



Great-grandmother: Eliza Maskell-England (1836-1907)

Grandfather: Richard Eugene Curtis (1877-1949) Grandmother: Addie Belle Norris (1890-1951) Great Grandfather: James Frank Norris (1868-1928)

Great Grandmother: Etta (Marietta) Bohannon (1863-1899)

What I am finding in the records in Middlesex shows that Etta had children with James Norris and Richard Norris. The birth dates of the children seem to mix so I'm not sure who she was married to at the time - it seems that she had some with James then with Richard then with James. My oldest sister also was married twice. Middlesex doesn't list her at all for marriages or tells me James death. I still I am going to Alburgh to check. Does Alburgh Springs have vital records also?

My cousin Edmund Spaeth (mother Ida Therrien) has researched some of the family lines on the Therrien side. Do you, by chance, have any pictures of the Lewis Therrien and families? I am willing to pay to have copies made if you or if you know if someone has access to them, I would like to add them to our family pictures.

At the State Library in Montpelier there is a copy of the genealogy that was done by Mr. Stratton, but once again the Norris's were thought about but not done. There is also information on the Bohannons there but not Etta and not James.

I can make copies of any of the lines I have on the Therriens, if you are interested. Did you want the information to add to where the Curtis line comes into the Therrien line? This may not be something you want to get into. The option is there if it is anything you are interested in.

Let me know how much for your book on the Therrien's, I feel as it is my family I should certainly be interested in having one.

Once again, thank you for taking the time to talk with me. I would also be interested in anything you might remember about my grandparents, notes make them come alive.



I don't believe that Etta Bohannon could have been named Edith. From what I have found so far, Edith was married to Alfred C. Norris, Jr. I haven't seen anything on an "Eva " Bohannon yet. All the birth certificates and Addie Bell Norris's birth and death certificates show that her name was Etta. On some there is no last name but on others it is Bohannon, James F. Norris, from what I can tell, was born on January 29, 1865, his father's name was James Norris, they also had a baby they named James Norris that lived only 3 days. I hope to get to Middlesex again this week and I think that I will concentrate on the Bohannons and maybe I can find something there. If she was indeed James' wife, she would have been around the same era take a little bit. James F. Norris was also married again to a Pearl Maskoll, I question whether the Maskoll should be with an "A" instead of an "o". They had at least two children - one of them named Mildred Pearl Norris. This is like putting together a puzzle and what excitement when another piece fits!

On another thought — My cousin is looking for information on Mary Ann Trepanier's parents, Edmond has her listed as the mother of Ida Audet/Odett wife of Napoleon Paul Therrien. He found a marriage certificate for John Trepanier and Eliza Simpson. He says he thinks John might be the father, but Eliza may not be the mother. Do you have info on this? You might have researched it for your book.



Hope all is well, and you haven't floated away with all the rain we have had.

Did you get my last e-mail that I had sent you? I wasn't sure if I had clicked onto the wrong address and your mail went who knows where.

I now know that my great-grandmother's name was Marietta Bohannon, daughter of Chauncy Bohannon. She married my great-grandfather, James F. Norris, in the manse, in Williamstown, ON, by a Presbyterian minister. My question now is, who would know who is buried in the Greenwood Cemetery? Does someone have a list of who is buried where or is that too old to be able to come up with anything? I believe that is where they are buried as we have a picture of Addie and Richard Curtis in that cemetery over by the little rock, and my oldest sister says that Addie is pointing to their graves. But since no one that I know is still living, I need help. Can you direct me where to go next?

My sister's, brother and myself took a ride into Clarenceville, PQ, and found the graves of my uncle, Stephen Palmer Curtis. On his stone, he is listed as S. Palmer Curtis, and his wife Olive Bohannon, also, my aunt Lydia Lucinda who married a Brown. I also believe that Elijah Curtis and Lucinda Wheeler are my great-great grandparents. They are also buried in the same cemetery. It appears to be something of a family cemetery. I need to find out who to go to up there also, I am going to try to get in touch with my cousin Doreen and see if she can help me.

Where did you say the cemeteries were that you had seen Curtis graves in? We found some Curtis's in the cemetery where my aunt, Flora Therrien Schoolcraft is buried and some of those are Stephen Palmer's children. Others seem to have the family name and may be great-aunts etc. The other cemetery we found was just after you cross the border from Alburgh Springs, Go up the rode to the "Y" in the road and bear to the right. Down that road on the left is a cemetery that is not being mowed at all and getting in rough condition. These people are related, and I still have to find the common connection. The names are too much the same not to be relatives. We had a great day checking out the cemeteries. Got soaked but all for fun.

Do you ever remember seeing my grandmother Ida Aubin and her husband, Louis, after they had their daughter, Ida and a baby, Paul? My cousin just sent me a very poor copy that he had scanned into the computer only being able to identify some of them. I'm going to ask him if he can get a better picture and maybe we could get together so you could look at it and tell me what you think. We found a picture of my grandfather and grandmother's wedding, so I know what they look like. I had some photocopies made out at Taft's Corner in Williston, on a special paper with a laser printer. Each page took 55 second to copy. It's not photo thickness but the pictures came out very well.

Well, have to go. Will write again.

Thanks for the e-mail. I did purchase the History of Alburg a couple of months ago when I was passing through Alburg on a shopping trip. I have studied the pages on the cemetery and have visited the cemetery twice. This i s where I find a lot of my Bohannon ancestors. What I am questioning is the

fact that I think that my great-grandparents, James F. Norris and Etta (Marietta Bohannon Norris) are buried there without a stone. A baby that they had is buried over in the far corner to the back, he was also named James. Etta's body was released to her father, Chauncy Bohannon, who is also buried in this cemetery, to be buried in the Alburg Springs Cemetery. I am assuming that the Alburg Springs Cemetery is what is now known as the Greenwoods Cemetery.

Thanks for offering to send me the book. When the person in the Town Clerk's Office mentioned it, I decided it was a must to purchase and have used it a lot. I also have been over to Montpelier and copied some of the pages from his second book on Alburgh that he never had the chance to complete. This also has been a wonderful resource. I was afraid you would say that for the microfiche/film. Well I did not expect to have everything come easy.

I have talked to the person who lives a little way from me who gave a lot of the information to Mr. Stratton for his Bohannon

Thanks for the e-mail. As to where my grandparents are buried, no they are not buried in Canada. They are in the Alburgh Center Cemetery in the same lot as my parents, they did not have a gravestone until a couple of years ago until my sister and I put one in for them and several other members of my family in the same lot. My Aunt Lena, Dad's sister is also buried there. Richard died in 1949 and Addie died in 1951. The year of birth on Richard's is wrong as, at that time, we did not know for sure when he was born but we found papers, so we now know. I have just recently received a picture of Uncle Parm (Stephen Palmer Curtis and Olive Bohannon and some others that I do not know who they are.) David do you ever remember someone by the name of James Frank Norris? He was Addie Norris Curtis's father. I'm not sure if it was him also in this picture. But I am thinking it is him or one of the other brothers.

Adam Tuttle Curtis is also buried in the Alburgh Center Cemetery, He is just up from where my father is buried. He does not have a marker with his name on it, but his wife Pearl Schoolcraft has a marker as his wife. I don't know why they never put one in for him, but Earl told me that that is where his father is buried.

David do you have any address and/or telephone number where you do research in Burke, NY? I am anxious to go over there to see if I can find out anything on my Curtis line.

Charles F. Bell from Swanton, — his father was A. J. Bell and his mother was Barbara Smith.

I have not caught up with a cousin of mine to see about pictures of the Therriens yet, we seem to be moving in different directions event though we live 'only' 3 miles from each other. I have touched base

and since they are back from taking their daughter to college, I will have to make time to get together with them as I want to see if they have any other pictures than the wedding picture of Louis and Ida Therrien and Arthur Therrien and Cora Dennis Therrien.

Hi David:

Thanks for the offer to look up the Curtis's in Burke, NY. The reason I am looking there is that when Assa, Ascell, or Ashael - all one and the same person - was married, it shows that he was born in Burke. Also, when he had children it shows his birthplace as New York State, or Burke. Assa is listed as being baptized at the same time as his father, Elijah Curtis, and bother Stephen, sisters Olive, Mahala and Sarah and someone else. It also lists Elijah's father as Stephen and his mother as Sarah. So, I guess that I am looking for information on that group. If you find anything I will go to New York and look at other records. It's not that far away. Stephen Curtis was born in 1837, Assa Fuller Curtis in 1844, and a daughter Amanda in 1850, so there is a range of time when they were young. There were also other children. I'm not sure how many. Elijah and Lucinda Wheeler were not married until 1843 and that was in Alburgh.

Alburgh Center Cemetery — we also put up a monument for my Mom's brother, Paul Therrien and one for the two babies that my parents lost. I will look for the one you put up. I have been going around and taking pictures to go with my genealogy and keeping track that way also. Just another way to recheck my work.

James Frank Norris — I have his information as to birth, marriages, children and his and Etta's death. I was wondering if you had ever met him to know what he looks like as I question a picture I have as to whether it might be him or another uncle on my Dad's side. I have quite a bit of information on the Norris side of the family, I have written down a lot of the family from Edward on forward. I have Edward's father as William and his mother as Sarah Hammond. Do you know where she was born? I

have also been able to connect the Norris's to the Curtis's along that other line of Curtis's in Clarenceville, James Frank Norris's aunt married a Curtis. I am willing to help people with what I have for information if you want

I talked to Addie Norris Curtis's niece (Addie's half-sister's daughter) who was Mildred Pearl Norris's daughter and she said that the Bohannon's were nothing but a bunch of Indians.

If I can be of any help just let me know. Thanks for all your help.


Dear Jude:

I have read and re-read your recent e-mail and have so much to reply about I don't know where to begin.

First, I am glad you have contacted David Bell - he has his mind on all the families of Alburgh and the nearby towns in VT and NY, and probably knows more than anybody about connections of families. I am more than anxious to know if he feels your Joseph Andrews is

part of the Andrew family of Alburg. If so, he must be a son of Hugh and Clarissa Andrew. Later generations of that family put an "s" on the end of their name. Also, Hugh and Clarissa were the only Andrews to have descendants: James and Olive (Hammond) Andrew had no children of their own.

Secondly, I went to the web site of Marlene Simmons with Eastern Townships of PQ and northern VT and NY information, and looked into the free index of names by Soundex, and there are many, many La Joie, MacNeill, Jennett, Brissette, and Andrews names with various spellings (some being obviously not connected even though same Soundex number). But the ones you can tell are same family are still in the hundreds.

Same is true for Hammond. Even if you don't hire Marlene to search, you know there is a wealth of information out there on those names. I rather think the name Jennett originated as "Jeannotte", a very commonly used French Canadian name. David may be in touch with Marlene through the French-Canadian genealogical society and have access to the same records she has indexed. Let 's hope so.

Yes, Malone would be a good place to expect to find Alburgh people. They populated a good deal of far north New York, I think. My own Hammonds went to Massena and Louisville, a

short way west of Malone. Also, Album people were known to be in Brasher and Bangor areas. The railroad went right through Ellenburg, where Benjamin Hammond, Jr., had a hotel before 1850. Really, you may expect Alburgh people throughout Clinton, Franklin and St. Lawrence Counties in New York, as well as Essex County. although the many Hammonds in Essex County were probably were not of Alburg.

No, I have never been to VT. In fact, I have been to England and to the Caribbean, but never east of So. Bend, IN, in the USA. I don't travel much, and when I do, it is usually to visit family in Amarillo, TX. My father is still living at age 101, and not in good health, so I go there several times a year, and that's as much as I can be away from here. I am going there next week, and while there, my brother, his wife, and I plan to drive to lowa and back for a brief visit in our High School home town where we will participate in alumni days with our classes - 60th anniversary of graduation for me! Whenever my brother leaves Amarillo, Dad gets panicky. He is in an excellent assisted living home so does not really need Ken there every day. We will see how he reacts when we get ready to leave for lowa. So, I will be away from my computer from May 18 through May 31. That is a longer time than usual to be away from here, so will have to do lots of prep, things on hand for my husband to cook for himself, etc.

First of all, Virginia, thank you for your wonderful email the other day. I am very excited about trying to locate Elizabeth (Betsey) Andrews and her brother Henry Andrews' parents, Joseph and Mary.

FYI - Betsey Andrews' death certificate, my gr gr grandmother, said she was born in Alburgh Springs. She and the Civil war soldier, William Lajoy, formerly, Lashway, were married in 1867, in Brush's Mills, NY. I learned it is now Brushton and part of the Town of Moira, NY. It is a wooding station on the Little Salmon River, in upstate NY. Betsey says in an affidavit in William's Civil War pension file, that she cannot recall the month and day of 1867 in which they married!!

But she further goes on to name all the children's exact birthdays!! Ha! The children of Betsey and William were born all over the place! Of course!

David- I will keep you posted, and you are a saint.





CATHERINE: Born on Monday evening, August 3, 1818 possibly at or near Downpatrick, County Down, Ireland. She migrated with her parents to Grand Isle, VT, later to the Irish Settlement Road in Schuyler Falls, NY. She married Francis McCadden on Saturday, January 2, 1841 in St. John's Catholic Church in Plattsburgh by the Reverend Roonev. According to the Plattsburgh Press Republican of Saturday, November 22, 1856, there was a mortgage sale of a parcel of land that Francis McCadden bought on Saturday, January 6, 1855. Three years later, on March 11, 1853, he sold this land to Benjamin Ketchum for \$755.27. By November of 1856, Benjamin Ketchum defaulted on his payments and Francis McCadden again tried to sell this land. Catherine's father, Daniel Tracy, sold two parcels of land in Plattsburgh to her and her husband on Monday, December 22, 1856.

Margaret, born on Tuesday, July 8, 1851, baptized on Tuesday, August 3, 1852 and died on Monday, March 8, 1880

Anastasia, born on Monday, October 17, 1853, baptized on Sunday, November 6, 1853 and died on Wednesday, January 24, 1912

Edward, born on Tuesday, November 6, 1855, baptized on Sunday, December 9, 1855 and died on Saturday, March 21, 1925

James, born in September of 1858 and died on Wednesday, October 13, 1915.

The family is listed in the 1850 Federal Census for Plattsburgh, which was enumerated on July 18, 1850. It lists Francis McCadden as being 36 years of age, occupation listed as a 'tailor' and being born in Ireland. Catherine McCadden as being 33 years of age, being born in Ireland; Mary as being 7 years of age, born in New York; John as being 5 years of age; Catherine as being 5 years old; Francis as being 3 years old; and Ellen as being 1 year old. According to the Federal Industry Census for Plattsburgh, it listed Francis McCadden as having a clothing store, and the value was listed at \$6,000.00. He had 5 employees of which male employees were paid 85 cents and female employees were paid 25 cents.

By the year 1860 Francis McCadden and his family are growing larger. According to the 1860 Federal Census for the town of Plattsburgh it listed Francis as being 45 years of age and a constable for the town. Catherine is listed as being 40 years of age and the value of her real estate is listed as being \$2,200.00 and the value of her personal estate is listed as being \$200.00. There are nine children listed in the household including Margaret age 8, Anastasia age 6, Edward age 4 and James age 3. The Plattsburgh Sentinel Newspaper reported on Friday, August 7, 1868, the following: "Mr.

McCadden has nearly completed a new two story, brick building, on Brinkerhoff Street, between Hooey's and the First Presbyterian Church, opposite the Post Office. This is a convenient locality for business, and we hope to see an enterprising establishment of some kind in operation there."

Francis McCadden was appointed a Police Constable for Plattsburgh on Wednesday, July 28, 1869. The Plattsburgh Sentinel reported on Friday, August 6, 1869, the following: "Mr. McCadden, Senior, was appointed one of the Police Constables of Plattsburgh, at a meeting of the village trustees last Wednesday evening. As most are aware, Mr. McCadden has had several years' experience in this line heretofore. We congratulate the board on selecting so efficient an officer. Any business entrusted to him we guarantee will be attended to with efficiency and dispatch."

According to the 1870 Federal Census for the town of Plattsburgh, it listed Francis and Catherine McCadden and their family. Francis is listed as being 55 years of age and is a constable for the town of Plattsburgh. His wife, Catherine is 50 years of age and is keeping house. The value of her real estate is listed as being \$6,000.00 and the value of her personal property is listed as being \$500.00. The following children are also listed at the household: Mary age 26 is a tailoress; Catherine age 24 is a dress maker; John age 23 is a clerk in a store; Francis age 22, Ellen age 20, Margaret age 18, Anastasia age 15, Edward age 14 and James age 12.



Francis McCadden bought land in the years 1872 and 1877. By the year 1880 the McCadden family is residing in Plattsburgh and some of their grandchildren are now living with them. According to the 1880 Federal Census it showed Francis McCadden as being 59 years of age and is at home. His wife, Catherine is listed as being 56 years of age. The following children are also listed in the household: Mary age 30 listed as keeping house, Edward age 23 listed as a clerk and James age 22 is also listed as a clerk. There are also two grandchildren living there. The grandchildren are Edward Newton age 3 born in Canada and Anna E. Newton age 5 months born in Ohio. Their mother, Margaret (McCadden) Newton died on Monday, March 8, 1880 in Toledo, Ohio of heart failure at the age of 28. Her husband, John Newton brought the children back to Plattsburgh to live with Francis and Catherine McCadden. Catherine (Tracy) McCadden was mentioned in the Plattsburgh Morning Telegram Newspaper on Monday, January 16, 1888. It read: 'Mrs. Francis McCadden fell on ice on Cornelia Street Saturday evening and ruptured a small bronchial blood vessel while on the way to the residence of her sister, Mrs. William Brenan, with a basket of flowers. Taken to the residence of Mr. J.P. Brenan nearby, she was treated by Doctors Larocque and Dunham. She is now comfortable and out of danger.' According to the New York State Census for the year 1892 it listed Francis McCadden as being 70 years of age and living with his wife, Catherine who is also shown as being 70 years of age and grandchildren Edward Newton age 15 and Anna Newton age 12. This is the last census that Francis and Catherine McCadden would be listed in.

Catherine McCadden died on Tuesday, March 21, 1893, at the age of 75 in Plattsburgh. According to the church records at St. John's, she died of 'stomach trouble.' Her funeral mass was said at St. John's Church and she was buried on Thursday, March 23, 1893 in the Old Cemetery in Plattsburgh (Section C9, Lot 12, Grave 2, Lot Book Page 56). After his wife's death in 1893, he was willed land from her (Book 89, Page 796). Francis McCadden died on Saturday, July 14, 1894, of pneumonia at the age of

82. On Monday, July 16, 1894, he was buried next to his wife (Section C9, Lot 12, Grave 1). A friend of the family from Ireland, Isaac Stanton, is also buried in the family lot, Grave 4. He died on Friday, June 24, 1881. Francis and Catherine McCadden were married a total of 51 years until Catherine's death.

Further land transactions made by Catherine McCadden are recorded by the Clinton County Clerk. On Sunday, April 20, 1873 Catherine McCadden is shown as having paid \$650.00 for a parcel of land located in Plattsburgh. Eleven years later she sold this same parcel of land, which was located on Durkee Street, to Bridget Tapp for \$1,025.00 on Tuesday, May 13, 1884. On Thursday, July 28, 1884, Catherine McCadden sold an additional parcel of land, which was located on the corner of Bridge and Water Streets also in Plattsburgh for \$80.00 to George Dodds. Francis and Catherine McCadden also owned and operated a grocery store, which was located on the corner of Bridge and River Streets in Plattsburgh. According to the Plattsburgh Sentinel on Friday, May 24, 1895, "F.H. Graves has leased the McCadden store, corner of Bridge and River Street, and will in short time open it with a full line of groceries." Thirteen years later, on Friday, June 26, 1908 the Plattsburgh Sentinel Newspaper reported that an early morning blaze damaged the upper stories of the McCadden block. The buildings were owned at that time by Frank McCadden, Jr.



MARGARET: Born on Wednesday, October 10, 1821, at or near Downpatrick, County Down, Ireland. She married Charles Kean on Sunday, May 19, 1839, in St. John's Catholic Church at Plattsburgh by the Reverend Drummond. Charles Kean was a joiner and builder by trade. According to the Plattsburgh Republican Newspaper for Saturday, November 10, 1838 (before their marriage), "Charles Kean would respectfully inform the public that he has opened a shop a few rods east of the Episcopal Church, on River Street, where he will carry on the carpenter and joiner business, in its various branches. The various kinds of cornice, and stairs of all descriptions, will be made and in the best style. He will also furnish architectural drafts according to five orders, on short notice. He feels assured that his experience and knowledge of the business acquired in the principal entries of America, qualify him to execute any work that may be wanted and justifies him in soliciting public patronage. Plattsburgh, May 1838."

Margaret and Charles had 14 children who were all born in Plattsburgh.

Apaibatia born in 1839 and died before 1850 Ellen born on Wednesday, May 24, 1840 and died on Wednesday, February 24, 1915 Catherine born in 1845 and died on Saturday.

Plattsburgh Republican - September 12, 1840

Charles and Margaret Kean were first listed in the 1840 Federal Census for Plattsburgh village. Charles Kean is listed as being between ages of 30-40 and his wife, Margaret is listed as being between the ages of 15-20. Their first daughter, Apaibatia is listed as under the age of 5. There is also listed another free white female aged 10-15. It is not known who this could be. Apaibatia Kean was born in 1839 and died before 1850.

According to the 1850 Federal Census for the town of Plattsburgh, it listed Charles Kean as being 39 years of age, born in Ireland and worked as a carpenter and joiner. The value of his real estate is listed as being \$800.00. His wife, Margaret was listed as being 24 years of age. The

following children are also listed: Ellen age 10, Mary age 8, Catherine age 5, Daniel age 4, Charles age 11 months. Also listed were John Cavanaugh age 21 who was a carpenter and joiner and William Brenan age 22 who was also a carpenter and joiner. He was married at the time to Margaret's sister, Mary a year before the census was taken.

On Thursday, December 26, 1850, Charles and Margaret Kean purchased a parcel of land in the City of Plattsburgh for \$500.00 from Moss K. Platt. In 1856 Margaret Kean sold some of her land to Richard Cothill (Book 29, Page 285). The family is listed in the 1860 Federal Census for Plattsburgh village, which was enumerated on Thursday, June 14, 1860. It listed Charles Kean as being 45 years old, occupation listed as an architect and being born in Ireland. His wife, Margaret (Tracy) Kean was listed as 33 years of age, birthplace listed as Ireland.

According to the 1870 Federal Census for Plattsburgh, Charles Kean was listed as being 50 years of age and is a carpenter by trade. The value of his real estate is \$3,000.00, and his personal property is listed as being \$2,000.00. His wife, Margaret is listed as being 48 years of age and keeping the household. The following children are also listed in the census: Ellen age 28 is a milliner, Kate age 24 is a clerk in a store, Margaret age 17, Elizabeth age 13, Annie age 9 and James age 6.

By the year 1880, according to the Federal Census for Plattsburgh, which was enumerated on June 7 it stated Charles Kean was 63 years of age, occupation listed as a builder. Margaret (Tracy) Kean was listed as being 57 years of age and born in Ireland. The following children were also listed as living with their parents: Margaret, Elizabeth, Anna, James and son Eustachius.

Later, Charles and Margaret Kean sold some additional parcels of land in 1885 to Mose K. Platt (Book 80, Page 714) and to William Rooney (Book 80, Page 715). There is also a record of Margaret Kean in May of 1888 selling a parcel of land to Myron Elkins for \$1.00 (Volume 84, Page 357). The last record of Margaret Kean is when she sold an additional parcel of land in Plattsburgh to Stephen Ryan for \$1,100.00 (Volume 84, Page 803) on Monday, July 23, 1888.

Charles Kean died on Tuesday, December 6, 1887, in Plattsburgh at the age of 74 and is buried in the Old Cemetery at Plattsburgh. Also, in 1888, their son, Daniel H. Kean, sold more parcels of his parents' land to Ellen Cavanaugh, his sister (Book 84, Page 728) and to the Heirs of Cotthill (Book 84, Page 807 and Book 84, Page 808). Margaret Kean was not mentioned in these documents.


Sometime very shortly after Charles Kean's death, Margaret and some of her children moved to Chicago, IL, in early 1888. She resided at 631 West 45th Street with her daughter, Ellen Cavanaugh. Later the address would change to 531 West 45th Street. Margaret Kean became a member of St. Gabriel's Church for the rest of her life.

Margaret Kean and her daughter Mary Murphy with her granddaughter, Nellie Murphy attended the Catholic Summer School in July of 1895 in Plattsburgh. According to the Plattsburgh Press Newspaper for Thursday, July 18, 1895, it listed Margaret Kean as residing at 631 West 45th in Chicago. They

resided while in Plattsburgh at 14 Couch Street. The Catholic Summer School program for that year had various lectures, daily outings and an evening at the Fouquet House.

Margaret Kean was listed in the 1900 Federal Census for the Town of Lake (Chicago), Cook County, IL. This census was taken on Saturday, June 2, 1900. The census listed Margaret as being 78 years old, a widow and born in Ireland in October of 1821. The census also listed her year of immigration to the United States as being 1823. Margaret was shown as residing at 631 West 45th Street along with her daughters, Ellen Cavanaugh and Margaret Kean; sons James and Eustachius. There was also a boarder listed named Ella Leeny whose age was 9. Her daughter, Ellen Cavanaugh ran a candy store near their residence for many years. Her son, Eustachius Kean was listed as being a furniture storekeeper which he ran for most of his life while living in the Chicago area.

Margaret Kean died on Wednesday, October 3, 1906, at her residence at 8:20 pm of stomach complications at the age of 84. Her death certificate listed her as being 85. She was taken to McInerney Brothers Funeral Home located at 750 West 43rd Street where she was waked for one day. According to the Chicago Record Herald Newspaper dated Friday, October 5, 1906: "Kean-October 3, 631 West 45th Street, Margaret, nee Tracey, wife of the late Charles Kean, mother of Mrs. Cavanaugh, Mrs. Murphy, Margaret, James and Stash Kean. Funeral notice hereafter. Plattsburgh, NY, papers please copy."



Margaret Kean was buried in an unmarked grave at Mount Olivet Cemetery in Chicago on Saturday, October 6, 1906 (Lot S107, Section 25) next to her son-in-law, Charles M. Cavanaugh who had died in 1892.

WILLIAM: Born on Sunday, November 10, 1823 at Grand Isle, VT. He was the first child of Daniel Tracy and Mary Hanna to be born on United States soil. He married Ellen Jorden on Thursday, December 25, 1845, in St. John's Catholic Church at Plattsburgh by the Reverend Rooney. In 1850, William Tracy is located in Peru Township, Clinton County, New York. According to the Federal Census, which was enumerated on Friday, August 23, 1850, he was married to Ellen Jorden who was born in New York. William Tracy was listed as being 26 years old, occupation being a blacksmith. His wife, Ellen, was 24 years old and in 1850 they had four children who were born in New York. They were: Elizabeth age 4; Daniel age 3; Thomas age 2; Mary age 5 months. William

Tracy was a blacksmith while in the town of Peru. Iron making played a major role in the economic development of early Peru with the discovery of high-quality iron ore. Today, long gone are most of the timber and iron related industries and the many mills that once lined the banks of Peru's rivers. William and Ellen Tracy had a total of 15 children. Eight children were born in the Plattsburgh area. Elizabeth born in 1846



William and Ellen Tracy are listed in the 1870 Federal Census for the 6th Ward, City of Chicago, Cook County, IL, which was enumerated on Sunday, July 3, 1870. The Census listed William as being 46 years of age, occupation being a blacksmith, born in Vermont, value of real estate listed at \$2,000.00 and the value of his personal property listed at \$500.00. His wife, Ellen Tracy is listed as being 46 years of age and keeping house.

According to the Federal Census also for the 6th Ward, City of Chicago, Cook County, IL, which was enumerated on Tuesday, June 15, 1880 listed William Tracy as being 56 years of age, occupation listed as a blacksmith, born in Vermont, both parents born in Ireland and living on Lyman Street in Chicago. His wife, Ellen Tracy was listed as well as the following children: William, James, Edward,

Alice, Ellen, Catherine, Margaret and Anna. Nine houses down also on Lyman street in Chicago was listed his son, Daniel and his wife, Margaret and two daughters: Ellen and Gertrude.

William Tracy was found listed in the 1888 Chicago Voters List. He was shown as being born in Vermont, residence listed at 2931 Keeley. He was at this address for 2 months, in Cook County 30 years and in the State of Illinois for 32 years. His sons Edward, William and James are also listed at that same address in Chicago. Two years later, in 1890, according to the Chicago Voters List, William Tracy was listed again. His residence was listed as 2912 Main Street in Chicago.

William Tracy also appears in the 1871 Merchants Chicago Census Report as residing at 143 Lyman and being born in Vermont. Ellen Tracy his wife, died on Monday, April 20, 1891, at the age of 66 at her home (2912 Main Street) at about 3:00 PM of kidney failure. She was interned at Calvary Cemetery in a single grave (Grave 5, Block 61, Section P) on Tuesday, April 21, 1891.


The Tracy family were members of Saint Bridget's Parish in Chicago. This Church was established in the year 1850. It was

located at 2928 South Archer Avenue in Chicago. This Church was demolished in the late 1980s. In the summer or early fall of 1869, William Tracy decided to run for political office as an Alderman for the City of Chicago. He was the first family member to hold political office. His blacksmith shop was thriving and in his local community he was well known. The 6th Ward of the City of Chicago came to be known as the 'Bridgeport' area. This area around the Chicago River was marshy, turning into higher prairie and farmland around 35th Street, with swampy sites here and there. The first good farm road, known today as Archer Avenue, was constructed in 1831. Bridgeport acquired its name through the fact that the heavily-laden barges going down the river had to unload at the location where a low bridge spanned the river around near Ashland Avenue. The chief industry of the area was meat slaughtering. The most famous stockyard, Brighton Yards, was located on the corner of Archer and 39th Street.

During William Tracy's period, a large steel mill was near Archer and Ashland Avenues. The residential settlements grew mainly north of Archer Avenue. Along Archer Avenue, which ran parallel to the river and the Illinois-Michigan Canal, a tavern, stores and hotels sprang up to accommodate cattle drovers herding their animals to the city.

By 1865, the cattle drives along Archer Avenue stopped, leaving the road as a major corridor for travelers to the loop. By 1869, streets were not paved yet and there was no sewage system.

According to the Chicago Daily News for Saturday, October 30, 1869 it stated that 'A mass meeting of citizens for the Chicago Sixth Ward will be held at McGrange's House...Candidate William Tracy will be present." The next day, October 31, 1869, the Daily News reported, 'A large mass meeting of the citizens of the Sixth Ward was held last evening... There were numerous speakers. all whom of enthusiastically applauded as they reviewed the present crusade against corruptionists...' William Tracy as candidate for Alderman was on the ticket with Colonel R.B. Mason who was running for Mayor of Chicago. Corruption during the period was rampant, and the press united with the best citizens in forming and supporting a 'People's Party' of Democrats. William Tracy was a candidate on the People's Party Ticket and urged the people of his ward to elect him and defeat Republican Mayor of Chicago John B. Rice who was Mayor from 1865. On Tuesday, November 2, 1869, election day in Chicago, the Daily News ran this headline: 'Today. The last hours of the Court House Barnacles. Honesty and Economy to meet Corruption and Extravagance Today.'



Wednesday, November 3, 1869 the Daily News reported a 'Grand and Decisive Victory of the Reform Movement in Chicago.' William Tracy at the age of 46, was elected Alderman for the Sixth Ward of the City of Chicago. The Daily News went on to report that in 'Bridgeport, the home of Mr. Kann, who was running against Mr. Tracy was overwhelmed with supporters of Mr. Tracy... The Hickeyites in the Third precinct were under the command of the notorious Jerry Donovan, of prize-ring fame. He engineered the voting, and, with the aid of his gang of bad characters, did much to promote the interest of his friend Kann. They were a rough crowd of swearing, swaggering loafers, with red-hot noses, as fiery as the cabbage-leaf cigars which they smoked. Men who care nothing for human life, and who have earned for the Sixth Ward the expressive title of the 'Bloody Sixth....' Tracy beat Kann (645 to 376) for the office of Alderman. The Daily News reported: 'Majority for Tracy.'

Not much is known about William Tracy's first two years as Alderman. He was a member of the Streets and Alleys Standing Committee (South District) from 1870-1871 and the Wharfing Committee also from 1870-1871 and the Local Assessment Committee from 1869-1870. His office was located on the northwest corner of Archer and Halsted Streets from 1869 until the Great Fire of October 1871, burned the building to the ground.

William Tracy served as a Chicago Alderman during a major historical event, that being, the Great Fire of October 7, 1871. He played an important role in the eventual re-building of the city. It is not known if William Tracy's home was destroyed by the fire.

On Monday, October 9, 1871, Mayor Mason and the members of the Common Council met to discuss the fire and relief. The Mayor issued a Proclamation to all citizens, and the Council passed the following order:

'In consequence of the great calamity that has befallen our city, and for the preservation of good order...It is ordered by the Mayor and the Common Council of Chicago, that no liquor be sold in any

saloons until further orders.'

The Council also set up a Relief Committee to supply information on missing persons and supply food and water to victims of the fire. The road to re-building the City of Chicago had begun.

On Tuesday, October 10, 1871 another Special Session of the Common Council took place and an ordinance was voted on and passed to prevent extortion in the sales of food to sufferers by the fire. The price of a twelve-ounce loaf of bread was fixed at eight cents, and a penalty provided for any violation of the ordinance. William Tracy voted in favor of this ordinance.

Mayor Mason's administration was upon the whole quite satisfactory to the citizens of Chicago, his opponents being mainly those who differed with his views in reference to the licensing and control of the liquor business. In a few weeks, William Tracy was up for re-election and another campaign.



The election of 1871 was a 'first' in Chicago political history. The Republicans Democrats joined together to form the 'Fire-Proof Ticket. This was done because of the Great Fire and the strong belief that no one was ready for another election. The Fire-Proof Ticket under Joseph Medill nominated William Tracy for another term as Alderman for the Sixth Ward. The Chicago Daily Tribune reported, "The man Tracey, who now represents the Sixth Ward in the Board of Alderman, claims that he cannot be beaten, but we have an abiding faith that his record is a little more than any intelligent people can endure Tracey's desire to hold an office which has no legal compensation is intense, but the voters of that ward ought not to let him become richer or

poorer by taking any more of his time on official services."

On Tuesday, November 7, 1871, Joseph Medill was elected Mayor. William Tracy defeated Philip Reidy for another term as Alderman. The vote was 'Tracy 696 to Reidy's 678.'

William Tracy voted on many important issues of the period. Among the issues were the following: City streets being widened, creation of a City Law Library, North side street railway track extended to Randolph Street, Fire Limits Ordinance, and the Appropriation of \$100,000.00 for the repair of the water works.

William Tracy was also an important player in bringing more industries into his Bridgeport neighborhood. After the fire, expansion of industries into the ward included

breweries, foundries, steel mills and brickyards. The Sixth Ward under Alderman Tracy was growing and expanding.


During the first part of Mayor Medill's term as Mayor, he was opposed to the closing of the saloons on Sunday, but being urged by the Committee of Seventy, representing a supposed popular demand, he yielded to these influences. The Committee of Seventy of which Alderman Tracy was a member, urged rigid enforcement of the Sunday-saloon closing law which was devised shortly after the Great Fire. The Committee also promoted moral reforms to combat the great prevalence of lawlessness and crime spread throughout the Chicago area.

By 1872, Mayor Medill was an ardent supporter of the Sunday-closing idea, and in January, he promptly vetoed an ordinance passed by the City Council late in December, repealing the Sunday liquor law. In his veto message, the Mayor said he did not believe a majority of the people wanted liquor sold on Sunday and would like to see the question put to a popular vote.

During his time as Alderman for the City of Chicago, William Tracy was the master mechanic for the Union Stock Yards and Transit Company. Also, with holding the influential position of Alderman of the Sixth Ward of the City, he represented during the 1870s, 22,918 Chicagoans living west of Clark

Street between Sixteenth Street and Egan Avenue (Thirty-ninth Street) according to the Chicago Census Report and Statistical Review of 1870. He was also instrumental in the appointment of Francis

O'Neill as a Chicago Policeman and later Chicago's long time Police Superintendent. In his memoirs Superintendent O'Neill stated the following:

"All appointments in those days to the Police force were charged to the political account of alderman and others in high favor with the existing administration. I was leaning against a lamppost, out on a street corner, not knowing what to do, when along came Alderman Tracy, master mechanic for the Union Stock Yards and Transit Company. What are you doing here? He inquired. After listening to my tale of woe, he continued, Come on in with me. It appears that the alderman was entitled to name two of the one hundred new men provided for the annual appropriation. Addressing the secretary of the board, he demanded my appointment. Why, Alderman, you got your man already, reminded the official. So, I did, came the prompt reply, but I'm entitled to two, and this is the other man. The memory of that kindly act, which was a momentous event in my life, rebounded to the advantage of many others, since the beneficiary of it attained rank and authority in later years."

Accordingly, by the end of 1872, the 'Citizens Union Ticket' was formed out of some members of the Committee of Seventy and the old 'Fire-Proof Ticket, of which Alderman Tracy was a member. This Republican ticket nominated on Sunday, October 26, 1873 William Tracy as their candidate for another term as Sixth Ward Alderman. Their Republican candidate for Mayor was L.L. Bond who was running against Democrat Harvey D. Colvin. This upcoming general election was to have a great historical significance in Chicago politics. That being, it brought an end to the Republican local organization in Chicago for many decades to come. The Citizens Union Ticket also during this election became known as the 'Law and Order Ticket.'

Alderman Tracy would be running against his former opponent in the last election, Philip Reidy of the 'Liberal People's Party' and Mr. Conley of the 'Independent Party.' In the Sunday edition of the Chicago Daily News for Sunday, November 2, 1873, the newspaper ran a paragraph campaign ad which stated: 'Let every man turn out, and the ladies, bless 'em. Let them do their duty, let them turn the men out to vote for the Union Ticket...'

The Union Ticket, including Alderman Tracy, indicated that the citizens could vote for law and order or

for continued crime and moral lawlessness. This election was based on moral issues, right and wrong. William Tracy's name appeared in the Daily News for the last time on election day, Tuesday, November 4, 1873, urging voters to elect him again.

The official returns of the election were released the next morning. The Daily News for Wednesday, November 5, 1873, carried this headline:

'The Hesing-O'Hara Ticket carries the day. Average majority about 12,000...A general Republican rout on all sides.'

The Daily News reported 'Long lines to the polling places.' At the Citizens Headquarters on election day the Daily News stated:

'The result astonished everybody but the candidates, who knew they were licked several hours previous... Most candidates went home early...'

The election totals for the Sixth Ward of the City of Chicago were as follows:

'Reidy 2,212 votes Tracy 984 votes Conley 149 votes'

William Tracy lost the election. With this election, the Union Party and the local Republican organization, as an active political factor came to an end. On Saturday, November 8, 1873, the Daily News ran a column stating:

When great men die it is necessary to embalm their memory... There was a sudden and

William Tracy.

William Tracy, who was a member of the city council during the administration of Mayors R. B Mason and Joseph Medill, died yesterday at his home, 2012 Main street, aged slifty-eight years Mr Tracy represented the old Sixth Ward, his first term as alderman beginning in 1889 He was elected a second time and served altogether four years He leaves three sons, Daniel, James and Henry.

unexpected death on Tuesday last of seventy estimable gentlemen, who figured conspicuously before the public for nearly two years, and have now gone out of the political world...They were buried Tuesday night...Thus, it is over: The Good die young...'

William Tracy served as an Alderman for four years during the Great Fire and other political changes. His term was marked by the Old Chicago, before the fire and he saw the New Chicago rise up and become the

nation's second largest city.

William Tracy returned to his blacksmith shop and eventually retired from his original profession. During his final years, he and his wife resided at 2912 Main Street in the Sixth Ward. The Chicago Tribune reported on March 17, 1891, what would be William Tracy's final involvement in Chicago politics. It stated, "At the Harrison headquarters at the Tremont House can be found nearly all the best workers of the Democratic local organization,,,ex-Alderman Tracy, Phil Ready, and other men of influence from the Sixth." After his wife, Ellen Tracy died in April of 1891, William Tracy lived for six more months.

He died on Monday, October 19, 1891, at his home at 2912 Main Street in Chicago at the age of 68. It is not known how he died, as the family did not request a death certificate. William Tracy was buried on Wednesday, October 21, 1891, next to his wife (Lot 5, Block 62, Section P) in Calvary Cemetery at Evanston, IL.

ALICE: Born on Tuesday morning, May 31, 1825 in Grand Isle, VT. She married Thomas McManus on Thursday, April 15, 1847, at St. John's Catholic Church by the Reverend T. Rooney in Plattsburgh. Thomas McManus was born on Tuesday, December 22, 1818 in County Meath, Ireland. He came to the United States sometime in the year 1828. Thomas McManus became a United States citizen on Wednesday, July 1, 1840, in Plattsburgh, NY. According to the 1850 Federal Census for the town of

Schuyler Falls, NY, Thomas and his wife, Alice are listed along with some of their children. They are living next door to Alice's father, Daniel Tracy. Thomas is shown as being 29 years of age and is a farmer. Alice is 25 years old. At the time, they have two children: Mary age 2 and Daniel age 6 months. They had at least six children who were all born in Schuyler Falls. They were: Mary born in 1848 and died on Monday, February 26, 1883; Daniel born on Thursday, December 20, 1849, baptized on Sunday, January 6, 1850, and died on Saturday, August 18, 1923; Matthew born in 1851, and died on Monday, November 15, 1852; Matthew born on Thursday, May 27, 1852, baptized on Sunday, June 13, 1852, and died on Tuesday, May 4, 1948; Alice born in 1857 and died on Monday, April 30, 1900; Thomas born in 1862 and died on Tuesday, September 22, 1914.

The family is listed in the Federal Census for 1860 Schuyler Falls. Their farm is next to her father's farm, Daniel Tracy. Alice (Tracy) McManus is shown as being 32 years of age and her husband Thomas is listed as being a farmer. In 1866, Alice and Thomas McManus sold various parcels of their farmland to Samuel F. Vilas (Book QQ, Page 143) and again in 1868 to Samuel F. Vilas (Book VV, Page 587).

According to the 1860 Agricultural Census for Schuyler Falls, it listed on Monday, June 25, 1860, that the McManus farm had 32 improved acres of land, 68 unimproved acres, cash value of the farm listed as \$1,050.00 and the value of farm machinery as \$75.00, 4 horses, 5 cattle, 9 sheep, 2 swine, value of livestock was at \$311.00.

Thomas McManus was drafted to serve in the Civil War. According to the record, he was registered sometime during the period of May-June 1863. The record states that he was 40 years of age, residing in Saranac, born in Ireland and his occupation was a farmer. He did not serve.

After selling their lands in Schuyler Falls in 1866, the family moved west and settled for a time in Lake County, IN. According to the 1870 Federal Census for Lake County, it listed Thomas McManus as being 52 years of age and a farmer. His wife, Alice is listed as being 44 years of age and keeping house. The following children are also listed: Mary age 20, Thomas age 9, Daniel age 19, Matthew age 17 and Alice age 14. It was said that during the Great Chicago Fire of October 1871, the family watched Chicago burn from across the lake.

Thomas McManus died on Sunday, November 5, 1882, in Chicago at the age of 63. His wife, Alice continued to live at their residence of 5155 South Bishop Street in Chicago. By 1900 Alice McManus is found living with her grandson, Daniel Williams who was 25 years old and working as a laborer at the stockyards. Alice is listed as being 75 years of age and is renting this house.

Alice was known for her stern ways according to one great granddaughter. When she came to dinner at her son Matthew's house everyone would have to dress properly and speak when spoken to. She was also not known for any kind of humor.

According to the 1900 Federal Census for the Town of Lake, Cook County, IL, Alice McManus was listed as being 75 years of age and widowed. Her residence is shown as being rented. At that time, she was living at 5155 South Bishop Street in Chicago. Her grandson, Daniel Williams was also living with her. He was 25 years old and born in Indiana. He worked as a laborer in the stock yards.

Sometime after June of 1900, she moved into a home located at 5249 Center Avenue. She lived there for the rest of her life. She was a member of the Church of Visitation in Chicago. Alice (Tracy) McManus died on Friday, April 26, 1907, at about 7 pm of apoplexy, which she had since Saturday, April 20, 1907, at the age of 82. She was waked at the McInerney Brothers Funeral Home located at 750 West 43rd Street on Sunday, April 28, 1907. According to the Chicago Record Herald dated Saturday, April 27, 1907, it read: "McManus-April 26, 1907, at 5249 Center Avenue, Alice, beloved wife of the late Thomas McManus, nee Tracey, mother of Daniel, Matthew and Thomas and the late Mary Williams

and the late Alice O'Neill, aged 82 years. Funeral Monday at 9 A.M. to Church of Visitation, where high mass will be celebrated, thence to Forty-seventh street depot, and by cars to Mount Olivet." She was buried at Mount Olivet Cemetery on Monday, April 29, 1907, in a single unmarked grave (Grave 4, Lot 18, Section 44).

MARY: Born on Saturday evening, at about 10:00 pm on November 25, 1826 in Grand Isle, VT. She married William Brenan on Wednesday, August 1, 1849, in St. John's Catholic Church at Plattsburgh by the Reverend T. Rooney. He was born on January 17, 1826 in Montreal. They had five children who were all born in Plattsburgh. They were:

Daniel Henry born on Friday, July 4, 1851, baptized on Saturday, July 5, 1851 and died on Tuesday, December 22, 1908

John Patrick born on Friday, March 10, 1854 and died in 1922

William James born on Friday, February 27, 1863 and died on Sunday, November 11, 1928

Mary Francis born on Tuesday, November 1,

1864, baptized on Saturday, November 5, 1864 and died on Monday, May 4, 1942 Margaret Elizabeth Gertrude born on Tuesday, September 18, 1866, baptize

Margaret Elizabeth Gertrude born on Tuesday, September 18, 1866, baptized on Saturday, September 22, 1866 and died on Saturday, October 4, 1947.

On Sunday, April 21, 1850, William Branan purchased his home and parcel of land leasted presently.

On Sunday, April 21, 1850, William Brenan purchased his home and parcel of land located presently at 60 Oak Street in Plattsburgh from George W. Palmer in the amount of \$200.00. Here the family grew up and were raised. Later, on Tuesday, March 6, 1855 William Brenan purchased an additional parcel of land near his home on Oak Street for \$225.00 again from George W. Palmer.

According to the 1860 Federal Census for Plattsburgh, New York, William Brenan was listed as being 32 years of age and a carpenter. The value of his real estate was recorded at \$1,200.00 and his personal estate valued at \$700.00. His wife, Mary was listed as being 31 years of age. The following children were also listed: Daniel age 9, John age 6. Mary A. Brenan, a sister of William's was also living in the household. Her age was 22 and place of birth shown in Canada.

On Thursday, October 12, 1865, her brother, Daniel H. Tracy and his wife, Anna Carroll Tracy sold 86 of the original 118 acres of land (originally owned by their father, Daniel Tracy) to Mary and William Brenan for \$3,000.00. At that time, Daniel H. Tracy had a \$350.00 mortgage on the land owed to Charles Bernard, of which Mary (Tracy) Brenan agreed to pay. It is thought that her father, Daniel Tracy and his second wife, Anna (Cook) Tracy were still farming and living on this land until both of their deaths. Mary Brenan owned this land for 22 years until she sold the land on Sunday, March 27, 1887, for \$1,800.00 to Joseph Macy of Saranac. At the time of this land sale, Mary Brenan was subject to a lien of a mortgage for \$1,500.00 on the land, which was held by Elizabeth Johnson. This lien was paid by Joseph Macy.

On Monday, April 6, 1868, Isaac Platt Foot sold a parcel of land located on Cornelia Street in Plattsburgh to Mary Brenan. Mary Brenan along with her niece, Ellen Kean, opened up a new millinery located at 84 Margaret Street in Plattsburgh. The Plattsburgh Sentinel newspaper reported on Friday, April 26, 1866: "New Millinery. Rooms have been fitted up over W.H. Morgan's Store for a new Millinery Establishment. They are to be occupied by Miss Kean and Mrs. Brenan, two ladies of taste, and who will enjoy all the facilities necessary to enable them to fill all orders promptly. We have no doubt of their success." The Plattsburgh Sentinel made mention of their millinery business again on Friday, November 22, 1866: "Miss Kean and Mrs. Brenan have just received from New York the latest fashions and a full line of Millinery Goods, which they say they will sell at the lowest prices. Ladies, call and see them." The building would later be called, "The Kean Shop", and by November 25, 1876 it would be completely destroyed by fire.

On Friday, July 1, 1870, the Brenan family were listed in the Federal Census for the town of Plattsburgh. In that year, William Brenan was listed as being 43 years of age, born in Canada and was a merchant. The value of his real estate was listed at \$2,000.00 and the value of his personal property was listed at \$1,000.00. His wife Mary was 42 years of age and keeping the household. The children listed were Daniel age 18, John age 16, William (Willie) age 7, Mary age 5 and Maggie age 3. The Plattsburgh Sentinel reported on Friday, April 8, 1870: "It will be noticed by an advertisement that Mr. Wm. Brenan, of Plattsburgh, is agent for the Great American Tea Company." William Brenan was also a merchant and ran a store located at 84 Margaret Street in downtown Plattsburgh for many years. He sold clothing, scarfs, breakfast shawls, woolen goods and wall papers.

-Wm. Brenau, of Plattsburgh, has received the appointment of Kitchen Keeper at Cliuton Prison.

Plattsburgh Sentinel - February 4, 1876

William Brenan, according to the Plattsburgh Sentinel Newspaper for Friday, February 4, 1876, stated that "William Brenan of Plattsburgh, has received the appointment of kitchen keeper at Clinton Prison."

According to the 1880 Federal Census for the town of Plattsburgh, William and Mary Brenan were listed as follows. William Brenan was 53 years of age and a storekeeper. His wife, Mary was also 53 years of age and keeping the household. The children still living at home were John age 26 and working as a clerk; William age 17 shown at school, Mary age 15 shown at school and Margaret age 13 shown at school. The family lived at 46 Oak Street in Plattsburgh.

During the month of June 1880 an Agricultural Census was taken for the Town of Saranac, NY. It listed Mary (Tracy) Brenan as the owner of her father's (Daniel Tracy) farm and lands. It listed 20 acres as being improved, 170 permanent meadows, value of the farm listed at \$3,000.00, value of the farming machinery at \$100.00, value of livestock \$456.00, amount paid for farm labor \$50.00, weeks hired labor in 1879 - 6 people, estimated value of farm production \$762.00, grass lands mown in 1879 shown as 50 acres, not mown in 1879 shown as 132 acres, hay harvested in 1879 as 45 tons. They had 2 horses, 4 milk cows, 13 other cows, 3 calves killed, 3 calves purchased in 1879, 2 calves sold living, butter made on the farm was 450 pounds, 3 swine, 16 poultry, 7 other poultry, eggs produced in 1879 was 50, wheat crop 18, hops acres 5.

By March of 1887, Mary Tracy Brenan sold the family farm to Joseph Macy. The farm and lands were owned by the Macy family, until Sunday, March 31, 1968, when the family sold the property to Daniel and Marion Downs. This property has now been placed in Marion Downs name by deed of September 15, 1978. The property has been subdivided and a portion was made into a subdivision of 28 lots and known as Feldowns subdivision. The property is located on the north side of the Irish Settlement Road and is on the town line between Schuyler Falls and Plattsburgh and is in the Town of Schuyler Falls. Now after the subdivision and other sell-offs, the farmland that Daniel Tracy once owned comprises 63.3 acres of untouched land left.

William Brenan was for many years an officer for the Clinton County Prison which today is a maximum-security prison called Dannemora. According to the Plattsburgh Morning Telegram on Saturday, January 14, 1888, it read: 'We regret to be compelled to announce that Mr. William Brenan who sustained a paralytic stroke some two years past, is now very low at his residence on Oak Street. His death may be expected at any time.' On Monday, January 16, 1888, the Morning Telegram read, 'In Plattsburgh, Saturday, January 14, 1888, of paralysis, William Brenan, aged 62 years. Funeral will be at St. John's Church this morning at 10 o'clock.' The Plattsburgh Republican Newspaper read on Saturday, January 21, 1888, 'Among those in attendance at the funeral of the late Wm. Brenan of this village were a number of officers of Clinton Prison where Mr. Brenan was by many years a faithful and efficient officer.' On Friday, January 24, 1890, the Plattsburgh Sentinel reported the following: "Mary Brenan, who fell on a sidewalk in Washington and had her collar bone broken, now sues the city for \$5,000.00 damages."

Mary (Tracy) Brenan continued to live on Oak Street in Plattsburgh until her death. In the 1900-01 Plattsburgh City Directory, Mary Brenan is listed as a 'widow' of William, Home 60 Oak.'

According to the Federal Census for Plattsburgh, which was enumerated on Saturday, June 2, 1900, it listed Mary Tracy Brenan as being 66 years of age, born in Vermont, widowed, and shown as keeping house. She is listed with her two sons, John and William, and daughter Mary along with 3 granddaughters Helen, Isabella, Marie, and grandson John. Mary Brenan is also listed in the 1905 New York State Census as being 73 years of age and living with her son John P. Brenan and family.



According to the Plattsburgh Press Newspaper for Wednesday, November 10, 1909 it stated, "Mrs. Mary Brenan is seriously ill at her home on Oak Street."

Mary Tracy Brenan died on Monday, November 15, 1909, of a cerebral embolism, which lasted for 48 days. She was 82 years of age. According to the Plattsburgh Republican Newspaper of Wednesday, November 17, 1909 it read: 'Mrs. Mary Brenan, widow of Mr. William Brenan, died at her home on Oak Street Monday morning after an illness of several weeks. Mrs. Brenan was a lifelong resident of this city and a lady much loved and respected,,,Mrs. Brenan,,,died at 9:30 o'clock this morning at her late residence, No. 60 Oak Street....' She was buried next to her husband, William, in Mount Carmel Cemetery (Section C-11, Lot 3, Book Page 46 #3) in Plattsburgh on Wednesday, November 17, 1909.

DANIEL H.: Born on Thursday, June 20, 1828 in Grand Isle, VT. He married Anna Carroll on Wednesday, June 27, 1849, at St. John's Church in Plattsburgh by the Reverend T. Rooney. They had eleven children who were all born at or near Plattsburgh. His wife, Anna Carroll Tracy died on Monday, October 20, 1873 at Plattsburgh. Sometime after that date, Daniel Tracy moved to Chicago, Illinois. On Monday, January 5, 1880 he married Bridget Harney in Chicago. After their marriage, the couple moved west to Whiting, KS, sometime in the spring of 1880. They had four children. Later the family moved to Horton, Brown County, KS, where Daniel worked in a boiler shop. Sometime after 1900, the family moved back to Chicago. They resided with his sister's (Ellen McWilliams) children at 640 West 45th Street in Chicago. Daniel H. Tracy died on Wednesday, September 18, 1907, at the age of 79. He is buried in Mount Olivet Cemetery in Chicago, however, there no stone. For further details on the family see record for the family of Daniel H. Tracy.

JOHN: Born on Friday, October 1, 1830, in Plattsburgh. He was the first child to be born in Plattsburgh since the family moved from Grand Isle, VT. During the summer of 1832, Plattsburgh witnessed a

cholera scourge. Warnings were distributed by the village health officer which included the following: 'All persons are prohibited from throwing upon any vacant lot or into any yard, street or lane, any offal, vegetables, fruit, dirt, ashes, filth, garbage...etc.'

According to the book entitled, 'Plattsburgh 1785-1815-1902", by Marjorie Lansing Porter, it stated that 'A wooden barracks was erected near Dead Creek and there, persons found sanctuary until the cholera crisis passed...There were many victims...Doctors cared for the sick from one end of the community to the other...And often under the most distressing conditions. No record was kept of the

dead.' John Tracy most likely contracted cholera during this scourge. He died on Thursday, December 13, 1832, at the age of 2 years old in Plattsburgh and is buried in Plattsburgh as well.

JAMES: Born on August 10, 1832, in Plattsburgh. He married Jane Byrns on Sunday, May 4, 1856, at St. John's Church in Plattsburgh. According to church records, this marriage was witnessed by his sister, Ellen Tracy. James Tracy resided in Schuyler Falls for a short time and later sometime in 1856 moved to Chicago. He was a contractor and builder by trade.

His wife, Jane Tracy, ran a school store near O'Brien Street in Chicago. They are listed in the 1880 Chicago City Directory as residing at 348

Fifth Avenue and James Tracy was listed as a 'Stonecutter.' By 1900 according to the Chicago City Directory, James Tracy is shown as a 'Carpenter' residing at 659 O'Brien Street.

James and Jane Tracy had 13 children who were all born in Chicago.

Of these children, seven died as infants and are buried in the Tracy lot in Calvary Cemetery in Chicago. They are:

William J. born on Thursday, February 14, 1856 and died on Monday, July 19, 1926

James L. born in March 1859 and died on Friday, August 23, 1935

Mary Ellen born on Monday, July 1, 1861, baptized on Sunday, July 7, 1861

Catherine born on Friday, September 4, 1863, baptized on Sunday, September 13, 1863 and died on Tuesday, May 8, 1866

Francis Daniel born on Monday, January 29, 1866, baptized on Sunday, February 18, 1866 and died on Saturday, February 26, 1872

John born in September of 1867, baptized on Thursday, September 26, 1867, and died on Friday, May 15, 1868

Charles Edward born on Monday, February 17, 1868, baptized on Sunday, March 1, 1868, and died on Tuesday, January 12, 1926

George born on Sunday, February 20, 1870, baptized on Sunday, March 6, 1870, and died on Wednesday, May 18, 1870

Mary born in August of 1872, baptized on Sunday, August 25, 1872, and died on Saturday, April 1, 1950


Jane (Jennie) Hanna born on Tuesday, April 11, 1871, baptized on Sunday, April 23, 1871 and died on Friday, April 27, 1928

Margaret born in 1873 and died on Monday, July 27, 1874

Anna Loretta born on Sunday, January 25, 1874, baptized on Sunday, February 22, 1874

Lillian born on Tuesday, March 19, 1878, baptized on Sunday, April 14, 1878.

The family is listed in the 1865 Illinois State Census for Chicago, Cook County. The Chicago Tribune reported a story on August 22, 1871, which involved James P. Tracy and his brother who was a Chicago Alderman at the time. James was a building contractor for the city, was defrauded and asked his brother for help. The newspaper stated the following: "Alleged Swindlers. An Ex-Union General and an Ex-Rebel Major Arrested on the Charge of Defrauding a Contractor." In the early 1870s, James Patrick Tracy, as he became known, helped to contract and build the steeple for Holy Family Church in Chicago, which is one of the largest Churches in the city. It is located at 1080 West Roosevelt Road. The following was recorded by Brother Thomas M. Mulkerins who wrote a book entitled, 'Holy Family Parish Priests and People' in 1923. It reads,




James P. Tracey was born in Plattsburgh, New York, and came to Chicago in 1856. He settled on O'Brien Street, and holds to his old homestead to the present day, his being the only Christian family left in the neighborhood. He was a carpenter and builder by trade. When he first came to Chicago there was nothing south of twelfth street but prairies, clusters of trees here and there, and a few scattered houses of what nowadays would be called shacks. When Father Damen was ready to put the wooden superstructure on the tower, Mr. Tracey was one of those invited to bid on it. His bid was \$11,000.00 which was \$1,700.00 above the lowest bidder, but such was Father Damen's confidence in Mr. Tracey's ability that he gave him the contract. The tower was thirty-two feet square. The height from the sidewalk to the top of the cross was 266 feet. The height of the brick work is ninety-five feet and height of the superstructure is 171 feet. The architect said that the superstructure would not weigh more than thirty-five tons. When Mr. Tracey had finished it, over 150 tons of material had been put into it. Here are a few details just as Mr. Tracey gave them;

'Forty tons of stone capping the brick. Eleven and one-half tons of wrought iron bars, clamps and nuts. The remainder of large beams, some of which are eighteen-inch square lumber.'

Mr. Tracey himself placed the cross in position. The tower was completed in 1874. According to Mr.

Tracey, Father Damen was one on the best businessman he had ever met. Mr. Tracey lived to the advanced age of ninety years.'

Sometime before 1880, James Tracy and his wife and children relocated west to Kansas. They resided in the city of Atchison. They are shown in the 1880 Federal Census as residing on Fourth Street. James is listed as being 48 years of age and is a builder. His wife, Jane is listed as being 45 years old and the following children are also listed: Mary, Francis, Charles, Jennie, Ann, Lillian and William. Two of his brothers were already in Kansas, Daniel H. and John. His son, James L. Tracy stayed behind in Chicago and operated his father's business and resided in the family home located on O'Brien Street. The family is listed in the 1885 Kansas State Census for Atchison. James Tracy is listed as being 52 years of age and is a contractor. His wife, Jane is listed as being 50 years of age along with the following children: Frank age 19 a laborer; Charles age 17 a telegraph operator; Jennie age 13; Annie age 11 and Lillie age 7. Sometime before 1900, the family moved back to Chicago. According to the 1900 Federal Census for the City of Chicago, James P. Tracy was listed as being 67 years of age and working as a carpenter. His wife, Jane is listed as being 65 years of age. They are listed as being married for 44 years. Their daughter, Lillian is listed as being 22 years of age. Another daughter, Jane

(Jennie) Quinlan is also listed as being 28 years of age and working in a mill shop. Her son, Edward F. Quinlan is listed as being 5 years of age. The Tracy family in 1900, are residing on O'Brien Street. The Tracy family were listed in the 1910 Federal Census for the City of Chicago which was enumerated on Friday, April 22, 1910. The census listed James P. Tracy as being 77 years of age, born in New York, owning his home, being married for 54 years. His wife, Jane Tracy, is listed as being 76 years of age. Their son, James is 31 years of age and their daughter, Jennie Quinlan, is listed as being 28. His wife, Jane Tracy, died on Thursday, December 16, 1915, in Chicago at the age of 73. She was buried in Calvary Cemetery in Evanston, IL (Lot 38, Block 3, Section B) on Monday, December 20, 1915. All their children are buried beside their parents except James L. Tracy. It is not known when or where he died. The other children buried in the family lot are: Catherine died on Tuesday, May 8, 1866, age 2; Mary died on Friday, August 4, 1866, age 2; John died on Thursday, May 14, 1868, age 1; William died on Monday, April 4, 1870, age 1; George died on Tuesday, May 17, 1870, age 1; Daniel died on Friday, February 23, 1872, age 1; Margaret died on Wednesday, August 26, 1874, age 1;

Jennie (Tracy) Quinlan died on Saturday, April 28, 1928, age 56; and Charles who died on Tuesday, January 12, 1926, age 58.

James Patrick Tracy resided in his old homestead on O'Brien Street in Chicago until his death. He was listed in the 1920 Federal Census for the City of Chicago, which was enumerated on Tuesday, January 13, 1920. James P. Tracy was shown as being 87 years of age, living with his son, James and daughter Jennie. His son, James was listed as being 60 years of age and his daughter, Jennie was 46 years of age.

James Patrick Tracy died on Tuesday, October 31, 1922, while attending the wake of his son-in-law, William Southern at the age of 90. According to the Chicago Tribune dated Wednesday, November 1, 1922 it stated: 'Stricken by death at wake for son-in-law. While attending a wake at the late home of William Southern, 55 years old, 641 West 69th Street, Monday night, James Tracy, 90 years old, 659 O'Brien Street father-in-law of Southern, was stricken ill with heart disease and died soon after.' James Tracy was buried in Calvary Cemetery in Evanston, IL, next to his wife on Thursday, November 3, 1922 (Lot 38, Block 3, Section B).

ELLEN: Born on Sunday evening, March 6, 1836 in Plattsburgh. She married Andrew McWilliams on Thursday, November 29, 1860, at St. John's Church in Plattsburgh by the Reverend Maloney. By 1868 the family is found in Chicago.

The couple had five children:

Edward born in January of 1863 and died on Wednesday, June 5, 1901

John born in 1864 and died on Friday, August 26, 1870

Charles born in 1866 and died on Saturday, March 18, 1899

Andrew born on Friday, October 4, 1867 and died on Tuesday, December 15, 1868

Mary born in October 1874 and died on Tuesday, September 12, 1933.

On Tuesday, December 15, 1868 their son, Andrew died in Chicago and is buried in the James Tracy family burial lot (brother of Ellen's) at Calvary Cemetery in Evanston, IL (Lot 38, Block 3, Section B). A second child of theirs, John also died in Chicago on Friday, August 26, 1870, and is also buried in the Tracy family plot at Calvary. The family is listed in the 1870 Federal Census for the City of Chicago. Andrew McWilliams is listed as being 43 years of age and is a laborer, Ellen age 34, Edward age 7, John age 6 and Charles age 4.

The McWilliams family is listed in the 1880 Federal Census for Chicago. Andrew McWilliams is shown as being 53 years old and is a carpenter, Ellen is 43 years old and keeping house, Edward age 17 and is a laborer, Charles age 14 and is at school, and Mary age 6 and is at home.

In the 1880 Chicago City Directory, Andrew McWilliams is listed as a 'laborer' and their residence is 2913 Lyman. Andrew McWilliams died on Monday, April 25, 1887, at the age of 60 and was buried on Wednesday, April 27, 1887 (Grave 8, Lot 67, Block 24). By the year 1890 Ellen McWilliams is listed according to the Chicago City Directory as a 'widower' and her residence is 2917 Lyman. Sometime before 1900 she moved in with her son and daughter. According again to the 1900 and 1901 Chicago City Directories it listed Ellen McWilliams as a widower and her residence is 640 West 45th Street. According to the Federal Census, which was enumerated on Thursday, June 7, 1900, for the Town of Lake in Chicago, it listed Ellen McWilliams as being 63 years old, born in New York and widowed. She is also shown as renting the home at 640 West 45th Street. Her son, Edward is shown as living with his mother, age 37, born in New York, occupation listed as a laborer in a packinghouse. Her daughter,

Mary (McWilliams) Speck is also listed in the census as being born in October 1874 in Illinois, age 25. Her husband, William Speck is listed as being 29. They had 6 children.

On Tuesday, January 13, 1903 Ellen (Tracy) McWilliams died in her home at 640 West 45th Street of a blood clot at the age of 67. According to the Chicago Herald Examiner for Friday, January 16, 1903 it stated: 'McWilliams, 640 West Forty-fifth St., Ellen, wife of the late Andrew, mother of Mrs. Mary Speck, late Charles and Edward McWilliams. Funeral to-day at 9 AM to St. Gabriel's Church. High Mass will be celebrated, then to Forty-ninth and Halsted Street Depot by cars to Mount Olivet.

Plattsburg, NY, and Denver papers please copy.' Mary Speck was shown purchasing the graves for her mother and brother in Mount Olivet Cemetery. Ellen McWilliams was buried in Mount Olivet Cemetery on Friday, January 16, 1903 (Grave 4, Lot 30, Block 39). Their two sons Charles McWilliams who also lived with his mother and her brother (Daniel H. Tracy) at West 45th Street and Edward McWilliams are buried in Mount Olivet Cemetery as well. Charles McWilliams died on Saturday, March 18, 1899, in Chicago and was buried on Tuesday, March 21, 1899 (Lot S15, Block 41). Edward McWilliams died on Wednesday, June 5, 1901, at Cook County Hospital in Chicago and was buried on Saturday, June 8, 1901, in Mount Olivet Cemetery (Grave 1, Lot 31, Block 39).



JOHN: Born on Monday evening, August 6,

1838 in Plattsburgh. He was baptized on Wednesday, October 3, 1838, at St. John's Catholic Church in Plattsburgh. His sponsors for baptism were James McWilliams and his sister, Mary Tracy. He married Mary Ann Brennan on Tuesday, November 26, 1861, in St. John's Church at Plattsburgh by the Reverend Maloney. According to St. John's Church records it stated, 'On the twenty-sixth day of November, I united in marriage John Tracy and Mary Ann (Marianne) Brennan, witnesses 'Loomis Brennan and Maria McCadden.' They had at least one child, James who was born in 1862 in Plattsburgh.

Between the years 1861-1865 they migrated west to Chicago. John and Mary Tracy lived in the same city ward as his brother, William, who was an Alderman at that time. John Tracy according to the Chicago City Directories, is listed as residing at 155 Lyman between the years 1870 to 1879. The family is listed in the 1865 Illinois State Census for Chicago, with John Tracy's age as given between 20 and 30 years old, along with his wife and child. According to the 1870 Federal Census for the Sixth Ward of the City of Chicago, it listed John Tracy as being 32 years of age, occupation listed as a carpenter, value of his personal property \$200.00, born in New York. His wife, Mary, was 32 years of age, listed as keeping house and born in Canada. Their son James, was 8 years old, born in New York and listed as going to school. James Patrick Tracy was born on Tuesday, September 23, 1862, at Plattsburgh and died on Thursday, September 27, 1945, in Long Beach, California. John Tracy worked as a carpenter and blacksmith while in Chicago. He and his wife also operated a small grocery store out of their house at 155 Lyman during the 1870s. Their second child, William was born on Sunday, January 24, 1869, and baptized at St. Bridget Catholic Church on Sunday, January 31, 1869. Their third child, Daniel Charles was born on Thursday, February 23, 1871 and baptized on Sunday. February 26, 1871 at St. Bridget Church. Their fourth child, Margaret Bolbina was born on Monday, March 31, 1873, and baptized on Thursday, April 17, 1873, at St. Bridget Church and died shortly later. Their fifth child, Mary was born on Saturday, June 26, 1875, and baptized on Sunday, July 4,

1875, at St. Bridget Church in Chicago and died on Friday, October 16, 1964, in San Bernardino, CA. By 1879-1880, the family has moved west to Atchison, Atchison County, KS. While in Atchison, the family resided at 675 Kearney Street. The Tracy's were members of St. Benedicts Parish at 1001 North 2nd Street. According to the 1880 Federal Census for Atchison, John Tracy is listed as being 46 years of age and is a carpenter. His wife, Mary Ann Tracy is listed as being 39 years of age, born in Canada and keeping house. Three other children are also listed in the census: James age 18, born in New York, and is a clerk in a store; Mary age 5, born in Illinois, listed as being at home; and John age 1, born in the month of May, and born in Kansas. There is a 12-year-old servant named Florence Passot listed in the household. Their sixth and last child, John Joseph, was born on Monday, May 31, 1880, in Atchison, Kansas. He was baptized on Saturday, June 26, 1880, at St. Benedict's Catholic Church in Atchison. John J. Tracy died in September of 1966, at Trinidad, CO.

John Tracy and his family migrated west to the City of Denver, CO, by 1884. In 1884, John Tracy is listed in the 1884 Denver City Directory as being a millwright and residing at 165 Holladay in Denver. In 1885 the state of Colorado conducted a state census. John Tracy is listed as being 48 years of age, born in New York along with his family: Mary Ann age 45 born in Canada; Mary age 10 born in Illinois; and John J. age 5 born in Missouri. The 1885 Denver City Directory shows John Tracy as residing at 165 Holladay and being a millwright.

John Tracy by the next year, 1886 is listed in the Denver City Directory as residing at 801 Larimer and is working for the Union Pacific Railroad as a carpenter. In 1887



according to the Denver City Directory he and his family are listed as residing at 2840 Holladay as well as his son, James who is a laborer for the Union and Pacific Railroad. In 1888, the family has moved again according to the Denver City Directory. They are residing at 2840 Market Street with John Tracy listed as being a carpenter. John Tracy purchased his home located at 3420 Larimer Street on Friday, May 11, 1888. The Denver City Directory for 1889 shows the family as residing at 3420 Larimer Street in Denver. By 1894 John Tracy is working as a machine hand for the Union Pacific Railroad. In 1896, Mary Tracy is working as a music teacher from her home at 3420 Larimer, John Tracy's daughter. John Tracy worked as a carpenter and machine hand for the Union Pacific Railroad up and until 1904. After 1904 he is not listed in the Denver City Directories as working. His son, John J. Tracy, is listed


The Tracy family is listed in the 1900 Federal Census for the City of Denver, Ward 5, Precinct 8, Arapaho County, Colorado. John H. Tracy is listed as being born in August of 1838, age 61, married 39 years, born in New York and is a carpenter, having owned his house. Mary Ann Tracy is listed as being 61 years of age, born in Canada and the following children: Mary born in June of 1876, age 23, born in Illinois and is a music teacher; John J. born in May of 1880, age 20, born in Kansas and is a machinist for a railroad shop.

in the 1910 Denver City Directory as being a machinist for the Union Pacific Railroad and living at

On Wednesday, February 3, 1909, John Tracy became ill. He died on Sunday, February 7, 1909, at the age of 71 at his home at 3420 Larimer Street in Denver at about 6:45 am from bronchial pneumonia. According to the Denver Times on Tuesday, February 9, 1909, it stated: "Tracy-The funeral of John H. Tracy will be held from residence, 3420 Larimer at 1:30 P.M., Annunciation Church at 2 pm, Wednesday, February 10, Internment at Fairmount." He was buried at Fairmount Cemetery (430 South Quebec Street) on Wednesday, February 10, 1909 (Grave 4, Lot Number 96, Block Number 10).

Mary Ann Tracy continued to reside at the home along with her son, John J. Tracy and his wife, Elizabeth Tracy. She is listed in the 1910 Federal Census for Denver as being 71 years of age and is widowed. Mary A. Tracy died on Wednesday, February 28, 1912, and was buried next to her husband at Fairmount Cemetery (Grave 2, Lot Number 96, Block Number 10) on Friday, March 1, 1912. According to the Rocky Mountain News on Thursday, February 29, 1912, it stated: "Tracy-Mary Ann, at her residence, 3420 Larimer. February 28, Funeral from residence Friday at 1:30 pm, Internment Fairmount cemetery." She is buried with her grandchildren, Edmund D. Tracy who was 8 months old and buried on Monday, August 21, 1893 and John M. Tracy who was 10 months old and buried on Tuesday, February 9, 1897 at Fairmount Cemetery.







The Adirondack News – November 23, 1895 - **Charles McGowan**, son of James McGowan, of Malone, died suddenly at the Adirondack Sanitarium Sunday morning. The particulars of the case as explained by Dr. M. E. Fleming and first published in a Malone paper follow: "Chas. McGowan. of Malone, came to his death suddenly and unexpectedly at St. Regis Falls, Sunday morning. He was an Inmate, recently, of the Keeley Institute, but went to drink again. As near as can be learned, arrangements were made Saturday by some of the ladies and Mr. Hadley, of Malone, to send him to the Adirondack Sanitarium, at which institution he arrived late Saturday night in charge of F. N. Bassett. He was in a very precarious condition when he arrived, so much so that no examination or treatment could be given. Supper, of which he ate but little, was given him, after which Dr. Tower's, medical attendant, put him to bed, Mr. Bassett remaining until he went to sleep. With difficulty he was aroused in the morning and the attendant saw that his heart and respiration were in a bad state. Dr. Fleming, medical examiner of the sanitarium, was summoned and upon arrival life was found to be extinct, death being due, in all probability, to heart failure, produced by alcoholism. He was a young man 32 years of age."

CLINTON COUNTY CIVIL WAR SOLDIERS FROM QUEBEC

Many of the Civil War soldiers in Clinton County were first or second-generation Americans who came down from Quebec to settle in the area. In all over 20,000 men who were born in Quebec came to New York alone to enlist. There was about 450,000 men who enlisted in the state. Imagine how many French-Canadians were in the Union Army.

Adolphus Rock was one such soldier. His parents, Joseph LaRocque and Christine Labonne had a farm in Schuyler Falls.



Magdala Solitude Cemetery, or the St. Alexander's Cemetery, in Morrisonville contains the body of Adolphus Rock, who enlisted in the 1st Engineers on December 31, 1864. For his enlistment, he received a town bounty of \$150 and a county bounty of \$200. A little way away, in the Old St. Alexander's Cemetery lies the body of his father, Joseph Rock, who had emigrated from Yamaska, Quebec, enlisted in the same regiment 9 months later. When he enlisted, Joseph received a town bounty of \$800.


Adolphus met up with the regiment in South Carolina during their winter hiatus. The regiment was soon in the battlefields around Petersburg and Richmond in May. He must have been glad to see his father in September. By the end of the war,

both men had been appointed artificer with their own crews. On April 2, 1865, they were at the Fall of Petersburg, and on June 30th were mustered out and came home to farm.

In 1894, Joseph had a sudden and violent death by being thrown from his carriage on the Lakeshore Road, now Rte. 9. They had just left the grounds of the Catholic Summer School, where his son, Charles, a mason, had been looking for work, and the horse had shied, pulling the carriage into the ditch. Joseph's body was put back in the carriage, and they took off for Plattsburgh. Near the barracks, the horse shied again, this time breaking one of the back wheels. They finally got to the coroner's office. He said Joseph had died instantly with a broken neck at the scene of the accident. At 70 years of age, he left behind a wife and 11 children. He was buried in the Old St. Alexander's Cemetery. Adolphus, who was born in Schuyler Falls, lived until 1922. He died in Morrisonville at the home Henry, his brother, after an illness of 2 weeks. Surviving him were five children, Victor of Morrisonville, George of Elizabethtown, Mrs. Alvina Trombley, Edgar Rock and Albert Rock of Cohoes.





Another soldier from Quebec was Jean-Baptiste Cassavah.

Jean-Baptiste Cassavah enlisted in 1864 when he was 44 years old in the 118th Infantry in Plattsburgh with the inducement of a bounty of \$150 from the Town of Chazy and another \$200 from the County. n October 27, 1864, he was wounded in the right hand and the hip while in the advanced line of skirmish at Fair Oaks, VA, and never rejoined his regiment.


While he was recuperating from his hip injury and loss of a finger, he was transferred to the 96th Infantry in June 1865. John was given an honorable discharge and mustered out from the hospital at Fortress Monroe, VA.

John and his wife, Marguerite LaPierre, had 6 sons in the war – three survived - two died at Drewry's Bluff on May 16, 1864, and another died on June 18, 1864, before Richmond. The youngest enlisted in Vermont.

He and his wife are buried at the top of the hill in the St. Louis de France Cemetery in Sciota. This picture was taken on a cemetery tour CCHA sponsored in 2013. It shows one of their 3rd great grandsons, Scott Recor, between them.

On January 2, 1864, two brothers, who were born in Sorel, Quebec, enlisted in the 5th Cavalry on January 2, 1864. Joseph and Solomon, both under 5' 6" with dark eyes, dark hair and dark complexions, enlisted under the name Lature. Their parents, Solomon Latour, dit Balard and Angeline Hus dite Paul, came to Clinton County after their birth and settled in Beekmantown for a few years.


Seven men enlisted in Champlain during that recruitment and all received a \$200 town bounty when they enlisted. They probably got to Virginia in time for the first engagement



of 1864, the skirmish at Ely's Ford on the Rapidan River. It was the regiment's 89th engagement since they began with their first skirmish at Port Republic on May 2, 1862. On the 8th engagement after Ely's Ford, they found themselves at Palmer's Store on the day before the Battle of the Wilderness. During the battle at the store, they had 14 men killed, 23 men wounded and 22 men who went missing or were captured.

Joseph was one of the men captured and was recorded as "Missing in Action" on his Muster Roll Abstract. His family had to accept that he died there.

Solomon, the elder brother, went on to the regiment's 99th engagement on May 6th – the Battle of the Wilderness. The Rebels under General Lee advanced on the Union Army almost to Grant's headquarters which was within musket range of the enemy. In the History of the 5th NY Cavalry, by Louis Boudrye, he writes – "Grant resolved to fight it out



on this line and his band was quickly advanced into the woods as far as possible, where it struck up Yankee Doodle. The exhausted men were recharged and, inspired by the notes, and with a wild should of battle, they charged the enemy and drove them back to their former lines."

For the next several months, until the end of the war, the 5th Cavalry was in 81 more battles and skirmishes and had their 171st and last battle at Appomattox Court House on April 9,.1865. On July 19th, Solomon was mustered out and returned home from Winchester, VA.

He lived in Plattsburgh after the war, and sometime after 1870, lived alone in Wisconsin. In 1890, he started receiving a pension there. In later life, Solomon went to live in Pittsfield, MA, to work in the mills there. He died on February 3, 1915.


You may remember that we met last year at the Clinton County Historical Society & Museum in Plattsburgh. My husband and I were researching our Lynch family and purchasing Lynch photos from the Museum. We have so much we could share, and I thought the attached might be just a little different. The jpgs attached are excerpts from the 1880's Autograph Books we have for my husband's 2nd great aunts Maggie and Eliza O'Keefe (Keefe) from Bombay, NY. Both Maggie and Eliza were teachers. We know from Eliza's obituary that she taught in the Drum Street School in Fort Covington, but I haven't discovered where Maggie taught. Maggie's (and her brother Daniel's) 1911 Obituary tribute was written by Lucia Fessenden Gilbert from Malone. To provide a face to the autograph books, I've attached a tin type of Maggie, which I am guessing was taken in the 1860's (she was born in 1846) and one of a very old Eliza that was taken in Malone in 1929. Also attached is a photo of Charles T. & Raymond G. O'Keefe, which we believe was taken in or around Fort Covington about 1910. Charley and Ray were nephews of Eliza and Maggie.

I think the autograph books are just adorable; there are several entries with names I now recognize from researching my husband's family and others from reading old Franklin County newspapers. 

Charley and Ray O'Keefe about 1910 - Fort Covington







THE KNAPPS AND THEIR DNA

Based on the table below, if you go back 20 generations from the children of Abel Knapp and Maria Southwick, they have over a million ancestors! This doesn't mean that each of the ancestors is unique in each of the generations – some are counted several times. The farther back you go, the more likely you are to have repeated ancestors in any generation and, maybe in the generation above and below. It all depends of how many children from one particular ancestor are your ancestors, and at what age they bear children. Some generations habitually marry and bear children at a young age and in other families, they may marry later. Historical and political consideration may also come into play, i.e. during the Great Plague, if all the children in the family died, and after the plague was over, the parents had more children. To us it would look like they didn't have children until they were older. So, looking for events surrounding the births would explain the situation.

You will have repetition of ancestors like the Knapp family after the 10th generation or so. The further back you go, the more repetition you are likely to find. This is known as a concept called *pedigree collapse*, which is what happens when people end up with a mate who is somewhat or very closely related to them. If 2 cousins had a child, for instance, that child would only have six great-grandparents, not eight. There are eight filled great-grandparent spots on its family tree, but because two of the spots are *duplicates* the child only has six great grandparents and this skews the family tree into antiquity. Many of you have noticed this happening in several of your ancestral lines.



According to some experts, most marriages have been between second cousins and closer. For most of human history, people spent most of their lives in the same five-mile radius, and the other people in that same area tended to be immediate and extended family. Think of your ancestors in Quebec or early New England. If you have royal ancestors, they tended to keep it in the family by marrying cousins sometime even brothers and sisters which duplicated the spots in their trees. You will see the duplication of ancestors in the early generations of the Knapp family ancestry.

For those of you who have done the autosomal-DNA test like 23andMe or the Ancestry DVA test, looking at this table makes it clear why At-DNA is most useful only within 5 generations where the

highest concentrations of DNA are found. Each generation receives only half of the generation before. At the 5th generation, one is likely to share only 3.125% of that generation's genes. It's disappointing to realize, that even if you are descended from Edward I and Eleanor of Castile, like the Knapp's children, they have only .0001% of their unique genes - probably not enough to change the shape of a nose or the color of the hair.

In reality, one is really searching for ancestors with stories that are interesting, and that's what people did before DNA testing. Nowadays with genetic testing for medical conditions, one can pinpoint the mutation of the gene that caused the condition and chase it down through the generations and find treatment for it. Doctors nowadays are researching ways to take out the anomalies so that future generations will not have

Friedreich's Ataxia, or FDRA, is an autosomal recessive disease that causes progressive damage to the nervous system. It is the most common inherited ataxia, affecting approximately 1 in 29,000 individuals. FDRA manifests in initial symptoms of poor coordination such as gait, it can also lead to scoliosis, heart disease, and diabetes, but does not affect cognitive function. The disease is progressive, and in most cases a wheelchair is required for mobility. The condition is named after German physician, Nikolaus Friedreich who first described it in the 1860s.

to deal with debilitating conditions such as Friedreich's Ataxia which is found in citizens of Clinton County.

The table below is based on an average generation time of 30 years and uses 1840 as the starting point because most of the Knapp children were born around that date. It tells you how many people you should find per generation if your family history is to be complete. You can count your duplicate ancestors each time they're mentioned. How many of you can complete the first 10 generations?

Among the most successful and enterprising business men of the town of Mooers or Clinton County, is the subject of this sketch, Abel Knapp. He is of English origin. His ancestors came to this country, and settled in New England, long before the Revolutionary war.

Abel Knapp, son of Abel and Miriam Hawks Knapp, was born in the town of Berlin, Washington County, VT, August 28,1808. His grandfather (Knapp) was a resident for some time of Wilmington, CT, where his first family of children were born, among whom was Abel, Senior.

His grandfather removed to Hanover, NH, and there married his second wife, and had a family of children. He lived and died in Hanover.

Abel Knapp, Sr., was born at Wilmington, Conn., July 15, 1769, settled at Hanover with his father, and from there went to Berlin, VT.

He was a farmer and surveyor by occupation and reared his children to habits of industry and economy. In politics he was a Whig. He was one of the leading political men of his town and held many important positions. He was Town Clerk of Berlin for 50 consecutive years, Justice of the Peace for several years, Judge of Probate for some time, and a Representative in the State Legislature for several years.

He was the leading man of his town and did more town business than all the rest of the men of his town.

His wife was a member of the Congregational Church at Berlin, and Mr. Knapp was a regular attendant of the same. He died in March 1845 and was buried in the cemetery at Berlin. Mrs. Knapp lived some twenty years with her children at Mooers. She died in June 1865.

Abel Knapp went to school winters, and worked on his father's farm summers, until he was 19 years of age. He spent one summer in Massachusetts on the farm at ten dollars a month, returned in the fall, and went to school in the following winter.

In the spring of 1823, he came to Clinton County, settled in the Town of Mooers, and clerked it in a store for J. T. Andrus, for ten dollars a month. When Mr. Knapp arrived at Rouse's Point, he had only two dollars and a half in money. He worked for Mr. Andrus for nearly two years, when he commenced business for himself. Mr. Andrus removed his stock of goods from the Canada line to Mooers, and sold the same to Mr. Knapp, taking notes for the same. Mr. Knapp met every note he gave, promptly, which has been a marked characteristic of him through a long and successful career. He kept his stock of goods replenished from the store of Thomas Hibbard, of Rouse's Point. He began business in Mooers in the spring of 1825 and continued in trade for more than fifty years. He was engaged for a number of years as a manufacturer of and dealer in, pot and pearl ashes. He has also been extensively engaged in the manufacture of lumber and shingles.

He has owned a large tract of timber land, the most of which is now in the family. Besides being thus extensively engaged, he has been one of the large farmers of Mooers and has raised some fine horses. In politics he has always been a staunch Whig and Republican. He never aspired to any political position but gave his attention exclusively to his large and increasing business.

He married Maria, daughter of Deacon Daniel Southwick, of Mooers, Aug. 15, 1826. She was born in Mooers Aug. 6, 1804. Her father was an early settler here and was, for a great many years, the most active man in religious matters that ever lived in Mooers. He was respected by all.

Of the union of Mr. and Mrs. Knapp nine children have been born, vis.: Almeda J., who married Myron W. Messenger, one daughter born, Julia E., who is now living with her parents; Delia C, married to P. P. o, one son born, Charles K., - Mr. and Mrs. Douglass are dead; Parsons, A. married Juliette Shedden, by whom one son, William F., was born. - Parsons Knapp is dead; C. F. married T. Matlock, by who one son, Walter, was born, - C. F. is a merchant at Westfield, IL: Horatio F., now an enterprising merchant in Mooers, married Kate Fitch, by whom one son, Wallace, has been born: Emma M. married Dr. Child, by whom one son, Edward W., has been born, — the doctor is dead; Charles L., now largely engaged in the manufacture of lumber and shingles, married Maria Hagar,— they have three children, viz... Mary M., Morris, and Gaylord; Mary A. married Dr. Charles Bidwell, of Mooers. Their sons, Frank and Orville E.t are deceased, the latter at the age of 23 years.


Mr. and Mrs. Knapp have been members of the Presbyterian Church since 1831. Mrs. Knapp was a very devoted woman and took an active part in all matters relating to the best interests of society. She was a faithful wife, and a kind and affectionate mother. She died August 25, 1874 and was buried in the cemetery at Mooers.

Mr. Knapp married his second wife, Hannah Warren, of Berlin, VT, October 24, 1875. She taught school for a number of years when young. She too is a member of the Presbyterian Church at Mooers. Mr. Knapp built his present fine store in 1874.


It will be seen that Mr. Knapp began life poor, and by his industry and frugality became the leading man. financially, of Mooers. lie is now an old man, in his seventy-seventh year. He retains his faculties remarkably well for one who has led so active a life.

1 YEAR, 6 MONTHS AND 9 DAYS IN THE MILITARY - Charles Lucius Knapp's ancestors, Aron and Elizabeth Knap came to this continent in about 1638 with the second Plymouth Colony. In the late 1700's his ancestors started moving west through New Hampshire and Vermont until his parents settled in Mooers.

At 21 years of age, Charles enlisted in the newly-formed 153rd Infantry to serve for 3 years. He was mustered in as 2nd lieutenant of Company I about a month after his enlistment in October 1862. The regiment organized in Fonda, NY, and from there left for Washington by train on October 18th. For most of the next year and a half, they served with the Military District of Washington and the Department of Washington DC performing garrison and guard duties in the capital area. In December 1863, Charles was promoted to 1st lieutenant.

The regiment was transferred to the command of the Army and Department of the Gulf in Louisiana in February 1864. While in Louisiana, he resigned his commission on June 29, 1864, in Morganza and returned home. Shortly thereafter, the 153rd returned


to Washington to defend the city against General Jubal Early's attack.

Charles married Sarah Maria Hagar in 1867 and raised a family. To support his family, he engaged in the manufacture of lumber, shingles and starch. In 1891, he started receiving an Invalid's Pension and, when he died in 1914, Maria started receiving her Widow's Pension. She received it for the next 7 years until she died in 1921. The couple is buried in the Riverside Cemetery on Rte. 11 in Mooers.

ANCESTORS OF ALFRED BESSETTE ~ BROTHER ANDRE

A FREQUENT VISITOR TO PLATTSBURGH AND RELATIVE OF MANY IN CLINTON COUNTY

This man had humble beginnings, born near Mont Saint Gregoire, about 6 miles east of St. Jean-sur-Richelieu, to a farmer and lumberman. By the time he was 12, his father had died in a lumbering accident and then his mother died of tuberculosis, leaving 10 brothers and sisters as orphans. Always frail in health, he was "provisionally" baptized by the family's priest. When he was orphaned, his piety and generosity were noticed, and he was recommended to go to the Congregation of the Holy Cross in Montreal. The Congregation didn't want a servant with delicate health, but the Archbishop of Montreal changed their minds.

He was given lowly tasks and gradually, they found that his forte was looking after sick people However, his superiors didn't like the fact that this lowly porter had a gradually-spreading reputation for helping sick people. In 1924, the basilica which can be seen from miles away, was built, and Brother André retained his little wooden chapel next to the new church.

If you never have been to St. Joseph's Oratory in Montreal, you really should go. The building is magnificent, the grounds are beautiful, and the museum is wonderful. You can also visit Brother Andre's little house.

Dr. Samuel Beaumont, Assistant to his Cousin, Dr. William Beaumont, in the St. Martin Experiments—

The subject of this sketch was the son of William and Mary Beaumont, and was born at Champlain. NY, on March 1st, 1791. That he came of patriotic stock may be known by the fact, that his father, William Beaumont, (who was born at Lebanon, CT. in 1753), volunteered in the service of his native land immediately after the battle of Lexington in 1775, and so served until the following year when he enlisted in the 8tfc Connecticut Regiment, and was at once promoted to be quartermaster sergeant—the next year he was promoted to a Lieutenancy, and appointed quartermaster of his regiment,-served in the Continental Army for seven years—was in constant and fatiguing duties, and a number of engagements, and only returned to civil life, on the reduction of the army in 1782. In August of that year he was married to Mary Wright, of Philipstown, NY, went next year to Spencertown. NY, where he engaged in mercantile business and



remained four years, and from thence removed to Champlain, NY, where he was one of the first, if not the first American settler, and where the subject of this sketch was born in 1791. Of the early youth and education of Samuel Beaumont but little is known beyond the fact that, during his early years he became a good English scholar, and had acquired the printer's art, for, in 1815 he was the publisher of the Plattsburgh Herald, a weekly paper, a copy of which, issued on Friday, August 15th, 1815, Vol. 3, No. 21, now lies before the writer. This little

newspaper is now a curiosity. Its latest foreign news is under date Of July 2, 1815, and, among other items of interest, its readers are informed that "The village of Plattsburgh is fast recovering from the destruction of buildings by fire during its occupation by the enemy in September last." During the interval between the years 1815 and 1819, Samuel Beaumont underwent the study of medicine and was a student with and under the direction of his cousin, Dr. William Beaumont, a surgeon in the U.S. army. Dr. Samuel Beaumont's authority to practice physic and surgery is evidenced by a 'parchment" to that effect issued by the Clinton County Medical Society, (of which society he was himself the president in 1831) dated at Plattsburgh, NY, March 19, 1819, signed by Benj. J. Mooers, president, and Oliver Davidson, secretary, and recorded in the office of the clerk of Clinton Co., April 21st, 1824, John Walworth, Clerk. There is in existence his commission issued February 17th, 1820, signed by DeWitt Clinton, Governor of the State of New York, appointing Samuel Beaumont surgeon of the 15th Regiment of Cavalry of said state. On the 31st of August 1820, Dr. Beaumont was married to Charlotte Taylor, of Perth Amboy, NJ. Four children were the issue of that marriage. Mary, the only daughter, born at Plattsburgh in August 1821, and three sons, two of whom were successively named William, who both died in infancy at Hampton, VA, and one, named Joseph Irwin, born at Plattsburgh, in May 1827. Mary and Joseph Irwin both survived their parents. Mary died at the home of her brother, in St. Paul, MN, (where the latter now resides), in September 1878.

At the time of his marriage, Dr. Samuel Beaumont was a practicing physician at Plattsburgh, and so continued until the year 1824, when he removed with his family, consisting of his wife and two children, to Hampton, VA. His sojourn at Hampton was of comparatively short duration. His hope of finding it a promising field for the building up of a remunerative practice was doomed to disappointment, and the death, at that place, of his two infant sons, intensified his dissatisfaction with the locality to such a degree that he decided to return to Plattsburgh, and this he did late in the year 1826, or early in the following year, resuming at once the practice of his profession, in which he continued substantially without interruption, to the end of his life. The infirmities of age and enfeebled health, during his last few years, prevented him from engaging in the active work of his profession, in which, however, he never lost interest. He died, suddenly, on April 5th, 1860. "Few die as sudden or as safe." His widow did not long survive him, dying on December 28th, in the same year. In the year 1832,

Dr. Beaumont devoted some portion of his time to the work of assisting his cousin Dr. William Beaumont, in continuing a series of remarkable experiments (which had been commenced by Dr. William Beaumont in 1825) on the action of the gastric juice in the human stomach. The subject of these experiments was one Alexis St. Martin, the contents of whose stomach could be viewed through an opening in his side, resulting from a gunshot wound, which had healed without closing. The history of these novel experiments, which were the first ever known to give ocular demonstration of the action of the gastric juice on various kinds of food, the time required for their digestion, and the processes of digestion generally, as carried on in the stomach of the human animal, were embodied in a very interesting and valuable work, the first edition of which was published by Dr. William Beaumont, in the year 1833, and entitled, "Beaumont's Physiology and Experiments." In the arrangement and preparation of this work for publication, Dr. William Beaumont was largely assisted by Dr. Samuel Beaumont, of which assistance a handsome acknowledgement appeared in the preface of the work.

Very naturally, after this experience, Dr. Beaumont was more than ordinarily interested in the study of digestion and made it the subject of several public lectures. There lies before the writer a small printed notice or hand-bill, dated March 27th, 1834, which notifies the public that "Dr. S. Beaumont will deliver two lectures on Digestion, on Monday and Tuesday evenings, the 31st of March and 1st of April," and, as an inducement to attend, the notice goes on to say: "To gratify curiosity, he will, at the close of the lecture, exhibit to those who wish to remain and see it, the side of Alexis St. Martin." It is to be presumed that in the new and comparatively unsettled country in which Dr. Beaumont was born and in which his early years were passed, the advantages for education in schools were of a very limited kind. Notwithstanding these

disadvantages, he was a thorough student of English literature particularly of the works of those brilliant writers whose names have added lustre to the language, and whose productions are justly entitled to be called, as in fact they are called, the English classics. Besides lecturing on digestion, Dr. Beaumont occasionally publicly lectured on other subjects suggested by his profession, and these lectures conveyed to his hearers much valuable information regarding the requisites of good health in the individual, and of a sanitary condition in the community, in language so clear and simple and so free from technical terms as to render them interesting and popular. He was also an occasional contributor to the columns of the newspapers, writing on subjects of popular interest in the times in which he had a healthy, hearty and robust dislike for men who, setting themselves up as reformers of the world, and claiming to be possessed of all the virtues, failed to see anything but vice in those who differed from them.

While it was known by the public generally, through his lectures and occasional contributions to the columns of the press, that Dr. Beaumont was a clear and forcible prose writer, it was only known by a few of his most intimate friends, that he sometimes indulged his fancy in poetic composition, poems still extant clearly indicating that when the Muse deigned to inspire him, he was fully equal to the occasion. There is a strain of poetry in the blood of the Beaumont. which he inherited from his father and transmitted to his children. But it is upon his skill as a physician, his virtues as a man, his graces as a Christian, his loyalty as a citizen, his steadfastness as a friend, and his love and affection as a husband and father, that the writer of this sketch most delights to dwell. As a physician, Dr. Beaumont ranked far above mediocrity. In his diagnoses he was, in in the great majority of cases coming under his care, correct in his first judgment, and, having acquired an exact knowledge of the properties and effects of the various drugs (in those days comparatively limited in number) comprised in the term, "Materia Medica," he was enabled to intelligently prescribe the proper remedies with good effect. If he was more than ordinarily successful in the treatment of disease, his success was not alone to be attributed to his having prescribed the proper remedies, but, in no small degree, to his conscientious care and watchfulness of his patients, until the crisis of the disease was favorably passed. With the skill of the physician he combined that watchful and intelligent care of his patients, which, in these days is in a great measure, delegated to the trained nurse, and such care is known to be, in common parlance, half the battle. Suaviter in modo, fortiter in re, may be truthfully said of Dr. Beaumont. While he was always gentle, kind and reassuring in the sick room, he was, at the same time, firm to insist upon having his instructions strictly obeyed, and the measures he had adopted for the .welfare of his patient, carried out to the letter, The sick man under his charge, won by his gentleness and watchful care, came to look upon him as a friend as well as a physician, and when the physician could do no more, the friend remained to advise, to comfort and console. As a surgeon Dr. Beaumont was always able, skillfully and successfully, to perform such operations as ordinarily come under the care of a village surgeon.

In his day the practice of medicine was, as it is today, and must ever remain, owing to the diversities of temperament, constitutional peculiarities, and the diverse habits of life, existing among men, tentative and experimental, while surgery has, since his time, taken great strides, and advanced almost, if not quite, to the dignity of an exact science. Dr. Beaumont was always, and under all circumstances, the courteous gentleman—a man of firm principles, strict integrity, and possessed of a high sense of honor, both social and professional. He was at all times a law-abiding citizen, and whenever the occasion demanded, cheerfully sacrificed his personal rights for the good of the community, which is ever the distinguishing characteristic of a good citizen. Dr. Beaumont was baptized at Plattsburgh on September 30th, 1827, by the Rev. M. Townsend, an Episcopal churchman of Caldwell's Manor, Lower Cana and from that time to the day of death was a member and communicant of the Protestant Episcopal church. He was for long years a member of the congregation of Trinity (Episcopal) church of Plattsburgh, and, during much of the time, was either a vestryman or warden of that church. He was for many years an intimate friend of the Rev. Dr. J. H. Coit, the well-remembered and beloved pastor of Trinity, whose death, some years ago, is still lamented, and whose memory

will be ever revered.

That Dr. Beaumont was a sincere and devout Christian will not be questioned by any who knew Mm. He was a practical Christian, whose faith was known by his works. His piety was of that unobtrusive kind which did not flaunt itself before the eyes of the public, but was known by his God, his family, his intimate friends, and, though last, by no means least, by the poor, for whom he did much, and from whom (in a worldly sense) he received little. As a friend he was always true, faithful, kind and sympathetic, and for these sterling qualities his friendship was duly appreciated. But it was in his home—in the bosom of his family, that his graces as a Christian, his virtues as a man, and his love and affection as a husband and father, most brightly shone, and were best known and most appreciated. Having almost attained the allotted span of three score years and ten, after a comparatively uneventful but thoroughly useful, honorable and blameless life, beloved by many, and respected by all, he died, and his death was lamented by a wide circle of friends, but most deeply by his surviving wife and children, "who best knew his worth, and most deplored his loss."

The writer, than whom none more devoutly reveres the memory of Dr. Beaumont, has found it a labor of love to prepare this crude and imperfect sketch of his life, and, yielding to a natural and almost universal instinct, has for years prayed, and while life lasts will ever pray that he may rest in peace, December 28, 1891. 





SAMUEL FLINT VILAS - The Plattsburgh Sentinel March 26, 1886

A dispatch was received in Plattsburgh Wednesday morning, at nine o'clock, announcing the death of Samuel F. Vilas, at the Grand Union Hotel in New York, at 5 o'clock that morning.

Mr. Vilas left Plattsburgh some two weeks since, accompanied by his daughter, Mrs. George H. Beckwith, for a long-contemplated visit to his nephew in Washington, Postmaster-General Vilas, and was then in his usual health. While there he contracted a severe cold which he tried to throw off by taking a trip to Florida. Last Friday, we believe, a letter was received from Mrs. Beckwith, dated at Jacksonville, Fla., in which she reported that he had been suffering from a cold and fever, but gave no occasion for alarm. The next intelligence was the dispatch from New York announcing his death. It appears that he started for home, but unable to come farther north than New York city. he immediate cause of his death was bronchial pneumonia.

The name of Samuel F. Vilas is of course familiar to everyone in this region, and his wealth, accumulated by his own efforts, is a matter of common remark. He was born in Sterling, Lamoille County, Vermont, June 9th, 1807, and at the age of 19 commenced without means, wholly upon credit, to wholesale Yankee notions throughout the sparsely settled country of Northern New York. During the ten years that he devoted to this business, he laid the foundation for the remarkable success which has attended him through his long life.

In 1836 he settled in Plattsburgh and began a remarkably successful career as a wholesale and retail merchant.

In 1864 he organized the Vilas National Bank of Plattsburgh of which he has ever since been president. In 1868 he abandoned his wholesale business and devoted himself exclusively to banking and to the investment and care of his great wealth, though continuing to deal extensively in wool, lumber, iron, lands and stock.

It is no injustice to other enterprising citizens to say that the building of the Saranac River Plank Road, and the Plattsburgh and Montreal railroad, the first railroad into Plattsburgh, was largely due to the enterprise and assistance of Mr. Vilas.

George Martin (14), son of George Martin III and Mercy Durkee, was born on 19 Apr 1712 in Windham, CT. He died on 30 Jul 1794 in Hampton, CT. He married Sarah Durkee on 12 May 1737 in Windham.

Sarah Durkee (15), daughter of William Durkee Jr and Rebeckah Gould, was born in Windham, CT. She died on 05 Dec 1807 in Windham.

John Gay (18), son of Samuel Gay and Mary Bridge, was born on 25 Jun 1668 in Dedham, MA. He died on 17 Jun 1758 in Dedham. He married Mary Fisher on 24 May 1692 in Dedham. **Mary Fisher (19),** daughter of Thomas Fisher and Rebecca Woodward, was born on 11 Sep 1668 in Dedham, MA. She died on 18 May 1748 in Dedham.

Cornelius Baker Jr., (20) son of Cornelius Baker and Hannah Woodbury, was born on 21 Jul 1667 in Salem, MA. He died on 01 Sep 1714 in Beverly, MA. He married Abigail Sallows on 05 Nov 1710 in Beverly.

Abigail Sallows (21), daughter of John Sallows and Elizabeth, was born on 22 Jun 1667 in Essex, MA. She died on 01 Jul 1714 in Beverly, MA.

Richard Ober Jr, (22) son of Richard Ober Sr and Abigail Woodbury, was born in Beverly, MA. He died on 02 Aug 1725 in Beverly. He married Priscilla Woodbury on 15 Jan 1706 in Beverly.

Priscilla Woodbury (23), daughter of Peter Woodbury and Sarah Dodge, was born on 23 Jun 1687 in Beverly, Essex, MA. She died on 08 Mar 1769 in Beverly.

George Martin III (23), son of George Martin Jr and Hannah Green, was born on 17 Sep 1680 in Ipswich, MA. He died on 15 Aug 1755 in Windham, Windham, CT. He married Mercy Durkee on 04 Jun 1709.

Mercy Durkee (29), daughter of William Durkee and Martha Cross, was born in Jun 1675 in Ipswich, MA. She died on 01 Aug 1730 in Windham, CT.

William Durkee Jr, (30), son of William Durkee and Martha Cross, was born in May 1672 in Ipswich, MA. He died in Windham, CT. He married Rebeckah Gould on 18 Jan 1704 in Ipswich. Rebeckah Gould (31), daughter of Henry Gould and Sarah Ward, was born in 1680 in Ipswich, MA. She died in Hampton, CT.

PLATTSBURGH SENTINEL - November 3, 1899

Mrs. Harriet Hunt Vilas died at Plattsburgh, October 29, 1899, widow of the late Samuel F. Vilas, in the 89th year of her age.

After being a resident of Plattsburgh for more than 63 years, it seems fitting that more than a brief and formal obituary notice should be had of her death. She was born in Pinckney, NY, March 17, 1811, the daughter of James and Wealthy Hunt. She leaves 3 sisters, Mrs. Hadcock and Mrs. Woodworth of Watertown, NY, and Mrs. Orvis of Plattsburgh, one brother, James Hunt of Utica, NY.

With the advantage of only a common school education, she taught school in Watertown and Champion several seasons. She was married to Samuel F. Vilas in August 1836, and came to Plattsburgh at once, where she has always resided since that time. She was the mother of seven children, one of whom died in infancy. James H. Vilas, another, died in 1881, and Emeroy V., wife of George H. Beckwith, Esq., who died in 1891. Two sons, F. M. Vilas of New York and S. F. Vilas of Burlington, VT, and 2 daughters, Mrs. F. V. Carpenter of Boston and Mrs. H. V. Norton of Springfield, OH, survive her.

Mrs. Vilas had been a member of the Presbyterian Church for nearly 60 years.

Harriet Hunt Vilas was the wife of Samuel, and also a philanthropist. Her most noticeable gift to the people of the North Country is the Vilas Home at the corner of Beekman and Cornelia Streets in Plattsburgh – still a retirement home – but now co-ed.


HARRIET HUNT VILAS' LEGACY
