those actually listed in the census must have been expected to return, for other young unattached men who had left in 1849 were not included.

For example, William Carson, who later became the "Redwood Baron" of Eureka, Humboldt County, had left New Brunswick in September of 1849, accompanied by four fellow woodsmen. He is not listed with his family in St. Patrick Parish. Since there was then no overland transportation, these five young men took passage on the Brazilian, a California-bound sailing vessel. They finally reached San Francisco on April 1, 1850, after a long, hazardous voyage around Cape Horn. Other men, hoping to reach the gold fields in a hurry, disembarked in Panama and walked across the Isthmus of Panama (approximately 50 miles), hoping to find passage north on the Pacific side. Unfortunately, many failed to survive the malaria-infested swamps and the unfamiliar heat and humidity en route. Others succumbed to epidemics of small-pox. I wonder what became of one man listed in St. David's Parish of whom the census-taker reported in a foot-note: "Lumbered -indebted; Lumbered -- more indebted; Lumbered -- superlatively indebted. Farm mortgaged and went to California." He was 46 years old, married with five children ranging from 6 months to 15 years. Fortunately, his wife's parents lived with them, so the family was not totally abandoned!

Since the trip to California took from six to nine months by sailing ship, communication must have been sparse, to say the least. Yet the word spread and in the years following the 1851 census many more men went West to improve their status. Most found their way to the gold fields first but later joined William Carson's redwood operation, or found other related work. A considerable number of Charlotte County emigrants did settle in the Eureka area around Humboldt Bay, about 275 miles north of San Francisco. The pattern seemed to be that after a few years men would make the long trip home for a visit, choose a bride, and return to settle in Humboldt County. Others had chosen their future wives before they left home and, when they could afford to support a family, either went East themselves or sent the fare and the young woman in question made her own way to California. I marvel at the courage of these young women and trust that usually the prospective groom was able to meet his bride in San Francisco so that they could travel to the more remote northern area together. Such was the case with William Carson and Sarah Wilson, who were married in San Francisco in 1864.

Sarah Wilson also came from St. Patrick Parish, Charlotte County. Her sister Mary had married Charles Hill in 1862 and already lived in Humboldt County, California. He had journeyed "back East" to accompany his bride to their new home. A younger sister, Elenor or Ellen, later joined them and married Sam! McFarland (listed in the 1851 Charlotte County Census as "McFarlane"). While the Carsons lived in Eureka proper, the latter couples made their homes near the Carson-Dolbeer mill in the community which came to be known as Bayside. (This community has now been partially integrated into the town of Arcata.) A brother, Hugh Wilson, lived in nearby Freshwater and had a blacksmith shop there.

The above was a pattern followed in many Charlotte County families and the ties with "back East" were seldom broken. A current member of the New Brunswick Genealogical Society and the Charlotte County Branch, Mrs. Jean Hartley of Redding, California, grew up in Bayside and has provided me with excellent resource material on the history of Humboldt County (see Bibliography). Once the women arrived and family life replaced the rough, rugged bachelor existence of the Gold Rush era, homes were built and schools and churches followed. A new school district was formed in 1875, and a Presbyterian Church was organized and held services in the Good Templars Hall as early as 1882. While the earliest arrivals came from the Parishes of St. Patrick, St. David, St. George and St. Stephen, many of the later ones were from St. James Parish, and there was much interrelationship among these settlers of Bayside, as well.

Charter members of the Bayside Presbyterian Church included:
Sisters Mrs. John Smith (Margaret Isabella MacKenzie) and Mrs. Fred Getchell
(Flora Elizabeth MacKenzie); their sister-in-law Mrs. Peter MacKenzie (Florence Elizabeth Weatherby) and her sister-in-law Mrs. Duncan Campbell Weatherby (Johanna Matheson). (It was some time before one man joined the church, and he was not related to any of these!).

"An Historic Resources Inventory" compiled in 1978 lists and describes the major dwellings along the Old Arcata Road and also points up the family interrelationships of the Charlotte County settlers. Skiffington Mitchell, nephew of William Carson, arrived in 1883. After successful summer treks to the Klondike gold fields, he had an elegant house built by David Wilson (a nephew of Mrs. Carson). The Charles Hill home was built by George Close, another New Brunswicker. Brothers Gideon and Joseph (Walter) Spinney were from St. George Parish. Sam McFarland's son Will married the daughter of John Smith. Hector Morrison's wife (Elizabeth McKenzie) was an aunt of Mrs. John Smith and Mrs. Fred Getchell.

Much of the social life of the Bayside area revolved around these former New Bunswick families. When Sam McFarland built a new barn, the <u>Humboldt Times</u> of October 24, 1888, reported:

Mr. McFarland, knowing that Harrison would be elected this fall and that consequently there would be large crops next year, he has lately built a large and commodious barn, and on the eve of the 21st he celebrated the event with a "barn social". About 75 people were present, including quite a number from Eureka. Mr. and Mrs. McFarland did the honor of the occasion with grace and heartiness that could not be surpassed.

Fred Getchell's farm was a favourite place for picnics. William Carson and his partner John Dolbeer (a native of New Hampshire) built an iron-rail track to

their logging site in 1875. Soon after a competitor built another logging railroad which led to two granite quarries. On at least one occasion a special excursion for sightseers was organized on the latter railroad. Benches were placed on the flat-cars, people took picnic lunches and made a day of visiting the two quarries. They were even treated to a dynamite blast, which hurled boulders many yards. At that time the granite rock was needed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers which planned to build two parallel jetties at the entrance to Humboldt Bay.

There has always been a close relationship between the residents of Charlotte County and those across the border in Northern Maine. One Maine family which also located in Bayside was that of David Frost Dyer. He was appointed the first postmaster of Bayside in 1886 under President Grover Cleveland's administration. His health must have improved by that time, because the following advertisement appeared in the Humboldt Times of March 13, 1884:

David F. Dyer offers for sale a nice little improved tilled farm of 40 acres on Jacoby Creek. Ill health compels him to make a sacrifice of the property which he has reclaimed from a barren waste with his own hands. The land is under cultivation. A cozy residence, convenient outbuildings, and good bearing orchard of assorted fruit are among the inducements which the property offers. The farm is bounded on the south by Jacoby Creek which carries an abundance of water throughout the year.

This indicates the occupational change that was gradually taking place in Humboldt County. At the beginning of the Gold Rush, the settlements around Humboldt Bay served as supply depots for the mines on the Trinity River. Then Maritimers with lumbering experience discovered the redwood trees and developed a thriving lumbering industry with its related businesses. Gradually agriculture and dairying began to gain prominence. After 1900 lumbering went into a decline because of over-harvesting of the great trees plus the setting aside of extensive forest tracts as State parks by the United States Government.

By the end of the century, a number of Charlotte County men, in addition to William Carson, had risen to prominence in Eureka. Alex Stirling Campbell, born in Scotch Ridge on July 10, 1861, became Inspector of Ports for Eureka. Daniel Matheson went to California in the fall of 1882 to work in the forests. He also mined gold in both California and Alaska, and in 1906 was elected City Assessor of Eureka. Skiffington Thompson Weatherby of Little Ridge went to California as a young man and was listed as City Treasurer of Eureka in 1899. George Close, a mill-wright and builder, became manager of the Standard Furniture Company in Eureka. Henry B. Hitchings, born in Charlotte County on March 9, 1859, moved West with his parents ten years later and eventually became Chief of Police in Eureka. In 1913 he was appointed Probation Officer of Humboldt County. The list could go on and on, as so many Charlotte County families contributed brains and brawn to the development of Humboldt County.

However peaceful the life of these pioneers appears to have been, Humboldt County did not totally escape the jarring and tumultuous events which were so much a part of California's early history. In 1869 the transcontinental railroad was completed, a magnificent achievement. The tragic side-effect was what happened to the thousands of Chinese coolies who had been brought to North America to build the railroad, often against their will. They worked long

hours for low wages and when the railroad was completed they were suddenly turned loose on the labour market. This led to an ugly campaign by "legitimate" American workers against the use of Chinese labour. "The Chinese must go!" was the slogan that rallied much of the labour movement. Nor was Eureka innocent in this racist campaign. In 1885 Eureka's Chinatown housed several hundred. On the evening of February 6, 1885, a Eureka councilman was killed by a stray bullet during an outbreak between warring tongs. Feelings were inflamed to the point of mob violence, but cooler heads prevailed and the Chinese were simply ordered to leave the county within 24 hours! A scaffold was erected and a hangman's noose warned of the penalty for not obeying that order. The Chinese properties were expropriated by Eurekans, and even today Humboldt County has very few Oriental residents.

In an earlier decade, there had been skirmishes with native Indians who had freely roamed these lands for many centuries. "Bayside Through the Years" (p. 2) notes that, "As settlement spread along the shores of the bay between Eureka and Union (Arcata), it took but a relatively short period of ten years from the first settlement in April 1850 for the Wiyot Indians to be displaced from the lands they had held for at least 2,000 years." The remnants of two or three tribes who remained in the area were encamped on an island in Humboldt Bay in the winter of 1860. For some reason, on the night of February 25th, when the Indian men were away hunting and fishing, white settlers raided the encampment and killed all the women and children, the old and infirm. Of course, the husbands, fathers and brothers on returning to burned homes and mutilated dead, swore vengeance, and months of bitter warfare followed. Author Bret Harte, then a young journalist on the Uniontown paper, denounced the outrage and because of threats against his life was compelled to leave the area and return to San Francisco. One of the Bayside residents who was a victim of the Indians' vengeance was John Mars Dyer. The Humboldt Times reported on February 20, 1864:

On February 17, 1864, word was received at Fort Humboldt of an Indian attack upon the place of J. M. Dyer near Jacoby Creek, a short distance from Arcata. The hired hand and Mrs. Dyer escaped by flight but the Indians pillaged and burned the house.

Descendents of Charlotte County pioneers have followed with interest the careers and families of their California relatives. The reverse is also true. In September, 1989 three Californians attended a "family reunion" in Scotch Ridge -- along with 90 others from New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Maine, British Columbia, Florida and Ontario. The more people scatter abroad, the deeper the interest in learning about our "roots". Family history libraries and journals such as "Generations" provide a vital link with our past. Long may they continue!

MIRAMICHI ROOTS - Researchers who trace their ancestry to Northumberland County will be pleased to learn that a genealogical centre has opened in the old St. Michael's Rectory. Chatham, a few steps from the new rectory next to St. Michael's Basilica. The centre is administered by the St. Michael's Museum Association, It has land petitions, church and census records and much more. The Museum keeps three people working year round transcribing documents into the computer. Carl Landry is the curator. The Museum is open Monday to Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. (Atlantic Standard Time) The mailing address is St. Michael's Museum Association, 10 Howard St., Chatham, N.B. Canada E1N 3A7 Telephone (506) 778-8233. Research for individuals will be undertaken for a fee of \$ 30 for the first hour and a half, and \$ 20 for each additional hour. However, if individuals are seeking a specific reference ie. marriage, a small donation is requested.

Genealogists, community and marine historians alike will welcome the publication John McLeod Shipbuilding Company, Black River, N.B. by Mary Bedford, an executive member of the Saint John Branch, N.B.G.S. Far more is included than what the title may suggest. The ship yard was a central focus of economic and social activity within that St. John Co. community. This fact is aptly exemplified by the reproduction of the relatively unknown private ledgers of McLeod's shipyard and the Mispeck Mill. The list of workers has been augmented with the genealogies of local Black River families, church histories and accounts of personal experiences. The shipyard drew men from all parts of St. John Co. and will be of particular interest to those with roots in nearby St. Martins and Quaco. Genealogists with Westmorland and Albert County Roots will be pleased to learn that volunteers of the Southeastern Branch, N.B.G.S. have begun a project to gather the epitaphs from approximately 5000 gravestones of Elmwood Cemetery located in the City of Moncton.

The series Vital Statistics From New Brunswick Newspapers enters its ninth publications. The project to extract genealogical data from New Brunswick newspapers began in 1982 under the auspices of the New Brunswick Genealogical Society. In 1986, the project was continued by D.F. Johnson. To date 39 volumes have been published covering newspaper extracts from the year 1784 to 1876 - over 180,000 full names cross-referenced. In addition to births, marriages, death notices are coroner inquests, shipwrecks, drownings and any references to death involving natives of New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and P.E.I. 





THE COMMONWEALTH WAR GRAVES COMMISSION

Through the interest and kindness of Mr Graham P. Allen, of Halifax, N.S. we have been provided with information on the Commonwealth War Graves Commission, which may prove to be of interest to some of our members.

Mr Allen's letter reads in part:

"...'.When I first began researching my family tree some 19 years ago it was extremely different to get started as our family moved around a lot and because many records were lost for one reason or another— or because the spelling of our surname changed in one generation from 'Allan' to 'Allen'.Anyone researching my family will find that some of my uncles and aunts are called Allen and some are called Allan.

"During the course of my research I found that I was unable to locate one of my Great uncles because I rmeembered my father telling me that he had enlisted in the army during the First World War.. A visit to the Amry Museum at the Halifax Citadel provided me with the name of his regiment, his service number and also his photograph.

"Upon talking to the museum's curator, I was able to learn the address of an agency known as the Commonwealth War Graves Commission. I therefore decided to see what in information I could learn by writing to them.

"In response to my letter I was sent a copy of the REGISTER OF NAMES OF THE OVERSEAS MILITARY FORCES OF CANADA WHO FELL IN FRANCE DURING THE GREAT WAR, WHOSE GRAVES ARE NOT KNOWN AND WHO ARE COMMEMORATED ON THE VIMY MEMORIAL, FRANCE.

"They also sent me a map of the memorial showing on which face his name may be found as well as a booklet telling all about the memorial itself. They went further to indicate to me that I should contact the personnel records center of the National Archives of Canada, in Ottawa.

"Upon doing so, I was sent a complete copy of his entire military service record. As a result of this I have been given more information than I could ever have hoped for. Because og my ext eme good fortune and because of all the time spent looking for this information, I decided to send you (for publication) a copy of a letter sent to me by the War Graves Commission, as well as its address (and) the address of the National Archives of Canada...

"The addresses are as follows:

The Commonwealth War Graves Commission Canadian Agency 284 Wellington Street Ottawa, Ont. KIA OP4

...and

The National Archives of Canada Personnel Records Center Ottawa, Ont.

KlA ON3

A letter from the Commission to Mr Allen notes that the body was set up in 1917 with responsibility for ensuring that graves of members of the Commonwealth forces who died during the two World Wars are marked and maintained, to builf and maintain memorials to the missing and to keep records and registers.

The letter also underscores the importance of knowing the regimental number of the service person involved, date of death and the particular arm of the service.

Circumstances and particulars of death are not known or held by the War Graves Commission. Service records are held at the National Archives of Canada.

A related release from the National Archives, in regard to military service information, makes the following points:

- 1. While former service persons have access to almost any information contained in his/her records, his/her written consent is required for release of personal information to a third party.
- 2. If a service person has been dead for less than 20 years limited information may be released to a member of the immediate family. Proof of death and evidence of relationship must be provided.
- 3. If a service person has been dead for more than 20 years there are no restrictions placed on the release of information contained in the service records. Proof of death must be provided.

A MOUNT ALLISON AUTOGRAPH ALBUM - 1875-1878

When Cavour Chapman went to Mount Allison College in Sackville, N.B. in 1875, he started to keep an autograph album. His fellow students came from all across the Maritimes as well as Bermuda, Newfoundland and even Ontario. While most of the entries were made at Mount Allison, his friends usually also included their place of origin and the date. Unfortunately most of the young men signed only their initials and last name. The young women were more forthcoming, though a couple were frustratingly discrete.

Many entries are in beautiful copper-plate script, others include elaborate examples of calligraphy or drawings, and some, in pencil or faded ink are almost indecipherable. Some repeat virtuous sentiments, others hint at College hi-jinx and escapades.

Names are transcribed as they are written; < > enclose doubtful readings. Place names, day and month appear as written, but years have been written out and placed in a separate column to facilitate a separate sort.

Cavour Chapman was born 25 Oct. 1860, the son of Robert Andrew and Mary (Frost) Chapman, of Dorchester, N.B. Cavour grew up in the Chapman shippard at Rockland on the Memramcook river, across from Dorchester. The years when he was at Mount Allison were busy and profitable years for shipbuilders, and the album contains many names of families in this industry from around the Bay of Fundy. In 1876 he was seriously ill, and when he recovered, was sent on a voyage on one of his fathers ships to aid his recovery, which explains the gap in the album entries for that year.

With the decline of shipbuilding, the Rockland shippard's last vessel was launched in 1883. Cavour married Althea Alice Cleveland of St. Martins, N.B. on 24 Oct. 1883, and about this time moved to Moncton. In due course, he founded the N.B. Wire Fence Co. Ltd., the first fence manufacturer in the region. As he drove about the Maritimes selling this newfangled wire fence, he no doubt renewed contacts with his many college friends. He was twice Mayor of Moncton, dying there on 1 Sept. 1943.
