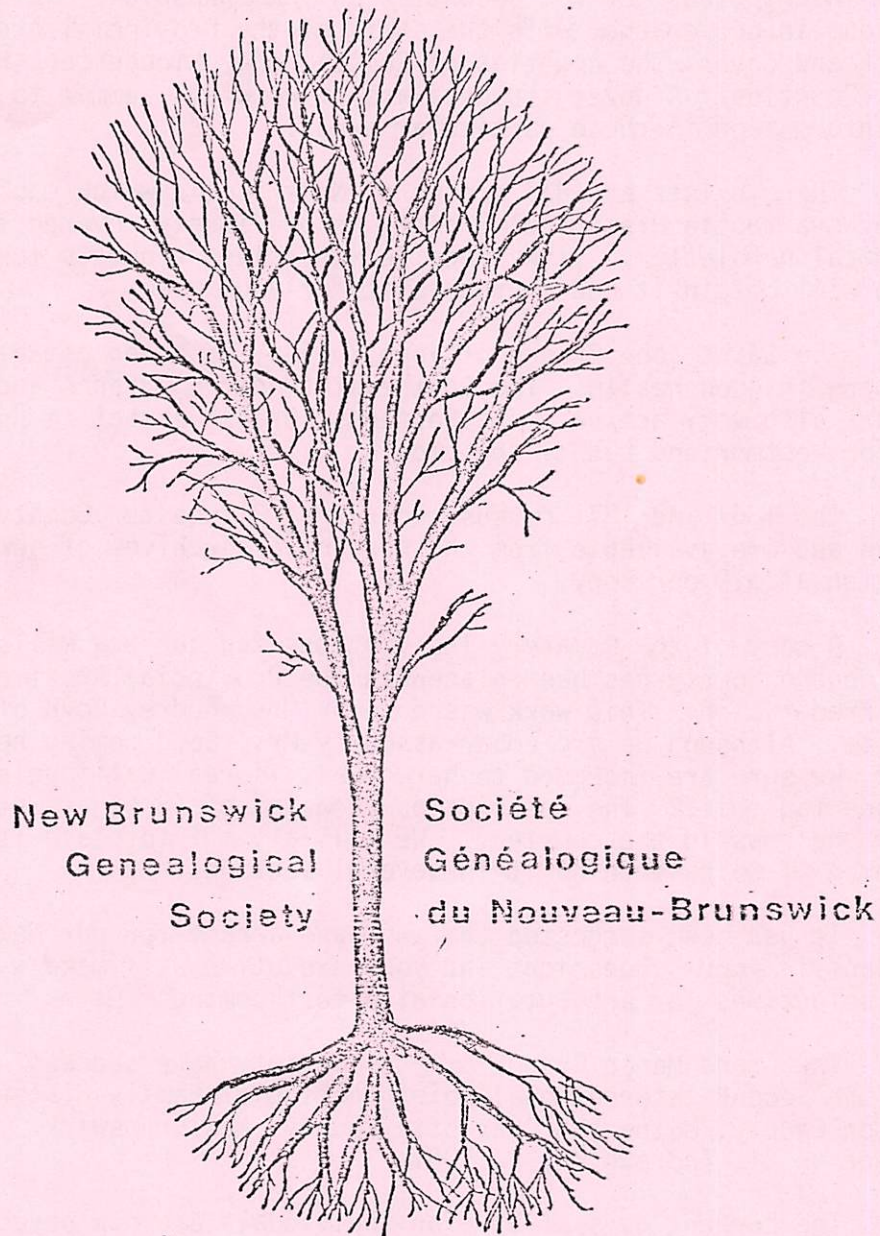

SOCIETY NOTES

Your Society has applied for financial assistance from the Canada Employment Commission to carry out the microfilming of church records and cemetery inscriptions for four counties in New Brunswick. This work is to be carried out in cooperation with the staff of the Provincial Archives of New Brunswick and covers the counties of Restigouche, Gloucester, Northumberland and York Counties. A dozen students are to work all summer to bring you pertinent information in these particular areas.

There exists an 1827 census of Nova Scotia which could be available from the Nova Scotia Historical Society as previously covered in their Genealogical Newsletter. If we receive sufficient requests for this particular item, we will obtain it and reproduce it for your use.

The Saint John Branch of your Society has been established and is functioning in good health. The Southeast (Moncton) Branch and the Grand Manan Branch are also very active. The Southeast Branch expect to publish the 1851 census for Westmorland County this month.


The 1867 and 1871 census records of Gloucester County have been published and are available from the Provincial Archives of New Brunswick in Fredericton at \$10 per copy.

A copy of the Cemetery Inscriptions for the New Mills United Church of Restigouche County has been placed in the Provincial Archives of New Brunswick in Fredericton. This work was done by Mrs. Audrey Boyd of Lodi, California. Although we are embarrassed by Mrs. Boyd coming here and doing the work, we sure are indebted to her. This is real California participation. Can anyone top this?? The inscriptions consist of 48 pages which are in order of the rows in the cemetery. We will attempt to place it in the Newsletter even if we have to do it in several sections.

It has been suggested that we have a name for our Newsletter. Kindly send in your suggestions and your executive will make a selection, or several selections for presentation at a forthcoming meeting.

MRS. SAMUEL TIBBITTS (from the Sun, Saint John, N.B., Wed., August 28, 1907) - The sudden death of Mrs. Samuel Tibbitts, Fairville, which took place yesterday morning, deprives Fairville of one of its oldest and most respected residents. Mrs. Tibbitts was a native of England, having been born in the county of Cornwall in 1824. She was thus in her eighty-third year. In the year of the cholera, 1854, she came to this country with her husband and for the remainder of her life, with the exception of three years spent in Carleton, she has lived in Fairville. Her husband died ten years ago. For some time Mrs. Tibbitts had suffered from the infirmities of old age, but her death was unexpected. She was found dead in bed at six o'clock, having expired during the night. Mrs. Tibbitts was the mother of a large family, numbering fifteen in all, thirteen of whom were boys and two girls. Those who survive are John Tibbitts of Boston, Thomas of Boston, Isaac of New York, Mrs. Alexander Cobb of Cincinnati, Mrs. George Cleveland of Bangor, George Tibbitts of Fairville, Fred Tibbitt of Boston. The funeral will take place from the residence of her son, Geo. Tibbitts.

FUNERAL, (from The Sun, St. John, N.B., Wednesday, August 28, 1907) - - - The funeral of the late Francis Monahan took place at 2:30 yesterday afternoon from his late residence, Brussels Street, to the cathedral, where Rev. Father Holland read the burial service. Interment was in the Catholic Cemetery.

ERNEST RUEL - From the Daily Telegraph, St. John, N.B., Monday, July 30, 1894 ---- The death of Mr. Ernest Ruel, which occurred at Rothesay very suddenly on Saturday evening, was told of in the city late last night and the word came as a great shock to all who heard it. The young man was extensively and favorably known throughout the community, and had been seen by many of his friends but a few hours earlier in full possession of all his excellent qualities of body and mind. He was well known to have been a fine swimmer, and the report that he had been drowned could hardly be credited; the facts now show that his death, though sudden, was not accidental. Mr. Ruel, along with a number of other young gentlemen, has been camping at Rothesay during the summer. Recently several of them have purchased canoes and on Saturday evening each week races have been held. On Saturday last there was three races, a double-scutt rowing race, a four-paddle canoe race and a single canoe race each participant to paddle standing up in his canoe. In each of these contests, which were held in quick succession, Mr. Ruel took part, and, as was his characteristic, worked very hard for victory. After the races he started to paddle to his camp at Henderson's Point, opposite the wharf at Rothesay, to change his clothing so that he could return to a picnic which was being given by Mr. Dr. R. Jack. Mr. Harry Puddington, who had taken part in the races, started also for the camp, and on the way across a little race was proposed by Mr. Ruel. Both men were standing up in their canoes, and Mr. Puddington was in the lead. He missed hearing the stroke of his associate's paddle, and glanced back to see what was the matter. He saw the empty canoe floating on the water. Mr. Wm. Davidson, who was in a rowboat about 100 yards away, noticed the empty canoe about the same time, and started on the way to it at full speed. When he reached the spot his boat was moving very fast, and he shot past. He noticed the body floating and shouted to Ruel to keep swimming and he would pick him up, and at once turned to do so, but the body had sunk. An alarm was at once given, and a search for the body begun. The hour was about 9 o'clock, and the workers could not see very distinctly, but they worked with a will, and made every effort that could be thought of to recover the body. Grappling irons were secured, a message being sent to the city for some. Mr. Fred Hanington, I.C.R. ticket agent, did what he could towards securing the necessary equipment, holding the Halifax Express for a time so that they might be taken to Rothesay more quickly. The people of Rothesay and several from the city who were present, manned the boats and under the direction of Messrs Henry Hall, Harry Gilbert and John Robertson, a most systematic search was made. They worked all night until after day break without any result, but about 4:30 in the morning, after they thought they had searched most thoroughly, the body was found on the side nearest the wharf, in water about seven feet deep. Coroner Fairweather did not consider an inquest necessary. Dr. T. D. Walker, who had been one of the search party, examined the body and concluded that death had

not been caused by drowning. The body was exactly in the attitude which would be assumed by one who was paddling a canoe standing and did not show that any struggle had been made in the water. The canoe had not been upset by the fall, but had drifted ashore and stranded. From his examination, Dr. Walker concluded that death had come suddenly to Mr. Ruel while he was paddling and had possibly been induced by over-exertion during the early part of the evening. Considerable excitement and physical strain had attended upon the races and perhaps had their bearing upon the death. Had the fall from the canoe been an accident, a mere losing of his balance, Mr. Ruel was far too good a swimmer to have perished without a struggle. He was lightly clad and was capable of swimming 20 times the distance necessary to place him in safety.

Of the character and manly qualities of the young man whose life has been so quickly terminated, much can be said. He was the third son of Mr. J. R. Ruel of the customs, and had almost arrived at the 22nd year of his life, a life which gave every promise of being an excellent one. Intelligence, manliness, unselfishness and a decided buoyancy of spirits were characteristics which marked him and made for him hosts of firm friends in his very wide acquaintance. He was passing through a very promising period of preparation for the later achievements to which, in common with his friends, he looked forward. In 1892, he graduated B.A. from the provincial university with honors in English literature and in history, his whole course at the college having been a very satisfactory one, both from the position he took in his classes and also among his fellow students and with his professors. After graduation he came to St. John and entered upon the reading of law in the office of Messrs. Weldon & McLean, where he remained until a couple of months ago, when he entered the office of his brother, Mr. Gerald Ruel. It was his intention to have taken the Harvard course this fall.

He was a member of the YMCA of this city and took a prominent position on several of its most important committees. Speaking generally he was a young man of strength and character, intelligent and manly, interested in all that is well for a young man to be interested in and of fine influence among his friends...

DUNCAN ALLANACH - Moncton, July 28, 1894 Duncan Allanach of Buctouche, Kent County, died at a late hour last night at his son's residence, Bonnacord street here, aged 83. He came to Moncton about two months ago in good health but 5 days since became prostrated with diarrhoea. He was born in Scotland, about 55 years ago, and moved to N.B., where he was engaged in the lumber business. He is probably the

only surviving charter member of Keith Masonic Lodge of Moncton. The deceased leaves a widow, six sons - Samuel of Buctouche; Robert of Kouchibouqasis, John S. of Moncton, William of Newport, R. I., and Alexander and Edward, of Pennsylvania - and two daughters, Mrs. John McKee, of Kent County, and Mary, of R. I. His body was taken to Buctouche this afternoon, by D. & M. Railway, for interment.

PHILIP LONG, c. 1756 - c. 1832. A private in the King's American Regiment 1775-1783; Carrier of English Mail 1783-1828 along the postal route Quebec to Halifax. From 1809 to 1828, resided at the Head of Lake Temisquata. A Loyalist to Canada, New Brunswick, in 1783.

Ed. Note -- Esther Clark Wright in her extensive list of Loyalists shows Long as having received Block 6 in Saint John, and then taking up residence in Lower Canada.

Mrs. Isabelle Laframboise of 945 Elizabeth Street, North Bay, Ontario writes - I was a bit dismayed that the Carman name (which I am researching) was not mentioned in the above issue. (Nov. 1980 Information Bulletin). Would like very much to see a compilation of the earliest cemeteries in Saint John and Bathurst, also Fredericton and Woodstock, N.B. In 1977 I visited the gravesites of my great great grandfather in Bathurst, N.B. -- a small cemetery beside an old church down by the waterfront, which we just happened to locate. I do not know the name of the church - only a block away from the small Tourist centre there. Most likely it is an Anglican church. Could you perhaps enlighten me in this regard?

ARCHIBALD MACLEAN settled in Fredericton, N.B. after the American Revolution, where he had fought with the New York Regiment, a Royalist Corps. He had been at the battle of Eutaw Springs, South Carolina. MacLean represented the County of York, N.B. in the Legislature for 20 years, and died in 1830. Mrs. Lant's great grandfather, Sheriff William MacLean, was a son of Archibald.

The Crab, Crabb, Crabbe and Crabtree families with which his newsletter is primarily concerned are probably all descended from John and Elizabeth (Bassett) Crabb who left their home in New York at the end of the American Revolution, and settled in New Brunswick in 1783. In the 1851 Census returns for St. George Parish, Charlotte County, the following Crabbs are listed; Samuel T., age 48, lumberer, Mary Ann, 47, Mary Ann, 18, Rebecca, 16, George, 11, and Samuel, 9. In Wicklow Parish, Carleton County, we find William Crabb, age 48, farmer, Elizabeth, 47, Charles, 19, Elizabeth, 17, William H., 14, and Thomas, 12. All the above were born in New Brunswick.

The earliest Crabb graves located thus far in New Brunswick are those of Stephen (the oldest son of Loyalist John Crabb) and his wife in St. Paul's Church Yard at Oak Point, Greenwich Parish, Kings County, N.B. - Stephen Crabb departed this life June 18th, 1859, aged 98. Mary Crabb, the wife of Stephen Crabb, deceased in 1853, aged 85.

Daniel Keith was a sergeant in the Queen's Rangers who came to New Brunswick with the Loyalists in 1783. He and his wife Elizabeth settled in the pioneer community of New Canaan in Queen's County, where they brought up a family of 12 sons and 2 daughters. As Daniel grew up and married, there was not sufficient land along the Canaan River to provide farm lots for them, and most moved to establish farms in the Butternut Ridge (Havelock) area of Kings Co.

The book contains over 5 historical chapters dealing with Daniel's military service in a cavalry troop of the Queen's Rangers during the American Revolution; arrival on the St. John River in 1783; the pioneer settlers and the struggle to establish prosperous farms along the Canaan River; and the mass movement of the members of the second generation to develop a flourishing community in and around Butternut Ridge (Havelock) in King's County during the last century.

"...If good minded genealogists feel it would help the field of genealogy in N.B. to have a Board of Certification, why wait and listen to Private and Colonel who attach more importance at their badge & uniforms than the real meaning of genealogy..." Mr. Ghislain Long, Casier Postal 199, Clair, Madawaska, N.B., Canada

"I noted with much interest two comments by American Certified Genealogists in issues Nos. 6 and 7, Col. Leonard Smith of Florida and Robert C. Anderson, respectively, that we should be using the American system of certification since it was set up for both the United States and Canada. Why bother setting up another Board of Certification, type of thing?

"It bothers me very much that we always seem to have to depend upon the United States. Surely we in Canada are capable of setting up our own system regardless of what area it may be. I do not consider myself particularly anti-American, anti-British, or anti-anything, instead I am for Canada and all that Canada stands for. We are quite capable of setting up our own system of Certification for Genealogists, based on the requirements as we see it. Let's get together the best qualified Canadian genealogists to start and see what can be done in this area. We have many very excellent genealogists, one in Nova Scotia who apparently is an American Certified Genealogist. Just possibly this person has something special to offer, but so do many other experienced Canadian genealogists.

"Possibly in Canada we should be setting up special courses in our Universities, Colleges and maybe high schools, or suitable alternatives as a beginning in genealogy and any history. So many skills are required to do a decent job in this field yet with a few properly structured courses at the appropriate time and places, much can be done to raise our expectations in this very fascinating field. Practical experience appears to be an absolute must, but let us start investigating what we Canadians consider important to becoming a Certified Canadian Genealogist..." Gwen P. (Goodwin) King, 85 Heritage Road, Beaconsfield, Quebec.
