#### GLIMPSES OF THE PAST

Member Kathleen Knowlton Sedoff, 1013 Meadow Lane, Alberton, MT 59820 has made available to us a number of letters written in the 1860's. These are not only very interesting for their content, but there are also frequent references to residents of Florida, Massachusetts which may be of help to some researcher. Here is the beginning of the series.

To Mrs Abigail Knowlton, Marion, Lynn Co., Ohio % Mr. Edward Knowlton

Florida, Mass. Jan 22, 1859

Dear friend:

I received your letter Jan 18 and was I glad to hear from you. I had been thinking of writing to you for some time but did not know certain where to direct my letter. I thought you was a little more excusable because you would have a great many letters to write. You did not write how you and your little girl's health was and you stood your journey, but I thought probably pretty well or you would have written. My health is considerable good. Jonathan and Mabin have taken away my little boy, we call him, and commenced housekeeping in South Adams. Her health is about as it has been the past summer. Mother has Ellen Smith to work for her this winter. You wished me to tell you something about the church affairs. I cannot tell of much good. I do not suppose you expected it - you know us too well here for that. There has some come back to the church and walk with them that have not for some time past before now. They had a meeting not long since to see about hiring Mr. Bogart for another year but did not get half enough signed to keep him. It is thought quite doubtful about his staying another year. We had a donation party at his house in December and had a fine time of it. There were a The Donations here number there that have never attended. before: Gideon Sylvester, Jesse Thoemp and their wives, Lyman Tower and his wife, Mr. Norcutt and his wife and a number of others that have never attended before. We had four long tables full in the daytime and they had quite a large party in the evening. The receipt amounted to about forty dollars.

I was speaking with Almina about you and she said when she thought you were only going to Ohio she thought she should see you again sometime.

...It is very sickly in Monroe and Readsborough with the typhoid fever. There has been a great many deaths there of young and old. In some instances both father and mother both have been taken from their little ones. Miles Hicks has buried his wife, she that was Phila Tower and her brother, Harry the one that had

such fits is dead and Alvin Tower is very dangerously sick and they do not expect him to live. Ebenezer's folks had a son, it lived about two months old and died very suddenly and left them with their two little girls as before.

I am afraid the Monroe fever will get about here, it has got in near Florida. Angeline Phelps is sick with it. It has been a very open winter here. Thus far we have not had snow enough to make good sleighing here but once and that was short.

I can not write much more, it tires me very much to write. I wish you to write me often as you can. I will try and answer.

Goshen Sept 4, 1859 Friend George

I have come to the conclusion that Ezra will never get ready to answer your letter and I thought that I would. We were very glad to hear from you also that you liked your new home. I suppose you will like to hear all the news, well we have plenty. Hiram Barris commences select school tomorrow in our district. I do not expect to attend but think I shall send the old people. Chloe Sears is going to board here. Sears do not like your name for his boy. Mary has gone to East Hampton with Olive. Lovel has moved back to Goshen lives in the yellow shop. Barris is stopping at Esq. Barris, can not tell you what he is doing. Frederick Hunt and family have moved out of town live near Worcester is going to carry on the tin business. Maj. Hawks has had his house remodelled inside and outside and blinds which makes it look real smart. They have got twenty-five boarders. Henry Smith and Julia are courting as strong as usual. Naramore & Nichols carry on Hinckly Williams farm. Hinckly is out in Ohio selling patents for washing machines. Mrs. Williams has gone out with him. I suppose your mother will like to know how Aunt Williams is, well she is a rich, poor old lady and she has been confined to her bed ever since you left town and Lurone has to be over her most of the time night and day so that she have to have a hired girl to do her work. She has got a Mrs. Taylor that one that dont live with her husband. Elucia Hawks was buried yesterday died with consumption. Brother We all spent Independence up on Mr. Rood dont you think we had a large doings. Mr. Rood figures about the same as he did when you were here does not seem to advance much in the courting line the last I heard he had been to see May Rolins of Cummington but it does not work to a charm. Heman and Ellen do not get married as yet. Olive Brackett that married the Porter her husband is in the consumption do not think he will live long. A few remarks about ourselves. Father and Mother keep about the

same as usual. Mother has some cough. Ezra the same old expense. Alvan is out at Pike's Peak, we hear from him occasionally. As to myself I do not grow any better. Mother send love to you and Mother hopes you will write often and I will not keep you waiting so long again. All join in sending love yours in haste. Calista [Hunt]

Adams Jan 15th 1860 Dear Sister Not Forgotten

Though long neglected I will take this lazy pen and try to write a few lines. We are well and in good order. We went home last friday after chores and staid until the morning and then came back. We found ma down with the sich headache and not able to visit me but she was better in the morning. She is very poor and looks all worn out. Lyanda is at home and smart though rather thin. pa is about the same and trying to team it a little with his colt and steers. Almond and family have got young Almond into pants so quick, but will not rob ma for she has a letter commenced which will be forthcoming soon. Sarah is asleep in the cradle. Viola is preparing for bed and Nathan is dozing.

Old Squire Sayles is buried today his wife has been dead some time Old John Buchliss is dead, Mahala has a little girl six months old she had a son ten years old his name was Isaac Crosset Labe Partriges wives son Ann and Mary have made out very badly I do not know how Mary makes out. I am afraid Alden will have them all to maintain. they have all been sick with fevers this past summer and have had a hard time of it and amongst them all. Alden has to lay on the lounge nights and rock the cradle they say Mary does not like work much. Anns girl is now more than a year old. The girl that has lived with Shubael Lincoln so long was married new years her sister worked for me one summer she is pretty her name is Ella. F Card has two children L one and W none M is not married.

We have had a cold winter most of the time and a good deal of snow. We have had a January which carried it most all off. Nathan bought me two geese the other day and last night they absconded either by fair means or foul. We think the latter. we have lots of thieves around breaking into stores and houses. North Adams is an awful rum hole. George Malory has been taking up a lot there and now he is afraid of his life he has been most killed once. I am dreading to have spring come again for then I must go to work again. I think of doing my work alone but it is hard. It is getting late and I have got to the end of my yarn. tell E to write and Ella can write so well she must write to Viola soon send to n. Adams. Dont try to pick this all out in one day for your eyes used to be weak. SSH [Hunt]

#### BIBLE RECORDS

Phelps Family Bible. The Holy Bible, containing the Old and New Testaments Translated out of the Original Tongues. Published by the American Bible Society, 1860, New York. Bible is now in the possession of Nancy J. Pennington, 6204 Halifax Ave. South, Edina, MN 55424.

Thomas Phelps was born probably in Otis, Mass., although no birth record except in the family bible has been found. His parents were Isaac Stevens Phelps and Sarah (Sally) Thomas, who were living in Otis at the time of his birth. Thomas is listed as an Otis taxpayer from 1853 to 1855. He is #1652 in the Phelps Family of America, by Phelps and Servin.

# THE WILLIAM B. BROWNE COLLECTION

In the last three issues of the BERKSHIRE GENEALOGIST I have briefly described four of the five special collections found in this library. The Browne Collection is unique in that it covers land and families in northern Berkshire County, eastern New York and southern Vermont beginning in the 18th century.

William B. Browne (1875-1953) was a native of North Adams, and began his career by working eight years compiling proprietary titles of the county. This was followed by his service for many years as Registrar at the Northern Berkshire District Registry of Deeds. During this period (1916-1944) he wrote articles for the NORTH ADAMS TRANSCRIPT under the titles "Pathways of the Past" and "Pownell Sketches". When Mr. Browne retired he devoted full time to genealogy. The Athenaeum is fortunate to have his genealogical notes. This material is in the vault and may be used by permission of the librarian; some copies are fragile and must be handled with great care.

There is one large metal file drawer marked "Browne Collection". It is filled with file folders, arranged by family name; all relate to early families of northern Berkshire, eastern New York or southern Vermont. The information in each folder varies, but may include land records as well as vital records for these families. Some are typed, some are hand written. The file drawer also contains a few bound volumes, such as a typed family genealogy of John and Priscilla Alden and descendants. There is a book of New Providence (now Cheshire) church records, the First Baptist Church 1793 and The Church of Christ 1767-1808; also the Church of Christ records from 1808-1847 with index of all the names. There is miscellaneous information on some early houses in Adams and New Providence and an 1800 map showing the sites of these houses.

The vault contains five small hand-written notebooks of Mr. Browne's. One is "Family Records 1896, North Berkshire Families" with index. The others contain information on families already listed, and each book has an index. At the top of some of the pages it will say "Bennington Records" or "Pownell Records".

On the shelves of the Local History Department are two books that contain the articles Mr. Browne wrote for the NORTH ADAMS TRANSCRIPT. These have been indexed as well.

- Give the full name, including middle name or initial, of the person subject to enquiry.
- Establish identity of the person by giving place and date of birth, place and date of death, parentage, place and date of marriage and identity of spouse to the extent these data are known, as:

John Doe b Hartford, CT 12 Jan 1900; d Fairfield, CT 19 Mar 1967 s/o Richard & Abigail (Weston) Doe m Hartford 11 June 1923.

- If unable to give a complete description of the person under enquiry, start with a son or daughter for whom more information might be available and ask for that person's ancestry.
- 4. Identify spouse in manner described in (2) above.
- State what information is desired, as: Need ancestors of John and Abigail.
- 6. Place the question at the end of the query.
- Do not abbreviate the names of persons or towns.
- 8. For any locale outside Massachusetts, be sure to identify the state.
- 9. Dates should be written: day, month, year as: 13 Oct 1743.
- Use multiple queries rather than several parts to the same query.
- 11. Queries should not exceed four or five lines and each should be printed or typed on a 3"X5" index card. One query per card.
- 12. Well-known abbreviations may be used but elaborate use of them is not required.
- 13. Address for reply should be stated on each card so that the Editor is not obliged to keep their envelope as well in order to have a complete record.
- 14. Acknowledge receipt of all replies and reimburse respondent for postage and the cost of any material copied.
