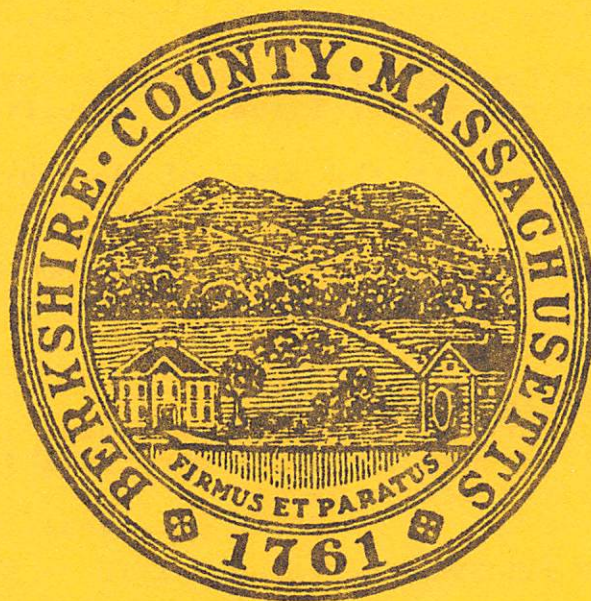

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## BENJAMIN WHEELER OF BOLTON

### First Settler of New Marlborough

This year is the 250th anniversary of the settlement of New Marlborough, Mass. This article examines the life of Benjamin Wheeler, the first settler of New Marlborough and is intended to generate interest in solving several important questions about his life. Many details here are taken from secondary sources and need further work.

Rev. Harley Goodwin said in his chapter on New Marlborough in the 1829 History of Berkshire County that Benjamin Wheeler came from Marlborough. This has been repeated in every other account I've seen, including Hudson's 1832 history of Marlborough. It is time to set the record straight and say that Benjamin Wheeler came from Bolton and not from Marlborough.

Benjamin Wheeler was born on 29 Sept. 1693 in Concord, the son of Obadiah and Elizabeth (White) Wheeler. His grandfather, Resolved White, was a passenger on the Mayflower along with Resolved's parents William and Susannah White. The family is discussed in authoritative detail by Robert M. and Ruth W. Sherman in Mayflower Families Through Five Generations, Vol. 1, with Addendum.

From this we see that Benjamin was the eighth child and seventh son of his parents. They may have thought that he was their Benjamin (i.e. youngest) but his brother Joshua was born in 1696. Four of the nine Wheeler children moved to the part of Lancaster that was later set off as Bolton and a fifth, Joseph, moved to Lancaster much later, in 1742.

The second son, Josiah Wheeler, (b. 1675) was granted land in Lancaster in 1699. He married Martha Prescott, daughter of John and Sarah (Hayward) Prescott. Sometime before 1710 the fourth son, Jonathan Wheeler (b. 1683), moved to Lancaster. His wife was Mary Fletcher. He was a Quaker and the birth and death dates of his children and grandchildren are listed in the records of the Uxbridge Monthly Meeting.

Joshua Wheeler, the eighth and youngest son came to Lancaster by 1716 when he was admitted to the church there. Benjamin Wheeler was in Lancaster by 1717 when he and his wife Hannah owned the covenant and had their daughter Hannah baptized. The identities of Benjamin's wife Hannah and Joshua's wife Anna aren't known.

A 1723 Rate List for Lancaster locates Josiah, Benjamin, and

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Joshua Wheeler "east of the river" in the Old Common and Wataquadoc area. This is now part of Bolton.

On 19 April 1727, according to a deed quoted in The Wheeler Families of Old Concord, Mass. by George Tolman (1908), Jonathan Wheeler of Lancaster sold to Alex Cummings "a first right in Concord Village which did appertain to my honored father Obadiah, but now belongeth to me." This may provide a clue to finding what became of Obadiah and Elizabeth Wheeler after they deeded half their estate in Concord to their son Obadiah in 1712 and acknowledged the deed in 1713.

Benjamin and Hannah Wheeler had their first four children baptized in Lancaster and recorded their birth dates in the town record. These were;

Hannah, b. 22 Dec 1717  
Jesse, b. 15 May 1720

Bulah, b. 1 March 1724  
Zenas, b. 29 Dec. 1725

The birth of the fifth child, Consolation (b. 28 April 1732) was not recorded in Lancaster and she was not baptized there. They waited to record her birth in Bolton after it was established in 1738.

In 1736 Benjamin was convicted of breaking the Sabbath by "spreading dung and harrowing" and fined six shillings plus costs. His sixteen year old son Jesse was convicted of the same offense that same year and was fined 15 shillings, having pleaded ignorance of the law. Thus it seems that Benjamin Wheeler had come to a difference of opinion with the established church. This subject needs more research.

New Marlborough was granted in 1735 under the name of Township No.2. It was one of four towns opened along the road from Westfield to Sheffield, part of the Albany to Boston Road. There were to be 60 proprietors and each was to have a 60 acre house lot. In 1737 Nahum Ward convened the proprietors of No.2 at Jonathan Howe's inn in Marlborough. They agreed to present a petition to the governor showing that they had bought the land from the Housatonic Indians. The proprietors continued to meet in Marlborough through 1749.

The 1829 History of New Marlborough says that Benjamin Wheeler was the first settler and that he spent the winter of 1739-40 out there alone. Benjamin must have gone out to New Marlborough on the Albany to Boston Road, the only east-west road through western Massachusetts at that time. It is 120 miles by today's roads from Bolton to New Marlborough and must have taken several days to get there.

The 1829 History says that Benjamin returned to Marlborough in 1740 and brought his family out to their new home. Since it is clear he didn't bring them from Marlborough, the second half

of his statement deserves further study, especially in light of the next two records.

Benjamin executed his last known deed of Bolton Land on 20 Nov. 1741. Witnesses were Zenas Wheeler and Hannah Wheeler.

Jesse Wheeler died on 16 Dec. 1744 in his 23rd year and was buried in Bolton.

Hannah Wheeler married Joshua Fosket, son of Robert and Mercy (Goodwin) Fosket, sometime before their son Jesse was born in Bolton in 1750. They came to New Marlborough by 1754 and she died there on 18 March 1793.

Beulah Wheeler and Nehemiah Howe, son of Peter and Grace (Bush) Howe, were married in Bolton on 4 March 1746/7. They moved to New Marlborough around 1749 and on to Poultney, Vt. where she died in April 1777.

Zenas and Consolation Wheeler apparently went to New Marlborough with their parents and married there. Zenas married Azubah (\_\_\_\_) by 1750 and died in New Marlborough on 6 Oct. 1785. He inherited his father's home which was located on the road between New Marlborough village and Hartsville. In 1885 another Benjamin Wheeler, a retired farmer, lived there. He was the great-great grandson of the first Benjamin Wheeler.

Consolation Wheeler married David Smith by 1753 and died on 19 March 1808, also in New Marlborough. They lived near Southfield village on today's Cagney Road. The house was still standing in 1885 but had been sold to the Cagneys by Auren Smith, David Smith's great grandson.

Benjamin Wheeler died in New Marlborough on 14 May 1759 just one month before the incorporation of New Marlborough. He is buried in the cemetery in New Marlborough village and his stone is there today. The record of his death says that he was "Son to Obidiah Wheeler of Concord" and that he was in his 66th year when he died. His land was divided in 1760 among his children, Hannah Fosket, Beulah Howe, Zenas Wheeler, and Consolation Smith, all of New Marlborough. Hannah Wheeler died on 8 July 1778 in New Marlborough and is buried next to her husband.

There are several important genealogical facts need to complete the story of Benjamin Wheeler: the identity of his wife Hannah, his son Zenas' wife Azubah, and the parents of his son-in-law David Smith, as well as the date and place of death of his parents. Additionally, his life could be better understood through further study of New Marlborough and the Wheeler's religious beliefs at that time.

## THE BOOKSTALL

The Palatine Families of Ireland, Second Edition, by Henry Z Jones, Jr., F.A.S.G., Picton Press, Camden, Maine, 1990, 166pp. 6" X 9", light green covers.

The fruit of thirty years' labor, this deceptively small book focuses upon 176 Palatine families, in varying degrees, and moves from Germany to London to Ireland to Albany, New York (and even to Shaftsbury, Vt.: John Barrackman, P.10 - in Vermont's first federal census, p.21, col.2). The Introduction is fascinating, the every-name index thorough.

Carmel, Southeast (Brewster), Kent, Philipstown, Patterson, and Putnam Valley are the towns of Putnam County, formed in 1812 from southern Dutchess County and located east of the Hudson River, west of Danbury, Conn. The tome abounds with cemetery lists, marriage records, lists of 18th century tenant farmers, and genealogies. The casual New York State researcher will be surprised and pleased. The new subject index contains "Cemeteries and Burying Grounds". The index of persons is surnames only. A good number of early settlers seem to have come from Cape Cod, such as Elnathan Doane, Brewsters, Bangs, Fosters, Weeks, Peleg and Shubael Wixsom. The paucity of 18th century gravestones leads to much conjecture.

Maine Families in 1790, Volume 1, Maine Genealogical Society, Ed. Ruth Gray, Picton Press, Camden Maine, 1988, 384pp, 6" X 9", light green covers.

Submissions by many differing researchers total 413 families in this collection, about 24 % of the households in 1790 in the five "Maine" counties. Submissions are brief, pithy: biographical data on the "head" and his parents, a list of the head's children and their marriages. The every-name index has 16,000 entries, pp.303-372. Ms. Gray calls this a "finding aid", and the reader can easily in most cases trace the families "down west". The layout of each page is attractive, and not at all crowded. The name and complete address of each submitter is given. [Vermont note: The Genealogical Society of Vermont, inspired by this fine volume, plans to publish in 1991 a similar work, based on the 1791 federal census of the 14th state.
