

RECORDS OF HENRY W. BISHOP, JUSTICE OF THE PEACE RICHMOND and LENOX, MASSACHUSETTS, 1825-1865

Abstracted by Marcia Jesiek Eisenberg*

"Records of Henry W. Bishop one of the Justices of the Peace within & for the County of Berkshire & Commonwealth of Massachusetts. A.D. 1825."

This 9 3/4 x 8 inch, leather-bound book was discovered by librarian Ruth Degenhardt in the process of making a survey of the contents of the vault of the Local History Department of the Berkshire Athenaeum, Pittsfield's public library.

The 170 handwritten pages record actions before Henry W. Bishop, a Justice of the Peace, "at my dwelling house in Richmond" beginning the fifteenth day of April 1825. From 4 August 1827, actions are dated at Lenox, at "my dwelling house in Lenox," or "at my office in Lenox," and continue to 10 August 1865.

Actions ranged from matters as trivial as the registration of a promissory note or a suit against a youth for swearing in public to the portentious preliminary hearing into a case of alleged poisoning.

Most records cover two or more pages of Justice Bishop's careful script. They are too long to be transcribed completely in this quarterly. To give a flavor of the language and the style, one of the briefer entries is transcribed here in its entirety. The remainder of the records will be abstracted.

This record was written on page 7:

Berkshire ss - At a Justices Court holden before me Henry W.

No. 5

Bishop, Esquire, one of the Justices of the Peace, within & for Sd County at my Dwelling vs house in richmond in Sd County on the twenty Dickinson first day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred & twenty five - Amos B.

Harvey of West Stockbridge in Sd County Husbandman Plaintiff

Ira Dickinson of S^d West Stockbridge, Stone-Cutter. Defendant. In a plea of the case for that the S^d Dickinson at West Stockbridge on the day of the date of the writ being indebted to the Plf in the sum of twenty dollars for meat and drink, washing, lodging, before that time found provided & done for the Defendant at his special request by the Plf then & there promised the Plf to pay him S^d Sum on demand - Yet tho requested the Deft. hath not paid S^d Sum but neglects & refuses so to do - To the Plfs damage twenty dollars - This action is

entered before me the $S^{\bar d}$ Justice & the Plf appears by Kellogg & Kellogg his attorneys & the Deft. tho' three times publicly called to come into Court comes not - but makes default of appearance here - It is therefor considered by me the said Justice that the Sd Amos B. do recover of the Sd Ira the sum of fourteen dollars damages & costs of suit taxed at three dollars and thirty two cents.

> Given under my hand the day & year aforesd Henry W. Bishop

Execution issued May 23. 1825 -

Commonwealth of Massachusetts

No. 1 Leavenworth et al vs Hendricks 15 April 1825 William Leavenworth of West Stockbridge & John A. Laffargue of Sheffield, formerly Partners - versus Wyllis Hendricks of West Stockbridge, Hatter, Defendant, charged with being justly indebted for the sum of \$20 for goods, wares, and mechandise. Defendant has not paid the sum, tho often requested, nor paid the Justice's charges. Damages allowed to plaintiffs, who appeared by Kellogg & Kellogg their attorneys, of \$12.23 and costs at \$3.78. Execution 16 April 1825. Pp. 1-2

No. 2 Snow vs Hendricks 15 April 1825. Caleb Snow of West Stockbridge, yeoman, vs Wyllys Hendricks of same place. On 17 February last past, Snow gave a note for \$8.20 with interest; also a note of Feb. 15 last past, promising to pay to Levi Crocker or bearer \$9.19, of which plantiff is the owner. Kellogg & Kellogg represented the Caleb to recover damages of \$17.56 and costs of plaintiffs. \$3.12. Executed 16 April 1825. Pp. 2-3

No. 3 Bacon et alii vs Wyllys Hendricks 15 April 1825. James S. Bacon of Great Barrington, William Leavenworth of West Stockbridge & John A. Laffargue of Sheffield, Merchants, Plaintiffs, versus Wyllis Hendricks of West Stockbridge, Hatter, justly indebted for \$20.00 for goods, wares, and merchandise. Damages of \$10 and costs of \$3.78 awarded. 15 April 1825. Pp. 3-4

No. 4 Brown vs Barber 29 April 1825. Bradford B. Brown of Alford, Merchant, versus Abraham Barber of West Stockbridge, Husbandman. On 16 Jan. 1824 promised to pay \$5.80 to Lemuel Moffett by 1 March next. Damages of \$20.00. Plaintiff appears by Kellogg & Kellogg. Defendant comes, says he never promised in manner & form alleged. Continued to 21 May next. Plantiff appears by his attorney, defendant appears; case continued to 4 June next.

Plaintiff appears by Boward [?] Kellogg his attorney; defendant makes default of appearance. Bradford B. to recover of Abraham \$6.20 damages and costs of \$7.04. 4 June 1825. Pp. 5-6

No. 5 Harvey vs Dickinson [transcribed on BG page 3]

No. 6 Dewey vs Dickinson 21 May 1825. Luke Dewey of West Stockbridge, Physician, versus Ira Dickinson of West Stockbridge, Stone-cutter. Ira indebted for \$20.00 for medicines, advice, and attendance. Plaintiff appears by Kellogg & Kellogg, his attorneys. Luke to recover from Ira \$9.44 damage and \$2.99 costs. 21 May 1825. P.8

No. 7 Younglove vs Johns 2^d
21 May 1825. Robert Younglove of West Stockbridge, Blacksmith, versus William Johns 2d of West Stockbridge, Labourer. On 18 September 1820 W^m Johns gave a note & promised to pay Rufus Willson or bearer \$20.46 & interest. Plaintiff is lawful owner of that note, appears by attorneys Kellogg & Kellogg. Robert to recover \$7.31 damages and \$3.40 costs. 23 May 1825. Pp. 9-10

No. 8 Blim vs Crumb
4 June 1825. Ovid Blim of West Stockbridge, Labourer, versus
Robert B. Crumb of West Stockbridge, Labourer. On 14 March last
past at Canaan to wit at S^d West Stockbridge gave a note for
\$6.00 with interest. Ovid to recover \$6.06 damages and costs of
\$3.19. Plaintiff appeared by attorneys Kellogg & Kellogg. 6
June 1825. Pp. 10-11

No. 9 Arnold vs Lane 4 June 1825. Samuel Arnold of West Stockbridge, yeoman, versus Ithamer Lane of West Stockbridge, Joiner. For goods, wares, and merchandise, Lane indebted for \$20.00, also for work, labour, and services. Plaintiff represented by Kellogg & Kellogg, to recover \$10.70 damages and \$10.67 costs. 12 July 1825. Pp. 11-12

No. 10 Hutchinson vs Brown 11 June 1825. Lombard Hutchinson of West Stockbridge, yeoman, versus Willard Brown of Tyringham, Joiner. At Great Barrington on 1 January last past, note given to pay Hutchinson \$10.00 within ninety days. The Defendant being indebted at Richmond for \$20.00, and hath not paid debt or interest, plaintiff appears by Kellogg & Kellogg, his attorneys. Lombard to recover of Willard \$10.27 damages and costs of \$3.55. 13 June 1825. Pp. 12-13

\$2 25 Received of Eben Blanchard two Dollars and twenty five cents


