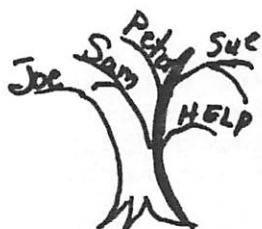
***SOCIAL COMMITTEE REPORT-Marge Small**

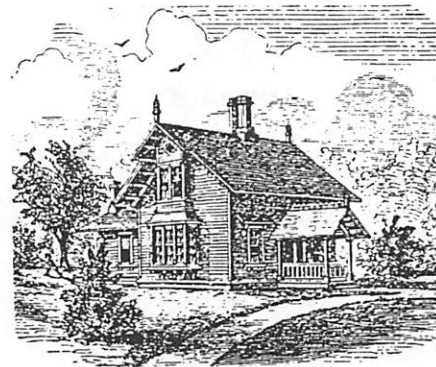

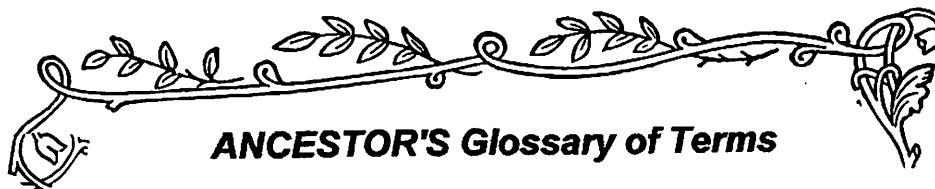

ANCESTOR'S Glossary of Terms

One of the most difficult challenges faced by any genealogist is keeping track of the tremendous number of phrases and terms associated with family search. To assist with this problem, the following terms and definitions are given by Ancestors:

ANCESTRAL FILE	A searchable database of over 35 million names organized into families and pedigrees available at http://www.familysearch.org/Search or through local family history centers.
ARCHIVE	A place in which public records or historical documents are preserved.
ATTACHED FILES/ ATTACHMENT	Electronic files that can be linked to E-mail messages and sent via the Internet; a useful means to share family database, photo or other files.
BANNS	Public announcement of an intended marriage before the time of the actual marriage to allow advance notice to those who might have a reason to protest. In most churches, the banns were read aloud in church on three successive Sundays prior to the marriage.
BAPTISMAL RECORD	Written notation kept by a church official about the baptism or christening of an individual; generally included the individual's name and the date of baptism; in an infant's case, also includes the date of birth and parents names.
BIBLE RECORDS	Pages from family Bibles which record births, marriages, deaths and family relationships and some genealogies. These pages may have been copied, collected or indexed by family name.
BOLSHEVIK REVOLUTION	The Russian Revolution that took place in 1917 and resulted in a Communist government for most of the 20th century in what was then known as the USSR. One side effect of this revolution was the deliberate destruction of records of any genealogical value.
BOOKMARK	An Internet browser option that permits the saving of web site addresses, making it easier to access favorite sites.
BOUNTY LAND	A specified amount of land issued by either the federal or a state government to an individual in return for military service, particularly in the Revolutionary War.
BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT	Federal government office responsible for purchase, sale and development of all federally owned land; maintains extensive records on transactions transferring property from public to private possession.
BURIAL RECORD	Written record kept by a church official about the death, funeral and/or burial of a church member.
CD/CD-ROM	Compact disks capable of storing large amounts of information; frequently used by marketers of commercial databases (such as census indexes) and by individual genealogists for sharing large files (such as photos).

CD-RECORDER/CD-BURNER	A device to save electronic information onto a CD.
CENSUS RECORD	Population survey conducted every ten years in the U.S. which provided information on our ancestors, such as ages, addresses, family relations and country of origin.
CHRONOLOGY	A date based approach to family history, addressing each event in a time sequence.
CHURCH RECORD	Generally refers to birth, marriage and burial registers maintained by most churches, but may also refer to other records such as minutes, confirmations, etc.
CITY DIRECTORIES	Predecessor to today's phone books, directories which usually listed residents(head of household or all over 18), addresses and occupations; often used in conjunction with census records to close the gaps in between census years.
CIVIL REGISTRATION	The recording of births, marriages, deaths and divorces by government agencies; a term frequently used outside of the United States in lieu of "vital records".
COMMUNICANTS	Those members of a church who are entitled to partake in Communion; often used to refer to church members in general.
COMPILED MILITARY SERVICE RECORD	An envelope(sometimes referred to as a "jacket") containing abstracts of an individual's service records, as well as some original documents, most often attendance, enlistment and discharge, hospital and prison stays, and payroll.
CONFIRMATION	A rite supplemental to baptism, administered usually to those who have reached years of discretion. It confers upon them the fullness of the privileges of members of that church.
CONSENT PAPERS	Papers filed by the parent or guardian of a legally underage son or daughter, establishing that the parent has agreed to an intended marriage of the child.
COUNTY COURTHOUSE	The building at which the business and legal matters of the county are conducted; usually contains extensive local records such as probates and deeds.
COUNTY HISTORY	A book covering the history of a county from the time of its founding to the time of writing; frequently containing biographies of local citizens, especially the more prominent.
COUNTY RECORDER	County employee charged with maintaining land records.
DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION (DAR)	Patriotic society founded in 1890 in Washington, D.C., open to women with ancestors who aided the American Revolution. The society has extensive holdings which are available to the public through its library. Catalog may be searched at http://dar.library.net/ .

MEMORIAL DEDICATED



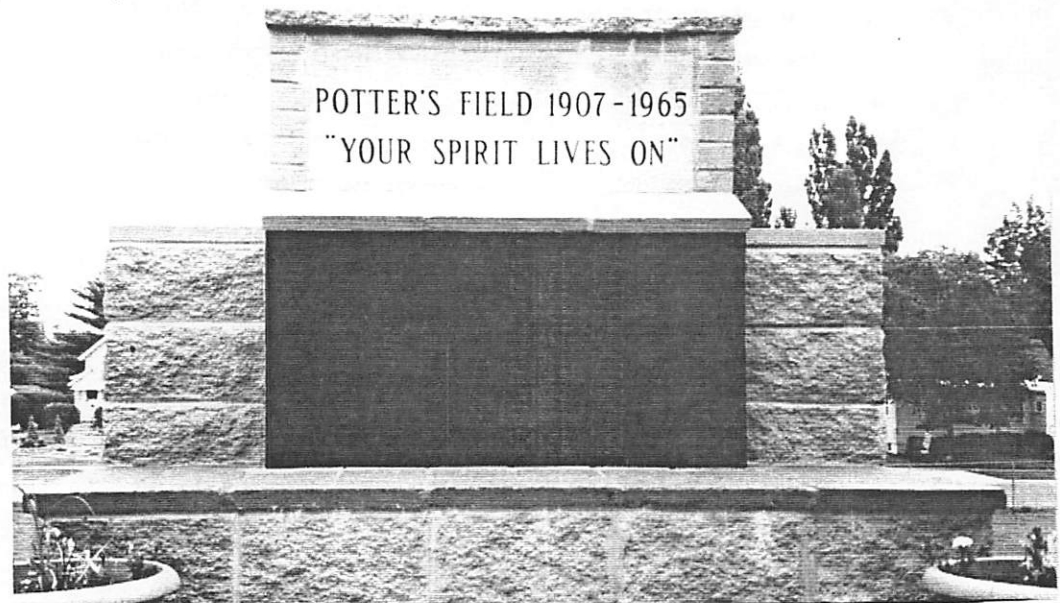
On Memorial Day, May 28, 2001, a new memorial was dedicated to the memory of 633 people who are buried in Potter's Field, Park Cemetery, Marquette, Michigan. Public burial areas have been called potter's fields since biblical times when a reference in the book of Matthew spoke of the purchase of a potter's field for a graveyard.



William Malandrone, the sexton, inscribed the names onto a large black granite stone. The earliest burial was a "Baby Johnson" in 1907 and the last interment was a "John A. Johnson" in 1965. Many of the people buried in the Potter's Field were residents of Birch or Big Bay, small communities north of Marquette. Some were lumberjacks, some were hermits, many were children. Only one of the interred had a tombstone. Now, all are remembered in this fitting memorial.

Courthouse Records

County Courthouses are important sources of genealogical information. Most people are aware of **birth, marriage and death** records. However, courthouses often hold other records that help solve genealogical problems. Researchers will want to examine **probate** records for their relatives. **Probate** records include **estate** records for people leaving **wills** and for those who died **intestate** (without a will). **Insanity, guardianship, and adoption** records are also kept by the probate court. **Circuit court** records can include **divorce** proceedings and **civil** cases where a person or business sues another person or business. **Criminal court** records may also have been created for individuals who broke laws. Before visiting your local courthouse, call ahead and find out about the availability of records, which offices are open to researchers, and how much photocopies cost. Many records are available through the LDS Family History Centers, but many others must be obtained by visiting the courthouse or hiring a researcher to do so. Some records may be available by telephoning the pertinent offices. Keep in mind that the County Courthouse where your ancestor resided, probably has more information there than you thought!

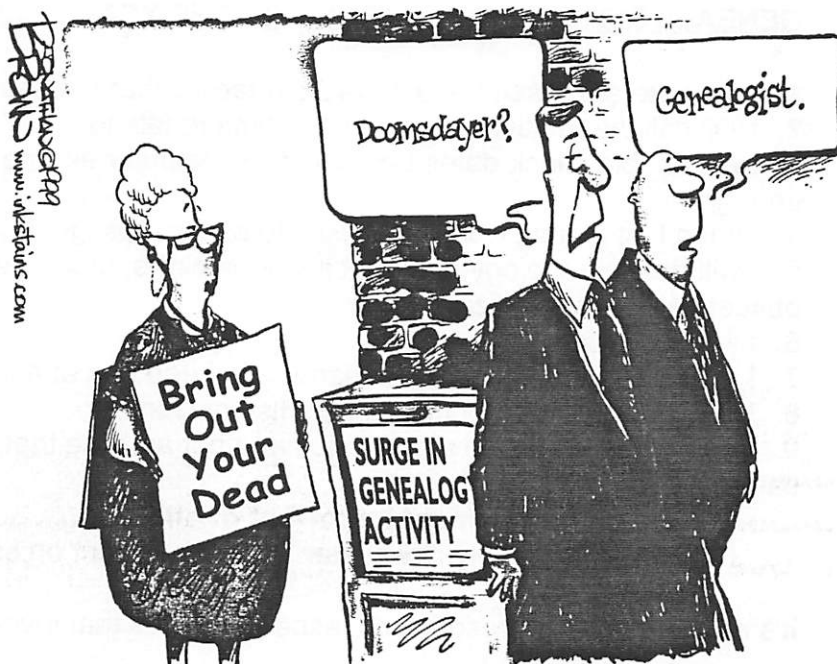
When reading writing that has faded, use a black 75 watt lightbulb in any lamp that will cast light directly on the subject. The black light will bring out the dim copy or images.

For those who do not have ready access to the indexes of Federal Census records, Ancestry .com website, (<http://www.ancestry.com/search/rectype/census/main.htm>) has a database that provides access to the 1790-1870 census indexes. It is fully searchable and provides information you would find in a printed index, including year, surname, given name, county, state, page (on which the name appears on the original census record) , township and other info like the census type such as Federal Population, Mortality Schedule, etc. This database is part of Ancestry's subscription program. If you do not have a paid up membership, it may be available periodically in their free database offerings.

Editor Note: This database is free to use at Peter White Library's computer lab. Ask the librarian for the address to access AncestryPlus. Many libraries offer this free service.

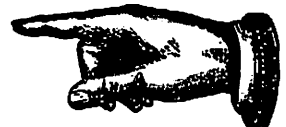

Meetings are open to the public and visitors are welcome!

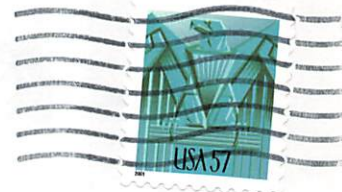

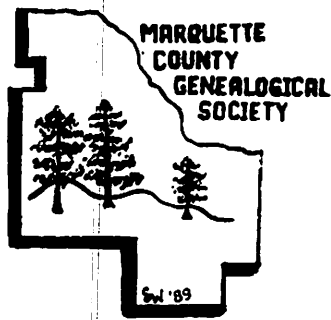

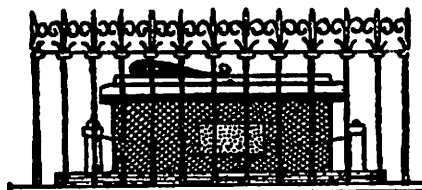
***Social Committee Report- Society Annual Picnic- Marge Small**

***Photographs Needed for "Ancestor Gallery"**

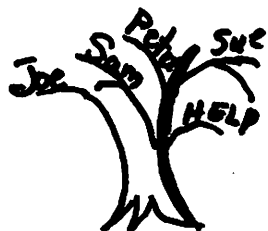

MARQUETTE COUNTY MINE INSPECTOR REPORTS

The iron mining industry has been crucial in determining the development of Marquette County, beginning with the discovery of iron ore in Negaunee in 1844, to the present. The Marquette County Board of Supervisors annually reviewed and published reports from all the county officers, including the Mine Inspector. These reports can be a good genealogical source, because many of the yearly reports list names and dates of the miners who died during that year in mine accidents.

*To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of
Marquette County, Michigan:*

GENTLEMEN:—I have the honor to submit my annual official report of my doings as inspector of mines for Marquette county during the year ending Sept. 30, 1902.

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 1.

Jacob Hutha was instantly killed in the Lake Superior Hematite mine, of the Oliver Mining company, Oct. 9, 1901. Hutha was a miner working in a drift. Above the drift was a large room from which the ore had been mined. This room was of considerable length and breadth and about twenty feet high. The back of this room consisted of cap rock, very thick and firm. On the floor of this room was a large quantity of timber and caved rock which had fallen from time to time. Under this room Hutha was working, leaving about five feet of ore at the back of the drift for their protection in case any rock should fall from the back of room above. This drift extended to the boundary line, then the ore left in back of drift was taken, working back. The night shift men had blasted out a set of timber together with the ore in the back, but at the time of the accident deceased and his partner were loading this ore, when the set of timber under which they were working instantly fell, letting the ore down upon him, completely covering him. Hutha was a Finn, single, and aged twenty-seven years. Verdict of jury, "Accidental death."

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 2.

John Sarko was instantly killed in the Blue mine, of the Oliver Mining company, on the 13th day of November, 1901. Sarko was a miner working in a drift, robbing ore from its back, working back towards a raise. Above the drift in which Sarko worked was an open room or space about ten feet high and of considerable length and width where the ore had been taken off to the cap rock. The bottom of Sarko's drift was about twelve feet below the bottom of this room, thereby leaving about four feet of ore between. This ore Sarko was robbing, the same method being employed as described in accident No. 1. They had blasted two holes in the back and after waiting for about ten minutes returned to their place of work, and it seems they failed to notice that the blast had injured and displaced some of the remaining timber under which Sarko was standing, when two sets of timber instantly fell letting the ore down upon him, killing him instantly. Sarko was a Finn, married, and twenty-seven years of age. Verdict of jury, "Accidental death."

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 3.

Thomas Hawking was instantly killed on surface at the Negaunee mine on December 12th, 1901. Hawking was a machinist's helper. At the time of the accident he was engaged in assisting moving a boiler. A piece of timber 6 x 8 inches and 26 feet long was being used for a pry, one end of it being under the boiler, the other elevated considerably. There being snow under the boiler it settled down suddenly causing the rear end of the pry to raise in the air out of the men's reach. The fore end at the same time slipping from underneath the boiler and fell suddenly to the ground, striking Hawking back of the ear in its descent, killing him instantly. Hawking was a married man, of English descent and forty-five years of age. Verdict of jury, "Accidental death."

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 4.

Samuel Parkins was fatally injured in the Champlon mine on the 19th of December, 1901, and died from the effects the following day. Parkins was a miner, sinking No. 7 shaft. The shaft had reached the desired depth for the present and they were at this time cutting out a station preparatory to again sinking. The dirt is hoisted from this shaft with a bucket by the aid of what is commonly called a trolley, the best and safest known device for hoisting out of such shafts as the Champlon. The bucket was full of dirt and was hoisted to the brace when a piece of rock either fell from the bucket or some other place in the shaft striking Parkins on the head rendering him unconscious, in which condition he remained until death. Parkins was of English descent, married and forty years of age. No inquest.

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 5.

Thomas Teare received fatal injuries in the Foxdale mine on December 21st, 1901, and died from the effects on the 23rd of the same month. Teare was a shift boss. He also looked after the pumps. The Foxdale is a small mine and at the time of the accident Teare and two other men were the only ones in the mine. Teare left the second, or bottom level, to go to the first level to attend to the pump stationed there. A short time after the two men at the bottom of the shaft heard a sudden thud and went to the shaft to ascertain the cause of the noise and found Teare lying in an unconscious condition. How or what caused him to fall is unknown. He never regained consciousness. Teare was a Manxman, married and forty years of age. No inquest.

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 6.

A terrible catastrophe happened at the Negaunee mine at the noon hour on Tuesday, the 7th day of January, 1902, whereby ten men lost their lives by a caving of sand from surface. The names of the victims are as follows: William Williams, shift boss, English, married, aged thirty-seven; John Sullivan, pumpman, Irish, single, aged twenty-eight; John Pearce, miner, English, married, aged twenty-seven; Erick Lofly, trammer, Finn, married, aged thirty; John Pascoe, miner, English, single, aged thirty-five; William H. Hakkenen, trammer, Finn, single, aged twenty-seven; Louis Matson, trammer, Finn, single, aged twenty-six; Julius Anderson, trammer, Finn, single, aged twenty-two; Angelo Crella, miner, Italian, married, aged twenty-seven; Jacob Hanala, trammer, Finn, single, aged twenty-five. About one year and a half previous to this accident the first settling or caving of the surface of any consequence took place in the Negaunee mine when a large amount of sand went through a hole in the capping, a little larger than an ordinary shaft. The capping is of great thickness. At that time large cracks were visible running in different directions from the hole mentioned, so much so that it became necessary to remove the hoisting plant. A short time after this was completed, the engine bed, one solid mass of brick and cement together with a portion of the old engine house which had been cut



in two, tumbled into the cave and lodged at a given point in the capping and stopped further runs of sand into the working below, until the action of the water, the great weight of sand and other material became so great, finally weakened the anchorage, when it went down with a rush. A large amount of sand and water followed it with the above dreadful result. Verdict of jury, "Accidental death."

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 7.

John Dole was instantly killed in the Section 16 mine of the Oliver Iron Mining company at second level, east of shaft, north vein, Feb. 12, 1902. Dole was one of the timbermen. At the time of the accident he was engaged putting in timber to support a piece of loose ground. They had put in two or three pieces when a piece of ore weighing five or six tons fell and caught Dole. The piece that fell was not the piece they were attempting to secure, but above it and was not considered dangerous. It took but a few minutes to recover the body. Dole was of English descent, married and thirty-eight years of age. Verdict of jury, "Dole came to his death by fall of ground in Section 16 mine of the Oliver Iron Mining company; no blame to any one."

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 8.

Charles G. Anderson was instantly killed at the 17th level, Salisbury mine, contract No. 1, on March 15th, 1902. The room in which Anderson was killed was one set wide and two sets high. The room was finished and they were stopped from further work in it the previous day by the captain, were ordered to take up their rails, move back, and take out a slice crosswise from the main drift. They had taken out one set of ground and stood one set of timber in their new place. A short time before the accident happened they blasted a hole which shook down some loose ore in the abandoned room between the old timbers. It was while loading this ore that the accident occurred. It appears that a large piece of rock settled off the side of the room under the timber, causing them to collapse instantly. It took about ten hours to recover the body. Anderson was a Swede, married, aged thirty-eight years. Verdict of jury, "Accidental death."

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 9.

Edward Nottle was killed in the East Champion mine on March 18th, 1902. Nottle was a miner engaged in sinking a shaft which was already 138 feet deep from surface. At this point they had cut out a station and were about to put in a pentis to protect the men while sinking the shaft further down. At the time of the accident they were attempting to take the measurement of timber for this pentis. In order to get to the desired point their longest ladder was not of sufficient length, it was therefore necessary to splice two together. This being done Nottle climbed the ladder but found he was not able to take the measurement alone so called to his partner for assistance. When his partner got as far up the ladder as the junction it immediately broke and both were precipitated to the bottom. There being a few feet of water at the bottom undoubtedly saved his partner's life. Nottle was killed. Nottle was of English descent, single and thirty-eight years of age. No inquest.

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 10.

Harbadella Harvey was fatally injured in Lake Superior Hematite mine of the Oliver Iron Mining, on March 18, 1902, and died on following day at Ishpeming hospital. Harvey was a timber boss, or in other words, had charge of all timber work in the mine. The tramping in the main level in this mine is done by rope haulage. A little engine stands at each end of a line or drift by which the cars are hauled each way. Sometimes when a single loaded car is standing near the shaft it is let down by a brake attached to the car. It was when one of these cars was being let down, there being sufficient grade for the car to run to the shaft, that Harvey met with the injury. Harvey was standing alongside of the track, was so near to it that the car in passing in some manner caught his clothing, throwing him in front of the car, pushing him some distance against a roller in the center of the track. The car then dumped and Harvey was caught between the car and roller, inflicting injuries which caused his death. Harvey was of English descent, married and forty-four years of age. No inquest.

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 11.

Even Skolberg was fatally injured at the 350-foot level of the Section 21 mine, of the Oliver Iron Mining company, at 1:15 a. m., April 9th, 1902, and died about 3:00 o'clock the same morning. Skolberg was a trammer, taking ore from a drift that was let down through a raise. Some few days previous to the accident a quantity of ore fell off the side of a pillar on the level above, knocking out the chute and two or three sets of timber upon which the chute was built. It was while removing this ore that had fallen that the accident happened. A chunk of ore rolled over the pile and caught Skolberg against the side of the drift, inflicting fatal injuries. Deceased was a Swede, fifty-eight years of age and married. Verdict of jury, "Accidental death."

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 12.

Joseph Taleno was instantly killed in the Lake Superior Hematite mine, of the Oliver Iron Mining company, on March 31, 1902. His partner went one way to notify the men they had fired and Taleno went another. As soon as one hole exploded Taleno went back to his place to work just in time to be caught by the second explosion. It is not known why he returned to his place of work so quickly for it is said that not more than two or three minutes elapsed between the first and second explosions. Taleno was frightfully mangled. Nationality, Italian, single, aged twenty-eight. Verdict of jury, "Accidental death by blast."

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 13.

Louis Tassone received fatal injuries in the Lake Superior Hematite mine, of the Oliver Iron Mining company, on April 18th, 1902, and died a few hours after receiving the injury. Tassone was a trammer in the main drift. The system of tramping in this drift is described in Accident No. 10. There was a train of empty cars at the shaft which were about to be pulled in to be loaded at different chutes. Tassone got into the car and rode some distance. He then got out of the car and stood on the front of it. When passing a chute he stooped but did not quite clear the latter and was caught between the car and chute timbers and was fatally crushed. There was ample room on either side of the car in this drift for a man to stand clear of a passing train except where chutes are stationed. Tassone was an Italian, single and twenty-three years of age. Verdict of jury, "Accidental death."

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 14.

Jens Hollum was killed on surface at the Lake Superior Hematite mine, of the Oliver Iron Mining company, on April 19th, 1902. Hollum was one of the steam shovel gang. At the time of the accident he was adjusting a jack screw when a portion of ore slid from the stockpile and caught him by the feet. Before he could extricate himself another fall came down upon him and before his partners could get him out a third fall came completely covering him. He undoubtedly died from suffocation. Hollum was a Norwegian, married and forty-five years of age. Verdict of jury, "Accidental death."



FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 15.

Richard Granness received fatal injuries in the Republic mine by falling down a winze a distance of sixty feet, on June 4th, 1902, and died a short time after. Granness was a laborer. He had not yet started to work, it being only a few minutes after seven o'clock a. m. In going from the shaft to his place of work he had to pass through a room from which the ore had been removed, which was secured by heavy timbers. The winze into which he fell was sunk at this point and was of fairly good size. A part of the winze mouth was in the side and a part outside of the timbers which formed a traveling way through this room. The legs were supported by horizontal timbers across the center of the winze. The part of the winze inside of the timbers was covered with planks to prevent persons from walking therein. The outside was covered with heavy timbers. Granness, it was supposed, must have got in between the standing timbers to look for candles which were supposed to be hidden there, and slipped through a small hole between the planks. His back was broken by the fall. He was a Swede, single and seventeen years of age. No inquest.

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 16.

John Kangas was fatally injured in contract No. 13, No. 2 shaft, Negaunee mine, at nine o'clock p. m., on the 13th day of June, 1902, and died a few hours later at his home. Kangas was a trammer and was tramping ore from above mentioned place. On the morning of the accident I inspected the Negaunee mine and visited the place where the accident occurred and while there Capt. Piper and myself came to the conclusion it was necessary to put in one or two sets of timber to protect the trammers. The captain ordered his foreman to have the work done at once. It was while preparing to put in this timber that the accident happened. The place where it happened was a drift through a pillar leading to an open room, about ten feet wide and as many feet high. A piece of ore weighing about 400 pounds fell from back of drift, a portion of it striking Kangas, fatally injuring him. Kangas was a Finn and single.

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 17.

Thomas Luigi, an Italian trammer, aged twenty-five years, who had been employed by the Donora Mining company at their Volunteer mine, Palmer, Mich., for two weeks, and who had come direct from Italy to their service. He was working at the sixth level filling cars when seeing a quantity of dirt which was easy to get at he went under a bad piece of ground on which a machine drill was working which was being run by Alf Deckstrom. The latter saw the danger Thomas Luigi was in and told him to go away, but Luigi not understanding him, continued with the work. The machine runner pulled him away but when he began working on the drill the trammer went back under the same piece of ground and was stooping with his shovel in his hand when a large slab of ore weighing about a ton fell out of the back and rolled over him, crushing his legs and severely injuring the lower part of his trunk. He was removed to his boarding house where he received the most careful attention, but died July 5th from peritonitis.

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 18.

Henry Wistener received fatal injuries in the Negaunee mine on August 1st, 1902, and died on the following day. Wistener was a trammer working in room No. 10. The room was about 18 feet wide, 25 feet long and 20 feet high. The miners blasted down the ore in such a way as to be always under solid ground, the ore falling to the bottom of the room into the mouth of the drift leading to the room where it was loaded into cars. This drift was securely timbered and Wistener was loading the car when a chunk of ore weighing about a ton fell from some place in the room or rolled over the pile. Wistener heard it coming and attempted to get out of harm's way. His partner succeeded in doing so but Wistener ran against one of the upright timbers which knocked him off his feet. Before he could get on his feet again the chunk rolled on his legs. The chunk was quickly taken off him and he was removed to surface and from thence to his home where he died. Deceased was a Finn, married and forty-two years of age. Verdict of jury, "Accidental death."

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 19.

Isaac Johnson was instantly killed at the third level, No. 3 shaft, Lake Superior Hard Ore mine of the Oliver Iron Mining company, on August 30, 1902. Johnson was a miner engaged with others taking out pillars and floors, working from the bottom of the mine upwards. The space caused by the removal of the pillars is filled with rock close up to the next pillar or floor to be removed before they are attacked. One pillar is taken out at a time. The space is then filled with rock and so on consecutively. Johnson at the time of the accident was engaged in putting in a short piece of track when a piece of soapstone fell off the side of another pillar about ten feet above where he stood killing him on the spot. Johnson

was a Finn, single and twenty-six years of age. Verdict of jury, "Accidental death."

FATAL ACCIDENT NO. 20.

John Kaluna was instantly killed at the 830-ft. level of the Section 16 mine of the Oliver Iron Mining company on September 3, 1902. Kaluna was a company miner or machine drill runner. The place in which he worked was originally a raise, 15x15 feet. The raise was cut through at different places making sub-levels, thus forming a range of pillars on both sides of the raise. These pillars were being stripped down to the desired size, two pillars being attacked at a time, the miners working on one while the trammers were taking the dirt from the other. In this way it was thought the pillars could be stripped with perfect safety both to trammers and miners. It was while blasting down some loose ground caused by blasting that he met his death. He was attempting to bar down a piece of ground on the hanging side when a slab of rock about five feet wide at the bottom and ten feet at the top and about 18 inches thick fell from the hanging wall knocking him off the ladder upon which he stood killing him instantly. Kaluna was a Finn, single and twenty-five years of age. Verdict of jury, "Accidental death."

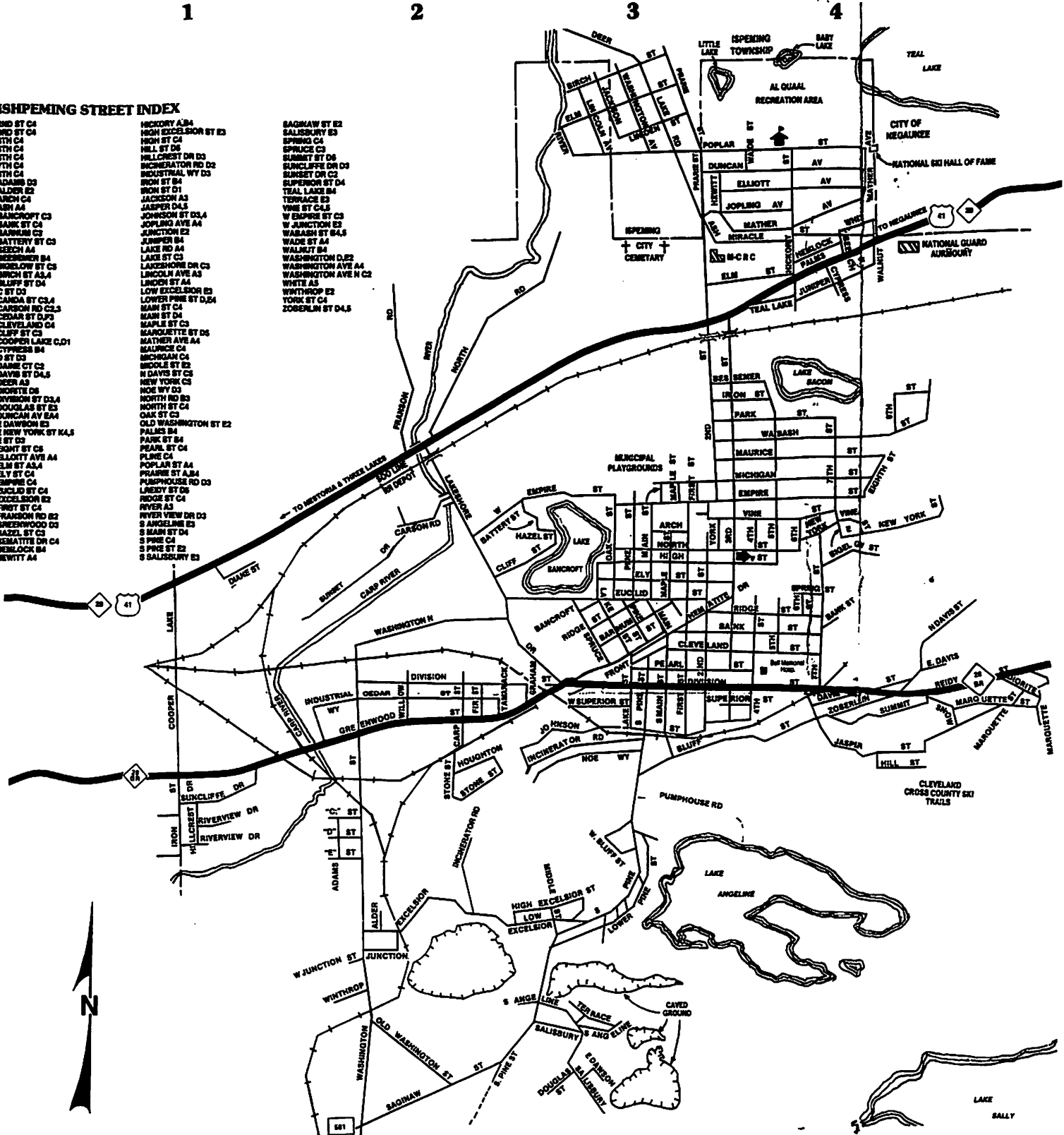

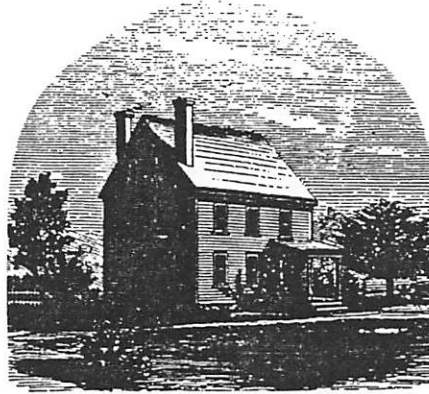

ANCESTOR'S Glossary of Terms

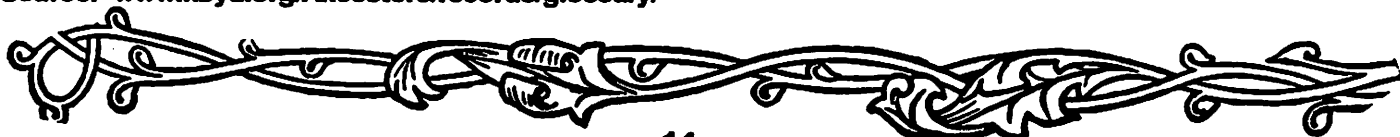
One of the most difficult challenges faced by any genealogist is keeping track of the tremendous number of phrases and terms associated with family search. To assist with this problem, the following terms and definitions are given by Ancestors:

CONTINUED:

DECLARATION OF INTENT	First step in naturalization process; sworn statement of an alien announcing intention to become a citizen.
DEED	A legal document transferring ownership of property; private land records generally maintained at the county level.
DENOMINATION	A name, designation or title used to denote a society of individuals, often those belonging to a particular religion.
DIARY/PERSONAL JOURNAL	A personal record kept by date, on a daily or regular basis, in which a person tells about his or her own experiences soon after they occur.
DIVORCE RECORDS	Documents generally found in civil courts(also registered at the state level) recording the dissolution of a marriage. In some cases, access to these records may be limited to the parties in the divorce.
E-MAIL	A means of sending messages instantly and inexpensively via the internet.
ELECTRONIC IMAGES	Photos, documents and other items that have been scanned or otherwise digitized into electronic files that can be printed, inserted into genealogical software packages, sent as attached files with E-mail messages, uploaded to web sites and used and shared in other ways.
ENUMERATOR	Census taker; the person who went from residence to residence to record census data.
ESTATE	The property(belongings and assets) left by an individual at the time of death, for dispersal among surviving heirs.
EXTANT	In existence; often used to refer to whether the originals of certain records still exist.
FAMILY GROUP RECORD	A widely used genealogical form listing a husband and wife and all of their children, along with their dates and places of birth, marriage and death.
FAMILY HISTORY LIBRARY FAMILY HISTORY CENTER	Established in 1894 in Salt Lake City, Utah; the largest of it's kind in the world. The library houses millions of microfilms, thousands of microfiche and books, and other records which have been acquired through an extensive microfilming program that began in 1938. Original documents are currently being filmed in churches, courthouses and archives in many countries. Anyone is welcome to request a loan of these materials at local Family History Centers.
FAMILY HISTORY	Records that contain genealogical information. biographical sketches, or stories about members or branches of a family, or those having a common surname.
FAMILY RECORDS	The documents, photos, diaries, Bibles and other memorabilia that can be found at your home or tucked away in grandmother's attic.

FHL CATALOG	Descriptive list of the contents of the FHL, available for searching by surname or place at local Family History Centers or on-line at http://familysearch.org/Search/searchcatalog.asp
FINAL PAPERS	Another term for the petition for naturalization in the naturalization process.
FINDING AIDS	Tools such as compiled records, inventories, registers, indexes or guides to collections held by archives, libraries and other repositories. Their purpose is to facilitate the identification, evaluation and location of primary sources.
FIRST PAPERS	Another term used for declaration of intent in the naturalization process.
GAZETTEER	Dictionary of geographic locations and place names; useful for finding former names of towns and villages.
GENERAL LAND OFFICE	Former name of the Bureau of Land Management; the term is still used to refer to extensive land patent records generated at the time the office was known by this name.
GENOGRAM	A medically-focused family tree for the purpose of understanding the health history of a family and used by therapists and physicians as an assessment tool to graph information about family health patterns and conditions.
GRID SYSTEM	A land surveying system used especially for land patents.
IMMIGRATION RECORD	A term generally used to refer to ship passenger arrival lists and/or naturalization records.
INFORMANT	The individual who provides the information found on a death certificate. This person is often the spouse, children or other relative of the deceased.
INTERNATIONAL GENEALOGICAL INDEX	IGI- A database of over 600 million names, mostly extracted from vital records from throughout the world and available for searching at FHL's or on-line.
INTERLIBRARY LOAN	A system found at most libraries allowing patrons to borrow holdings from other libraries.
INTERNET	The global information highway that allows access to staggering amounts of information and quick and easy communication with people around the world.
INTESTATE	Said of an individual who dies without leaving a will to specify his/her wishes for the disposal of the estate in question.
INVENTORY	When an individual dies intestate, the administrator prepares a list and appraisal(inventory) of all items in the possession of the deceased for the purpose of devising a fair division of the property among the eligible heirs.

MARQUETTE COUNTY MINE INSPECTOR REPORTS

The iron mining industry has been crucial in determining the development of Marquette County, beginning with the discovery of iron ore in Negaunee in 1844, to the present. The Marquette County Board of Supervisors annually reviewed and published reports from all the county officers, including the Mine Inspector. These reports can be a good genealogical source, because many of the yearly reports list names and dates of the miners who died during that year in mine accidents.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE INSPECTOR OF MINES FOR MARQUETTE COUNTY, MICHIGAN, FOR YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30TH, 1903.

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Marquette County, Michigan:

Gentlemen—I have the honor to submit to you my annual report as inspector of mines for the county of Marquette for the year ending September 30th, 1903:

ACCIDENT NO. 1.

James Collins was fatally injured on surface at the Cliff Shaft mine of the Cleveland-Cliffs Iron Co. on October 2, 1902, and died on the following morning. Collins was employed running a small engine at B shaft house. The loads of ore as taken off the cage were let down by gravity to the crusher and it was Collins' duty to draw the car back to the shaft house when empty. The car that was being let down at this particular time had been recently repaired and for this reason would not run smoothly, so Collins started to push the car. It reached the crusher O. K., but on its return to the shaft house Collins was standing in the car, and the man whose duty it was to look after the car was running the engine in Collins' place. The car had traveled about half way to the shaft house when from some unknown cause it jumped the track and ran through the trestle guards to the ground below, Collins falling with it, a distance of sixty feet. The track, car and all other appliances were in first-class condition and no apparent cause could be found for the car leaving the track. Collins was of Irish descent, single, and twenty-one years of age. Verdict of the jury was "accidental death."

ACCIDENT NO. 2.

Peter Karhemen was fatally injured at the twenty-fourth level, No. 7 shaft, Champion mine, on October 17th, 1902, and died on the 19th, same month. Karhemen was a miner or machine drill runner. He and his partner had rigged up a post on top of the stope, the same being about thirty feet high. They also had the shell fastened to the post and were in the act of inserting a machine in the shell when Karhemen slipped and he caught hold of the post to steady himself. The post immediately gave way, Karhemen, machine and post falling over the stope. The accident was caused by the oversight of the parties in not securely jacking up the post. He was a Finn, aged fifty-nine. No inquest.

ACCIDENT NO. 3.

Daniel Backen was fatally crushed in the Lake Shaft mine of the Cleveland-Cliffs Iron Co. on Nov. 1, 1902, at 8 a. m., and died a short time after at the Ishpeming hospital. Backen was cleaning the track at the third level, southwest. The motor and three or four cars were standing on the track near where Backen was working. One of the cars was being loaded from a chute. There being not sufficient ore in the chute to fill the car, the conductor told Backen to stand aside. He then gave the signal to the motorman to back up his train of cars. Deceased in the meantime had got under the car. They did not move more than two or three feet when deceased was caught between the car and lip of chute and received injuries which caused his death. Backen was a Norwegian, single and aged twenty-four years. Verdict of the jury, "accidental death."

ACCIDENT NO. 4.

Matt Pesola was fatally injured at the Lake Shaft mine of the Cleveland-Cliffs Iron Co. on Nov. 10, 1902, and died at the Ishpeming hospital on the 15th of the same month. Pesola was a miner, and at the time of the accident was cleaning down a chute which was about 100 feet deep. He had succeeded in cleaning it down near to the bottom when a small piece of ore fell from above, striking him on the head and fracturing his skull. Pesola was a Finn, married, aged thirty-five years. Verdict of jury, "accidental death."

ACCIDENT NO. 5 (Panni)

Matt Leppamäki and Panni were their lives in the Lake Superior Hematite mine of the Oliver Mining Co. on Nov. 19, 1902, by suffocation, caused by an explosion of giant powder. The victims were driving a drift, or sub-level, at a point fifteen feet below where the explosion occurred. The drift was in about fifteen feet from the raise. The bottom of the raise was connected with the main level below. The top connected with the main level above, thus giving them two outlets from their place. At the sub-level where they were working they kept the raise covered over to prevent any person from falling in. The powder was kept at the level above. A sufficient quantity of powder exploded to entirely destroy the top of the raise and filled the place with smoke, also letting down a large quantity of dirt and other material on the covering of the raise at the sub-level, thus cutting off both avenues of escape. It took considerable time and labor before the bodies could be recovered. Both were Finnish. Verdict of jury was "accidental death."

ACCIDENT NO. 6.

Matt Nemic, a trammer in No. 1 shaft of the Republic mine, was almost instantly killed on Dec. 8, 1902. Nemic got on the skip and was riding up the shaft, and thoughtlessly leaned over the side of the skip and was caught between the skip and gate timbers, crushing him fatally. Nemic was a Finn, married, aged twenty-eight. No inquest.

ACCIDENT NO. 7.

A double fatality occurred at the Section 16 mine of the Oliver Iron Mining Co. on Feb. 5, 1903. The names of the victims are Jacob Penola and Frank Sarcoro. The men were laborers working at the back of the 310-foot level, where the floors and the pillars of ore are being mined by the filling system. All the original openings are filled with rock, leaving barely room for the men to work. A portion of the ore is then removed, then filled, and so on consecutively until the entire block is mined out. The room in which the accident occurred was about twenty feet wide on the average and

100 feet long. In addition to the filling to insure the safety of the men, wood pillars 8x8 feet, or cribs, were constructed from nine to twelve feet apart. The center of the cribs are filled with rock. The pillars rest on the filling and the top reaches to the back, which is about five feet high. The top of the pillars are then securely wedged. These pillars are examined daily by the captain in charge and the timbermen and again wedged if found necessary to do so. The men were throwing ore into the chute when a portion of ore slid off the hanging side, killing them instantly. Penola was a Finn, eighteen years old and single. Frank Sarcoro was an Italian, married. Verdict of jury was "accidental death."

ACCIDENT NO. 8.

Andrew Holmgren, rock picker and skip-tender, was almost instantly killed at the Moro Shaft mine of the Cleveland-Cliffs Iron Co. on Feb. 12, 1903, at 10:30 p. m. Holmgren was at work at the fifth level. He and two trammers came to the shaft with a car of ore. The skip was stopped and then lowered on the gate. Deceased was putting what is called the stoppers around the skip to prevent dirt falling down the shaft. In order to do this he stood upon the skip. Without any warning the skip suddenly started up the shaft and Holmgren was caught between the skip and skip road and received fatal injuries. Some one gave the signal to the engineer to hoist, but it is not known who. Electric bells are used in this shaft. Holmgren was a Swede, married, and fifty-five years of age. Verdict of jury was "accidental death."

ACCIDENT NO. 9.

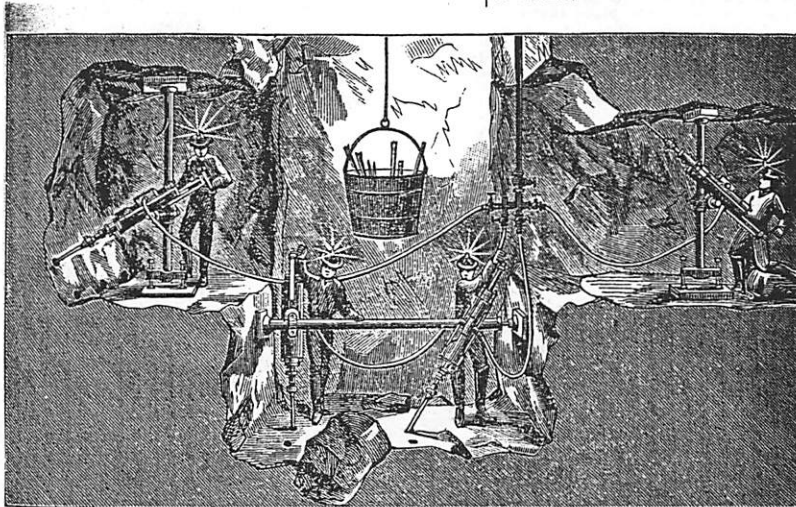
Matt Bentla was instantly killed in the Foxdale mine on _____, 1903. Deceased was a miner and was engaged sinking a winze. At the time of the accident the winze was about six feet deep. He and his partner had rigged up a machine and had drilled but a short time when a terrific explosion occurred, killing Bentla instantly and severely injuring his partner. In my opinion they drilled into a missed hole or into an old bottom in which remained a portion of the powder from a previous blast. Bentla was a Finn, married, aged twenty-seven years. Verdict of the jury was "accidental death."

ACCIDENT NO. 10.

Seth Strand lost his life by suffocation at the third level west of No. 1 shaft, contract No. 53, at the Lake Shaft mine of the Cleveland-Cliffs Iron Co. on April 21, 1903. Strand was a miner. The chute in which he dumped his ore became choked and he was attempting to clear it. Not being able to do so as readily as he desired while standing in the ladder compartment of the raise he went through the cribbing into the ore compartment through a hole about 12x20 inches and immediately began "propping" the ore above him in the chute, when it suddenly came down the raise, completely covering him over. There was no possible chance for his escape. About thirty minutes were required to recover the body. Strand was a Swede, married, aged thirty-seven. Verdict of jury was "accidental death."

ACCIDENT NO. 11.

Charles Matson was almost instantly killed in the Blue mine of the Oliver Iron Mining Co. on April 22, 1903. Matson was a miner working in a drift. The drift was two sets wide and was timbered up to within three feet of the breast. Matson was turning a drill in what is called a cunder, or flat hole at bottom of drift, when a chunk of ore fell out of the back of the drift, striking him on the head and producing injuries which proved fatal. Matson was a Finn, married, aged thirty years. Verdict of the jury, "death by a fall of ground, no one to blame."



ACCIDENT NO. 12.

John Hanala was killed in the Blue mine on April 27, 1903, in contract No. 53, bottom level. Hanala and his partners had four holes to blast and Hanala was left to charge and blast them while his partners went to get timber. He succeeded in charging three of the holes, but when charging the fourth the powder from some unknown cause exploded. He was frightfully mangled and died in a short time after being removed to surface. Hanala was a Finn, single, aged twenty-eight years. Verdict of jury was "accidental death by premature blast."

ACCIDENT NO. 13.

Lewis Cameare was killed on surface at the Champion mine on May 19, 1903. Deceased was a laborer employed at the time of the accident with a number of other men lifting a piece of machinery with a pair of blocks suspended to a jin pole. The men were standing on a trestle about twelve feet high when the jin pole broke and deceased either jumped or was knocked from the trestle and was almost instantly killed. Cameare was unmarried, twenty-two years of age, and of French descent. No inquest.

ACCIDENT NO. 14.

Thomas Bettison received fatal injuries in the Salisbury mine of the Cleveland-Cliffs Iron Co. on April 17, and died on May 25, 1903. Bettison was a miner, and at the time of the accident was standing on the 17th level waiting for the cage, intending to go to surface. When the cage got to the level within a foot or two he attempted to get on the cage, but instead stepped into the shaft. Had he waited until the cage had got into its proper position it would have been impossible for him to have stepped into the shaft, as the base or bottom of the cage entirely covers the opening in the shaft at this as well as all other levels. He fell a distance of eighty feet. Bettison was forty years of age, married, nationality English. Verdict of jury was "accidental death."

ACCIDENT NO. 15.

Fred Rowe was instantly killed at the bottom level of the Section 16 mine of the Oliver Iron Mining Co. on June 23, 1903. The nature of this accident was exactly the same as that recorded in "accident No. 1." Rowe was English, single, and twenty-seven years of age. Verdict of jury was "accidental death."

ACCIDENT NO. 16.

John Pearce was fatally injured on surface at the Lake Shaft mine of the Cleveland-Cliffs Iron Co. on June 30, 1903. At the time of the accident Pearce was removing lagging from the stockpile, carrying them a short distance down the track and there piling them. It was while making one of those trips that a loaded car of ore was being let down from the pocket which struck him, knocking him under the wheels. The steam shovel gang, who were near by, shouted to him to get out of the way of the car, but he either failed to hear them or imagined they were calling to some one else. Pearce could not see the car, as his back was towards it. It is said that deceased was somewhat deaf. He died in a very short time after receiving the injury. Pearce was English, married, and was fifty-four years of age. Verdict of jury was "accidental death."

ACCIDENT NO. 17.

Joseph Atwell was killed at the Lake Angone old mine on July 13, 1903, at the fourth level, contract No. 60. Atwell was a miner. He and his partner had cut out the end of a raise and had drifted and put in a number of sets of timber. They then came back and started to put in some timber over the top of the raise to make the place thoroughly secure. It was while removing the dirt and old timber to make room for the new timber the back suddenly came down and Atwell was caught by the foot by a piece of timber. His partners exerted themselves to the utmost to pull him out, but were unable to do so. The dirt in the meantime continued running down upon him until Atwell was completely covered. It took considerable time to recover the body. Atwell was of English extraction, single, and aged twenty years. Verdict of jury was "accidental death."

ACCIDENT NO. 18.

Thomas Lynch was almost instantly killed at the fifth level, No. 1 Shamell shaft, of the Republic mine, on Aug. 12, 1903. Lynch was a shift boss. Almost the first place he visited on the fatal morning was where the accident occurred. A number of holes had been blasted the previous night and Lynch went to examine the place before the men were allowed to enter there to work. He took a bar in his hand, holding it with one hand, and with the other hand on the ground he struck the ground with the bar to detect the slightest motion. As he did so the ground immediately fell upon him. It was a back stope and in this particular place was not more than five feet high. Lynch was of Irish descent, married, aged forty-three years. No inquest.

ACCIDENT NO. 19.

John Antilla was instantly killed in the Volunteer mine, of the Oliver Iron Mining Co. on August 15, 1903. Antilla was employed to do the barring of loose ground in different stopes. The stope in which Antilla was barring at the time of the accident was a breast stope and was about sixteen feet wide by about ten feet high, there being about four feet of dirt at the bottom of the stope so that a man standing upon it could easily reach the back with his hand. Antilla was either examining the loose ground at the back or attempting to bar it down when it suddenly came away upon him. The ground which came down upon him weighed about 500 pounds. Antilla was a Finn. No inquest.

ACCIDENT NO. 20.

Hackka Karpia was instantly killed in No. 1 Shamell shaft, Republic mine, on August 25, 1903. Karpia was a machine helper and had gone to the shaft for something and while there the trammers dumped a car of ore into the skip, one large chunk of ore resting on the bale of the skip. It was necessary that this should be removed before the skip was hoisted. The skip-tender was unable to move it alone, so Karpia got on the skip to assist him. The skip immediately started up the shaft throwing Karpia off and into the shaft. It is not known who gave the signal to hoist. The lander whose duty it is to ring the bell to the engineer was stationed some two or three levels above the point where the skip was loaded and he claims he saw the men standing on the skip, which he could easily do from where he stood, and therefore did not ring the bell. The brakeman claims he received the hoisting signal. Electric bells are in use at this shaft. Karpia was a Finn, married, and forty-three years of age.

ACCIDENT NO. 21.

John Zapetti was killed by an explosion at the Princeton mine. At the time of the explosion, Zapetti, Christopher Columbus, William Azzola, the pumpman, Samuel Roberts and Captain William Jory were present. The three miners above mentioned were cleaning up the dirt in the bottom of the shaft. Zapetti was engaged in loosening up the dirt with a pick and his pick came in contact with the powder and it exploded. It appears that none of the miners had any idea that there was any powder in the bottom of the shaft that was not exploded. They blasted a round of holes in the bottom of the shaft on Thursday morning, August 27, and started to clean up the dirt on Friday morning, the 28th. There were four sinking holes in the blast. It seems that one of the holes did not explode and the other holes must have thrown the powder out with the dirt. The explosion occurred August 28, at 5 p. m. Zapetti lived twelve hours after the accident.

PROTECT YOUR PHOTOGRAPHS

If you think your precious memories are safe in a photo album, think again. They may be disintegrating faster than if you'd stuffed them into a shoebox. magnetic albums often contain caustic glue and acidic cardboard, both of which cause photos to deteriorate. Others contain polyvinyl chloride(PVC), which emits gases that can cause yellowing. To safeguard your photographs, follow these guidelines:

1. Choose photo-safe albums (look for words like "acid-free" and "long-term photo storage") that lie flat when opened. They may run as high as \$40.00 but they're worth it.
2. Use photo-safe adhesives, not rubber cement. If in doubt, check with a photo supply store.
3. Look for albums that indicate the page protectors are made of melinex, polyester, polystyrene, or mylar, not PVC plastic.
4. Store albums upright so the photographs aren't under pressure. Keep them away from heat, humidity and sun.
5. Keep negatives in acid-free envelopes or negative sleeves. Don't store them inside the photo album. If you lose the album, you lose everything!

Librarians bring census data, Civil War records, ship passenger lists and family histories to your desk. 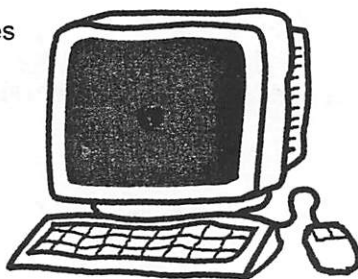

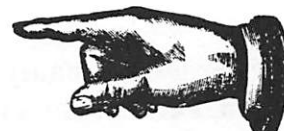
