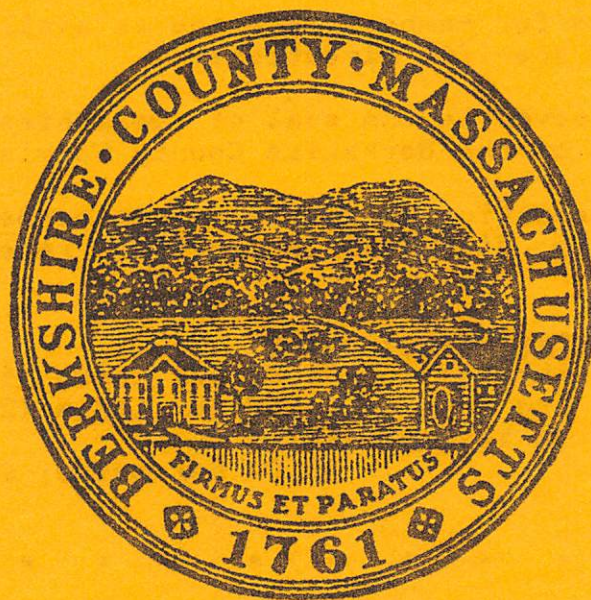

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GENEALOGICAL RESOURCES IN BERKSHIRE COUNTY LIBRARIES

RICHMOND FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY

Richmond has devised a very practical and good arrangement for their library. It is in two pleasant rooms in their Consolidated School. The area is used by the school until 1:30 P.M. - then it is open to the townspeople.

Every small town library seems to have something different and special. In Richmond it is the work of the Richmond Historical Commission. This group has researched, typed and bound good sized books on their town history. Each one is an outstanding piece of work and they have done so many! They did not only a fine genealogy on the Rossiter family but a book giving a complete record of historical documents in private collections that they have put on microfilm. These documents include family papers and many account books of the following families: Dwight, Hand, Williams, Barnes, Seymour, Pierson, Cook, Griffing and Sherrill. The book is called Record of Microfilm 1762-1862. (I hope someone gives them a microfilm reader after all this work!)

The rest of the books they have written and contributed to the library are: Inventory of Historic Resources in the Town of Richmond compiled 1979; Analysis of Iron Ore and Pig Iron from Richmond Iron Works 1891-1915; The Brown Iron Ore District of Berkshire County, Massachusetts; Early Berkshire - a Historical Review by John Camp. Since iron was a big industry in Richmond the Historical Commission also gave the book Survey of Stone Blast Furnaces of New England and Eastern New York by Victor Rolando. All these fine paperback books are kept locked as they should.

The only history of the town of Richmond, written by Katherine H. Annin, is here and extra copies are sold in the library. They also have Terry Hallock's fine book Early Houses of Richmond, Massachusetts.

One finds a full set of Massachusetts Soldiers & Sailors in the Revolution, histories of the nearby towns and the History of Berkshire County by the W.P.A. The Town Reports are bound from 1865 to the present.

There are two family genealogies - the Bradford family (1892) and the Rossiter family (a project of the Richmond Historical Commission). Fortunately Richmond was included in the series Massachusetts Vital Records to 1850. This is the only book of this series in the library and the only vital records available here.

AN INDIAN DEED OF 1738

Indian Deed. Presented by James D. Colt.

Apr. 22, 1889.

(Found among his father's papers.)

To All Persons to Whom these presents shall Come Greeting
Whereas Jacobus Cooquahegameek Muhtacommin & Wampanon
All formerly of Menahnock on the Island in Hudsons
river below Albany now Planters in the Indian Town
on Housatonnuck river in the County of Hampshire &
Province of the Massachusetts Bay in New England
Have by a Certain Instrument, or Lease under their
Hands & Seals dated Octo^r. 25th; 1737 in the Eleventh
Year of the Reign of King George the 2^d, Demited Granted
& to farm Lott unto John Stoddard of Northampton
in the County AforeSd Esq; A Certain Tract of Land
Containing Six Miles Square lying on Unkameeks
and also Ketunkametts road leading from Albany to
Northampton(viz) Sd Land is to measure from the
Sd Place Where the Sd road crosseth the Main Branch
of Housatonnuck river, two miles Eastward four miles
Westward then three miles Northward & three miles Southward
& so Extending East, West, North, & South, So as to
make Six Miles Square the Sd Lease is to Continue

from the date thereof for & During the Term of Nine Hundred & Ninety Years thence forward & the Annual rents thereof is the Sum of Six Pounds in bills of Publick Credit or So much Silver as is Equal thereto as the Estimation then was All Which with what Else is needfull will Appear in Sd Lease reference thereto being had

Now know Ye that I Moshenamawg now of the Shawanoas Country in the Province of Government of Pensilvania in America, formerly of the Place now Called the Indian Town on Housatonnuck river in the County of Hampshire & Province of the Massachusetts Bay in New England Having a Claim or right in the Sd Leased, Granted & to farm lott in Land & Premises I do for my Self my Heirs & assigns Hereby Consent to & Intirely Acquiesce in the Sd Lease Lease of the Same & Having Already taken Sufficent Security for my part or Proportion of the Anual rents of Sd Lands & being Intirely Satisfied & Contented therewith do hereby ratifie confirm & Established Sd Lease fully & amply to all intents & Purposes According to the Tenure of it, & I do Covenant & Engage for my Self my Heirs Executors Adms & Assigns Shall from time to time & at All times during the Whole Term of Sd Lease Quietly & Peaceably Have Hold Occupy & Improve the whole of Sd Lands with the priviledges & appurtenances thereto belonging without any let Hindrance or Molestation from me the Sd Moshenamawg _____ Heirs Assigns or any Other person or persons whatsoever Lawfully Claiming from by or under us or any of us In witness Whereof I have hereto set my hand & Seal this _____ Day of October in the Twelfth year of the reign of George the Second King of Great Brittain, France & Ireland Defender of the faith & c Anno^e Domⁱ 1738

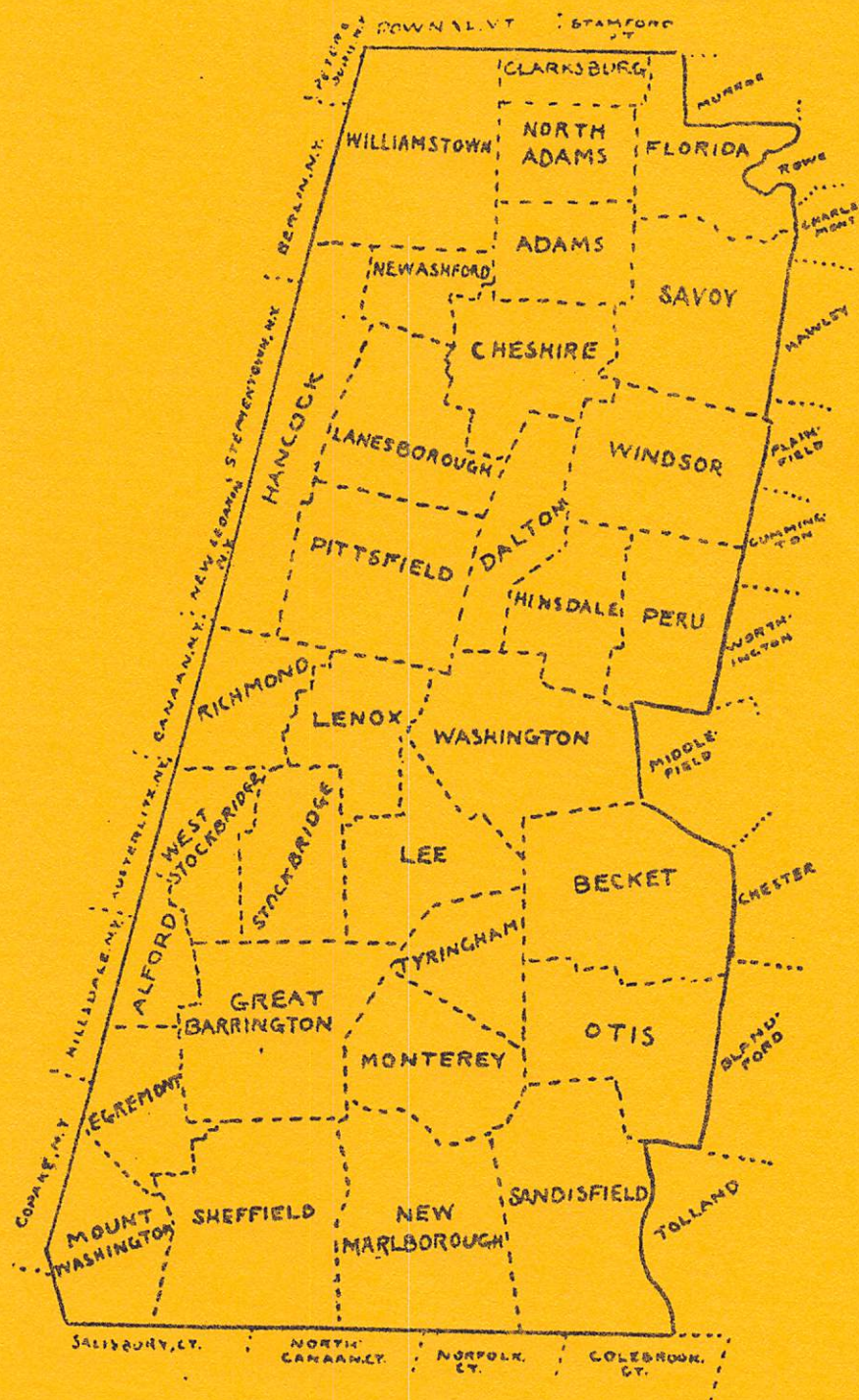
