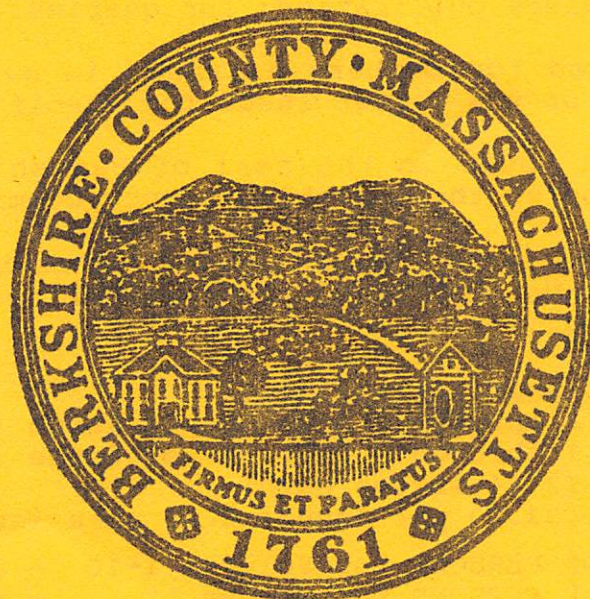

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LEE, MASSACHUSETTS - HIGH SCHOOL ALUMNI 1862-1892

From *The Ferncliff Echo*, February, 1932

When the Alumni Association was founded, it was agreed that there were many who attended the school before a definite course of study was arranged or before diplomas were awarded, who were entitled to be members of the Society. As a result, anyone who attended for even one term before eighteen hundred seventy-two (the first year diplomas were given) is listed in the alumni column. This accounts for the large number of pupils in the classes of '62, '63, and '64 and for the decrease after '72. In compiling this list we have used only the available records, those of the Alumni Association.

THE BOOKSTALL

Reviews by J. Bradley Cooper

The Blair Memorial, written by, about and for Blairs and their relations by Bob Blair, 1991, 214 pp, 3rd ed., index, soft bound, \$18.00. Heritage Books, 1540-E Pointer Ridge Place, Suite 300, Bowie, MD 20716.

After a folksy introduction there is a short history of Clan Blair from the thirteenth century to the seventeenth when David Blair, the progenitor of one New England line, b ca 1618 moved with his family from Scotland to Ulster, Ireland around 1620. Preceding the data for each generation is a historical commentary which sets the stage upon which these people will play a part. This is very interesting reading. Major coverage is given the direct line of descent from David but some details are given of siblings and spouses. The American connection stems from Robert, the grandson of David, who settled in Worcester, Massachusetts with eventual descendants in Geauga Co., Ohio and finally Ruth Ann and Robert Henry Blair bringing the generations into the 1900s. A helpful feature is a ten page descendancy chart carrying the line from 1610 to well into the 19th century. The material is very well documented and such interesting reading that a personal interest in the Blairs is not essential.

The Pioneers of Massachusetts - A Descriptive List Drawn from Records of the Colonies, Towns and Churches and Other Contemporaneous Documents, by Charles Edward Pope, 1900. Reprint 1991, soft bound, 550 pp, index, \$27.50. Heritage Books, 1540-E Pointer Ridge Place, Suite 300, Bowie, MD 20716

The work of Farmer in "A Genealogical Register of the First Settlers of New England" and Savage in his 1858 "Genealogical Register of New England" has been carried forward by Pope and set forth in this volume. To stay within workable bounds, Pope focuses upon the single state of Massachusetts and "confines the study still further to those persons who came here early enough to be foundation-layers...". The time frame is arrival in Massachusetts not later than 1650. The names, dates and facts have been taken from the original documents or from verified copies. For the most part the settlers are followed down to the time of their deaths with a concise genealogical sketch including data on children.

In my own case, many of the sketches yielded data to fill in gaps in my family history or confirm what had already been discovered.

Vital Records of Chilmark, Mass. to the Year 1850, New England Historic Genealogical Society, 1904. Addenda by Catherine Merwin Mayhew, reprint 1991, 151 pp, softbound, \$16.50. Heritage Books, 1540-E Pointer Ridge Place, Suite 300, Bowie, MD 20716.

In 1904 the New England Historic Genealogical Society published the vital records of Chilmark, a town established on the island of Martha's Vineyard 14 Sept 1694. Ms. Mayhew provided additional material obtained from a number of sources. The town of Chilmark has no official vital records prior to 1845. The Chilmark Town Records in this publication were derived from depositions filed with the town clerk after 1850. Presented are birth dates, parentage, marriage and intention dates, place of origin (where known) of the bride and groom, death dates, age of deceased, cause and place of death when known and in some cases to whom the deceased was related. The data are presented alphabetically by surname and cross-referenced in detail with no index required.

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The History of Haverhill, Massachusetts, by Benjamin L. Mirick, 1832. Reprint 1991, c 340 pp., new index, soft bound, \$23.00. Heritage Books, 1540-E Pointer Ridge Place, Suite 300, Bowie, MD 20716.

There are some indications that this work was drafted by John Greenleaf Whittier, a native son, and turned over to Mirick. Among the sources consulted were ancient manuscripts in private families, some written in the 17th century, private journals, town records and discussions with knowledgeable individuals.

The narrative begins with the year 1640 with information on the founding of the town of Pentucket, now Haverhill, and is followed by a year by year recital of many interesting events in the intervening years through 1831. As a frontier town, Haverhill for the next seventy years was subject to continuing trouble with the Indians to the extent that settlers went armed about their daily chores or conducted them under the watchful eye of an armed companion. There are numerous accounts of these encounters throughout this period. Many of the settlers are named throughout the text and there are a few genealogies.

The appendix provides a listing of the ministers and their tenure, college educated Haverhill natives, Representatives to the General Court and an 1830 Census. There is a Directory of "Professional Gentlemen", merchants, manufacturers, mechanics, etc. followed by a list of local societies and their officers. What could be the "Fragment Society" organized in 1825? Could it be involved with quilting bees?

This book is interesting reading in its own right, with or without a personal interest in Haverhill.

The Jewell Register - Containing a list of the Descendants of Thomas Jewell of Braintree, near Boston, Mass., by Pliny Jewell, 1860 and Revd. Joel Jewell. 1991 reprint, 104pp, index, soft-bound, \$12.50. Heritage Books, 1540-E Pointer Ridge Place, Suite 300, Bowie, MD 20716

The first record of Thomas Jewell, b ca 1600 in England, relates to his 1639 grant of land in Mt. Wollaston, incorporated

1640 as Braintree. Thomas had sons Thomas, Joseph and Nathaniel from whom stem three separate lines each of which is delineated in detail through eight generations. Each of these lines is prefaced by some biographical material and a discussion of some of the sources from which conclusions were derived. Each Jewell is assigned an identifying number to facilitate tracing relationships.

This is a concise and elegant presentation of genealogical statistics on about 1800 descendants in the male lines. The two part index lists Jewell names with a companion list of those who have married Jewell daughters or their children.

GUIDE TO INTERPRETATION OF THE 1855 MASSACHUSETTS CENSUS

The taking of a census in 1855 was mandated by an act of the General Court of Massachusetts, 21 May 1855. The act provided that a census of each city and town be taken between 1 June and 1 October 1855. The census was to be "as of" the first day of June of the census year.

Reports on the taking of the census stated that the instructions were generally "well observed". Some enumerators, however, were so negligent or heedless that their reports were "scarcely fit to be received". Cautions, still appropriate, were given against relying too absolutely on the census because of "the great liability to error", and the "usual difficulty of arriving at the truth" arising from ignorance and prejudice.

To secure uniform reporting, blank forms were provided and the following data were to be recorded:

1. Dwelling houses numbered in the order of their visitation.
2. Families numbered in the order of visitation, ("family" being all those living in one house, public house or institution.)
3. Name of every person whose usual place of residence was in this family 1 June 1855. Note: Excluded were those born after 1 June. Included were those who had died after 1 June and those temporarily absent. Relationship of household members to the head of the household was not recorded. An aid in establishing relationships exists, nevertheless, in the requirement that the enumerator arrange names in a given order:
 - (1) Master
 - (2) Mistress
 - (3) Children in order of age
 - (4) Male domestics, etc.
 - (5) Female domestics, etc.
 - (6) Boarders, etc.
4. Age. To be given as of last birthday unless next birthday would be within four months, then age at next birthday.
5. Sex.
6. Color. B for Blacks, M for Mulatto, no entry for Whites.
7. Profession, occupation or trade for each male over fifteen. For clergymen, initial letters of denomination.
8. Place of birth. State or territory if native born; country if foreign born.
9. Whether deaf and dumb, blind, insane, idiotic, pauper or convict.
