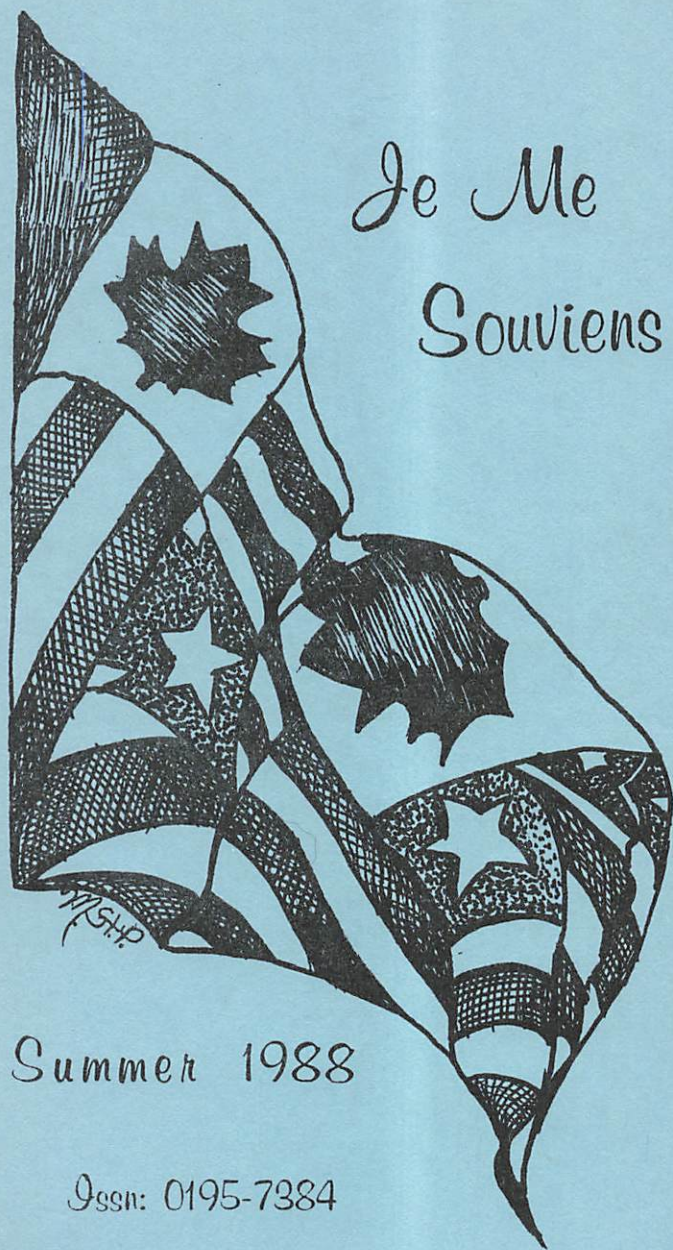

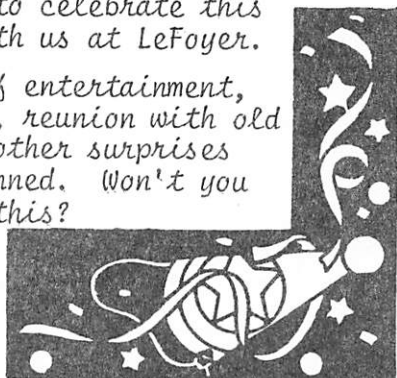
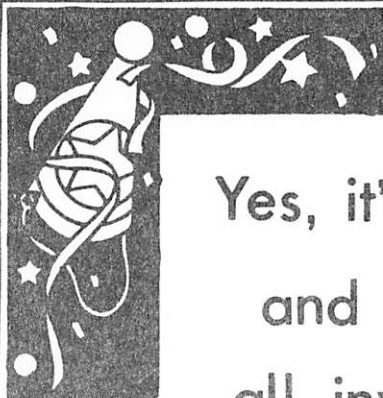
This past March 1988 marked the 10th Anniversary of our Society's founding. We've come a long way since those early days, and we feel that we all deserve a pat on the back for a job well done.



THE LACHINE MASSACRE

It was a stormy night on the 5th of August 1689, when a mass of some fifteen hundred Iroquois surprised the little village of Lachine, located just a few miles southwest of Montreal. The Indians unmercifully butchered, tortured, burned, and, in some cases, even spitted their victims, roasting them over roaring flames like so many Christmas geese. The village was totally destroyed; houses were burned to the ground; villagers scattered everywhere for safety. Some of the villagers were killed as they fled. After the raid, the bold savages did not go very far from the site of their destruction to camp for the night. Rather, they set up camp nearby and celebrated their victory with captured brandy, while feasting on some of their victims as the surviving prisoners looked on in horror.

The massacre was so brutal that the later arriving soldiers were shocked at the devastation they encountered. The troops wanted to set out in immediate pursuit of the Indians in order to extract a measure of revenge. However, their commander dissuaded such impulses, reasoning that the Iroquois were lying in ambush waiting for such an event. Consequently, the soldiers remained in Lachine to care for the scattered remains of the massacre.

It turned out that the commander's instincts were partly correct. The Iroquois had, in fact, planned such an ambush. However, the Indians were so full of belly and so sodden with brandy that most of the attacking force

was fast asleep, with only a handful of the party remaining as look-out.

Orders to the contrary notwithstanding, a few soldiers did set out from the village in pursuit of the Iroquois. They were quickly captured and killed by the more alert Indians. Ironically, had the soldiers set out in full force they undoubtedly would have been victorious in any ensuing encounter.

A few days later, the Iroquois began the long trek back to their village, which is presumed to have been near the present day town of Fonda, New York, along the Mohawk River. They, of course, took their prisoners with them. The strongest of the captives survived the ordeal of the march; the less strong and those who fell behind were killed instantly.

Following is a list of the known victims of the barbaric attack on the village of Lachine:

VICTIMS

ALY dit LAROSSE, VINCENT: born 1649, son of MERY and LOUISE BOUTON of Angouleme, France. He was a former member of the famous Carignan Regiment in the Rougemont Company. He married on 4 October 1677 to MARIE DELPHIN PERRIN, the daughter of HENRI and JEANNE MEERIN. At the time of the attack, Aly and his wife barricaded themselves in their cabin. The Iroquois burned it to the ground. Aly and his wife perished, but seven of their children managed to escape.

BOURSIER, MADELEINE: Born 29 September 1688 at Lachine. She was an eleven month old child who was thrown into the river by the Iroquois and

drowned. She was the daughter of JEAN and MARTHE THIBODEAU.

BOUTIN, ALBERT: Born 7 September 1670 at Quebec, the daughter of PIERRE and MARIE MARCHESSEAU.

CADIEU, MARIE GENEVIEVE: Born 21 July 1669 at Montreal, daughter of JEAN and MARIE VALADE. She married on 27 July 1688 at Lachine to ANDRE CANAPLE dit VALTAGAGNE, the son of ANDRE and MARIE HEDET. Her body was later found decapitated.

CANAPLE, MARIE: Born 30 April 1689, at Lachine, the daughter of ANDRE and MARIE CADIEU.

CHARMOIS dit DEPLESSES, NOEL: Born in 1625. He was the husband of MARGUERITE DELORME. His remains were found burned in his house along with the body of ANDRE DANIS. Charmois and his wife were boarders in the Danis household.

CHARTIER, RENE: Born in 1679, the son of RENE and MARGUERITE DELORME.

CHARTIER, FRANCOIS: Born 6 August 1673 at Quebec. He was the son of RENE and MARGUERITE DELORME.

CHARTIER, RENE: Born in 1625 in France. His parents are unknown. He married on 1 October 1669, at Quebec to MARGUERITE DELORME, the daughter of HUGH and MARIE MAUPIN. Marguerite escaped the massacre.

DANIS dit ARPENTIGNY, ANDRE; Born in 1653, the son of ELIE and MARGUERITE BRAU of France. He married on 21 June 1688 in Lachine to MADELEINE BARBARY, the daughter of PIERRE and MARGUERITE

BELOY. His remains were found in the ashes of the house several years after the massacre. The remains were buried on 20 October 1694.

DANNY, ANDRE: No information is known about him.

FAGUERET dit PETITBOIS, JEAN: His remains were found and buried on 28 October 1694. They were found near a large rock on the property of Rene Chartier and there was evidence that the flesh had been eaten. He was a former soldier of the La VERENNE Company of the Carignan Regiment.

FILASTREAU, PERINNE: Born 19 October 1663 at Montreal, the daughter of RENE and JEANNE HERAULT. He married on 8 November 1677 at Lachine to SIMON DAVAU, whose parents are unknown. She had been decapitated.

HUNAUT, THERESE: Born 12 February 1663 at Montreal, the daughter of TOUSSAINT and MARIE LORGUEIL. She was married on 24 November 1676 at Montreal to GUILLAUME LECLERC, son of ANTOINE and MARIE RAMBOYS. Her body was found in a barn where she had been brutally killed.

MICHEL, PIERRE: Born on 24 September 1672, son of JEAN and MARIE MARCHESSEAU.

MICHEL, JEAN: Born in 1640 in France. Married on 25 November 1670 in Quebec to MARIE MARCHESSEAU. Both sets of parents are unknown. MARIE escaped the massacre with her four children, MARIE RENEE, FRANCOIS, and two others whose names are unknown.

"PANIS INDIAN": She was a slave to RENE CHARTIER and his wife. She was found decapitated.

PERRIN, MARIE DELPHINE: Born 1 April 1664. Married on 4 October 1677 at Montreal to VINCENT ALIX dit LAROSSE, the son of MERY and LOUISE BOUTIN. She and her husband and children barricaded themselves in their cabin during the Iroquois attack; however the Indians burned the cabin and the entire family perished.

RAPIN, ANDRE: Born in 1640, a Chigugien, the son of JEAN and MARIE BOUFANDREAU of Poitou, France. He escaped the massacre, but several bodies were found on his property along with that of his wife, MARIE CADIEU.

THE DERYCKE FAMILY OF ROUBAIX

Albert Arthur Derycke was my maternal grandfather. He was born in Roubaix, France on 11/8/1895. Through oral history and a cache of old family documents, I learned that his father, Albert Jean-Baptiste Derycke, died on 11/4/1903. His widow married Jules Desjardins in 1907. Albert spoke fondly of his stepfather and they seemed to have gotten along well.

Albert's mother, Fedeline Dyedereck Derycke, died on March 27, 1917 in Roubaix.

Young Albert left school at the age of twelve and worked beating rugs, a task for which he earned the sum of ten cents per day. Later he secured a job as a waiter and worked at that until the onset of World War I.

Albert's stepfather was called to active duty because he had previous military service and held a rank. Albert felt it was his duty to serve his country in the Great War.

In 1915 Albert's infantry regiment reported to the Citadel in Lille. Albert was wounded in action, yet remained with his regiment, until such time as he received additional wounds. At this time he was taken prisoner by the German forces. One citation awarded Albert indicates that he received rifle shot injuries to the head and took shrapnel in a shoulder. Albert remained in a P.O.W. camp for a period of nine months, until the end of the war.

We can only speculate as to the conditions Albert endured while a prisoner. He never spoke of that time and it is understandable that he did not wish to re-live those hardships. We do know that both his feet were frostbitten and he felt for a time that he would lose them. Fortunately, he did not.

For his courage under fire Albert was awarded *la Croix des Combattant* and *la Croix de Guerre* by the French government.

After the war Albert visited the United States. His uncle and godfather, Arthur Derycke, was then living on East School Street in Woonsocket, Rhode Island. Albert's aunt, Flore Derycke, was married to Adolphe Depratere and was living nearby in Milville, Massachusetts.

After paying the sum of 1135 francs for his passage, Albert sailed from Antwerp on the steamer *Laplander* of the Red Star Line on May 24, 1920. He arrived at Ellis Island, New York; spent two days there; and then made his way to his uncle's home in Woonsocket.

The planned visit evolved into a permanent stay. Albert found work at the Montrose mill in the Rhode Island city. He met and later married Felice Duhamel. The couple had two daughters, Marguerite and Helene, the former my mother. Later the family moved to Blackstone, Massachusetts, where Albert lived until his death in 1965.

I was fortunate in that Albert's family lived on rue St. Eulethere in Roubaix for three generations. As I began my research into the Derycke family, I wrote to Roubaix city hall

and indicated that my grandfather (Albert) had always been extremely proud of his French heritage and that I sought as much information as possible about his family. By return mail I received photocopies of various documents, some dating from the early nineteenth century. Although most of these copies are hand-written and often-times difficult to read, the data they contain include not only names, but also occupations and backgrounds. Suddenly, for me, my ancestry took on a life of its own! My heritage was more than mere names from the past; it was, rather, family members sharing the joys of baptisms and marriages and offering each other consolation in times of death.

Albert Jean-Baptiste Derycke (my great grandfather) was born in Roubaix, France on May 24, 1869. His wife, Fedeline Dyedereck, was born December 4, 1874 in the same city. They were married on December 1, 1894. They lived, during their entire married life, at 9 rue St. Eleuthere. Fedeline was a housewife and her husband sold wool waste.

When a son was born of the marriage on August 11, 1895, he was named Albert after his father, and Arthur in honor of both his grandfather and uncle.

Albert's paternal grandparents were Arthur Adolphe Derycke (born 3/12/1840 in Roubaix) and Adele Louise Potier (born 3/9/1844 in Croix). Arthur and Adele married on 24/11/1862, also in Roubaix. At the time of the nuptials the groom was a "tisserand" (weaver) and the bride a "rattacheuse" (one involved in the spinning process). According to Arthur and Adele's marriage certificate, Adele's mother, Fidelity

V. Duthoit, died some years prior to the marriage, on 31/7/1807.

Relatively little has been found concerning Albert's maternal side of his family. Fideline Dyedereck was the daughter of Adolphe Joseph Dyedereck (born in 1848 in Roubaix) and Marie Therese Vandavelde (born in 1852). At the time of Fideline's birth in 1874, her father was a mecanicien (a mechanic or engine driver) and her mother a housewife.

In conclusion, there is a family story about my grandfather that is among my favorites, the telling of which demonstrates the spirit and fortitude of the man.

The hurricane of 1938 struck Southern New England with little warning. In its wake was left death and destruction unparalleled to that time. My grandfather was then working at the French Worsted Mill on Hamlet Avenue in Woonsocket, Rhode Island. As windows began breaking from the sheer force of the violent winds, the mill's management decided to close early and to send the employees home to safety. For Albert, this meant walking from Woonsocket to his home in Blackstone, Massachusetts, a distance of some three miles. And this is precisely what he did!

As he crossed the Court Street Bridge (holding on to the railing for dear life), a patrolman warned my grandfather to take cover as there was a hurricane striking. Albert simply related that he had to get home, rather than have his family worry about him. As he walked along Harris Avenue in Woonsocket, trees were being uprooted all about him. Yet, he persevered through this frightening experience.

Eventually, he did arrive home, unharmed and safe, generally no worse for the wear.

EDITOR'S NOTE: The data upon which the above article is based was drawn primarily, if not exclusively, from the author's personal family research. Accordingly, no bibliography was submitted. The only documents submitted were the reproduced birth certificate and certain reproductions of photographs besides those published here. By the absence of documentation, we do not mean to imply a lack of accuracy in the article. We simply have not verified the information.

BEQUESTS AND OTHER GIFTS

On a number of occasions in the recent past various members of AFGS have received inquiries relative to whether the society is interested in receiving books, manuscripts, family charts and records, etc. to add to its holdings. Usually such questions are asked within the framework of a testamentary disposition (by will) and the means and method by which to accomplish such a gift.

The answer to the first question is quite simple: yes, the society is always interested in adding to its holdings and will be grateful for any such gifts. The second question is only slightly more problematical. A properly drafted will should only be done by a competent professional, namely an attorney. Myriad problems can arise out of the well-intentioned efforts of one who attempts to draw his or her own will.

Below are sample will clauses which would effectively bequeath certain property to the society. Like all samples, however, these should be viewed as such. Again, seeking out the assistance of a qualified attorney is recommended.

(a) I give and bequeath to the AMERICAN-FRENCH GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY, a non-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Rhode Island, and located in Pawtucket, Rhode Island all of my genealogical holdings, specifically, (name the items as specifically as possible).

(b) I give and bequeath to the AMERICAN-FRENCH GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY, a non-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Rhode Island, and located in Pawtucket, Rhode Island the following items:(name the items bequeathed.)

(c) I give and bequeath to the AMERICAN-FRENCH GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY, a non-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Rhode island, and located in Pawtucket, Rhode Island the sum of (\$)Dollars.

Finally, it must be pointed out that there is no reason why a gift which can be accomplished under will cannot also be made during one's lifetime. In either case, the board of directors, officers, and members of the AMERICAN-FRENCH GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY are appreciative, in advance, for any gifts made.

**CHURCH ADDRESSES FOR
THE PROVINCE OF QUEBEC

Frequently in the course of one's search for his/her "roots" it becomes desirable or even necessary to obtain a copy of a document confirming an event, whether a christening, marriage, or death. In such cases the options are, in Canada, at least, to write to the Archives or to the parish where the event was commemorated. Experience has shown that the latter course is marginally less expensive. More importantly, writing directly to the parish in search of a record is a much more expeditious method of obtaining the hoped-for results. Accordingly, with this issue we are publishing a list of virtually every parish in the Province of Quebec along with the mailing addresses needed when writing for a copy of a record.

The date which appears parenthetically immediately after the name of the parish is the year in which that particular parish was founded.

Since the complete compilation is voluminous, it is expected that the entire listing will take at least three issues to complete.

Finally, a word about writing to the Quebec parishes. The cost per document is \$5.00-\$8.00 Canadian. Also, it is much better, if possible, to write in French, rather than English. Therefore, at the beginning of the listing on the following pages, we have reproduced a sample letter, in French, which will suffice for all inquiries contemplated by the publication of this listing.

Cher Monsieur/Madame:

Je vous adresse cette lettre en faisant de la recherche genealogique de ma ligne (paternelle/maternelle), celle de la famille (insert family name). Veuillez croire que toute assistance que vous pourriez m'accorder serait beaucoup apprecie.

JACQUES CARTIER'S
OFFICERS & CREW
By Roger C. Ross

(Editor's Note: I recently obtained, at a most favorable price, an 1881 publication entitled, **THE SCOT IN NEW FRANCE--AN ETHNOLOGICAL STUDY**, which is a verbatim printing of a lecture given by one J. M. LeMoine before the Literary and Historical Society of Quebec on 29 November 1880. The pamphlet comprises eighty three (83) pages, including appendices. The title says it all. LeMoine attempts, with varying degrees of success, to trace very early Scotch settlers in New France long before the obvious thousands of Scots who came with the British forces during the period 1756-1760. He approaches his task with some documentation, some anecdotal re-tellings of times past, and a most liberal interpretation of facts. LeMoine even makes a case (although, in my opinion, a tenuous one, at best) for Scotch settlers preceding by many, many years the historically well-known Abraham Martin *dit* l'Ecossais. He does so by examining obviously French-sounding names and torturing a translation of those few names into his thesis-supporting Scotch/Irish counterparts. The point is that those names are found as members of Jacques Cartier's crew aboard various ships in the 16th century voyage from Old France to New. Regardless of the reliability of LeMoine's conclusions in the body of his address, Appendix A of the pamphlet in question contains the names of officers and crew of the Cartier ships with the following notation: "Liste de L'Equipage de Jacques Cartier, conservee dans les Archives de St. Malo, France---revue avec soin sur le fac-simile par C. H. Laverdiere, ptre., Bibliothecaire de L'Universite Laval, 22 Novembre 1859."

It is my thought that the listing of the names of those men in these pages would be, at a minimum, informative, and from a genealogical point of view, perhaps even valuable to our membership and to readers of **JE ME SOUVIENS**. In certain limited cases, the trade or occupation of the crew member appears; I, too, have included that datum.-----Roger C. Ross.)

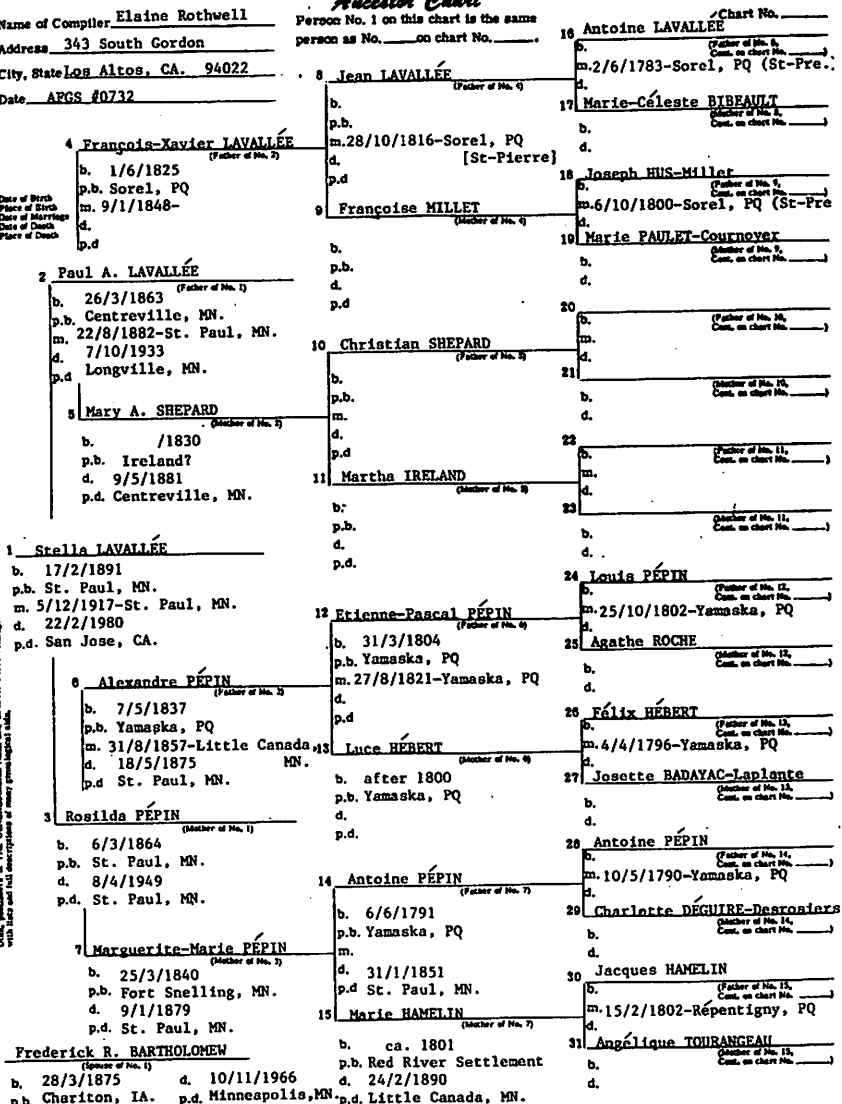

OUR EDELINE dit DELISLE GENEALOGY

by Paul P. Delisle

- I -

DAVID EDELINE and his wife, NOELLE LAMBERT of the parish of St-Jacques-la-Boucherie in Paris, France, were the French parents of our family's ancestor and first colonist of that name in the New World, who was their son:

- II -

CHARLES EDELINE. Born towards 1641 in Paris, and baptized in the parish of St-Jacques in that city, our ancestor undoubtedly arrived on Canadian soil between the start of the navigational season of 1668-1668. This can be determined by the fact that his name is absent from the 1666 and 1667 censuses of Québec, yet his presence is mentioned as a witness to a marriage which took place on the 2nd of December 1669 at Notre-Dame Church in Montréal.

On the 16th of October 1675, Charles married JEANNE BRACONNIER, the widow of Créspin Thuillier, at Boucherville, PQ. From this parish, the Edeline family moved to the neighboring parish/town of Longueuil, where they were listed in the 1681 census as follows: "Charles Edeline, age 40; his wife, age 30; their three children, Catherine, age 5; Charles, age 3; and François, age 1". Other notarial acts dated 1687, 1696, 1697, 1702 and 1711 all give his residence as that of Longueuil, where he was active as a churchwarden of St-Antoine parish. Charles died at the l'Hôtel-Dieu in Montréal at the age of approximately 73 years, and was buried in

Montréal on the 27th of October 1711. Civil records from this period of history offer several variations of the EDELINE surname: Deline, Delisne, Debine and Edline.

Jeanne Braconnier, Charles' wife, was born also at Paris in either 1651 or 1653. She was the daughter of Nicolas and Claude(Brunet) Braconnier from the parish of Ste-Marguerite in that city. She arrived in Québec in 1673 as a "Fille du Roi". On the 10th of September 1673, she entered into a marriage contract with Louis Chapacou before the notary Becquet. This contract was nullified within a week of its being signed. On the sixth day following this first contract, again before the same notary, she entered (on 16 September) into a marriage contract with Créspin Thuillier dit Latour, the son of Urbain and Florence (Paillo) Thuillier of St-Sauveur-de-Péronne in Picardie, France. He was the widower of Madeleine Canard from St-Sulpice parish in Paris. Jeanne Braconnier and Créspin Thuillier were married at Notre-Dame Church in Québec on the 18th of September 1673. There were no known children of this marriage. Their marriage contract mentions that she brought to this union, an estate with an estimated value of 200 livres.

Jeanne Braconnier also died at the l'Hôtel-Dieu in Montréal, eight months prior to her second husband, Charles, on the 20th of February 1711. Their children were:

She married Guillaume Lalonde on 27/4/1710 at Bout-de-l'Ile, Montréal, PQ. There is in reality, no connection between this woman and our Edeline family. Cf. also. Rock, Lucille F. "Guillaume Lalonde dit L'esperance and related families" in J.M.S. IV, 3, 1981].

PIERRE EDELINE, the son of Charles and Jeanne Bracconier, was born on the 30th of June 1683 and baptized on the 1st of July at Boucherville, PQ. He married on the 21st of February 1718 at Longueuil to LOUISE PATENAUDE/PATENOTRE, the daughter of Pierre and Catherine (Brunet) Patenaude. This marriage was short lived, as Pierre died towards 1724. Louise was baptized on the 7th of February 1697 at Montréal. She remarried Michel Pépin on the 12th of February 1725 at Verchères, PQ, where she later died the 22nd of May 1742.

FRANÇOIS EDELINE, son of Pierre and Louise Patenaude, was born on the 15th of March 1720, and baptized on the following day at Longueuil, PQ. His occupation is given as a journeyman. He married first to MARIE-LOUISE ("Françoise") LATOUCHE, the daughter of Marien and Marguerite Daudelin, the 7th of May 1742 at Verchères, PQ. She was baptized at Contre-cœur, PQ on 21 May 1724, and died by 1749-50.

François married secondly, also at Verchères, on the 23rd of November 1750 to Marie Valet [Vallée], daughter of Jean-Baptiste & Marie-Josette Thuot. This family was also described in the 1765 census as follows: "1 house, 1 man, 1 woman, 1 boy under 15 years, 1 girl, 90 arpents of land (10 under cultivation), 1 cow and 2 sheep". [NOTE: Among the French-Canadians who participated in the American Revolution was Charles Racine. He was a private in the Company of a Captain M. Gilbert in the First Canadian Regiment (later called "Congress' Own") commanded by Colonel Moses Hazen of Haverhill, MA. Charles Racine was discharged on the 30th of June 1783. Gabriel Edeline (who gave his name as DELISLE) and his brother-in-law, Joseph-Moyse Racine, filed for a widow's pension for Joseph's mother in 1855 under a law passed by Congress earlier, which entitled certain widows of veterans to receive a pension. At the time of his marriage, Gabriel was listed as a laborer in the United States. (cf. "A Quebecois in 'Congress' Own" and the New York Refugee Tract" in THE GENEALOGIST, IX, 2, Fall 1983].

PASCAL EDELINE dit DELISLE, son of the previous couple, was born towards 1801 in or near St-Marc-sur-Richelieu, PQ. He was a journeyman farmer by occupation. His first marriage occurred in 1825 at St-Marc to Amable Guyon, the daughter of Joseph and Marie-Anne (Levasseur) Guyon. Amable died before 1830, as Pascal remarried on the 27th of September 1830 also at St-Marc-Richelieu to CLÉMENCE GUYON (also known as Théotiste Dion), the daughter of Ignace and Suzanne (Gervais) Guyon. Pascal was a Patriot in the insurrection of 1837. Family tradition states that he was found on the battlefield of St-Charles, the 24th of November 1837, fatally wounded in the neck by a British bayonet. He was buried at St-Marc on the 30th of November.

JOSEPH DELISLE, the youngest son of Pascal's second marriage to Clémence Guyon, was born at St-Marc-sur-Richelieu, PQ on the 9th of December 1837, just days after the death and burial of his patriot-father. His first marriage took place at Beloeil, PQ on the 28th of September 1858 to MARIE-HERMINE MUIR, the daughter of Toussaint and Julie Duvernay-Crevier. He emigrated to the United States before 1879, settling in North Grosvenordale, CT., where he likewise transferred his occupation as a farmer in Canada to American soil, until securing a job in the mill at North Grosvenordale, and later at the mill in Putnam, CT., where he worked until his retirement. After the death of his first wife, Joseph married her sister, Aurélie Muir on the 29th of December 1880 at North Grosvenordale, after which the family then moved to Putnam. Although no proof has been found to substantiate it, family tradition tells that he spent his last years of his life repairing clocks and watches from a shop in his home on Lee Street in Putnam. He died there on the 16th of May 1914, and was buried in St. Joseph's Cemetery, in North Grosvenordale, CT.

ALPHONSE-JOSEPH DELISLE, also known as Albert, was born of Joseph and Marie-Hermine Muir on the 5th of June 1870 at St-Marc, PQ. His occupation was that of a loomfixer in the local Connecticut and Rhode Island textile mills. He married first to Alphonsine Leclair, the daughter of Norbert and Philomène (Lauzon) Leclair at Putnam, CT. on the 7th of January 1892. Like his father and grandfather before him, he too remarried after the death of his first spouse to MARIE-MARGUERITE GINGRAS, the daughter of Augustin and Délima (Lamothe) Gingras, on the 10th of April 1898 at Putnam, CT. Alphonse died the 9th of April 1955 at Woonsocket, RI, and was buried three days later in St. James Cemetery, Manville, RI.

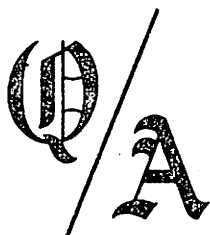
