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#### GENEALOGICAL RESOURCES IN BERKSHIRE COUNTY LIBRARIES

#### THE CHESHIRE LIBRARY

Depot Street

The Cheshire Library, located in the Town Hall, is small but attractive. The arrangement here is so very practical and unusual. The librarian is also the town clerk, and her office is just across the hall from the library - an excellent arrangement for a town this size.

The genealogist will find Berkshire County Histories by Beers, Coxey, Child's <u>Gazettier</u> and <u>History of Western Mass</u>, by Holland. The Massachusetts histories are varied. Two Massachusetts Tercentenary books: <u>Markers of Massachusetts Bay Colony</u> and <u>Pathways of Puritans</u>. The older ones - Bradford's <u>History of Plymouth Plantation</u> (published 1909); <u>Records of Plymouth Colony 1620-1651</u> (1 vol.); and last but not least, Barber's <u>Historical Collection of Massachusetts Towns</u> (published 1839). Cheshire is in the Hoosic Valley, so it was not surprising to find <u>Hoosic Valley</u> by Niles and <u>The Hoosic Railroad</u>, a report of 1873.

Massachusetts in the wars is covered by <u>Massachusetts in the World War</u> and a book for each of the Massachusetts regiments in the Civil War by Alfred Roe. The most interesting and seldom seen was <u>Photographic History of the Civil War</u> by Francis Miller (published 1911) - a 10 vol. set!

Only two histories have been written for the town of Cheshire. One by Mrs. Ellen Rayner and Mrs. Emma Petticlerc in 1885 and The 175th Anniversary of Cheshire 1793-1968 by Stephen Reynolds (published 1968).

There are several large scrapbooks of miscellaneous newspaper clippings on Cheshire and Cheshire, people dating from 1845.

The Town Reports are kept in the town vault in the adjoining town clerk's office. At present they date from 1903 but more are being found from an inventory being made of old basement storage.

The vital records of Cheshire start in 1855 and are kept in the town vault. These books are now showing signs of so much wear, the town clerk is starting a card file for this information.

No one is certain what happened to the records from 1790 to 1855 but they suspect they were burned. The vital records they do have have been put on microfilm but they do not have a microfilm reader. There is a copy machine available in the town clerk's office.

The library hours given below may seem limited, but the librarian pointed out - the town clerk is there all day for genealogy research!



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### THE DIARY OF CHARLES FREDRICK COUCH (son of Mary C. and John Whitfield Couch)

This narrative came from an 1861 diary found in the possessions of Winnifred R. Bates after her death, October 26, 1986. It is transcribed as best I can make it out. (Transcribed and submitted by his great grandson, Robert P. Bates, 4035 N.W. 14th Place, Gainesville, FL 32601.)

The following is concerning the life of Charles Fredrick Couch.

I was born in Barrington Jan 30th 1841 of Mary C. Couch

My father John W. (Whitfield) Couch was born in Barrington Sept 8th 1797 he left B\_. when two years old with his parents - (they died at Pine Plains, N.Y.)

Father was a physician & commenced practice when he was about 22 in amenia (since called North East)

From there he moved back to Barrington in Sept 1834 where he

lived untill he died Feb. 16th 1845. He was married to his first wife (Mother's sister) Leydia Van Doorn. in Brattleboro. She died aug 15 1825

Mother was born in Fitzwilliam N.H. Apr 23rd 1805. When 11 years old she went to Brattleboro, VT with her father. & her father died there in 1825 (age 67). but her Mother died in Fitzwilliam in 1810.

In 1828 Mother went to Hartford Ct. where she was married May 28th/28 to Father. From there she went to Amenia & then to Barrington with father. After he died she boarded until she married R. J.[?] Rogers & went to Sheffield Mass. May 12 1849 left Sheffield Oct. 12 1852. & went to Sharon to bourd with Wm Stone & made her home there untill Nov. 20 1861 when she went to Pittsfield to keep house Broke up house keeping in July 1864 & went to visit through the summer. but Alfred lost his wife in Sept & mother went to Worcester to keep house for him.

Mother died in Philadelphia Dec 17 1876 agd. 73.

Alfred my brother was born in North East May 17 1829 He entered Williams College in Aug 1845 & stayed a little over a year when he went to Pittsfield to learn the Machinist trade. died Aug 2nd 1888 He was married to \_\_\_\_\_ Fairbanks in Mch. 1852 She died in Sept. 1864 in Worcester He then married Irene [?] S. Jordan.

She died at Brattleboro, Vt. at her son's house <u>Henery</u> [?] Jordon - (by a former marriage) Apl 11-1912-

Leydia V.D. my sister was born North East June 6 1832 & has been sickly ever since She died Mch 17, 64 of consumption. Died in a fit to which she had been subject 7 years. She was very much emaciated her thigh measuring only 10-1/2 inches in circumference. Calf of leg 8 in. She was burried in Barrington

I went to Brattleboro Vt. with Mother Brother & Sister in June 1845, we spent 4 weeks & returned to Barrington. In May 1848 Mother Sister & I went to Rochester & spent six months & returned to Barrington. I went to Sheffield May 12 1849 & stayed until Oct 12 1852 when I went to Sharon Summer of 1857 I went to Brooklyn & attended school three months.

Summer of 1852 I was in Troy N.Y. about 2 months, Winter of /52&3 went to school to Alvis Parmer and boarded with  $\,$  Wm Stone Summer of /53 I worked for Mr. Stone on the farm. for my board.

Nov 2/53 went to Barrington & attended the Academy In 1854 I commenced going to N.R. Harts boarding school & attended two years. Paid \$200. per year for board & tuition.

Winter of /56&7 worked in Sharon Valley for Hotchkiss& Sons. turning Curry Comb handles for \$15. per. Month without board.

July 13/57 I went to Newark N.J. as clerk for J.W. Seilley I was to have my board & \$25. for the first year. but from dissatisfaction on Mothers & my Guardians part I returned to Mr. Stone Oct.23/57

Dec 2nd 57 I went to Eligir, Festers (& attended school to Mr Webster) Leakeville Conn & stayed untill June 6/58. June 6/58 went to Wm Stone & worked 5 months at 7 per month driving teams.

Nov 15/58 I went to Canaan as clerk for B.[?] Jones & Co. I stayed one year for board & \$50.00

From Nov 16 to Dec 15. stayed in Pitts. I made visit to Hartford Cornwall 2nd [?] Dec 15 went to Springfield & clerked for H & J Brewer. at \$500 per. year Boarded with Mrs Richards 408 Pynchon St. Left Brewer about the middle of May 1864. Went to Pitts. stayed there untill July 15 when I went to Gaylordsville to practice. Went into Partner ship with W. H. Graved M.D. 1864 & boarded with Mr Monroe at 3.00 per. week. payed \$16.00 per ton for hay in the lot. & \$1.00 for eats. Slept in the office.

My sister Leydia died Mch 17 64 was buried in Barrington. Died of Consumption. Through the summer Mother visited at New Lebanon Nasaw Barrington Cornwall &c.

I was drafted in July 63 & got out being the only son of a widow liable to military duty. My Brother being also drafted & furnished a substitute for \$325. & here I am in my office at 1100 am. Aug 16th 1864 Dr. Graves in N.Y. getting substitutes. He is paying 10 to 11 hundred apiece. I expect to be drafted next month.

I was married to Allic Montville Jan 2 1865 in Dover by Rev Wm Decker. after a week she went to Pittsfield Jan 18 I went after her after visiting in Worcester we came to Gaylordsville & boarded with Mrs Gaylord for 7 per week we commenced Jan.24/65 I was boarding at Mr. Morrows when I was married Boarded at Mrs Gaylords untill July 13 when we commenced housekeeping in the second floor of Ana Warners house. In three rooms & a small

pantry thus began my housekeeping. paid 3 dollars per. month rent.

We stayed there untill Apr 1, 1866 when we moved across the river into Chas Platts house. We had a daughter born Jan 21/66 called her Minnie She has been so far (8 mo.) a smart active child. First commenced to creap a little Oct 28/66

In Apr. 1866 moved to C.B. Platts house west side river G-ville & after awhile bot the place. & in Apr. 1863 sold to G.H. Graves for 2750.

Allic & I had a child born. Which we called Allie[?] Belle Couch in Aug 13 1870 & she died Jan 30 1871 Agd. 5-1/2 months 5 mo 17 days Her disease seemed cholera Infantrum

In Oct 15/71 a daughter to us C.F. Couch & A.M.C. & we called her Grace E. Couch she is well today June 1, 1874

I moved to Bangal [?] N.Y. Apr. 16 1873 & practiced there untill Oct 26 Nov 28 73 then went & lived in the rooms of mrs Marsh G-ville & was well recd. back. Lived with Mrs Marsh until June 1878 Allic was in Pitts. & Minnie went to Philadelphia so that broke us up & I went to E.A. Hilsten to board & boarded there untill Apr 1880 When Allic & Minnie came back to Gaylordsville & we went to keeping house in the Bailey house Apr 1/80 lived there untill Aug 1/82 when we moved on the west side of the river. Taking a bond for a deed of Hindrix & Roberts. To pay them \$300 Sept 1/84 \_\_\_\_ to keep up interest on the whole price of place \$600 Keep it insured for this security & pay taxes


