

This letter will explain our research capabilities, lately our society has recieved many letters requesting research in probate, census, and cemetery records, this letter will explain our research policies.

- (1) We as a society will only research the records in our genealogy library. We are a volunteer society and cannot run all over the county doing research in the name of the society.

  (2) Our library consists of marriage repertoires of over 600 Canadian Catholic parishes plus the marriages of Clinton County, N.Y. from 1843-1880. Also we have births and deaths for many of the Clinton County parishes for the same time frame. We have no Protestant records and there are none availably for the county, the Canadian repertoires for the most part contain only marriages.

  (3) We have no census or cemetery records in our library other than those which may appear in our journal from time to time. We have no probate or alien admitted records in our library.
  - (4) One must be aware there are no civil records in New York before 1885 and in many towns none before 1890 allowing for the 5 year grace period.
- (5) Missing Catholic church records are as follows: St.Joseph's in Coopersville, N.Y. (St.Joseph du Corbeau) as it was first called. The record are missing from 1828-1842 the records pick up again in 1843 this was the main church for the french speaking people. St.John's in Plattsburgh, N.Y. the Irish church, the records are missing from 1825-1848 the records pick up in 1849. This church also covered Keeseville, Saranac, Redford, N.Y. Because of these missing records many of our members cannot bridge the gap to Canada. That is not to say we can never help as Virginia DeMarce has taken many lines back to that first step across the border and we can then continue from there.
- (6) We do not have the Loiselle or Rivest indexes (they will come with time and money) so we cannot answer request like "my great grand parents were married somewhere in Canada can you find their marriage. Please send as much information as possiable. I know many times this is all the information one knows. For those types of request we will hold maybe up to six months until one of our members goes to Montreal Public Library where the indexes are. Or one may avail themselves of the Montreal researcher who

advertises in our journal. Also the American-Canadian Genealogical Society is 10 years older than us and has all the indexes on film and they will do research for a \$10 fee for their members. Their dues are \$15 a year and their address is A.C.G.S. PO Box 668 Manchester, N.H. 03106-0668 they has a excellent research department. Each member may submit one free query per journal, each additional query is \$5 per query. Non-member queries are \$5 each and do not include a copy of the journal. The following person are expert on Clinton County and are willing to do research for a fee. David Kendall Martin, Mouse Hill Rd. W. Chazy, N.Y. 12992 (see his article page 91) The other expert is Addie L.Shields, Clinton County Govt.Center 137 Margart Street, Plattsburgh, N.Y. Addie has most every book written on Clinton County, she has most of the Clinton County Federal Census films in her office, she also has the McLellan Cemetery Records and the New York State Census for many years are in the next building as well as the probate and alien admitted records are at her fingertips. One may visit her and avail themselves of the records. Addie only works 3 days a week so one should write or call for an appointment with Addie her phone is (518) 565-4749. If one goes to her office and the light is on rest assured she is not very far away looking up something. Addie is mandated by the County to charge a small fee, write for a form letter as always include a S.A.S.E. the same goes when you write us. One member of our society went so far as to write a member of our society saying they had been a member since the beginning and we had not solved their problem and they wanted an answer now! That the best way not to solve ones problem I know of, perhaps they should contact one of the experts listed, if they can't solve the problem no one can.

We are now is our new room at the Community Center in Keeseville it is a much larger room. Our library is worth over \$10,000 and is growing all the time, we could buy 5 times that much including the indexes if we had the money. 

#### A BRIEF HISTORY OF ST. ANNE'S SHRINE IN ISLE LAMOTTE

From its earliest occupation by the white man, the territory now known as the state of Vermont has been placed under the protection of St. Anne, the mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary. As early as 1666 the French had erected a Fort and chapel on Isle LaMotte as their southernmost fortification against hostile Indian attacks on the settlements in Montreal and Quebec; this was dedicated under the invocation of "la bonne Sainte Anne". It was here that the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass was offered for the first known time in these parts, and here too that the first episcopal visitation in the northeast took place when, in 1668 the Bishop of Quebec jouneyed by canoe to Fort Sainte Anne to visit the place and confirm a number of Indian converts.

Although the Fort was abandoned within a few years; its ruins remained a mute witness to the devotion of its builders, which would be reawakened with the establishment of Vermont as a diocese.

This was effected in July of 1853, with the Very Reverend Louis de Goesbriand, Vicar General of the Diocese of Cleveland, being the first bishop of the new See. A Breton by birth, where devotion to St. Anne has always been exceptionally fervent, the young Bishop soon began to foster her devotion among his people. On June 5, 1859, the cornerstone of the new church of St. Anne in Milton was blessed, dedicated, and all just 200 years from the date of the construction of the French Fort.

In 1886 a new parish was formed, consisting of Alburg, Isle LaMotte, and North Hero. This was entrusted to one of the Bishop's Breton priests, the Reverend Joseph Kerlidou. A scholarly man, he was directed to do as much research as he could on the nearly obliterated French Fort. His notes were published a few years later as an encouragement for raising funds to purchase the land on which the Fort had stood. The first parcel, containing the part of the Fort in which the chapel had been located, was acquired in 1892. By the feast of St. Anne the following year ground had been cleared and a small chapel erected. A large statue of St. Anne was purchased in Montreal and donated to the now shrine as the gift of the Breton clergy of the diocese. This same statue still graces the present chapel on the site.


1893 saw the blessing of the chapel and the first organized pilgrimage to the new shrine. Nearly 2,000 people attended from Vermont, New York state, and Canada. Many came by steam boats specially chartered for the occasion. It became a regular custom in the summer months to have a day-long excursion culminating in Mass and devotions at the Shrine. The Chronicle of St. Joseph's Orphanage in Burlington annually records the great enthusiasm and enjoyment of the large numbers of children and Sisters who would make the pilgrimage, often as guests of the Bishop, on such boats as the Maquam, the Reindeer, and the well-known Ticonderoga.

These steamer excursions were forced to stop by the shortage of coal during the First World War, and for economic reasons were not subsequently resumed. For many years thereafter devotion to St. Anne was centered principally on the parish level, in the many confraterities and sodalities dedicated in her name.

A resurgence of devotional activities was begun under the Most Reverend Edward F. Ryan following his consecration as fifth Bishop of Burlington in 1945. He presided annually at the solemnities at the Shrine, and encouraged the organization of pilgrimage.

The Fathers of St. Edmund, who have staffed the Shrine since 1904, have made extensive physical improvements in the last two decades, so that they now have the capabilities to handle large numbers of people with ease. During the diocesan bicentennial celebration in 1976, an extimated 7,000 persons participated in the 3-day observance at the Shrine.

Currently, as the principle center for devotion to St. Anne in the diocese, the Shrine offers a full range of devotional activities, culminating in the Solemn Triduum marking



#### TO THE EDITOR:

New York "Orphan Train" riders are being sought by a newly formed organization, THE ORPHAN TRAIN HERITAGE SOCIETY OF AMERICA.

This clearinghouse of information gathers the family histories, documents the institutions and railroads involved, collects artifacts, and provides information for researchers.

Between 1854 and 1929, over 150,000 orphaned, abandoned and homeless children were taken out of the institutions of New York City, and transported by trains to rural America. At stops along the way, the children were lined up on railway station platforms, churches, schools, and opera houses for the local residents to look them over and perhaps choose a child to take into their homes.

Those not chosen were loaded back on the train to travel to the next stop where the entire procedure was repeated until all the children had homes.

Some 33,033 children had been placed in New York homes by 1910, according to a Children's Aid Society report.

The United States Catholic charities also placed-out infants and children. They sent agents in advance to arrange for families to accept the waifs when they arrived.

#### SIGNOR - WILLIAMS

On February 20, 1988, my grandmother (Blanche Pombrio) died. After things quieted down, we began to empty out the house. We began in the attic. There we found a pamphlet that had belonged to her sister (Mary Laravie), simply titled <a href="Signor - Williams">Signor - Williams</a>. There is no copyright listed. The preface reads; The following family sketch has been prepared from records secured by my mother at the cost of years of untiring interest and painstaking research.

It was her fond hope that her children and grandchildren might cherish the records and keep up the interest in the family history.

In continuance of that hope this little sketch is presented in affectionate remembrance of Sarah Signor Williams.

My great great great grandfather, John Jacob Sickener, came from the old country to Nine Fartners, N.Y., in 1710. He married Christina Schryver in 1734, record of which, together with other records, of membership, pewholdings, etc., are on the books of the Dutch Reformed Church in Rhinebeck.

Their son, Johannes, was born in 1737. He married Hannah Schafer and was executor of her father's will, filed for probate in 1772. Both John Jacob and his son signed the Association Pledge at Nine Partners, Dutchess Co. The father was too old to fight but Johannes served in the Revolution.

In 1760 petition had been made for grants of land in Vermont, by residents of Nine Partners but the first surveys were not completed until 1763. That fall, or early in the Spring of 1764 a road was laid out from Bennington to Danby. It was cut for a bridle path merely and is the same road that is now used from Danby to West Dorset over the mountain.

The first settlement was made in 1765 by five men, one

of whom was Luther Colvin, uncle of my great great grandmother Philey Colvin. Bears, wolves and other wild animals roamed the wilderness unmolested. It was no light task to conquer the primeval forest, nor was it easy for these settlers to secure food for themselves and their animals while their work was going on.

They faced days of hardship and danger and we cannot realize the toil and suffering endured by them. The houses were rude structures with only one room and no doors and window. Everything was manufactured at home. For want of machinery people were obliged to perform manual labor. They made their own implements by hand. While the men worked the women were busy at loom and wheel. They picked their own wool, made their own cloth, spun their own yarn, dipped their own candles, wove their own carpets and made their own chairs and baskets.

As soon as a shelter and the common necessities of life were provided, the settlers established schools. Education was somewhat limited, it is true, and the teachers receied little or no compensation, for money was scarce. The school-houses were rough cabins but, nowithstanding the few advantages these early settlers had, nearly all of them were able to read and write and had sufficient knowledge of arithmetic for the transaction of ordinary business. There were some graduates of college.

In 1785 Johannes Signor, or John Henry, as he now became known, with his wife and six children, the youngest but two years of age, went up the Vermont trail and settled just out of Danby on what was called "Dutch Hill." This name was given to the settlement because the Signors were supposed to be of Dutch descent. From Rhineback records we learn that they were not Dutch descent. From Rhineback records we learn that they were not Dutch, but Germans, who came with the Palatines in 1710. Though John Henry and his family, probably did not endure the extreme privation of the first settlers nevertheless, there was the same hard labor of redeeming the land from the wild, the same lack of conveniences. For implements were still made at home by hand. The first grist mill was built two years after the Signors went to Danby. This was a great

help, as they had previously been obliged to take their grain to Manchester and Salem.

The Signor family was a Methodist family, the names of John Henry and John Jr., appearing upon the early records. The Colvins were Quakers.

The Danby history says of John Henry. "He was a man of noble heart, sound judgement, industrious and persevering and acquired considerable property." Both John Henry and his son held positions of responsibility and trust in Danby.

John Jr., was a Freemason, a member of Farmer's Lodge No. 30. When he was twenty years old he married my great grandmother, Sally Williams, daughter of Ephraim Williams, our Revolutionary ancestor, and direct descendant of Roger Williams,. Sally was bright, energetic and nimble of finger. I have the flax and spinning wheels she used and an apron beautifully stitched by her hands.

Sally had three children, Henry, Fhilip and Joel. Henry born 1304, died 1836; Fhilip born 1807, died 1879; Joel born 1809, died 1901.

When Philip was but a little lad the family moved to Feru and remained there, making it their permanent home. John Jr., died in 1840 and Sally in 1866. All the family except Philip are buried in the cemetery at West Peru. Grandfather Signor lived in Peru till 1838 and married Grandmother in 1829. She was Irena Hunt, daughter of James Hunt and Almira Southmayd.

From Feru they moved to Saranac where Grandfather farmed for a time and then engaged in the iron industry, building, I am told the first forge "up the river" on the Saranac. They went to Rouses Point from Saranac and in 1854 came to Plattsburgh to live. Grandfather was employed by the U.S. Customs Service and the Montreal and Plattsburgh Rail Road. They first lived in the house still standing on the corner of South Platt and South Catherine Streets, facing the river. Their home, which is the one I remember, was on Macomb Street, now made into apartments and owned by Miss Sarah Weaver.

Grandmother Signor was a very devout woman whose faith

was exemplified in her daily life. She was known everywhere for her sweetness of character and was a wonderful mother and neighbor. Had she lived three months longer she and Grandfather would have celebrated their golden wedding, but she died in September of the same year. The old home was bought by my father who gave it to his oldest daughter and in this home my parents had their golden wedding and from it they were carried to their lasting resting place.

Philip W. Signor married Irena Hunt at Peru, NY., 1829. Their children were: Emily Julia, born at Peru 1831, died 1917: James Hunt, born at Peru 1833, died 1914: Sarah Ann, born at Peru 1835, died 1908: Martha Jane, born at Peru 1839, died 1899: John S., born at Peru 1837, died 1841: Elmira A., born at Saranac 1844: died 1900: J. Leslie P., born at Saranac 1850, died 1911.

Emily married Shepard P. Bowen 1353; James married E. Elizabeth White 1368; Sarah married Andrew Williams 1356; Martha Jane married William S. Lawrence 1359; J. Leslie married Mary Fatchin 1874.

Mother was named for her grandmother Sally and was called "Sally" as a little girl. She quite offenced the old lady by choosing to be addressed as "Sarah" when she was a young lady and was forgiven only when she married Andrew "illiams, thus restoring the family name.

Mother attended a private school kept by Uncle William Hunt in Newton Mass., and afterward taught school in Saranac. She used to drive up in a stage and it was on one of these trips that she met my father. They were married in 1356, at Plattsburgh, NY.

Andrew Williams born at Ormstown, Canada, August 27, 1328, married in 1856 Sarah Ann Signor who was born at Ausable, NY., Feb 13, 1835.

Their children were: Martha Elizabeth born at Elsinore 1357, died 1927; James Leslie, born at Elsinore, 1353, died 1362; Robert Philip, born at Elsinore 1360, died 1862; Sarah Irena, born at Dannemora 1864, died 1897; Andrew Frederick, born at Plattsburgh 1867; Mary Emily, born at Flattsburgh 1874.

Martha Elizabeth married George H. Webb, Aug 25, 1875; Sarah Irena married William J. Carmichael, Feb 13, 1884; Andrew Frederick married Martha L. Collins, Oct 24, 1893; Mary Emily married William F. Brown, Nov 21, 1901.

Some of the ancestors whose lives are of outstanding interest are the following:

ROGER WILLIAMS belonged to an old distonguished house in Cornwell, England, holding high rank and wealth in Gwinear. He was a student in the famous Charter House School, London, and graduated from Cambridge University in 1624. He became ordained a minister, but because of his separatist views met with strong orposition and fled to New England with his family in 1631. He built the finest house of that time in Massachusetts at Salem. He was expelled by the Puritans from the colony and after wandering in the wilderness, became the founder of Rhode Island.

Goodwin in "The Pilgrim Republic" pays him this tribute: "Williams was only two years chosen governor by the colony for which he had done so much. So neglected was he by the many men who owed to him their prosperity, that in his old age he became depedent on his sons-he whom the United colonies of New England should have delighted to maintain with honor. Yet to the last he was cheerful and loving.

Roger Williams' theology was visionary and contradictory, but his practice was steadily self-sacrificng, public spirited and beautifully philanthropic. He was buried at Providence under arms and his memory is entailed on the successive generations

of Rhode Island as a priceless legacy".

The Roger Williams line is: Roger, born 1599; Daniel, born 1642; Peleg, born D1766; Robert, born 1715; Ephraim, born D1797; Sally, born 1783; Fhilip, born 1807; Sarah, born 1835.

Many of our ancestors came from Beverly, Wenham and

Many of our ancestors came from Beverly, Wenham and adjacent towns. I have an interesting old history of Beverly which tells of its early days.

Among the early settlers were the Woodberrys, Gaylords, Giles Hamilton, the Fairfields, Balches and Raymonds. No name is more conspicuous in the first century and a half in Wenham than that of Fairfield.

ELIZABETH FAIRFIELD in 1690 married Freeborn Balch, whose gravestone is in a cemetery on a hill near Wenham Lake. Their daughter Tabitha married Lieut. Paul Raymond, a grandson of the famous Capt. Rayment of Beverly. Lieut. Faul Raymond and Tabitha (Balch) had a daughter Tabitha who married Ephraim Hunt, my great great grandfather. One of his grandsons was named Faul Raymond Hunt.

Captain William Rayment led an expedition against the Indians in 1675 and a fleet against Quebec in 1690 and was a distinguished veteran. The history of his father-in-law

is also of interest.

EDWARD BISHOP, who with his wife Sarah, came to Salem in 1639 and there had his three children baptized. He was one of the founders of the church at Beverly in 1667, nevertheless

in 1692 both he and his wife were imprisoned on the charge of withcraft, but happily were not too old to escape by breaking jail for which their property was confiscated. This was afterward redeemed by their son. But Bridget Bishop, probably Edward's sister, had been charged with the same "damnable offense" and two months after Edward's escape, was tried, condemned, and as the poor old woman was too infirm to escape, was hanged.

COLONEL JOHN ALLYN was for many years secretary of the colony of Massachusetts. He married Ann Fynchon and their daughter Margaret, married William Southmayd of Middletown, Conn. Their Son was the Revolutionary, William Southmayd who served from early in 1776 to 1778, when he fell victim to smallpox at Lake Champlain where the army was encamped. He was at Fort Schuyler in 1776. He had one son and three daughters, when he died at the age of 39 years.

WILLIAM PYNCHON came to America in the fleet with Winthrop in 1630. In a letter written by Gov. Endicott to to Sir Henry Vane, he says "Fynchon was a man of great enterprise and highly honored until his publication of "The Meritorious Price of Our Redemption and Sanctification; Clearing it from some Common Errors." For this he suffered indignity in 1651 when his book was by our government ordered to be burned, and lest the same form of purification might reach the author himself, he went home as more freedom was enjoyed in his native land." I am glad to note that Pynchon in 1655 published in England a second edition of his book in which he replied to his critics.

"Among the men whom the people delighted to honor were MP. GILES HAMLIN, his son John Hamlin and his grandson Jabez Hamlin. Mr. Hamlin was elected representative to the General Court 22 times. Both his son and grandson held positions of trust. The excellence of Gile Hamilton may have contributed to bring forward the son and grandson but they could not have received and retained the confidence of the people in those times, had they not been superior men. Jabez was publicly educated and possessed a well informed and well balanced mind, unusual sweetness and uniformity of temper and courtliness of manners. He took an active interest in the welfare of every class and descended to his grave rich in the esteem of men and beloved of his God." This if from Dr. David D. Field's Centennial address at Middletown, Conn.

GEORGE LAMBERTON was a merchant from London who was prominent in New Haven in 1541, a man of some wealth and distinction. He had several children, one of whom was Mercy, born in 1541.

George Lamberton left New Haven in 1646 for England in an 80 ton craft which he owned, carrying several prominent colonists, among whom was the wife of Lieut. Governor Goodyear.

By cutting the ice for three miles out from her wharf, the ship was enabled to pass into Long Island Sound-never to be heard from.

#### Signor - Williams cont.

Lieut. Governor Goodyear eventually married Lamberton's widow a rather romantic ending to the tragic incident. The daughter Mercy, married Thos. Painter, and had a daughter Mercy. She married Edward Allen and had a daughter Mercy, who married Peter Evans and had a daughter Mercy, thus making four generations of Mercys. Mercy Evans married Rev. Samuel Todd and named her Irena. She was the mother of Almira Southmayd, my great grandmother whose family registry follow:

James Hunt, born 1774 married Almira Southmayd at Charlestown, N.H., 1796, their children were: Lucia, born 1797, died 1803.

Cynthia, born 1798, died 1871. Married Abner Weston 1818. Paul Raymond, born 1800, died 1804.

Emily, born 1802, died 1885. Married Samuel Covel 1822. Lucia, born 1804, died 1894. Married Henry Wells 1822. Almira, born 1806, died 1886. Married Henry Signo 1825. Mary Ann, born 1808, died 1825.

Irena, born 1813, died 1879. Married Philip W. Signor 1829. Eleanor, born 1912, died 1879. Married Joseph W. Everest 1831. James L., born 1815, died 1886. Married Maria Baldwin 1850. John W., born 1821, died 1906. Married Rouettes Thompson 1848.

Uncle "illiam Hunt was a favorite with all the family and a very welcome visitor in our home. He was patriarchal in appearance wearing a long white beard, and had a very dignified bearing. He often used to ask me to play for him his favorite hymn, "Watchman, tell us of the Night," and would sit by the piano while I played it, going through it verse by verse.

He was a dear old gentleman and his history is one to be remembered.

He was born in Jay, NY., 1821, the youngest of eleven children. When he reached his fifteenth year, he decided to secure a broader education than could be obtained in his native village and stated out, afoot and alone, walking a distance of 125 miles in the snow to Meriden, NH., where he entered a school to prepare for college.

His earnest efforts were at last rewarded and in 1843 he was admitted to the freshman class of Middlebury college from which he graduated in 1847.

After graduation he taught in North Bridgewater, and

Flymouth Mass., and in 1850 was called to Newton Center to take charge of the grammar and high school. Six years later he opened a private school in the same place, where he remained for nine years, fitting for college many of the men now prominent in the United States.

In 1866 he was obliged to seek a warmer climate and went to Washington where he was at once awarded a prominent place in the public school system as instructor and manager. He subsequently opened a private school for boys called the English and Classical Freparatory Schoo, where young men were fitted for college, West Foint and Annapolis. He was principal of this school for thirty years, and when physical infirmities compelled him to take up less arduous duties, he received pupils in his private home. There several attaches of legations were instructed in English and some of Washington's best known citizens prepared for college.

He continued in his work until his eighty-first year when he left Washington and retired to his daughter's home in Erie.

For 40 years he was a very earnest worker in the New Jerusalem Church, being a Swedenborgian.

He died at Erie in 1906.

The story of my Grandmother Williams on my father's side has always had a great fascination for me. I never saw her, but I know she was a brave woman and her story is worth relating because she represents that great army of women, heroines of every day life, who are the salt of the earth.

Robert Williams of Banbridge, County Down, Ulster, in the north of Ireland, on Sept. 5, 1808 married a young Scotch girl, Elizabeth Hamilton. Family tradition says that she was of noble birth but whether this is true or not, I do not know. That she was gently born, one who knew her could never doubt.

Mygrandparents were stauch adherents of the Church of England and Grandfather was a member of the Orange Lodge of Banbridge. His certificate of membership bearing the signatures of the officers and with official seal attached, is now a treasured possesion of my brother.

During the period from 1813 to 1828 the turbulence in

Ireland was so great that Parliament suspended the Grand Lodge of Ireland. It was in one of these uprisings, the exact date of which, I have not been able to discover, that my grandfather was injured, taken to the woods, beaten and left for dead. When he had recovered sufficiently, he dragged himself to the house of a woman and begged for shelter. The woman said she would gladly take him in if she dared, but, being of the opposite party, her life would be in danger if she were found out. She told him, however, that he might share the shelter with the animals in an outhouse. There he stayed until he gathered strength to get home.

Soon after this, he, his wife Elizabeth with their children body servant named Peter, sailed for Canada. Grandfather had a modest fortune for that day, and bought a tract of timber land from which he redeemed a farm. He was a man of good education and was often called upon to conduct funeral services and baptise children, there being no clergyman in the settlement of Ormstown at that time. He was not a successful farmer, however, and the little fortune dwindled under indifferent management and dishonest help.

Grandmother made the best of everything. She cut and stiched clothes for herself and the youngsters, knit their stockings, and kept a cheerful hearth for her family. The memory of their holidays with Scotch short bread and Christmas cake remained with her children all their days. Her carefully preserved wedding gown of silk was a curiosity in the country side and with her wedding ring adorned many a country bride. Where there was sickness there were the Williamses, and Grandmother was a great favorite with all her neighbors.

The stork which had visited them with unerring regularity at least every two years, had missed a year because of their change of address, but now found them out, and when Uncle Robert was three years old another little son arrived. The new baby was called Andrew and was my father. When he was less than three years of age a terrible blow fell upon the household.

Grandfather started on horseback one winter day for Montreal to purchase some neccessary supplies for the house.

# Signor - Williams cont.

Hearing the hoofbeats of the returning horse, Grandmother sent the servant to unbridle the animal, and herself went to meet her husband. She met instead, the breathless servant, who came running to tell her that the horse was there, but the saddle was empty and no sign of grandfather to be found.

Who can describe the terrible suspense of the days that followed and the hardships of the years after that had to be lived through somehow?

When thorough search failed to reveal any trace of Grandfather, it was decide(sic) that he had been killed and robbed of his money which he carried in a belt on his person. This theory, however, was disproven the next Spring when his body was found by a priest down the river at Beauhornis, with belt and money intact.

Against great odds Grandmother kept her family together and reared her children to be a credit to her. My father began earning his living when he was fourteen years old, so that his early advantages, you can see, were not very great; but, if by success is meant a life of usefulness to others, and a name respected and loved by all who knew him, then his was a life of extraordinary success. No one man, I believe, contributed more to the early development of industry, transportation and finance in Northern New York than Andrew Williams and I am proud to be his daughter.

The cheerfulness and courage with which Elizabeth Hamilton met the vicissitudes of her life were inherited by her youngest son.

I often think of her years of loneliness and care, and imagine the hunger that was in her heart for a sight of her old home and her "ain folk" across the sea.

There are two treasured keepsakes in my possession: one a little workbox, and the other an old Irish nursery rhyme, both of which came from the old country with my grandmother.

The little workbox I cannot give away but the old Irish nursery rhyme you all may share.



# SOURCES FOR FAMILY HISTORY

The National Archives - Boston Branch in Waltham has custody of the permanently valuable records of field offices and regional division of Federal agencies in the New England states - Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont. It is one of eleven such field branches of the National Archives located throughout the country. Records of Federal agencies which are judged to have permanent administrative, legal, or historical value are accessioned into the National Archives and maintained in the field archives branches. These records have continuing value for assisting the necessary processes of government, for protecting public and private rights, and for providing scholars, students, and the general public with basic historical sources. They reflect the history and development of the agency or office that created them and provide information on American legal, economic, political, and social life. By preserving the permanently valuable records of field offices of the Federal agencies, the archives branches keep within respective regions those records which document Federal activities of the regional and local levels.

In addition, the field archives branch has over 35,000 rolls of microfilm containing copies of documents located in the National Archives in Washington, D.C. In order to make its holdings more accessible, as well as to provide security copies of the original records, the National Archives has reproduced on microfilm many of its most significant records, especially those with high research value. Microfilm publications help bridge the gap between the expensive printed editions of selected documents and the enormous mass of unpublished records and serve the public's need for greated access to original source material. Over 150,000 rolls of microfilm have been produced by the National Archives, and select series of microfilm have been deposited in field archives branches where they can be used by researchers.

A significant number of these records and microfilm contain material of genealogical value. The most widely used records for family research are described below.

#### CENSUS RECORDS

The National Archives - Boston branch has microfilm copies of the existing Federal population census schedules, taken every ten years, for all states from 1790 to 1910 (nearly all the 1890 schedules were destroyed by fire in 1921). We also have microfilm of "Soundex" indexes to the 1880 and 1900 censuses and a partial "Soundex" index (only 21 states are indexed) to the 1910 census. In addition commercially published name indexes to the census for many of the states from 1790 to 1860 are available for use in our research room.

The field archives branch also have microfilm copies of non-population census schedules for the state of Massachusetts from 1850 to 1880. In addition we have microfilm of some schedules of a special census of Union veterans and widows of veterans in 1890.

# REVOLUTIONARY WAR PENSION BOUNTY LAND WARRANTS AND MILITARY SERVICE RECORDS

We have microfilm copies of the applications for pension and bounty land warrants issued to veterans of the Revolutionary War and microfilm copies of military service records of those who served in the Revolution. These records cover all states and include name indexes. In addition, we have a microfilm index to compiled service records of volunteer soldiers who served during the War of 1812.

#### THE NATIONAL ARCHIVES (CONT.)

### NATURALIZATION RECORDS

The branch has records of immigrants who applied for American citizenship. Below is a list of these naturalization records consisting of the original petition or a record of naturalization and some declarations of intention,

- 1. FEDERAL COURTS (United States District and Circuit Courts)
  Massachusetts, 1790 to 1950 Rhode Island, 1842-1950
  Maine, 1790 to 1955 Vermont, 1801 to 1972
  New Hampshire, 1873 to 1977 Connecticut, 1842 to 1973
- DEXIGRAPH COPIES (5' x 8' photostat negatives)

These are copies of naturalization records from Federal, state, county and municipal courts in Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Vermont and Rhode Island, 1790 to 1906. These records, transferred to use from the National Archives in Washington, D.C., were made by the WPA during the 1930's.

# 3. CONNECTICUT NATURALIZATIONS

We have some records from non-Federal courts, 1790 to 1974. Included are records of Connecticut Superior Courts, Courts of Common Pleas, District Courts and some minicipal courts.

We have a "Soundex" name index to naturalization petitions and records for all courts in the six New England states covering the years 1790 to 1906 (Connecticut 1790 to 1940)

#### PASSENGER ARRIVAL LISTS

Copies of most passenger arrival lists are located in the National Archives in Washington, D.C. The holdings of the National Archives - Boston Branch include microfilm copies of the lists for the ports of Boston, MA (March 1891 to July 1920): New Bedford, MA (1902 to 1919) and miscellanous ports on the Atlantic and Gulf Coasts and the Great Lakes (1820 to 1873; this does not include the large ports as Boston, New York, Philadelphia and Baltimore). In addition, the branch has passenger arrival lists for the port of Galveston, Texas (1896 to 1948) and indexes for various small ports in Vermont (1895 to 1924) and St. Albans, Vermont (1896 to 1952).

# MAIL AND TELEPHONE INQUIRES

Extensive research by the archives staff is not possible. The staff will provide answers to specific inquiries made over the telephone or through the mail only if the information desired is brief and easily obtainable. Otherwise, the records are made available for examination in our research rooms by individuals who must conduct their own research.

# REPRODUCTIONS

The archives branch can provide electrostatic reproductions of its texual records and paper copies from microfilm images for a fee. Prices vary with the size and method of reproduction.

## THE NATIONAL ARCHIVES [CONT.]

Despite the above resources, however, we are not primarily a genealogical institution. Questions involving family histories, local records, records of the Colonial period (pre-1789), church records, etc., should be directed to the proper state or local government agency or genealogical/historical society in the area in which you are interested. The branch does not have "vital records" (birth, death, marriage or divorce). These are either state or local records.

#### DIRECTIONS

## By Automobile

From West of Boston: Take the Massachusetts Turnpike to Route 128 (Interstate 95), go north on Rte. 128, get off at the first Trapelo Road exit (28A) and continue on Trapelo Road 2.8 miles to the National Archives - Boston Branch and Federal Records Center building.

#### From Downtown Boston:

Take the Massachusetts Turnpike west to Route 128 (Intersate 95) Exit 15 (11 miles). Take Rte 128 north to Trapelo Road (Exit 28A). Continue to the National Archives - Boston Branch and Federal Records Center building (2.8 miles). An alternate route is to follow Storrow Drive in Boston to Mt. Auburn Street, Cambridge, to Belmont Street in Watertown, continue on Belmont Street to Trapelo Road in Belmont and stay on Trapelo Road for 2.4 miles to the Center.

#### By Public Transportation

From Downtown Boston: From the Park Street station take the M.B.T.A. subway train to Harvard Square. Then take the M.B.T.A. bus to Waverly Square in Belmont (runs every 15 minutes). From Waverly Square you must either walk (about a mile) or take a commercial taxi west on Trapelo Road.

#### HOURS OF OPERATION



Christopher Riel was in the 1850 Census at Mooers as Christopher Yell. We already know that his brothers Moise and Joseph who also lived in the area pronounced the name Ryell rather than Reel— that is clear from the census and church entries. So,I presume that Christopher pronounced it Ryell or Oryell rather than Reel—Riel also. Now in french Christopher is Christophe and what he said was Christophe Ryell. But the English—speaking census taker expected to hear CHRISTOPHER and mover the "R" over to the end of the first name, which left YELL for the last name. I suspect thar "ORYELL" name came from the same kind of slurring of the syllables. He had given up and changed Christophe into Christopher. But he slurred it. But then the French—speaking priest expected to hear CHRISTOPHE, so Christopher Ryel turned into (Phonetically) CHRISTOPH/ERYELL or CHRISTOPH/ORYELL. He was in between a rock and a hard shell. Sometimes you have to "phych these people out"





#### **GUIDE CARD**

#### Do's and Don'ts

- Select a subject whose hasic facts are definitely known, whether that person is yourself, a forbear, or someone not related to you.
- Only work backwards from the subject chosen, step by step.
- Whether you elect to record female members either under their maiden names or under their married names, be sure to be consistant throughout your records.
- Where a forbear has married more than once, normally there will be space only for recording the details of that marriage of which the subject is the eventual issue.
- Be prepared for the spelling of surnames to vary, (sometimes considerably), as you get further back, and for some first names apparently to change during their owner's lifetime.
- Whether yielding relevant information or not, log all sources searched, in order to avoid repeating work already done.
- Try to corroborate all references with alternative sources.
- Allow for the change in the new year in 1752 from 25th March to 1st January, and hence the double-dating of some entries.
- Remember that, if it can be traced, a marriage certificate provides a wealth of useful information, and a birth certificate includes the maiden name of the mother.
- Bear in mind the likelihood of the following: -
  - The parish of a ghi's birth being the same as that of her marriage
  - The parish of a man's birth being the same as that
    of his burial.
  - A person's parish of birth being a neighbouring one, or the same one as that of the birth of the spouse.
  - The date of marriage being shortly prior to date of birth of the eldest child of the marriage.

I hope that those of you who publish journals will not regard this as something exclusive for printing, but rather a simple public service to alert the public to the availability of the data. You cannot imagine how much NAGGING I inspired Charlotte Easter to do to get SLC to catalog these reels and make them available a couple of years ahead of schedule!!!!!

#### QUEBEC MARRIAGE INDEXES

THE LOISELLE MARRIAGE INDEX

1. The Loiselle index is an index to the marriage records in Quebec; Madawska County, New Brunswick; and Manchester, Hillsboro, New Hampshire, 1642-1963.

- 2. It is an index in one alphabet to brides and grooms.
- 3. Each index entry gives the name of the bride and the groom, the date and parish of the marriage. If the bride or the groom is not widowed the entry will also record the names of his (her) parents.
- 4. If either the bride or the groom is widowed the record of the marriage will indicate the name of the previous spouse. To find the names of the parents of a widow(er) it is necessary to find the indexed entry for the first marriage.
- 5. If either parent of the bride or groom is deceased this is indicated on the index.
- 6. If the parents of either spouse were married in a parish other than the one in which their child is married the index will indicate the parish of the parents' marriage.
- 7. Most of the entries are typewritten.
- 8. A list of abbreviations used for first names and localities, and a list of all the parishes which were indexed (with beginning and ending date), are filmed at the beginning of each reel of the index.
- 9. The alphabetical order of the cards is only approximate. The parishes covered are listed at the beginning of each film.

A section for anonymous (Anonymes) names is located in the "A" section alphabetically and is arranged alphabetically by the surname of the groom. This section includes all those marriage entries for which there is either no surname or no name for the bride.
- 4. See #4 above.
- 5. See #5 above.

6. If anyone in the indexed entry is a resident of another parish, or of another province than Quebec, this is indicated.



#### BASIC GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH IN CLINTON COUNTY

DAVID KENDALL MARTIN # 377-R

abstract of a talk given at the May 1987 conference

For more years than I care to specify, I have worked hard at building my own family genealogy. In the course of my work, I have been lucky enough to have talked and corresponded with some of America's most experienced genealogists. From them and from my own experience, I have developed some sense of genealogical technique.

My own background is largely in New England and in New York's Hudson and Mohawk Valleys. I have only one ancestral connection in the area of interest to this society, a 17th century forebear, Pierre Monteross, who came from France to Canada with the Carignan-Salieres Regiment, soon resigned, married, and went to live down among the Dutch in the fur trade. As a result, I am only now serving my North Country genealogical apprenticeship. However, I have found useful ideas in one region can often work well in another.

Clinton County is an interesting place to search because it has a small population which fact avoids the tedium of going through the record mass of a large city. There are distinct groups here from New England, Down-state, French Canada, and Ireland. Working with such a group often makes research easier than tracking an isolated individual. The basic records of the county are well organized and accessible. The county, settled largely after 1785, does not have a long or complicated history.

#### Clinton County Research cont.

Yet, North Country research can be frustrating. Some important records, such as the 1855 and 1865 state census returns, are missing. We are very near several other record jurisdictions: Canada (Quebec); Vermont; Essex and Franklin Counties, New York. The mingling of French and English families sometimes creates name forms that are hard to follow. For example, Fontaine has become Vantine, which sounds more Dutch than French; Boulanger has been translated to Baker. An electrifying case is Eli Charlesbois who became Eli Charles Bois, which was then translated to Eli Charles Wood, then retranslated to Eli Dubois.

Sometimes I try to help someone who writes from a distance with a North Country problem. When I get such a letter, I am encouraged to try to help if it is a good letter with these characteristics:

- \*The problem is specific and clear; the letter does not ramble and jump around.
- \*The scope of the search is well outlined, the jobs to be done stated, and the time to be spent set forth.
- \*There is enough supporting information given to get going: dates, names, places, relationships, occupations, religion, etc. Group charts are helpful.
- \*Previous work is indicated to prevent duplication.
- The handwriting is clear. Especially for names, typing is much better.
- \*The letter gives a clear go-ahead for the search or makes it definite it is just a preliminary inquiry.

When I start a search, I try to fix several pictures in my mind:

- \*Various forms of the name
- \*The region involved, whether the whole county or a certain town; is it near a border?

\*What time period is involved:

1785-1800 - a primitive time

1800-1850 - a limited, interesting period

1850-1880 - a difficult time to search

1880-1900 - a somewhat easier period

(We rarely get a search after 1900)

\*Possible migration groups:

There were "ghost settlers" pre 1763.

Documented settlement begins 1763-1777.

The area was evacuated during the Revolution.

Resettlement begins 1783.

First came the French Canadians and veterans, then the down-state New Yorkers from Dutchess County, Long Island, and Columbia County. Next were the New Englanders followed by the Irish, after whom came new waves of French Canadians. By 1861 there was an important Jewish community. There were early a few slaves and free Blacks. It is my impression there was not much else before 1900. Of course, people were always drifting over from Vermont.

After this orientation is clear in my mind, I would follow through with a standard search, the nature of which varies somewhat with the time period but which consists of:

- \*Early lists such as refugee lists, the 1798 Direct Tax list, road worker lists.
- \*The federal censuses for 1790, 1800, 1810, etc. Our state censuses for 1825, 1835, etc., are lost. There are indexes for the federal censuses from 1790 until 1860; there are four indexes for the 1800 census.
- \*Land records including LANDHOLDERS OF NORTHEASTERN NEW YORK 1739-1802 (1983), deeds, and mortgages.
- \*Maps, especially the 1856 Lamb wall map and the 1869 Beers atlas which each record hundreds of names at the location where they lived.
- \*Surrogate records, both the index and the files as well as the books of wills, administrations, and guardianships.
- \*Naturalization records which are indexed.

- \*Cemetery records which have been transcribed and indexed for the entire county in the excellent McLellan collection.
- \*Vital records, which can be a problem to locate.
  Until 1881 we have to rely on gravestones,
  newspapers, and church records. The latter two
  types of record are scattered and unindexed.
  After 1881 the records are either in Albany or
  with the town clerks where we face the problems
  of expensive copies, busy people, and confidentiality.
- \*Published material which is often too general to be helpful; although Hurd's history of the county (1880) is detailed and has been indexed.

If gravestones or roads or buildings are found for a particular family, it is interesting for the distant descendant to have photographs taken.

After such a basic search is completed, further research involves special problems which need special approaches developed which can be time consuming. It is now frequently necessary to consult with specialists such as Addie Shields our County Historian, the various Town Historians, the public librarians or those in the North Country Collection of the Feinberg Library at SUNY Plattsburgh, members of the Clinton County Historical Association or of the Northern New York American-Canadian Genealogical Society. While these people are knowledgeable, friendly, and helpful, they are busy people and cannot be bothered too often.

I have had great difficulty locating certain potentially valuable records for a comprehensive search, among them particularly the Protestant church records. So, while Clinton County is an interesting place to search with many excellent sources, it also has some serious problems. Regrettably, no search can guarantee an answer - but this is a fact all seasoned genealogists face stoically.


