## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE


## Roger Beaudry, President


This tour has a twofold purpose.


I hope you enjoy the tour.




The research area, looking from the entrance. At the rear, the microfilm room is at the left, and the office is at the right.




This view is of the main stacks, taken from the research area. Note the computers, on the right side of the room.

Our computer equipment is set up here. We have several software research aids, both on the hard drives and on CD ROM. The AFGS Library is one of only three in the State of Rhode Island to have the complete database file of the Rhode Island Cemetery Transcription Project

#### AFGS RESEARCH POLICY

#### STEP ONE: WHAT YOU SEND

Your request and a self-addressed stamped envelope. Your choice of the type of research to be done according to the following descriptions:

- A. Single Marriage Only one marriage to search. Marriages of parents will be counted as additional single marriages and billed as such. Rates are \$2.00 per marriage for AFGS members and \$4.00 per marriage for non-members.
- B. Direct Lineage A straight line of either a husband or wife back to the immigrant ancestor. This will include each couple, their date and place of marriage, and their parents' names. Origin of immigrant ancestor in France will be included where this information can be obtained. Price for this service will determined by the number of generations found times the applicable rate quoted above for single marriages.
- C. Five-Generation Ancestral Chart Standard five-generation ancestral chart of 31 ancestors with 8 marriages found. The last column of names will give parents' names only: no marriages as they will each start a new chart. Prices are \$16.00 for AFGS members and \$25.00 for non-members.

NOTE: Do not send payment in advance.

#### STEP TWO: OUR JOB

After receiving your properly submitted request, we will immediately start your research. We will then notify you of our findings and bill you for the research performed according to the applicable rates quoted above.

#### STEP THREE: YOUR APPROVAL

After receiving our report and billing statement, return the top portion with a check for the proper amount payable to AFGS. Upon receipt, we will forward your requested research.

All requests not resolved by the Research Committee will be placed in the Question and Answer section of *Je Me Souviens*.

Again, please do not send payment in advance.

# THE NEVER-ENDING BATTLE:

# Keeping Vital Records Open for Present and Future Generations

Editor's note: The following is reprinted from the syllabus for the Federation of Genealogical Societies' conference, held last September in Seattle. WA. Also reprinted here is the outline of the accompanying lecture. Standards of conduct for researchers follow this article and will be reprinted in future issues of Je Me Souviens. Our thanks go to the author for giving her permission to reprint this material here. Ms. Reisinger is a member of the FGS/ NGS Records Preservation and Access Committee and is active in trying to promote an attitude of respect towards the records and the records custodians. With record-keeping agencies limiting access to their records, this is an issue that is vital to all genealogists.

#### WHAT CAN WE DO?

While we must remain vigilant, lest someone slip a Closed Vital Records bill through a state's legislature while our backs are turned, we must also be very careful not to overreact. We must check our facts before sending off warning letters to genealogical societies asking them to write to their legislators. One rude, demanding genealogist in a records custodian's office can do more to close access to vital records than almost anything else. We must all adhere to a code of ethics.

#### WHAT ARE SOME REASONS THE AGENCIES CLOSE RECORDS?

The reasons are many and varied. Following are some that are often given:

- To prevent people from adopting a fraudulent identity.
- To protect the integrity of old and fragile records.
- To prevent access to confidential information.
- To resolve the problems created by inadequate space.
- To resolve the difficulty of conducting daily office work.

As society leaders, what can we do to keep records open?

- Educate our members regarding proper conduct in a records repository, whether it is the courthouse, a library, a church office, or archives.
- Reproduce the Accepted Standards of Conduct for Family History Researchers in our newsletter.
- Make it available to all new members and visitors.
- Make it available to all genealogical students.
- Establish a dialogue between vital

records custodians and genealogists.

- Read updates on current specific issues in the FGS *Forum* and the NGS *Newsletter*.
- Encourage the genealogical societies within our state to work together.
- Monitor records preservation and access issues in our area and notify FGS of our efforts.

There are no rights that do not carry corresponding responsibilities. It is not enough to "put out the fires" as they pop up. We must continue our efforts — this is a never-ending battle.

#### SUGGESTIONS FOR RECORDS PRESERVATION AND ACCESS ISSUES:

What can you do if you become aware of a situation that threatens a record collection or access to records? The destruction, deterioration, restricted access, disposal, or disappearance of records is an increasing problem. One individual acting in a timely manner is usually the key first step in preventing a records disaster from happening. You can be that individual! The suggestions below will help you then inform and involve others in working on the problem.

- 1. Obtain as much specific and accurate information as you can about the problem and its causes.
- 2. If necessary, do a little quick research so you understand the laws or regulations that may govern the collection or records involved.
- 3. Explain the situation, as you understand it, to others in your area who may be knowledgeable and concerned. This should include your local genea-

logical society, historical society, and elected officials. Discuss the situation with them and lay out possible options, solicit their opinions, and urge them to act also. Ask your local genealogical society to take further steps, as appropriate; and also make the state genealogical organization aware of the situation.

- 4. Share the information you have found in a clear, factual, nonthreatening manner. You can be courteous while remaining firm and persistent in your concern.
- 5. Compose a notice summarizing the situation for your society's newsletter or quarterly, if there is time to wait for that. Indicate the options and suggested action for society members. Make an announcement of the same information at your society's next meeting. Ask permission to post the information at libraries, historical societies, and other appropriate locations. Print that notice on brightly colored paper (light enough that it will reproduce).
- 6. If there is not a society meeting or publication, ask your society board to consider a special informational mailing, if the situation is serious and urgent enough to justify that action.
- 7. Marshal your fellow individual genealogists. Your voices will be better heard in larger numbers. Urge them to be firm but reasonable in their letters and phone calls, and to indicate their long-term concern in this and other records issues. Genealogical computer bulletin boards are a quick way to reach large numbers of people.
- 8. Contact others, both within your society and beyond, who might have influence in the process or the

outcome of the issue. This includes not only community movers and shakers and the media, but also the average taxpayers, of whom there are multitudes.

- Notify the FGS/NGS Records Preservation and Access Committee of the situation, and keep the Committee advised of developments and outcome.
- 10. Indicate to all involved the desire to resolve this issue; then stay involved and cooperate to develop, in

advance, plans that will help prevent and resolve issues regarding records in the future.

## Accepted Standards of Conduct for Family History Researchers

- ♦ I will be courteous to research facility personnel.
- ♦ I will do my homework, and know what is available, and I will know what I want.
- I will dress appropriately for the records office that I am visiting.
- ♦ I will not take small children into repositories and research facilities.
- ♦ I will not approach the facility asking for "everything" on my ancestors.
- ♦ I will not expect the records custodian to listen to my family history.
- ♦ I will respect the record custodian's other daily tasks, and not expect constant or immediate attention.
- I will be courteous to other researchers and work with only a few records or books at a time.
- I will keep my voice low when conversing with others.
- I will use only designated areas for my work space.
- I will not go into off-limits areas without permission.
- I will ask for permission before using photocopy and microforms machines, and ask for assistance if needed.
- I will treat records with respect.
- ♦ I will not mutilate, rearrange, or remove from its proper custodian any

printed, original, microform, or electronic record.

- I will not force splines on books or handle roughly any original documents.
- I will not use my fingertip or a pencil to follow the line of print on original materials.
- ♦ I will not write on records or books.
- I will replace volumes in their proper location and return files to the appropriate places.
- I will not leave without thanking the records custodians for their courtesy in making the materials available.
- ♦ I will follow the rules of the records repository without protest.

## GÉRARD LEBEL, C.Ss.R

A massive myocardial infarction took from us Father Gerard Lebel, well known genealogist and historian. Society members may be familiar with his name which is associated with a series of books containing short biographies of Canadian pioneers. Fr. Lebel was co-writer and editor of the collection Nos Ancêtres, which appeared in French and in subsequent English translations (The LISI Press, Palm Harbor, FL).

My brother and I had known Fr. Lebel for over ten years, since a colleague in genealogy suggested that we contact him to see if he could provide a missing link or a key to clear our blockage. At our request, a first face-to-face meeting took place at Ste.-Anne-de-Beaupré one Labor Day weekend. Upon seeing us. Father commented that he had expected "deux petits vieux" (two oldtimers); he was, in fact, the oldest of the three. Having overcome his preconceived notion, he proceeded to congratulate us and encourage our work in genealogy. From then on, we maintained regular communications in writing and by telephone; he to provide other answers, we to share our productions. He was a generous man with his time and talent and proved to be a great support to us in the enterprise he amusingly called genea-folly.

Fr. Lebel often expressed his surprise at the amount of research and writing we were able to achieve way down in Kentucky, so far from French-Canadian resource materials. (We have a well-chosen library of basic works but it is not always sufficient for our needs.) He not only complimented us for the books we produced, but gave us strong public recognition in his biography of Vincent Chrétien (Vol. 26), an unrelated contemporary of our ancestor, Michel Chrétien. Father's co-editor, Jacques Saintonge, had previously mentioned us in his biography of Michel (Vol. 17).

We miss Fr. Lebel and his hearty laugh. This year he will not be around to meet us on Labor Day weekend when we make our yearly pilgrimage to Canada. He has left us to join all the many pioneers he praised in his writings. Doubtless he has found the answers to many of his quandaries. His memory inspires us. We believe that in spirit he will continue to offer us his insights to resolve our research problems. May his soul rest in peace.

# The Joy Of Giving .... PCs

Do computers, like people, slow down as they get older? No, but it sure seems that way! Today's software places greater demands on equipment. That, along with higher expectations, nifty options, and tax depreciation, feeds "upgrade fever".

But, while we're preoccupied with when to upgrade, and to what, an important question is often

ignored...what do you do with the old equipment? Some of our members just pass it down the ladder to other family members, or to those whose demands aren't as great as those who are upgrading. The trouble is, many members often can't find anyone who can use the older machines. One alternative is to try and sell the hardware, while another is to sell your equipment to a liquidator or used computer dealer.

A better option, however, might be to give it to a nonprofit organization, such as the *AFGS*. What these machines lack in dollar value often pales in comparison to their value to groups and individuals that really need them.

Our organization would be happy to accept any old IBM-PC, 386, 486 or higher compatible. But, do not forget to take a few precautions! For example, software that works for you might be inappropriate for volunteers. Be careful about giving away machines with copyrighted software on the hard disk. Some software companies allow users to donate older versions of their programs, but it's best to check with the vendor.

Whatever you do, do not let your PC sit in a closet gathering dust! So many people can use them for so many different and very good reasons! (And, it could mean a substantial tax deduction for you!)

## JOLIETTE DAYS

Editor's Note: The following is taken from the book, <u>Je Me Souviens</u> — <u>A Family Remembrance</u>, by Albert BOISSONNEAULT and is reprinted here with his widow's permission. This is the fourth installment. Mr. BOISSONNEAULT's book is in the AFGS Library.

Now although 40 miles is only a hop and a skip by today's standards, it was a far different matter in 1920, especially in that section of Québec; in those days 40 miles was a long, long way! There were no automobiles around there then, and of course no paved roads. The sole transportation consisted of horses and buggies. We would not see my grandparents for the next three years, until their return to Lowell in 1923.

My father's first stop was at the convent where he would leave my sisters. Since they had already spent one year there, the nuns knew them, and the girls were familiar with their surroundings. My father then proceeded with me to the Seminary, about one mile away, where my trunk had already arrived. For an hour or so, my father remained with me, but all too soon he had to leave and catch the train to Montréal where he would board a connecting train to White River Junction.

Looking back on it today, I cannot adequately describe the pain of my first few days at the school, except to state that somehow I survived The priests who were our teachers were very good to me, perhaps knowing the circumstance of my being admitted, but being the youngest boy in a school of about 500 boys ranging in age from 12 to 22 was, on occasion, no picnic. As the most vulnerable, once in awhile I was pushed around and twice I was pushed into the pond on the school grounds. A gravel walk on which the students would walk surrounded this pond. The water was very shallow and when pushed in, I was in no danger, just very wet and humiliated. Of course, this was done when there were no professors about so no one was guilty! Americans were disliked by some of the Canadian boys, especially those from small villages, perhaps because Americans usually had more money and better clothes. Canadians from Montréal were, as a rule, friendlier. Even in those days, Montréal was a large city with stores as well-stocked as those in Boston and perhaps they felt that we were on the same level

I must admit that on many, many nights I cried myself to sleep. With no one to run to for sympathy, I had to learn to cope with conditions, whatever they were. I could not write and tell my father as he already had enough problems to handle. It took some time but eventually I adjusted to the situation and tried to live as normally as possible.

One blessing in overcoming my homesickness was the fact that the school kept us all pretty busy. During the summer, fall, and spring, we were awakened at 5:00 a.m. (yes, you read it right, 5:00 a.m.). We immediately set about making our bed, washing up, and dressing, before heading for the chapel at 5:45 a.m. Mass was celebrated at 6:00 a.m., after which we went to the study hall until 7:00 a.m., when we were finally allowed to eat our breakfast of oat meal, toast and jelly. (On Sundays we were treated to ham and eggs and toast.) Of course we drank milk with our meals. At 7:30 we had free time until 8:00 a.m. when we went to class. At 10:00 a.m. we returned to the study hall until 12 noon, at which time we ate our lunch of meat, potatoes and dessert. From 1:00 p.m. to 2:30 we enjoyed a recreation period, after which we were once again scheduled for classes from 2:30 to 4:30 p.m. Next came our third trip to the study hall, remaining there until our 6:00 p.m. supper was served. The evening meal was soup or stew, with bread and maple syrup, all you could eat. (The high cost of the latter was far in the future!) The time from 6:30 to 9 p.m. was free, and at 9:00 p.m. we went to the dormitory, with lights out promptly at 9:30 p.m.

This was pretty much our schedule for the six days of the week that classes were held, although we did have Tuesday and Thursday afternoons off. On those days we could play sports or go to town. Usually one day a week I would go to a Chinese restaurant near the school. For 35 cents I had a plate of chop suey and milk. I never asked what the chop suey was made with, I was just as happy not to know.

The school was well equipped for sports. Besides two baseball diamonds, one for the big boys and one for the smaller set, it also offered handball courts, tennis courts, outdoor trapeze and rings, and, from November until March a large skating rink.

Smoking was not permitted in the school building itself, but there was an old farmhouse on the grounds where smoking was permitted. During our first day interview, the priest had told my father that if he wanted to buy me a pipe, I would be permitted to smoke, provided that I buy the tobacco. How grown-up I felt with my little pipe and personal tobacco pouch! Matches were only available at the farmhouse, where they were handed out one at a time by the priest in charge that day. I valiantly tried to smoke but soon found that it was not at all to my liking. Canadian tobacco was much too strong for me and so turned me off that I have never acquired the habit since.

Every Sunday, weather permitting, I would be allowed to walk into town to visit my sisters. (In the harsh Québec winter time it was often out of the question!) At the little canteen in the school I would buy candy bars or cookies and take them to the girls – no popcorn or potato chips in Canada in those days!

In November, my father made his first visit to see us. It was very difficult

for him to come so his visits were few and far between.

On Christmas Eve, 1920, my father somehow managed to send a carton full of goodies for the Réveillon after the Midnight Mass. There were ham sandwiches, candy bars, cookies and dolls for each of my sisters. Midnight Mass at the college was not very well attended since most of the students had already left for home. The only ones remaining were those who lived in Joliette and they went home with their parents right after the Mass, so a couple of the priests and I devoured the sandwiches and some of the cookies, the rest of which I took to Estelle and Gabrielle. Luckily, Christmas was not a very cold day and I was able to make the trip to the convent with no problem.

On Christmas Day I was the only student left at the school. I had no place to go since my grandparents were too far away to pick us up. It was a long ten days for me until the fellows came back after New Year's Day. Rather than having me stay in the gloomy, lonely dormitory, the priests moved me into a single room. I also ate in the priests' dining room, and found their food to be about the same as that of the students.

During one of those days, a priest for whom I had served the mass, thinking that he was doing me a favor, gave me a cigar. Would you believe that I was silly enough to smoke it? Was I sick? — for a little while I was afraid I wouldn't die! Somehow I went to sleep and, to my great surprise, survived, but the memory of that experience cured me permanently of any desire to smoke.

On a Tuesday afternoon of a cold winter day, the American Club, which was composed of about 20 boys from the States, decided to travel on snowshoes to a hut owned by the Club. The building was in the woods about three or four miles from the schools, on land owned by the Diocese of Joliette. At my request, my father had bought me a pair of snowshoes and I decided to make my maiden voyage on them by going along with the group. The priest in charge, Father Tisdell, should never have let me go because I had never been on snowshoes before; of course being 11 years old. I did not have brains enough to pass up this experience. I did not even have the proper clothing to go so far in that bitter cold. You needed heavy shirts. sweaters, and pants, and especially moccasins with very heavy socks. My clothing was good enough to be outside for an hour or so, but not suitable for that long a trip in the frigid Canadian outdoors. Travelling on snowshoes was not as easy as it looked. Add to that the fact that all the other boys were older and bigger than me and you will guess that I was soon left far behind. At that point I should have turned back and returned to the school but being a stubborn and perhaps brainless 11 year old, I trudged wearily on, following their tracks in the snow. After an agonizingly long time, I thankfully saw ahead the smoke rising from the cabin in the distance. Since it was located at the bottom of a hill, I managed to stumble my way down, and, shivering and exhausted, finally entered the cabin.

The fire in the stove was then almost out as the group was making ready to return to the school. It was after 3:00 p.m. and the boys were due back at the

school by 4:00 p.m. because darkness came early in those Québec forests. In the few minutes before they started back, they rubbed my feet, hands, and ears to warm me up a little. I drank a cup of hot cocoa and felt a little better. The priest assigned two of the biggest boys to stay with me and bring me back to the school.

As I was still quite cold and weary, I had a very difficult time climbing the hill beside the cabin. Finally we three struggled to the top and started on the return trip only to find that we had somehow lost the trail. To our good fortune, we happened upon some lumberjacks who were chopping trees. They had a great fire blazing so we gratefully huddled about those huge logs for a few minutes. I remember that one of the men let me wear his big mittens. By the time that I had warmed up, it was very dark. One of the woodsmen set us on a path leading to a house about one half a mile away, but long before we reached that farmhouse I was shivering again. The farmer's wife sat us as close to the kitchen stove as possible. She then prepared some pancakes for us which we enjoyed drowned in maple syrup and accompanied by some very hot tea.

Since personal telephones were very rare in that lonely section of Québec in those days, the farmer did not own that modern invention and had no means of notifying the school that we were safe. The good farmer hitched up two horses to his sleigh and, bundled in blankets, he drove us back to the school, a couple of miles distant, arriving there about 7:00 p.m. The school officials were overjoyed at our arrival as they were deeply worried about us; the Québec woods were dangerously cold on winter nights.

For a couple of days I was confined to the infirmary to make certain that my toes, fingers, and ears were not permanently affected by the frostbite I had suffered; luckily I had no severe problem. As for the snowshoes, I never tried them again, and for all I know, they may still be in my old locker. One of the boys who helped me back was named Deary from Webster, MA, whose father operated the Allstar Dairy. I always meant to go and look him up but never did. By now, 1991, he is probably no longer living, as he was about three years older than me.

The priests who operated this school were called Clerics of St. Viateur, a French teaching order. They were similar to Jesuits although not as strict. Wonderful priests and teachers, they were very liberal and understanding. They joined the students in all sorts of sports, especially skating and hockey – of course I was much too young to play hockey. We had a school uniform, a black topcoat with a green sash, but we wore it only when we went to the city of Joliette.

There was not very much of interest in that small city except for an ice cream parlor, where a college ice (sundae) cost ten cents and a banana split or banana royal was 15 cents.

Eventually June, 1921 arrived and my sisters and I were picked up by my father and brought back to Lowell. That summer I stayed at my grandfather Boissonneault's home. My grandmother Boissonneault had died during the year and my father's sister, Rosalie BEAUVAIS, looked after me. My little sisters went to live with my mother's

sister, Anna GENDREAU.

In September 1921, my sisters and I returned to school in Joliette. The parting from my father was not as painful as that of the previous year. I pretty well knew what to expect and of course I was happy to see again the friends I had made the year before. I was also glad to see my teachers and to discuss the summer's happenings.

Very soon the academic year started and I was now in the fifth grade. I must say that I always enjoyed school and was a pretty good student. We spent about four hours a day in the study hall which gave me plenty of time to complete all of my assignments. During that second year I was confirmed by Bishop FORBES. His home was next to the college and we saw him quite often as it was his practice to regularly visit the school grounds to watch the various games.

Again I stayed at the school during the Christmas vacation, but this time I had company as another boy from the States also stayed at the school.

Several times I have spoken about buying candy and ice cream and I suppose you are wondering where I obtained the money to buy these things. Every month my father would send me a money order to pay the board for my sisters and me. The check was in the amount of \$140.00; \$80.00 for my two sisters' board and \$60.00 for mine. As the check was for American money, I would take it to the Bursar's office where he would convert it to Canadian money, take out the board and give me the remaining balance. The exchange

was usually around nine or ten percent, and that percentage was my allowance for the month. With this money I was able to indulge my great fondness for chocolate bars and cookies, although I did share much of it with my sisters.

By now I had become quite well adjusted to school life in Joliette. I sang in the choir, served as an altar boy and took a role in a small play. Although I remember that I played Clovis, the son of Charlemagne, oddly I have no idea today what the play was about.

All of the students were also active in the school militia. After the end of World War I, the British Army discarded a large inventory of obsolete uniforms previously used in the Boer War of 30 years before. We, the school militia, wore those old rags and puttees and drilled all over the school grounds. We were a fierce and raggedly aggregation beneath those wide-brimmed campaign hats and wraparound leggings, and would, I think, have fitted very well in a Gilbert and Sullivan operetta!

Almost before we knew it, June rolled around again and we returned to Lowell. That summer the three of us stayed with my kindly Aunt Anna, who had cared for my mother during her illness, and her husband, Uncle Edmond, in South Lowell. At the time of our visit, they had one baby, Thérèse, though later, the Gendrerau family grew with the births of Réné, Paul, and Rita.

During this stay at Aunt Anna's home, I woke one night in my bedroom and proceeded to walk in my sleep. The foot of the bed in which I slept was made of brass tubes; these tubes ended in an-

other brass tube which peaked at the center of the bed's foot. The sides of the tube were rounded out. In my sleep, I walked to the foot of the bed, felt the peak in the center and thought it was the radiator cap in my uncle's car. When I touched the ends I imagined that they were the headlights and that I had been accidentally locked up in my uncle's garage. Having reached that conclusion, I decided that I had to get out so I went to the window, opened it and promptly jumped out. Luckily for me they lived on the first floor, perhaps six or seven feet from the ground. When I landed on the gravel below the window, I had a rude awakening; there were no sidewalks in South Lowell. I did not swear because I did not know any bad words, either in French or English, but there I stood, at about 2:00 a.m., in my nightgown (no pajamas for me in 1923).

What to do? I had no choice but to knock on the door, wake my uncle or aunt, and have them let me in to return to my nice, warm bed. I knocked on the door and after a few minutes, heard the footsteps of my Uncle Edmond. Before he unbolted the door, he asked "Who's there?" and when I answered "It's Albert", he said that Albert was in bed. I said, "No, I'm out here" and when he finally recognized my voice, he opened the door. By then my Aunt Anna was also on the scene and I described how I had found myself outside the house. They probably wondered what kind of nut I would eventually ripen into. To be on the safe side, my uncle nailed that window shut but as far as I know I never walked in my sleep again.

It was a lazy summer, with nothing special happening, except that three times a week my father's train would pass through South Lowell, around 7:00 p.m. We would go to a field near the tracks and our father would throw out a box of chocolates. Unknown to us, those boxes were prepared by our future stepmother, Grace ROBERTSON, nee BROWNE. She was then working at the North Station Drug Store and we later learned that she had packed those boxes especially for us. Needless to say, they were enjoyed by all.

## HOW DID MY LAGACÉ ANCESTORS END UP IN NORTHERN MAINE?

I've always wondered where my French family ancestors originated from, and how my family ended up settling where they did (in Northern Maine). I suppose these are two questions about which all of us are curious, and for which helped spark my genealogical research. After much work, I found out that my 9th great-grandfather, André MIGNIER DIT LAGACÉ, came to Québec from Ile de Ré. France. As a French soldier, André was sent by the King in the 1660s to protect settlers from the Iroquois. But that still left the question, how did the LAGACÉ name migrate from Québec to Maine?

The answer to this puzzle, as I later discovered, was linked to my 4th great-grandfather Joseph MIGNIER DIT LAGACÉ and his son, Germaine. As it turns out, Joseph (son of Basile & **LECLERC** DIT Madeliene FRANCOEUR from Ste. Anne-de-la-Pocatiere, Québec) was the first of my LAGACÉ ancestors to take the difficult journey hundreds of miles east out of Ouébec to the timber and farm-rich areas of western New Brunswick. Between 1805 and 1812, in a time when New Brunswick was still under control of the British government, Joseph (in his late thirties) and his wife Josephte PELLETIER decided to leave Québec to settle in the fertile lands around Ste.

Basile, New Brunswick. Located about 20 miles northwest of Van Buren, Maine, Ste. Basile borders present-day Maine. Back in those days, however, Maine was not yet a state and the boundary dispute between Maine and New Brunswick had not yet been settled (not until 1842).

We know from official records that Joseph was a cultivateur, or farmer, but WHY he decided to leave Québec to start over in a strange land still eludes me. Was it because of the fertile farm land available at low cost due to earlier British land grants? Did he just want a change? Or worse, was he escaping justice?! These questions are very hard to answer 200 years later having only limited information at my disposal; however, economic factors are probably the most likely reason. I do know that he arrived in New Brunswick with Josephte and five known children at a time when the province's population was booming. Joseph and others (mostly British immigrants) helped triple New Brunswick's population in 21 years — from 25,000 in 1803 to 74,000 in 1824.

The most important piece of the puzzle to solve, however, was how Joseph ended up in Maine. I had traced him close to where I grew up in Aroostook County, but he still lived across the river which marks the interna-

tional border with Canada. The answer. I learned, was not through Joseph but his eldest son. Germaine (my great-great-Joseph-Germaine great grandfather). (aka Germaine) LAGACÉ was born on 11 April 1796 in Riviere-du-Loup, P.O. and was still a young child when his father moved his family from Quebec to New Brunswick. Germaine grew up in St. Basile and married Marie LECLERC in St. Basile on 4 November 1823 According to the Deane & Kavanagh Report in 1831, Germaine and Marie were living next door to the St. Basile Church and they owned a house and stable. Their land had a width of 10 rods, and they had 4 acres in cultivation

But shortly after this survey was taken. Germaine and Marie mysteriously left their home and farm in New Brunswick and moved across the river into Maine with their five children. By tracing the birth/baptismal records of Germaine and Marie's children, I deduced that they must have moved across the border into Maine in late 1831 or early 1832. This was inferred from their daughter, Marie Rose's birth record who was born in April of 1832 in Frenchville. Maine. The family is seen 7 years later living approximately 30 miles away in Van Buren. Maine where we find the birth record of their son, Jean (born in 1839).

Alas! The mystery of how my LAGACÉ ancestors came to Northern Maine has been solved. But in doing so, several new questions that my curious soul would like answered have now been uncovered. Isn't this what always happens with genealogical research?



## HAVE COMPUTER, WILL PUBLISH

Genealogy has captivated my interest for many years, but like so many other people, there never seemed to be enough time to devote to this fascinating hobby. It wasn't until I discovered the AFG Society that I began working in earnest. About three years ago I started squirreling away several hours a month. By last spring I had harvested a good crop of partially completed genealogical charts. Several family members, in particular, a paternal aunt, indicated a genuine interest in our family history. They were not necessarily intrigued by the lists of names, dates and places. They were piqued by the human elements, the little dramas, the quaint circumstances and the stories of courage. Thus, the idea was hatched that someday I would write a historical narrative as a unique gift for my aunt and family. There was, however, a serious impediment, I had tragically contracted the Genealogist's Disease called I don't have enough information, otherwise known as, My genealogical charts have names and dates missing. Consequently, I procrastinated in putting my plan into operation. One day, I finally faced reality, there would never be, in my estimation, enough information. Some names and dates would probably always remain elusive. Undeniably, my aunt and I were not getting any younger. It was time to get

started. Christmas was the deadline.

#### THE HISTORY BEGINS

Fundamentally the plan was to produce a short biographical chapter of four or five pages about our first Québecois ancestor, Claude Poulin. Another similar chapter would be dedicated to my grandfather, Elzear Poulin, my aunt's father. If a couple of pictures were included the work would appear more professional and interesting. In order to provide a backdrop for the narratives, I used histories of my ancestors' native cities and anniversary booklets from the relevant parishes. Both of these ancestors were integrally associated with their parishes. Thus these publications provided interesting photos and human interest anecdotes which could be easily incorporated into the account.

#### **CLAUDE POULIN**

Several sources contributed basic facts about Claude Poulin<sup>1</sup> including a few graphics and endnotes.

My grandfather's chapter seemed more daunting. There were indeed many photos, but I wanted to avoid creating a chapter that was a glorified photo album. My aim was a short fac-

tual biographical account of my grandfather's life.

his baptismal Locating church's anniversary album²family in the United States, copies of census reports for 1900,1910, 1920 were significant. These documents revealed the date of immigration, the ability to read, write and speak English. The Central Falls City Directories, found at the Pawtucket Public Library pinpointed great grandfather's family and later grandfather Elzear's home address and provided information on home ownership. occupation and sometimes the actual date of death of the head of household. Naturally when the actual date of death was known the local newspaper's obituaries provided valuable information.

Compiling these bits and pieces of my grandfather's life into a narrative proved interesting and challenging. Again I underestimated the amount of information available. The twenty page biographical account unearthed several little known facts about Elzear and his wife, Louise Duplessis.

#### THE BOOK GROWS

With nearly fifty pages of text this work was taking on a life of its own. It seemed appropriate to divide the book into five sections: the introduction, two biographical chapters, a documents section, genealogical chart inserts, and bibliography.

In the documents portion were copies of: birth, baptismal, marriage, death certificates, illuminations from

church registers, naturalization papers, census reports, newspaper obituaries, memorial cards, newspaper articles, and an assortment of other data. The series of genealogical charts were every genealogist's treasure: albeit, these were most incomplete. Now the book numbered over eighty pages, still there was so much more that could have been included, but my self-imposed Christmas deadline was advancing at a dreadful pace. The decision had been made and the constraints accepted. Printing and production began in earnest.

#### TECHNOLOGY TO THE RESCUE

The text and graphics were done on a 486 IBM compatible laptop computer using the softwares WordPerfect 6.0 for Windows 3.1 and Family Tree Maker 2.0. A colleague scanned the pictures and photos on disks which I was then able to adapt, modify and caption through my computer. The book was bound by plastic spiral binders. (For those who do not have access to a scanner many copy centers provide this service with varied prices. Copy centers also offer binding capabilities with plastic spirals).

#### THE GIFT

The Poulin Family Book as a Christmas gift was a success. It was far from perfect. There were errors, gaps in information, and lack of continuity. Yet, it was a beginning from which I learned much and acquired a great deal of experience. As a colleague encouragingly remarked, "This book isn't imperfect, it's a work in progress." All genealogists know that their research is never absolutely fin-

ished. Thus this publication can be considered as the first rung of a ladder on which I, my relatives, and others may climb the Poulin Family Tree.



This photo was taken during the winter of 1909-1910 and shows Napoleon-Augustin CLOUTIER and his family posing in front of their home in Disraeli, Wolfe Co., Québec. The building attached to the house was used for Napoleon's bakery business. Pictured from left to right are Isabelle; Anne-Marie; Rose-Alba GARNEAU, wife of Napoleon, holding Florentin; Gabrielle; and Yvette. Florentin died shortly after this picture was taken, and Anita was

born in July 1910.

Napoleon operated the bakery from 1909 to 1915. In that year he sold the business to the Jolicoeur family, and the family moved to Woonsocket, RI; hoping to find a better life for themselves. Napoleon worked in the mills for a short time and then opened a grocery business on Burnside Avenue in Woonsocket.


Napoleon died in Biddeford, ME in 1940; his wife died there in 1948.

At long last we are able to report that the Massachusetts microfilm is on order and the latest word is that the order will be filled within the next six weeks. Perhaps the films will be at the Library by the time you receive this issue of Je Me Souviens. After many delays, the Massachusetts Archives finally suggested that we order the films directly from the LDS and once this was done. there were no more delays. I know that you are as anxious as I am to have this valuable tool at the Library. I am also happy to report that more films from Rhode Island have been ordered and that we are looking into purchasing films for New Hampshire.

We have had another busy publishing year. We have had very successful sales of our books and this had made it possible for us to publish other books. Please watch your mailings for announcements as we introduce our many new volumes. These very fine books will be wonderful additions to our Library and your personal libraries. Please see if your local libraries will be willing to purchase some of our books for their genealogy sections. I know that genealogy enthusiasts everywhere will find these books to be helpful.

We now have some birth, marriage and obituary information from the Springfield, MA area available at the AFGS Library. This information was generously provided by Albert Roy and Marcel Gingras. They have been collecting this information for many years and we are happy that they have been willing to share it with us.

We have added some major material to our future publication list. This includes St. Ann's Church of Fall River, MA; and Precious Blood Church of Woonsocket, RI. These two very old and important parishes will be wonderful resources for our members.

We are continuing our work on our Blackstone Valley Heritage Corridor Project. Material is being gathered from all the cities and towns in the corridor from Worcester, MA to Providence, RI. Included are Worcester, Millbury, Grafton, Sutton, Upton, Northbridge, Douglas, Uxbridge, Millville, Hopedale, Mendon, and Blackstone in Massachusetts; and North Smithfield, Smithfield, Lincoln, Central Falls, Woonsocket, Cumberland, Pawtucket, and Providence in Rhode Island. Starting with vital records that are already in our library, we will be adding church, cemetery, and funeral home records for as many of these locations as possible. To accomplish this very ambitious program, we need help. We need volunteers to donate their time at the Library to copy microfilm records; we need people to do some work on their home computers; we need people to

take our copying machine to specified locations to copy records. Most important of all, if you know funeral directors in any of these localities, would you be willing to approach them to get permission for us to copy their records? Please let me know what you are willing to do. There are also some research projects to do at various libraries or town halls. This could be your chance to get involved and meet some new people in your Society. I really hope to hear from you, that is why I am repeating this plea for help.

Our obituary, bride, and milestone projects continue to grow weekly. Thanks to all the loyal members who continue to clip, paste, copy and catalog this wonderful information. Please keep up the good work. If you have obituary information on family members, you might want to make a copy and send it along to us. We can then add it to our collection. If you would like to join us in this project, please feel free to do so. Just clip out pertinent information from your local newspaper and send it along to us. If you live nearby and would like to join Noella and her crew in working on the final pages of this project, please let us know. It involves taping the obits on sheets and making sure that the pertinent information is listed for each obituary. This is a project that can be done at home.

An index to all of our obituary books is presently in production. When the index is completed to Volume 50, we will offer it for sale. I think that this will be a great research tool. We plan to offer copies of individual obituaries.

Paul Delisle and Roger Beaudry continue to mastermind the cemetery project. The computer program used in this project has been installed on the Library computers, and is available for your use. The AFGS Library in one of only three facilities in Rhode Island which has the complete files for the statewide cemetery project. The other two are the Rhode Island Historical Society Library and the E. Grenwich, RI Town Library. Roger Bartholomy and his committee are working very hard to provide records and resources on CD for use at our Library. These new resources add an exciting new dimension to the tools available to our members.

We have many new books in the Library and many more are on order. A list of our new acquisitions follows. We continue to make every effort to keep our Library up to date and to purchase new books as they become available. We appreciate those members who continue to donate to the book fund. **Length:** Length of your article should be determined by the scope of your topic. Unusually long articles should be written in such a way that they can be broken down into two or more parts. Surnames should be capitalized.

Style: A clear, direct conversational style is preferred. Keep in mind that most of our readers have average education and intelligence. An article written above that level will not be well received.

Manuscripts: This publication is produced on an IBM-compatible computer, using state of the art desktop publishing software. While this software has the capability to import text from most word-processing programs, we prefer that you submit your article in straight ASCII text or in WordPerfect 5.1 or 6.x format on either 5.25" or 3.5" floppy disk. If you do not use an IBM-compatible computer, or do not have access to a computer, your manuscript should be typewritten on 8.5" x 11" paper. It should be double-spaced with a 2-inch margin all around. If notes must be used, endnotes are preferable over footnotes. A bibliography is desirable.

Illustrations: Our software is capable of importing graphics in most IBM-compatible formats. Vector graphics (PIC, PLT, WMF, WMT, CGM, DRW, or EPS) are preferred over bit-mapped graphics (BMP, MSP, PCX, PNT, or TIF). Scanned images can also be used. We prefer the Tagged Image File Format (TIF) for scanned photos. You may also submit printed black-and white photographs. We will have them scanned if, in our opinion, the photo adds enough to the article to justify the cost.

Other Considerations: Authors are responsible for the accuracy of all material submitted. All material published in *Je Me Souviens* is copyrighted and becomes the property of the AFGS. All material submitted for publication must be original. Previously published material, except that which is in the public domain, will be accepted only if it is submitted by the author and is accompanied by a signed release from the previous publisher. Articles that promote a specific product or service, or whose subject matter is inappropriate, will be rejected.

Members' Corner: Members' Corner is a section whose purpose is to provide a conduit by which our members may contact each other for the purpose of exchanging information. This is a service provided for members only at no cost on a space-available basis. You may submit short items (one or two paragraphs) in the

Book dealers may not use this space. Book dealers are encouraged to purchase advertising space in this journal. Rates are published on the inside front cover.

Cousin Search - If you have a <u>living</u> relative with whom you have lost contact, you may use this space to help in your search. Include the person's full name and last known address, along with any other pertinent information.

All submissions to Members' Corner must include your name, address and phone number. Deadlines are 15 December for the Spring issue, and 15 June for the Fall issue. Keep in mind that this is a semiannual publication. Where time is important, items should be sent to AFGnewS.



## PARTING SHOTS

This past Spring, after almost a lifetime of living in the bustling metropolis of Woonsocket, RI, we packed up all of our worldly possessions and moved to the sleepy hamlet of Millville, MA. Now, after more than half a year later, we pause and take time to reflect upon the changes this move has made upon our life-style.

The losses: While we miss the convenience of retail stores being close by, they are only 10 minutes away. We have lost the noise of city life; the smell of auto exhaust under our bedroom window; the sounds of neighborhood teenagers partying at all hours. We will not miss the frequent fender-benders at our busy intersection, nor the drivers' language as they curse each other for causing the accidents. We will not miss the 3 AM drug raids on our neighbors which seemed to have no effect.

The gains: The peace and tranquility of living in a semi-rural setting. The smooth flowing river nearby with its abundant wildlife. The peace of mind that comes with knowing that our grand-children can play safely in our neighborhood.

All of this was not unexpected. However, there was one thing that came as a complete surprise: Not only was our new home situated in a historic neighborhood, but we found an authentic piece of local history in our own back

yard. Our home is situated about 300 feet from the Blackstone River. It was this river that supplied power to run the mills that brought so many of our ancestors here to seek a better life for their families. On the west bank of the river. within sight of our back porch, there is an interesting bit of stone work, obviously very old. Our curiosity was awakened. Closer inspection showed it to be a trench lined with large granite blocks. Was this a raceway for a long-gone mill's water wheel? Further investigation revealed that what we had found was the Millville Lock of the Blackstone Canal The canal was built in the 1820's as a means of moving goods and materials between Worcester, MA and Providence. RI. This lock is one of the few surviving examples of the canal architecture, and probably the best preserved. It is in amazingly good condition, a tribute to the craftsmanship of its builders.

The lock itself is an interesting study. It is barely ten feet wide on the inside, and almost 100 feet long. It was designed to accommodate the long, narrow canal barges. The huge, hand-hewn granite blocks are precisely fitted together, without mortar to form solid walls that have not moved in over 170 years. The wooden gates are gone, and the wrought iron hardware that held them in place disappeared long ago, but it doesn't take much imagination to vi-


sualize them in use.

While the Blackstone Canal was in operation for barely twenty years before it gave way to competition from the railroads, it gave a much needed boost to the area's manufacturing economy. The Blackstone Canal started a long period of growth for the textile manufacturers in the Blackstone Valley that lasted well into this century. It was this growth that brought so many of our ancestors from Quebec to this area, looking for a better life.


Our home housed some of those immigrants. Most of the 20 or so duplexes that were built in *Brannigan's Village* are still standing. Their first inhabitants probably would not recognize the neighborhood now. The homes have been renovated, some several times. The general store and school house built by

the owners of the rubber boot manufacturer across the river are both gone, their foundations almost hidden by the thick growth. Also gone is the red plank covered bridge that was built to connect the village with the mill. On the western side of the village lies an abandoned railroad bed, which served a second mill, this one manufacturing woolen goods. All that is left of this mill is a long cellar hole. In moving to Millville, we discovered a community that is rich in history.

Changing the subject . . . We hope that you paid special attention to Joy Reisinger's article on page 7, and the Standards Of Conduct on page 10. Our thanks to Ms. Reisinger for allowing us to reprint this material. This should be required reading for all who work with public records.

The vertical shadow on the right wall is an indentation that accommodated the gates. There is a similar indentation on the opposite wall. The lock is about 40 feet deep.
