It should be noted that not all of the above acquisitions have been arranged and thus may not be immediately available for research purposes.

During the summer the Provincial Archives, with the assistance of six university students funded by a grant from the Secretary of State, has been reorganizing the records of the Department of Municipal Affairs. A considerable quantity of records which had filtered in from the now defunct county councils has been arranged.

Recent publications include the printed census manuscripts of 1851 for York County (compiled by Elizabeth Sewell and Elizabeth Saunders and available for \$10.00) and Kings County (compiled by Julia Walker and Margaret Duplisea in two volumes, at \$6.00 each.) The Archives also co-operated with Roderick Cummings of Non-Entity Press in the re-printing of the Fredericton "Bird's Eye View" of 1882 and the First History of New Brunswick by Peter Fisher, 1825.

Mid-summer activities and statistics show that the summer of 1980 has been the busiest yet, with 840 visitors registering at the institution in July, compared with 606 for a similar period last year and 436 in 1978.

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LETTERS TO THE EDITOR - - -

3 June, 1980 Dear Secretary, In your letter of 13th May, 1980, you ask if I would mind your members writing to me concerning their forbears in Cornwall. I will be pleased to do what I can to help anyone who cares to write to me.

Perhaps I should explain that one can get all marriages in the Established Church before 1837. Even non conformist marriages were performed in the Church of England before that date.

On the other hand, Christenings in Non conformist chapels could be performed. be performed and many are lost for ever. The ones that did survive were handed in to the PRO in 1837, and an index of these for Cornwall has been made by Mr. Lawson-Edwards. (Librarian of the Society of Genealogists). I have the index here, of course, but the nearest micro-film of the records is in Exeter some 100 miles away. Therefore, although I can easily find hopeful non-conformists from the index, it might be many months before I go to Exeter; usually with a whole list to look up details.

Generally, the number of burials in the non-conformist chapels is small.

The wills for Cornwall survived the war, and are at the Cornwall Record Office. One can not get xerox of them at the moment owing to shortage of staff, but abstracts can be made of course.

Fees for searching: 1 free hr. to all inquiries. Further time for searching \$6.00 per hour (this includes petrol, postage, but not the \$1.00 (approx.) per reel. I should have to pay the CRO if I am obliged to take to the census and not the birth, marriage and death certificates (after 1837) if anyone would like them.

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Letter To The Editor - - - re: Certification of Genealogists in N.B.

26 Sep 1980

Dear Sir:

I have just received Issue #5 - which brings to my attention the imperative need for a file of back issues. I trust the enclosed check is adequate for the four issues of last year.

May I ask that your typists be requested to leave at least one-half inch margin on the binding side of each page? I bind these publications and as you can quickly see, part of the copy on the right hand edge of pages 26 and 28 is going to be lost in the binding.

With respect to the suggested program of certification of genealogists- I would point out that this is a program of tremendous work and one which is already in existence. The Board for Certification of Genealogists, 1307 New Hampshire Avenue, N.W., Washington, D. C. 20036, has been existence since 1964. It was organized by some of the best genealogists in America. It examines and certifies candidates in the degrees of Certified Genealogical Record Searcher, Certified Genealogist Lineage Specialist, and Certified Genealogist for work in the United States and Canada. Its current certification list runs eleven pages long, eight names to the inch, and includes thirteen Canadian residents, one of whom lives in Nova Scotia. (I am a Certified Genealogist, as you can see from the letterhead address). I would strongly recommend the use of this existing machinery as opposed to any effort to create a competitor agency. Any effort to try and develop a competing agency with the limited resources you have available seem to me to be unnecessary, unwise, and unlikely to succeed. I am sure the Board will be glad to furnish you any information desired on request. Sincerely yours, Leonard H. Smith, Jr., Certified Genealogist, 1660 Harmony Drive, Clearwater, Florida.

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Although I would like to thank Col. Smith for his letter and remarks, I feel there are a few points I should make. We have no intention of forming a 'competing' agency, but one to serve the need of New Brunswickers in New Brunswick. Col. Smith mentions there are 13 Canadians certified by the American organization and points out that one is from Nova Scotia. This, quite frankly, is of little value to persons searching, or wanting research done, in this province. I still feel strongly a Certification Board should be established in New Brunswick - Eugene Campbell, Editor, N.B.G.S. Newsletter
