

LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

Although this is the February issue, the month is April and I have had many reminders of that fact. It brought to mind the following quote from The American Genealogist, vol. 63 (January 1988), p. 29. This was the George McCracken Memorial Issue and Roger Joslyn wrote in "Inside TAG Back Covers" about the late editor. "Many times he told us why TAG was late in production and how much further behind it became since he 'had' to answer all the inquiries about why the journal had not arrived. One subscriber who 'wrote about the lateness... kept nagging his postmaster, asking that we be subjected to an interrogation! We were, twice, not being at home the first time, visited by an amiable and charming gentleman from the Post Office whom we were glad to get to know." 'Nuff said?

Reaction to the book review of *The Library* in the November is sue has been interesting, to say the least. Two staff members of the Family History Library wrote. One applauded the review and said that "the genealogical community has been much too kind or unaware" when reviewing the(se) book(s). Both pointed out the fact that the book was not authored by staff members of the Family History Library of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, and that it is not an official publication of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. If that point was not made strongly enough in the review, I wish to rectify it here. I also wish to point out that there certainly is material of value in the book, but readers should know about the limitations and errors.



Closing note: Father Dallaire's missionary visits to the U.S. seem to have come to a close in the middle of the year 1844. For the second half of that year, there was only the one entry for a U.S. family. Beginning with the year 1845 and continuing, there will be American data to be found in the St-Jean Chrysostome records, but of a different type.

From 1845 through 1853, according to entries found in this series, the U.S. records by and large appear singly, as if to indicate that the family had travelled to Quebec Province for the administration of the sacrament. New place-names also begin to appear, primarily that of "Moretown," which is Mooers in Clinton County, NY.

Ministers of the Church of Scotland in Canada Part 3

Ontario and Quebec

Following the capture of the city of Quebec by General Wolfe in 1759 and the surrender of Montreal to General Amherst in 1760, the population was about 70,000, almost all Roman Catholic. In 110 rural parishes there were only nineteen Protestants. The first Presbyterian minister was George HENRY who organised a congregation in Quebec about 1765, service being held in a room of the Jesuits' College. The first to settle in Montreal was John BETHUNE who organised a congregation in 1786. In 1791 the Province was divided into Upper and Lower Canada (Ontario and Quebec). An American Presbyterian preacher, Jabez COLLVER, organised a congregation in 1793 in the county of Norfolk. Robert DUNN came in 1794, and John Ludwig BROEFFLE, a minister of the Dutch Reformed Church, laboured amongst German Presbyterians in the counties of Stormont and Dundas from 1795 to his death in 1815. (See pp. 623-624 for a lengthy and detailed history.)

AITKEN, William born Silver Mine, Torphichen, Linlithgow, 28 February 1834, eldest son of Robert, farmer, and Anne ANDERSON. Appointed by Colonial Committee to Cobourg 1864; admitted to Vaughan 1 November 1865; still in that charge 1875; transferred to St James's, Newcastle, New Brunswick 1880; died 13 December 1913. He married 8 May 1867 Jane NOBLE (died June 1927), daughter of Joseph Vaughan and Sarah M'QUARRIE, and had issue: Sarah Noble born 1 March 1868, married 15 June 1907 Horatio WALKER, M.D.; Annie Anderson born 19 April 1870; Robert Traven Donaldson born 23 April 1873; Joseph Mauns born 26 February 1878; William Maxwell born 25 May 1879, created a Knight 1911; Arthur Noble born 26 July 1883; Jean Noble born 11 September 1885, married William STICKNEY 1919; Allan Anderson born 15 September 1887; Laura Katherine born 24 February 1892, married Douglas Monro RAMSAY of Bowland, Stow 9 December 1925. p. 624

ALEXANDER, Thomas born 1805 Aberdeen, son of James, tailor; appointed by Glasgow Colonial Society 2 June 1834, ordained to Colborne that year; minister at Cobourg 1835-44; joined the Free Church 1844 and ministered at Cobourg 1844-60 and at Percy and Seymour 1860-74, at Mount Pleasant 1874-84. He died 16

December 1895. p. 624

ALLAN, Daniel born 1812 Ross-shire; appointed 20 July 1836; ordained to Stratford and Woodstock 21 October 1838; joined the Free Church 1844; minister at North Easthope 1847-74; died December 1884 at Goderich. p. 624

ANDERSON, Duncan born 1826 Monymusk; appointed by Colonial Committee and ordained to Point Levi 26 December 1854; still in that charge 1875. p. 625

ANDERSON, James born 1797 Cromarty, son of James, farmer; appointed 16 July 1834 and ordained to Ormstown 15 July 1835; died there 6 April 1864. p. 625

ANDERSON, Joseph born 1790 Glasgow, second son of John, merchant; ordained minister of the Irish Presbyterian Church, Newtown Crommelin 8 August 1826; emigrated to Canada and was admitted to South Gower and Mountain. Joined the Church of Scotland 1840; retired July 1864. p. 625

ANDERSON, William admitted to Buckingham and Cumberland 20 July 1869; demitted 10 January 1872; minister at Kincardine 10 October 1872-79; died 10 October 1901 Toronto. p. 625

BAIN, James born 1802 Madderty, eldest son of Peter, artificer; ordained to Kirkcaldy 5 April 1826; resigned 16 August 1853; emigrated to Canada and was admitted to St Andrew's Church, Scarborough 10 October 1854; retired 1874; died 9 December 1885 Markham. p. 625

BARCLAY, James (cf. Vol. I, p. 103) formerly minister of St Cuthbert's, Edinburgh; admitted to St Paul's, Montreal 11 October 1883; resigned 8 November 1910; returned to Scotland and resided Edinburgh; died 17 March 1920 Keswick, England. p. 625

BARCLAY, John born 9 July 1795, son of Peter, minister of Kettle, Fife; ordained to Kingston 26 September 1821; died there 29 September 1826. (Bell's Hints to Emigrants, 114; Life of Dr Machar, 25). p. 625

BARCLAY, William formerly minister of Kirkcudbright (cf. Vol. II, 419); minister of Central Presbyterian Church, Hamilton 1927. p. 625

BARIDON, Louis minister of St John's, Montreal 1850-53 and again 1859-61. p. 625

BARNHILL, William (cf. Vol. III, 225) formerly minister of East Strathaven Chapel, Lanarkshire; appointed by Colonial Committee for missionary service in Canada 20 October 1874; 1879 went to St Clement's, Berbice, British Guiana where he died 22 October 1883. p. 625 and 676

BARR, John born 1840 Lanarkshire, eldest son of William, farmer; ordained 1 August 1866; admitted to Laprairie 3 June 1867; died from effects of an accident when returning from preaching at a distant part of his charge 11 August 1870.

BARR, William, native of Strabane, Ireland; went to Canada 1826; minister at Hornby; admitted to Trafalgar 1847, Wawanosh 28 September 1849; demitted September 1871; died 5 May 1886 Brantford. p. 625

BAYNE, John born 16 November 1806 Greenock, son of Kenneth, minister of Gaelic Church there; ordained for service in Canada 3 September 1834; admitted to Galt 1835; joined the Canadian Free Church 1844 and became its leader; died 3 November 1859. (Gregg's Hist., 490; Campbell's Hist. of St Gabriel's, 460, 576, 615, 721; Smellie's Life of Dr Bayne Toronto, 1871.) p. 625-6

BELL, Andrew born 1805 London, England, son of William, minister at Perth, ca; ordained to Streetsville, Toronto 15 July 1828; minister at Ancester (sic) and Dundas 1847-52; at L'Orignal October 1852-56; died there 27 September 1856. He was an accomplished scholar and a noted geologist. He married Elizabeth NOTMAN and had son Robert born 3 June 1842, died 17 June 1917, scientist and explorer. Publication: "Letters on Canada" in his father's Hints to Emigrants (Edinburgh, 1824). (Gregg's Hist., 370, 376; Hallock's One of Canada's Explorers (Washington, 1901). p. 626

BELL, George son of William, minister at Perth, Ontario; ordained to Cumberland 30 May 1844; minister at Simcoe 1848-57; at Clifton, Niagara 1857; demitted 22 July 1873 and admitted to Walkerton 17 March 1874; died before 1898. p. 626

BELL, William born 1780 Airdrie, son of William, weaver, Anderston, Glasgow; ordained 4 March 1817; minister at Perth, Ontario 1817-57. Joined the Church of Scotland along with his congregation 20 August 1835; died 16 August 1857. He made several remarkable missionary journeys in the east of Canada and endured great privations in his earlier ministry. Two sons were Andrew, minister at L'Orignal, and George. Publication: *Hints to Emigrants* (Edinburgh, 1824). (Gregg's *Hist.*, 196-200). p. 626

BELL, William, a native of Canada; ordained to Pittsburgh 1863; demitted 5 February 1868 and returned to Scotland. p. 626

BELL, William born 1816 eldest son of James, farmer, Drummerin, Co. Monaghan, Ireland; licentiate of Irish Presbyterian Church; ordained to Stratford 17 May 1848; minister at North Easthope 1857; died 17 December 1873. p. 626

BENNETT, John born Kinross-shire; ordained to Three Rivers 29 June 1869; admitted to St Andrew's, Almonte 17 September 1872; died there 7 November 1888. p. 626

BETHUNE, John born 1751 Isle of Skye; emigrated to South Carolina and as a licentiate of the Church of Scotland became chaplain to a regiment of Royal Militia, composed of Scottish settlers, on the breaking out of the revolutionary war. With many Loyalists he was taken prisoner and suffered considerable hardships at the hands of the rebels. On regaining his liberty he settled in Halifax, Nova Scotia. After the Peace of 1782 he resided in Montreal where he organised the first Presbyterian congregation in that city (St Gabriel Street) and acted as pastor 12 March 1786 to 6 May 1787 when he removed to Glengarry, taking possession of 3000 acres assigned to him. He carried on missionary work over a wide district and founded flourishing congregations at Williamstown, Martintown, Cornwall, and Lancaster. He died 23 September 1815 at Williamstown. He married a Swiss lady, Veronica WADDEN, and had issue: Angus born 1783; Norman, auctioneer; John born 1791, died August 1872, Principal of M'Gill College and Dean of Montreal; James, auctioneer; Alexander Neil born 28 August 1800, died 3 February 1879, Bishop of Toronto; Donald; Christie married 2 November 1817 Montreal to Robert HENRY, merchant; Ann born 21 May 1798, married 23 May 1815 Montreal to Henry M'KENZIE; another daughter. (Croil's Report, 76; Macmillan's M'Gill and its Story, 102; Campbell's Hist. of St Gabriel Street Church, 25-38; Canniff's Hist. Early Settlement of Upper Canada (Toronto. 1869); Tombst. at Williamsburgh erected by his six sons). pp. 626-27

BLACK, David, appointed by Colonial Committee and ordained to Laprairie 19 October 1837; minister at St Thérèsa; joined the Free Church 1844; resident at Chateauguay 1868. p. 627

BLACK, Edward born 10 December 1793, third son of James, minister of Penninghame, Wigtownshire; assistant to his father 1817-22. In 1822 he went on a visit to Montreal, preached in St Gabriel Street Church and became collegiate minister. Upon the division which took place in that congregation in 1831 he was settled as minister over the section who formed St Paul's Church; first Scottish minister in Montreal to receive a D.D. (Edinburgh, 1837); died 9 May 1845. His son, William MacMillan, became minister of Anwoth (q.v.). p. 627

BLACK, James born 1834 Glasgow, eldest son of James; appointed by Colonial Committee and ordained missionary at Point St Charles (afterwards St Matthew's), Montreal July 1860; admitted to Chatham, Quebec 4 September 1861; resigned 1864 and returned to England; was Unitarian minister at Stockport, Todmorden, and

Knutsford, and tutor to the Unitarian Missionary Board, Manchester 1874-89; went to USA where he became a missionary and private tutor at Topeka, Kansas. p. 627

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Strays

Registers of the Anglican parish at Berthier, Quebec are on microfilm reel 128.46 of the Archives Nationales du Québec. While looking through this reel, I noted a number of marriages that would most likely not ever be sought in these registers. A significant number of these "strays" were married by license rather than by banns. Virginia DeMarce stated that these licenses were issued by the Anglican Bishop of the diocese and should be housed in the Anglican Church of Canada Diocese of Montreal Archives, 1444 Union Avenue, Montreal, Quebec H3A 2B8. Marriage by license rather than banns was usually done by a couple who didn't want the fact of their impending nuptials made public. They also had to explain to the Bishop why they didn't want banns read, and this fact should be stated in the license. Their parents may also be named. It was a rather expensive route to go, costing about 50 pounds sterling.

Genealogy in Ontario: Searching the Records, Brenda Dougall Merriman. (Ontario Genealogical Society, 1988). Soft cover, 6" x 9", illus., 168 pp., \$13.50 plus \$2.00 postage to the US or \$1.00 to Canadian addresses. Order from the Society at 40 Orchard View Blvd, Suite 253, Toronto, Ontario M4R 1B9. This is a revised and greatly enlarged edition of her 1985 publication. Without a doubt--if you have ancestors who lived in Ontario, this book is a must-have for you to study. The author explains the many types of records to be found in Ontario, how they were created, how to find them and how to use them. There are maps showing boundary changes through the years as new districts and/or counties were created, as well as addresses of resource centers (centres), genealogical societies and publishers. Throughout the text, reference is made to journal articles and books that will further aid you in your search. In the introduction, under the sub-heading Finding Emigrants' Origins, she states, "Sources that should be investigated for this important clue are cemetery. inscriptions, obituaries, land petitions, military lists, Loyalist claims, ships' lists, marriage records, local histories and directories. Historical atlases sometimes have biographies of prominent settlers or lists of inhabitants with birthplace and date of settlement. Chances are you may never discover exactly what you want, but perseverance is the only course. As an encouraging example, searches of all these records had failed to indicate where in Ireland one original emigrant had lived, other than 'County Tyrone' in his land petition. Ironically, and by chance, we learned that the local school in his area had been named for his home parish in Ireland." Each type of record mentioned is thoroughly described in the book. It is like having a detailed map of an area you are traveling through rather than merely a vague outline.

Irish Migrants in the Canadas: A New Approach, Bruce S. Elliott. (McGill-Gueen's University Press, 1988). Hard cover, 6" x 9", illus., 371 pp., \$35.00 (in all funds to US addresses - NY residents add 8% sales tax) from Manager Direct Mail Marketing, McGill-Queen's University Press, 855 Sherbrooke Street West, Montreal, Quebec H3A 2T7. In May, a paperback edition will be available for \$18.95 from the same address. This is volume 1 of McGill-Queen's Studies in Ethnic History. Mr. Elliott has tracked some 775 families of Irish emigrants who left County Tipperary for Canada, most between 1815 and 1855. These people were largely Protestants who settled in Quebec and Ontario. Most immigrants were part of a "chain migration," following kin who had come earlier. All statements are footnoted in detail, and any Irish genealogist can get ideas for further research. In the past, studies of Irish migration to North America have largely been aggregate and statistical. This excellent work employs techniques of both genealogists and historians. The book should be in the genealogical collection of every library, both public and private. (Bruce will lecture on the subject of Irish research at the NGS Conference in St. Paul this May.)

In addition to the census index, the editor has explained the history of the District of Assiniboia West and the method of enumeration. As Eileen stated in a cover letter, many of the western settlers were born in Quebec, Ontario, USA and elsewhere, and readers may find some adventuresome ancestors or relatives. Names are arranged alphabetically, so if one wishes to know who lived nearby, you will have to order the microfilm copy of NAC reel T-6426. This may be borrowed through Inter-Library Loan from the National Archives of Canada (or see notice

about the AGLL elsewhere in this issue). If you find a person of interest to you, you would want to read the entire entry anyway. The index has the full name, sex, age, place of birth, division and page number. Additional information in that census is: type of dwelling, marital status, relationship to head of the family, whether French-Canadian, place of birth of father and mother, religion, occupation, whether an employer or wage-earner, ability to read and write, and any infirmities. This volume is the first in a planned series. They are to be commended for a job well-done.

Inhabitants of Toronto, Ontario 1850, Norman K. Crowder. (Nepean, Ont.: Crowder Enterprises, 1988). Soft cover, spiral bound, 8 1/2" x 11", 56 pp., \$9.00 from Norman Crowder, 22 Canter Blvd., Nepean, Ontario K2G 2M2. This list was taken from the Toronto portion of Rowsell's City of Toronto and County of York Directory for 1850-51, published by Henry Rowsell in 1850. Since the census returns of 1848, 1850, and 1851-2 for Toronto have not survived, this directory is the best available substitute. Pages are facsimiles of the original publication, thus reducing the error potential in re-typing. Researchers should welcome Mr. Crowder's efforts to make this information available to people who do not have access to a library holding the original. In fact, I do not find Rowsell's directory in the catalog of the Family History Library.

Genealogical Computing, a quarterly journal published by Ancestry, Box 476, Salt lake City, UT 84110. Staple binding, 8 1/2" x 11", 40 pp., \$25.00 per year (add \$5.00 postage to Canadian addresses). Until April 30, you may write for a complementary sample copy from Department RV (above address). This was formerly public of bi-monthly by Paul Andereck, who continues as a contributing editor. I was a charter subscriber, but dropped after several years because many of the articles were too technical for me. Since reading the review copy of vol. 8 #3' (Jan-Mar 1909), I think I will re-subscribe. Genealogists who use computers, or are thinking of buying a computer and genealogy software, will find the articles and comments helpful. This issue has an article, "What About Hardware: Time to Switch"?, and another about the long-awaited Macintosh version of the PAF, as well as others. Regular features include "Beginner's Board" and "Tech Notes" for the more advanced user.

Bibliography of Massachusetts Vital Records, Jay Mack Holbrook. Microfiche, second edition, 280 pp. on one fiche, \$6.00 from Holbrook Research Institute, 57 Locust Street, Oxford, MA 01540. The Institute publishes microfiche editions of vital records of Massachusetts, and this bibliography catalogs the towns that have been filmed, as well as the state-wide birth, marriage and death indexes from 1841-1895. If you wish to buy only the vital records from a specific town covering a specific range of years, you will know which fiche to order. For example, the state-wide birth index 1841-1895 is 54 volumes on 417 fiches, and the records of Mount Washington are on 28. Complete sets are \$4.00 per fiche; partial sets are \$5.00 per fiche. Write for details.

Francisco Researcher, a family newsletter for Francisco/Cisco/Sisco/etc. published by Rick Dodds, 1454 Springleaf Circle, Smyrna, GA 30080. 8 1/2" x 11", 6 issues per year, \$15.00 annually. No. 15 (November 1988) contains pages 338-354 with stories and vital records concerning persons of this surname. If you have this name in your background, you should certainly enjoy this publication.

The following books are all available from Genealogical Publishing Co. Inc., (GPC) 1001 North Calvert Street, Baltimore, MD 21202-3897. Shipping is \$2.50 for the first book, \$1.00 each additional book. Orders totalling \$10.00 or less, allow \$1.25 for one book. Maryland residents add 5% sales tax; Michigan residents add 1% sales tax.

Emigrants from England to the American Colonies 1773-1776, Peter Wilson Coldham. (Baltimore: GPC, 1988). Hardbound, 6" x 9", vii + 182 pp., indexed, \$22.50. Emigration to the colonies following the end of the French and Indian War was so heavy, the British Government required every port in England and Scotland to submit returns regarding the emigrants. From December 1773 to April 1776 every emigrant, officially recorded as leaving, is listed. These registers were earlier transcribed and published in the New England Historical and Genealogical Register, but the transcription was found to be deficient in certain areas. Coldham re-transcribed the data and included all relevant information from the registers, showing port by port, in order of departure, the names of ships, the name of each emigrant, his place of residence, his occupation, his age, and his destination in the colonies. Destinations listed are Maryland, Rennsylvania, Virginia, New York, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Maryland, Florida, Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, Quebec, Jamaica, Grenada etc. Possibly many of those who went to the American colonies ended up in Canada, especially those who arrived just prior to the rebellion. Vice-Admiral Graves wrote: There is reason to believe that most of the men would serve in the Army and the others, with the wives and children, could be sent to Nova Scotia." This compilation is of those leaving from English ports only; those who left from Scottish ports will be treated in a separate publication.

American Wills & Administrations in the Prerogative Court of Canterbury, 16.0-1857. Peter Wilson Coldham, compiler. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989). Hardcover, 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", ix + 416 pp., \$30.00. Englishmen who emigrated to America and died leaving estates in England, had their wills proved by the Prerogative Court of Canterbury. Information is extracted from the wills for maximum genealogical usage. It presents information about each person in both England and America (including Canada). You may find place of residence, occupations, and many family relationships. It may provide the exact place in England, linked to the new home in America. It also explains what the Prerogative Court of Canterbury is, instead of assuming that the reader is familiar with English courts. The information is easily found and the book is well indexed by surname, place name, and ship. I noted quite a few Canadian entries. There are about 6000 abstracts. Mr. Coldham has provided researchers with yet another tool to use in their search for British ancestors.

Eight British research guides by Jeremy Gibson are offered by GPC. The titles are descriptive of the contents. All are staple binding, 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", 1989 publications. Census Returns 1841-1881 on Microfilm: A Directory to Local Holdings in Great Britain, Channel Islands, 1sle of Man, fifth edition, 56 pp., \$7.00. Unpublished Personal Names Indexes in Record Offices and Libraries, second edition, 40 pp., \$6.00. Local Newspapers 1750-1920 England and Wales, Channel Islands, Isle of Man: A Select Location List, 64 pp., \$7.50. Bishops' Transcripts and Marriage Licences, Bonds and Allegations: A Guide to their Location and Indexes, second edition, 32 pp., \$5.00. Probate Jurisdictions: Where to Look for Wills, third edition, 72 pp., \$7.50. Record Offices (In England and Wales): How to Find Them, co-authored by Pamela Peskett, fourth edition, \$7.00. Marriage, Census, and other Indexes for Family Historians,

third edition, 44 pp., \$6.50. Quarter Sessions Records (in England and Wales) for Family Historians: A Select List, second edition, 32 pp., \$5.00.

Abstracts of Bristol County, Massachusetts Probate Records, Book 2, 1745-1762, H.L. Peter Rounds, C.G., compiler. (Baltimore: GPC, 1988). Hardbound, 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", ii + 365 pp., indexed, \$25.00. This is a continuation of Book 1 which covered the period 1687-1745. The records themselves are located in the Registry of Probate in Taunton, MA and are also available on microfilm at any LDS Branch Library (Family History Center). Until 1747, the Rhode Island towns of Barrington, Bristol, Little Compton, Tiverton and Warren were part of Bristol County, MA. The compiler not only abstracted every item from volumes 11-17 of the probate records, but included the guardianship volumes 124-126. If you have ever tried to decipher old documents, you can well appreciate the work that went into these abstracts. The compiler has excellent credentials, including receiving the Donald Lines Jacobus Award from the American Society of Genealogists.

Irish Emigration Lists 1833-1839: Lists of Emigrants Extracted from the Ordnance Survey Memoirs for Counties Londonderry and Antrim, Brian Mitchell, compiler. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989). Hardbound, 6" x 9", maps, 1x + 128 pp., indexed, \$20.00. Although the Ordnance Survey covered nineteen Irish counties, the memoirs covering Antrim and Londonderry are the only ones that contain lists of emigrants. These lists have been extracted, arranged under parish, and al, thetized. Unlike passenger arrival records, these lists identify both the destination of the emigrant and his place of origin in Ireland. In addition, the age, townland address, year of emigration, and religious denomination of each emigrant are given. A sample entry from Drummaul Parish, County Antrim for the HANNAH family shows they left Lenagh Townland for Quebec in 1837 with: John 60; Sarah 58; John 40; Hugh 38; James 36; Thomas 34; Margaret 32; Sarah 30; Anne 28; Eliza 26; Martha 36. All were Presbyterian. Destinations were to ports in New York, New Orleans, Philadelphia, Quebec, St. Johns, St. Andrews, Van Demens Land (sic), and many others. Since ship passenger arrival lists at the port of Quebec were not kept until 1865, these lists represent a valuable find. Persons from Ireland bound for the United States often arrived through Canadian ports and the opposite was also true. Given the sometimes difficult chore of Irish genealogy, if your people were from these counties you will welcome Mitchell's efforts. Over 3000 people are listed with more than one-third bound for Canada.

Irish Passenger Lists 1847-1871: Lists of Passengers Sailing from Londonderry to America on Ships of the J. & J. Cooke Line and the McCorkell Line, Brian Mitchell, compiler. (Baltimore: GPC, 1988). Hardcover, 6" x 9", xvii + 333 pp., indexed, \$28.50. Although ships' captains were not required to keep passenger lists, the ship owners kept them for business reasons. Two companies operating from the port of Derry were the J. & J. Cooke, which operated a passenger line to North America from 1847 to 1867, and McCorkell & Co. which operated from 1863 to 1871. Many of the people in these lists were bound for Quebec or St. Johns, as well as ports in the United States. In fact, a large percentage were Canada-bound. The chapter about the Cooke Co. states (p. ix) that "Ship fever left sixty of the Superior's 360 passengers dead before they arrived at Quebec in 1847." This would mean that there were likely orphans arriving in Quebec. The "Alphabetical List of Orphans in the Catholic Orphanage of Quebec 1847" published in Grosse Ile: Gateway to Canada 1832-1937, Marianna O'Gallagher (1984) (p. 124) shows "Gormolly, Arthur (Gormley?) age 7, and Mary Gormolly age 5, entered 6 Oct 1847, children of Fergus Gormolly and Mary Nellis

from parish Killer. County Tyrone, arrived on the Superior, adopted by Mrs. Daly, Upper Canada." Irish Passenger Lists (p. 38) of the Superior in 1847 to Quebec: "Germly. Fergus, Mary. Rose 11, Thomas 9. Arthur 7. Mary 5, Joseph 2 of Beragh...(and) Margaret Gormly of Beragh." A rather sed implication, isn't it? Some passengers to the port of St. John in 1847 can be round in Ine St. John County Alms and Work House Records, D.F. Johnson (1985). This is a welcome compilation which fills some of the gap prior to the 1865 arrival lists. Over 27,000 passengers are named.

The Original Scots Colonists of Early America 1612-1783, David Dobson. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989). Hardcover, 5 1/2" x 3 1/2", xi + 370 pp., \$28.50. The author is a native of Scotland and has researched in archives throughout Great Britain as well as the United States and Canada. Much of his work has been published in eight earlier volumes by GPC. This new information was found in newspapers, journals, parish registers, and university and apprenticeship records. 7,000 persons are identified with as many as 23 points of information given about each, and each source is fully cited. The material in arranged alphabetically by name and there is an added index of ships. Destinations mentioned are chiefly in the colonies.

Chronicles of the Scotch-Irish Settlement in Virginia extracted from the original court records of Augusta County 1745-1800, Lyman Chalkley. 3 vols. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989; originally published 1912). Hardcover, 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", 623 + 653+ 712 pp., each vol. indexed, \$150.00 the set. Augusta County was erected in 1745 and extended from the Blue Ridge Mountains to the Alleghenies to the Mississippi River and from northern Tennessee to the Great Lakes. Judge Chalkley abstracted records from court order books, county court judgments, original paper's relating to suits, petitions filed with the court, records of the circuit and district courts, marriage bonds, licenses and returns, land entries, guardians' bonds, administrators' bonds, tax delinquents, proceedings of the Vestry of Augusta Parish, records of military service in colonial wars and the Revolution, wills, and deeds. Over 50,000 names are mentioned. This is a goldmine for those who trace their ancestry to Augusta County and the Great Valley of Virginia.

Baltimore County Families, 1659-1759, Robert W. Barnes. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989). Hardcover, 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", xii + 924 pp., indexed, \$55.00. Barnes, widely regarded as a leading authority on Baltimore County, Maryland genealogy, has compiled family groups using many sources, both primary and secondary. All entries are documented, whether the source is parish registers, wills, deeds, or published genealogies. If your family extends back to that area, you will certainly want to consult this work. It is arranged alphabetically by family name with an index to other individuals and names of tracts of land.

Genealogical Data Polating to the German Scitlant of Pennsylvania and Adjacent Territory. From Advertisements in German Newspacers Published in Philadelphia and Germantown, 1743-1800, Edward W. Hocker. (Caltimore: GPC, 1989). Hardcover, 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", 242 pp., indexed, \$17.50. This compilation was made in 1935 by Edward Hocker, the librarian of the Garmantown Historical Society. He abstracted paid notices, advertisements, and articles portaining to German Settlers in Pennsylvania published in five German newspapers from 1743 to 1800 in Philadelphia and Germantown. The data was obtained from death notices, advertisements for runaway servants, offers of property for sale and lense, offers of goods and services, notices of arrival and ramoval in the Pennsylvania

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area, advertisements of letters received and awaiting delivery, and notices placed by persons seeking news of relatives and friends, which sometimes designate place of residence in America and birthplace in Germany. Thomas L. Hollowak compiled an index and GPC first published this book in 1980. I noted an entry (p. 192) in the *Philadelphische Correspondenz* of 9 April 1793: "Engel Christina Getzin inquires for her brother, Andreas Getz, formerly doctor with the Anspach troops and now believed to be in Canada." I checked German Military Settlers In Canada after the American Revolution, Virginia Easley DeMarce (Sparta, WI: Joy Reisinger, 1984) for her brother. On page 114 there is: "Gotze, Andreas. Assistant medical officer, Brunswick troops, born Arnshausen, Eichsfeld, age 36 years 1 months, discharged in Canada 1783 (Rimpau); Regt. Specht, Capt. Plessen's Co. (WB)." I wonder if she ever found her brother? It is also possible that some of these Pennsylvania Germans later settled in Canada.

<u>Gateway to the West</u>, Ruth Bowers and Anita Short, compilers. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989. Hardcover, 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", xv + 972 + 999 pp., indexed, \$150.00). These volumes are a reprint of articles originally published in the periodical of the same name from 1967 to 1978. Articles covered some of the least accessible and most important genealogical records of 76 of Ohio's 88 counties, from common pleas court records, guardianships, naturalizations, and deed abstracts to births, marriages, deaths, cemetery records, and wills. Of the counties I might consider "Canadian-border counties" there is nothing for Cuyahoga, Ashtabula, Ottawa, Lake, and Geauga and some coverage for Erie, Huron, and Lorain. However, if you have ancestors who lived (or died) in the other parts of Ohio, you will certainly want to consult these volumes. Because articles were contributed by many authors and compilers, there is a varying degree of documentation. For instance, "Butler County, Ohio Marriages 1803 to 1812" has no other explanation, such as the name of the person who abstracted and compiled the list, nor where the original records may be found. On the other hand, the section on "Butler County, Ohio - Orphan and Testamentary Records" states that, "The following records were taken from 'Testamentary Record Book 1' located in the Butler County Archives, Court House, Hamilton, Ohio." Issues of the periodical are often hard to find, and this publication, gathering them together, will be welcomed, as so many families traversed through Ohio to parts west, and their descendants often have no idea where their people lived when "Grandpa was born in Ohio."

Washington County. Ohio Marriages 1789-1840, Bernice Graham and Elizabeth S. Cottle, compilers. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989). Hardcover, 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", xix + 98 pp., \$18.50. Washington County was created in 1788 and covered nearly half of the present state of Ohio. The compilers of this book abstracted information from the earliest record book - the "Northwest Territory Book" - from 1789 to 1803 when the county covered all of the area north and west of the Ohio River, and from marriage Book I and Book II up through 1840. Some unrecorded marriages, found in other sources, are also included. Abstracted are the names of the bride and groom and their place of residence, the date of marriage and the officiating person, and the page reference to the original record book. However, explanations of the abbreviations used are scattered throughout the introduction, rather than conveniently shown at the beginning of the listings. Arrangement is alphabetical by surname of the groom and there is an index of brides.

Ohio Cemetery Records Extracted from The "Old Northwest" Genealogical Quarterly, indexed by Elizabeth P. Bentley. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989). Hardcover, 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", x + 495 pp., \$30.00. Originally published in fifteen volumes from 1898 to 1912, tombstone inscriptions were copied in cemeteries in the counties of Trumbull, Geauga, Portage, Lorain, Guernsey, Knox, Licking, Delaware, Franklin, Madison, Fairfield, Pickaway, Athens, Vinton, Ross, and Jackson. Also included were burial records and inscriptions from cemeteries in East Haddam, Connecticut, and Rutland, Massachusetts. The arrangement for publication varies from issue to issue, with some inscriptions appearing in alphabetical order (are people buried in that order?) and others (presumably) row by row.

Addendum to the review of <u>The Library: A Guide to the LDS Family History Library</u> in <u>Lost In Canada?</u>, volume 14, #iv (November 1988), pp. 197-205. This review generated many comments, mostly favorable and in agreement. Two staff members of the Family History Library of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints pointed out that the book was not written by library staff members (with one exception), nor did the FHL publish it. These were facts of which I was aware, but I failed to mention it. I also failed to state that the chapter describing the services of the library is accurately written by a staff person. The FHL is publishing a series of research outlines - write for a price list. One writer enclosed a copy of his own critical review written for the staff, which I found very interesting. He also pointed out that the IGI and FHLC microfiche are now available for purchase by the general public.

The National Archives has published a free catalog of "Aids for Genealogical Research," 28 pages describing a wide selection of research guides and gifts. Request a copy from National Archives Trust Fund Board, Publications Services, Room 1W1, Washington, DC 20408.

The following notice was received from P. William Filby.

The first edition of <u>Who's Who in Genealogy</u> was issued in 1981, with about 750 entries, from all over the world. Gale Research Company, publishers of the first edition, now out of print, have given us permission to compile and published a second edition, updating the first edition.

All persons listed in the first edition who have moved are urged to contact the compilers so that the original entry can be sent for revision. All those in the first edition will receive a copy of the original entry for updating. Similarly, those who had been accepted for the second edition, which was aborted when not enough names were forthcoming, will receive the original entry for updating.

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

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LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

The NGS Conference in St. Paul is now history. All reports indicate it was a tremendous success and I hope you feel so too. I only regret that duties kept me so busy that I did not get to meet many of you. Attendance topped 1600! Persons were there from every state but West Virginia, and from Canada, Australia, West Germany, France and Sweden.

When illness and death required substitute speakers, the substitutes responded with excellent presentations. Curt Witcher, of the Allen County Public Library in Fort Wayne, replaced Diane Carothers' talk on "Little Treasures in Big Libraries: Major Collections in the Midwest." Lou Szucs, coauthor with Sandra Luebking of The Archives: A Guide to the National Archives Field Branches, took over Reed Whitaker's lecture on "A National Resource in a Local Setting: The National Archives Regional System." Both of these changes were made early enough to be included in the Program booklet. Less than ten days before the Conference began, Carolyn Habelman became ill and Pat Geyh, of the French-Canadian group in Milwaukee, stepped in and presented "Beyond the Inscription: Gathering Full Cemetery Information" to a packed room. Jim Johnson was to lecture on "Federal Land Records" Wednesday evening, but had a death in the family on Tuesday evening. Jim Hansen prepared a lecture on the topic in less than twelve hours and was a great success. In that short amount of time, he also prepared a two-page handout. (Thank goodness a little voice told me to pack the printer cable to my laptop computer.) Lloyd Bockstruck of the Dallas Public Library delivered Johnson's Saturday talk on "Solving Research Problems in Kentucky and Tennessee." On Friday afternoon we learned that Nils William Olsson was hospitalized and wouldn't be there for his Saturday lecture on "Tracing Your Ancestors in Sweden." Fortunately, there were genealogists from Swedish institutions who had a vendor booth and they graciously assembled a panel which included an archivist from Sweden.

During my lecture someone asked where to find a list of Latin Christian names and their English equivalents. Dr. Neil Thompson, C.G., F.A.S.G. sent the citation of such a list to me. He said, "...the book is by Archibald F. Bennett, A <u>Guide for Genealogical Research</u> (Salt Lake City, 1951). Appendix III, pp. 313-314 contains a handy table of Latin Christian names and their English equivalents. There are also useful collections of genealogical terms in 11 languages (pp. 296-312), calendar tables and English regnal years (pp. 320-331) and a brief handwriting guide, among other things."

Next year's Conference will be in Arlington, VA June 6-9, 1990. It, too, promises to be a great one. Between now and then I have resolved to see the top of my desk and answer letters that have grown mold. And I hope to get publication back to something resembling the regular schedule. GOOD HUNTING!

here.

CLELAND, William, native of Ireland, went to America and was four years minister at Long Island, New York; minister at Uxbridge 1850-54; admitted to Church of Scotland 1853; transferred to Mountain and South Gower 2 August 1854; transferred to West Gwillimbury and Innisfil 18 June 1873; died 1899. p. 630

CLUGSTON, John born 1796 Glasgow, son of James, tailor, and brother of William, minister of Forfar; ordained to St John's, Quebec 15 June 1830. Joined the Free Church 1844; died at Free Church manse, Stewarton, Ayrshire (where his

only son, James, was minister) 21 January 1877. p. 630

COCHRANE, William born about 1830, second son of John, artificer, Rothesay; admitted to Elgin, Canada 18 September 1866; transferred to Port Hope 2 April 1868; demitted 7 August 1871; afterwards at Middleville; died 29 May 1879. p. 630

COLQUHOUN, Archibald, ordained 14 July 1832; minister at Georgetown, Chateaugay 1833-35; at Otonabee 1836-38; at Otonabee and Dummer 1839-42; 1843 suspended by Presbytery for difficulties with his congregation, ending in a civil lawsuit; reinstated 1847 and appointed missionary of the Presbytery 1848-53; minister at Mulmur 1854-61 when he retired and was still on the Roll in 1872. p. 630

CONNELL, Archibald born 25 December 1789 Kilchoman, Islay, second son of Patrick, farmer; ordained 24 November 1825 and admitted to Martintown, Canada;

died there August 1836 (Tablet in Church). p. 630

COOK, John born 13 April 1805 Sanquhar, Dumfries-shire, son of John, artificer; admitted to St Andrew's Church, Quebec 1836; resigned his pastorate 1884; died at Quebec 1 April 1892. Described as "the most distinguished minister that Presbyterianism in Canada has been able to boast of...."
Publication: Sermons (Montreal, 1888). p. 631

CREEN, Thomas, native of Ireland; ordained to Niagara 1825. Joined the Church of England and became rector of Niagara; died about 1863. p. 631

CRUICKSHANK, John (cf. Vol. VI, 273), minister St Andrew's Church, Bytown (now Ottawa) 1830-43; at Brockville 1843-46; at Niagara 1846-49; returned to Scotland and was admitted to Turriff 19 September 1850. p. 631. VI: 273 - born 1803 Fordyce, cousin of James, minister of Fyvie; called to St Andrew's, Ottawa 17 September 1829 and admitted 4 March 1830; minister of Brockville 1843-46, of Niagara 1846 to 11 April 1849; admitted to Turriff 19 September 1850; died at London 13 June 1892. He married 1 August 1838 at Bytown to Katherine FELLOWS who died 21 May 1909, and had issue: Katherine Margaret born 31 October 1839, died 26 July 1840; Charlotte born 20 March 1841; William John born 28 December 1842; May Amelia born 12 May 1844, married 14 October 1869 David GILL, Raecloch; Margaret born 19 February 1846; Alexander Imlach born 7 April 1848; James Clark born 9 March 1851; Thomas Fellows born 18 January 1853; Katherine Laura born 26 June 1861.

CURRIE, Archibald born Argyllshire; ordained to Côte St George 23 October 1861; transferred to Brock 11 July 1867. p. 631

CUTHBERTSON, Samuel appointed a missionary in 1840. Joined the Free Church in 1845. p. 631

DARROCH, John (cf Vol. VII, 174) minister Lochiel, Ontario 1861-67; returned to Scotland and admitted to Portree, Skye 2 April 1867. p. 631. VII: 174 - born 1829 Jura, son of Neil, Largiebreck; went to Virginia, USA; educated at Princeton University 1854, Columbian Theological Seminary 1856-57, Princeton Theological University 1857-59; ordained by Presbytery of Luzerne to Withesley, Pennsylvania 1859; transferred to Lochiel, Glengarry, Canada 1861; demitted 1867; presented by Queen Victoria 16 January and admitted 2 April that year (sic); demitted 19 July 1893; died 17 September 1916 Musselburgh. He married 2 November 1871 to Mary Jessie JACKSON (died 20 September 1876), daughter of Donald JACKSON, minister of Kilmartin, and had issue: Neil Donald born 27 June 1873, died 29 May 1920 Glasgow, teacher; Campbell Lamont (daughter) born 11 June 1874; John Alastair born 24 August 1876. Publications - Discourse on the Life of the late Rev. Norman Macleod, D.D.; A Sermon on the occasion of the lamented death of Mrs Ross of the Royal Hotel, Portree (1878).

DARROCH, William, native of Scotland; educated at Queen's College, Canada 1858-61; admitted first minister of St Matthew's Church, Montreal 24 December 1861; died 16 June 1865 Montreal. p. 631

DAWSON, Alexander, native of Canada; educated at Queen's College, Kingston; ordained to Kincardine 1863; demitted 29 May 1867. p. 631

DICKEY, John, native of Ireland. Joined the Church of Scotland 1840; admitted to Williamsburg 1841; died there 24 May 1851. p. 631

DOBIE, Robert born 1826 Stirling, eldest son of John; appointed by Colonial Committee as assistant at Montreal 1852; ordained to Osnabruck 7 October 1853; at Milton 1872-87; declined to join the Union of 1875; died 28 April 1888. p.

DOUDIET, Charles A. born Geneva, Switzerland; went to Canada 1842; ordained minister St John's (French) Church of Scotland, Montreal, 23 August 1869; transferred to St Matthew's Church, Montreal, 27 September 1872; demitted April 1876; appointed French Lecturer, Presbyterian College, Montreal 1876-77; readmitted to St John's 1877; later at Buckingham, Quebec and Point St Charles; died 13 June 1913. p. 631

DOUGLAS, James Struthers minister of St Andrew's, Peterborough, Ontario 1858-64; missionary to Presbytery of Toronto 1864-67; returned to Scotland and became minister of North Yell (cf Vol. VII, 304. p. 632. VII: 304 - born 1818 son of John, blacksmith, and Mary TURNER; appointed to Birsay 1870; inducted to North Yell 21 June 1877; died 18 June 1884. He married at London 2 January 1856 Anna M'CRATE who died 12 April 1917, had issue: Annie Maria born 27 December

1856; Thomas Fortye born 23 February 1859; George Alexander born 1 December 1860; Arthur Pringle born 20 November 1862; Clara Newcombe born 10 April 1865; Edith Emma born 15 August 1867; Mary Alison born 18 January 1870; Catherine Elizabeth born 18 March 1872; James Robert born 20 April 1874; John Frederick born 17 September 1875; David Henry Webster born 27 February 1878; Christian Caroline Maud born 6 November 1880.

DOUGLASS, James born 11 June 1792 Co. Monaghan, Ireland, youngest son of Robert, farmer; emigrated to America and was a minister at Lisbon and in Pennsylvania; went to Canada 1829 and laboured in the townships of Monaghan, Cavan, and Emily; admitted to Cavan September 1834; demitted September 1868; died 30 April 1870. His son Alexander entered the ministry of the American Presbyterian Church, and died in early manhood. p. 632

DUNBAR, William appointed ordained missionary to Canada by Colonial

Committee 1847; dismissed next year. p. 632

DUNCAN, Robert eldest son of Robert, farmer, Meigle, Angus; appointed missionary to Canada 1832; resigned 1834. Possibly "the Rev. R.D." WHITEHILL, Dalserf, who died 25 April 1867. p. 632

DUNN, John born about 1768, probably son of James, farmer, Fintray, Stirlingshire; sometime a minister in Albany, USA; minister at Niagara before 1 October 1794 (when the Session Records commence); demitted 1796; became a merchant in Niagara; drowned 1803 in the *Speedy*, which foundered in Lake

Ontario, when all on board perished. p. 632

DURIE, William born 1804 Glasgow, eldest son of William, merchant, and Janet GILLESPIE; joined the Church of Scotland 1846; admitted to St Andrew's Church, Bytown 14 January 1847; died unmarried of fever caught while ministering to Scottish and Irish sick immigrants 12 September 1847. (Tait's Border Church Life, ii, 137; "A Priest of the Lord" in Stories and Verses, by Mary Stewart Durie (Toronto, 1913); "A Hero of Fifty Years Ago" (Trans. Women's Canadian Hist. Soc., Ottawa, i, 1901); Small's Hist. of U.P. Congs., ii, 438; Tombstone).

EASTMAN, Daniel Ward, native of Goshen County, NY; educated in America; licensed by the Morris County Associated Presbytery 17 March 1801; settled at Stamford and carried on missionary itinerations throughout a wide district, organising congregations at Gainsborough, Pelham, Clinton, Louth, Vienna, and Grimsby. Joined the Church of Scotland 1840. Joined the Free Church 1844; died 4 August 1865. (Cregg's Hist., 185-89; Canadian Presbyterian 8 November 1878,

21 March 1879; Tombstone at Gainsborough). p. 632

EASTON, Robert, native of Ecclefechan; educated at University of Edinburgh and Associated (Burgher) Hall 1793; ordained to Morpeth 2 August 1798; resigned 1802; emigrated to Canada and became minister of St Gabriel Street Church, Montreal 1804-07; first minister of St Peter Street Church there 8 August 1807; demitted 1824; died May 1831. (Campbell's Hist. of St Gabriel Street Church, 176-82; Gregg's Hist., 163). p. 632

EDMISON, Henry born 1839 Canada; educated Queen's College, Canada 1860-65; ordained to Nelson and Waterdown 18 October 1866; transferred to Melbourne, Canada 26 May 1873; afterwards at Richmond, Quebec and Rothesay, Ontario where he laboured for 25 years; retired and went to Brandon, Manitoba; died at

Transcona, Manitoba 1 April 1924. p. 632

ESSON, Henry born 1793 Balnacraig, Aboyne, son of Robert, farmer; ordained 15 May 1818 at St Gabriel Street Church, Montreal. Joined the Free Church 1844; Professor of Literature and Philosophy, Knox College, Toronto 1844-53; died 11 May 1853. He was an accomplished scholar and metaphysician. Publication - Sermons to St Andrews Society (Montreal, 1835). Editor of the Canadian Miscellany. (Campbell's Hist. of St Gabriel Street Church, 276-96; Gregg's

Hist., 164-66. p. 632-33

EVANS, David, native of Ireland; ordained 1815; minister at St Therese 1823-41; at Richmond 1841-52; at Kitley 1852-62; demitted July 1862; died at Prescott 9 August 1864, aged 74. p. 633

EVANS, Joseph, native of Canada; educated at Queen's College 1852-57; ordained at Oxford 3 November 1858; transferred to Litchfield 1861; transferred

to Sherbrooke 27 October 1864. p. 633

FAIRBAIRN, John (of Vol. II, 20), minister at Ramsay 1833-42; returned to Scotland and admitted to West Greenlaw Chapel, Berwickshire 9 July 1842. p. 633

FAIRLIE, John, assistant at Dunbarton; formerly ordained missionary; admitted to L'Orignal and Hawkesbury 24 February 1874, and served in other congregations; retired 1900; died at Kingston 1920. p. 633

FERGUSON, George D., native of Canada; educated at Queen's College, Kingston 1848-51, University of Edinburgh, and Halle, Germany; ordained to Three Rivers 16 May 1855; transferred to L'Orignal September 1860; was the oldest minister of the Presbyterian Church in Canada in 1925, then aged 97. p. 633

FERGUSON, John, native of Canada; ordained to Kincardine, Presbytery of Guelph 22 April 1868; demitted 24 January 1871; admitted to Osprey and Dunedin

15 May 1872. p. 633

FERGUSON, Peter, native of Bridge of Teith; 1830 to Canada; ordained to West Williamsburg April 1831; admitted to Esquesing 11 April 1832. Joined the Church of Scotland 1834; died 1863. p. 633

FERGUSON, William, son of John, Aberdeen; educated at Marischal College 1817-21; appointed catechist in Canada by Colonial Committee; afterwards Inspector of Schools, Co. Dundas. Publication - The Layman's Preservative

against Popery (Aberdeen, 1831). p. 633

FINDLATER, Andrew born 1810 Aberdour, Aberdeenshire, son of Andrew; educated at Aberdeen 1832; appointed by Colonial Committee for missionary work in Canada, but returned home; engaged in teaching and headmaster of Gordon's Hospital, Aberdeen 1842-49; died at Edinburgh 1 January 1885. He married a daughter (died 1879) of Thomas BARCLAY, sheriff-clerk of Fife. Publications - Editor of Chamber's Encyclopoedia, Information for the People (1957), Etymological Dictionary, Miscellanies, and numerous educational manuals. (Dict. Nat. Biog.). p. 633

FINLAY, William (cf Vol. IV, 327), appointed by Colonial Committee and ordained to Sarnia 1841; returned to Scotland and admitted to Third Charge,

Stirling 18 January 1844. p. 633

FLETCHER, Alexander born 1791 Skye; went to Pictou, Nova Scotia 1816 but dissatisfied with the condition of Church affairs removed to Canada where he engaged in teaching in the county of Glengarry; ordained to Martintown October 1819; minister at Williamstown 1822-24; died at Plantagenet 1836. p. 633

FORBES, Alexander born about 1821 Old Machar, son of Alexander; appointed by Colonial Committee as a missionary in New Brunswick 1854; minister of St John's Church, Dalhousie, New Brunswick 1855-58; minister at Inverness, Ontario 1859;

retired and was resident in Ontario 1875. p. 633-34

FORREST, Robert, native of Dunbar; ordained to Saltcoats 27 February 1798; demitted 29 April 1802 and joined a group of ministers sailing for America under the leadership of John MASON, D.D., New York; went to Montreal and officiated for a time in St Gabriel Street Church; admitted to Pearl Street congregation, New York 26 April 1804; minister at Stamford, Delaware 1810-43; died 17 March 1846, aged 78. Publication - A Testimony to the Doctrines of Original Sin and the Atonement. (Small's Hist. of U.P. Congs., ii, 309). p. 634

FRASER, Donald, native of Canada; licensed by Presbytery of Glengarry 26

FRASER, Joshua, native of USA; educated at Queen's College, Kingston 1855-62; admitted minister of St Matthew's, Montreal 22 September 1865; transferred

Joined the Free Church 1844; appointed Principal of Toronto Academy and Professor of Classics, Knox College 1846; Moderator of Synod 1853; died at Logie, Hamilton 6 April 1854, a man of great scholarly attainments. Nova Scotia, A Retrospect
Terrence M. Punch, CG(C), author of <u>Genealogical Research in Nova Scotia</u>

There is no one like the native of a place to take it for granted that "everyone knows" where one's province or state is located, how big it is and all sorts of other "perfectly obvious" things. The trouble is that "everyone" doesn't know, and thereby hangs my excuse for this little article.

Visualize a map of our continent of North America, then consider the east coast. Nearly everyone knows the shape of Florida which makes almost a handle on the south-east corner of the United States. The next major distinct political jurisdiction to stick out of the east coast is the peninsula and island which make up the Canadian province of Nova Scotia. If the reader is still dubious, he/she could look at the map on the cover of Lost in Canada? and discover the mainland peninsula with the adjacent island of Cape Breton which together comprise Canada's second smallest province.

The province contains about 900,000 inhabitants within an area of 21,100 square miles. Geographically it is located on the forty-fifth parallel of latitude, making it halfway between the Equator and the North Pole. Our climate reflects this fact, and the influence of the ocean which is never more than an hour's drive from any point in the province. Fruit, hay, trees and a good variety of vegetables grow here, and unless some children grow adventurous in January, we do not have igloos. In fact, we are very much simply the northerly extension of New England.

European settlement began in earnest in the early seventeenth century when the French arrived in the Bay of Fundy area. The Bay separates Nova Scotia from its neighbour, New Brunswick. The French established a colony known as Acadie or Acadia, and it comprised not just the modern Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, but Prince Edward Island, much of Maine and the near part of Québec province. It was a relatively large area inhabited by a fairly scattered population of Acadian French when, in 1713, the Treaty of Utrecht awarded "mainland Acadia" to Great Britain.

France retained the insular portion of Acadia (Prince Edward Island and Cape Breton Island, known respectively as Ile-St.-Jean and Ile-Royale) and attempted to rebuild its control of the area through the erection of the stronghold and town of Louisbourg on Ile-Royale. The area we know as New Brunswick was bickered over by France and Britain for forty years until the 1750s.

The British did not bring settlers to Nova Scotia or "New Scotland", whose name resulted from a short-lived attempt by King James VI and I to have a Scots settlement established in the territory in the 1620s. It was only after they had captured Louisbourg in 1745 and had to give it back to France in 1748 that the British appreciated that the presence of an English-speaking population in the area might be to her advantage. In 1749, therefore, Halifax was founded, the first permanent town in mainland Canada to be settled from England, unless one counts a few northern trading stations of the Hudson's Bay Company in the north.

The 1750s were years of showdown in Acadia, as the British brought "foreign Protestants" from the Rhineland and elsewhere to bolster their attempts to retain the region. When war was imminent, the British renewed their demands (made sporadically since 1713) that the Acadian French swear unconditional allegiance to the British Crown. Though the Acadian farmers were willing to pledge benevolent neutrality they were not about to take an oath that not only might oblige them to fight their former sovereign, but might prove dangerous for the oath-takers should France win the war and take the area back. After all, Acadians had seen the region change hands half a dozen times before 1713 and had no way of knowing in 1755 who might win the impending conflict.

When a British force captured Beauséjour, a French fort just across the border where New Brunswick now joins Nova Scotia, a few hundred Acadian men were found with arms inside. That these farmers had been forced there by threats and that they seem to have done little to resist the British attack were considerations not to be taken. The francophobe governor of Nova Scotia, Col. Charles Lawrence, decided to bring the Acadian question to its determination and demanded that Acadian delegates take the full oath of allegiance in the name of all their people. When the delegates did not comply, Lawrence put into effect the deportation of the French Acadians from the region. From 1755 until the end of the Seven Years War groups of Acadians were rounded up and exiled. This expulsion proved a watershed event in determining the future population of the province, as the French in Louisbourg were vanquished in 1758 and the entire area became British territory in 1763.

From 1759 until 1775 thousands of New Englanders flocked into Nova Scotia, encouraged by promises of land grants and by the pressure of overpopulation in the more desirable parts of their own colonies. In 1773 th "Hector" brought the first party of highland Scots who, in the next century, would give substance to the name Nova Scotia. Several shiploads of Yorkshire settlers also reached the province on the eve of the Revolutionary War.

For complex reasons involving the British naval strength, the poor internal communication in the province, the distractions of a religious revival and so forth, the New Englanders here were known as "the neutral Yankees" during the American Revolutionary War. It was not so much that the New England Planters were not sympathetic to their fellows at home so much as that they, like the Acadians before them, considered neutrality the safest course when two powerful adversaries were contesting supremacy of this part of the world.

The end of the War of Independence brought tens of thousands of Loyalists to Nova Scotia from all over the Thirteen Colonies, but most particularly from New England, New York and Carolina. The present province of New Brunswick was established in 1784 as a Loyalist colony, and for a short time (1784-1820) Cape Breton Island enjoyed a similar status. In addition to others, several thousand Loyalists were black and help to account for the fact that Nova Scotia has the highest percentage of blacks of any Canadian province. Another group which came after 1783 were some hundreds of former "Hessians" who decided to strike roots in the province.

Irish from Newfoundland began arriving in numbers during the 1790s and between 1815 and 1845 they, together with Scots from the Highlands, were the major settlers of Nova Scotia. In the broadest of terms Nova Scotia can be divided into three parts. One third, concentrated on the western mainland, are

"Americans", either as Loyalists or Planters from the eighteenth century. A second third, concentrated in Cape Breton and on the eastern mainland, are Scots. The remainder, located in the central mainland but with enclaves elsewhere, are the others: Irish, English, Acadian, German, Swiss, Montbéliard and Afro-Nova Scotians.

In the nineteenth century, Nova Scotia had a period of growth at mid-century and for a time an economy based on the sea gave a good living to most inhabitants. Towards the end of a time of maritime prosperity, Nova Scotia became one of the four founding provinces of the new Dominion of Canada (1867). A worldwide recession and depression, the decline in wooden sailing ships in the face of steam competition, and the replacement of the sea by the continent as the focus of the economy of the future, combined to turn Nova Scotia from a host to an exporter of population. So many people from this region emigrated south and west into the United States and other regions of Canada that today there are as many as four million North Americans living outside this province who have ancestral connections to this relatively small region.

As a basic overview of what sorts of records exist for research into Nova Scotian ancestry, here is a list of the dozen major types together with an indication of the years during which each usually exists.

More about The King's Daughters

A book reviewer, writing about *The King's Daughters*, stated, "Women have been added who did not appear in the earlier edition, while others were found not to be King's Daughters." The earlier edition refers to the stories that ran in series in *Lost in Canada?* Actually, women were also added and deleted from the list published in *Les filles du roi en Nouvelle-France*.

The following article is about some of those women and the rationale for omitting them from my book, as well as some corrections. Additions to the list of books suggested for further reading are also made.

<u>Catherine-Marguerite Delamare</u>. Dumas found no marriage contract nor church record of her marriage to Jean-Francois Billy (DeBilly) about the year 1670 somewhere in the area of Gentilly.⁵

Jetté stated that Catherine-Marguerite (de) Lamarche married about 1671 at

Sommereux, Diocese of Beauvais, in Picardy, France, 6

Archange Godbout, the great Quebec genealogist, wrote that Catherine-Marguerite De la Marche probably married about 1671 in Québec. Since Jetté cited Godbout as a source, I cannot explain the discrepancy.⁷

Benjamin Sulte wrote about the Billy family and stated the couple probably

married in France.8

More recently, Jacques Saintonge wrote, "The majority of genealogists agree with Benjamin Sulte who said that it was in the mother country, more precisely at Sommereux, that Jean-Francois de Billy married a childhood friend, Catherine-Marguerite de la Marche, at the end of 1671 or in the beginning of 1672."

With such strong statements, by such emminent genealogists, that the couple married in France, and given the lack of a discovered marriage record in Quebec, I doubt that she was a King's Daughter.

Madeleine <u>Dutault</u>. Dumas said that she married Nicolas Leblanc dit Labrie in November 1664 near Trois-Rivières and cited their marriage contract, but did not

quote from it. 10

Jetté cited a marriage contract on 2 November 1664 in front of the notary LaTouche at Cap-de-la-Madeleine. However, her father, Pierre Duteau, had a second wife, Jeanne Perrin, whom he married about 1638 at LaRochelle, France. Madeleine was born the 5th and baptised the 13th of July, 1649 at the Calvinist Temple in LaRochelle. Her mother signed on as an engageé at LaRochelle 16 April 1658 to go to Canada where she was to work as a servant for Jacques Leneuf at Trois-Rivières. She took Madeleine with her "with the authorization of her husband." Another daughter, Marie, was 18 years old and signed on for herself, as did a 16-year old son, Charles. 12

Since Madeleine came with her mother from France as a young girl of eight years, she cannot be considered a daughter of the king. The father did not die until December 12th of that year, which raises the question of why he sent his wife and children off to a strange country. Perhaps he knew he was dying and wanted his family to take this opportunity to better their lives. Saintonge has

a few other observations on this situation. 13

Elisabeth Languille. Dumas says she was born at LaRochelle and married René Lanceleur about 1668 near Montreal. 14

Jetté speculates that they married about 1669 at LeLude. Elisabeth was born 22 July 1645 at LeLude, LaFlèche, Diocese of Angers in Anjou. Their first child, René, was baptised 7 February 1670 at Montreal. 15

Godbout did not reach a conclusion as to the place of this couple's marriage. He does state that the Lanceleur name is unknown in LaRochelle and he

has no listing for the Languille family in this work. 16

I chose to leave her out, but I could just as well have included her. There certainly were other women included with less substantial evidence to show that they were King's Daughters.

<u>Isabelle Martin</u>. According to Dumas, she married Jean Auzou about 1667 near Trois-Rivières.¹⁷

Jetté states they married about 1667 in France. Their eldest known child, Pierre, was born about 1668 and was 13 years old in the census of 1681 and was

confirmed in June of 1681 at Lachine. There is a mis-print in Jetté regarding the second child, Madeleine, stating that she married Antoine Fournier in 1696. That was actually her second marriage. Her first was to René-Antoine Lafaye in 1690 as his second wife. Second wife Jetté's usual practice in listing children of a family group is to show only the first marriage.

I doubt that Isabelle was a King's Daughter, but, as with Elisabeth

Larguille, she possibly was.

Jeanne Tavanelle. Dumas states she married Jacques DeLaBarre about 1672 near Berthier.²⁰

Jetté shows a marriage of Jacques Genest dit Labarre, a soldier with the Carignan Regiment, about 1670 on the Ile d'Orleans to Catherine Doribeau or Doribelle.21 This listing is the only possible one for this woman that I could find in Jetté, and I doubt that Catherine is the same person as Jeanne Tavanelle. Catherine Doribeau is probably a King's Daughter and I included her in the chapter about women of unknown origins.22

Tanguay shows this couple with no specific marriage information, and a daughter, Catherine, born 1675.²³ Apparently he created this family group

solely from the 1681 census returns of Louiseville.

Lafontaine shows the census listing and has a footnote stating that this is instead Harin Harest dit Labarro, husband of Harie Deschamps, and that Tanguay and Dumas made an error based on this census return. This is Jeanne Trudel alias Tavanelle, the wife of Jean DeCerlaise.²⁴ Ho also cited Trudel in Genélogie de la famille Trudel.²⁵

Unfortunately, every publication of the 1681 census uses the same source. Whether it be Sulte in Histoire des canadiens français 1608-168026 or Le Répertoire des actes de baptême, mariage, sépulture et des recensements du Québec ancien27 the source used is a copy of the 1681 census, housed at the National Archives of Canada and available on microfilm. The original is in France and I have not been able to locate a microfilmed copy. The transcript at

NAC is all in a very neat hand with families neatly separated. 28 I have questioned the accuracy of this transcript when doing research on other famililes.

Madeleine Varenne. Dumas states that she married Claude Caron, probably near

Trois-Rivières, but does not suggest a year.29

Jetté says that she married about 1670 at St-Jean d'Aubrigoux, LePuy, Diocese of Clermont in Auvergne, and she was probably the daughter of Claude Varennes who died in April of 1672 at Laprairie. He was from St-Jean d'Aubrigoux.30

If she came to Quebec with her father, she was not a King's Daughter.

There was a story in Elmer's manuscript about Jean Durand and his wife, Catherine Amenontha, a Canadian Indian.31 I could find no connection between Jean Durand and any daughter of the king, and deleted the entire tale. Apparently Elmar read a statement in Jean Durand et Sa Posterite32 that Durand contracted marriage on 3 October 1661 with Marie Fayette, "a fille du Roi who had arrived the same year." This marriage was later annulled and he married Anenontha. Marie then made and annulled a marriage contract with Charles Pouliot, and finally married Nicolas Huot 26 July 1662.33

All evidence shows that the first contingent of women who received a dowry from the King of France arrived in the spring of 1663. Thus, Marie Fayette was not one of those women. I discovered this in checking the final version of my manuscript, and although I deleted the story, I forgot to delete the name of Marie Fayette as having been written about in an earlier chapter.34

Since The King's Daughters was published, two more volumes of Our French-Canadian Ancestors have appeared. You may wish to add the following information to the entries in your copy.

Anne Renault and Jean Laspron dit Lacharite.35 Marie Fayette should not appear in the list of other women from Ile-de-France. There is no biographical sketch about her. 36

This 320-page book describes two brothers, Angus and Donald Campbell, who emigrated with their 19 children from Scotland to the Gaspe peninsula of Quebec in 1831. Although many of their children remained in Quebec, many descendants moved to Ontario and the United States.

All 3,529 descendants are indexed and the book describes many personal anecdotes and nicknames. There are 56 photographs of old deeds, landmarks and ancestors, including pictures of several people born in Scotland in the early 1800s. Brief histories of Black Cape and the Gaspe peninsula are included. Allied names: CALDER, HUGHES, JAMIESON, KERR, LANGWILL, LINN, MacKENZIE, MARTIN, McCOLM, MURPHY, POWELL, WOODMAN.

Our French Canadian Ancestors, Thomas J. Laforest. (Palm Harbor, FL: LISI Press, 1989). Soft cover, 6" x 9", xi + 280 pp., no pricing information included (earlier volumes were \$14.00). Order from LISI Press, Box 1063, Palm Harbor, FL 34682-1063. Volume VIII in a series; this one authored by Jacques Saintonge. The first chapter is a very interesting account of slavery in New France, something many writers ignore. Biographical sketches are of Nicolas Baron dit Lupien, Paul Bertrand dit Saint-Arnaud, Gervais and Florent Bisson, Jean Bourasseau, Laurent Brunsard dit Langevin, Noël Carpentier dit Larose, the Acadian Pierre Comeau, Jean-Francois de Billy, René de Cotret, Guillien Dubord dit Lafontaine, Etienne and Jean Gelineau (Gélinas), Pierre Hudon dit Beaulieu, Pierre Lamy, Louis Lefebvre dit LaGroye, Jean Laspron dit Lacharité, Jean and Pierre Levasseur, Raymond Pagé de Quercy, Jean Riquart (Ricard), Pierre and Jean Toupin, and Jean Trudel. The series of name variations continues with surnames beginning with E and F. The sketches are interesting and sometimes speculative. I did note, in the story about Nicolas Baron dit Lupien, there was no baptism noted for the "son" Joseph dit Lupien et Lafrenière. Joseph was the illegitimate son of Baron's widow, Marie-Marthe Chauvin and Andre Ethier, and was baptised 3 May 1701 at Pointe-aux-Trembles, Montreal (see Jette, pp. 51-52).

St. Armand Methodist Church Records 1831-1836, Pamela Wood Waugh. Volume 1, 1988. Soft cover, 8 1/2" x 11 1/2", 25 pp., \$8.50 from the author at 730 Dunhill Drive, Orlando, FL 32825. Records of St. Armand, Missisquoi County, Quebec, abstracted from Archives Nationales du Quebec microfilm 124.11. Caldwell Manor and Christie Manor Anglican Records 1815-1825, Pamela Wood Waugh and Shirley Dean Wood. Volume 1, 1989. Soft cover, 8 1/2" x 11 1/2", 44 pp., \$12.95 from the author, as above. Extracted from ANQ microfilm 128.42. The extracts are arranged in chronological order and an index is provided. This arrangement is much better than if entries were placed in alphabetical order. The author plans to continue extracting records of Protestant churches and notaries who served the Anglo population in this area of Quebec. We must applaud and encourage her efforts.

Across The Border. Diana Hibbert Bailey, editor. Vol. I, No. 1 (n.d.) and Vol. I, No. 3 (Spring 1989) were submitted for review. 8 1/2" x 11", paper cover, staple binding. The cover inscription reads, "For all family history researchers interested in the northern Vermont counties of Essex, Lamoille, Chittenden, Caledonia, Grand Isle, Franklin, Washington, and Orleans and the Eastern Townships of Quebec." Quarterly for \$14 (U.S.) or \$16 (Canadian) from the editor at 149 Sarah Street, Carleton Place, Ontario K7C 2Y8. The first issue (40 pp.) includes a list of heads of families and number of persons found in Potton Township, Stanstead Co. (now Brome Co.) and Sutton Township, Bedford Co. (now Brome Co.) in the 1825 census; heads of families in the 1860 census of Barton, Orleans Co., Vermont with age, occupation and birthplace; extracts of Vermont-related persons in (Protestant) church records at the Brome County Historical Society Archives, Knowlton, Quebec; declarations of aliens in Lower Canada 1794-1811; Calvinist Baptist Church marriage records, Barnston, Quebec; various family records; queries and index. Issue number 3 continues the articles in the first issue. It is encouraging to see another person contributing genealogical information for this often difficult area of research. There are miscellaneous Campbell-related notices, and articles such as: Emigration from Argyll; Mary, Queen of Scots, in Argyll; Duncan Campbell of Inverawe 1702-1758, subject of the Ticonderoga ghost story; Lord Campbell, judge & statesman; Westward the tide, the Woodlawn Campbells of Dallas County, Alabama; Across the wide Hissouri, William Campbell (1793-1885) wagen train & California pioneer.

Indexes to Ontario Census Records, Norman Kennoth Crowder. (Napsan, Ontario: Crowder Enterprises, 1985). Paper cover, 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", 36 pp., \$5.

Indexes to Ontario Census Records: 1988 Supplement, Norman Kenneth Crowder. (Nepsan: Crowder Enterprises, 1988). Same size, 48 pp. + 10 pp. insert to be used with the 1985 edition, \$8 postpaid in the same currency as the country of address. Order from N.K. Crowder, 22 Canter Boulevard, Nepsan, Ontario K2G 2M2. Many published census indexes for Ontario exist in society newsletters and special publications. Finding which are published, by whom, and how to order, can be tricky. Mr. Crowder has neatly assembled a chart by municipality with a corresponding list, in order to assist researchers to find these indexes. As the OGS continues to publish indexes to the 1871 returns of Ontario, this will need periodic updates. This is a very helpful tool and should be in every genealogical library.

The Genie, Ark-La-Tex Genealogical Association, Inc. 8 1/2" x 11", paper cover, staple binding, quarterly, \$12.50 membership from the Association at Eox 4462, Shreveport, LA 71134. Vol. 23, No. 2 (2nd quarter, 1989), pp. 65-128 + ix. This issue contains Bossier Parish, Louisiana marriages from Book C, 1867-1875; 1867 marriages and obituaries from Ney Orleans Christian Advocate; Civil War Muster Roll of the Natchitoches Rebels; Civil War Records of Concordia Parish, Louisiana; Greenwood Cemetery and Blanchard Cemetery, Rural Caddo Parish; DeSoto Parish marriage index 1843-1912; civil suit court records in Union Parish; notices, queries, book reviews and surname index.

The following books are available from Genealogical Publishing Co. Inc., (GPC) 1000 North Calvert Street, Baltimore, MD 21202-3897. Shipping is \$2.50 for the first book, \$1.00 each additional book. Orders totalling \$10.00 or less, allow \$1.25 for one book. Maryland residents add 5% sales tax; Nichtgan residents add 4% sales tax.

Founders and Patriots of America Index, National Society of Daughters of Founders and Patriots of America. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989). Hard cover, 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", 255 pp., \$22.50. This is a reprint of the 1975 edition. It is a compilation of Founders and Patriots listed in the volumes of lineages of the members. Publication of the lineages was begun in 1909. In each lineage is a Founder who arrived in one of the Colonies between May 13, 1607 and May 13,

1687, and a Patriot ancestor who gave service or aid during the American Revolutionary war between 1775 and 1784. This Index gives date of birth and death of each Founder and each Patriot, his date of marriage and name of wife, as well as the state where the Founder settled. If you have tracked back to any of these member's lines, you will easily be able to find the volume where the lineage is published. As with any hereditary society, rules for proving descent varies from time to time. Some lines will be well-documented, while others may consist of unsubstantiated statements. Whatever the case, the Index will be of help.

A List of Emigrants From England to America 1682-1692: transcribed from the original records at the City of London Record Office, Michael Ghirelli, transcriber. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989). Hard cover, 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", xiv + 106 pp., \$15.00. Originally published in 1968, this is a reprint edition. There is an introduction by Marion Kaminkow explaining the nature of the original material from while this book was compiled. During the period of years covered, anyone wishing to emigrate to the colonies in America and the West Indies as indentured servants had to be registered. This was done to prevent "spiriting," a practice whereby unsuspecting persons were transported against their will. The names are registered in many volumes known as the Lord Mayor's Waiting Books which are kept in the Record Office of the City of London. A sample entry (p. 2) is "ANBIER or AUBIER, BARON BANCE, REYNAULT, (Henry, Elizabeth, Fancois (sic) and Marie). VIELLET, FLEURIOTT (Jean and Louise). 'These eleven persons are French Protestants and were bound at the request of Mr. Jean du Mastre and Mrs. Stephen Noguier (or Nognier), deacons of the French Church in London'. 14/353" followed by "ANBIER or AUBIER, Moyse or Meyse. A Frenchman of London, mason. Bound to Harmaduke Larkin for 4 years in Jamaica. Aug. 3, 1685. See above. 14/353" The figures refer to volume and page number in the Waiting Books. Although there is an index of agents (and places) there is no index to the occasional names such as Mrs. Stephen Noguier. Entries are arranged alphabetically by surname and contain the parentage, place of origin and age. This is a valuable reference tool for those researching ancestors in the Colonies.

A List of Emigrants From England to America 1718-1759: transcribed from microfilms of the original records at the Guildhall, London, Jack and Marion Kaminkow. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989). 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", xxv1i + 292 pp., \$20.00. This is a reprint from a work originally published in 1964. As explained in the introduction to the above books, it is apparent that registration of indentured servants ceased in 1692 and the practice was begun again in 1718. The Kaminkow's explain how the system worked and how the records were kept. They state that not all of the emigrants were from London even though they entered into indenture in that city. They were from all over the British Isles. Entries include the person's name, parish and county, occupation, agent, years of service, colony to which he was bound, age, whether signed or marked, date of indenture and page number. Entries are alphabetical by surname with an index of places. Again, a welcome source for those with colonial ancestry.

The English Ancestry and Homes of the Pilgrim Fathers: who came to Plymouth on the "Mayflower" in 1620, the "Fortune" in 1621, and the "Anne" and the "Little James" in 1623, Charles Edward Banks. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989). Hard cover, 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", 187 pp., indexed, \$15.00. Originally published in New York 1929. Although Banks did not document all of his statements, this work remains a fairly standard source. There are three pages of "Additions and Corrections" by

Robert S. Wakefield and Ruth Wilder Sherman, C.A.L.S., lending credibility to the book as a reference tool. This section was added to the 1976 edition. For example, John Billington is written about on page 31, and Sherman notes on p. 181 that additional information can be found in the Register of the New England Historic Genealogical Society (April 1970). Since the 1976 edition, Wakefield wrote in the Fall 1982 issue of The Genealogist, "Some descendants of Francis Billington of the Mayflower." A researcher would also want to further substantiate a line with Stratton's more recent work on the Plymouth Colony. GPC is to be commended for making standard works available for the individual researcher.

The Winthrop Fleet of 1630: an Account of the Vessels, the Voyage, the Passengers and their English Homes from Original Authorities, Charles Edward Banks. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989). Hard cover, 5 1/2" x 3 1/2", ix x 119 pp., indexed, \$13.50. Originally published in Boston 1930. The background information and account of the voyage is well-documented. Appendices have an alphabetical list of passengers as well as the passengers on the Mary and John and the Lyon. There is an index of other names, places and subjects. A sample entry (p. 82): "Morton, Mary. She may have come from Colchester and was a servant of Mrs. Downing in 1629 (L.&L.W., 291). Probably the 'Mary M' one of the servants of Winthrop mentioned in letter to his wife 2 March 1628/30 (1bid.). Church member No. 86." There is a map of English counties showing the number of passengers from each who sailed in the Winthrop fleet, and a chart of the course of the Arabella. Caution may be needed—the above Mrs. Downing appears in the index as "Mrs. Lucy Downing."

The Norman People and their existing descendants in the British Dominions and the United States of America, n.a. Hard cover, 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", xvi ÷ 484 pp., indexed, \$30.00. Originally published in London 1874. The anonymous author presents an argument showing that the Normans existed in greater numbers in England than was previously thought. There is alphabetical list of surnames with statements purporting to show their origin. If I were searching any of these families, I would be very careful to not be led astray with this material. If used with appropriate suspicion there can be value in this work.

Beginning Your Family History in Great Britain, George Pelling. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989). Soft cover, 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", 64 pp., \$7.50. Originally published in 1980, this fourth edition has been extensively revised and updated by the author. Obviously this little guide is not going to cover everything you need to know about genealogical research in Great Britain, but it certainly is an informative outline of records creation. It would be essential to a beginner, and indeed it is the standard introductory work for members of the Federation of Family History Societies in Great Britain.

The A-Z Guide to Tracing Ancestors in Britain, F.C. Markwell & Pauline Saul. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989). Soft cover, 224 pp., \$14.95. Originally published by the Federation of Family History Societies in 1985, this third edition is extensively revised and updated. It is a glossary of terms relating to genealogical research in Britain and answers your questions about terms unique to research there. Under "International Genealogical Index (IGI)" (p. 97-99) there is a good explanation of how to best use this tool for British research, pointing out pitfalls with the 1981 edition and updated to include comments on the 1988 edition of the IGI. Appendices list the record groups held at the PRO at Kew and at Chancery Lane; a list of leaflets in the PRO 'Information' Series

available from the PRO; units of the British Army with their dates of formation; maps showing the counties of England, Wales, Scotland, and Northern Ireland before and after 1974. The title is a little misleading, but I found this to be a most helpful reference work.

Index to the Prerogative Wills of Ireland 1536-1810, Sir Arthur Vicars, F.S.A., ed. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989). Hard cover, 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", ix + 512 pp., \$30.00. Originally published in Dublin 1897. Prior to the Dublin courthouse fire in 1922, Sir William Betham made abstracts of the genealogical data found in the wills. He then drew up 39 volumes of "will pedigrees," drawn up as genealogical charts, which he called his "genealogical analysis" of the abstracts. Vicars prepared an index to these charts. Since the original wills were all destroyed some years later, the abstracts are all that remain. This Index contains 40,000 entries, alphabetically arranged by name and showing rank, occupation or condition, town and county of residence, and the year in which the estate was probated. There is an index to alliances and aliases, and a table showing the relation between the counties and dioceses of Ireland. This is helpful since wills were of two classes—Prerogative and Diocesan. The system is well explained in the preface.

A Topographical Dictionary of Scotland comprising the several counties, islands, cities, burgh and market towns, parishes, and principal villages with historical and statistical descriptions: embellished with engravings of the seals and arms of the different burghs and universities, Samuel Lewis. 2 volumes. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989). Hard cover, 6" x 9", 611 + 622 pp., \$75.00. Originally published 1846 and updated in 1851. This is a description of all Scottish localities as they existed in 1851, showing exactly where a village was located in relation to its parish or to the nearest town, where a parish was located in relation to its nearest district and the names of the villages situated within it, the number of inhabitants of a locality, principal landowners, and the chief topographical features. I cannot imagine trying to undertake genealogical research in Scotland without consulting this dictionary. Entries range from brief paragraphs to very detailed descriptions. When looking for Shotts in Lanarkshire I found cross-reference to Bertram-Shotts. Civil registration of vital records began in 1855 and at that time all the old parish registers were called in. The Family History Library in Salt Lake City has microfilms of nearly all of the pre-1855 records. If all you knew of a location was "Shotts" you would need this dictionary to identify the county before you could find the records you wanted to read. This is an essential tool for any reference library.

Ohio Valley Genealogies: relating chiefly to families in Harrison, Belmont and Jefferson Counties, Ohio, and Washington, Westmoreland, and Fayette Counties, Pennsylvania, Charles A. Hanna. (Baltimore: GPC, 1989). Hard cover, 5 1/2" x 8 1/2", xliv + 128 pp., \$17.50. Originally published in New York 1900. There are genealogies of about 350 families who settled in Pennsylvania between the Blue Ridge Mountains and the Alleghenies, and genealogies of those families who migrated across the Ohio River and made the first settlements in the Northwest Territory. Entries are arranged alphabetically by name of the head of family (usually the father) and give vital information such as birth, marriage and death information. There is no index to other surnames appearing in the entries and there is no documentation to show where Hanna obtained the information. Although this is a fairly standard source, I would advise readers to use it with caution.

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
