

LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

A question frequently asked by beginners to French-Canadian research is "What is the meaning of 'dit' names?" It seems a simple enough question, but the answer is a bit more involved. The word means "alias" or "called". In Quebec, many members of a family had the same given name, which created a confusion as to which Jean-Baptiste BRUNET (or whomever) was meant. They then received a dit name which was tacked onto the surname as a means of differentiation. The name chosen may have been a physical characteristic of the person, his occupation, a place of residence or former residence, or just a word that seems, now, to have had no particular connection with the individual. Not all members of a family used the same dit name, which confuses the issue further. For instance: one BRUNET brother may use the dit name of LETANG while the other is called CARISSE. On the other hand, he may sometimes be recorded as BRUNET dit LETANG (or BRUNET-LETANG) while at other times he is known as BRUNET and again as only LETANG. The many variations of a surname must always be considered when searching for that elusive ancestor. And remember that women retain their maiden name forever.

This then brings up some of the other problems in Quebec research that I have been asked. My first advice is to forget what you have learned about American (or Ontario) research. The most important record to find is the marriage of a couple. This is the simplest way to go about it, because so many marriage records have been published, and the parents names for both bride and groom are given, as well as the residence if other than where married. Then you may write the priest of that parish in an attempt to locate the baptism of their children. For the most part, baptismal and burial records of parishes have not been published. although there are exceptions in the case of burials. Most priests ask \$4 per record, but I have seen instances where he took a particular interest in the family and sent pages of material. Because fire destroyed the early records of the church of Notre-Dame in Quebec about 1640 (they were reconstructed from memories) it has since been required that parishes deposit duplicate registers with the Protonotaire of the District. Some of these registers are now housed at one of three National Archives located in the cities of Quebec, Trois-Rivieres, and Montreal. However, you cannot ask a priest or anyone else to randomly search for your family records. You must have a location and close time era. Try to locate the marriage record in a published repertoire first. Sending a query to LOST? has produced results for many genealogists who said they had spent years looking for that information - how I wish that were true for every subscriber!

This is just a light skimming of the basic difference in French-Canadian research. An excellent talk on the subject was given by Anita Coderre G.R.S. at a meeting of the Ottawa Branch of the Ontario Genealogical Society. It was then published by that group, and I highly recommend it to you who are still scratching your heads and wondering where to turn next. It is publication # 77-2 and sells for \$1.25 from the above organization - address in the Exchange Shelf section.

Now - how do we locate an ancestor in Quebec of Protestant background?! Apparently letters to various places such as churches, Anglican Archives etc. are going unanswered. If you have had experience in this area that met with success, please share your information with us.

At the risk of repeating myself, I urge you to send one, because it is impossible for anyone to help you if the problem isn't known. Try to include at least an approximate time era, and location (if known). Even some unheard-of place names can be translated into an actual spot on the map.

THE KING'S DAUGHTERS (Eighth of a series)

A large number of our ancestors appear in Canada in the Seventeenth Century out of nowheres.

Many had fld Acadia where their records were destroyed by the British and Americans. But almost as many were settlers in the wild areas in and around Richelieu, Sorel, and Berthier, and some areas in the Trois Rivieres region.

These areas, plus Montreal, possibly because they bore the blunt of the Iroquois attacks over a period of decades, have the worst record for missing documents.

The large majority of our ancestors march in such an orderly procession back to their origins in France that it is disheartening to find even a few that do not. But it is still possible that at some time in the near future, documents will be uncovered that will reveal some additional information. It seems unlikely that everything has been returned to light.

Still, it is unlikely that more than a few of the filles du roi listed here will ever be completely identified. Many would be completely unknown except that they appear in documents of other French-Canadians.

In some cases, the documents exist but are nearly unreadable. This is saying a lot. Anyone who has seen many of the originals or photocopies of them will understand how difficult it is to read them. It would be beyond the ability of most Americans, even those well-versed in French. The task takes special training.

Because of this, it is entirely possible that additional facts will show up. In this chapter's list, many of the marriages are pinpointed principally by the Census of 1631. The age of the oldest child gives an approximate year of marriage. The place of residence gives an approximate place of marriage.

Typical of an incomplete marriage record is that of Genevieve PLEMAREST who married Antoine REGNAULT dit LE TAMBOUR Jan. 11, 1666 at Montreal. The marriage document gives her parentage, Pierre PLEMAREST and Catherine DERMONTRE, and we know she was literate. She signed the document. But it fails to mention her origin and no dowry contract has ever come to light.

Typical, too, of how marriages have been pieced together are the two marriages of Marie LE ROUX. She is present at the marriage of Marie Anne BEAUMONT Oct. 23, 1673 and in M1le BEAUMONT's dowry contract is listed as the wife of Jacques ENAUD. The only reason we know she married a second time is that Pierre BORNEUF is recorded as her widower in the marriage contract of her son by the first marriage, Pierre ENAUD dit CANADA.

Again, in some documents, we learn Jeanne FOURIER is the daughter of Pierre FOURIER and Jeanne BUSSON. But her marriage documents have never been found and we do not know her origin. She married Francois VANASSE around 1671, the oldes of their children are listed in the 1681 census as 9. And in a civil contract of Aug. 2, 1671 she is called the widow of Jean BAILLON so we know there had to be an earlier marriage. Since BAILLON was listed as unmarried in the census of 1666, we know it had to be after that and can pinpoint it roughly.

Filles du roi of unknown origins discussed in earlier articles included: Fleurance ASSERIN, Anne AUERY, Jeanne BARBERET, Marie Jeanne BEAUJEAN (GUICHONNE), Marie BENOIT, Jeanne BESNARD, Marie BILDEAU (PESCHER), and Etoinette LAMOUREAUX.

Others were:

Francoise BOIVIN who married Louis LAMOUREAU around 1668 in the region of Montreal. LAMOUREAU was single in the 1667 census and the couple's first child was baptised Sept. 14, 1669 at Montreal.

Marie BOVANT who married Jean LAFOND around 1670 in the Richelieu area. They had a child baptised May 6, 1671 at Sorel.

Marie BRIAU who married Pierre JOFFRION around 1669 in the Richelieu area. They had an 11 year old child in the 1681 census. Baptismal records of children of this family can be found at Varennes, Boucherville, and Contrecoeur.

Marie BRISET who apparently never married. She signed the wedding contract of another fille du roi, Marguerite COLET, then vanished from the records.

Jeanne CAILLE who married Jacques RENOUARD (also RENOUER and REIGNOIR de ST-ETIENNE) about 1670 in the Trois Rivieres area. One of their children was baptised in Trois Rivieres Feb. 26, 1672.

Jeanne CEDERET who married Pierre PICARD around 1668 in the Montreal area. They had an 11 year old child in the 1681 census.

Marguerite CHEMEREAU who married Jean PIETTE around 1669 in the Berthier area. They had an infant baptized Dec. 23, 1670 at Sorel.

Marie DAINE who married Francois MARQUET around 1669 in the Quebec area. MARQUET was unmarried in a 1666 census.

Marie DE BERUNINE who was present at both the wedding of Sebastiene NOLET and Jeanne AUGER, two other king's daughters, in 1671, but then vanishes from the records.

Jeanne DE CORPS who married Martin MASSE (or MACE) around 1670, in the Montreal area. In the 1681 census, they had a 10 year old child.

Catherine-Marguerite DE LA MARE who married Jean Francois BILLY (or DE BILLY) around 1670 at La Prade. They had a 9 year old child in the 1681 census.

Dianne DE LA MOTTE who was present at numerous weddings of king's daughters in 1671, but then vanishes from the records.

Jeanne DE LA MOTTE who married Jean COQUINEAU around 1672 in the Linctot seigneurie area. They show up in the 1681 census without children.

Francoise DE LASTRE (or LATIERE) who married Jean LEVERT Sept. 15, 1669 at Ste-Famille. It is known she had been previously married.

Catherine DE LA TOUR-ENVOIVRE who attended a number of weddings of king's daughters in 1671, then vanishes from the records.

Marie DESCHAMPS who married Marin MAREST around 1672 in the Cap-de-la-Madeleine area. They had an infant baptized at Louiseville Aug. 1, 1673. They are shown with two offspring in the 1681 census.

Marguerite DESHATES who married Pierre MENARD around 1670 in the Richelieu area. They had a 10 year old child in the 1681 census.

Marie DESHATES who married Adrien BETOURNE dit LAVIOLETTE around 1669 in the Montreal area. The couple had a 12 year old child in the 1681 census. Dumas swung to the belief that Marguerite and Marie DESHATES were sisters.

Anne D'OLLERY who married Thomas FREROT, sieur de la Chenaye, around 1669 in the Boucherville area. The couple had an 11 year old child in the 1681 census.

Simone DORIANT who married Jean HEBERT around 1665 in the Cap-de-la-Madeleine area. They appear without children in the 1667 census.

Elizabeth DURAND who was present at two weddings of king's daughters in 1670, then vanishes from the records.

Marguerite DUSSON who married Jean LA VALLEE around 1670 in the Sorel area. The couple had a 10 year old child in the 1681 census.

Michelle DUVAL who married Pierre BON dit LACOMBE around 1670 in the Richelieu area. They appear in the 1631 census and the age of their oldest child was listed as 9.

Francoise ENFRE who was present at two weddings of king's daughters in 1669, then vanishes from the records.

Marie Anne FLEURE who attended the wedding of a king's daughter in 1673 but is unheard of after that date.

Francoise GEREMIE who signed a civil document to marry Pierre DE LAVOYE in 1667. The document hasn't been found, but was indexed, and apparently it was annulled. There is no record of her after this date.

Marie-Marthe GEOFFROY who signed the wedding contract of a fille du roi in 1673, then vanishes from the records.

Marguerite GIRARD who 1/m Pierre FORCIER around 1675 in the Sorel area, and 2/m Rene Abraham DESMARETS Nov. 30, 1690 at St-Francois du Lac. Marguerite and Pierre are recorded in the 1681 census with a 5 year old child.

Marie GRANDIN (or BINARD) who 1/m Michel MORAL dit PARISIEN around 1669 in the Trois Rivieres area, and 2/m Claude ROBILLARD around 1672, also in the Trois Rivieres area. In the 1681 census, Marie and Claude's oldest child is 8 years old. A child of the first marriage is listed as 11 year old.

Jeanne GRIAUX who married Jacques PIGEON around 1670 in the Montreal area. In the 1681 census, they are recorded with a 10 year old son.

Marie Charlotte HUBERT (or HEBER) who 1/m Jean LE SIEUR around 1672 in the Trois Rivieres area, and 2/m Louis DEFOY around 1694 in the Batiscan area. Marie Charlotte and Jean's oldest child is recorded as 8 in the 1681 census.

Jacqueline LABBE who married Mathurin COLIN (HIVIN) dit LALIBERTE around 1669 in the Montreal area. They are listed with an 11 year old child in the 1681 census.

Marie LAMY who 1/m Francois CHEVREFILS dit LALIME around 1670 in the Richelieu area and 2/m Jean DUVAL around 1679 around St-Ours. Marie and Francois had at least three sons and a daughter. In the 1681 census, Marie and Jean DUVAL are recorded as having a 1 year old child.

Marie LANGELIER (L'ANGELIER) who married Vivien ROCHELEAU around 1672 in the Trois Rivieres area. In the 1681 census their oldes child is listed as 8.

Elizabeth LANGUILLE who married Rene LANCELEUR around 1668 in the Montreal area. They had an infant baptized Feb. 7, 1670 at Montreal.

Anne LE PER (or LE BER) who married François PINSONNEAU dit LAFLEUR around 1673 in the Richelieu area. Their oldest child in the 1681 census was listed as 7 years old.

Anne LECLERC who married Vincent CHRETIEN around 1668 in the Quebec area. Their oldest child in the 1681 census was 12.

Jeanne LECOMPTE who 1/m Adrien SENECAL around 1670 in the Trois Rivieres area, and 2/m Julien GUILLOU Jan. 8, 1689 at Boucherville. Jeanne and Adrien are recorded in the 1681 census and their oldest child is listed as 11.

Marguerite LECOMTE who attended the wedding of a king's daughter in 1673, then vanishes from the records.

Suzanne LECOMTE who married Francois ARSENEAU around 1665 in the Trois Rivieres area and died Dec. 24, 1666 at Cap-de-la-Madeleine in childbirth.

Louis LE LOUTRE (or LECOUTRE) who married Nicolas CREVIER, sieur de Bellerive, around 1665 in the Cap-de-la-Madeleine area. They appear in the 1666 census with a 3 month old child.

Marie LE PREVOST who 1/m Jacques VOYNE around 1671 in the Montreal area and 2/m Etienne FORESTIER Nov. 20, 1701 at Varennes. Marie and Jacques are recorded in the 1681 census with their oldest child listed as 10.

Marie LE ROUX who 1/m Jacques ENAUD around 1667 in the Richelieu area and 2/m Pierre BORNEUF at an unknown date and place.

Jeanne LE TELLIER (LEFELLE) who married Mathurin GERBERT dit DE LA FONTAINE Jan. 26, 1670 on the Ile d'Orleans.

Marie LIMCGES who married Noel LAURENCE Nov. 3, 1667 at Trois Rivieres.

Anne MABILE who married Claude SALOIS around 1666 in the Ile d'Orleans area. They had an infant baptized May 13, 1667 at the Ile d'Orleans.

Marguerite MANCHON who married Sebastien PROVENCHER around 1663 in the Cap-de-la-Madeleine area. Their oldes offspring was listed as 17 in the 1681 census.

Marie MANIE (or MAGNIE) who 1/m Michel CHARTIER around 1665 in the Quebec area, and 2/m Louis JINCHÉREAU Jan. 7, 1673 at Ste-Famille. In the 1681 census, Marie and Michel are recorded with an infant age $1\frac{1}{2}$.

Isabelle MARTIN who married Jean OZANNES (or AUZOU, HOUSSEAU) around 1667 in the Trois Rivieres area. In the 1681 census, their oldest child is listed as 13.

Reyne MARTIN who signed a protest of the filles du roi at Dieppe in 1667 and was present at a wedding of a fille du roi in 1668, but vanishes from the records after that date.

Marie MASSERON (or MASSON) who married Francois MARCEL around 1671 in the Richelieu area. Their first infant was baptized June 1, 1673 at Sorel.

Marie MEUNIER who married Jacques HUDDE around 1666 in the Quebec area. They have a month-old child in the 1667 census.

Anne MICHEL who 1/m Jacques PAVIOT around 1667 in the Sorel area, and 2/m Jean MASSEAU dit ST-MARTIN in 1674 in the Contrecoeur area. In the 1681 census listing Anne and Jean, the oldest child of Anne and Jacques PAVIOT is recorded as being 12.

Charlotte MORIN who married Pierre LETENDRE (LEGENDRE) dit LALIBERTE around 1668 in the Berthier area. Their oldest child is listed as 12 in the 1681 census.

Marie Charlotte PEQUET who married Rene RICHARD around 1671 in the Richelieu area. She was probably a widow when she had a son, Julien, baptized July 29, 1678 at Quebec, "father unknown."

Nicole PHILIPPAU who married Mathurin GAUTHIER dit LANDREVIILE around 1671 in the Montreal area. Their first child was baptized June 28, 1672 at Montreal.

Anne RABADY who married Antoine LESCUIER around 1671 in the Trois Rivieres area. Their oldest child in the 1681 census was 8.

Marguerite RAISIN who married Bernard DE NIGER dit SANSSOUCY around 1670 in the Richelieu area. Their oldest child was recorded as 11 in the 1681 census.

Marie RENAUD who married Charles PETIT around 1669 in the Quebec area.

Suzanne ROUSSEAU who married Pierre JOUINEAU around 1667 in the Trois Rivieres area. Suzanne died April 8, 1681 at Champlain. In the 1681 census, the oldest of two daughters of Suzanne and Pierre was listed as 11.

Marguerite SAMSON who married Jean BOUGRAND dit CHAMPAGNE around 1671 in the Sorel area. In the 1681 census, their oldest child is listed as 9.

Jeanne TAVANELLE who married Jacques DE LA BARRE around 1672 in the Berthier area. In the 1681 census they are recorded with one child, 8.

Jeanne TOUSSAINT who married Noel CARPENTIER around 1672 in the Trois Rivieres area. Their oldest child in the 1681 census was 8.

Marguerite VALLLANT who married Jean Pierre DANIAU around 1668 in the Trois Rivieres area.

Marie VARA who married Louis BARIBAULT dit LAMARCHE around 1670 in the Richelieu area. The 1681 census lists their oldest child as 9.

Proceedings and Transactions of the Royal Society of Canada, 1908, published the "History of the Queen's Rangers". This was a paper read 26 May 1908 by James HANNAY, D.C.L. It is a rather lengthy (53 pages) and complete story and the book is in my library. Miscellaneous early SMITH names in Chatham-St. Andrews

- Oliver SHITH b ca 1787, probably in Vermont, married in Franklin, VT 26 Feb 1807 to Rachel SCHAGEL. They were in Chatham in 1808, when their first son, Elijah, was baptized. There was no more mention of them in records until 1831, when four more children were baptized: Clarissa (1812), Lurena (1821), Caroline (1825), and Betsy (1827). In 1839 Roxina (Roxana?)(1832) and Julian (Julia Ann)(1834) were baptized. We think that Julia Ann is the Julien SHITH who was the wife of Robert DOUGLAS, but have not found the marriage record—just baptisms of daughters: Rachel (1858), Caroline (1859), and Hary Ann (1861). Oliver SHITH died in 1840 and Rachel married Joshua HILL in 1846.
- Isabella SHITH was the wife of Lemuel LINCOLN, and associated with the family of Aaron SCHAGEL in some way.
- Elizabeth SHITH was wife of John BATES. They were married before 1808 and were in the records with Oliver and Rachel SHITH.
- Elizabeth SHITH wife of James BATES. Their son Henry was baptized 10 Feb 1843 at Grenville.
- Alexander SHITH lived at "The Chute". Children: Hargaret (1819), Margaret (1821), Eleanor (1823), Isabel (1828). John WANLESS was witness for Eleanor.
- Cecelia SATTH, wife of George DOUGLASS. She was born 16 Aug 1816, died 9 Hay 1915. Son Jones DOUGLASS b 9 Apr 1846, d 26 July 1924. (Stones in St. Andrews Cemetery) Samuel SHITH of Chatham, buried 13 Dec 1827. No age, no witnesses named. This is one of the few burial records in the church registers!
- Maria SHTTH born ca 1825 or 1826, d 17 Sep 1892. She was the wife of John SOMER-VILLE. Son George Arthur SOMENVILLE 1862-1865 (St. Andrews Cemetery stone).

Samuel SHITH and wife Hargaret had son Samuel SHITH baptized 7 Sep 1834 Church of England, St. Andrews.
