LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

Where has time gone since the October issue was published? Unbelievable that we are approaching Christmas and a new year of publication. I thank those of you who renewed promptly; it makes it much easier for me. An attempt will be made to place this issue in the mail December 31 in order to use this year's bulk permit. That will give me until April to try to obtain a 'Library Rate' or 'Book Rate', as so many similar publications have. You may have noticed that the mailing date has been stamped in the lower left corner of your envelope. This was done in self protection to let you know that I mailed on time--it just wasn't delivered very promptly. I know that each LETTER from me seems to contain comments on the Postal Service, but I am totally dependant on them and helpless to do anything about the problems. I will refrain from the vitriolic comments I read recently, made by another publisher (not of genealogy), but I do offer my thoughts that the Pony Express was set up with an obligation to the citizens of our country, and I reflect that we can send men to the moon and back but cannot send a letter to the next town within a week. Third class mail, such as LOST IN CANADA? seems to be treated with little sense of obligation, even though this is solicited material that has been paid for by subscription, and not 'junk mail'. These points are brought to you so that you might have a better understanding when your magazine is very late. And I must give another reminder that if you are moving, please notify me at once, preferably by your letter as the cards supplied by the Postal Service take a very long time to reach me. The average extra cost to me (which I must pass on to you) when the address in incorrect, is \$1, but it can vary. Third class mail is not forwardable.

Again, Paul Lareau has worked very hard searching for marriages in Quebec to answer queries, and has had a great deal of success. If your line is printed, remember that ** following the parents names means that their marriage and ascending line will be found in Tanguay or Drouin. I have nearly completed extracting the marriages from the microfilms of the registers of St-Benoit, co. Deux-Montagnes 1799-1850; Ste-Scholastique, co. Deux-Montagnes 1825-1850; St-Eustache de la Riviere du Chene, co. Deux-Montagnes 1769-1850; Ste-Anne des Plaines, co. Terrebonne 1788-1850; and St-Andre d'Argenteuil 1833-1850. These will be published either in book form, or installments in LOST IN CANADA? I really would appreciate hearing your opinions about this (or any other type of material published in the magazine) and if enough are heard from it will influence the decision.

THE KING'S DAUGHTERS (Fourth of a series)

Except for approximately 80 filles du roi, the origin of all the known daughters of the king, or king's girls, is known, and 52-plus percent of these women came from just two provinces of France, the Ile-de-France and Normandy.

In today's France which has been divided into regions called departments since the Revolution, these provinces no longer exist, but an examination of a pre-revolutionary French map, plus a knowledge of the history of the period, will show why the largest number of filles du roi were from those two areas.

We have already examined some economic reasons of the period which were of great importance, but this doesn't explain why larger numbers of women from other provinces weren't among this group.

Our American society can provide one reason, and any church member with a strong missionary society could explain another. A third big reason was simply communication. It is highly unlikely that vast numbers of the peasants of the interior of France were even aware of New France. They were too busy with a daily struggle for existance. We discovered an example of this during World War II while traveling in India, a country of 800 million people. The vast majority of these people had never heard of the United States, already the world's most dominant country.

In our own society, it is the country area that is most likely to take care of its own in one form or another. The family remains strong. The more unsettled portions of the country population, including many of the more ambitious, drift to the cities. It is in the cities that the first and largest institutions of public aid, such as orphanages, are organized.

In the France of that age, these institutions were staffed by priests, brothers and sisters of Catholic Orders. And it would be these priests, brothers and sisters who would be the first to read and disseminate the famous mission reports from New France, the Jesuit Relations, and their constant appeal for manpower and financial aid to help Christianize the heathen Indians. These compelling stories would certainly have influenced the young charges with even more force than Sunday School mission stories in America today because there would have been little as colorful in the France of our ancestors to compete with these stories of adventure from a strange, exotic new world.

The Normans, of course, were a majority of the first settlers of New France. This province located along a major French seacoast had the principal ports servicing New France. The latest and most reliable news of Canada would be the first to arrive and spread in Normandy. Normans were most likely to have relatives in New France.

Remember that at no time was there ever the vast movement of peoples to New France from France that one found between England and its 13 colonies. So even 100 or 200 persons from a province was a huge total. The filles du roi themselves were to provide some 15 percent of all the ancestors of French-Canadians in North America today.

We plan to enumerate the Norman women in a later chapter. But the largest total came from the Ile-de-France and this total was so large we have had to break it into two groups.

It was the Ile-de-France, originally named Francia, that gave France its name. Its boundary varied over the centuries but it was roughly the region circling Paris that includes the present departments of Seine-et-Marne, Paris, Val-de-Marne, Aisne, Oise, Essonne, Seine-St-Denis, portions of Nievre and Loiret, and the department of Hauts-de-Seine. It touched Normandy on the northwest. And by 987 when the count of Paris, Hugh Capet, became king of France the Ile-de-France, the fief of the count, became the French royal domain.

Marguerite COLET of St-Benoit, Paris, daughter of the deceased Eustache COLET and Marie FOURNIER, who married Jacques BISSONNET 19 Nov 1670 at Boucherville.

Francoise COUSIN of Paris, daughter of Martin COUSIN and Marie HUBERT, who married Charles GAUDREAU (GOTTREAU) 13 Oct 1665 at Charlesbourg.

Marie-Charlotte COUET (COY, COHE), of St-Nicolas, Paris, daughter of Francois COUET and Michelle OUYER, 1/m Jean BRAI (BRAIS) in 1669; 2/m Pierre BRUNION 24 April 1678 at Sorel.

Jeanne CROSNIER of St-Paul, Paris, daughter of Guillaume CROSNIER and the deceased Jeanne CHANTE, who married Francois MAGNAN 30 Sept 1669 at Ste-Famille. Her dowry of 350 pounds included 50 from the king.

Denise DAMESNI of St-Jean-en-Greve, Paris, daughter of Michel DAMESNI and Catherine TOUREAU, who married Rene HOURE (AURE), 26 Oct 1665 at Cap-de-la-Madeleine.

Claude DAMISE of St-Nicolas-du-Chardonnet, Paris, daughter Etienne DAMISE and Genevieve PIOCHE, who married Pierre PERTHUIS 10 Dec 1668 at Montreal.

Helene DAMOURS of St-Laurent, Paris, daughter of the deceased Nicolas DAMOURS and Madeleine SAISON, who 1/m Louis FOUCHE 6 Aug 1668 at Quebec; 2/m Isaac IEMIRE 5 June 1686 at Batiscan.

Gabrielle D'ANNEVILLE of St-Eustache, Paris, daughter of the deceased Brice D'ANNEVILLE and Marguerite LE ROY, who 1/m Louis BLANCHARD 27 July 1665 at Quebec; 2/m Mathieu DE LA GRANGE 12 June 1684 at Quebec; 3/m Hilaire BERNARD, sieur DE LA RIERE, 22 Sept 1712 at Beauport.

Marguerite D'AUBIGNY-DENAUX of St-Leu, Paris, daughter of the deceased Francois D'AUBIGNY and Antoinette LECOQ, married Charles DAVAUX dit LAPLANTE and D'ORVEIL-LIERS 19 Sept 1673 at Quebec.

Marie DE BEAUREGARD of St-Germain l'Aurerrois, Paris, daughter of Olivier DE BEAUREGARD and Philippe ARDOUIN, 1/m Sebastien LANGELIER (L'ANGELIER) 12 Nov 1665 at Quebec; 2/m Etienne GELINAS (GELINEAU) 12 Oct 1682 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 200 pounds for her first marriage.

Marie DE LA COUR-LA COMETE of St-Germain L'Auxerrois, Paris, daughter of the deceased Guillaume DE LA COUR and Marie BIRRA, who married Gabriel RCGER 30 Oct 1669 at Quebec. Dumas says this marriage was at Ste-Famille but registered at Quebec. Her dowry of 450 pounds included 50 from the king.

Elizabeth DE LA GUERIPIERE of St-Sulpice, Paris, daughter of the deceased Jean DE LA GUERIPIERE and Gabrielle BOUTEILLER, who married Jean DE RAINVILLE 26 Oct 1671 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 500 pounds.

Catherine DE LA HAYE of St-Victor, Paris, daughter of Pierre DE LA HAYE and Catherine POITEVAN, 1/m Pierre GINAT 18 Nov 1669 at Quebec; 2/m Etienne RAGEOT dit LIONNAIS 25 June 1685 at Quebec; 3/m Pierre CORDIER 7 Jan 1689 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 250 pounds, including 50 from the king, for her first marriage.

Jeanne DE LA HAYE of St-Sulpice, Paris, daughter of Simon DE LA HAYE and Jeanne DE COINTE, married Philippe CHAUVIN 25 Oct 1666 at Quebec.

Marie-Claire DE LA HOGUE of St-Germain, Paris, daughter of Gilles DE LA HOGUE and Marie LEBRUN, married François SEDILOT dit MONTREUIL 27 Nov 1669 at Quebec. Her dowry of 100 pounds included 50 from the king.

Charlotte DE LA MARCHE of St-Jacques-du-Hautpas, Paris, daughter of the deceased Francois DE LA MARCHE and Suzanne BOURGEOIS, who married Jacques LUSSIER (LUSSYE) 30 Sept 1669 at Quebec. Her dowry of 350 pounds included 50 from the king. See also Catherine CLERICE.

Perrine DE LA PIERRE of St-Leonard, Corbay, daughter of the deceased Pierre DE LA PIERRE and Claude LECLERC, who married Honore DANNY dit TOURANGEAU 20 March 1666 at Montreal.

Madeleine DE ROYBON of Montaigny, daughter of Jacques DE ROYBON, sieur D'ALONNE, died unmarried at Montreal 17 Jan 1715.

Anne DESCHAMPS of Paris, daughter of the deceased Charles DESCHAMPS and Jeanne D'ORCHEVILLE, married Michel BOUTET dit L'ESPINASSE 29 Oct 1669 at Quebec. Her dowry of 250 pounds included 50 from the king.

Marie DESCHAMPS of St-Medard, Paris, daughter of Claude DESCHAMPS and Jeanne BRIOLET, married Michel VERRET 13 Oct 1669 at Quebec. Her dowry of 300 pounds included 50 from the king.

Francoise DESFOSSES of Paris, daughter of the deceased Georges DESFOSSES and Marie LEDOUX, married Jacques BIDET dit DES ROUSSELETS (and DE RUSSEL, DERUSSE) 18 Oct 1669 at Ste-Famille. Her downy of 150 pounds included 50 from the king.

Francoise DESJARDINS of Notre-Dame, Vincennes, daughter of Francois DESJARDINS and Martine GODFROY, married Nicolas DE BOISSY 12 Oct 1665 at Quebec.

Catherine DESMARETS of St-Nicolas-des-Champs, Paris, daughter of the deceased Mathieu DESMARETS and Marguerite FLORIMONNE, married François LAIRET 20 Oct 1669 at Quebec. Her dowry of 250 pounds included 50 from the king.

Madeleine DESPRES of St-Sauveur, Paris, daughter of Francois DESPRES and Madeleine IE GRAND, married Nicolas AUDET dit IAPOINTE 15 Sept 1670 at Ste-Famille. Her dowry of 250 pounds included 50 from the king.

ADVENTURE IN GENEALOGY
Joseph Yott 1800-1862 and Harriet Mercier 1807-1892
of Kingston and Wolfe Island, Ontario

Today I have made the acquaintance of one pair of my second great-grandparents!

So I wrote on 2 September 1973. It was a milestone in my family history project. I had known all four sets of great-grandparents for many years, but never before had I known any of their parents.

On that September day, I met Joseph and Harriet YOTT, parents of Elizabeth (YOTT) GREENWOOD, mother of my grandmother, Harriet (GREENWOOD) DONOVAN. I met them by way of three rolls of microfilm borrowed from the Public Archives of Canada - census records for Wolfe Island, Ontario, for 1851, 1861, and 1871.

Joseph and Harriet YOTT were living on Wolfe Island at the time of the 1851 and 1861 censuses. Harriet was still there in 1871, but her husband had died during the previous ten years.

Joseph was born in Lower Canada; Heriott (sic) in Upper Canada. In 1851, his age (next birthday) is given as 51; hers as 46. They lived in a one-story log house with their nine youngest children.

Joseph was a farmer. The agricultural census showed him holding 49 acres of land in the first concession, 30 under cultivation, the rest "wood or wild." He reported four acres in wheat, five in peas, 15 in oats, two in buckwheat, one in Indian corn, one in potatoes, and one in "gardens or orchards."

Their eldest son, Joseph jr., age 24, his wife, and small daughter, lived in a $1\frac{1}{2}$ -story stone house next to them. They are listed just before the elder YOTTs. Beyond Joseph jr., in another one-story log house, is his sister Elizabeth, age 25, her husband Maxim GREENWOOD, and their first four children.

These are the only married children of Joseph and Harriet. Others, living at home, are Francis, 21; John, 19; Edward, 18; Hary, 12; Alexander, 10; Angeline, 8; Luis, 6; Jean, 4; and Oliver, 1 (born during 1851, the record specifically says.) The parents and first five children are listed at the bottom of page 21 of this census. The four youngest are at the top of page 22.

In 1861, Joseph's age is given as 59; his wife's as 53. Her name is now spelled Harriett. Still at home are Alexander, 19; Angeline, 17; Lewis, 15; Jane, 12; and Oliver, 9.

Elizabeth, Joseph jr., John (a mariner), and Edward (also a mariner) are married and living on the island with their families. Francis and Mary have disappeared.

In 1871, Joseph sr. is gone. Harriet lives with her daughter, Jane ROGERS. Elizabeth and John, with their families are still on the island. I found no others there.

This information from the censuses, combined with what I had learned the previous summer from two lovely ladies on Wolfe Island, granddaughters of Joseph and Harriet YOTT, gave impetus to my YOTT family search. Janie (YOTT) SMITH, age 83, and her sister, Sadie (YOTT) KANE, age 78, both widows, were the only living children, that summer of 1973, of Oliver YCTT, my great-grandmother's youngest brother. Chris SMITH and I interviewed them on 16 July, recording their voices on tape and photographing them at Janie's home near Sacred Heart Church. Sadie's home was on Main Street in the village of Marysville.

I wrote to three other YOTTs on Wolfe Island, whose names were in the telephone book, and received a reply from Vern YOTT, a grandson of Lewis, brother of Elizabeth and Oliver. He enclosed information from the family Bible and newspaper clippings, and he added, "Some information concerning the name YOTT has been passed down to us. It seems that our ancestors came over from France to Quebec many years ago, and sometime before moving to Wolfe Island, they had their name changed from a French spelling to the present 'YOTT' spelling."

I inquired in various places as to what the French spelling might have been and received various answers: AYOT, AYOTTE, HAYOT, HOTTE, etc., none of which proved to be correct.

Then I found, on page 4 of Cosgrove's <u>Wolfe Island</u>, <u>Past and Present</u>, the name of Joseph HUOT who purchased Lot #1, 1st <u>Concession</u>, from C.W. Grant in 1840, and asked, "Was this Joseph HUOT the same man as my second great-grandfather, Joseph YOTT?" Considering French pronunciation and the location of Joseph's farm in 1851, I was convinced this was the original French spelling. My conclusion was later verified.

One item in Vern YOTT's Bible record was "Joseph F. YOTT expired March 9th, 1922 at Detroit, Mich. Beloved husband of Georgiana BECHARD." No one could tell me who this Joseph was, although another cousin provided, from her deceased mother's collection, a prayer card with the same information and a tiny photo of this man.

Then a correspondent in Detroit sent me names and addresses of six YOTTs from the city directory there. I wrote to the six and received two replies. One was from a retired medical doctor, William J. YOTT, and surprisingly his reply came from a Florida city not far from my home. My husband and I visited Dr. YOTT and his wife in early April 1976 and learned that he was the youngest of eight children of Joseph and Georgiana. He was unable, however, to provide the missing link. What relation was his father to my great-grandmother, Elizabeth?

We were convinced that we were cousins in some degree. He gave me what family information he had and referred me to his eldest sister, 88-year-old Marie PLUNKETT, in Detroit.

I wrote to Marie and received a cordial reply. "Write to my nephew in Pain Court, Ontario," she said. So I did, and received another cordial reply.

Amédée EMERY, her nephew, principal of the Ecole Secondaire at Pain Court, was interested in the search. He sent the material we had gathered to his brother, Alphé C. EMERY, in Ottawa, who proved to be really the historian in the family. Alphé had traced many branches of his family, but had never solved the riddle of his great-grandfather, Francois YOTT, who married a Howe Island girl, Martha (or Matilda) YOTT, who, it was claimed, was "not related." Their daughter Catherine was his grandmother, whom he remembered fondly and vividly.

Meanwhile, genealogical information from the Registrar General's office in Toronto, extracted from the death certificate of Elizabeth, my great-grandmother, gave her mother's maiden name as MERINO, which I accepted until my June 1976 visit to Wolfe Island. My cousin, Chris SMITH, and I searched the parish register at Sacred Heart Church there, and found Harriet listed variously as MERCIER and VINCENT - never MERINO. We were baffled.

And we found something else. In the oldest book, which begins with July 1855 (Wolfe Island had previously been part of St. Mary's parish, Kingston), we found an entry dated 11 January 1863, which recorded the baptism of Catherine, daughter of Francois YOTTE and Math.... The rest of the hand-writing was illegible.

Not immediately did it register. We were copying entries so hurriedly that it was only later, when we studied our findings and compared them with Alphé EMERY's information, that it suddenly hit us. This was Catherine, his grandmother. The dates coincided closely. Catherine was born on Wolfe Island, one previous source showed, although her parents' home was on Howe (St. John's) Island. The illegible name was Math... (what?) YOTT. And this Francois could well be the brother of my great-grandmother, Elizabeth - the brother missing from the 1861 and 1871 censuses.

Soon after my return home to Florida, I received one of Alphé EMERY's delightful letters. He and his brother, Amédée, he said, "drove to Howe Island and had a most exhilerating visit of the part of the island where F. YOTT had his farm. We visited the church also (built in 1858). The old tombstones had been gathered up and piled somewhere, we were told. However, the township clerk. . told us that all the church records were being kept in Gananoque, just across on the mainland. There we found the most exciting information.

"We went also to. . .Wolfe Island. We had so often heard of that island and to realize that we were setting foot there was just about unbelievable. . .We said hello to Anthony Vernon (Vern YOTT). . .(and) also saw Mrs. Sadie KANE. . .She has beautiful eyes with a soft shade of brown. . .We then went to the rectory to have a look at the registers but the priest was not there. There was a dog, but he never even woke up. Quite a watch dog!.."

The "exciting information" included the marriage record of Francois YOTTE and Matthie YOTTE, from the register of St. John's Church, Gananoque. It reads as follows:

"On the seventh day of June, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, after three publications, I, the undersigned priest, have received the mutual consent of Francois YOTTE (or HUOT), son of Joseph YOTTE and Henrieta VINCENT of Long Island, on the one part, and Matthie (or Martha) YOTTE, daughter of Renne (or Remi) YOTTE and Josette PELTIER of Howe Island on the other part. Witnesses were Jean Baptiste YOTTE and Catherine BESINET. James Rd. Rosseter."

Here at last was conclusive evidence! This was indeed Elizabeth's brother, son of Joseph and Harriet of Wolfe Island (Long Island, or Longue Ile). This was our lost Francis; and this was the father of Catherine, Alphé EMERY's grandmother. We were, without doubt, third cousins!

More was yet to come. In August, Peggy COHOE, editor of the newsletter of the Kingston Branch, Ontario Genealogical Society, wrote to me that she had found, in the register of St. Mary's parish (which the Kingston Branch had transcribed), the marriage record of Joseph and Harriet, as well as baptismal records of their eldest children and other YOTTs (YOUTs/HUOTs), and she provided me with transcripts.

On 29 April 1823, occurred the "marriage of Joseph YOUT, son of Joseph YOUT and (another illegible name) ST. AMOUR, and Henerietta MERCIE, daughter of Baptiste MERCIE and Angelic ROUSSAU. Witnesses Francis VINCOURT and John SHICKLEBOUR."

I rushed a photocopy of this record to Cousin Alphé, and learned that he too had obtained the same information from the Rev. Brian PRICE, Archivist of the Kingston Diocese. Both Mrs. COHOE and Father PRICE had attempted to decipher the illegible name. Alphé EMERY concluded it probably was Francoise. So here we had three more family lines: ST. AHOUR, MERCIE/MERCIER, and ROUSSAU/ROUSSEAU.

Mais non! This was not all! In his lively style, Cousin Alphé continued:
"Last Thursday. . .I was at the Archives and was not getting anywhere in my search
. . .I noticed the title of a book, <u>Kingston</u>, <u>Frontenac County</u>. . .In a few minutes
I was handed the book. A glance at it was enough to depress me for good. It was
. . .the Register of births, marriages and burials for the Anglican Church, St.
George's. . .After a while, merely out of curiosity, I looked up the index. .for,
of course, HUCT, YOT, YOTT and YOTTE, nothing - I noticed the index at MERCIER said
see 'MERCY.' So I looked!! Under baptism I saw: Harriet MERCY - this was too
much I thought it can only be a coincidence. What would my g-g-g-m be doing in a
place like this. . .and then there the other 'MERCY' entries, one for burial Henry MERCY whose burial was reported on 28 July 1808 - and then the marriage of
Francois VINGTENT and Angelic MERCIER on October 7th, 1809. . .All too many clues.
. .yet the setting was all wrong. . .What in the world would Harriet be doing getting
baptized in the Anglican Church?"

In other references, Cousin Alphé gained understanding, which he passed on to me "..after the conquest (of Canada) the only organization that could lawfully record births, marriages and burials in Upper Canada was the established church, which means the Anglican Church. So that all Catholic baptisms, marriages and burials were recorded in the register of St. George's church. (At least the ones that have been recorded)..

"As for the use of the name VINCENT, it appears her mother, Angelique, had become a widow and married Francois VINCENT. Harriet was born on the 27th December 1807 and her mother remarried on October 7th 1809. So I find it quite plausible that the child was known as Harriet VINCENT in childhood at least. The way VINCENT is written as 'VINCENT' may show the difficulty the French population had of pronouncing English as well as the English officials of understanding the French words. Could it be that Francois VINCENT lisped!! and pronounced his name VINTENT, or could it be that the scribe himself lisped and wrote phonetically what his mind said?"

So she was Henrietta (or Harriet) MERCIER, otherwise surnamed for her step-father VINCENT! But what of the name MERINO? I wrote to the Register General's office, where it was confirmed that the handwritten entry could be nothing other than MERINO. Yet, surely, whatever informant provided that information after Elizabeth's death in 1910 must have copied it from some difficult-to-decipher record which actually was MERCIE or MERCIER. Those old handwritten records are a challenge, but thank goodness for typewriters.

PARISH REGISTERS OF CANADA ON MICROFILM

This is a supplement to an article of the same title contained in Volume 2, Number II, page 80. The revised checklist of parish registers (1975) reveals many parish registers that have been added, especially in the Province of Ontario, and new information regarding their loan. "...no copies may be made from any microfilm while on loan. Copies of individual entries in the registers may be obtained from the Public Archives of Canada, 395 Wellington Street, Ottawa, Ontario K1A ON3, at the standard charge for photoduplication, provided that there is no restriction on the use of the film which prohibits such copying. Certain registers are available for consultation subject to specific restrictions. All such records are identified by the word RESTRICTED in this checklist and potential borrowers should apply directly to the Public Archives for information on obtaining permission to view the films before submitting an application for a loan through any institution. Microfilms of original church registers may be purchased only with written permission of the church and the institution having custody of the originals. Restricted microfilms are not for sale, specifically, all reels coded F'." The Revised Checklist of Parish Registers costs 90¢.

WHAT BECAME OF JOSEPH?

The above question was part of my query which was published in the 1976 October issue of LOST IN CANADA? on page 162. I found the answer myself and the process and the information obtained will interest those of you who have ancestors who died in Ontario.

Background Information.

Each county in Ontario has a Surrogate Court which deals with the disposition of the estate of deceased persons either by Last Will and Testament or in the event that there is no Will, by Letters of Administration. The index to these records and the records themselves prior to 1900 are available on microfilm at the Ontario Archives.

Pertinent Information.

The Index of the Surrogate Court of the County of Bruce produced the name Joseph BLANEY. The Letters of Administration produced the following information:

- 1. The Letter of Administration was obtained by John BLANEY, the father of the deceased.
- 2. Joseph BLANEY died on or about June 23, 1887.
- 3. He was an egg buyer.
- 4. He died in Bentinck Township, Grey County.
- 5. His permanent place of abode prior to his death had been the Town of Walkerton.
- 6. He left an estate of approximately \$1,000,00.
- 7. He left the following heirs:
 - (a) His father, John BLANEY, a lumberman.
 - (b) Two full sisters: Ellen CAMPBELL, wife of Archibald CAMPBELL, of the Town-ship of Bentinck, Grey County, and Mary HOOEY, wife of John HOOEY, carpenter, of the Town of Walkerton.
 - (c) A half brother, Robert John BLANEY.
 - (d) A half sister, Janet BLANEY.
- 8. His mother had predeceased him.

All in all, a sizable piece of information, either original or confirmatory, concerning an individual about whom the only previous information had been that he was 10 years old in 1871, as recorded in the Census report of Bentinck Township, Grey County.

The question of "shifting county lines" is one that is often asked. One clue to this answer can possibly be found in the counties that were enumerated (or not) in the censuses of 1825, 1831, 1842, 1851, 1861, 1871. Comparing this list with a current map may help you determine the location you are seeking. Note for example the counties of L'Assomption and Leinster in Quebec. It was Leinster in 1825, L'Assomption in 1831, Leinster again in 1851, and L'Assomption in 1861 and 1871. The importance of this lies not in knowing where to look for registers today, but in solving the problem of more than one place of the same name and finding a reference to a county that no longer exists! This was most prevalent in Ontario and Quebec as the provinces grew and district lines were shifted for one reason or another.



### LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

Many times I have wondered if I should publish reader/subscriber letters telling of their delight with the helpful suggestions, or actual answers to queries, that they have felt. I have resisted because it smacked of "horn blowing", but I do want to share this one with you, since it isn't all complimentary and expresses what has been in the back of my mind for quite some time. This was received from a new subscriber who had previously borrowed issues of LOST IN CANADA? "...my 4th reason for writing, which has been on my mind ever since I first heard the words LOST IN CANADA? My instant reaction was 'They are not lost in Canada. are lost in the USA because of the scanty records and torturing of French-Canadian names.' French-Canadian records are marvelous and Quebec takes great pride in them. To my surprise I caught an echo of my feeling in Quebec through the intonation used in repeating the title when I had suggested subscribing to LOST IN CANADA? as a source for French-Canadian info. The title is catchy and appealing to USA hunters who are bewildered about crossing the border but it does carry a derogatory implication on the condition of affairs in Canada. I also remind myself that you are serving immigrant descendants from all of Canada, and I have resolutely kept away from all except province of Quebec, and its Catholic church records. Whenever I venture into records of other churches there, I get discouraged. I still wish you had called it maybe something like Somewhere in Canada, as carrying less implication of pointing the finger. I am always amazed at the amount of interest in Canadian forebears there is in Western USA. My narrow concept, as a born Vermonter, was of Quebec immigration into Vermont chiefly and other N.E. states. But I am learning differently and do appreciate the fine job you are doing in helping all Canadian descendants."

This hit home since I have often had the same feeling about the title myself. I will explain that it was born of a selfish feeling that I was lost in Canada, with ancestors that had migrated from Quebec to Ontario to upstate New York, then to Wisconsin-Minnesota, taking nearly a generation to do so and leaving a trail that was marked with tortured surnames and place names. But, lacking a better inspiration for a title, I settled for the subtitle "Canadian-American Query Exchange" which was more descriptive than catchy. Apologies to my Canadian cousins are in order, and given, and I offer the comment that I didn't think of the implications carried in the title at the time it was "hatched".

A question that has been asked more than once is "Are there any books about the Regiments sent to Quebec, such as The Carignan Regiment, the Royal Roussilon, the Sabrevois etc?" Another comment was "I would love to see an article about Pennsylvania German settlement in the Niagara Peninsula". This came from a Canadian subscriber, and I wonder if any of you have, or would write, such an article.

Also frequently asked is "Which back issues are available?" All have been reprinted (some for the fourth time) and are currently available. When these are gone, I doubt there will be future reprints.

With summer approaching, I am certain there are some of you planning a trip to Quebec for the first time, with the idea of doing some research in the Courthouses (Palais de Justice). Please remember to request permission from the Minister of Justice for each one you wish to search. Had someone not mentioned this to me, it would have ruined a delightful trip, since I had blithely assumed I could just walk in as I had done before. (That turned out to have been possible only because the Protonotaire was a kindly gentleman who didn't turn me away). Have a great trip and don't miss Chute Montmorency (Montmorency Falls) which is my favorite spot of all travel—and that includes Europe as an Army wife and much of the United States.

# THE KING'S DAUGHTERS (Fifth of a series)

There are many minor and major mysteries among the records of our ancestors in Quebec and we'd like to pause to tell of one among the filles du roi involving the names Marguerite BOURBIER, Marguerite VIART or VIARD, and, again, Marguerite VIART or VIARD.

Were they one and the same girl or three different girls or two different girls? If they were different girls were they cousins, sisters, half-sisters?

In the first article in this series, we mentioned the sources we were using, all secondary. But even if we had access to the original documents, it is doubtful if we could solve this mystery.

The problem is contained in three documents, marriage contracts, listed by Roy in his "Inventaire des Contrats de Mariage du Regime Français conserves aux Archives Judiciares de Quebec" (Quebec, 1937-38).

In Vol. I, page 220, we find: BOURBIER, Marguerite, et Jean FIEURICOUR (Becquet 2 Nov 1671). In Vol. VI, pages 108-109, are listed: VIARD, Marguerite, et Simon DAVAUX (annule) (Becquet, 15 Oct 1671) and, VIARD, Marguerite, et Mathurin BENARD (Becquet 8 Oct 1672).

In these documents, all three girls indicate they were born in the town of Brie-Comte-Robert in the Ile-de-France. Marguerite BOURBIER gives her father's name as the deceased Pierre and her mother as Isabelle NOBLAIR. In the VIARD-DAVAUX contract, Marguerite gives her father's name as the deceased Pierre and her mother's name as Marie NOBLAIR. Finally, the second Marguerite VIARD lists her father's name as the deceased Pierre and her mother's name as Catherine IECOMPTE.

Dumas mentions the annulments of the BOURBIER-FLEURICOUR and VIARD (VIART)-DAVAUX (DAVAULT) contracts in his book, "Les Filles du Roi en Nouvelle-France," (Quebec, 1972) and relates there is no further trace of either girl after 1671.

There is one other slim clue. The BOURBIER dowry is given as 250 pounds. Both of the VIARD dowries are listed as 350 pounds.

On the surface, since we have only these documents to go on here, we have three different girls and that was Dumas' decision. It would appear that possibly Marguerite BOURBIER and the first Marguerite VIARD are first cousins and the two VIARD girls might be half-sisters.

Well, not quite. Dumas mentions that Sulte in his "Histoire des Canadiens francais, 1608-1880," (8 vols., Montreal, 1882-1884) lists Besnard's wife as Marguerite BOURBIER. Dumas twice mentions that Godbout believed that the two Marguerite VIARDs were the same but we can't find any note of it in the only source we have, Godbout's "Nos Ancetres au XVII Siecle," (Extrait du Rapport de l'Archiviste de la Province de Quebec).

Unless more material is uncovered, we have to agree with Dumas. We are inclined to believe the two VIARD girls are half-sisters. The only other possibility is a hodgepodge of 'dit' names, i.e: Marguerite BOURBIER dit VIARD and a mother named Marie-Isabelle-Catherine NOBLAIR dit LECOMPTE. Not impossible, we might say, but where's the proof?

Tanguay and Drouin don't list annulments. In the BESNARD-VIARD (VIART) marriage, Marguerite's parents are listed in both sources as Pierre VIARD-VIART and the mother as Catherine LECOMPTE. Tanguay also lists a BERNARD-FIART marriage which has to be the same couple.

In marriage registers of Pontbriand for Laprairie, Quebec, and Contrecoeur covering marriages between Marguerite VIARD-VIARDE-VIARGE and (1) Mathurin BESNARD; (2) Jean INARD, and (3) Joseph SERRAN, the parents are always listed as Pierre VIARD and Catherine LECOMPIE.

And what of the other filles du roi from the Ile-de-France? Last issue we said there were so many we'd have to name them in two lists. Actually, we've had to break that list in half, too. Here is the second third of the king's daughters from the Ile-de-France:

Marie VIGNY (De VIGNY) of St-Nicolas of Paris, daughter of the deceased Louis VIGNY and Marie GERMAINE, married Jean AMAURY 25 Sep 1673 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 200 pounds.

Ambroise DOIGT (DOUET) of St-Sulpice of Paris, daughter of the deceased Nicolas DOIGT and Perinne ALAIN, married Jacques MIGNIER 14 Oct 1669 at Quebec. Her dowry of 250 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Catherine DROUET of St-Medard of Paris, widow of Rene MILLET, married the widower Pierre CHAMARE 19 Oct 1671 at Quebec. Her dowry of 250 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Catherine DUCHARME of St-Benoit of Paris, daughter of Jean DUCHARME and Anne LELIEVRE, married Pierre ROY 12 Jan 1672 at Montreal.

Marie Anne DUCHEMIN of St-Paul of Paris, daughter of the deceased Louis DUCHEMIN and Marie LE SUEUR, married Pierre YVELIN 19 Sep 1673 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 600 pounds.

Antoinette DUMOUSTIERS of St-Paul of Paris, daughter of the deceased Jean DU-MOUSTIERS and Guilmette BIDO, married Jacques MARTINEAU 28 Nov 1669 at Quebec. Her dowry of 250 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Catherine DUPUY of St-Germain of Auxerre, Paris, daughter of Andre DUPUY and Catherine DUVAL, became the first wife of Charles MARTIN 28 Nov 1663 at Montreal.

Catherine DURAND of St-Eustache of Paris, daughter of the deceased Pierre DURAND and Jacquette COURTOIS, married Pierre PICHET 25 Nov 1665 at Quebec.

Madeleine DUVAL of St-Severin, Paris, daughter of the deceased Jean DUVAL and Jacqueline DION, married Jacques JOUBERT around 1672-73 in the area of Montreal.

Anne FAYET of St-Laurent of Paris, daughter of Denis FAYET and Marie GUILBERT, married Rene SIRET dit LAFIEUR 8 Sep 1670 at Quebec. Her dowry of 250 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Marie FLEUREAU of St-Germain of Auxerre, Paris, daughter of the deceased Nicolas FLEUREAU and Sebastienne BEAUJOUAN, married Jean DELAUNAY 30 Sep 1669 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 500 pounds.

Anne FCUBERT of Chastre, Diocese of Paris, daughter of Louis FOUBERT and Marie CHARPENTIER, married Pierre BOISSEAU 20 Oct 1670 at Montreal.

Catherine FOURIER of St-Sulpice, Paris, daughter of Claude FOURIER and Marie PENNETIER 1/m Mathurin MERCADIER 14 Oct 1670 at Montreal; 2/m Jean BOUSQUET 11 May 1672 at Montreal.

Louise FROST of St-Etienne des Gres, Diocese of Paris, daughter of Michel FROST and Barbe BONNEVAL, married Julien MEUNIER 9 Sep 1670 at Quebec. Her dowry of 250 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Anne GALAIS of St-Pierre, Gonesse, Diocese of Paris, daughter of Pierre GALAIS and Marguerite LA SERRE, married Michel HEBERT dit LAVERDURE 1 Sep 1670 at Quebec. Her dowry of 250 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Therese GALLIEN (PAULINIER) of St-Come, Paris, daughter of the deceased Jean GALLIEN and Marguerite DUPONT, 1/m Laurent GOUIN 22 Oct 1665 at Ft. La Touche; 2/m Louis GILBERT 7 Jan 1687 at Champlain.

Marguerite GAMBIER of St-Sulpice, Paris, daughter of Antoine GAMBIER and Francoise BERNARD, married Michel Nicolas LE GARDEUR dit SANSOUCY 26 Jul 1664 at Quebec.

Marie GAUTIER (GAUTHIER) of St-Roch, Paris, daughter of Louis GAUTIER and Jeanne LAREAU or TAREAU, married Pierre PROU in Nov 1669 in the Trois-Rivieres area.

Jeanne-Marie GAUTIER of Remy, Diocese of Sens, daughter of the deceased Honore GAUTIER and Jacqueline MAVILLE, married Gilles MASSON 17 Oct 1668 at Quebec.

Catherine GICHELIN of Laon, daughter of the deceased Louis GICHELIN and Thoinette LALAYE, married Nicolas BUTEAU in the Fall of 1669 in the Quebec area.

Jearne GILIES of Paris, daughter of the deceased Pierre GILIES and Anne MERTRA, 1/m Francois FLEURY in Aug 1670 in the Quebec area; 2/m the widower Rene DUMATS dit RENCONTRE 1 Jun 1689 at Montreal; 3/m Pierre GALET 1 Sep 1704 at Montreal. Her dowry of 350 pounds at her first wedding included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Mathurine GOARD (GOUARD) of St-Sulpice, faubourg St-Germain-des-Pres, Paris, daughter of Gilles GOARD and Catherine LEGER, married Louis MARIE dit STE-MARIE 31 May 1667 at Montreal.

Anne GOISET of St-Laurent, Paris, widow of Michel DE LA PLACE, married Andre ALBERT 21 Oct 1669 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 800 pounds including the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Madeleine GOMOND of St-Nicolas-des-Champs, Paris, daughter of Jean GOMOND and Anne REMOND, 1/m Jean LANGLOIS 15 Oct 1668 at Quebec; 2/m Pierre LEFRANCOIS 16 Aug 1670 at Quebec. Her dowry at her first marriage was 300 pounds.

Noelle GOSSARD of St-Eustache, Paris, daughter of the deceased Francois GOSSARD and Sulpice VEILLOT, married Jacques BUSSIERE 16 Oct 1671 at Ste-Famille. Her dowry of 350 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Adrienne GRANDJEAN of St-Martin, Paris, daughter of Claude GRANDJEAN and Andree DUTROUGE, became the first wife of Rene BAUCHE dit SANS-SOUCY in Jan 1666 in the Quebec area.

Anne GRIMBAUT of St-Paul, Paris, daughter of the deceased Martin GRIMBAUT and Jeanne JARDEAU, married Jean JOANNE (JOUAN) 17 Sep 1670 at Ste-Famille. She had a dowry of 400 pounds.

Marie GUILLAUME (GUILLON) of St-Medard, Paris, daughter of Denis GUILLAUME and Anne CARON, 1/m Nicolas MAHEU 15 Jan 1671 at L'Ange-Gardien; 2/m the widower Laurent MIGNERON in 1675 near Beaupre.

Catherine GUYARD of St-Laurent, Diocese of Paris, daughter of the deceased Louis GUYARD and Madeleine VANC (VANT), married Antoine BAUDRY dit L'EPINETTE 24 Nov 1665 at Montreal.

Francoise HACHE of St-Eustache, Diocese of Paris, daughter of the deceased Jacques HACHE and Marie DANETZ, married Guillaume BONHOMME 30 Oct 1664 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 500 pounds.

Marie HALAY (HALLAY) of St-Sulpice, Diocese of Paris, widow of Pierre PETIT, married the widower Antoine AUGERON 11 Jan 1672 at Quebec. Her dowry of 250 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Marie HIARDIN of St-Germain of Auxerre, Paris, daughter of the deceased Jean HIARDIN and Marguerite CHESNAY, married Pierre L'ANCOUGNIER 9 Oct 1668 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 200 pounds.

Elizabeth JOSSARD of St-Nicolas-des-Champs, Paris, daughter of the deceased Gaspard JOSSARD and Marie DESCHAMPS, married Jean Baptiste POITIERS (DU POITIERS), Sieur DU BUISSON, 6 Oct 1670 at Quebec. Her dowry of 850 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Jeanne JUIN of St-Laurent, Paris, daughter of Francois JUIN and Anne CHARLOTTE, married Bernard DUMOUCHEL dit LAROCHE in Apr 1673 in the Trois-Rivieres area.

Anne JULIEN of St-Germain of Auxerre, Diocese of Paris, daughter of Pierre JULIEN and Marie DE PIEN, married Nicolas CHOQUET dit CHAMPAGNE 12 Nov 1668 at Montreal.

Marguerite L'ADMIRAUT of St-Germain of Auxerre, Paris, daughter of Francois L'ADMIRAUT and Jeanne CLOS, married Honore MARTEL 26 Nov 1668 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 300 pounds.

Chambly and had a dowry of 350 pounds, including 50 from the king. Dumas also has a record of a contract of marriage between her and Nicolas DUBRAY dit IAPLUME 25 Oct 1693 at Boucherville following the death of BERNIER.

Nicole LE GRAND of St-Sulpice, Paris, daughter of the deceased Nicolas LE GRAND and Anne DUPLESSIS, married Francois NOEL 22 Oct 1669 at Quebec. Her dowry of 450 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Madeleine LE GUAY of St-Mary, Paris, daughter of the deceased Jean LE GUAY and deceased Madeleine LE GUAY, married Jacques L'ARCHEVEQUE 3 Jun 1669 at Quebec.

Marie-Anne LE LONG of St-Pierre-aux-Boeufs, Diocese of Paris, daughter of the deceased Jacques LE LONG and Marguerite GROSNIER, married Joseph BONNEAU dit LA BECASSE 16 Sep 1670 at Ste-Famille, with a dowry of 250 pounds including the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Francoise LEMOINE of Paris, daughter of Antoine LEMOINE and Francoise DE LONG-UEMERIJERE, married Pierre NIQUET in June, 1666 in the Trois-Rivieres area.

Anne LE ROY of St-Germain, Paris, daughter of the deceased François LE ROY and the deceased Anne BOURDAIS, married Jean RODRIGUE 28 Oct 1671 at Quebec. Her dowry of 350 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Catherine LE ROY of St-Paul, Paris, daughter of (unreadable) and Marie LUSSIA, 1/m Pierre SALVAYE (DE SALVAYE), squire, contract Adhemar Nov 1673 and 2/m Jean DE MIRE, Sieur DE L'ARGENTERIE, around 1689.

Marguerite LE ROY of St-Eustache, Paris, widow of Brice D'ANNEVILLE and mother of the fille du roi Gabrielle D'ANNEVILLE (see Lost In Canada, Jan 1977, page 24) married Hilaire CHARDONNEAU 27 July 1665 at Quebec.

Marie LE ROY of Ste-Etienne-du-Mont, Paris, daughter of the deceased Guillaume LE ROY and Germaine BERGER, married Pierre PERUSSEAU 8 Mar 1666 at Montreal.

Marie-Anne LE ROY of Paris, daughter of the deceased Jacques LE ROY and Marguerite SUSSAY, married Mathieu BINET 21 Oct 1670 at Boucherville.

Marie LE SEIGNEUR of St-Paul, Paris, daughter of the deceased Jean LE SEIGNEUR and Jeanne GODAILLON, married Pierre SASSEVILLE 8 Sep 1670 at Chateau-Richer.

Marie LESPERANCE, born at St-Etienne-du-Mont, Paris, widow of Jean POMEROLLE and daughter of Jean LESPERANCE and Marie DUVON, married Benoit FONSART 8 Nov 1665 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 200 pounds.

Claire LEVIEUX of St-Honore, Paris, daughter of Pierre LEVIEUX and Jeanne LEGRAND, married the widower Pierre NEVEU 5 Oct 1669 at Ste-Famille. Her dowry of 250 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

This Editor noted these entries in the Jesuit "Relations", the diary kept by the priests of the Society of Jesus of early Quebec, volume 49, page 169: "10 Oct 1665. Four companies departed to wait for Mgr de Tracy at Trois-Rivieres. 2 Oct 1665. The ship from Normandy arrived with 82 girls and women—among others, 50 from a charitable institution in Paris, where they have been very well taught. Item, 130 laboring men, all in good health; an excellent cargo for the company, and at good prices; all the communities had on board all that comes to them from France."

Volume 50, page 177: "25 Aug 1667. Monsieur de Tracy sails in three days to return to France...the troops remain and the King again sends us, this year, 350 laboring men, and 60 girls to populate the country."

Volume 53, page 37: "1669-1670. His Majesty is so persuaded that it is necessary to maintain troops constantly in this country, for the purpose of subduing the Iroquois pride, and preventing them from breaking the peace, - as they have done, as soon as they thought themselves the stronger, - that he has taken care to send over, a few (eight) months ago, 150 girls, in order that the Soldiers settling in New France may have families here, cultivate the lands, and defend the colony."

#### LITTLE BATEESE

A query appeared in Volume 3, #I, page 17, requesting the poem "L'il Bateese". Rev. Arthur T. GOOLD, 412 North Plum Street, Northfield, MN 55057, read the query, remembered reading this as a child, and fortunately found the book. It was in "Poems of Today" edited by Alice Cecilia COOPER, Ginn & Company, Boston, copyright 1924 by the author. A footnote indicated the poem was from "Johnnie Courteau" by William Henry DUMMOND. Courtesy of G.P. Putnam's Sons, Publishers, New York and London.

You bad leetle boy, not moche you care

Others also wrote to express an interest in finding this poem, or to give a suggestion regarding the identity of Louis CYR (most believed him to be a fictitious character). Paul MARTSCHING, 1120 Marston, Ames, IA 50010, wrote to say that

"Louis CYR was born 11 Oct 1863 somewhere in Quebec. In his early teens he lived with his parents in Lowell, MA, and he later married Melina COURTOIS in Canada in January 1882. He was on the police force in Montreal several years later and is famous as a strong man. Louis was at his best in the 1890s weighing around 300 pounds at 5 feet  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inches of height. He later weighed quite a bit more. During the 1890s only the Frenchman Lui Uni (Apollon) was any way near the equal in strength to CYR. During part of Louis' public career he kept his hair long in the belief that it would make him stronger. He died 10 Nov 1912 in Montreal." He also enclosed a copy of a page from a book containing a photograph of Louis CYR and illustrations of some of his feats.

# GRENVILLE TOWNSHIP, COUNTY DEUX-MONTAGNES IN 1851

The following appeared as remarks at the end of the 1851 census of Grenville Twp, Deux-Montagnes county, Quebec. It is copied as written.

The Township of Grenville is situated on the North side of the Ottawa River at the Head of the Long Sault Rapids and compasses 11 ranges of 1 mile in depth by 27 lots, 1/3 of a mile in width out of which there is a broken front. The Township is exceedingly Mountainous and very much intersected by Lakes. The Mountains are rocky and Barren, containing Copper, Iron-Ore, Marble, and Plumbago. The Plumbago Mine has been worked, it was found very rich but the work was abandoned owing to the great expense of working it. The Marble Quarry has also been worked but found not remunerative. The Mountains range nearly parallel with the Ottawa River, and towards the West end of the Township they approach to within a few acres of the Ottawa and are inaccessible. Except in four places which the inhabitants have improved according to their means in order to get back to the Farms, and only 1 of these roads is available for Carts to the 8th range. The West end of the Township is divided from the East end by a Rapid unnavigable River called Rouje, too crooked and too full of Falls to admit of Square Lumber descending but has been a source of Revenue to the Province from Saw Logs for many years. There are other streams which empty into the Ottawa but not being of such Extent the Inhabitants have Bridged. The River Rouje is without a Bridge, although on the direct Road to Hull and By Town but as it has been estimated to cost 1000 pounds and the Inhabitants too poor to raise that sum it remains as a Memento to the Government. There is a succession of Mountains through the whole of the Township, and for some miles in the Rear, before the Table Land commences. The Land is thickly interspersed with Boulders rendering it disadvantageous to Village and consequently keeping the Inhabitants poor. The Inhabitants in the rear are in very isolated situations owing to the Mountains and Lakes, and this circumstance contributed to their ignorance, added to which their extreme Poverty, renders them so obstinate that it was with the greatest difficulty any statistical information could be arrived at from them, the Majority supposing that the information now required was the precursor of a general Tax for Schools which they are strongly opposed to: their situations precluding the most of them from sending Children so far to schools through the detours of Mountains and Lakes. There is not one Public School in the whole Township which will account for the Columns 24 and 25 (# of males and females attending school--ed) in the Personal Census remaining blank. Most of the Lakes contain Fish which the Inhabitants in their vicinity take advantage of perhaps to the detriment of their Farming interest. Farms partially cultivated with a Log House and Barn erected would sell (generally speaking) at about 10 Shillings an Acre".

# MARRIAGES AT GRAND ISLE COUNTY. VERMONT

These extractions from the Town Records of Grand Isle County, VT were made by Mrs. Virginia DE MARCE, 2508 North Kenilworth Street, Arlington, VA 22207, while reading microfilm in her family research. Extracted were names of Canadian-born persons, or persons whose names appeared to be of Canadian origin. Since people went back and forth over the border of Canada and the United States freely, many acts were recorded in places other than their "home area". Names are copied as is, and it becomes quickly apparent that many were written phoenetically. The location of the marriage place follows names and dates. Parents names, where given, are shown in (). Common abbreviations are used, such as Zip Code letters for states, and also:

MELANGES GENEALOGIQUES, CAHTER IV -- he has done it again! Raymond Gingras has put out another excellent publication. Sent to me as a gift, I am not aware of the price, but assume it to be \$2 as were the others in the series. Items included are: a list of Norwegians of Quebec, Honfleur en Normandie, a list of ships arriving at the port of Quebec 1760-1850, reviews of published material of interest to French-Canadian researchers, and "Appreciation americaine" to this publication and to Mrs. E.J. Turk's THE QUIET ADVENTURERS. Mr. Gingras is the assistant genealogist at the National Archives in Quebec and a most accomplished and thorough one.
