A GLIMPSE AT CAMERON PARISH, LOUISIANA IN 1936 (extracted from an article in the Beaumont, Texas Enterprise of May 31, 1936)

The Grand Chenier settlement serves a parish population of about 6000 persons who dwell on farms scattered over an area of more than 1000 miles.

Cameron Parish, with its southern boundary skirting the Gulf of Mexico, ane with a history that dips back into earliest Louisiana times, continues the quaint and homespun traditions of another day. At the same time, evidences of the newest in modern trends are everywhere present. The contracts are delightful.

Horseback is still the favorite mode of travel but there are now several improved highways, but not a single mile of railroad. There is no means of telegraphic communication and the only telephone in the parish is connected with the outside world in the courthouse at Grand Chenier.

The people belong to a wholesome social order and have a good percentage of wealth and literacy. The parish is dotted with churches and good schools.

Many descendants of the original settlement still live in Cameron Parish. They were native Louisianians known as Americans, as distinguished from French-Acadians who had settled to the northeast at what is known as Cow Island.

Following the Civil War, however, Captain E. A. DURR, member of the state legislature, was directed by a number of persons from Lauderdale County in Mississippi to ferret out a section of country that was free from carpet bag rule. He came to Grand Chenier and found it inviting country. It was new and unsettled except for a few homesteads along the ridge, or "chenier", for which it is named.

CAPTAIN DURR became the leader of the colony of Mississippians. His daughter, MRS. J. W. DOXEY, still lives at Grand Chenier. Others of the original party were CHARES and BROWN GORDON, B. C. and JACK HARPER, THOMAS and ABSOLUM GILLESPIE, MATT CARPENTER, MRS. SUTTLES and WM. E. MCSHAN.

A settlement at Pecan Island, also in Cameron Parish, was made by EDMOND and JACOB VAUGHN, WIMON WHITE, TEOGENE LABAUVE, JOHN and PHILLIP STEIN, MICHAEL MILLER, FROZIEN ROY, LUCIEN BERTRAND, PIERRE VALCOUR MILLER, VOLSAIR MONTIE, JOE BONSALL, JOHN W. SWEENEY, JOHN D. GORDY, LAURENT STURLESE, MILLEGE MCCALL, JOHN WEATHERILL, WILLIAM DOXEY, JOHN ARMSTRONG, JAMES HALE, GEORGE ROOT, PAUL JONES, and others.

The visitor to Grand Chenier is charmed by the magnificence of its setting: strips of verdant highland, dotted with massive live oaks that shelter inviting farmhouses. Rice, cotton and pecans are chief products of this section. Because of its coastline oystering, shrimping and crabbing are among the major industries. Hunters find the territory well supplied with ducks, geese, rails, snipe, quail, doves, rabbits, squirrel and deer.

HEREDITY

BOOK REVIEW

GUNTER, compiled, written and edited by Edwin D. Gunter, Edwin D. Gunter, $\overline{\text{Jr., Lena}}$ Mae Fryer, and Barbara Fryer Price; 391 pgs., name index, $8\frac{1}{2}$ x 11", soft cover, illustrated; \$27.00 (Texas residents add \$1.25 sales tax), order from Mrs. Lena Mae Fryer, Box 608, Fairfield, TX 75840. Profit from sales of this book will be used to establish a scholarship at Stephen F. Austin State University as a memorial to Claiborne Cooper Gunter, who became a Methodist minister at age 16, settled in Nacogdoches County, Texas and served there until his death in 1881. One section of the book deals with Gunters in the United Kingdom. Although no definite proof has been found tying these to the first Gunters in America, the author offers convincing evidence of the connection, and has been very thorough in his research. The Gunter family is traced through many states, including Tennessee, Mississippi, North Carolina, Arkansas, Virginia, Kentucky, Alabama, Kansas, Missouri, Texas and the Cherokee Nation, Oklahoma. A 194 page appendix section includes census records, wills, deeds, and other misc. records. book is illustrated with many photos of Gunter family members and maps and charts which add much to the book in terms of documentation and readability.
