#### PRIVATE SMITH OF NEW MARLBOROUGH AND THE MASSACHUSETTS LINE

by Mary Ann Long Skinner\*

Following are synopses of the National Archives pension application files of five men named Smith who came from New Marlborough and served as privates in the Massachusetts Line in the Revolution. They are: Amos Smith (b.1762), David Smith (b.1757), Ebenezer Smith 3rd (b. ca. 1761), Elias Smith (b. ca.1765), and Richard Smith (b. 1761). In the original documents the name "New Marlborough" is followed in every case by "County of Berkshire, State of Massachusetts" or a similar phrase, which has been omitted here. My comments are in brackets. All references to the New Marlborough Vital Statistics (NMVS) are taken from the typescript copy in the NEHGS library.

AMOS SMITH
PRIVATE, MASSACHUSETTS LINE
FILE NO. S-7553

Amos Smith, aged 70, applied for a pension in 1832 while a resident of Whitestown, Oneida County, New York. He said that he was born at New Marlborough on 5 July 1762 and lived there until February 1789 when he moved to the part of Whitestown, Oneida Co., New York that later formed the town of Westmoreland. After twelve years he moved to the present town of Whitestown. In 1777 he went into the army as a substitute for Josiah Whiting of New Marlborough, who had been drafted. He entered Lt. Eli Harman's company, whose orderly sergeant was Adam Cason. was in Col. John Coller's regiment, Gen. Fellows' brigade. They marched from New Marlborough to Fort Edward, New York, and then to Fort Ann, Kingsbury, and "different places" retreating before Burgoyne's army. He was discharged near Kingsbury in August and returned to New Marlborough. [Ft. Edward, Ft. Ann, and Kingsbury are near Glens Falls, N.Y.] He was under the command of Gen. Schuyler at Fort Edward and believed that Gen. Nicholson's brigade served with them. In May or June of 1779 he volunteered at New Marlborough for nine months and was marched to Great Barrington to be mustered in and then on to Springfield and to West Point to join the Continental army. He believed he was in Capt. Renick's company, Col. Brewer's regiment. The regiment was later commanded by Col. Sprout. He also remembered Maj, Tupper and said they were in Gen. Patterson's brigade, Massachusetts Line.

He said that Gen. Washington's headquarters was at West Point part of the time he was there, that he remembered seeing Gen.

Washington several times, and that Gen. Arnold was there at West Point part of the time. They remained at West Point until the "fore part of the winter" when they marched to Fish Kill Barracks to winter quarters and he remained there until he was discharged in February. He "well knew" Capt. Luke Hitchcock of the Continental Line and believed they belonged to the same regiment. He also knew Lt. Foot. Amos Smith seems to have gotten a three party character reference from John Frost and George Foote, Presbyterian ministers in Whitestown, and from Needham Maynard, judge and farmer, of New Hartford, but the copy of the affidavit is not complete. They referred to him as "Capt. Amos Smith".

In 1834 Jedediah Smith, 68 years old, of Walworth, Wayne County, N.Y. said that he was Amos Smith's brother and substantiated Amos's statement almost word-for-word.

[Amos Smith, born 5 July 1762, and Jedediah Smith, born 24 October 1766, were sons of Amos and Mary Smith. (NMVS)]

## DAVID SMITH PRIVATE, MASSACHUSETTS LINE FILE NO. R-9675

David Smith applied for his pension in 1818 while a resident of Brutus, Cayuga Co., N.Y. He said that in 1776 he enlisted at New Marlborough in Capt. Soul's company, Col. Whitcomb's regiment, served his one year enlistment and was discharged. [Although his file number starts with "R" to indicate "rejected", David Smith was awarded a pension in 1818. His widow's pension was rejected.]

In 1837 Richard Smith of Albany, N.Y., aged 77, made a deposition saying that he was the brother of David Smith, deceased, that David was in the Revolutionary War for about four years, and that his first service was at Boston for about one year. He also stated that he and David enlisted together at New Marlborough in Capt. Allen's company, Col. Wigglesworth's regiment, went with the troops to North and South Carolina, and that David continued in service three years after his enlistment. He said that he was present at the wedding of David Smith and Abigail Hatch in Sheffield, Mass. in 1780 and that they were married by Jedediah Ward, Justice of the Peace. [Actually they were married in 1779 by Jabez Ward.] Richard said that David died at Brutus, Cayuga Co., N.Y. about fifteen years earlier [around 1822] leaving Abigail his widow and that Abigail still lived in Brutus in 1837.

In 1837 Abigail Smith of Brutus, N.Y. applied for a pension. She said that she was the widow of David Smith and that he was in the "army of the Revolutionary War" for four years: mostly a

militia-man, partly in the Continental troops, and for some time clerk to one Col. Stark. She thought he was in the Battles of Bunker Hill and Monmouth and that he was at one time in Capt. Soul's company and at another in Capt. Allen's company, Col. Wigglesworth's regiment. She said that before he entered the army he lived with his father's family in New Marlborough. She also said that he was furloughed from the army on account of ill health and was brought home by his brother, Dr. Benjamin Smith of New Marlborough, that his disease, gravel, [kidney stone] was contracted while in the army and caused his death. She then gave a long excuse for not having his discharge paper. [Not unusual.]

She then said that she and David were married on 20 May 1779 in Sheffield and that he died on 30 August 1822 and that she remained his widow.

In December 1837 at Weedsport, N.Y. Abigail Smith's son-in-law Alonzo L. Smith, the postmaster of Weedsport, wrote to the pension office about her case, which had apparently been rejected in February 1837. He said that his wife was Abigail Smith's youngest child and that Abigail had lived with them for "years past".

In 1838 James Hyde, clerk of the town of New Marlborough, provided an affidavit certifying that David Smith and Abigail Hatch were married on 20 May 1779 in New Marlborough by Mr. Jabez Hatch, Justice of the Peace.

In 1839 Benjamin Smith of New Marlborough, physician, "of lawful age", made a deposition for his brother David Smith. He said that David entered the service in January 1776 in Capt. Moses Soul's company under Col. Asa Whitcomb, that nearly a year later he heard that David was "dangerously sick" at Fort George and so he went there to get him and brought him home. After David's health improved he rejoined the southern army in Capt. Allen's company, Col. Wigglesworth's regiment, and he remained in the army three or four years until near the close of the war. Benjamin Smith's character was attested to by Levi L. Smith, Justice of the Peace.

In 1851 Sophronia Smith of Cayuga Co., N.Y. stated that she was the daughter of the late Abigail Smith and David Smith, that Abigail died in Cayuga Co. on 12 July 1841 and that she is one of the surviving children. She then executed a power of attorney which was witnessed by Sophia Smith.

### EBENEZER SMITH PRIVATE, MASSACHUSETTS LINE FILE NO. W-11465

Ebenezer Smith applied for his pension in 1818 while a resident of Walton, Delaware County, New York. He said that he enlisted under the name of Ebenezer Smith 3rd at New Marlborough on 12 July 1779 for nine months. He then went to West Point and was enrolled in the main army in Maj. Furnall's company, Col. Sprout's regiment, which he thought was the Third Regiment, Massachusetts Line. He was discharged 12 April 1780 at Newburgh, N.Y.

He said that previous to this he served three months in the militia and was in the "battle of the taking of Burgoyne" [Saratoga] and that he also served two other nine month terms, the details of which he had forgotten.

In 1820, while living at Delhi, Delaware Co., New York, he made another statement and gave his age as 58. He said he was enlisted on 12 July 1779 by Col. John Collar in "New Malberough", marched to Springfield to draw his equipage and then to West Point under the command of Lt. Stover. He was then put in Maj. Fernal's company, Lt. Miller commanding, under Col. Sprout in the 3rd Massachusetts Regiment, Gen. Patterson's brigade.

He gave his occupation as wagon maker but said he was infirm and then proceeded to demonstrate his level of poverty. He had household goods and tools worth \$161 and debts of \$102. He listed his family as: his wife, his daughter Catherine, 18, son James, 14, and daughter Mary, 9.

In 1838 Catherine Smith of Andes, Delaware Co., N.Y., aged 67, applied for her pension. She said that she was and remained the widow of Ebenezer Smith, that they were married on 28 Feb. 1788, and that he died on 5 Feb. 1823. She then provided a page from their Bible which she said was in her husband's handwriting. It said "Ebenezer and Cata Smith was married Feb. 28, 1788". She explained that she was always called "Cata" or "Caty", never Catherine.

The page from the family bible also says:

Anna born 14th Janu. 1789
Orange born 26th Novem 1790
Ebn. born 11th Decm 1792
Matthew B. Febr. 10th 1795
Philander Smith born 27th April 1796
Caty [?] Joanna Smith born August [dim]
James Milton Smith born febr 14th 1805
Mary Salvira [?] Smith born Novem 8th, 1810

In 1835 Ray and Catharine Hitt of York, Livingston Co., N.Y. made a statement that Catherine Smith, widow of Ebenezer Smith, was a Revolutionary pensioner, that she lived in York and died there on 5 Nov. 1844 and left the following children: Anna McCorrey, Orrin Smith, Catharine Hitt, James M. Smith, and Mary S. Blakeslee, and that Orrin and James M. Smith had since died.

[Ebenezer Smith 3rd of New Marlborough and Catherine Balling (or Bellamy) of Sheffield were married 28 Feb. 1788. (NMVS)]

ELISHA SMITH PRIVATE, MASSACHUSETTS LINE

FILE NO. S-35073

Elisha Smith applied for a pension in 1818 while a resident of Seneca County, New York. He was "aged 53 years or more does not know precisely". He said that he joined the army in May 1781 in Massachusetts in Capt. Ebenezer Smith's company, that he served to the end of the war, was discharged at West Point, and served in no battle except "with the Cowboys so called on the North River".

In 1820 while a resident of Wolcott, Seneca Co., N.Y., Elisha Smith gave his age as 56 and said he enlisted in the spring of 1781 in "New Maltbury" in Capt. Ebenezer Smith's company, Col. Calvin Smith's regiment, and was discharged at West Point in "January or December 1783".

His personal property in 1820 consisted only of a half burnt great chair, all that was saved when his house burned. He said "my family consists only of myself" but a scratched out sentence appears to say "I have neither wife nor children, my wife is dead and my children of age or married". He said he was a farmer but could only work half time.

In 1833 he applied to have his pension transferred to Monroe County, Michigan, where he had moved with his two sons, his only remaining children.

[An Elisha Smith is listed in the 1790 Census for New Marlborough with one male over 16, one under 16, and one female. A Joel Smith is listed on the adjacent line.]

RICHARD SMITH
PRIVATE, MASSACHUSETTS LINE
FILE NO. W-25009

Richard Smith applied for a pension in 1818 while living in Brutus, Cayuga County, New York. He said that in 1778 he enlisted in New Marlborough in Capt. Noah Allen's company, Col. Edward Wigglesworth's regiment, Gen. Glover's brigade. He served nine months and was discharged by Gen. Sullivan at Providence, Rhode Island. He was in the Battle of Monmouth under Gen. Morgan and also in "the battle of Rhode Island".

David Smith, also of Brutus, attested to this and said that he was Richard's brother, went into the service with him, and was discharged with him.

In 1820, when living in Phelps, Ontario Co., N.Y., Richard Smith said that after the service already described he was transferred to Capt. Rennick's Company in Col. Nixon's regiment, Gen. Patterson's brigade, and discharged at West Point, year not recollected. He gave his age as 59 and said that he was a farmer, troubled with rheumatism and gravel, and unable to support himself and his 54 year old wife, Mary.

In 1818, Edward Annable of Aurelius, Cayuga Co., N.Y. said that in 1778 he was an orderly sergeant in Capt. Allen's company and "well remembers" Richard's enlistment.

Also in 1818, Darius Howe of Brutus, Cayuga Co., N.Y. said that he knew Richard from his youth and that he [Howe] was an ensign in the army in 1778 and knows that Richard joined then as a "nine month man".

Mary Smith, aged 71, applied for her pension in 1838 while a resident of Milton, Saratoga Co., N.Y. She said that she was the widow of Richard Smith, Revolutionary pensioner, that she married him on 1 December 1785, that he died on 15 January 1838, that her previous surname was Redington, and that she was married at her father's house in the town of Richmond, Berkshire Co., Mass.

Smith Cogswell of the city of Albany, N.Y. made a statement in 1838 supporting Mary Smith's application. He said he was 59 years old, was born in Richmond, Berkshire Co., Mass. and was well acquainted with both Richard and Mary Smith, having known them both since his childhood. He said that in 1838 Mary lived with her sister in Milton, Saratoga Co., and that for about a year before his death Richard Smith had lived in Albany but that he died in Milton in 1838.

[David and Richard Smith were the sons of David and Consolation (Wheeler) Smith whose children's birthdates are given in the NMVS as follows:

Samuel, b. 25 Jan., 1753 Benj., b. Apr. 11, 1755

David, b. May 15, 1757 Richard, B. Nov. 19, 1761 Obidiah, b. Jan. 20, 1765 Laban, b. Jan. 26, 1768 Gilbert, b. July 25, 1771

David Smith (Sr.) was born ca. 1726 and died in 1774 (gravestone, New Marlborough cemetery). I know nothing about his family. Consolation Wheeler was born in Bolton, Mass. on 28 April 1732. the daughter of Benjamin and Hannah (\_\_\_\_) Wheeler. Benjamin Wheeler was the first white settler of New Marlborough (1739). Consolation (Wheeler) Smith died on 9 March 1808 in New Marlborough. I am descended from her son, Samuel.]

#### EARMARKS AS GENEALOGICAL TOOLS

Earmarks won't tell you anything about your ancestry (we hope) but they do place a farmer at a certain point in time. These men lived in New Ashford, Mass., and had earmarks registered to them.

#### GENEALOGICAL RESOURCES IN BERKSHIRE COUNTY LIBRARIES

#### THE BERKSHIRE ATHENAEUM

1 Wendell Avenue Pittsfield, Mass. Mrs. Ruth T. Degenhardt Local History Librarian

This library has a vast amount of material for the genealogist. It will take several issues of BERKSHIRE GENEALOGIST just to give a general survey. The most outstanding features are the unusual and detailed "collections". They are known by the names of Corbin, Cooke, Shepard, Brown, Hoyt and Williams.

#### THE WILLIAM WILLIAMS COLLECTION

Many years ago, the personal papers, letters and deeds of Col. William Williams of Pittsfield were given to the Athenaeum and they were stored in the vault. During the Depression, W.P.A. workers copied and typed all of this material. The well typed sheets were bound into three volumes. Then they carefully indexed this work and that was bound into Volume 4. The material in these four volumes has been microfilmed by the Mormons and is therefore available through the LDS Branch Libraries.

William Williams was born in 1711 in Weston, Mass. He had an unsuccessful business career in Boston but in 1739 he began his 17 year military career that covered the French and Indian War. He finally settled in Pittsfield in 1758 and died here in 1785. Most of the interesting letters and papers pertain to his military activities and the early Pittsfield town meetings, officers and affairs. To briefly summarize:

- . His list of 321 names of men who enlisted and joined the 8th Regiment raised in Massachusetts Bay in 1745 and sailed from Boston 25 June 1745 to join the army at Louisburg under command of Lt. Col. Pepperrell. Also list of the officers in this 8th Regiment.
- . Deerfield Muster Roll of 1748.
- . A 1754 list of soldiers and laborers used to build Fort Anson at Pontoosuck (later Pittsfield).
- . List of names of the Detachment of Sir William Pepperrell's Regiment at the Onida Carrying Place (Oswego area) 1755.
- . List of names of men Williams paid for work 1755-56.
- . List of names of men who returned arms by Major Day. No date.
- . Northampton 1758. List of soldiers belonging to Capt. Day's Co.
- . List of Captain's names under the command of Col. William Williams. 1758 list from Fort Miller.

- . List of men belonging to Col. William Williams who returned their arms to him before they left the Camp at Lake George on return of invasion of Canada.

#### THE HOYT COLLECTION

[Given by Mary Hoyt DeGiorgis in memory of her parents, George David and Fannie (Jones) Hoyt.]

This Berkshire County material consists of two drawers filled with an alphabetical card file. There are over 500 cards with individual Berkshire County residents' names on each. Some cards are filled, others are sparse.

These cards have 18th and 19th century vital records, Registry of Deeds records, Probate Court records and court action as recorded in <u>Acts and Resolves</u>. Every statement is well documented. Many of the cards refer to a tavern ledger kept by Isaac Marsh of Stockbridge<sup>1</sup>.

Another feature of this collection is the cards for Berkshire County towns listing the original proprietors (from Registry of Deeds records).

'In the Stockbridge Library are two tavern ledgers and two day books kept by Isaac Marsh. They record in detail all his tavern business in Stockbridge from 1775 to 1791. These records give his customers' names, the town where they lived and how and when they paid their bill. The tavern was located in the center of Stockbridge near the site of the present Red Lion Inn.

Mr. Dewey C. Eldridge of Johnson City, New York has written us as follows:


"I recently found a grave marker in Riverside Cemetery in Whitney Point, Broome County, New York with the following inscription:

GENERAL CALEB HYDE died 25 December 1820 ae 81

Nearby, a marker inscribed Elizabeth Hyde, wife of Caleb Hyde. I was unable to read the dates on this marker. There are many Hyde family graves in this cemetery and an area about three miles south is known as Hydesville. Also a road named Hyde Street. Knowing that the Hyde family came from New England, I think it is interesting to find a marker that quite likely refers to a name of nearly two hundred years ago."
