***Grocery Receipts**

*The Social Security records were not digitized until 1962, so deaths prior to 1962 are generally not found online in the SSDI database. You can still get the information (the fee varies according to what you are requesting) by going to: www.ssa.gov/foia/html/foia_guide.htm

*** Follow Siblings Records**

Records of siblings may include valuable references to the ancestors you are researching. Sometimes when you hit a "dead end" it is helpful to locate records of your ancestor's brother or sister, and follow their paper trail until you locate common ancestors. A sibling's obituary, for example may contain details or clues to place of birth, parents' names, and even to other unknown siblings. By following these leads, you may find a path past your dead end to parents and grandparents. From there, you may be able to work downward to confirm or prove relationship to your otherwise "dead end" ancestor.

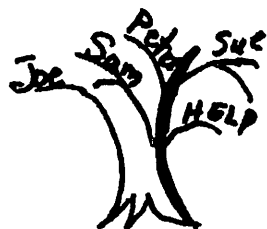

THE CHASE INTERVIEWS

Over 350 residents of Marquette County were interviewed in the 1920's by college students of Professor Chase of Northern State Teachers College (now Northern Michigan University). These interviews were conducted in most of the Marquette County communities and tell the story of immigration, families and times of old.

DISCOVER YOUR FAMILY'S HISTORY

Exerpts from article by *ROBIN VAN AUKEN*

If you've ever wanted to know who you are and where you came from, you are not alone. More than 100 million Americans are looking for their roots, a remarkable explosion in genealogical research inspired in part, by author Alex Haley who discovered his own "Roots" three decades ago. In fact, researching genealogy is one of America's favorite leisure-time activities.

Many parents keep track of the accomplishments of their children, recording first steps and saving locks of hair in a traditional baby's first album. These mementos are stored away and, as a child matures, a parent will accumulate photo albums and scrapbooks, filled with school-related memorabilia.

But how do children understand their relationship with other family members, many of whom they've never met? And how do children understand their context of American history?

Every child above the age of 7 years has lived through the most tragic, and most visible event in America's history: the terrorist's attack on the World Trade Center. This becomes part of their history. A young child might not realize the importance of the cloning of the first mammal, Dolly the sheep. The medical advances scientists have made since that 1997 venture could prolong your child's life by 50 years or more. It's important for your child, and for you to identify, interpret and preserve your family history.

A handy tool for accomplishing this is to use a guidebook. One such book is, "My History is America's History", an initiative of the National Endowment for the Humanities. "My History is America's History" was designed to encourage and help you explore your family history, discover your family's place in American history and make your own contribution to

history. Using the NEH's guidebook is an opportunity for every American to be an historian, to remember to record and to see things in the "big picture."

Another book that is useful is Jim and Terry Willard's "Ancestors: A beginner's guide to family history and genealogy." The Willards, host of the PBS series, "Ancestors," are guides to lead you in an adventure: tracing your family's roots.

You may even consider taking a family history workshop, a gathering place for sharing family stories, for meeting folks in the community who are prepared to share or help with your voyage of historical discovery, and for getting the scoop on Web sites, books, films, and places to visit where our past is seen through the triumphs and trials of ordinary families.

Here are some important ideas of the meanings of "My History is America's History": Some people wish to take their history a step further and create a memoir to share with family members as a legacy for future generations. Such projects could be the result of long-term research. A short-term project would focus on a central idea you want to write about such as:

- your experiences in World War II, Korea, Vietnam, the Gulf War or Iraq;
- a special trip;
- your high school life;
- raising your family;
- character sketches;
- the birth of each child;
- falling in love
- and other important events in your life.

It's never too late to consider your history.....

And your family's history is America's history.

Care for Your Paper

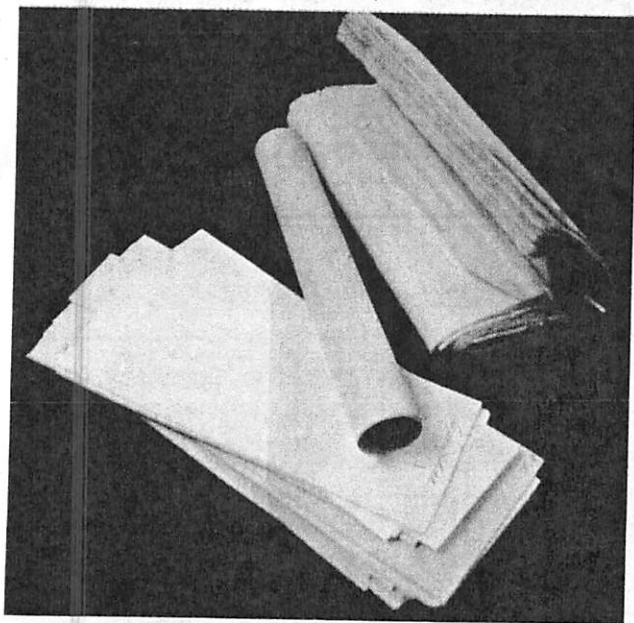
Collecting old papers, photographs, and books can be exciting but, sometimes, the condition of a valuable paper item may appear that the document is beyond saving. Nevertheless, many of these are pieces that can be saved and preserved. This article will show how to unroll and unfold papers and long photos easily and inexpensively.

Unroll your yardlongs

Collectors often encounter rolled military unit photos, commonly referred to as "yardlongs". These commercially made photographs were delivered to their customers in a tight roll. Some veterans immediately unrolled and framed the photos (while they were still fresh and pliable). Too often, though, these relics remained rolled for many years. Today, when someone attempts to unroll one of these photos, it cracks or breaks because it has become dry and brittle. There is a method; however that will enable a collector to safely unroll a yardlong and prepare it for display.

Paper fibers over time can become dry and brittle. They need moisture to "relax." To relax folded or rolled paper and photographs, conservators generally place the documents in a "humidification chamber." Do not attempt to humidify papers that may have water soluble materials on them like watercolors, felt tipped pen, or charcoal. If you are in doubt, contact a professional conservator. It is always better to be safe than sorry.

A humidification chamber can be constructed for just a

few dollars. All that is needed are a few simple items found lying around your house: water, a towel, a plastic rack, and a container with a lid that can be snugly fitted. Do not use a metal rack because the chance of the rack rusting and transferring the rust to your documents.

A container that can be used is one in which there is a towel soaked in water and that has space enough to place a rack above the water. Set it up this way so the papers are not touching the water. It is necessary for them to absorb the humidity given off by the wet towel. If a container like this cannot be found in the home, any department or hardware store carry items that will work great. Business's like Lowe's, Westlake, or Wal-Mart carry items that will work just fine. These are relatively cheap and can be found for about \$10-\$15. Some people prefer clear containers so they can keep an eye on their papers during the humidification process.

Now that things are ready, wet the towel and squeeze out the excess water. Lay it down in the container making sure it will not come in contact with the papers when they are on the rack. Place the rack inside and put 1 or 2 letters or photos side by side, depending on how much room in the container. Whenever possible try to separate the items so they will humidify faster. The thicker the bundle or more tightly wound the yardlong is, the longer it will take for the humidity to penetrate. Snap the lid on and after approximately 1-2 hours, the items should be humidified enough to unfold or unroll. The time in the humidity chamber will vary based on the size of the container. Remember, a humid environment is being created and the larger the area, the longer it will take to become humid.

When removing yardlongs or papers, they will feel cool and slightly damp. Do not let the photo or document become too damp. The inks may blur or even run ruining the item. *Never* leave a document in a chamber for more than eight hours. It will become too damp, weaken and possibly fall apart. Sometimes the inks will run or blur. One cheap and simple tool that will help a person remember to check on documents or photos is a kitchen timer. Simply set it for one hour. When it rings, check on the things in the chamber. When finished, dry the container thoroughly so when not in use there is no chance of it becoming moldy and passing the mold onto your next humidification project.

After unfolding the letters or yardlongs, many will make copies of them and put the originals away for safe-keeping in acid free archival folders or plastic like Mylar/Melinex or Polypropylene slips. Wear cloth gloves when handling the documents—they will keep fingerprints and body oils from coming in contact with the papers or photographs which over time could cause damage. 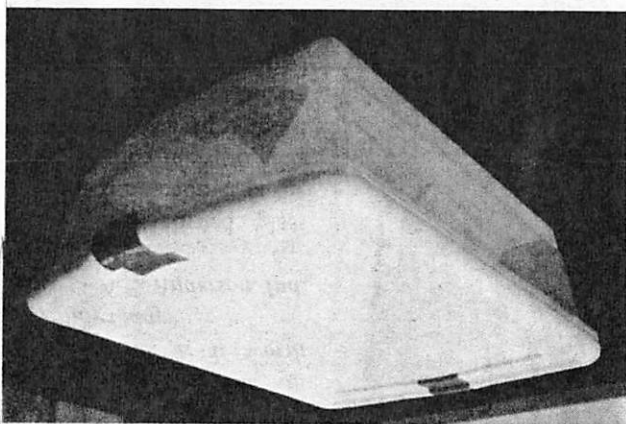

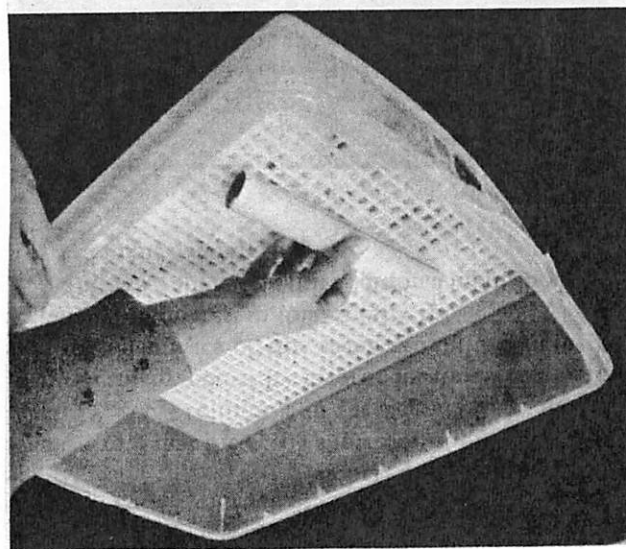

Remember always think a step ahead and be careful with photos and documents. It is always to better be safe than sorry. When in doubt always contact a professional conservator. 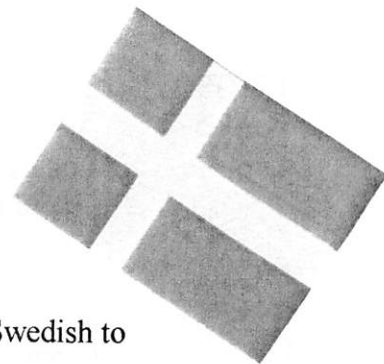
This simple home-made humidification chamber was built from a plastic storage box of the kind found at many department and hardware stores. Smaller ones work best. The larger ones will take longer to become humid due to their larger area inside.



Remember to place the document or photo as near to the center as possible. Do not let it come in contact with water droplets which may cause the inks or colors to fade or run.

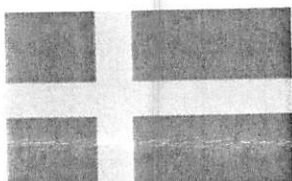
To get help locating these resources in our collection, ask the librarians on the second floor of Peter White Public Library, or visit our volunteers during the hours of 12-4pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

For those really enthusiastic about the family background, it might be helpful to immerse yourself in the history and culture of your forebears; there are many other titles and resources in libraries. Travel and geography titles for both Sweden and Finland can be found in the 914.71 and 914.8 shelves. History of those areas are in 947.1 and 948 of the circulating collection in the library. Finland is included in this list, because a part of the Finnish population is Swedish speaking, of Swedish descent and the cultures and history are overlapping.

▲ Sweden's Flag

The exact age of the Swedish Flag is not known, but the oldest recorded pictures of a blue cloth with a yellow cross date from the 16th century.

The flag of Sweden was officially adopted on June 22, 1906. The design of the flag is probably taken from the Danish flag, and its blue and yellow colors possibly come from the Coat of Arms.

The *Lesser Coat of Arms* (left) is the one more frequently used in Sweden today.

This colorful banner features three crowns of gold, two over one, topped by a bejeweled closed crown.

The three crowns have been, in one way or another, an emblem of Sweden since 1336, then used as a familiar symbol of the "Three Wise Kings."

An additional legend regarding its application is that King Magnus Eriksson (1319-64) adopted the three crowns to symbolize his title, "King of Norway, Sweden and all of Scania," - a southern province.

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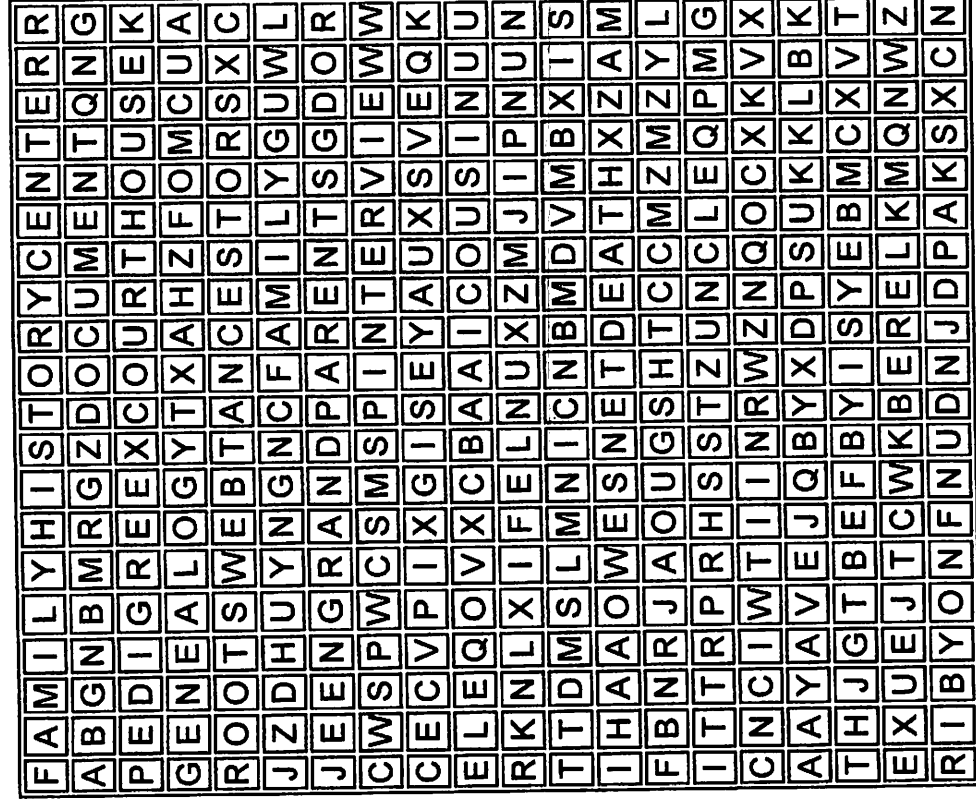

Two days later the girl asked her father the same question.

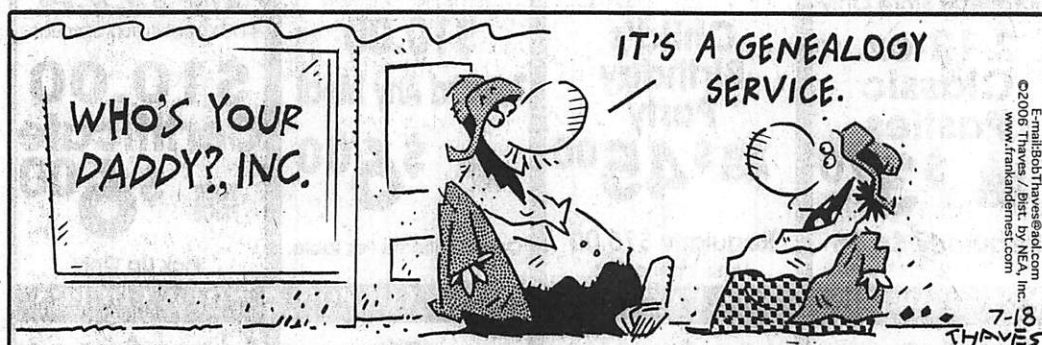

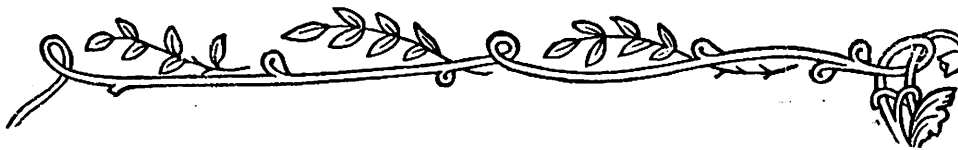

During the year of 18??, a very young girl, Sarah Elizabeth Hamm, was kidnaped from her family in England, and taken aboard a sailing ship bound for America. During a long hard trip across the ocean, the captain of the ship learned that he had a kidnaped child aboard. He took charge of the child, and upon reaching N.Y. thinking it would be too hard on the child, if he took her back on his ship, he placed her with a responsible N.Y. family, (the Wares), and they raised the girl and trained her as a servant. Sarah worked as a servant until she was about 20 or so years, at which time she worked at a well to do family in the charge of the household help

Thomas Elmore born in county Meade, Ireland, came to N.Y. about 18?? and hired out as a coachman for the family Sarah was working for. Thomas and Sarah met, and soon married. After their first child was born, they decided to move West. They left N.Y. with a team of horses and a covered wagon. They settled in Water Town, Wisc. where two more girls were born. Sarah started school in Water Town. Don't know much about the family in Water Town..(later found out he was a mayor, and a butcher among other titles) Most likely, Elmore worked with horses. During the Civil War, the railroad was pushed north from Green Bay to the U.P. of Michigan. Sometime during the early 60's, Elmores moved north. Elmore acquired teams and took a job granding for the railroad. (name scribbled) and Sarah ran the cook shack and bunk house for the help. In 1864 the Elmores were working in the woods west of Ishpeming. The R.R. construction crews were rough bunches. Army deserters, crooks a few jumps ahead of the law. This was the type of life the Elmores lived while your great grandma (Sarah Elmore (Greene jr) was a girl 12-15 years old. Sarah being the oldest had to do work which might been given to a boy. At the age of 15, her father strapped a six-shooter on her, and sent her by foot into Ishpeming to pick up the payroll. It was some way for a girl to grow up, but Sarah was up to it. She told my brother Bill and I, on the way back from the bank, she noticed a man, a short ways behind her. When she walked fast he seemed to keep up, and when she slowed down, he slowed down, so at a curve of the road she slipped behind a large tree and waited until the man was ahead of her. She then stepped back on the road and with the gun in her hand, she marched the man into camp.

In 1864, the Elmores quit the R.R. construction business and moved into Marquette on a work train. Mrs. Elmore opened up a boarding house on Superior St. (Baraga Ave...home of the Children's Museum now) (they got the property from Peter White)

William Greene of St. Jerome , Canada, near Montreal, came to Marquette about 186?, boarded with the Elmores, met Sarah jr. and married her. They in turn, built the first Hi-rise hotel in Marquette. located on the corner of Washington and Fourth St.. They raised all their children there. It later became the convent for the nuns at St. John's Church which was next door.

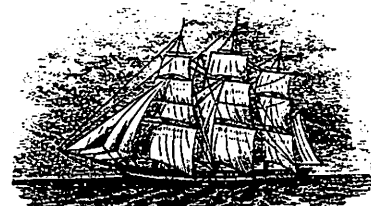
(The Elmores were the grandparents of my own grandfather, Charles Cleary, as their daughter was his mother, Cornelia)

NARA Posts Free Passenger Indexes Online

The National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) has added passenger lists of Russian, German and Italian immigrants to its free Access to Archival Databases (AAD) service. (Irish passenger lists already were available here.)

Each collection consists mostly of immigrants who identified their nationality as Russian, German or Italian and arrived at the ports of New York, Boston, Baltimore, New Orleans or Philadelphia during the 19th century.

The database for each nationality also contains some names of immigrants from other places. For example, 90 percent of people in the German records said they were from Germany or a "German" area—the other 10 percent came from elsewhere.

The data are from passenger list indexes created by the Balch Institute for Ethnic Studies. Keep in mind they're not complete listings of all Russian, German, Italian or Irish immigrants.

For each collection, you'll see a Manifest Header Data File and a Passenger Data File. The search isn't the most intuitive we've ever seen, so get started with these tips:

1. From AAD, click Passenger Lists under Genealogy/Personal History. Then, click the Search button to the right of a Passenger Data File to look for an ancestor. (NARA calls the search terms you enter "values.")
2. In your results, click View Record on the left to see first and last name, age, sex, occupation, last residence, destination and other information.
3. Use the ship manifest identification number to determine the port of arrival. Click View the FAQs and scroll to the chart showing ports and the range of manifest numbers assigned to each port's records.



If you think you've found an ancestor, you can search the database for his or her passenger manifest identification number. That lets you see all passenger records from that ship—handy for finding traveling companions.

In the Manifest Header Data File, you can search for all ships with a particular manifest identification number, ship name, departure port or arrival date. For example, say you know your German ancestor arrived March 16, 1846. Click the Search button next to the German Manifest Header Data file and enter *03/16/1846* in the Arrival field. You'll get all the ships included in this database that arrived that day. Then you can go back to the Passenger Data File and search for the passengers on each ship.

I highly, highly recommend reading the FAQ document—each database has its own, linked at the top of the search screen. It'll help you search the databases and understand your ancestor's record.

Some places of origin or other data are difficult to interpret. You'll want to see your ancestor's original passenger list, which you can do on microfilm at major genealogy libraries, NARA facilities and the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints' Family History Library. You can view records online through the subscription Web site Ancestry.com.

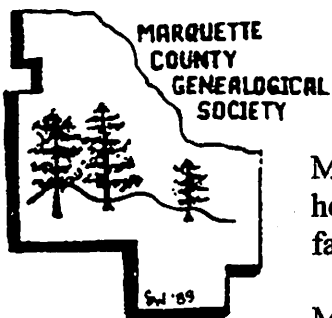

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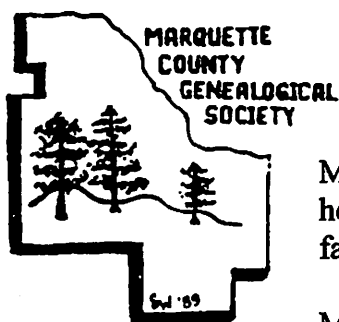
