## LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

Why does my mind go blank when I begin this letter, but refuses to do just that when I am trying to go to sleep and have many good subjects in mind for the next edition?? There are a few points that I have jotted down:

Microfilms from the Public Archives of Canada may be purchased for \$10.00 each, excepting those marked "Restricted". Be prepared to wait four to five months to receive them.

The Nova Scotia Newsletter has increased in price to \$3.00 for two years --still a great bargain.

Please note the new addresses in the Exchange Shelf for both the Vermont and Wisconsin Genealogical Societies.

When corresponding across the border, you cannot enclose SASE, but you can enclose a self-addressed envelope and loosely fix the stamp in the corner to your letter. The recipient can then use that for his own SASE to the other country.

The answer to your research problem most likely will not be found today or even tomorrow, but with education and effort you can hopefully do sooner what it took me twelve years to accomplish. One of the purposes of this journal is to turn up sources that are obscure to some, however basic they might be to others. I operate on the premise that we all have something to learn.

As the newly-elected 2nd Vice-President of the Wisconsin State Genealogical Society, I would like to point out that they have resumed the Pioneer Family Certificate project, and are preparing a book of those certificates already given. An applicant must directly descend from one who settled in Wisconsin by 1850, and submit proof. Applications should be submitted on a form available from WSGS, Box 5106, Madison, WI 53705. The completed form is then sent to the same address with \$1.50 for each certificate desired. Applicant need not presently be a Wisconsin resident. When I applied several years ago as a descendant of Nicolas Perrot, the early Wisconsin explorer, I wasn't sure if it would be accepted, since he did not settle his family here, but was certainly a large part of our state's history. I also thought that had to be the earliest certificate possible. Imagine the thrill and surprise when last week I was carrying the line of Ella Delarce Ruetten through Drouin and Tanguay (since I don't let those books out of my library) and found that her line goes to the first Wisconsin resident--Louis Joliette who with Pere Marquette discovered the Mississippi River! No sincere genealogist traces his line looking for royalty or famous persons, but it is an added bonus to find someone you can read about, and it sometimes is the spark the disinterested family members need. (Extension of her line from Volume 3, #2, page 69: Joseph-Vital Caron, son of Joseph-Vital and Charlotte Joliette.) Without question, there are many of you who will trace to these same lines--GOOD HUNTING!

## THE KING'S DAUGHTERS (Sixth of a series)

It is over 300 years since the first of our ancestresses known as filles du roi left France. Much as we would wish to know more of the intimate details of their lives and the desires that drove them to the momentous decision to embark on the great adventure so important to us, their descendants, in the end much of what we write must be speculation.

But we can only puzzle over some items. Who wouldn't want to know more about the Demoiselle Esperance DU ROSAIRE! "Sauvagesse de la nation du Brezil...." Born in Brazil. Baptized at the Church of St. Paul in Lisbon, Portugal. The first of the girls arriving from France in 1668 to get married.

She rated a mention in one of the letters of the Venerable Marie GUYART dite MARIE de l'Incarnation, one of the foundresses of the Ursuline Nuns in New France who relates "the first to marry was a Moor who espoused a young Frenchman."

Drouin tells us that she was married at Quebec 9 Oct 1668 to Simon LONGUEVILLE, the son of Marcel LONGUEVILLE and Jeanne BERNARD of Notre-Dame des Tables, Montpellier, Languedoc. Dumas mentions they had no children.

But two ocean trips in that period of time! For a young girl! Almost unbelievable. Was she really black or part black? There must have still been relatively few blacks in Brazil at that period. Was she Indian? How did she get to Portugal? How did she get to France? Was she secretly dreaming of returning to Brazil when she embarked for Canada? (There were other Frenchwomen sent to colonize French possessions in the Caribbean. Many of these women were actually deported, resulting in unsupported stories which French-Canadians have sought since to prove false.)

We can only speculate that someone, a sailor perhaps, took pity on a waif in a strange port. Lonely soldiers and sailors often collect these strays as any veteran of one of America's foreign wars will tell you.

But how did she get to France? There just wasn't that much traveling in that period. Especially by young girls. On another boat while traveling with the same person who brought her from Brazil? It seems the most likely route. Or perhaps by a band of gypsies?

Or was this young lady simply a dark-skinned Frenchwoman with an extremely vivid imagination, determined to cast off her past in every way? Or a stray girl making up a bit of a past? It would certainly be worth a search of the Lisbon records of St. Paul if they still exist.

We speculate in other ways. In this issue's list completing the enumeration of the women from the Ile-de-France who were filles du roi are three sisters. Records exist stating that two of the sisters had dowries exceeding 1,000 pounds. No record has been found for the third sister, but we know they attended each other's marriages. They were not estranged. So it is almost a certainty that the third sister also had a dowry of over 1,000 pounds.

We have speculated, too, on the things these ancestresses of ours carried with them to New France, and in an earlier chapter related a list of the effects noted at an inquest following the death of one of the girls. It was a sorry list of things, but some of these women must have made tremendous efforts to bring with them some family heirlooms, some in the same nature as the huge pieces of furniture which some women on the Oregon trail insisted be dragged in prairie schooners from one coast to the other, not because it was practical, but because what they brought with them was a link to the past.

We have come across another small list in Lanctot's "Filles de Joie ou Filles du Roi."

As with any government plan, the project of sending women overseas, of paying their way, and providing cash dowries didn't reach full fruit with the first contingent



of young ladies leaving for Canada. And we can be sure, as it is today, when the news that the king was paying for this immigration was spread throughout France, that the businessmen of the era recognized a good thing and responded with kits and articles, tour plans, package deals, and what have you in an effort to keep some of the king's money in France.

Lancotot relates that one of the original plans suggested a cost to the king of 100 pounds per woman. The original costs were divided into 10 pounds as the cost of recruiting and getting the woman to the port of departure to Canada, 60 pounds for her ocean transportation expense, and 30 pounds for a set of articles for a dowry. Later, this was augmented by 50 and/or 100 pounds of "money of Canada" given her on her marriage in New France.

You can be sure that the suppliers of the merchandise to be used in the material dowry pondered long and carefully over their margin of profits. What did the women get generally? Lancotot lists: A cassette, the small chest to hold the dowry; 1 head dress, 1 taffeta handkerchief, 1 pair of shoe ribbons, 100 sewing needles, 1 comb, 1 spool of white thread, 1 pair of stockings, 1 pair of gloves, 1 pair of scissors, 2 knives, 1,000 pins, 1 bonnet, 4 lace braids, and 2 pounds in silver money.

Anne LOISEAU, born at St-Sulpice, Paris, daughter of Francois LOISEAU and Barbe GAULIN, who 1/m Guillaume GENDRON dit LA ROLANDIERRE 21 July 1664 at Montreal; 2/m Charles LEMOINE 2 Aug 1688 at Montreal.

Etiennette LORE, born at St-Laurent, Paris, daughter of Jean LORE and Francoise LEFROY, who married Jean BAU dit LALOUETTE 15 May 1672 at Boucherville. She had a dowry of 100 pounds.

Perette LAURIOT (LORYOT), born at Bourget, daughter of Pierre LAURIOT and Jeanne BUCQUET, married Pierre BUTAUD 21 Oct 1671 at Ste-Famille. Her dowry of 350 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Catherine LUCO, born at St-Maurice-Charanton, near Paris, daughter of Nicolas LUCO and Marie BASSON, married Marin (Jean) MOREAU dit LAPORTE around Nov 1671 in the Richelieu area.

Jeanne MAGDELAIN, born at St-Laurent, Paris, daughter of the deceased Jacques MAGDELAIN and Marguerite ROUSSEL, married Antoine TAPIN 4 Nov 1669 at Quebec. Her dowry of 150 pounds included a gift of 50 pounds from the king.

Anne MAGNAN, born at St-Germain-l'Auxerrois, Paris, daughter of the deceased Simon MAGNAN and Aimee (name unknown), married Jean GAUVIN 22 Oct 1665 at Quebec.

Elizabeth MARCHAND, born at St-Paul, Paris, daughter of the deceased Jacques MARCHAND and Claude BIETTRY, married Pierre COEUR dit JOLICOEUR 6 Oct 1670 at Quebec. Earlier she had signed a contract to marry COEUR. The contract was annulled and she signed a second to marry Sylvain LEVEAU. This, too, was annulled, and she wed COEUR. Her dowry of 450 pounds included 50 pounds from the king.

Jeanne MARIE, born at St-Sulpice, Paris, daughter of Denis MARIE and Madeleine BIENVENUE, married Francois VEZINAT 29 Oct 1670 at Chateau-Richer. Her dowry of 350 pounds included 50 from the king.

Denise MARIE, born at St-Sulpice, Paris, daughter of the deceased Pierre MARIE and Jeanne LORET, 1/m Jean QUENNEVILLE 12 Feb 1674 at Montreal; 2/m Jean GILBERT 15 May 1704 at Lachine.

I generally write a simple request in English stating that they may reply in French. However, if you wish to ask in their language, here is a suggestion for a letter, followed by the translation. Any request for records, to anyone, anywhere, is more likely to be answered if it is simple.

## THE CANADIAN REBELLION OF 1837-1838

The stories of the "Patriotes" of 1837 have been many, and fascinating. There were, of course, two sides to the opinions and feelings that shaped the Rebellion, and two sides of thought regarding the outcome. Research has taken me to many books and accounts, some extracts of which will appear here.

Sessional Paper No. 18 (Report concerning Canadian Archives for the year 1904) is a government document of 1905 listing the officers and men killed and wounded in 1837-38, or otherwise injured while on active service.

### Hemmingford Battalion:

ALLEN, Pvt. James, killed, married, 1 ch 20 yrs of age, living at Sherrington, middling.

BURTON, Pvt. John, killed, married, 9 ch aged 4,6,8,10,12,14,16,18,20, living at Sherrington, middling.

DEVELLIN, Pvt. Charles, severely wounded, single, living at Montreal.

EDGENORTH, Pvt. William, slightly wounded, single, living at Hemmingford, middling.

MC ALLISTER, Capt. Charles, killed, married, 1 ch 25 yrs of age, living at Sherrington, very poor.

MC INTYRE, Pvt. Robert, killed, married, 3 ch aged 2,3,7, living at Hemmingford, middling.

MC INTYRE, Pvt. William, killed, married, 3 ch aged 2,4,7, living at Hemmingford, very poor.

MOORE, Sgt. William, slightly wounded, married, 6 ch aged 1,3,5,8,10,12, living at Hemmingford, poor.

MORRISON, Pvt. Robert, severely wounded, 8 ch aged 10, 12, 14, 16, 18, 20,23,25, living at Sherrington, middling.

OUEL, Pvt. William, slightly wounded, single, living at Hemmingford, middling.

### Odel Town Battalion:

BARTLETTE, Pvt. Lewis, severely wounded, married, 3 ch aged  $\frac{1}{4}$ ,2,4, living at LaColle, very poor.

DEMHAN, Pvt. Thomas, killed, married, 3 ch aged 20,23,25, living at LaColle, destitute.

DURHAM, Pvt. William, severely wounded, single, living at LaColle, very poor.

KIDD, Pvt. William, disabled, married, 6 ch aged  $\frac{1}{4}$ ,3,5,7,10,12, living at LaColle, very poor.

MC ALLUM, Pvt. Daniel, slightly wounded, single, living at Odel Town, poor.

ODELL, Lt. Hiram, severely wounded, married, 3 ch aged 6,10,14, living at Odel Town, good circumstances.

### Royal Regiment attached to Hemmingford Regiment:

BEATTIE, Sgt. John, slightly wounded, married, 3 ch aged 1,5,22, living at Hemmingford, poor.

### LaColle Frontier Company:

ATKINS, Pvt. John, slightly wounded, single, living at Odel Town frontier, volunteer doing duty, poor.

HEVENOR, Pvt. John, killed, married, 4 ch aged 5,7,9,11, living at Sherrington, very poor.

REILLY, Pvt. James, dead, married, 2 ch aged 12,14, living at LaColle, very poor, died from cold caught while on duty.

### St. Johns Loyal Volunteers:

CHARTRAND, Pvt., murdered, married, 3 ch aged 2,4,6, living at Montreal, poor, but marriage doubtful.

### Henryville Loyal Volunteers:

BOHA, Pvt. Usta, drowned, single, living at Henryville, drowned while crossing the Richelieu river. He left an aged mother in Henryville in very poor circumstances.

CARR, Pvt. Charles, drowned, single, living at Noyan; drowned while crossing the Richelieu river as above. His father is a farmer and lives at Noyan.



MC CHAIE, Pvt. drowned, 5 ch, living at Quebec, very low circumstances, drowned while attempting to cross the Richelieu river near Isle aux Noix, as one of a guard to be placed over the property of the Rebel GAGNON.

MC KECHNIE, Pvt.

TOBIN, Pvt. John, drowned, single, drowned while crossing the Richelieu river. He was a native of Ireland and has no relatives in this country.

Stanstead Loyal Volunteers:

KILBORN, Capt. Alexander, severely wounded, living at Stanstead, wounded in the abdomen by a musket ball while in active duty in Her Majesty's service.

Beauharnois Loyal Volunteers:

BROWN, Lt. Col. L.G., slightly wounded, married, 2 ch, living at Beauharnois, good circumstances, taken prisoner.

Shefford Loyal Volunteers:

ELKINS, Pvt. Henry, injured, married, living at Granby, himself and family driven from their home on the frontiers in Potton in consequence of having shot a Brigand, and while on duty, leaving his farm and buildings at Potton valued at \$250.

Huntingdon Loyal Volunteers:

KING, Pvt. William, killed, married, living at Hinchinbrook, indifferent circumstances, widow paralytic.

Loyal Subjects:

CHOUINARD, Francois, killed, married, 2 ch aged 6,8, living at Napierville, good.

FLOWER, Pvt. Martin, killed, married, 4 ch. all girls, aged 1½,4,9,14, living at East Sherrington, very poor.

GIBSON, John, severely wounded, married, living at Caldwell's Manor, was severely wounded by the Brigands on the 30th Dec 1838, lost all his property and has a wife and 5 ch.

LEECH, Matthew, disabled, married, 7 ch aged 2,4,7,9,12,15,18, living at Hemmingford, very poor.

LIEN, Henry, volunteer, ruptured, living at Royan. He is an old and loyal man, who got a fall while on duty at Moore's Corner in Dec 1837, which severely ruptured him. He is a deserving person and served during the rebellion in Ireland and also in this country. He is a petitioner to Sir John for employment under Govt. as carpenter or turner.

POULIOTTE, Charles, killed, married, 5 ch aged 2,4,5,6,8, widow living at Napierville, destitute, on the eve of confinement.

TAYLOR, Esq. Ralph, volunteer, severely wounded, living at Philipsburg, knocked down and severely wounded in the face while on sentry, by GAGNON and a party of rebels passing through Philipsburg on their way to the United States.

VITTIE, severely wounded, married, living near Laprairie, good circumstances.

VOSBURG, Abraham, severely wounded, married, living at Caldwell's Manor, was severely wounded by the Brigands on the night of the 9th of Feb last, who burnt his barns and stock and plundered his house.

VOSBURG, Abraham Jr., slightly wounded, single, living at Caldwell's Manor, was wounded on the same night and occasion.

VOSBURG, Miss, daughter to Abraham VOSBURG Sr., slightly wounded while attempting to protect the Parent.

VALIER, murdered, married, 4 ch, all girls, aged 1,3,5,7½, living near Laprairie, poor circumstances.

Submitted by Rev. John KASTENHOLZ, 610 Maryhill Drive, Green Bay, WI 54303. From Le Patriote Canadien, Burlington, VT, Wednesday evening, 2 Oct 1839, translated.

"The 58 Canadians sentenced to death were put on board the British American on Thursday, the 26th, and sent to Quebec. From there they are to board the transport ship Buffalo, which is to take them to Botany Bay - to be deported for life. They were chained in pairs and guarded by the troops of the 24th Regiment. The

eight political prisoners from upper Canada, also sentenced to death and whose sentence was also changed to deportation, arrived in Montreal the same evening as the other prisoners--through the Lachine Canal. They were immediately loaded onto the St-George and sent to Quebec to share the same sentence as the other exiles--slavery.

Twenty-seven were to be set free and told to be careful of their actions. Two others: LEVEQUE and BRIEN, besides a bail of 4000 piasters, were to stay at least 200 leagues away from Canada.

The list of prisoners from lower Canada who after a year of rigorous imprisonment were condemned to death, but the sentences were changed by the dictator, COLBORNE, to deportation from Botany-Bay.

(Rev. KASTENHOLZ notes some discrepancies occur between this list and the one of A. FAUTEUX in his work 'Patriotes de 1837-38'. Where obvious differences occur, Fauteux's will be given in parentheses.) Place of residence is followed by occupation, age, and number of children.

Mrs. LEVEQUE was seen Friday evening at Burlington, leaving for New York, where he is to immediately leave for France."

Translated from the registers of the parish of St-Eustache--

14 December 1837 at the place of the battle, were killed Jean Olivier CHENIER, Esquire and doctor of medicine, age 34 years, husband of Dame Zephyrine LABRIE; Joseph PAQUET age 30, a laborer and husband of Adelaide LAUZE; Jean-Baptiste LAUZE age 25, husband of Marie TESSIER; Nazaire FILION age 22, farmer, married to Julie GRATTON; Seraphim DORE 29, farmer, husband of Henriette BELANGER; Francois DUBE 29, a laborer married to Marguerite GOSSELIN; Joseph GUITARD 26, husband of Theotiste JOANNETTE; Pierre DUBEAU, innkeeper age 28, spouse of Olive OUMETTE; Joseph BOUVRET, age about 23 years, son of Jean and Isabelle REGIBAL. All of these people are of the parish of St-Eustache and were buried here, as well as Jean Baptiste TOUPIN, age 30, son of Francois, a farmer. Present were Jacques and Francois BEAUCHAMP.

On the 26th day of December 1837, was buried the body of Robert DOUHERTY, a soldier with the 2nd Battalion of the Royal Regiment, native of Ballyfeble, County Antrim, Ireland, killed 14 December in the battle of St-Eustache, age 23. Among those killed during the Rebellion of 14 December, the parents failed to report the death of Alexis, age 14 years, said to have died in the same battle, son of Alexis LACHANCE, a laborer, and the late Reine LIRET, his mother, of this parish.

Soon after, the priest, Messire Jacques PAQUIN, curator of St-Eustache, Riviere-du-Chene, of the District of Montreal, asked the Judge of the District Court to "honor that at the time of the burning of the church, the sacristy, and the rectory of the parish on 14th December instant, the registers of deaths, baptisms, and marriages for 1 January 1837 to this day, were destroyed. It is impossible to be able to verify all of the same acts." He requested to be allowed to reconstruct the registers with the aid of the people involved. The Judge granted the permission.

The best account of the Patriots of the Rebellion has been written by Aegidius Fauteux in "Patriotes de 1837-1838", Les Editions Des Dix, Montreal, 1950. Written in French, the work contains biographies of the Patriots and their families. After many letters and returned checks, a copy was finally purchased. \$7.50 (soft-cover) from the Librairie Garneau Ltée, 333 ouest 55e Rue, Charlesbourg, Quebec G1G 5N7.

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#### NOVA SCOTIA AIDS

Inventory of Manuscripts in the Public Archives of Nova Scotia, Halifax 1976, is available for \$15.85 from the Public Archives of Nova Scotia, Coburg Road, Halifax, Nova Scotia B3H 1Z9. Family material such as documents, letter, genealogies, lease, indenture, etc. is listed, with a great many of the families having a number of items (i.e. the ALLEN surname has eight). The surnames are too numerous to list here. Also given are the church and community records held in the Archives, as well as many other categories. 703 pages showing the holdings of the Archives, this is an invaluable aid to the genealogist.

Recently brought to my attention: Centre D'Etudes Acadiennes, Universite de Moncton, Moncton, New Brunswick E1A 3E9. Correspondance should be directed to Stephen A. WHITE. This is an "Acadian Archives" holding copies from the Public Archives, family papers, maps, journals, periodicals, photographs, Acadian folklore etc.

Also found in early (Volume 1) issues of the publications of the Nova Scotia Archives, were "a list of the families of English, Swiss, etc. which have been settled in Nova Scotia since the year 1749, and who now are settlers in the places hereafter mentioned." (July 1752); "a list of the settlers who came out with Governor Cornwallis to Chebucto in June 1749", listed by ship, and giving occupation, number of children and servants, and Regiment.

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## THE URBAIN TESSIER DIT LAVIGNE STORY

Urbain Tessier dit Lavigne was certainly one of the most prominent among Montreal's pioneers and citizens. Remarkable for his courage in defending the embryonic town against the unending attacks of the Iroquois, he deserved to see his name appear on the old maps which indicate the "place Lavigne", and the "bastion Lavigne". The "Rue St. Urbain" would further recall the location of the grant, situated outside the town, which Urbain Tessier had received in 1651 from the Company of Montreal. As to the arpent which he had received at the same time, within the town, it included the greater part of the present "Place d'Armes, the site of the Bank of Montreal and the lots which "Rue St-Jacques" cuts through, to the east. The tourist can read, sculptured into a building block of the facade of "The Royal Trust Company, Rue St-Jacques", the following inscription... "This building is erected on part of the original concession to Urbain Tessier dit Lavigne being the 8th grant made to an individual in the island of Montreal."

The above paragraph was originally written in French and is the property of the Quebec Provincial Archives. The original author was the Rev. Archange Godbout, and the story was published in the "Memoires of the Societe Genealogique Canadienne-Francaise". The original story is some 15 pages in length and deals with the life and times of Urbain Tessier, in the middle 17th century. Urbain Tessier died on March 21, 1689 and under normal conditions his story should also come to an end. This was not to be the case. More research material has come to my attention and it appears the Tessier story was not to die, but to lay dormant for close to 250 years. This is where my story is to begin. At the present time, my earliest dated material is a share of stock from the Tessier-Lavigne Corporation, dated August 15, 1930. Although I do not have all the documents pertaining to this story, the following can be surmised from the documents and letters in my possession.

It seems that in the 1920s a group of men gathered together to form a corporation in which they would attempt to prove that the land of Urbain Tessier was still owned by the descendants of Tessier. The idea behind the corporation was to sell stock, at the price of \$10.00 per share, to the Tessier descendants, with the idea in mind of taking this belief to court and proving the land ownership. According to the stock certificate in my possession, the capital stock of the company consisted of 4900 shares of common stock of the par value of ten dollars each. This stock certificate was issued to Edward GAGNE, my grandfather, on August 15, 1930.

On November 26, 1930, a letter was sent to Mrs. Emma ST. GEORGE from Emile FALARDEAU. From the reading of the letter, Mr. Falardeau is with the Tessier corporation. The letter, three pages in length, goes into some detail as to what the corporation is doing for the stock holders, and wondering why more heirs of the Tessier's do not buy into the corporation. On page 2, he describes the land claimed as "60 acres right in the center of Montreal, facing Notre Dame Church". It is 2 acres wide by 30 deep, and worth "millions and millions of dollars".

On March 5th, 1931, a financial report was sent to the share holders, showing an income of \$23,504.72, with disbursements of \$19,675.17 and cash on hand of \$3,839.55. The largest expense was for salaries and attorney fees. This report also indicates an election of Directors and a report of the attorneys. The final line of the report states "in order to continue the work and arrive at a final conclusion, the company thinks advisable to ask each shareholder to subscribe at least one more share".

Another meeting was held at Holyoke, Mass. and a letter dated May 22, 1932 was sent to Alice (Unknown) by Nelson J. BUCKWHEET of Huntington, Mass. Nelson BUCKWHEET takes the position that the "corporation" is a hoax and states his position to Hormidas TESSIER, the president. An interesting part of the letter states that lawyer GERMAIN, a former lawyer of the corporation, wrote to the Pope

regarding the case and the Pope advised "the fathers that if the case were real and the heirs proven, not to fight the case in any way, but to make payment". Two of the Tessiers (most likely with the corporation) met with Monsignor LABELL. This was to get the church support for the corporation. The Monsignor would have nothing to do with the case, however, till all the papers were in. It was also brought out that in the previous winter (1931-32) "detectives swooped down on the office of the corporation and seized the papers and books". The detectives gave the corporation a "clean bill" and the corporation was quick to point to this as "evidence that everything is on the level".

Between May 26, 1932 and April 3, 1933, five more "form" letters were sent to the heirs, begging for more money to complete the project. As previously stated, Edward GAGNE purchased one share of stock for ten dollars on August 15, 1930. There are also two receipts for money, one on June 15, 1931 for \$10.00 and another on May 13, 1933 for \$1.00. On April 28, 1968, Edward GAGNE died, possibly believing he had a chance at "millions and millions" of dollars. Edward's brother, Fred, still alive and in his 90s, still believes he has a "slim" chance of getting the money. While working on the family tree, I tried to trace this corporation in the hopes they may have done some honest genealogy to contact some of the heirs. The Canadian Department of Justice had no record of the Tessier-Lavigne Corporation. Urbain Tessier dit Lavigne was there, the land is there, and the descendants continue to increase. Is this the end of the story? I don't know. The last time, it only lay dormant for 250 years.

Ed note--The financial report of March 5, 1931, shows the following shareholders as elected corporate directors: Hormisdas TESSIER, A. DAGNAIS, E. PRIMEAU, J.R. LEDUC, Nap. TESSIER of Holyoke, Mass., J.R. FAUBERT, J.E. LAPORTE, U. TESSIER and R.A. DIPLOCK.

For a complete story, in English, of the life of Urbain Tessier dit Lavigne, see the French Canadian And Acadian Genealogical Review, Volume 1, No. 3. Many of the readers of LOST IN CANADA? will be able to trace to this immigrant, as his descendants are many!

JOHNSTON GENEALOGY by Lorand V. JOHNSON, 17600 Parkland Drive, Shaker Heights, OH  
44120. This is a most interesting and valuable book for anyone of the line (ascend-  
ing or descending) of Alderman Robert Johnson, "the devious Scot, and Assistant  
treasurer of the Virginia Company" (early 1600s). It was sent to me with reference  
made to page 190 on which appears The Johnston Legend. I will copy this fascinating  
poem with Dr. Johnson's comments.

"The members of the ancient Border Clan are said to be still distinguished (as were  
the house of Rowan of Rohan) by a peculiar tuft of hair, by the growth of a single  
lock of a lighter color than the rest of the covering of the head. How this came  
to pass was thus:

In time so far the guiding star  
Of written history fails;  
Ere a Bruce was known in the halls of Scone,  
Or a Norman Prince of Wales.  
Where Griffer shades wild glens and glades,  
And where bright Solway ran,  
By bow and bend and red right hand  
Lived a stalwart Border Clan.  
  
Ere the Anevin King from whose blood we spring,  
To the three crowned kingdom clomb  
With a host arrayed for a fierce crusade,  
The Johnstone was found in Rome.  
"No priest or Pope with cowl or cope  
Shall dompt the belted plaid;  
To the old man there in up-borne chair  
I will not kneel" he said.  
  
On waving plumes on incense fumes,  
Showed the cressets' fitful glare;  
And the silver clang of the trumpet rang  
As on came the Pontiff's chair.  
Like the wave that floats o'er a field of oats  
When a stormy gust sweeps by  
Sank plumed crest o'er mail clad breast  
As the stately train drew nigh.  
  
As the sturdy oak braves the levin's stroke  
Stood the Scot when the crosses came;  
Here each taper here a glancing spear,  
To kneel would be a shame.



"Down, warrior, down" with sullen frown  
 Cried an old, old Cardinal,  
 "Why kneelst thou not, accursed Scot?"  
 Asked the stony glance of all.

So close he pressed, his eagle crest,  
 Was brushed by the feather fan,  
 "Now what doth he seek with the unblanced cheek  
 A blessing or a ban?"  
 A beaten ever of silver pure  
 (The city and the world  
 As he passed to bless) his Holiness  
 At the stalwart Northman hurled.

The bonnet blur that magic dew  
 Of holy water mocks,  
 On plaid or face it leaves no trace,  
 But it stained the auburn locks.  
 Can water burn? To gold they turn  
 On the brow of the Johnstone bold,  
 And his gallant sons, so the legend runs,  
 Are still marked by a LOCK OF GOLD.

This 15th century poem was obtained from the Hon. Judge A.W. SAVARY of Annapolis Royal, N.S. sometime between 1903 and 1908 by Virgil JOHNSTON.  
 Poem written ca 1605 by Rev. John JOHNSTON of Crimond—first Professor of Old Testament at St. Andrews College. Who was Judge A.W. SAVARY? A JOHNSTON descendant of Rev. John J? Does anyone have any suggestions as to how to identify the judge?

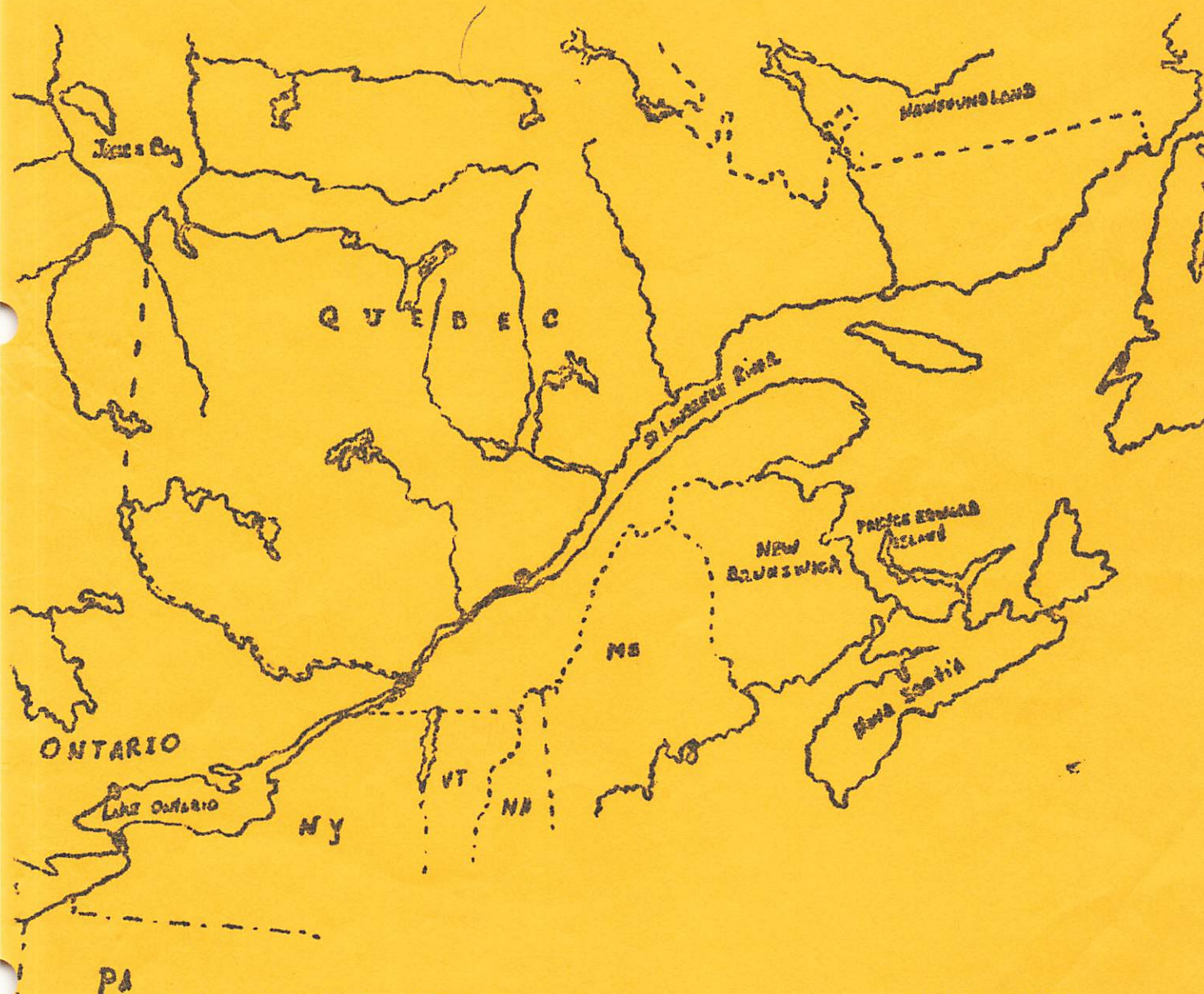

## LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

Unbelievable to me that three years of publication has gone by so quickly. This business has grown by leaps and bounds and has become a full-time job. Fortunately, I was able to ease out of my former part-time work as an X-Ray tech without a jolt to either the hospital or myself. My office will be remodeled to make room for the many books acquired in this time--books from which I am willing to share information with subscribers. Your generous donations to the Book Fund as well as continuing support have made all this possible. If you do not hear from me for a while, remember that the correspondence stack grows every day and with more resources available, I spend more time answering each one--a never-ending spiral. I have noted recently quite a number of SAEs--Self Addressed Envelopes without the stamp attached. At first I thought it due to oversight, but I am receiving a disturbing number. Please check your correspondence and SASE to be sure you included the stamp.

Many subscriptions expire with this issue and I tried to put notices in only those envelopes, but mistakes are bound to occur. If your address label has 34 in the lower right corner, your subscription has expired. The annual index appears and I remind you that a name may appear more than once on a page. If you see a name of interest and don't have that issue, consult the Key to see which one it is, and you may order it. There are limited numbers of back issues, but most are in print.

May I apologize for the poor quality of printing in recent issues? Equipment gremlins are at work and repairmen are not. I am still waiting for a stencil platen (to replace the new one that is too soft to make good impressions) but had to go ahead with the present one or be way off the deadline.

Many have asked where to find articles and stories of the early colonists to Quebec. A few sources are suggested here (the majority in French) and the obvious one is the French-Canadian and Acadian Genealogical Review in English. Filles Du Roi, La Grande Recrue (of 1653), Passagers du Saint-Andre (1659), Tourouvre et Les Juchereau, Emigration Rochelaise en Nouvelle France, and many government publications. If you consult Your Ancient Canadian Family Ties, be sure to check the bibliography used for that immigrant. If Tanguay was the only source, double check to see that Tanguay had found the particular act, rather than arriving at a date by deduction, as was so often the case. Especially in the case of a marriage, for when the act was eventually found, he had frequently given the wrong parents to the couple. J.-Arthur Leboeuf's Complement au Dictionnaire Genealogique Tanguay (3 volumes) should always be used, and published marriage indexes are the best source for searching for the missing link. Once the marriage is found, baptisms can be sought in that area.

A Canadian subscriber commented recently that the help seemed to be going one-way. I again urge American readers to see if they can help with information from their area of residence. It has to be as difficult for a Canadian to obtain information from here as is the reverse, and we have to show that we value their assistance to us. The Golden Rule is paramount in genealogy.

Was it the success of "Roots" that has prompted the increasing interest in genealogy, or the fact that people are finally getting around to what had been put off for a more convenient time? Possibly some are becoming aware of the growing tendency of states to close their records to the public. This frightening situation has now popped up in Wisconsin and raises visions of future generations being deprived of knowledge of their personal history. "How can you know where you're going, if you don't know where you been?" (to paraphrase a character in "Roots") is more than a catchy line. Events of the past have always shaped the future and intelligent people search out those events. It seems ironic that we would close the celebration of our country's Bi-Centennial with such acts.

It has become apparent that more and more researchers are interested in education as well as only finding the answers to their own particular line. This is the most encouraging sign of all and indicates a solid approach to genealogy. My hope is that you find your answers along the way. GOOD HUNTING!

## THE KING'S DAUGHTERS (Seventh of a series)

If the French-Canadians were dominated by the characteristics of any one of the ancient provinces of France it was probably Normandy.

This large area, now organized into the departments of Orne, Calvados, Manche, Eure, and Seine-Maritime in modern France, was the duchy granted by Charles the Simple to Hrolfr (Rollo), son of Ragnald, jarl of More, a Danish subject believed to be of Norwegian blood.

The area of the ancient province varied over the centuries as it was dominated by the ancient Celtic and Frankish tribes. It became part of the Roman empire under Julius Caesar, but was occupied by the Franks by the 5th century. It then became part of the Merovingian kingdom before falling first to the Carolingians and then the Normans.

Roughly, it included the region of France bordered by the English Channel on the North, by the provinces of Picardy and the Ile-de-France on the east, Maine to the south, and Brittany to the west.

Normans, a corruption of the name Nortmanni (Northmen), was the name for the Vikings from Scandinavia who pillaged throughout Europe and Asia in the years between 800 and 1050. At first the name was used universally but then became the name of first the Vikings who settled in the duchy and then to the peoples with which they mixed.

The Vikings had at first been content to pillage the lands they visited, but by the time of Rollo, the pirate raids were ending because Vikings ruled all the easily reached lands and no longer permitted the raids. They did welcome settlement and thousands of their countrymen swarmed to the new territories.

The Norman breed of Vikings remained the most vigorous of all the bands who stretched in two arcs, on the east through Russia to the Black Sea, and in the west from Norway to southern Italy. By the mid-11th century, William the Bastard, fifth duke of Normandy and descendent of Rollo, made himself king of England and the sons of Tancred, seigneur of Hauteville, helped themselves to southern Italy and Sicily, their descendants eventually becoming kings there.

For several centuries after William, Normandy was the bone of contention between his descendants ruling in England and the French kings. There were constant influxes of English soldiers, merchants, and churchmen for several centuries. The lot of the landless would have made the challenge of the sea and finally New France a welcome one and the majority of the early arrivals in the New World were Normans who established their variation of French language, architecture, customs, and government as the pattern in New France.

The Normans had a genius for adaption and a strange mixture of the Viking traits of savagry and individualism that made them perfect settlers of the New World. Little wonder that among the filles du roi, women of Normandy were the second most numerous group.

Catherine BOURGEOIS, born at Rouen, daughter of the deceased Thomas BOURGEOIS and Marie PETIT, who married Rene BINET 19 Oct 1667 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 300 pounds.

Marie BREMAILLE, widow of Michel LANGLOIS and daughter of the deceased Charles BREMAILLE and Catherine TOUROUVRE of Faucarmour, who married Jacques DOUBLET 22 Jan 1667 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 300 pounds.

Marie CAILLET, born at Rouen, widow of Pierre LAFRANCE and daughter of the deceased Nicolas CAILLET and Madeleine LAINY, who married Pierre PASQUET (JACQUET) in the spring of 1668 in the area of the Ile of Orleans.

Marie CAMPION, born at Rouen, daughter of Pierre CAMPION and the deceased Marguerite HENAUT, who married Mathurin DUBE 3 Sept 1670 at Ste-Famille. She had a dowry of 200 pounds.

Michelle CHARTIER, born at St-Maclou of Rouen, daughter of the deceased Jacques CHARTIER and Marguerite LATOUCHE, who 1/m Masse BEGNIE in Oct, 1668 around Champlain; 2/m Laurent CASTEL 23 Jan 1684 at Champlain.

Isabelle FRESSSEL, born in Monancourt, daughter of the deceased Jacques FRESSSEL and Isabelle DESLANDES, who married Francois HEMERIO (MOREAU) dit BELAIR 30 Oct 1671 at Montreal. She had a dowry of 350 pounds including 50 pounds from the king.

Anne GIRARD, born in Vandreuill, daughter of Michel GIRARD and Francoise GOUSSARD, who married Nicolas DAUDELIN 22 Oct 1665 at Chateau-Richer.

Anne GODEBY, born in Dieppe, daughter of the deceased Laurent GODEBY and Marie MORIN, who married Julien TALUA 7 Oct 1669 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 100 pounds, 50 from the king. In 1684 at Lachine, TALUA killed Antoine ROY dit DESJARDIN of Batiscan when he found ROY in bed with Mme TALUA. TALUA was taken to Quebec, tried, but allowed to return to Montreal. Mme TALUA was tried for adultery and banished from the Ile of Montreal for life.



Anne-Marie GUEDON, born in Magny, daughter of Thomas GUEDON and Isabelle DE MARINNE, who married Gabriel BENOIST in Oct, 1665 in the Champlain area. She had a dowry of 200 pounds.

Marie-Madeleine GUILLEBOEUF, born in Rouen, daughter of Nicolas GUILLEBOEUF and Madeleine VAVILIN, who married Jean BLOUF 24 June 1669 at Montreal.

Catherine HUIELOT, born at St-Pierre of Rouen, daughter of the deceased Paulin HUIELOT and Jeanne LEFEBVRE, who married Jacques HARDY 1 Sept 1670 at Ste-Famille. Her dowry of 250 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Marguerite ITASSE, born at St-Simeon, daughter of Jean ITASSE and Marie LAPOIN (CAPON), who married Jacques AUBUCHON in Nov, 1667 in the Cap-de-la-Madeleine area.

Charlotte JOLIVET, born in Andresy, daughter of Louis JOLIVET and Louise BELLE-MANIERE, who 1/m Leonard GIRARDIN 12 Oct 1671 at Quebec, and 2/m Simon TRIAULT (TRILLAUX) 18 Oct 1688 at Iachine. She had a dowry of 350 pounds, including 50 from the king, at her first marriage.

Marguerite JOURDAIN, born in Boix-Robert, daughter of Claude JOURDAIN and the deceased Marguerite DE LA HAYE, who 1/m Bernard DELPESCHES 25 Nov 1667 at Montreal; 2/m Louis MAILHOT 8 Jan 1689 at Repentigny.

Marguerite LANAIN, born in Rouen, daughter of Jacques LANAIN and Marguerite DESHAIES, who 1/m Michel ROGNON dit LAROCHE 14 Sept 1670 at Quebec; 2/m Pierre MERCIER 8 May 1685 at Pte-aux-Trembles (Quebec). Her first marriage dowry of 350 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Jacqueline LANGLOIS, born in La Roche-Guyon, daughter of the deceased Claude LANGLOIS and Jacqueline GAUTIER, who 1/m Jean LEE 19 Nov 1668 at Montreal; 2/m Gilles GALIPEAU 30 Sep 1678 at Montreal.

Marie LANGLOIS, born in Dieppe, daughter of Francois (Thomas) LANGLOIS and Marie NUTVILLE, who married Jean POIRIER dit LAJEUNESSE 18 March 1668 at Montreal. She had a dowry of 200 pounds.

Francoise L'ARCHEVEQUE, born in Rouen, daughter of Adrien L'ARCHEVEQUE and Francoise RUEINS, who married Jean DUBUC 14 Jan 1668 at Quebec.

Marie LASNON, born in Rouen, daughter of the deceased Gilles LASNON and Colette LAISIE, who 1/m Pierre FERRE 24 Nov 1667 at Quebec; 2/m Pierre LEDOUX dit LATREILLE 8 May 1701 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 300 pounds at her first marriage.

Marie LE BRUN, born at St-Jacques of Dieppe, daughter of the deceased Jacques LE BRUN and Marie MICHEL, who married Pierre BARBARIN dit GRANDHAISON 24 Feb 1668 at Montreal.

Genevieve LECLERC, born at Dernetal, daughter of the deceased Marin LECLERC and Genevieve JULIEN, who married Laurent POIRE 26 Nov 1671 at Quebec. Her dowry of 350 pounds included 50 pounds from the king.

Antoinette LEFEBVRE, born at Charny, daughter of Charles LEFEBVRE and Louise PRUD'HOMME, who married Hilaire LIMOUSIN 9 Nov 1671 at Quebec. Her dowry of 450 pounds included a gift of 50 pounds from the king.

Barbe LEFEBVRE DE LA CROIX, born at St-Vincent, daughter of the deceased Jacques LEFEBVRE DE LA CROIX and Barbe THIEULIN, who married Mathurin GOGUET (BOYER, DODIER) 14 Jan 1669 at Montreal.

Marie LEFEBVRE, born at St-Vivien, daughter of the deceased Jacques LEFEBVRE and Marguerite CAPUT, who married Jean DE L'ASTINE 15 Oct 1669 at Quebec. Her dowry of 200 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Francoise LE FRANCOIS, born at Ouville, daughter of the deceased Antoine LE FRANCOIS and Pasquette RENARD, who married Francois LEVERGNE 19 Oct 1671 at Quebec. Her dowry of 350 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Antoinette LE GRAND, born at Eu, daughter of the deceased Jean LE GRAND and the deceased Nicole PION, 1/m Nicolas PREUNIER 3 Oct 1669 at Quebec; 2/m Francois NEFVEU dit LACROIX in 1691 in the St-Ours area.

Madeleine LE GUAY, born at St-Jean of Rouen, daughter of the deceased Rolin LE GUAY and the deceased Anne LAMARE, who married Jean GARNIER 6 Nov 1668 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 200 pounds.

Anne LE MAITRE, born at St-Remy of Dieppe, widow of Louis ROY, who married the widower Adrien BLANQUET 7 Nov 1663 at Quebec. She came to New France with her married son Nicolas ROY (LE ROY).

Catherine LE MESLE, born at St-Pierre-de-Chatel, daughter of the deceased Jean LE MESLE and Marguerite RENARD, who married Pierre MORIN 13 June 1672 at Quebec. Her dowry of 200 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Jeanne LE ROY, born at Cherbourg, widow of Etienne BOUVET and daughter of Nicolas LE ROY and Madeleine BELFOND, who married Jean PALARDEAU dit ST-JEAN around 1670 in the Richelieu area.

Marie LE SAINT, born at Nantes, daughter of the deceased Pierre LE SAINT and Martine BOULEAU, who married Etienne MARANDA 26 Nov 1671 at Quebec. Her dowry of 450 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Jeanne LEVASSEUR, born at St-Eloi of Rouen, daughter of the deceased Nicolas LEVASSEUR and Catherine LE FORTIER (LE FORESTIER), who married Barthelemy TESSON 24 Oct 1667 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 300 pounds.

Catherine LOUVET, born at Rouen, daughter of Abraham LOUVET and Marie DAVID, who married Guillaume BRASSARD 15 Feb 1672 at Quebec.

Marie MAJOR, born at St-Thomas of Touques, daughter of the deceased Jean MAJOR and the deceased Marguerite LE PELE, who married Antoine ROY dit DESJARDINS 11 Sept 1668 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 300 pounds.

Marie MALO, born at Bailliard, daughter of the deceased Jacques MALO and Marie CARTIER (CARTENE) who married Jacques BOIN (BRIN) dit LA PENSEE 20 Sept 1670 at Chateau-Richer. Her dowry of 450 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds.

Anne MASSON ( LE MASSON), born at Alonne, daughter of the deceased Nicolas MASSON and Martine BERTIN, who married Robert GALLIEN 8 Sept 1670 at Quebec. Her gift of 250 pounds included a gift of 50 pounds from the king.

Marie MICHEL, born at St-Vivien of Rouen, daughter of Pierre MICHEL and Catherine DUBOCQ, who married Charles MORIN 3 Nov 1667 at Quebec.

Madeleine OLIVIER, born at Caudebec, daughter of the deceased Jean OLIVIER and the deceased Louise PREVOST, who married Thomas ROUSSEAU 5 Oct 1667 at Quebec.

Elizabeth PROVOST (FOUCAULT), born at Rouen, daughter of the deceased Adrien PROVOST and Marie LE BLOND, who married Jean FRANCOIS dit FOUCAULT 14 Nov 1671 at Quebec. Her dowry of 350 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds. Elizabeth was a sister of Marguerite PROVOST.

Jeanne QUELUE, born at Evreux, daughter of the deceased Jean QUELUE and Marie CAMUS, who married Jean-Baptiste BRASSARD 26 April 1672 at Quebec.

Marie QUEQUEJEU, born at Alencon, daughter of the deceased Denis QUEQUEJEU and Louise DU CHESNAY, who married Pierre RIVAUT 30 Oct 1667 at Quebec. After becoming a widow, Mme RIVAUT was condemned to death and executed in May, 1684. The details are lost but her son-in-law, Pierre DORET, a coureur de bois, was executed at the same time.

Marthe QUITTEL, born at Rouen, daughter of Denys QUITTEL and Louise BENARD, who married Barthelemy VERREAU dit LE BOURGUIGNON 22 Sept 1665 at Chateau-Richer.

Catherine RELOT, born at St-Georges-du-Chateau, daughter of Olivier RELOT and Jeanne ROUSSEL, who married Charles BADIE dit LA FOREST 24 April 1668 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 300 pounds.

Marguerite RICHER, born at Rouen, daughter of Pierre RICHER and Anne LARICOUR, who married Jean VERDOI 19 Sept 1672 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 200 pounds.

Madeleine RIOULT, born at La Ronde, daughter of the deceased Thomas RIOULT and Marguerite de LA FOSSE, who married Louis LAVALLEE (VALLEE) 10 Sept 1673 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 200 pounds.

Anne RIVET, born at Sees, widow of Gregoire HISSE, who 2/m Rene OUELLET (HOELLET) 8 March 1666 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 300 pounds.

Marie ROBINEAU, born at Dieppe, widow of Jean ROBERT and daughter of the deceased Hubert ROBINEAU and Marie HIGHAUD, who married Jean-Pierre FORGUE dit MONTROUGEAU 16 Oct 1668 at Quebec. A date in her marriage contract shows she arrived in New France in 1667.

Charlotte ROUSSEL, born at Evreux, daughter of the deceased Thomas ROUSSEL and Barbe POISSON, who married Pierre GAUTIER dit SAGUINGOIRA 12 Nov 1668 at Montreal.

Marguerite ROUSSEL, born at Rouen, daughter of the deceased Jean ROUSSEL and Louise IDENI, 1/m Hathurin DUCHESNON dit DES LAURIERS 26 Sept 1673 at Quebec; 2/m Etienne BUREL 10 Oct 1682 at Cap St-Ignace. She had a dowry of 200 pounds for her first marriage.

Anne SEIGNEUR (LE SEIGNEUR), born at St-Haclou of Rouen, daughter of the deceased Guillaume SEIGNEUR and Marguerite SERRE, who married Jean BESSY in July, 1668 at Port Chambly.

Marie SELLE, born at Bois-Guillaume, daughter of the deceased Guillaume SELLE and Marguerite D'ORRESNIL, 1/m Nicolas GUILLET 17 Oct 1667 at Quebec; 2/m Vincent BERTIAU 19 Aug 1711 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 200 pounds at her first marriage.

Catherine SENEGAL, born at Benonville near Havre-de-Grace, daughter of Adrien SENEGAL and the deceased Guillemette ROLEVILLE, who married Jean DE LAFOID dit MONGRIIN in Oct, 1670 in the Trois-Rivieres area.

Louise SENEGAL, born at St-Malo of Rouen, daughter of Pierre SENEGAL and Francoise GALLION, who married Pierre GUILBAUT 6 Oct 1667 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 100 pounds.

Madeleine TESTU, born at St-Sauveur of Rouen, daughter of the deceased Edme TESTU and Elizabeth DE LA COUR, who married Jean JOUBERT 4 Nov 1669 at Quebec. Her dowry of 250 pounds included the gift of 50 pounds from the king.

Catherine TOPSAN, born at Dieppe, daughter of Charles TOPSAN and Marie CLINAGE (CLAUENCE) who married Julien DUNOFF dit LAFLEUR 2 Nov 1667 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 300 pounds.

Madeleine VALLEE, born at St-Lo, daughter of Thomas VALLEE and Renee VALLEE, who married Jean HERPIN dit TOURANGEAU 3 Oct 1669 at Quebec. She had a dowry of 100 pounds.

Catherine VARIN, born at Limboeuf, daughter of the deceased Jean VARIN and Jeanne BOUCHE, married Pierre TESSIER (BESSIER) 5 July 1666 at Montreal.

Marie VARIN, born at Rouen, daughter of Robert VARIN and Marie L'APOTRE, who 1/m Rene DRAICHE in Oct, 1667 at Quebec; 2/m Pierre COUROIS dit LACROIX 9 Sept 1681 at Quebec; 3/m Anicet BOYER dit JOLICOEUR 21 Nov 1681 at Quebec.

Catherine VIEILLIOT, born at St-Vivien of Rouen, daughter of the deceased Francois VIEILLIOT and Catherine BLANC, 1/m Jacques DU BOIS 18 Oct 1667 at Quebec; 2/m Pierre GANET (GUNET) 19 May 1673 at Ste-Famille.

Marie-Therese VIEL, born at St-Candre-le-Viel, daughter of the merchant, Charles VIEL, and Marguerite LECHEVALLIER, who married Etienne BOYER dit LAFONTAINE 26 Oct 1671 at Quebec. Her dowry of 350 pounds included the king's gift of 50 pounds. Mme BOYER returned to France, possibly to claim her dowry, and returned in 1676 pregnant. The daughter was baptised 14 Jan 1677 at Quebec and Mme BOYER accused Medard CHOUART, sieur DES GROSEILLIERS, the companion of Pierre-Esprit RADISSON, of being the father. CHOUART admitted having relations with her but denied being the father, claiming she was seen with many men in La Rochelle. CHOUART was ordered to pay 200 pounds damages and Mme BOYER returned to her husband.

Marguerite VITRY, born at St-Martin-de-Garonne, daughter of the deceased Samuel VITRY and Marie DE LIANCOURT, who married Jacques DESRY dit LAROSE 13 Oct 1669 at Quebec. Her dowry of 200 pounds included a gift of 50 pounds from the king.

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# CHRIST CHURCH (ANGLICAN) DETROIT

Marriages abstracted from the records of Christ Church, Detroit MI, a Protestant Episcopal church dedicated 1849 and located at 960 East Jefferson Avenue. Due to it's proximity to the Detroit River (and therefore Windsor, Ontario) as well as being the American daughter of the established, or Anglican, Church, it is not surprising that Canadians seeking a church in the USA came here. These extracts cover the first 30 years of the parish. Some appear to be elopements while others show that one of the parties was an American, and only marriages involving a Canadian were extracted. The rectors of those years were the Reverends Benjamin PADDOCK, John BROWN, and H.G. HARRIS, and each entered different types of information into the records. Their wives and daughters frequently served as witnesses. Arranged alphabetically in this article, the number preceeding the act indicates the consecutive numbering of the marriage, not the page. The second list is of passengers of the ship Winchelsea, Thomas CORNISH, Master. This will be continued next issue with the passengers of the ships Wilmington, Merry Jacks, Alexander, Beaufort, Rochampton, Canning, Everley, London, Fair Lady, Baltimore, and Brotherhood. ## REFERENCE SHELF

ACADIAN EXILES IN THE COLONIES, copy for review, arrived the day after the July LOST IN CANADA? was mailed, and is a very welcome addition to the Reference Shelf. In conjunction with Janet Jehn's earlier works of ACADIAN DESCENDANTS, Volumes 1 & 2, this should aid the Acadian researcher considerably. She notes that most of those who were sent to the American colonies returned to Canada, the majority to Quebec, and also comments on those sent to France and to Halifax. Photocopies of actual records are reproduced as well as the typewritten translations. Contained (among many other items) are lists of French neutrals sent to New York 1756; Nova Scotia French in Marblehead; those sent to Boston 1760, 1761, and 1763; French inhabitants in Essex 1760; French neutrals in Middlesex Co. 1761; Acadians in Worcester and other places 1761; in Georgetown, Maryland 1763; Acadian families sent to Connecticut 1763; Acadians in New York; in Pennsylvania 1763; transported to South Carolina 1763; prisoners at Halifax 1763; and those to Guyana. This well-researched and documented work is available for \$20 from Janet Jehn, 863 Mayman Branch Road, Covington, KY 41015. Recommended for all research libraries as well as individuals.

THE EPISTLE, P.O. Box 398, Machias, ME 04654 is a monthly magazine for the RICE, BATCHELOR, and CARPENTER families. Vol. IV, #1 (July 1977) contained 63 pages of family information and has to be a great bargain for researchers of these names at \$12.50 for the 12 issues.

WHATCOM (County, Washington) GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY BULLETIN, Vol. 7, #3 (March 1977) contains material of the area such as probate court day book, cemetery inscriptions, ancestor charts etc. Dues are \$4 per year and include the quarterly. P.O. Box 1493, Bellingham, WA 98225.

KINGSTON BRANCH, Ontario Genealogical Society, Box 1394, Kingston, Ontario K7L 5G6 publishes a monthly newsletter (except summer months). Write for details if you have an interest in that area. I do feel that researchers should join local groups when they have a strong interest in a particular place. Of value are the mentions of books and other materials to aid the searcher, and place name changes which can be very confusing to one unfamiliar with the locality.

THE YOUNG TITAN, by F. VanMyck Mason is a novel (not a new publication) that might interest persons involved in the early days of upper New England, New Brunswick, and Nova Scotia. I found this book very entertaining with a different perspective of the situation. Not necessarily recommended, but mentioned only for your information.

Another article worthy of mention and definitely recommended is in the April 1977 NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC. "One Canada - or Two?" is valuable for the photographs alone, but I very much enjoyed reading the writer's comments.

MIDWEST GENEALOGICAL REGISTER, Vol. XII, #1 (June 1977). Family and Bible records, settlers of Neosho Co, KS, a cemetery in Red Willow Co, NB and one in Van Wert Co, OH, tax rolls for Wellington, Sumner Co, KS, marriages in Sedgwick Co, KS, and the passenger list of the North German Bark Goeshe 3 Jul 1868. The Midwest Genealogical Society's address is Box 1121, Wichita, KS 67201. Dues are \$7 per year and include the quarterly.

"MICHIANA ROOTS" is a genealogy column appearing in the South Bend, IN Tribune each Sunday. It is dedicated to helping genealogists everywhere find their ancestors who may have lived in the northern Indiana-southern Michigan area. They print inquiries pertaining to ancestors from that region, and are also interested in any publications or services that would be of interest to readers. This service is free. As many inquiries may be included in one letter, and on one sheet of paper, as needed. They must, however, be numbered so that they can be separated. The queries for the past 4 years have been indexed and are available (for one surname) for SASIE. We invite inquiries and notices. Write: Michiana Roots, South Bend Tribune, 225 W. Colfax, South Bend, IN 46626.

THE AUGUSTAN - and others from 1617 West 261 Street, Harbor City, CA 90710, were shipped all at one time. Since they are all from the same publisher, I will review in one section. THE AUGUSTAN is the most familiar (these were the 78th through 81st issues) and is an excellent magazine devoted primarily to Heraldry. Also featured are lineages of royalty from many countries. The best way to benefit (it seems to me) is to be an involved member of the Augustan Society. Articles are always well researched and designed to educate. A few of the other issues were a bit disappointing, but I realize they are in early stages and will likely expand if response is sufficient. IRISH-AMERICAN GENEALOGIST, No. 8 (1977) had 16 pages. Of interest was the index to the emigrant cards submitted by readers, and an article about the Irish Genealogical Society.

SCOTTISH-AMERICAN GENEALOGIST, No. 8 (1977) 18 pages, had ancestral lines and several articles - one about MAC DONALD cairns in Nova Scotia.

THE ELYMOUTH COLONY GENEALOGIST, No. 7 (1977) 16 pages of information, including Genealogical References from the Journal of Peleg BURROUGHS 1780-1786.

THE COLONIAL GENEALOGIST, Vol. VII, #4 (30th issue) was much larger - about 70 pages - and had many articles and items of interest. As with the other special interest publications, this deals with early colonial immigrants to the USA.

SPANISH-AMERICAN GENEALOGIST, combined issue of Nos. 23-26 should be of much help to those searchers. There was a guide to the Archives and Libraries of Spain, and a list of commanders and soldiers at the Royal Presidio of San Gregorio de Cerralvo.

GERMANIC GENEALOGIST, also a combined issue of Nos. 9-12, was of particular interest to me, since all of my husband's lines and my paternal line are of that background. There was a lot of information, but also a disappointment when I read that "Readers are advised that Vol. 22 of the publication 'Beitrag zur Westfalischen Familienforschung' contains an indexed list of emigrants from the area of Westphalia under the jurisdiction of Munster in the 19th Century. In addition to the name and age of the emigrant, and that of the family members, it also gives the village where he lived before he emigrated." That was the extent of the item and left me frustrated that the source noted was not further identified. The publishers also have a magazine of French interest which I was especially eager to review, but neglected to include that one in the mailing. All in all, there is no question that there is much to help the researcher in these publications and are a great aid to education in genealogical research. Prices and other details have appeared in ads in other issues of LOST IN CANADA? and all can be ordered from the above address.

PROSPECTOR is the quarterly of the Clark County, Nevada Genealogical Society. Vol. 1, #3 (June 1977) contains 6 pages, mostly queries. As with many other new ventures of this kind, it takes time to grow and we will be watching for future issues to have primary records of the area. Dues were not stated, but you may write the Society at 4333 El Cid Circle, Las Vegas, NV 89121.

VINCENT FAMILY RECORDS, Volume 1, Census records prior to 1850. I have not seen the book, but a copy of two pages indicate that this should be quite valuable to anyone searching that surname. Censuses for many States in the years of 1790, 1800, 1810, 1820, 1825, 1830, 1835, 1840, 1845 were consulted, as well as 1825 Bedford Co, Lower Canada, 1831 Missisquoi and Shefford Cos, Quebec, 1842 Lincoln and London Cos, Canada West and Missisquoi Co, Quebec. About 80 pages, paperback 6 x 9 inches. Enumerates about 1500 VINCENTs and is completely indexed. \$4.00 postpaid from Mr. Sheridan E. Vincent, Box 7523, Rochester, NY 14615. Limited printing of 200.
