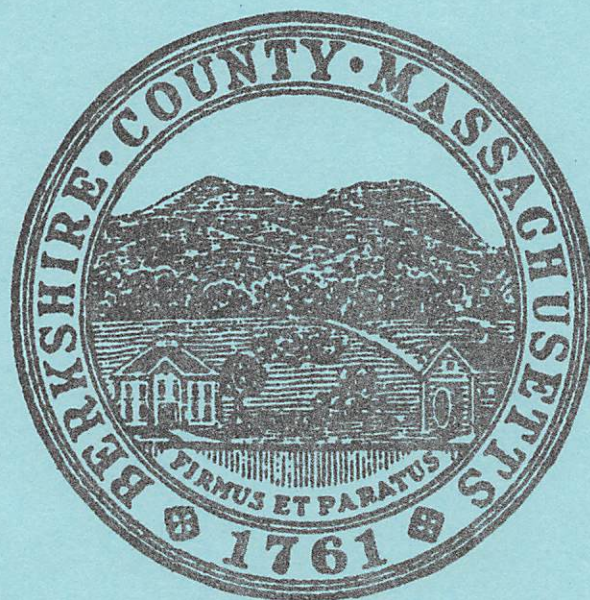

INFORMATION ABOUT BERKSHIRE COUNTY TOWNS

The local history department offers a wide variety of information on Berkshire towns which is of interest to the genealogist. The information below is a brief summary of the kind of material available on individual towns. The following are sources which cover all the towns in the county:

Census: All federal censuses from 1790 through 1920 are available on film at the Athenaeum, with the exception of the 1890 census which was destroyed by fire. We do have the 1890 Veteran's Census on film. Massachusetts State Census for 1855 and 1865.

Directories: Many towns are listed in directories, but not all. Business directories for the county begin around 1875, but they list only businesses by subject. City directories begin in the 1870s for Pittsfield, and in the late 1880s for some of the other larger towns.

Histories: Two histories of Berkshire County include histories of each town as well as the county as a whole. Those in the 1829 volume are generally 2-6 pages in length. Towns which have additional histories will have "Histories" noted.

History of the County of Berkshire by Gentlemen of the County published in 1829, is frequently referred to as "Field's History..." because David Dudley Field was one of the editors and wrote much of the text.

Maps: Although there are maps of individual towns with a wide range of publication dates, the following countywide sources indicate names of property owners:

Shepard Collection: Includes information on early families of all Berkshire towns, although some towns receive more complete coverage than others.

Corbin Collection: Although not all Berkshire towns are

included in the Corbin Collection (film), those which Corbin covers are noted.

Vertical Files: The Local History Department has clipping files on all towns in the county, although the information is generally related to the history of the town and historic buildings, rather than family history.

Town Reports: Town report collections are not complete, but the date of the first report is given for each town. The information contained in these varies by period and by town. If you are lucky, your ancestors lived in a town that recorded vital records in its annual report! Listed below are the dates of the earliest town reports.

Vital Records: Published Official Series, *Vital Records to 1850*, are noted for those towns included in the series. Those towns whose records have been filmed by Jay Holbrook, which are available on microfiche, are so noted also. A few towns whose records have been filmed by others (usually LDS) will simply say "film". Massachusetts Vital Records Indexes, 1841-1895 (fiche) include all towns.

- ADAMS:** Town reports 1850-. Town histories. First Baptist Church History. Quaker Records, births and deaths 1721-1838. Marriages to 1850. Cooke Collection included transcriptions of Quaker records, 1783-1842, indexed. The Browne Collection includes notes on many Adams families. Directories begin in 1887. *Company M and Adams in the War with Spain*. Filmed Vital Records, 1786-1847; Holbrook fiche to 1894. Town records to 1855.
- ALFORD:** Town reports 1882-. Tax Lists 1815, 1816. *Vital Records to 1850*. Holbrook fiche, 1759-1906.
- BECKET:** Town reports 1881-. Town histories. First Church History. Gravestone records, cemetery records and church records (1758-1892) transcribed by Cooke, indexed. *Vital Records to 1850*. Holbrook fiche, 1765-1900.
- CHESHIRE:** Town reports 1884-. Town histories. History of First Baptist Church and Methodist Church. Cemetery records, First Baptist Church records (1770-1848) and Second Baptist Church records (1779-1884) transcribed by Cooke, indexed. For information on early families, check Lanesboro also. Corbin Collection.
- CLARKSBURG:** Town reports 1935-. Town histories. Old Gravestone Inscriptions by W.B.Browne. Holbrook fiche, 1798-1915.
- DALTON:** Town reports 1884-. Town histories. Papermaking histories. Church histories (Baptist, Congregational, Methodist). Church records (1785-1855) transcribed by Cooke, indexed. *Vital Records to 1850*.
- EGREMONT:** Town reports 1875-. Bicentennial history. Cemetery inscriptions. Congregational Church records (1770-1875) transcribed by Cooke, indexed. Holbrook fiche, 1838-1897.
- FLORIDA:** Town reports 1968-.

- GREAT BARRINGTON:** Town reports 1865-. Town histories. History of Searles Castle, Mahaiwe and St. James Episcopal Church. Records of the Rev. Gideon Bostwick. Tombstone inscriptions (DAR). Assessors Poll Tax list 1902. Vignettes of Early Days (Jewish Community). Some early deeds. Monument Mills. Congregational Church records (1743-1872) and Episcopal Church records (Bostwick), transcribed by Cooke, indexed. Vital Records to 1850. Corbin Collection.
- HANCOCK:** Town reports 1883-. Town histories. Goodrich Hollow Cemetery Records (1791-1873) and Town Records (1767-1830) transcribed by Cooke, indexed. Holbrook fiche, 1797-1896. Filmed VRs 1767-1902. Corbin Collection.
- HINSDALE:** Town reports 1867-. History of the Baptist Church, 1797-1881. Centennial of the Congregational Church 1795-1896. Cemetery records (1790-1863), Cooke, indexed. Vital Records to 1850. See also records of Partridgefield (Peru). Holbrook fiche, 1860-1890.
- LANESBOROUGH:** Town reports 1874-. Town histories. Palmer's History of the town included vital records (separate index). History of all Lanesborough churches. History of the Baptist church 1817-1884. Addresses of John Leland. Town records 1797-1800. Congregational Church records (1764-1890) and St. Luke's Church Register (1767-), transcribed by Cooke, indexed. Corbin Collection. Holbrook fiche, 1765-1897. Town records (film), 1749-1816; 1843-1858; 1859-1897.
- LEE:** Town reports, 1881-. Town histories. Gravestone inscriptions to 1850. Deeds. Papermaking histories. Town and Church records from 1771-1801. Chronicle of the Huckleberry, Lee-Huntington line. History of the Baptist Church and Catholic Church. East Lee Flood. Account Books of Foote & Rogers (1789-1891). Vital Records to 1850. Holbrook fiche, 1844-1892.
- LENOX:** Town reports, 1860-. Town histories. East Street Book. Vital Records 1771-1832, addenda to 1848 (Vital records from Church on the Hill gravestones, transcribed by Stockwell). Cemetery inscriptions from New Lenox Cemetery by Stockwell. Information on Lenox Academy, Cranwell School, The Lenox Club, etc. Congregational Church Records (1771-1846), Trinity Church Records (1793-1835), Land records (1749-1804), and George Walker's diary transcribed by Cooke, indexed. Holbrook fiche, 1756-1890.
- MONTEREY:** Town reports, 1877-. Town histories. Cemetery inscriptions by DAR and Hoogs. Gravestone records and the daybook of Rev. Adonijah Bidwell (1750-1777), transcribed by Cooke, indexed. Holbrook fiche, 1825-1895. Corbin Collection.
- MOUNT WASHINGTON:** Town reports, 1886-. Town histories. Gravestone inscriptions by DAR and Keith. (Town of Tauconnuck

Mtn.) Holbrook fiche, 1745-1903.

NEW ASHFORD: Town reports, 1887-. Town records (1775-1815) and Cemetery records (1776-1901), transcribed by Cooke, indexed. Vital Records to 1850. Holbrook fiche, births 1844-1920; marriages, 1837-1921; deaths 1846-1921.

NEW MARLBOROUGH: Town reports, 1893-. Town Histories. Vital Records transcribed by Stockwell. The Rising Sun 1854-1885 and the Berkshire Sun, 1916-1918. Cemeteries by Sisson. New Marlborough Stage. Land Grantees admitted into Township No. 2, 1744, copied by Cooke, indexed. Holbrook fiche, 1734-1890.

NORTH ADAMS: North Adams was a part of Adams until 1878. Town reports, 1879-. There are no published Vital Records and none by Holbrook. The index to statewide vital records (to 1895 on fiche) can be useful, but you will need to write to either the City Clerk of North Adams or to the State Archives in Boston for actual records. Town histories. Directories begin in 1887. *Dew Upon the Mountains* (St. Francis of Assisi Parish, North Adams) indexed. Hoosac Tunnel Histories.

OTIS: Town reports, 1886-. Bicentennial History. Cemetery Records (1981). History of Loudon. Congregational Church Records (1779-1837) transcribed by Cooke, indexed. Vital Records to 1850. Corbin Collection.

PERU: Town reports, 1883-. Bicentennial History. Tombstone inscriptions (1948). Congregational Church members (1778-1868), transcribed by Cooke, indexed. Vital Records to 1850. Town Records (film) from 1771-1976. Vital Records (film) 1771-1893. The town was Partridgefield 1771-1806. Corbin Collection.

RICHMOND: Town reports, 1867-. Town histories. Early Houses by Terry Hallock. Voters in 1817. Town records (1771-1881) and Church records, transcribed by Cooke, indexed. Vital Records to 1850. Holbrook fiche, 1791-1901. Nathan Pierson's Ledger (1773) (film).

SANDISFIELD: Town reports, 1886-. History of the Baptist Church. Baptist Church, Montville section (1848-1903). First Baptist Church Records (1779-1917), partial transcriptions by Stockwell. Cemetery records from the Boston Transcript, 1932. Vital Records to 1850. Congregational Church records (1756-1899), transcribed by Cooke, indexed. Vital Records, revised, compiled by town clerk Flora B. Rhodes. Corbin Collection.

SAVOY: Town reports, 1870-. Town histories. History of the Baptist Church (1786-1885). Tax Lists; 1799-1819. Marriages to 1865 (copied by Elmer Shepard). Tombstone Inscriptions, by Corbin and Mason, indexed, with maps. Proprietors Records, Bullock's Grant, 1771-1801; transcribed by Cooke, indexed. Corbin Collection.

SHEFFIELD: Town reports, 1880-. Town histories. Early Deeds at

Springfield (1725-1738) transcribed by Stockwell. Cemetery Inscriptions (5 cemeteries) by Kellogg. Vital Records copied by Kellogg. Vital Records (1797-1850) transcribed from Town Records by Stockwell. Church records (1791-1870), transcribed by Cooke, indexed. Holbrook fiche, 1726-1897.

STOCKBRIDGE: Town reports, 1861-. Town histories. Town Meeting Records, 1739-54. Tombstone Inscriptions by DAR. Stockbridge Indians (books, files, notebooks). History of Austen Riggs Center. Vital Records (town records, Rev. West's and Episcopal Church) typescript, 17 pgs. Church members 1888-1921. Congregational Church records (1759-1850) transcribed by Cooke, indexed. Inventory of the collection in the Stockbridge Library Historical Room.

TYRINGHAM: Town reports, 1928-. Town histories. Papermaking. Extracts from Proprietors Book of Records, by H.W. Taft. Pauper accounts, 1821-27. Baptist Church history. Tyringham Views, Gilder & Eagle. Vital Records to 1850. Holbrook fiche, 1759-1898.

WASHINGTON: Town reports, 1927-. Town histories. Marriages (1774-1799), town records (1774-1877) and Congregational Church records (1772-1873), transcribed by Cooke, indexed. Vital Records to 1850. Vital Records (film), 1842-1961.

WEST STOCKBRIDGE: Town reports, 1870-. Town histories. Deeds, 1767-1852 (original copies, not indexed). Vital Records to 1850. Vital Records (film), 1770-1903. Court Records taken by Enoch Thayer, 1803-1809 (manuscript), not indexed. Records of the West Stockbridge Village Church (Congregational), 1839-1937 and 1938-1960 (vault; not indexed). Leet Iron Ore Bed Monthly Time Book, March 1891-November 1894.

WILLIAMSTOWN: Town reports, 1883-. Histories. History of Fort Hoosac, Fort Massachusetts and West Hoosac. William Williams Collection, indexed. Histories of the First and Second Congregational Churches, Baptist Church and Catholic Church. Inscriptions from gravestones in Southlawn Cemetery. Vital Records to 1850. Greylock Institute. Proprietors Book, transcribed by Cooke, indexed. Holbrook fiche 1757-1893. Corbin Collection. Note: because there are gaps in Williamstown's records, some of which were destroyed by fire and because he lived in Williamstown, Elmer Shepard devoted considerable effort to reassembling Williamstown records. Therefore, there are three file drawers devoted to Williamstown families in the Shepard Collection.

WINDSOR: Town reports, 1928-. Town histories. Cemetery records. Marriage records, 1792-1802. Records of Meetings of Ninth and Tenth School Districts, 1805-1882 (manuscript). Congregational Church records, (1773-1863), transcribed by Cooke, indexed. Vital Records to 1850. Holbrook fiche, 1860-1893.

THE BOOKSTALL

Batchelder, Batcheller Genealogy, by Frederick Clifton Pierce, 1898. 1992 facsimile reprint, 5¼ x 8¼, soft bound, 624pp, illustrated, index. Price \$35.00

The Batchelder name has some forty-four variants which complicates the determination of genealogical relationships. This work is concerned first with the lines stemming from Rev. Stephen Batchiler, born ca 1561 in England and an Oxford graduate who came to New England on the "William and Francis" in 1632. As a non-conformist he was frequently involved in the controversies of the time. He was associated with Lynn and Ipswich, Massachusetts and was the founder of Hampton, New Hampshire. The remainder of the book treats of the brothers John, Joseph, Joshua and Henry Batcheller who came from England ca 1636 to settle in Essex County, Massachusetts and their descendants.

There are numerous illustrations and a great deal of background material on the families in England, heraldry, etc. The indexing is quite erratic being hit or miss after the initial letter of the name.

The History of Malden, Massachusetts 1633-1785, by Deloraine Pendre Corey, 1898. 1992 facsimile reprint. 2 Vol. 870 pp, 5¼ x 8¼, soft bound, subject and person index. Price \$50.00

This is a detailed history of Malden starting with its English counterpart, Malden from whence came the little band of settlers leaving in April 1638 for the new country. A great deal of background material is included, facilitating an understanding of ecclesiastical difficulties which arose, development of the various town offices and officials as they became needed and the preparations for the coming war with England. These were times when jobs sought the man and he was fined if unwilling to accept the appointment. Included is material on the French and Indian War with upward of eighty biographies of varying lengths of seventy soldiers in it and similar coverage of over two hundred soldiers and sailors of the Revolution.

The flavor of the times is maintained by copious excerpts from documents relevant to the various important events and voluminous footnotes. The work is illustrated with three dozen pen and ink drawings, mostly of early homes, and thirty facsimile signatures of early settlers together with two folding maps. There are no specific genealogies but a great deal of genealogical data can be gleaned from the various lists, notes and text.

Salem Witchcraft and Hawthorne's House of Seven Gables, by Enders A. Robinson, 1992. 5½ x 8½, soft bound, 374pp, name and subject indexes, bibliography, illus. Price \$29.50

Among those caught up in the 1692 witchcraft hysteria were Samuel and Sarah Wardwell who were ancestors of the author. Over the years family members had accumulated a volume of material but which they had been too reticent to publish. Drawing upon this and other published and unpublished data, the author has contributed to a better understanding of these trying times. Appropriately so, on this the 300th anniversary of the affair.

"Salem Witchcraft History", the first of three parts of the book, deals with the settlement of New England by the Puritans and the circumstances resulting in the witch hunt of 1692. The author presents the occurrences as a conspiracy involving the preservation of old guard authority as well as the settling of festering grudges.

Part Two deals with Nathaniel Hawthorne's "House of Seven Gables" and relates several of its characters to their historical counterparts in the actual trials. Hawthorne was a descendant of John Hawthorne who was one of the most diligent of the witch hunters, as one of the judges at the trials.

Part Three, "Salem Witchcraft Genealogy" contains biographies of the accused and the accusers involved in the closing phase of Salem incidents. There are a great many lineage charts which provide a much needed understanding of the relationships existing between the various participants. These are most helpful. The genealogies mention several hundred people from many families of the time. There are numerous explanatory notes and the material is well documented as to sources.

This is a very interesting book, particularly so to a descendant of one of the "witches".

The Descendants of William and Elizabeth Tuttle Who Came from Old England to New England in 1635, and Settled in New Haven in 1639 with numerous Biographical Notes and Sketches; also, some account of the descendants of John Tuttle of Dover, New Hampshire; Richard Tuttle of Boston; John Tuttle of Ipswich and Henry Tuttle of Hingham, Massachusetts; to which is appended Genealogical Notes of several Allied Families, by George Frederick Tuttle, 1883. 1992 reprint, 2 vols, 754 pp, 5½ x 8½, illustrations, index, soft bound. Price \$45.00

While several Tuttle families are covered the bulk of the work is devoted to William and Elizabeth Tuttle and their descendants. A particular feature is the inclusion of female lines of descent and thus includes a great many Connecticut families which are traced to the immigrant ancestor. An appendix furnishes information on a number of non-Tuttle connected families. This provided material to fill in a number of blank spaces in my own charts.

The index of Tuttle names is arranged alphabetically by initial letter of the given name, beyond that it is quite erratic. The index of non-Tuttles is even more inconvenient in that

only the surnames are listed and the same lack of order is maintained.

The Old Records of Duxbury, Massachusetts, from 1642 to 1770, by George Etheridge, 1893. 1992 facsimile reprint 5½ x 8½, 348pp, index, soft bound. Price \$22.50

Created in 1637 as the third town established by Plymouth Colony, Duxbury was settled by many of the original "Mayflower" passengers. These records were transcribed from those existing in 1892 but do not include the vital records which were published separately. Most of the records relate to land transactions, allocation of common land and laying out highways. However, a great many names are mentioned in these records, establishing residence in time and place, which could be of value to the genealogist.

The minutes of the town meetings from about 1700 on, while still mostly concerned with land transactions, provide additional glimpses into the life of the time. That of 19 May 1701 has this to say: "...Voted to give Mr. John Robinson, in order to his settlement here in the work of the ministry, Sixty Pounds, in money ... and said money to be his if he live and die here in the aforesaid work of the ministry, but upon his removal from us, he is to return said money to the town ...". By 1737 the town was refusing to pay his salary and Rev. Robinson resorted to court action.

The Loyalists of Massachusetts and the Other side of the Revolution, by James H. Stark, 1907. 1988 facsimile reprint, 5½ x 8½, soft bound, 603pp, illustrated, name index. Price \$35.00

This excerpt from the author's introduction sets the stage for the first of the two parts of the book:

"These [school text-books] taught us that the Revolution was solely due to the oppression and tyranny of the British, and that Washington, Franklin, Adams, Hancock, Otis and the host of other Revolutionary patriots, had in a supreme degree all the virtues ever exhibited by men in their respective spheres and that the Tories and Loyalists, such as Hutchinson, the Olivers, Saltonstalls, Winslows, Quincys and others were to be detested and their memory execrated for their abominable and unpatriotic actions.

This led me to inquire and to examine whether there might not be two sides to the controversy which led to the Revolutionary War"

Part I of the book discusses the first and second charters granted by Great Britain and presents some of the causes of the Revolution, but from a perspective quite different from the usual portrayal. An analysis of the accelerating mob violence preceding the Boston Massacre and the Boston Tea Party strikes a familiar chord even today. There is a detailed account of the plight of

the Loyalists and their persecution and subsequent flight. The further difficulties with Great Britain in the War of 1812 and border disputes are covered.

Part II, three quarters of the book is devoted to biographies of hundreds of Loyalists of Massachusetts and Maine. These may be several pages in length or only a paragraph. Some are very detailed and trace ancestry back to the immigrant ancestor. This coverage could be very helpful in genealogical researching of Revolutionary times.

The text includes quotations from contemporary letters and documents and is well documented as to sources. The book is illustrated with over fifty engravings, including a folding map of the 1776 Boston area from Milton to Medford on the north.

Vital Records of Rehoboth, 1642-1896: Marriages, Intentions, Births, Deaths, by James N. Arnold, 1897. 1992 facsimile reprint, 2 vols, 964pp, 5½ x 8½, soft bound, index. Price \$50.00

While not a part of the Massachusetts Vital Records Project, its substance is substantially the same but differing somewhat in size and format. Each individual entry is supported by the citation of its source. There is a supplement containing data for 1896, Colonial Returns, lists of early settlers, purchasers, freemen, inhabitants and soldiers of King Philip's War and the Revolution.

One Clerk of Writs had this to say regarding his records: "Lett none marvell att the promiscuous and disorderly setting down of the names of such as are, or may be married, or doe, or may be born, or may dye; for they are sett as they were brought to mee as disorderly as they are sett downe. If the Courte order had been minded respecting this matter, they had bine otherwise placed than they are."

Concord, Massachusetts. Birth, Deaths and Marriages 1635-1850, printed by Town of Concord, 1894. 1992 facsimile reprint, 496pp 5½ x 8½, soft bound, name index. Price \$30.00.

In 1891 the Town of Concord appointed a committee to "procure the printing of the town's ancient registers of births, marriages and deaths". To this end town and county records have been supplemented and compared with church and cemetery data.

An opening statement reads "If any record of Births, Marriages and Deaths in Concord was kept previously to the year 1640, such record has not been preserved". The earliest dates noted were in 1643. In 1639 the General Court that "records be kept of the days of every marriage, birth and death of every person within this jurisdiction" but no officer in the towns was specifically charged with this duty. The items are presented in chronological order, as originally recorded. A complete name index provides easy access to the data.

Vital Records of Rye, New Hampshire: A Transcript of the

Births, Baptisms, Marriages and Deaths in this town to the year 1890, by Kathleen E. Hosier, 5½ x 8½, soft bound, 336pp, indexed 1790 Census. Published 1992. Price \$25.00

The area now known as Rye, settled in 1635, was separated from Portsmouth, New Castle and Hampton, NH by an act of the provincial legislature in 1726. These vital records were obtained from microfilms of the original town records, the genealogical records of tow of the town clerks and from the records of the Congregational Church which was gathered in 1726.

The birth records usually give first and last names of the child, sex, first names of parents and day month and year of birth. The listing of the baptisms is similarly arranged. Marriage records include both man's and woman's last name and in most cases the date, status (widow, title, military rank, etc.), town from and in some cases divorce date. Usually the death records will include first and last name, parent's or spouse's names, date and age. Where death occurred from some unusual circumstance (drowning, lightning, blasting rocks, suicide, etc.) the cause of death is listed.

The display of the 1790 census for the most part is not the usual 1-2-1-1-0-0 affair but is a very detailed presentation in family group sheet format of a great deal of genealogical information with a citation of the sources from which obtained. There is a name index of this portion (84 pp) of the book.

Annals of the Town of Keene from its First Settlement in 1734 to the Year 1790; with Corrections, Additions and a Continuation from 1790 to 1815, by Salma Hale, 1851. 1992 reprint, c130pp, 5½ x 8½, soft bound, index, maps 1700, 1800 and 1850 fold-out. Price \$13.50

Keene, New Hampshire was first settled under the authority of Massachusetts, before the survey of the line between that colony and New Hampshire.

This work was undertaken to preserve the most interesting events which, since its first settlement, have occurred there. To this end the author has copied "... freely and fully such written documents as came under his inspection" and drawn upon conversations with several aged and respected residents of the town. The text is a running narrative, year by year from 1732 to 1815. Much of the material is written in a manner permitting identification of the sources but a great deal is undocumented. The names of citizens appear throughout the text and in addition there is a 1734 listing of the original proprietors, 1773 of militiamen, 1776 of subscribers to a declaration of opposition to the British army and navy including a tabulation of those refusing to sign and a 1785 listing of pew owners.

A 1750 map shows the layout of streets with but four houses located and identified. The 1800 map displays the location of the various houses and keyed to a listing of their owners. All of the names are indexed.

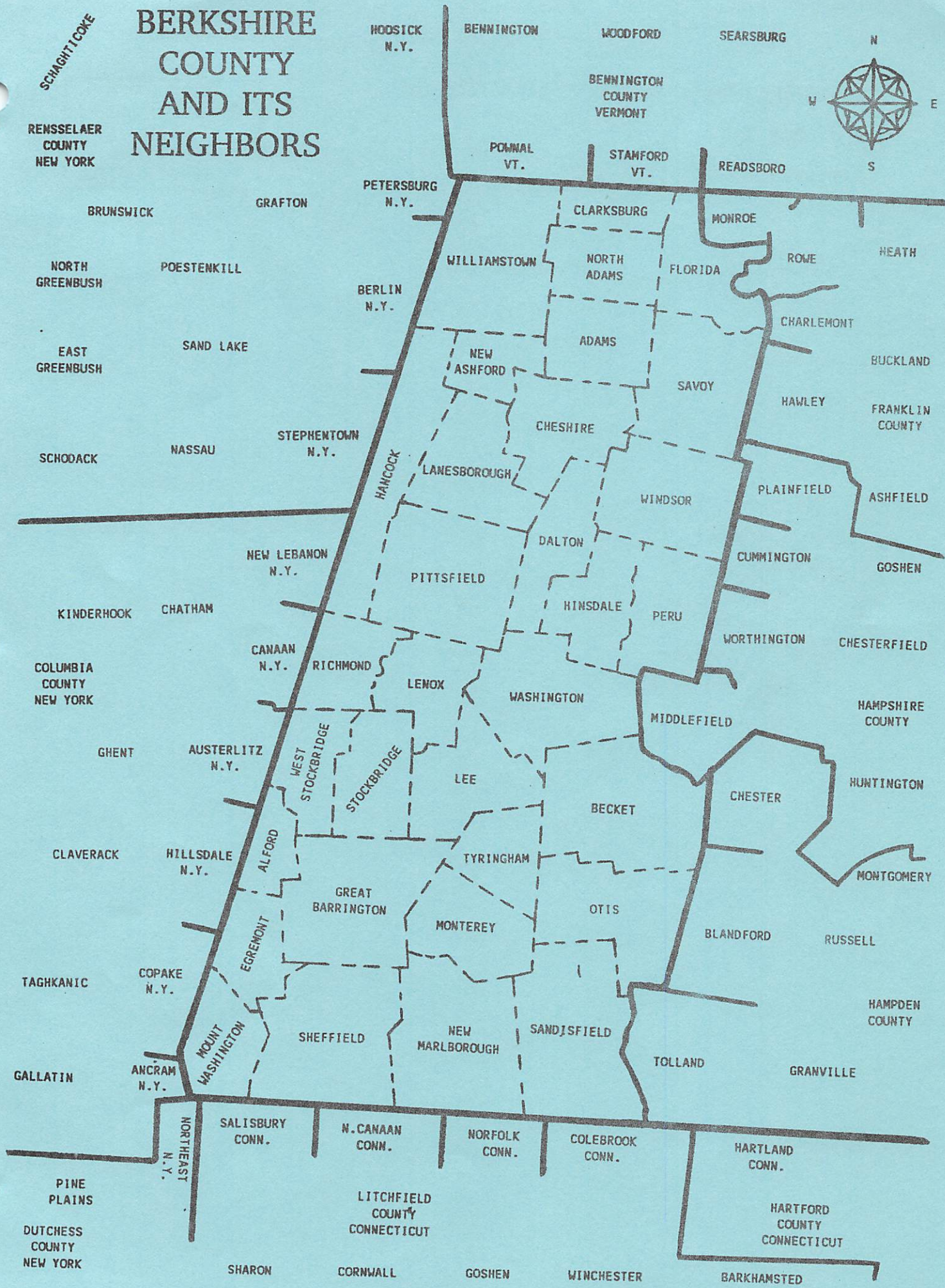
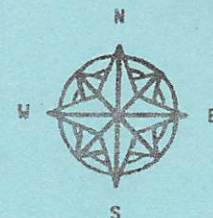
