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ELIAS KEYES OF NEW MARLBOROUGH

Private, Massachusetts State Troops
National Archives File No. W2810

The following is a synopsis of the Revolutionary War pension application of Elias Keyes of New Marlborough. Information taken from the pension application file is given in *italics*. I have checked his service record against his entry in "Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors in the Revolutionary War", Vol. 9, p. 152, and added some explanatory material from other sources.

On 6 Nov. 1832 Elias Keyes of Royalton, Ohio, applied for his pension under the act of June 7, 1832. He appeared personally at the Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas, his county of residence.

This pension law was the first to extend benefits to those whose service was in the militia or state troops. It didn't take long for the news to spread, even to distant Ohio.

He gave his age as "sixty-nine last February first".

This puts his data of birth at 1 Feb. 1763 and in combination with his later statement that he was born in New Marlborough it seems almost certain that he was the Elias Keyes, son of Paul and Mary Keyes, whose birth on 31 Jan. 1763 was recorded in Sheffield. I can't explain the one day and one town discrepancy.

He said that in June 1779 he enlisted for four months in the Massachusetts State troops and served out his term. He marched from New Marlborough to New Haven, Conn. where he helped guard the coast. He served under Capt. Collar and Lt. Canfield and said that the British had left New Haven before his unit arrived.

The British under Gov. Tryon occupied New Haven from 5 to 7 July 1779 and then departed by sea. "Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors" shows this period of service under Capt. John Collar as being from 19 July to 27 Aug. 1779, a term of one month and nine days.

The next year he went into the Massachusetts militia as a substitute for his father who had been drafted, and served six months, from April to October. He marched from New Marlborough to Schenectady and up the Mohawk River and was in the battle of Stone Arabia. He said he was discharged soon afterwards at Ft. Plank. He

served under Capt. Samuel Warner, Col. Brown of Pittsfield, Maj. Root, and Gen. Van Rensselaer.

The battle of Stone Arabia took place on 19 Oct. 1780. The garrison of around 150 troops under the command of Col. John Brown marched out and met the enemy between the town of Stone Arabia, New York and the Mohawk River. They were defeated with the loss of forty men including their commander. Col. Brown, who originally came from Sandisfield, was a prominent Pittsfield lawyer and an experienced soldier. He was killed on his thirty-sixth birthday. Fort Plank was two miles northwest of Fort Plain, N.Y., which is on modern maps.

"Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors" shows this service under Capt. Samuel Warner as being from 18 July to 23 Oct. 1870, a term of three months and thirteen days including travel of 130 miles in a regiment that had been raised for three months.

Elias Keyes also said that he was out with the militia for one month at West Point during the year and time of Arnold's treason but doesn't remember who his officers were.

Benedict Arnold's treason was uncovered during the last weeks of Sept., 1780, a period that is covered by his previous enlistment. However, "Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors" shows him serving at West Point from 27 June to 4 July 1780 under Capt. John King and Col. John Ashley, for a total of eight days.

He said that he was born in New Marlborough, went to Pownal, Vermont at the age of 21 [ca. 1784] and after two years [ca. 1786] moved to Springfield, Otsego Co., New York. Twelve years later [ca. 1798] he moved to Geneseo, Ontario Co., New York and then in 1817 he came to Royalton, Cuyahoga Co., Ohio.

The 1790 Census of Montgomery Co., New York, which then included Springfield, shows Elias Keyes with (probably) his wife living near but not adjacent to Paul Keyes. In the 1800 Census of New York he may be the "Elijah Cayes" listed in Bloomfield, Ontario Co. He does appear on the 1840 list of pensioners for Cuyahoga Co., Ohio.

Elias Keyes gave as his three references General William Wadsworth of Geneseo, John B. Stewart, Esq., Magistrate of Royalton and Cuyahoga County Commissioner, and Capt. Abial Cushman of Brooklyn [Cuyahoga Co., Ohio]. He said further that he served as a Captain in the New York militia under Gen. Wadsworth "before the last war".

The Act of 1832 allowed applicants to give character references if they no longer had contact with anyone who served with them.

Elias Keyes was credited with ten months service as a private and was granted a pension of \$33.33 per year on 27 Apr. 1833, retroactive to 4 March 1831, the effective date of the law.

The veteran's own statement was used to compute the ten months of credited service. Militia records (which the Federal Government did not have) show that he did serve these three enlistments but only for a total of about five months. Thus he would have received only half the amount except that there was a further stipulation of the Act of 1832 saying that no person would receive a pension who had served less than six months.

Elizabeth Keyes applied for her pension on 11 Oct. 1850 while a resident of Royalton, Cuyahoga Co., Ohio. She applied under the Act of 29 July 1848. She gave her age as 81 and said that she was the widow of Elias Keyes, Revolutionary Pensioner, who had died on 28 Jan. 1849. She said that they were married on 11 July 1787 but that all of her family records were destroyed by fire "many years since".

Widows whose husbands had been pensioned had only to prove their marriage and to state that they remained or were again widows.

On 5 Nov. 1851, Clarissa Smith, age 76, of Canaan, Litchfield Co., Conn. made a statement in support of her sister, Elizabeth Keyes. She appeared in court and stated that Elizabeth, who was formerly Elizabeth Noble, married Elias Keyes around 1789 in Cherry Valley, New York. She wasn't present at the wedding but remembered when it was said to have taken place. She "never heard or knew of this marriage being doubted".

Cherry Valley is in Otsego Co., N.Y., immediately adjacent to Springfield and was often used as a general term for that area.

Elizabeth Keyes' pension was granted on 11 March 1852 retroactive to 28 Jan. 1849 at the same rate as her husband's, \$33.33 per year.

Pensions were paid retroactive to the date specified in the enabling act or to the start of eligibility, which this case was when she became a widow.

On 20 March 1852 Elias Keyes of Royalton, Ohio made a sworn statement saying that Elizabeth Keyes had died at Royalton on 7 March 1852 and that he and Tabitha Cushman of Euclid, Cuyahoga Co., Ohio were the only children and heirs of Elias and Elizabeth Keyes.

Under some circumstances children or other heirs could apply for pension benefits. It isn't clear from the material provided by the National Archives whether or not these two received any money.

Note: Pension applications are a good source of hard facts that are unavailable elsewhere. Sometimes overlooked is the information found in affidavits supporting the applicant's claim which pertains to the maker of the statement rather than to the applicant. For example, Clarissa Smith's statement in this file gives her own age and probable maiden name. The only way this information will ever reach those who need it is if pension files are abstracted for publication. If you have files at home for soldiers who served from or lived in Berkshire County, do consider abstracting them for *BERKSHIRE GENEALOGIST*. You needn't add any additional information. THE KEYES FAMILY OF NEW MARLBOROUGH

Among the early settlers of New Marlborough were two brothers and a sister, Elias Keyes (1694-1780), William Keyes (1702-) and Sarah (Keyes) Brookins (ca. 1705-), children of James and Hannah (Divol) Keyes of Bolton. Elias Keyes had a large family and had a son named Elias, Jr. (1719-1756) as well as a grandson, Elias Keyes, (the pensioner in the foregoing article) and a great grandson named Elias Keyes (1766-1821), the son of Zenas Keyes (1742-) the only son of Elias, Jr. The grandson and great grandson were almost the same age and both moved to Ohio. Elias Keyes, Jr. died while serving in the army in the French and Indian War and his father outlived him by many years. Thus there is much confusion in identification.

Elias, which is the New Testament name of the prophet Elijah, is an extremely popular name among the descendants of Robert Keyes of Watertown. Most but not all the Keyes in colonial New England belong to this family. The name is properly pronounced "Kize".

I have been working on the Keyes family of New Marlborough and have quite a bit of information and quite a few loose ends. If anyone has death or probate records for members of this family who moved to New York State, I would appreciate hearing from you. I am particularly interested in Charles Keyes (b.1728), Paul Keyes (b.1731), Martha (Keyes) Saxton (b.1736), Zenas Keyes (b.1742), William Keyes (b.1702), William Keyes (b.1752), and Timothy Keyes (b.1744).

THE BOOKSTALL

West Stockbridge, Massachusetts 1774-1974, by Edna Bailey Garnett. Southern Berkshire Web Press, Great Barrington, MA. Third printing, 1990. Soft bound, 159 pages, including 18 pages of maps. 8" X 11", profusely illustrated in black and white.

The opening pages are devoted to a narration of the opening up of Western Massachusetts to settlement in 1822, the granting by the Massachusetts Bay Colony of the townships of "Upper and Lower Housatonic" so-called for their location along the Housatonic River. Then follows a description of the boundary disputes with neighboring states in regard to territories known as "The Gore" and "The Oblong".

Following the Revolutionary War the economic condition of the country was in severe disarray and the existing currency was practically worthless. Returning soldiers found their families destitute or even imprisoned for debt. This culminated in Shays' Rebellion in 1786 during which a group of 1200 men under the leadership of Captain Daniel Shays prevented the meeting of the Supreme Judicial Court in Springfield.

There is considerable information on the local industries of the time - iron mining, smelting, charcoal burning, woolen mills and more. Incorporated within the various narratives is a great deal of local genealogical material. Of particular interest are the many photographs of dwellings and accompanying captions noting the several families who had lived in them. A number of the maps show the locations of the homes of many of the residents of West Stockbridge.

The book has a separate 18 page index which may be purchased alone or in combination with the text, priced at two and ten dollars, respectively. These may be obtained from Edna B. Garnett, 185 Hamilton Road, Chapel Hill, NC 27514

SOME SUGGESTIONS FOR WRITING QUERIES

1. Give the full name, including middle name or initial, of the person subject to enquiry.
2. Establish identity of the person by giving place and date of birth, place and date of death, parentage, place and date of marriage and identity of spouse to the extent these data are known, as:
John DOE b Hartford, CT 12 Jan 1900; d Fairfield, CT 19 Mar 1967 s/o Richard & Abigail (WESTON) DOE m Hartford 11 June 1923.
3. If unable to give a complete description of the person under enquiry, start with a son or daughter for whom more information might be available and ask for that person's ancestry.
4. Identify spouse in manner described in (2) above.
5. State what information is desired, as:
Need ancestors of John and Abigail.
6. Place the question at the end of the query.
7. Do not abbreviate the names of persons or towns.
8. For any locale outside Massachusetts, be sure to identify the state.
9. Dates should be written: day, month, year as: 13 Oct 1743.
10. Use multiple queries rather than several parts to the same query.
11. Queries should not exceed four or five lines and each should be printed or typed on a 3"x5" index card. One query per card.
12. Well-known abbreviations may be used but elaborate use of them is not required.
13. Address for reply should be stated on each card so that the Editor is not obliged to keep their envelope as well in order to have a complete record.
14. Acknowledge receipt of all replies and reimburse respondent for postage and the cost of any material copied. One should not be left out of pocket for having answered a call for help. If the submitted material is of little use, that is the risk assumed in transactions by correspondence.
15. When requesting information, always include a SASE.
16. Help your query editor judge the effectiveness of this section. If you make a contact that provides significant help with your search, won't you let us know?

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
