DESCENDANTS OF SAMUEL SCRIPTURE

Compiled by Valerie Giorgi*

Samuel Scripture born ca 1650 probably in England and died between 1720 and 1728 probably in Groton, Middlesex County, Massachusetts. Samuel married 11 September 1674 in Cambridge, Massachusetts¹ (7 July 1674, Cambridge, Suffolk County, Massachusetts²) Elizabeth Knapp, daughter of James and Elizabeth (Warren) Knapp. Elizabeth was born 21 February 1655, Watertown, Middlesex County,

Massachusetts and died ca 1720, Groton, Massachusetts.

The first record of Samuel Scripture occurs in Vol. 2, page 87, of Abstracts from Middlesex Court Records wherein in April 1669 he testifies that he is aged 19 and servant to Samuel Davis. The next record is found on page 39 of The Early Records of Groton, Massachusetts 1662-1707 edited by Samuel A. Green, M.D., Groton 1880, where "At a town meeting held the 23:6m:1671 It was agreed and by vote declared that Samuell Scriptur shal be an inhabitant amongst us and for his Incoridgment these men have given him some small grants of upland as followeth." The land totaled 10 acres and was given by eight of the early settlers.

Samuel was in Groton in 1671, Cambridge by 1674, Charlestown 1676,

Concord 1677 and settled in Groton, Massachusetts by 1680.

The settlement of Cambridge was begun in the spring of 1631; first called "New-Town" inc. 1633 as New-Town, the name changed to Cambridge 1638; in 1642 Cambridge included "Menotomy" now Arlington, Cambridge Farms now Lexington, lands on the Shawshine now Billerica, and Nonantum later called New Cambridge now Newton³.

His first child, a son, Samuel, was born at Cambridge in 1675 (as recorded there) but his second, a daughter, Elizabeth was born at Concord in 1677 (as recorded there). This was because the town of Groton was destroyed by the Indians on 13 March 1676 and the inhabitants did not return until the spring of 1678. During part of this time he was fighting the Indians as in Volume 41, page 409, and Volume 43, page 277 of the New England Historical and Genealogical Register where he is mentioned as a soldier in King Phillip's War with Capt. Joseph Sill. (August 24, 1676 02 04 06). The manner in which payment of his account (01 15 06) was made 24 August 1676 would indicate that his family was then in Charlestown, Massachusetts. His next child is recorded at Groton in 1680 so he must have returned there soon after the town was re-settled.

Records of the Court of Assistants of the Massachusetts Bay, Volume I, page 53 mentions the name of Samuel Scripture as a witness in a trial in which several Indians were tried for murder of inhabitants of Lancaster, 21 September 1675.

In 1681 he was chosen Fence Viewer and Hog Constable, or to quote the record, "to veue the fancese anlok after the swine." His taxes that year were 9 shillings, 10 pence. In 1683 he was again Hog Constable and Viewer of Fences and in 1687 and 1688 a Surveyor.

The New England Historical and Genealogical Register, Volume 43, page 375, mentions him in the Garrison of West Regiment of Middlesex on 17 March 1691/2. In 1693 we find for the first time "Sr." attached to his name. The town (page 111 Early

Records of Groton) "did agree with Samuel Scripter se...for rashonall satisfactione.". He was apparently one of those who helped to bring up to Groton the family effects of their new minister, the Rev. Gersham Hobart."

Samuel Scriptor senor was on the town committee the 15 day of January 1710 to state the burying place and regulate highways. He witnessed an agreement January 23, 1710/11 regarding the curing place and signed with a reverse "S" mark⁴.

There are no epitaphs listed for any of the Scripture family so they probably are

in unmarked graves⁵.

In 1694 Samuel's first deed is recorded. In 1695 he was chosen Constable and in 1699 a surveyor of highways. In 1704 he was chosen a Tithingman while his son Samuel Jr., was fence viewer. In 1706 he sold land to his son Samuel Scripture, Jr. and the deed was witnessed by John Scripture; and in the same year he and his wife Elizabeth joined in a deed to Moses Barron of land formerly of his father-in-law James Knapp.

In 1712 Samuel and Elizabeth jointly signed a deed to their son Samuel Scripture, and both Samuel and Elizabeth appear on deeds in 1714, 1715, 1716, and 1719. It would seem that his son John returned from Connecticut in 1719 and was deeded land by his father provided he would take care of his father and mother in their old age. Apparently in 1720 John decided he wanted to go back to Connecticut as there appears a complicated transaction in which the property first goes to two other sons-in-law, Eleazer Lawrence and Phineas Parker, and finally comes back to Samuel Scripture, Jr., provided he support his father and mother.

Samuel and Elizabeth (Knapp) Scripture had the following children:

Mary married ca 1698, Eleazer Lawrence, son of Peleg and Elizabeth (Morse) Lawrence and grandson of John Lawrence. Eleazer born 28 February 1674 and died 9 March 1754, Pepperell, age 80.

4. Sarah Scripture born 8 February 1682, Groton, Massachusetts and married

James Shattuck.

(3) 6. Abigail Scripture born 28 January 1686/7, Groton, Massachusetts.

(4) 7. John Scripture born ca 1688, Groton, Massachusetts.

8. Deborah Scripture born ca 1690 and died 17 January 1711, Groton, Massachusetts. Deborah married 4 September 1710 in Concord, Massachusetts, Jonathan Whitcomb, son of Jonathan. Jonathan born 26 February 1669, Lancaster and died 10 April 1715. Jonathan married first Mary (Blood) Joslin, daughter of Abraham and Mary Blood.

9. Ruth Scripture born 2 February 1696/7, Groton, Massachusetts and married John Frost, son of Thomas and Mary Frost. John born 14 September 1684, Sudbury, Massachusetts and died between 15 February 1758 and first

Tuesday of September 1763

10. Lydia (Lidia) Scripture born 28 July 1700, Groton, Massachusetts⁸.

(1) SAMUEL SCRIPTURE

Samuel Scripture² (Samuel¹) born 4d.8.m1675⁹, Cambridge, Massachusetts (or born 4 October 1675¹⁰). Samuel died between 14 October and 6 November 1755, Nelson, New Hampshire (or Groton, Massachusetts¹¹). Samuel married (1) 8 February 1699/1700 in Concord, Mary (Pierce) Green,

daughter of Daniel and Elizabeth Pierce of Watertown and widow of John Green of Groton. Mary born 15 April 1671, Chelmsford, Massachusetts and died 25 September 172312, Groton, Massachusetts. Mary married (1) 25 December 1688 in Concord, John Green of Concord. John and Mary had children: Mary born 3 November 1690; Hannah born 5 January 1694/5; and John born 1 November 1696.

Samuel married (2) 6 February 1723/4, in Chelmsford, Middlesex County, Massachusetts, Elizabeth (Lund) Spaulding, daughter of Thomas and Eleanor Lund of Dunstable and widow of Henry Spaulding. Elizabeth born 29 September 1684, Dunstable, Massachusetts¹³ and died 15 April 1781,

From Concord, Massachusetts Vital Records "Samuel Scripture of Grotton & Mary Green of Watertown were Marryed by Justice Minott February 8th 1699 alias

1700". The marriage was also listed in the Groton records.

Materials for the History of Groton, Massachusetts by Samuel A. Green gives the account of a court martial held in 1706/7 in which Samuel Scripture was a member of a scout party. He is only identified as Samuel Scripture. If this is Samuel Scripture¹ he would then be 56 years of age or if it was his son, Samuel² would be 31 years of age is not definite. It is assumed it would be the younger Samuel.

Watertown was incorporated 7 September 1630. Waltham, Weston and a part

of Lincoln were once a part of Watertown.

Samuel and Mary (Green) Scripture had the following children all born in Groton, Massachusetts:

ANNA SCRIPTURE

Anna Scripture² (Samuel¹) born 10 January 1685, Groton, Middlesex County, Massachusetts and died 3 (31) September 1758, Groton, Massachusetts, age 73 years, 8 months and 21 days. Anna married ca 1701 Nathaniel Lawrence, son of Enoch and Ruth ([Stattuck] Whitney) Lawrence. Nathaniel born 21 February 1678, Watertown and died 12 September 1765, Groton.

Nathaniel and Anna (Scripture) Lawrence had the following children¹⁸:

- 2. James Lawrence born 26 August 1705, Groton.

(3) ABIGAIL SCRIPTURE

Abigail Scripture² (Samuel¹) born 28 January 1686/7 Groton, Massachusetts, and died 4 February 1720. Abigail married (1) Zachariah Lawrence, born 1683, Groton. Zachariah was a brother of Nathaniel Lawrence. Abigail married (2) Phineas Parker, son of James, Jr. and Mary (Parker) Parker. Phineas born 1684, Groton and died there 13 August 1744¹⁹.

Town History of Groton states Zachariah had the following children:

(4) JOHN SCRIPTURE

John Scripture² (Samuel¹) born ca 1688, Groton, Middlesex County, Massachusetts and died at age 91 on 24 July 1779 in Coventry, Connecticut. John married (1) 15 May 1712 in Coventry²⁰, Abagail Utley, daughter of Samuel and Sarah (Ashby) Utley. Abagail was born 13 January 1692, Scituate, Massachusetts (or Stonington, Connecticut) and baptized 27 June 1692, Scituate, Massachusetts and died 1728, Coventry. John married (2) 30 December 1728, in Coventry, Connecticut,²¹ Mary Slafter (or Slater), widow. Mary was the daughter of William and Mary (Burnet) Eaton of Lynn, Massachusetts and widow of Anthony Slafter. Mary died 20 July 1780, Coventry, Connecticut at age 87.

John resided in Coventry and Windham, Connecticut. John and Abigail were among the 52 dismissed from the church in Windham to form the church at Hampton in 1723.

John and Abagail (Utley) Scripture had the following children:

- (10) 8. Sarah Scripture born 1 December 1726, Coventry.
 - 9. Mary Scripture born 15 July 1728, Coventry, Connecticut²⁸ and died 30 July 1728, Coventry²⁹.
 - John and Mary (Eaton) Scripture had the following children:
 - 10. Mary Scripture born 2 September 1730, Coventry, Connecticut and died 1808. Mary married 28 July 1748 in Mansfield, Dr. James Jackson born 1721 and died 1791.

 - 12. Daniel Scripture born 27 February 1736 (or 1734), Coventry, Connecticut and died 14 March 1736, Coventry³⁰.

(5) SAMUEL SCRIPTURE

Samuel Scripture³ (Samuel², Samuel¹) born 27 April 1727, Groton, Middlesex County, Massachusetts and died probably ca 1817, Nelson, Cheshire County, New Hampshire. Samuel married 9 October 1746³¹ in Chelmsford, Middlesex County, Massachusetts, Mary Green, daughter of Jonathan and Sarah (Lakin) Green. Mary born 22 June 1731, Groton.

Samuel went to Mason, New Hampshire between 1750 and 1760; to

Packersfield (now Nelson) ca 1786.

Samuel and his son Samuel born 1760 fought side by side in the Revolution. Son Samuel enlisted in the Revolutionary war when he was 14 years and 4 months old³².

Samuel and Mary (Green) Scripture had the following children³³:

- 1. Mary Scripture born 5 May 1747, Groton and died 11 May 1797, Cambridge, Massachusetts. Mary married 13 or 23 April 1772, John Prentice.

 - 7. Hannah Scripture born 1 June 1763. Hannah married (1) 7 November 1782 Benjamin Barrett and (2) 28 August 1804 Joel Richardson.
 - 8. John Scripture born 18 September 1765 and married Molly -----.

(6) **ENOCH LAWRENCE**

Enoch (Enosh) Lawrence³ (Anna², Samuel¹) born 15 November 1710, Groton, Massachusetts and died 28 September 1778. Enoch married 29 January 1733, Sarah

Stevens who died 1 September 179734.

October 1752 a meeting was held at Enosh Lawrence home in Groton to organize the town of Mason, New Hampshire (which was called No.1, Massachusetts at that time.) He was living in Mason by 1753. In 1768, No. 1 became Mason. He was on the first Tax List (West Side) in 28 January 1769, as were his son's Samuel, Stevens, and Enosh, Jr. He was called Ens.

Enoch and Sarah (Stevens) Lawrence had the following children:

(7) ELIZABETH SCRIPTURE

Elizabeth Scripture³ (John², Samuel¹) born April 1714, Coventry, Connecticut³⁵ and died 19 February 1773, Tolland, Connecticut. Elizabeth married 1728 in Connecticut, Isaac Heath.

Isaac, son of Isaac and Rachael (Read) Heath, born 24 July 1705, Framingham, Massachusetts. Isaac moved to Connecticut with his parents in 1723. He was admitted to the church of Enfield, Connecticut 7 March 1731 and lived in Tolland in 1748. Isaac died 8 July 1749, Tolland.

Isaac and Elizabeth (Scripture) Heath had the following children: 1. Elizabeth Heath born 6 October 1729, Enfield, Connecticut.

2. Abigail Heath born 2 June 1731, Enfield, Connecticut and married 27 March 1748, Tolland, Connecticut, John Ward. John died 1811 and Abigail died 21 February 1813. They lived Belchertown, Massachusetts.

3. Rachel Heath born 6 December 1734. Stafford, Connecticut and married 27

May 1752, David (or Daniel) Markham.

4. Isaac Heath born 26 December 1736, Stafford, Connecticut and married in Stafford 11 March 1763, Hannah Carlton. Hannah died 14 April 1785, Tolland, Connecticut. Isaac served as a soldier in the Revolutionary War. There are no known children of Isaac and Hannah.

5. Relief Heath born 7 November 1738, Stafford.

6. Daniel Heath born 6 May 1740, Stafford and died 14 December 1805, Cambridge, Washington County, New York. Daniel married ca 1760 Anna ---. Daniel served in the Revolutionary Wary. Daniel's will was dated 2 December 1805 and proven 27 December 1805. Both are buried in the Old White Church Cemetery, Cambridge. They had 10 children.

7. Benjamin Heath born 4 September 1741, Stafford and married 3 January

1760 in Tyringham, Massachusetts, Gillian Davis who died 21 August 1797,

Tyringham.

8. Levi Heath born 8 or 28 April 1743, Stafford and died 27 August 1818. Levi married (1) ca 1760, Abigail ---- who died 1776-1779 probably in Sandisfield (2) 12 May 1779 in Tyringham, Massachusetts, Abigail Orton Doud, widow of Lent Doud. Abigail born 3 September 1751, Farmington, Connecticut.

9. Samuel Heath born 2 August 1744, Stafford and died 15 December 1744,

Stafford..

10. Samuel Heath born ca 1745, Mansfield, Connecticut and died 17 September 1829 at age 84 in Sandisfield, Massachusetts. Samuel married 22 October 1767 in Coventry, Mary Heath. Mary died 25 March 1829 at age 78 years in Sandisfield.

11. Cibal (Sybil) Heath born 3 May 1747, Tolland.



History of Hardwick, Massachusetts, With A Genealogical Register, by Lucius R. Paige, 1883. Reprint, 571pp, softbound, 5½" X 8½" w/index. Price \$35.00 plus \$3.50 S/H. The historical background of Hardwick is covered in the first part of the book. This includes a detailed table of contents covering the events of Hardwick's history during the period around 1673 to 1877. The text covers details of geography, Indians, first settlement, founders and early officials of the town, churches and ministers, Revolutionary War activity, Shays' Rebellion and the War of 1812. There is a great deal of material relating to activity with the Tories and with Shays' Rebellion. Throughout this portion of the book are copious notes and citing of the sources of information.

The second part of the book is a 224 page Genealogical Register arranged alphabetically and including the names of the spouse(s), children and children's spouses. In addition, there may be additional data as to place of birth, occupation, character, personality traits and anecdotes as available. This portion on the book cites the sources from which much of the information was obtained as well as many explanatory notes.

The index is arranged alphabetically by surname, but is expanded to bring forth the names in the genealogical section which differ from the main entry. This permits the tracking down of female lines and maiden names of married women.

From 1899 until 1937 this periodical was published under the auspices of the Massachusetts Society of Mayflower Descendants. Under the editorship of George Ernest Bowman, an eminent genealogist of the period, thirty-four volumes of vital genealogical data were published. He also did much of the actual transcription of the records.

The contents of the magazines included essential data relating to the Mayflower passengers, their families and descendants for the first few generations. Included also are data on other immigrants who settled in many of the southeastern Massachusetts towns. The series contains extensive transcriptions of the original records, compiled genealogies and articles of historical

significance.

Probably the best review is to quote from the compiler's own introduction. "... the early records of the town were not kept very systematically. The list has been prepared as correctly as possible under the circumstances. In the early history of the town, it is probable that many deaths occurred that were not entered on any record, except the eternal, and many of their graves were without markers, to give any information as to who they were."

While the burial was in Ludlow, Vermont, many of the reported deaths took place elsewhere than in Ludlow. There are here reported 2613 deaths by years, from one in 1790 to forty-two in 1901. At the end of the work are some interesting observations on longevity during the period. The text is arranged chronologically but with an alphabetical index.

SOME SUGGESTIONS FOR WRITING QUERIES

- 1. Give the full name, including middle name or initial, of the person subject to enquiry.
- 2. Establish identity of the person by giving place and date of birth, place and date of death, parentage, place and date of marriage and identity of spouse to the extent these data are known, as:

John DOE b Hartford, CT 12 Jan 1900; d Fairfield, CT 19 Mar 1967 s/o Richard & Abigail (WESTON) DOE m Hartford 11 June 1923.

- 3. If unable to give a complete description of the person under enquiry, start with a son or daughter for whom more information might be available and ask for that person's ancestry.
- 4. Identify spouse in manner described in (2) above.
- 5. State what information is desired, as: Need ancestors of John and Abigail.
- 6. Place the question at the end of the query.
- 7. Do not abbreviate the names of persons or towns.
- 8. For any locale outside Massachusetts, be sure to identify the state.
- 9. Dates should be written: day, month, year as: 13 Oct 1743.
- 10. Use multiple queries rather than several parts to the same query.
- 11. Queries should not exceed four or five lines and each should be printed or typed on a 3"X5" index card. One query per card.
- 12. Well-known abbreviations may be used but elaborate use of them is not required.
- 13. Address for reply should be stated on each card so that the Editor is not obliged to keep their envelope as well in order to have a complete record.
- 14. Acknowledge receipt of all replies and reimburse respondent for postage and the cost of any material copied. One should not be left out of pocket for having answered a call for help. If the submitted material is of little use, that is the risk assumed in transactions by correspondence.
- 15. When requesting information, always include a SASE.
- 16. Help your query editor judge the effectiveness of this section. If you make a contact that provides significant help with your search, won't you let us know?
