HERALDRY

Recently there have been some enquiries relating to heraldry. The question frequently asked is "Can I, John Doe, use a Doe family coat of arms?" Since the answer is both yes and no, further consideration of the matter may be of interest. Particularly so since this field is akin to that of genealogy - ancestors.

Heraldry is of medieval origin, possibly of the time of the Crusades in the eleventh to thirteenth centuries. When fighting men were completely cased in an armor of chain links or reticulated steel plates it was not easy to distinguish friend from foe. Some of the difficulty the Crusaders encountered in dealing with the Saracens early on has been attributed to lack of an effective identification system.

The term "coat of arms" is derived from the practice in the Middle Ages for knights to cover their steel encasement with a coat of fabric as a protection from rust and dirt as well as from the heat of the sun. The wearer had embroidered on this coat his particular symbol of identification or arms, hence "coat of arms".

This, or even earlier, was also a time when seals were used to authenticate documents as an aid to those many who were unable to read or write. On these seals were engraved or carved heraldic symbols, similar to those in the design of arms. A design to be heraldic must be hereditary, handed down from father to son. This leads to the need for some control of designs to prevent duplication and to ensure their employment only by those deemed to qualify for their use. This control was first obtained by the heralds in periodic visits throughout their respective districts and later by the College of Arms. The process was somewhat similar to our own registration of trademarks.

In 1418, Henry V of England issued a writ to the various sheriffs of counties, dealing with the assumption of coat armor by some not entitled to it by inheritance. In 1484, Richard III incorporated the College of Arms with its Garter King of Arms, Heralds and Pursuivants to exercise the desired control.

The use of coat armor in England came with the arrival of the Normans from France in the conquest of 1066. Consequently the language used to describe the various components and qualities of an armorial bearing is medieval French. There are a multitude of conventions and stylized representations which must be observed if authenticity is to be maintained. Before acceptance as authentic, any bearing should be compared with some standard work such as Burke's General Armory or Brooke-Little's An Heraldic Alphabet to see if it appears to obey the rules and does not present an absurd combination of elements or colors.

"Achievement" is the term applied to the complete armorial bearing, in contradistinction to its various parts - shield, supporters, helm, wreath, crest, mantlings and motto. As usually understood "coat of arms" refers to the shield alone and as viewed by the WEARER, not the observer. This is the part which conveys the information of interest to the genealogist. The term "crest" is not synonymous with "coat of arms" but applies to a part of the superstructure atop the shield. The shield can be used alone, and usually is. The crest is used alone only for decoration on small objects as silver flatware, buttons, etc. where it is impractical to use the entire device. A family never has a crest alone; it is but a part of the entire device on record. The motto is not a part of the arms and is not controlled. It can be changed at will and several families may have the same motto.

The shield has dexter (right) and sinister (left) sides. The elements comprising the shield or applied to it are metals, colors or furs. To provide proper contrast, metal is not applied to metal, color to color or fur to fur. That is to say, a black bird should not be placed on a red shield nor could there properly be a silver stripe on a gold shield. The various elements to be used are:

Metals	Colors	Furs
Or (gold)	Azure (blue)	Ermine - white with black spots
Argent (silver)	Gules (red)	Ermines - black with white spots
	Purpure (purple)	Erminites - ermine + red hairs
	Sable (black)	Erminois - black spots on gold
	Vert (green)	

The several items applied to the shield are called "charges" and these comprise its distinguishing features. The top portion of the shield, approximately a third, is called the "chief", a middle third "fess" and the bottom portion "base". These and many, many more strange terms are used to convert the graphic display into a verbal description which is called a "blazon". This latter word is also the verb used to describe the process of compiling the description.

The charge is anything borne on the shield or another charge. These may be bars of all shapes, horizontal, vertical, diagonal or whatever; graphic representation of anything, real or imaginary. Imaginary animals such as the unicorn, griffin, chat-loup (a combination wolf, cat and goat) in various poses and in all sorts of arrangements are frequent charges.

The coat of arms, related as it is to warlike pursuits, is hereditary through the male line only, from father to son. If there are no sons, the eldest daughter would be entitled to the

arms, displayed not on a shield but on a diamond shaped figure called a "lozenge". There would also be no helm or crest as these are deemed of a warlike nature inappropriate for a female line.

Of particular interest to the genealogist is an item called "cadency", which sons could apply to their father's arms and thus create distinctive arms of their own but still displaying the lineage relationship. Thus cadency or difference marks may at times provide a clue as to relationship. These different marks were:

- Eldest son - label (horizontal band from which depend three vertical pieces)
- Second son - a crescent
- Third son - a mullet (five pointed star)
- Fourth son - a martlet (bird with no beak or feet)
- Fifth son - an annulet (ring)
- Sixth son - a fleur-de-lis
- Seventh son - a rose
- Eighth son - a cross moline (equal armed cross with ends splayed out)
- Ninth son - an octofoil (flower with eight petals)

In my own case, a Willard coat of arms has three martlets which should provide an ancestral clue of some sort. Marriage between persons entitled to arms could result in a combination of the two arms in accordance with certain rules and their application to a single shield. The unscrambling of such a coat of arms can provide clues as to the component ancestors. The charges are symbolic of achievements of some sort and, if they can be identified, decoding may yield ancestral clues. However, any conclusions based on such evidence will be very tenuous and great caution must be exercised. An imaginative representation of an imaginary event combined with wishful thinking can be disastrous. Still the search for ancestors must pursue whatever clues are discovered.

In our country coats of arms, other than those used as registered trademarks are subject to no control and can be claimed by anyone. One English text refers to coats of arms as "marks of gentility". Americans have traditionally been opposed to the notion of gentility by inheritance. General Washington was severely criticized for his connection with the "Society of Cincinnati" established shortly after the close of the Revolutionary War as a brotherhood of officers of the Continental Army and to be perpetuated on a very strict hereditary basis. The Massachusetts Legislature declared the organization to be "dangerous to the peace, liberty and safety of the Union."

RESEARCH JOTTINGS

By Theodore Mayo Atkinson

Royal blood here in New Marlborough? The name is Whiting.

As most people were not literate in the early 1500's and surnames were only beginning to be used, about the only family lines which were known in the Middle Ages were the royal ones. For a variety of reasons these lines were important and scribes carefully recorded them. A handful of esteemed, reputable researchers in this country specialize in this kind of work; and more are located in England, of course.

The settlers of the Massachusetts Bay Colony between 1630 and 1640 were numerous and varied. If 5% of the population was disorderly and often afoul of the law, some were graduates of Oxford and Cambridge, officers in town and church; the other end of the spectrum. A few - a very few - were related to royalty.

Josiah (d 1811) and Lorrington (d 1845) Whiting, whose grave-stones are at the Huxley yard on the Norfolk road, south end, 5th row, are an example of this special breed. Their first immigrant was the Rev. Samuel Whiting of Boston, Lincolnshire, later of Lynn, Mass., 1636-1679. Samuel married 6 August 1629 in England, Elizabeth St. John, whose mother was a Bulkeley, related to Henry II, King of England, 1154-1189.

A letter I have received from Harold VanVoorhis of Des Moines, who is much more widely read on this subject than I, says, "An exciting line. It's legitimate through all the kings of France, illegitimate through the English kings and goes back to 480, several lines to the Magna Charta Barons." The word "illegitimate" in this instance points to a birth outside of marriage, and in the documentation provided, the name of Henry's mistress is "unknown". In this country, strict hereditary societies, like Mayflower, DAR and Colonial Clergy, would require the exact name of the mother. This seems to be different. In any case, the Bulkeley-St. John line goes back to Henry's "natural son", William Longspee, 1176-1226, Earl of Salisbury, whose mother was an "unknown mistress".

New Marlborough deed books (5:375, 6:573) show that John Whiting of Torrington (Conn.) bought lots 78 and 79 in the 3rd Division in 1773 and 1774, both lots being 60 acres and not far from the Connecticut line and just to the southwest of Harmon Pond (Cf. Proprietors Records, vol.2). On 9 Jan 1776, Josiah Whiting of New Marlborough bought from his father John, still of Torrington, Lot 79 for £95, "fatherly affection and goodwill" being mentioned but not reducing the price, it would seem.

The first federal census in 1790 shows Josiah here with two sons under 16, and probable two daughters and a wife. Neighbors may have been Moses Harmon, Joseph Harmon and Daniel Huxley. Hadley Turner's history, p. 37, shows Josiah on the "South Company 'Larmlist'". He is not on the 1771 tax list.

Much more can be found about his father, Deacon John, who died in Torrington 2 Feb 1820, age 94. He was born in Wallingford, the son of Benjamin and Rebecca (Parmelee). The connecting links to the Rev. Samuel and Elizabeth (St. John) are in History of Torrington by Rev. Samuel Orcutt, p. 780ff. It is related that when a certain wealthy and respected citizen of Torrington, Daniel Grant, wished to marry his daughter, his consent was withheld, the reason announced being "He did not like the blood".

Josiah and his children at New Marlborough may not have been outstanding persons. The records are scanty; we do not know. But connections to the high and the mighty of distant times and different climes have this plus; they widen the horizons of the researcher as he delves, and it can be assumed that such forebears will be written up copiously, guaranteeing a successful, interesting search.

A large company of the friends were present, and there was a grand reception at the residence of the bride's parents following the ceremony. The bride looked very lovely in pure white with orange blossoms and veil. They have our best wishes for their happiness and prosperity."

MASSACHUSETTS MIGRANTS TO MICHIGAN - SOME ADDENDA

[In our recent series of articles, taken from the Elmer I. Shepard Collection, we listed several hundred persons, born in western Massachusetts, and who subsequently moved to Michigan. In response to the listing for Hiram Covey, Donald P. Avery, 3712 Bent Branch Road, Falls Church, VA 22041 has provided us with the following biography, taken from the HISTORY OF OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN (1877).]

Hiram Covey was born at Mt. Washington, Berkshire County, Massachusetts, January 17, 1802. He remained there until 1814, and then removed to Oswego County, New York, where he continued to reside until 1837. That year he removed to Livingston County, Michigan and settled in the village of Brighton. On the 1st of April, 1839, he removed to Lyon Township, in which he has since resided.

In early life Mr. Covey was apprenticed to a carpenter and joiner, subsequently worked at the trade, and was eminently successful. He has for many years been a farmer, having had a farm in Lyon of two hundred and ten acres, one hundred and eighty acres of which he cultivated up to within a few years. He has recently sold his farm, and now only retains enough on which to spend his idle time.

November 1, 1827, he was married to Hannah Fuller, at Dutchess County, New York, by Rev. John Culver. She was born in Columbia County, New York. March 15, 1802.

The family record is as follows: - Juliet, born August 2, 1828, married George W. Button, Esq., March 17, 1846; Hiram S. born March 31, 1830, married Margaret Marlatt, November 11, 1855; Nelson F., born January 25, 1832, married Harriet Curtis, January 1, 1856; Leonora, born August 20, 1833, married John T. Andrews, April 20, 1853; Mary E., born January 17, 1835, married George W. Pennell, July 16, 1857; Frances A., born October 31, 1840, married John R. Sherman; Sarah, born October 13, 1843, married George M. Tucker, December 20, 1861. These all reside in the State, several of them in this County.

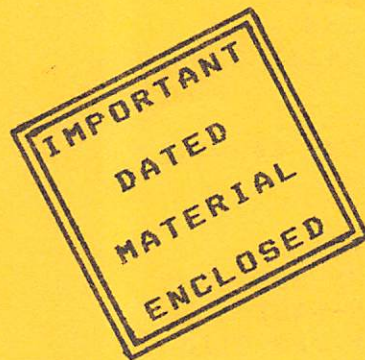
