GENEALOGICAL RESOURCES AT THE BERKSHIRE ATHENAEUM THE ELMER I. SHEPARD COLLECTION

Family trees blooming in the Midwest or far west may well have roots in Massachusetts in general and Berkshire County in particular. This is the natural consequence of ports of entry in the east coast and a westward tide of immigration over the years. Berkshire County has often been called "The Gateway to the West". The completion of the Erie Canal, linking the Hudson River at Albany with Buffalo on Lake Erie in 1825, stimulated this westward movement. With Berkshire County a station along the route, this is a good place to search. This is certainly the case if any of the clues point toward Massachusetts towns or cities in the list below:

Fortunate are researchers retracing the westward footprints from any of these communities. Help for them may very well be forthcoming from the Local History Department of the Berkshire Athenaeum in Pittsfield. This is one of the best genealogical libraries in Massachusetts, both as to available material and problem solving ability of the librarians. Of particular note are a number of specialized data sources, unavailable or hard to come by elsewhere. It is proposed to publish a series of pieces describing them in some detail; especially notable is the "Shepard Collection", which is the first of these presentations.

A bit about this collection in the words of its compiler, Elmer Irwin Shepard:

"I taught mathematics at Williams [College] for forty-five years except for three years at Harvard, returning in 1945. Previous to then my main outside interest had been as a reserve officer in the army, having moved to Captain of infantry to Lieutenant Colonel of FA. As I was over sixty, I was not called out for the last war; in 1943 transferred to the retired list. Before stopping teaching I had looked around for a hobby and found it in genealogy work, and in particular in the unpublished vital records of Berkshire County and environs. I have published four booklets under the titles of "Berkshire Notes" Nos. 1 and 4 being marriages in Pownal, Vermont and New Lebanon, New York...I am working on a big job; a digest of the probate records of Berkshire County from the beginning to -?-. I am putting all of the genealogical information on cards and combining it with anything else I can get from other sources, published or unpublished and filing the cards by towns. I have covered from the beginning to 1831 and would like to bring it down to 1850, or better, past the Civil War. If I can get it published it will be under the title of "Berkshire County Families, nearly 30,000 cards...."

Unfortunately the delicate balance between compiling and publishing was not achieved and the collection is still in the card stage. There are actually nearly 50,000 cards, handwritten in very fine script, and using many abbreviations, particularly with regard to sources. There is a religious regard for statement of sources, many of which are probate dockets on file at the Berkshire Registry of Probate, across the street from, but quite near, the Athenaeum.

Three examples will provide an idea of what one might expect to find. This will vary from very little information to considerable:

Each of these examples represents a separate card and the actual information it contains. It must be remembered that these cards are the actual notes taken by Professor Shepard for his personal use and later to be expanded into a finished publication. The 3 X 5 cards are handwritten in pencil. The greater the volume of information, the finer and more compressed the writing becomes. Generally this poses no problem as the context provides adequate clues as to what doubtful letters might be. However, with respect to dates, great care must be exercised in their interpretation. It is very difficult to read some of them

without a magnifying glass. Dates are frequently expressed in such a manner as 12-3-77. Unless the card contains other dates stated in their completeness it is not clear whether this is 12 March or 3 December or even what century is involved. There are usually other data on the card which will permit a proper determination, but care must be used. If the card is filled with cramped handwriting and interlinear inserts, checking any derived conclusions for compatibility and consistency should be helpful.

The thought that this file may contain several hundred thousand names points up the enormous contribution Professor Shepard

has made to our field of enquiry.

[The Shepard collection is housed in 41 file drawers under 203 independently alphabetized file tabs. In 1993, B.F.H.A. created a MASTER INDEX of the names under which the cards are filed, thus giving Athenaeum patrons "one-stop-shopping". Ed.]

Perhaps readers would like to add to the list. Who said there is no humor in genealogy?



CERTIFICATES OF DENOMINATIONS, LEE, MASSACHUSETTS

In the 1700's the original proprietors of any grant of land given by the state of Massachusetts had certain conditions they must follow. "That within the space of five years there should be sixty settlers residing in said township, who shall have a dwelling-house of the following dimensions: 24 feet long, 18 feet wide and 16 foot posts; and 7 acres of land well cleared and fenced and brought to English grass or ploughed." There were also to settle "a learned Protestant Minister of the Gospel in said township within the time aforesaid".

It happened that all early settlers were of the same religion. Their share of the cost of a minister and meeting house was a yearly assessment, which was included in the property tax collected by the town. This was satisfactory until immigrants from other countries with different religions settled in the state. Naturally they objected to supporting a church that they did not attend. Finally, the state of Massachusetts passed a law in the early 19th century exempting them from this church tax by submitting Certificates of Denomination to the town clerk. These lists may be found in the early handwritten town records.

Founded in 1823, The New Hampshire Historical Society accumulated a collection of over 2000 pages of family records representing over 600 families. About half of the records were pages torn from family Bibles or reproductions thereof and about a quarter were typed or handwritten transcripts of such records. The reminder are miscellaneous notes and brief genealogical abstracts. The time span is roughly 1800 to 1900. Often such records are the only source of birth, marriage and death data.

Volume 5 opens with a four page alphabetical list of subjects among which are continuations of the vital records of Barnstable, Bridgewater, Chatham, Eastham, Halifax, Harwich, Marshfield, Middleborough, Orleans, Yarmouth, Plymouth, Scituate, Plympton; deeds, wills and estate inventories of many of the passengers and their descendants and some Mayflower genealogies.

John Alden's will and probate proceedings are covered as well as those of many others of the colonists and a great deal of material from Governor Bradford's Letter Book. A researcher into this period of history will find this volume very helpful.

With its beginning in 1780 in Durham, New Hampshire, the Freewill Baptist denomination spread throughout the Northeast, Midwest and Canada. Eventually it reached California, Connecticut, Indiana, Iowa, Maine, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Oregon and Oregon Territory, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Vermont, Wisconsin and Wisconsin Territory and into Quebec and Ontario.

Save for Massachusetts, many marriages were not officially recorded - in Maine not until 1830 and not a legal requirement until 1892. In many states there were even fewer sources of marriage records. The entries in this book were transcribed from the Morning Star of Limerick, Maine 1826-1833 and Dover, New Hampshire 1833-1851, the Maine Freewill Baptist Repository of Limerick, Maine 1843-1851 and Maine Religious Informer published in New Hampshire 1819-1825.

The entries are arranged alphabetically in the two volumes - in Part 1 by the surname of the groom and Part 2 by that of the

GUIDE TO INTERPRETATION OF THE 1855 MASSACHUSETTS CENSUS

The taking of a census in 1855 was mandated by an act of the General Court of Massachusetts, 21 May 1855. The act provided that a census of each city and town be taken between 1 June and 1 October 1855. The census was to be "as of" the first day of June of the census year.

Reports on the taking of the census stated that the instructions were generally "well observed". Some enumerators, however, were so negligent or heedless that their reports were "scarcely fit to be received". Cautions, still appropriate, were given against relying too absolutely on the census because of "the great liability to error", and the "usual difficulty of arriving at the truth" arising from ignorance and prejudice.

To secure uniform reporting, blank forms were provided and the following data were to be recorded:

- 1. Dwelling houses numbered in the order of their visitation.
- 2. Families numbered in the order of visitation, ("family" being all those living in one house, public house or institution.)
- 3. Name of every person whose usual place of residence was in this family 1 June 1855. Note: Excluded were those born after 1 June. Included were those who had died after 1 June and those temporarily absent. Relationship of household members to the head of the household was not recorded. An aid in establishing relationships exists, nevertheless, in the requirement that the enumerator arrange names in a given order:
 - (1) Master
 - (2) Mistress
 - (3) Children in order of age
 - (4) Male domestics, etc.
 - (5) Female domestics, etc.
 - (6) Boarders, etc.
- 4. Age. To be given as of last birthday unless next birthday would be within four months, then age at next birthday.
 - 5. Sex.
 - 6. Color. B for Blacks, M for Mulatto, no entry for Whites.
- 7. Profession, occupation or trade for each male over fifteen. For clergymen, initial letters of denomination.
