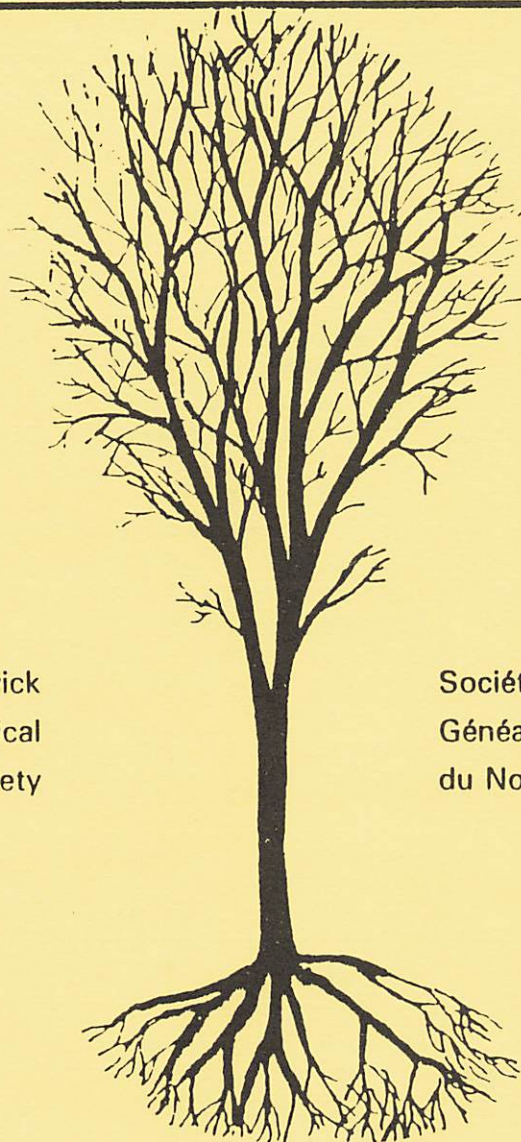

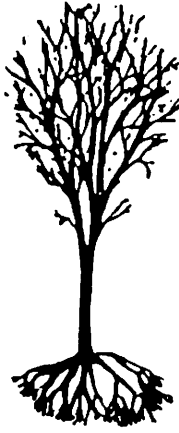

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Pioneer Preacher - Rev. Seth Noble

(Continued from previous issue)

2. **Joseph² Noble** (*Seth*¹), was born June 13, 1783⁽¹⁾, in New Market, N.H., son of Seth and Hannah (Barker) Noble. He died about 1869, probably in Carleton Co., N.B. A monument marking his grave has not been found.

He married **Mary Ackerson**, June 9, 1812⁽²⁾, in Carleton Co., N.B.⁽¹⁾. She was born September 23, 1794, in Sheffield, Sunbury Co., New Brunswick.⁽¹⁾ Her death date and burial place are unknown.

Joseph's mother, Hannah (Barker) Noble, died in Bangor, Maine, in 1790, when Joseph was seven years old. His father, who left Mauderville, N.B., in 1777, became an itinerant minister, taught school, including singing-school, and farmed; but he found it difficult to support his family in those early days on the Penobscot River in Maine. In 1791, he returned to Mauderville with 7 year-old Joseph and 3 year-old Benjamin, Joseph's brother, and the boys remained there with their mother's relatives. Their widowed father probably found he could not care for them. Joseph and his brother grew up in that part of the Mauderville settlement which later became the Parish of Sheffield, with the Barker family.

Joseph became a Free Christian Baptist minister. In 1811⁽¹⁾, at age 28, he removed from Sheffield to the Parish of Brighton in Carleton Co., N.B. and lived there the remainder of his life.

His wife, Mary, was probably a daughter of Jacob and Catherine (Mills) Ackerson. Jacob Ackerson was granted Lot 17, 200 acres, fronting on the Saint John River in Lower Brighton, December 6, 1815, but was probably on the lot well before that date. The Ackerson family came there from Sunbury Co., so Joseph and Mary likely knew one another in Sheffield. They were married in Carleton County by Rev. Frederick Dibblee, the Anglican Rector in Woodstock, N.B.

3. **Benjamin² Noble** (*Seth*¹), was born June 25, 1787⁽¹⁾, in Bangor, Maine, son of Seth and Hannah (Barker) Noble. He died in Carleton Co., N.B., April 12, 1860⁽³⁾, probably in Lower Brighton, and was buried in the cemetery there. A monument marks his last resting place beside the Saint John River.

He married first, **Susannah Currier**, March 29, 1810, in N.B.⁽¹⁾. She was born about 1785⁽³⁾, in New Brunswick, and died December 18, 1841⁽³⁾. She was buried beside her husband in the Lower Brighton Cemetery.

He married second, **Christiana (McMullin) Bubar**, March 15, 1845, in Carleton Co., N.B.⁽²⁾. She was born about 1785⁽³⁾, in New Brunswick, and died January 25, 1860⁽³⁾, probably at Lower Brighton. She was widow of Stephen Bubar who died in Mauderville, Sunbury Co., N.B., in 1836. After her husband's death, she removed with her children to Carleton Co. She too was buried in the Lower Brighton Cemetery.

The year following his mother's death in Bangor, Maine, when he was 3 years old, Benjamin was brought by his father from Bangor to the Saint John River in New Brunswick where he was left with his mother's relatives. He was brought up in the family of his uncle, Benjamin Barker, at Sheffield, Sunbury Co., N.B. About 1813 he removed from Sheffield to that part of old Wakefield which was later set off as the Parish of Brighton, in Carleton Co., N.B., and lived there, in Lower Brighton, the remainder of his life. He was a farmer, a blacksmith, a Justice of the Peace for about 20 years, postmaster for about 15 years, and a deacon of the Baptist church for several years.⁽¹⁾

His first wife, Susannah, probably was a daughter of Loyalist Issachar Currier, formerly of Connecticut⁽⁵⁾, and his wife Rebecca (Morrill), who came to N.B. in 1783. Issachar was granted first, Lot 75, 138 acres, at Upper Gagetown, Queens Co., N.B., May 12, 1786, and secondly, Lots 69 and 71, 390 acres, at Kingsclear, York Co., N.B., October 4, 1799⁽⁶⁾. This is supported to some degree by the fact that Benjamin and Susannah named their fifth child Rebecca, and their sixth child Issachar Currier Noble.

His second wife, Christianna McMullin, may have been a sister of Rev. Charles McMullin (1790-1879), a Free Christian Baptist Minister who lived in Hartland, N.B., and it may have been because of him that she removed to Carleton Co.

4. (Sophia) Jane³ Noble (*Joseph², Seth¹*), was born February 9, 1814⁽⁵⁾, probably in Lower Brighton, Carleton Co., N.B., where her parents lived, daughter of Joseph and Mary (Ackerson) Noble. She died May 11, 1887⁽²⁾, at Rockland, Carleton Co., N.B., and was buried in the old Calvinist Baptist Cemetery there.

She married **Alban Cole Estabrooks**, April 30, 1835, in Carleton Co., N.B.⁽³⁾. He was born May 12, 1811⁽⁵⁾, at Sheffield, Sunbury Co., N.B., son of Samuel & Myra (Palmer) Estabrooks⁽⁵⁾. He died May 12, 1847⁽²⁾, and was buried in the old Calvinist Baptist Cemetery at Rockland, Carleton Co., N.B.

In the New Brunswick census of 1851, Jane was living in the Parish of Brighton, age 37, a widow with five children, all listed as "fatherless." In the census of 1861, her name was recorded as Sophia, aged 47 years, still living in the Parish of Brighton and still a widow. It is said of her that she mourned for forty years.

Alban C. Estabrooks died accidentally when a log fell on him, probably at his farm in Rockland.

5. Mary³ Ann Noble (*Joseph², Seth¹*), was born September 3, 1815⁽¹⁾, probably in Lower Brighton, Carleton Co., N.B., daughter of Joseph and Mary (Ackerson) Noble. She died January 19, 1895⁽¹⁾, at Rockland, Carleton Co., N.B. I found no stone to mark her burial place, or that of her husband, when I recorded names and dates from the tombstones in several Northern Carleton Co. cemeteries in the 1980s. Mary and her husband are not in R. Wallace Hale's cemetery listings for Southern Carleton Co., N.B., either.

She married **Levi Handy Estabrooks**, May 11, 1837⁽¹⁾, in Carleton Co., N.B. He was born September 29, 1813, at Sheffield, Sunbury Co., N.B., son of Samuel & Myra (Palmer) Estabrooks⁽¹⁾. He died April 13, 1882⁽¹⁾.

In the New Brunswick census of 1851, Levi H. Estabrooks, age 37, carpenter; Mary A., 35, his wife; and children Joseph H, 9; Caroline A, 6; and Alethea J, 3, were living in the Parish of Simonds, Carleton Co., N.B. Letitia Noble, age 25, Mary's sister, was shown as a visitor in their household. In the census of 1861, Levi H. Estabrooks, 47, native, born Sunbury Co., N.B., carpenter; Mary Ann, 44, his wife, native, born Carleton Co., N.B.; Joseph H, 19, carpenter; Caroline A, 14; Alethia J, 11; and Louisa L, 8, were still listed in the Parish of Simonds, and Letitia Noble, 33, sister-in-law, was still living with them.

Mary Ann Noble was a sister of S. Jane Noble, #4, who married Levi's brother, Alban C. Estabrooks.

6. Sarah³ Noble (*Joseph², Seth¹*), was born July 16, 1820⁽⁵⁾, in Lower Brighton, Carleton Co., N.B., daughter of Joseph and Mary (Ackerson) Noble. She died December 1, 1861⁽³⁾, at Upper Brighton, Carleton Co., N.B., and was buried in the Upper Brighton Cemetery.

She married **Charles Bubar**, March 2, 1844, in Carleton Co., N.B.⁽¹⁾. He was born in 1813, probably at Mougerville, Sunbury Co., N.B., son of Stephen and Christianna (McMullin) Bubar⁽⁴⁾. He died October 1, 1894⁽⁴⁾, aged about 81 years, probably at Upper Brighton. His name is not inscribed on the tombstone in the Upper Brighton cemetery where Sarah was buried, but he may have been interred there also.

After Sarah died in 1861, Charles married second, **Hannah Mills**, October 29, 1862, in Carleton Co., N.B.⁽⁸⁾ I do not have a record of her birth or death date, or the names of her parents. The Carleton Co. marriage records show her, in 1862, "of the Parish of Peel," but the New Brunswick census of 1861 does not show her there. There is a Hannah Mills in the census of 1861 for the Parish of Simonds, age 15, recorded as a niece of William Mills, age 33, a hotel keeper. Age 15 in 1861 suggests a birth date of about 1846, which would make her about 33 years younger than Charles, and only 16 at the time of Charles' second marriage. It seems unlikely that she was the Hannah Mills who married Charles Bubar.

Hannah probably died before 1875, for Charles married third, December 23, 1875, **Mrs. Jane Clark**⁽⁹⁾. She was born about 1825⁽²⁾, in N.B., and probably was **Jane Spurr**, widow of Richard S. Clark of the Parish of Wakefield, Carleton Co., N.B. The Carleton Co. marriage records [Book A, p. 128] records the marriage of Richard S. Clarke and Jane Spurr, April 8, 1841. The N.B. census of 1851 shows Richard and Jane Clarke living in the Parish of Wakefield, with her age shown as 26 [born about 1825]. A tombstone in the Baptist cemetery in Wakefield is inscribed "Richard S. Clark, 1813-1868; Jane, his wife, 1824-1902." Cronology and geographical location suggest that Mrs. Jane Clark(e) was Jane Spurr.

7. **Elijah³ Noble** (*Joseph², Seth¹*), was born August 28, 1822⁽¹⁾, in Lower Brighton, Carleton Co., N.B., son of Joseph and Mary (Ackerson) Noble. He died before 1861, for the New Brunswick census for that year shows Julia Ann, his widow, as wife of his brother, Joel Noble.

He married **Julia Ann Albright**, January 27, 1848, in Carleton Co., N.B.⁽²⁾. She was born April 1, 1825⁽¹⁾, in N.B.⁽⁴⁾. I do not know for certain who her parents were, but when she was married in 1848 the marriage record showed her "of the Parish of Brighton," and in the N.B. census of 1851 (two years after her marriage) the only Albright family listed in all of Carleton Co. was Henry, 63, farmer, and Frances, 57, his wife, who were living in the Parish of Brighton, and because Julia Ann named her first child Frances, my guess is that Henry and Frances Albright were her parents.

Elijah and Julia Ann lived in the Parish of Brighton, but I have not located a monument marking their burial place there.

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8. Letitia³ Noble (*Joseph², Seth¹*), was born July 22, 1824⁽¹⁾, in Lower Brighton, Carleton Co., N.B., daughter of Joseph and Mary (Ackerson) Noble. She died July 31, 1920⁽¹⁾, at Upper Woodstock, Carleton Co., N.B.

She married **Jacob McShaffrey Craig**, July 10, 1872, in Carleton Co., N.B.⁽²⁾. He was born May 24, 1800⁽¹⁾, in Woodstock, Carleton Co., N.B., son of James and Mary (Blake) Craig⁽¹⁾. He died June 8, 1886, at Rockland, Carleton Co., N.B.⁽¹⁾.

Letitia was 48 years old when she married Jacob. He was 72. She was his second wife. His first wife was Ann, daughter of Ammi & Hannah (Dean) Shaw, who was born July 3, 1802⁽¹⁾, and died July 8, 1871, at Rockland⁽¹⁾. Jacob and Ann had ten children. Two of them were older than Letitia Noble. Jacob and Letitia had been married 14 years when he died. They had no children.

Jacob and Ann Craig lived at Rockland, where he was a deacon in the Baptist church, and he continued to live there after he and Letitia were married.

In the old Orser cemetery, in Hartland, N.B., there is a tombstone with the inscription, "Ann, wife of Jacob Craig, d. 8 Jul 1871, aged 69 yrs." Jacob's name does not appear on a stone in the cemetery, nor does Letitia's. I do not know where they were buried.

He married **Julia Ann (Albright) Noble**, April 8, 1861, in Carleton Co., N.B.⁽²⁾. She was born April 1, 1825⁽¹⁾, in N.B., daughter of (probably) Henry and Frances Albright who were living in the Parish of Brighton, Carleton Co., N.B., at the time of the N.B. census of 1851.

Julia Ann was first married to **Elijah Noble**. Joel's brother, who died before 1861.

Joel and Julia lived in the Parish of Brighton (1861). I do not have a record of any children born to them.

10. Benjamin³ B. Noble (*Joseph², Seth¹*), was born June 23, 1828⁽¹⁾, in Lower Brighton, Carleton Co., N.B., son of Joseph and Mary (Ackerson) Noble. His death date and his burial place are unknown.

He married **Lucretia Victoria A. Dickinson**, August 9, 1856, in Carleton Co., N.B.⁽¹⁾. She was born about 1838, in N.B.⁽²⁾, probably daughter of William and Louisa Jane (Estabrooks) Dickinson. Her death date and her burial place are unknown.

Benjamin and Lucretia lived in the Parish of Brighton, Carleton Co., N.B. Florence Estabrooks says that Jane, daughter of Samuel and Myra (Palmer) Estabrooks, married William Dickinson and had children Hannah, Lucretia, Scott, Samuel and George.⁽³⁾

Pioneer Preacher - Rev. Seth Noble

The N.B. census of 1851 for the Parish of Brighton shows Lucretia Dickinson, age 13, living with the David and Sarah (Purdy) Estabrooks family, age 13, "fatherless". Ten years later, in 1861, Benjamin's wife, Lucretia A., was 23⁽²⁾. Cronology suggests that Lucretia Dickinson, age 13 in 1851, and Lucretia (Dickinson) Noble, age 23 in 1861, were the same person, and the fact that she named a son William D. (perhaps William Dickinson) lends support to the theory that her father was William Dickinson.

Who was Loisa Roberts, age 43, visitor, living with Benjamin and Lucretia Noble in 1861⁽²⁾? Was she Lucretia's mother, Louisa Jane, and mother of George and William Dickinson who were living in the same household?

11. Hannah³ Noble (*Joseph², Seth¹*), was born May 22, 1831⁽¹⁾, in Lower Brighton, Carleton Co., N.B., daughter of Joseph and Mary (Ackerson) Noble. She died January 25, 1856, and was buried in the old Calvinist Baptist Cemetery in Rockland, Carleton Co. N.B.⁽²⁾

She married **Archaelus Belyea**, December 20, 1854, in Carleton Co., N.B.⁽³⁾. He was born about 1820 [31 in 1851 census], probably at Rockland, son of James and Mary (Albright) Belyea. His death date is unknown.

The Ruth Estabrooks notes say she married Archibald Belyea⁽¹⁾, and the Belyea Genealogy lists Archibald (but no Archaelus), son of James and Mary (Albright) Belyea, and says "His wife died in childbirth. He did not marry again."⁽⁴⁾ However, the New Brunswick census of 1851 and 1861 for the Parish of Brighton does not show Archibald Belyea, but does list Archaelus Belyea; 31 in 1851, and 40 in 1861, shown that year as a widower living with his mother, Mary Belyea, a widow aged 60 years. This, with the tombstone inscription⁽²⁾ and the marriage record⁽³⁾ makes it clear that her husband was Archaelus and not Archibald Belyea.

Hannah died thirteen months after she was married, probably in childbirth as the Belyea genealogy suggests, and I have found no record of children.

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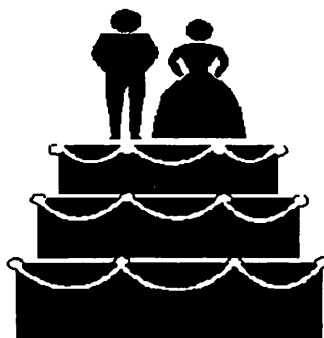

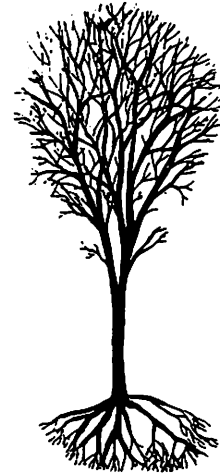

Two Publications Document Early Church and Irish Immigration to Aroostook County, Maine

O'Ceallaigh Publications of Augusta brings us a new publication about Benedicta, and a reprint of an earlier work concerning Houlton. Sister Marie Nicknair's Bishop Benedict J. Fenwick and the Origins of the Benedicta, Maine Community, gives us the story of the forces that shaped Benedict J. Fenwick's decision to found a town and college in the wilderness of Northern Maine. The reader is taken from the decisions of the Bishop through the settling and growth of Benedicta Township. Although written in 1962, few people have ever read this work. Now this excellent contribution to Maine History, and the History of the Catholic Church in Maine, is available to all.

W. J. Thibadeau's The Irishman, A Factor in the Development of Houlton, was written ca. 1909-10 as a reaction to the fact, that at Houlton's centennial celebration of 1907, not one word was put forth about the Irish, nor their contribution to the Town of Houlton. Mr. Thibadeau, his mother being Irish, was offended and decided to write his own book. We of the late 20th century must be grateful for Mr. Thibadeau's reaction, for without it we would not have this important firsthand account about the Irish in Houlton. As well as mentioning most of Houlton's early Irish immigrants, he also discusses the history of St. Mary's Parish, and the Acadians of Madawaska.
